Examination for Stenographers, 1938.

APPLICATIONS are invited for filling such vacancies in the posts of Stenographers as may occur during the next financial year. Nine new posts are to be considered in connection with the Estimates, 1938-39.

2. *Salary Scale.*—Rs. 936 per annum rising by annual increments, fifteen of Rs. 60 and one of Rs. 72 to Rs. 1,908 per annum with an Efficiency Bar the passing of which will be dependent upon an examination test before Rs. 1,476. Some posts are pensionable and others are n-pensionable.

3. *Examination and Selection.*—A qualifying examination will be held in Colombo by the Director of Education, on August 20, 1938, and the selection thereafter will be made by the Chief Secretary, who will consider the previous records of the candidates as well as the results of the examination. Candidates must be British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon.

4. *Scope of Examination.*—Candidates will be required to write an essay, take down in shorthand passages dictated at 100 words a minute for five minutes and to transcribe the record at 10 words a minute. They will also be required to make a correct copy of a passage of 600 words on the typewriter in 20 minutes, *i.e.*, 30 words per minute. Touch typewriting will be regarded as essential. Candidates should bring their own typewriters if possible; otherwise they will be expected to use any machine provided. Neatness and accuracy will be taken into account in marking the papers.

5. *Method of Application.*—Applications for admission to the examination must be made by letter to the Director of Education and must reach that Officer not later than 1 P.M. on August 6, 1938. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected. Stamps to the value of Rs. 10 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over them. All candidates should forward a copy of their birth certificate (which will be returned) with their application. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code of Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination. Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates. Candidates who are not in Government Service should also attach copies of two testimonials of good character.

6. *Age Limits.*—Candidates, unless already in Government Service, must be between the ages of 17 and 35 years on the date of the examination.

7. *Refunds of value of Stamps.*—(a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5ths the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of 1/2 the value of stamps affixed to his application provided his form of admission to the examination is returned with his notice of withdrawal.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 6th day of May, 1938.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 10th day of November, 1866(a), made under Section 1 of the Foreign Deserters Act, 1852(b), it was ordered and declared that seamen who, within His Majesty's

dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the Kingdom of Siam should be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships :

"An improved apparatus for roll-breaking and sifting green tea leaf, and for made-tea leaf sifting and grading."

Abstract.—Rotating horizontal sieves are used for sifting green tea leaf or fired tea. The inventor describes an arrangement comprising a plurality of horizontal sieves mounted on a common vertical spindle. Suitable means are described for giving the sieves a rotational movement, combined with a reciprocating vertical movement. If the machine is to be used as a roll breaker the receiving hopper as well as the top tray are fitted with vertical battens; clearance between the top tray and the receiving hopper is adjustable during working.

The meshes are made detachable from the sieve frame for cleaning purposes. The bottom of the trays may be suitably contoured to control the rate of travel of leaf.

~~SMC~~ chutes are provided for deflecting leaf that goes through each tray to the inner portion of the tray beneath, and for guiding the material that passes over the top of each tray into suitable collecting boxes.

"Improvements in and relating to Therapeutic apparatus".

Abstract.—A vaporising apparatus for inhalation purposes, having a glass vessel (of the shape of a flashlight bulb) for holding a few drops of medicament with at least one outlet open to the atmosphere; the vessel has two electrodes and a filament which is wound round a wick which dips in the liquid.

The base portion of the vessel is of a screwed type for attachment to a pocket torch battery. On passing a current, the filament heats the wick and releases the medicated vapours which can be inhaled through the opening of the vessel. The vessel may also be provided with a side outlet. The filament may be omitted, in which case the current is conducted by the absorbent wick itself.

The inventor states that the inhaler can be conveniently carried in the pocket in the manner of a pocket torch. As a new article of manufacture a set consisting of a vaporiser, spare vaporiser bulb, battery and bottle of medicament is claimed.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 18, 1938, at 8.45 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated June 14, 1938.

Present:—Mr. M. K. T. Sandys, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. Beven; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. O. T. Nettelton.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the meeting held on May 21, 1938, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1937 to April 30, 1938, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of work brought up to May 31, 1938.
- Health Officer's report for May, 1938.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May, 1938.
- The reservoir readings for the week ending June 18, 1938.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—

Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during May, 1938.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(1) Petition from Messrs. Wijeyasena Bros. dated June 6, 1938, objecting to the consideration of the tender received from Messrs. The Chettinad Corporation on the ground that it was

received after the time fixed for the receipt of tenders. Mr. Usoof Ismail presented—(2) Petition signed by Mr. P. S. Fernando and several others dated May 30, 1938, suggesting the opening of a cart road through Deyannawela in continuation of the road opened up to the school at the Model Tenements.

Resolved that (1) be considered with the tenders, and (2) be considered by the Works Committee.

4A. Ratwatte Adigar referred to the unsatisfactory electric lighting and the Chairman agreed to ask the Municipal Electrical Engineer for a report.

5. The following motion which stood in the name of the Chairman was with the leave of Council withdrawn in view of the recommendation of the Bogambara Grounds Committee under item 9 (26) of the agenda:—“Whereas the meaning of resolution 5B of November 21, 1936, is obscure, and whereas its present interpretation—under which details of the bookings of the grounds have to be referred to a Committee—has caused much delay and inconvenience to the general public; this Council is of opinion that henceforth the details of bookings should be left to the Chairman, who will consult the Special Committee only if questions of policy are involved. It is also of opinion that the control of the staff should be in the hands of the Chairman and the Works Engineer, subject to any general directions which the Committee may convey to them. The Council is further of opinion that, while it has full confidence in the ability of the Committee to act in its best interests, the ultimate control—particularly as regards finance—should be in its own hands.”

5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved:—“That the Hon. the Minister for Local Administration be approached with a view to secure the services of a Town Planner for Kandy, and to ascertain on what terms his services could be obtained for this Council.” Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—Carried.

6. Report of the Auditor-General on the Council's accounts for the year 1937. Tabled.

Mr. de Silva pointed out that the report indicated that Expenditure was being incurred in excess of Revenue. The Chairman undertook to report on the question.

7. Chairman's memo dated May 20, 1938, on the desirability of appointing two Electrical Inspectors for the Power Station to do work in connection with the new tariff. (E/LX.)

The Chairman moved that in accordance with the advice given by the Chief Engineer and Manager, Electrical Undertakings, one inspector be appointed for the present on a salary of Rs. 900 per annum. Mr. de Silva opposed the motion.

After several other members had offered comments the Council moved into Committee. The Municipal Electrical Engineer was questioned in Committee. He indicated that the charge hitherto was made only on the consumption indicated by the meter, whereas under the new tariff, the charge is based on two factors, viz. :—

- (a) a fixed charge based on the candle power of the lights installed, and
- (b) a charge on the consumption shown by the meter, and unless an officer made frequent inspections of the various installations and changes in candle power noted, proper charges under (a) could not be made.

It was suggested by certain members that this work might be entrusted to the Assistant Municipal Electrical Engineer.

The Council then resumed and the Chairman's motion was put to the House and negatived, the Chairman dissenting.

It was understood that Mr. Beven wished the question to be deferred pending consideration of the Auditor-General's report. The Chairman reserved the right to bring the matter up again when a decision was reached on this report.

8. *Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on April 28, 1938.*

(Item deferred from last General Meeting.)

“To consider the question of employment of a watcher to prevent abuses now prevailing at the Wace Park, and the closure of the park between the hours of 6.30 P.M. and 6 A.M. Recommended (1) the employment of a watcher on Rs. 15 per month, (2) the closure of the park between 7 P.M. and 6 A.M.”

Resolved that the park should be closed between the hours of 7 P.M. and 6 A.M., provided that individuals should be allowed to use it between those hours on receipt of a special permit from the Chairman.

A watcher to be employed on a salary of Rs. 15 a month without quarter.

9. Recommendations of Standing and Special Committees :—

(1) Letter dated February 7, 1938, from Mr. F. J. P. Mudannayake giving notice of an action which Mr. K. Podi Appuhamy intends to institute against the Council for damages. Tabled.

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on May 21, 1938.

(2) To sanction the lease of the vacant rice depot at Deyannawela to Mr. P. S. Seyadu Ibrahim Saibo on a rent of Rs. 18 per mensem.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on May 21, 1938.

(3) To consider the proposal made by the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, for the provision of illuminated notice boards in Ward street warning ‘buses and lorries not to use the section of the street prohibited for such traffic at night. (O 337.)—Recommended vote of Rs. 390 for installation of three boards and Rs. 200 for illuminating them for one year.

(4) To obtain a vote for Rs. 500 for overhauling the two steam rollers. (W/S 26/38.)—Recommended.

(5) To obtain a vote for Rs. 57/25 for providing two “school” sign boards at Katugastota road.—Recommended.

(6) To obtain sanction for the expenditure of Rs. 534 out of the savings on the conservancy vote for replacing the effluent pipe at the Heerasagala Septic Tank and putting the existing shed into order. Recommended transfer of Rs. 534 from Head 6, item 1 for the purpose.

(7) Application from Mr. K. B. Kulatunge, Entomological Inspector, for a loan of Rs. 200 to enable him to purchase a motor vehicle for his work.—Recommended on the same terms as Government repayable in instalments of Rs. 10.

(8) To obtain a vote for Rs. 15 for meeting the wages of substitutes employed at the Free Dispensary in the absence of the Dispenser during the year 1938.—Recommended.

(9) Papers on the subject of cycle allowance to the two peons of the Works Department.—Allowance of Rs. 2.50 each per mensem recommended.

(10) To obtain sanction for a supplementary vote of Rs. 1,960 for the purchase of 35 water meters.—Recommended.

(11) To sanction the payment to Mr. E. N. de Lanerolle of Rs. 1,320 as gratuity and compensation on abolition of his office as Installation Inspector and Plant Recordkeeper.—Recommended.

(12) To obtain sanction for the payment of a commuted pension of Rs. 1,554.15 and a reduced annual pension of Rs. 466.24 to Mr. W. H. Appuhamy, Marketkeeper, who is due to retire from the Municipal service as from July 1, 1938.—Recommended.

(13) Draft of Chairman's letter proposed to be addressed to the Commissioner of Local Government on the subject of financing of the Hunasgiriya Water Scheme.—Recommended that the letter be forwarded.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on May 21, 1938.

- (14) Application from the Manager, Buddhist Girls' College, to put up a two-storeyed vihare at premises Nos. 30-31, Victoria drive. (W/PW 111/38.)—Recommended. Tom-tomming not to be allowed.
- (15) To obtain a vote for Rs. 500 for overhauling the two steam rollers. (W/S 26/38.)—Recommended.
- (16) Papers *re* proposals to regulate pedestrian traffic on the streets in Kandy. (O 609.)—Vote of Rs. 450·30 recommended.
- (17) Applications for water services to—(a) Madawela road 53/1, (b) Peradeniya road 322A, (c) Trincomalee street 91, (d) Trincomalee street 238.—Recommended metered services.
- (18) Application from the District Engineer, Public Works Department, for an $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. connection from the 3-in. main to Government quarters No. 19, Palace square.—Recommended metered supply.
- (19) To obtain sanction for the distribution of the vote of Rs. 3,000 allowed in the budget for cement plastering Kandyan wall of Lake bund and providing ashlar sloping wall for the bund as follows :—Rs. 1,000 for cement plastering. Rs. 2,000 for ashlar sloping wall. Weak mixture of cement plaster (not blue) to conform to colour of present wall to be used for cement plastering.—Recommended type D be adopted for ashlar sloping wall—specification and estimate to be reduced.
- (20) To obtain sanction for a vote of Rs. 608·90 for building a retaining wall in Gregory road.—Recommended.

- (22) Papers *re* the extension of public lighting to a distance of 400 yards along Lady McCallum's drive.—Recommended vote of Rs. 200 under Electricity for installation of lights; and Rs. 246 under General Revenue for current.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Special Committee on the Administration of Bogambara Grounds held on May 27, 1938.

(23) Application from the Rural Cottage Industries Society of Ceylon for the use of Bogambara Grounds for a Grand Carnival and Health, Industries, and Agricultural Exhibition to be held during the next Perahera Season with Chairman's suggestion that the ground be allowed to them from August 10 to 18. The Hon. Secretary of the Society was present.—Recommended that—

- (a) a portion of Bogambara usually allowed for the Industries Pavilion and entertainments together with the portion of land that would be available by the removal of the Toc H. building, and
- (b) the area of the market grounds usually allowed for entertainments, &c., during the Perahera season,

be allowed to the Society for the period August 10 to 18, 1938, with permission to put up structures on an approved plan on payment in advance of a rent of Rs. 2,200 for the period together with a deposit of Rs. 250 against damages to the grounds. All special services that may be rendered by the Council to be paid for extra.

(24) Chairman's memo dated February 28, 1938, suggesting that the concession rate of Rs. 2·50 charged for use of Bogambara for Inter-School Rugby Football matches be extended to the Kandy Rovers Sports Club.—Recommended.

(25) Detailed estimates prepared by the Works Engineer for Rs. 3,000 for the upkeep of Bogambara Grounds.—Recommended.

(26) Chairman's memo dated May 26, 1938, on the subject of control of Bogambara grounds.—Recommended. that the control of staff and bookings for sports be left in the hands of the Chairman subject to a statement of bookings being tabled at each meeting of the Committee.

Resolutions of Council on the recommendations of Standing and Special Committees :—

Resolution on items (1) to (10), (12), (13), (15) to (18), (20) to (22), and (24) to (26).—Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

Resolution on item (11).—Resolved that consideration be deferred in view of the proposed deferment of the date of retirement which involves recomputation of the amount of compensation.

Resolution on item (14).—Mr. de Silva moved that the recommendation be adopted deleting the condition prohibiting tom-tomming.—Mr. Soysa seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that recommendation be accepted including the restriction as regards tom-tomming.—Mr. Nettelton seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and lost by 4 votes to 6. *Ayes*.—The Chairman, Dr. Godlieb, Mr. Beven, Mr. Nettelton. *Noes*.—Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. de Silva, Mr. Soysa, Mr. Wijayatilake, Mr. Ismail, Mr. Marikar.

Mr. de Silva's motion was then declared carried.

Resolution on item (19).—Resolved that consideration be deferred to enable Ratwatte Adigar to consider the proposal and make any alternative suggestion.

Resolution on item (23).—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted, subject to the Market ground being excluded and the Chairman making a proportionate reduction in the rent.

10. To obtain sanction for the lease of a small piece of land acquired for Back Lane Block C and lying behind premises Nos. 20 and 21, Ward street, to Messrs. M. Ismail & Co., at a reduced rent of Rs. 5 per annum for a period of 20 years. (O 681.)—Resolved that the rent be reduced accordingly.

11. Chairman's memorandum dated May 17, 1938, asking for sanction for the appointment of two clerks so as to give relief to other clerks and to maintain the efficiency of the departments.

Resolved that consideration be deferred pending the receipt of the report of the Economy Committee due in a few days time.

12. To obtain sanction for deferring the dates of abolition of the posts of Mr. A. K. Kaimal and Mr. E. N. de Lanerolle as follows to enable the officers to get the benefit of vacation leave available to them prior to retirement :—(a) Mr. A. K. Kaimal deferment of date of abolition of post from June 1 to July 31. (b) Mr. E. N. de Lanerolle deferment of date of abolition of post from June 1 to August 2.—Resolved that deferment be sanctioned accordingly.

13. To obtain sanction for a vote of Rs. 2,000 for purposes of obtaining a proper valuation of the land (625 acres) proposed to be acquired in connection with the Hunasguriya Scheme from the Government Valuer.—Resolved that the vote be allowed.

14. To obtain sanction for a vote of Rs. 1,731·60 for the proposed extension of the Market street Bus Stand.—Resolved that consideration be deferred and the Chairman be asked to make a report as to whether full use is being made of the stand in Railway Approach road.

15. To obtain sanction for a vote of Rs. 2,465·70 for providing quarters for the Playground Caretaker at Mahaiyawa and an office for the Instructor. (D 305.)—Resolved that consideration be deferred for next budget.

16. Tenders received for the laying of the 8-inch main in Peradeniya road, with letter from Messrs. Wijeyesena Bros. objecting to the tender from Messrs. The Chettinad Corporation being considered as it was received after the time fixed for the receipt of tenders. Resolved that fresh tenders be invited for the work.
