GOD SAVE THE KING

BY-LAW.

Chapter XI. of the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Colombo, published in *Gazette* No. 7,799 of August 22, 1930, as amended by by-law published in *Gazette* No. 7,921 of April 29, 1932, is hereby further amended, in by-law 3 thereof under the heading "Eating-houses" sub-heading "I.—Conditions of Issue of Licence", as follows:—

(1) by the substitution for all the words from "That if any food is cooked" to "of being opened", of the following:—

"That the premises include a kitchen with a minimum superficial area of 120 square feet in the case of a new eating-house, or of 80 square feet in the case of an existing eating-house, with an efficient smoke vent, and at least one window capable of being opened"; and

(2) by the addition at the end of that by-law of the following:—

"An existing eating-house in which, after the Fifth day of August, 1938, the business of an eating-house is not carried on for a continuous period exceeding one month shall, if such business is recommenced, be deemed for the purposes of the issue of a licence for the next succeeding year, to be a new eating-house.

In this by-law—

- (a) "new eating-house" means an eating-house kept or established on or after the Fifth day of August, 1938,
(b) "existing eating-house" means an eating-house kept or established before the Fifth day of August, 1938".

Regulations for Munnessaram Festival.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled an Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept in the camp area, and no cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, areated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

Customs Notification (General) No. 38/16.

ORDINANCE NO. 17 OF 1869.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Schedule to Customs Notification (General) 38/2 of January 5, 1938, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,341 of January 7, 1938, and amended by Notifications Nos. 38/8 of March 2, 1938; 38/14 of May 25, 1938; and 38/15 of June 8, 1938; and published in *Gazette* Nos. 8,357 of March 4, 1938; 8,370 of May 27, 1938; and 8,373 of June 10, 1938, respectively, is hereby cancelled in respect of the heading "In Colombo" with effect from June 1, 1938; and the following substituted therefor.

In Colombo.

I. For supervising all or any of the following operations outside the hours of general attendance a commuted charge of Rs. 6 an hour in respect of each ship:—

- (a) Loading or discharging cargo over the ship's side.
- (b) Landing of cargo into any one import warehouse or landing place, one bad order warehouse and one transshipment warehouse; Warehouses T 1 and T 2 being reckoned as one warehouse and Warehouses 5 and 6 if used in conjunction as transshipment warehouses being reckoned as one warehouse.
- (c) Supervision of lighters moored at the appointed quays and containing liquor.
- (d) Receipt of cargo brought for shipment.
- (e) Shipping of cargo including ship's stores.
- (f) Shipping of cargo from any one transshipment warehouse.
- (g) Passing of import or export cargo through the Lake to Harbour Locks.
- (h) Issue of clearance including checking of outward manifest.

Notes.—(1) This charge is not payable by ships which load or discharge nothing except coal, petroleum, or ships stores.

(2) The charge under paragraph I (b) covers only one import, one bad order and one transshipment warehouse or landing place during the period of the application. If an additional warehouse or landing place is used during the period of the application an extra charge under paragraph II will be made.

II. For supervising the landing or shipping of cargo outside the hours of general attendance, into or from any warehouse or landing place used in addition to those specified in item I, an additional charge of Re. 1 an hour in respect of each such additional warehouse or landing place.

III. (1) For supervising the transshipment of cargo direct from one ship to another at any time, a charge of Re. 1 an hour, in addition to the commuted charge payable under paragraph I, for the period for which such commuted charge is payable.

(2) Where the transshipment involves more than 2 ships or if the quantity of cargo to be transhipped exceeds 50 tons, additional Tidewaiters will be employed and an extra charge for each Tidewaiter will be made at the rate of 25 cents an hour.

IV. For supervising the discharge, landing, or shipping of coal or the bunkering of oil outside the hours of general attendance, a charge of Re. 1 an hour.

V. For supervising shipping of ships stores outside the hours of general attendance, in any case where payment is not made under paragraph I, a charge of Re. 1 an hour.

VI. For supervising the landing of petroleum at any time, a charge of 50 cents an hour.

VII. For supervising the removal of cargo from the Customs premises outside the hours of general attendance prescribed in paragraph 2 (b) of the notification under section 7 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869:—

- (a) Frozen produce direct from lighters; cattle, sheep, goats and fumigated plants* .. 75 cents an hour
- (b) Each horse 50 cents
- (c) Each motor car Rs. 2
- (d) All other manifested cargo for each importer taking delivery (a separate charge will be made in respect of each vessel and each warehouse) Rs. 3 an hour

* Overtime charges for the Fumigatorium Inspector and labourer are payable to the Port Commission.

VIII. For supervising the use of the Lake to Harbour Locks outside the hours of general attendance in any case where payment is not made under paragraph I, a charge of 25 cents an hour.

IX. For supervising, outside the hours of general attendance, lighters moored at the appointed quays and containing liquor, in any case where a commuted charge is not levied under item I in respect of the ship concerned, a charge of Re. 1 an hour in respect of each such ship irrespective of the number of lighters used.

X. For issuing clearance outside the hours of general attendance to a ship which clears without taking in any cargo at Colombo, in any case where a commuted charge is not levied under paragraph I. in respect of the ship, a charge of Rs. 3.

Conditions: (1) All applications to work overtime should, if possible, be made before 3 P.M. or on Saturdays before 1 P.M. They must state what work is to be done and what warehouses or other facilities are required.

(2) If notice is given that overtime work is to begin on Saturdays at or after 4 P.M., on Sundays and Custom Holidays at any hour, or on other days at or after 6 P.M., a minimum charge equal to the charge for two hours shall be payable whether or not any work is done, except in the case of charges under paragraphs IV, V, VI, or VII.

(3) Subject to the requirements of condition (2) the application for the services of any Customs Officer outside the hours of general attendance can be cancelled—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of June 3, 1938.*

(2) Considered the question of appointing an additional conservancy labourer for the Dewatte section in Ward No. 4.—Recommended.

(3) Considered what action should be taken with regard to the site acquired by the Council at Weliwatte for the erection of a public latrine.—Recommended (1) that the necessary steps be taken to acquire the adjoining strip of land situated between the fence and the boundary of the present site, as the temple authorities have no objection to the proposed latrine being constructed on the far end of the land adjoining the fence; (2) that the question of selling the remainder of the land be postponed for the present.

(4) Considered a report by the Medical Officer of Health recommending an additional double-bullock scavenging cart for Wards 3 and 4.—Recommended that, with effect from July 1, 1938, an additional double bullock scavenging cart be sanctioned for Wards 3 and 4 and that the necessary supplemental expenditure of Rs. 294 be sanctioned for the hire of bulls and drivers.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of June 3, 1938.*

(2) Applications for water service in respect of the following Government premises:—(a) Office of the Divisional Inspector of Schools; (b) Postmaster's Quarters (Alteration of existing service).—Recommended that consideration be deferred until such time as the Council is in a position to consider new applications for water service.

(3) Considered letter No. G/L. R. L/4,340 from the Government Agent, Southern Province, inquiring whether the Council will provide a sum of Rs. 300 for the construction of a 3-ft. bridge over the Koppe-e'a.—Recommended that the Council do make provision for the necessary expenditure in the Budget for 1939.

(4) Considered the Bacteriological and chemical analyses of the water in Hiyare Reservoir, and the Municipal Engineer's report thereon.—Recommended (1) that the catchment area of the Reservoir be daily cleared of all fallen leaves, branches of trees, and rotten timber at an annual cost of Rs. 350 and that the necessary supplemental expenditure for 1938 be sanctioned; (2) that the Municipal Engineer be instructed to inspect the catchment area and to report whether it is possible to exercise any test check on the inspection rounds of the Overseer; and (3) that the water in the Reservoir be bacteriologically examined again in December, 1938.

(5) Considered up to what amount the Municipal Engineer should be authorized to spend on ordinary maintenance works and repairs.—Recommended that the Municipal Engineer be authorized to incur expenditure on ordinary maintenance works and repairs up to Rs. 100 without reference to the Chairman.

(6) Considered tenders for the construction of two semi-permanent wards at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Dadalla.—Recommended the acceptance of the lowest tender of Y. L. George Silva for Rs. 2,142.38 subject to inquiries being made as regards his suitability.

(7) Considered an estimate of Rs. 55 for building a cement concrete curb round the triangle at the War Memorial.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that the expenditure be met from the Works Contingencies Vote.

(8) Considered a proposal by the Municipal Engineer that the clearing of canals and outlet drains in the town should be done on contract instead of departmentally as hitherto.—Recommended that the work of clearing canals and outlet drains be offered on contract to the present working Kangany at Rs. 2.50 per cube on condition that he continues to employ the present labourers.

(9) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Finance, the draft agreement with Mr. V. B. Sathé, Municipal Engineer.—Recommended that the draft agreement be approved subject to the following alterations and amendments:—(1) determination of the engagement by three months notice on either side, and the deletion of the words "or on paying him one month's salary" (Clause 8). (2) that the Municipal Engineer be allowed to accumulate vacation leave for three years instead of two and that he be granted such full pay vacation leave as may be available at the end of his period of service. Apart from this provision that the ordinary leave regulations should apply (Clause 6). (3) That both on the outward and the return journeys he be allowed 1st class train fare in Ceylon and 2nd class train fare in India for himself, his wife and children (not exceeding three), and reasonable transportation charges on personal effects; and that a clause to this effect be embodied in the agreement; (4) that the Municipal Engineer be not entitled to holiday warrants as in the case of other officers on the permanent establishment.

Resolution.

With regard to item (4) it was resolved the recommendation (1) be adopted, and as regards recommendation (2) and (3) Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment that the matter be referred back to the Works Committee for consideration of the question as to how the organic matter in the Reservoir could be removed. The Chairman seconded—carried.

With regard to item (8) Mr. E. M. Katunaratne moved as an amendment that the present practice be continued till the end of the year and that special provision be made for better supervision of the work. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded—carried by 5 votes to 4.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(c) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of June 3, 1938.

(2) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Municipal Works, the draft agreement with Mr. V. B. Sathé, Municipal Engineer.—Recommended that the draft agreement be approved subject to the following alterations and amendments:—(1) determination of the engagement by three months notice on either side, and the deletion of the words "or on paying him one month's salary" (Clause 8). (2) That the Municipal Engineer be allowed to accumulate vacation leave for three years instead of two and that he be granted such full pay vacation leave as may be available at the end of his period of service. Apart from this provision that the ordinary leave regulations should apply (Clause 6). (3) That both on the outward and return journeys he be allowed 1st class train fare in Ceylon and 2nd class train fare in India for himself, his wife, and children (not exceeding three), and reasonable transportation charges on personal effects; and that a clause to this effect be embodied in the agreement. (4) That the Municipal Engineer be not entitled to holiday warrants as in the case of other officers on the permanent establishment.

(4) Lists of demolished buildings in Wards Nos. 2, 3, 4, and 6.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(5) Considered the salary scale and allowances of the post of Public Health Nurse.—Recommended that the salary should be Rs. 800 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 40 to Rs. 1,200 per annum, and the following allowances:—Rickshaw Rs. 20 per mensem; Uniform Rs. 50 per annum; and Shoes Rs. 16 per annum.

(6) Considered an application from Tax Collector, Arambewala, regarding rate of commission payable in respect of Ward No. 7.—Recommended that, as the revised assessments in Ward No. 7 will not come into force till 1939, the Tax Collector be paid commission for 1938 at the former rate of 6 per cent. in respect of that portion of Ward 7 which falls within the assessment area.

Resolution.

With regard to item (5) the Chairman moved as an amendment that the salary scale of the post of Public Health Nurse should be Rs. 960—Rs. 60—Rs. 1,500 with the allowances as recommended by the Standing Committee—Carried unanimously.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(d) Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of June 3, 1938.

(2) Considered papers relating to the licensing of dangerous and offensive trades.—Recommended (1) that, as the licence attaches to the premises and not to the person, a fresh licence be insisted on, on payment of the prescribed fee, on every occasion on which a licensee shifts his premises: (2) that sundry boutique-keepers who store firewood in small bundles be not required to take out licences under section 212 of the Ordinance.

(3) Considered the question of passing a by-law compelling the owners of cattle to tend and tether their animals.—Recommended that the following draft by-laws be approved and that the necessary steps be taken to add them to Chapter X. of the Council's by-laws dealing with the Prevention of Nuisances and Public Safety:—

- (1) "Every owner or person in charge of cattle shall tie up or pen such cattle at night, and tether or tend them by day."
- (2) "The owners of swine, goats and poultry shall keep them within properly fenced enclosures. Any swine, goat or poultry found trespassing may be shot, but the carcass of any animal so shot, shall be given to the person to whom the animal belonged."

Resolution.

With regard to item (3) Mr. W. Dahanayake objected to the by-law being passed and opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committee. The Chairman explained the necessity for passing the proposed by-laws. Messrs. E. M. Karunaratne and A. C. Mohammado supported the recommendation of the Standing Committee, and after further discussion it was resolved, Mr. W. Dahanayake dissenting, that the draft by-laws be approved subject to the following amendments in by-law (2), viz., the substitution of the word "seized" for the word "shot" and the deletion of the words "but the carcass of any animal so shot shall be given to the person to whom the animal belonged."

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to item (2) was adopted.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayake presented a petition from the stall-holders of the Fruit Market praying for a reduction in the rents. The Chairman said that it would receive consideration.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayake, asked the following questions:—(1) (a) Is it not the fact that at the last General Meeting of the Council it was resolved to postpone the consideration of the suggestion that the Municipal Engineer should keep a register of approved contractors? (b) Contrary to this decision, why did the Municipal Engineer call for applications from those who desired to be "approved contractors"? (c) Has the Municipal Engineer or his Assistant been given permission to deal with contractors privately in their respective bungalows? (d) Will the Chairman please note that I have seen contractors loitering about the private premises of the Municipal Engineer and his Assistant with suitable presents for the master? (e) What steps does the Chairman propose to take to end effectively this reign of corruption in the Municipal Engineer's Department? (2) (a) Did the Chairman on May 26 receive a communication from me to the effect that Mr. Hamilton de Silva was in possession of a key or keys enabling him to gain entrance to the Municipal Engineer's Office, and that this fact was unknown to the Municipal Engineer? (b) Subsequent to this information was a key discovered in the possession of Mr. de Silva? (c) When all keys were handed over to the Municipal Engineer on his assuming duties, was it right on the part of Mr. de Silva to have kept back a single key for his own use, unknown to his superior? (d) Is the Chairman aware that on certain holidays and Sundays Mr. de Silva had borrowed the keys from the Municipal Engineer, thus pretending that he had no key of his own? (e) Why did the Municipal Engineer allow his Assistant to work alone in the office on Sundays and holidays? (f) Why has the information contained in question (d) above been withheld from the Chairman by the Municipal Engineer? (g) Is the Chairman aware that those who gave the information about the secret possession of keys by Mr. de Silva are to-day being roughly treated by the Municipal Engineer, the Inspector of Works, and the Chief Clerk of this Department? (3) (a) For how many days in May did the Inspector of Works, Mr. H. de Silva, obtain sick leave? (b) Has not the Municipal Engineer reported that on several of these days he had seen Mr. de Silva apparently hale and hearty? (c) Has not the Municipal Engineer reported that Mr. de Silva seemed to be shirking work deliberately? Will the Chairman please find out why the Municipal Engineer should have withheld the information contained in (b) and (c) above?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) Yes. (b) On instructions given by me on May 19, 1938, the Municipal Engineer by public notice called for applications from persons who desired to be registered as Contractors under the Council. (c) No. (d) I do not consider this to be a question in terms of by-laws 4 (3) and 9 (d) of Chapter 2 of the Council's by-laws. (e) No steps can be taken in the absence of any proof that a reign of corruption in the Municipal Engineer's Department had begun. (2) (a) Yes. (b) Yes, the key of the entrance gate to the Office was found to be in the possession of Mr. de Silva, and on my instructions this was taken over by the Municipal Engineer on May 26. (c) No. (d) I understand from the Municipal Engineer that Mr. de Silva borrowed the office keys on one occasion, and for one day only, during the Easter holidays for the purpose as stated by Mr. de Silva, of clearing off arrears of work. (e) Because the Municipal Engineer saw no objection to his Assistant working in the office on the occasion referred to for the purpose of clearing off arrears. (f) Because the Municipal Engineer rightly considered it to be a matter within his province. (g) I am not aware of this. (3) (a) For three days. (b) No. (c) No, he merely reported to me verbally on one occasion that Mr. de Silva was not carrying out his duties satisfactorily. (d) Does not arise.

8. Mr. W. Dahanayake asked the permission of Council to withdraw the following motions which stood in his name on the ground that the matters referred to therein were still pending:—(1) This Council is of opinion that the inquiry held by the Chairman on the 7th instant was incomplete and unsatisfactory, inasmuch as the Chairman overlooked the serious allegation contained in the following paragraph of the petition:—"We also wish to state that the rates submitted by the six favoured contractors were hatched together in conference by Mr. de Silva and his six henchmen. Each of these six was not allowed to decide upon the rates as he liked. They were all together on a certain date, of which we have proof, and inside a room in Mr. de Silva's bungalow, inflated rates were decided upon. When a certain figure was decided upon, the other five contractors made a note of it and quoted a higher figure. Acting thus in collusion each helping the other under the able guidance of the Acting Engineer, your Honours can see for yourselves how well the ring has divided up the work." (2) That all works involving an expenditure not exceeding Rs. 1,000, which at present are carried out by a so-called departmental system that is open to corruption, be carried out in future through a system of tenders that is open to all.

Permission having been granted the motions were accordingly withdrawn.

9. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayake moved:—(1) Instead of enforcing straight away all the anti-Plague regulations on grain boutiques, a step which will lead to the utter ruination of many boutique-keepers, that regulation 17 alone be enforced to start with, giving the boutique-keepers six months' time to comply with this demand. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded.

Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya supported the motion.

Mr. E. M. Karunaratne also supported the motion, but suggested that it be amended by the deletion of the words "a step which will lead to the utter ruination of many boutique-keepers".

The mover and the seconder agreed to the suggestion and the motion was accordingly amended.

The Chairman explained the position and stated that he was quite prepared to give reasonable time to the owners of grain boutiques to comply with the regulations.

The motion, as amended, was then put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 7 against.

(2) That the special licence for the hawking of fish be issued in future without charging a fee. The Chairman seconded—carried.

(3) That the special licence to hawkers of fish be issued to them direct and not to the stall-holders. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded.

The Chairman explained that according to the present practice, which was based on the resolution of 1931, there was no restriction in the number of permits issued provided that application for them was made by a licensed stall-holder of the Fish Market. If this practice was departed from, there would be unrestricted hawking of fish in the town, and this was not desirable.

The motion was then put to the Meeting, and declared lost, 2 voting for and 8 against.

10. Pursuant to notice Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya moved:—That provision be made in the Budget for 1939 to establish a Vagrants' Home. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded.

Mr. W. Dahanayake said he would be in favour of the motion if it did not definitely commit the Council to any expenditure.

Mr. J. E. Perera supported the motion but suggested that it be amended to read as follows:—"That provision for a Vagrants' Home be considered in framing the Budget for 1939."

The Chairman said the amendment was not necessary because it was understood that the motion was being considered in that light. He also agreed with the mover that the establishment of a Vagrants' Home in Galle was an urgent need.

The mover replied.

The motion was then put to the Meeting and carried unanimously.

11. To sanction the appointment of ten temporary clerks instead of six in connection with the preparation of the new lists of Voters and Councillors under Ordinance, No. 60 of 1935.—Sanctioned.

12. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on Friday, July 22, 1938, at 2.30 P.M.

Colombo Commercial Co., Ltd., and Andrew Young.

Improved apparatus for grading manufactured or partially manufactured tea leaf or other similar substances.

Abstract.—The object of this invention is to prevent "greying" of tea due to the rubbing action that takes place in the sieves. According to the invention, a main sieve is hinged at its upper end to a gantry, and is disposed at an angle (about 25°) to the horizontal. The lower end is submitted to a series of jerks from a multifaced cam. Tea thrown up in a direction substantially normal to the sieve, returns to a point lower down in the sieve, without undergoing any abrasive action. The angle of the sieve is adjustable. Supplementary sieves, whose inclination is adjustable with respect to the main sieve, are hung by links to the underside of the main sieve, so as to further grade the tea and deliver it to suitable bins. Material is fed to the tray from a hopper mounted on the gantry provided with an adjustable shutter: the construction of the gantry is sufficiently light to enable some of the vibratory motion to be imparted to the hopper: thus any tendency for the leaf to stick in the hopper is prevented.

Callender's Cable and Construction Co., Ltd., and Archibald Milne Hamilton.

Improvements in sliding doors.

Abstract.—The invention relates to sliding doors for large sheds (aeroplane hangars and the like). It is usual in such cases to provide closing doors in sections with runways on top and guide rails at bottom, each section on either side of shed moving in a separate runway. The essential feature of the present invention lies in providing on each runway a set consisting of one wide door and two narrow sliding doors, so that in the folded position the narrower sections slide behind the wide section. The vertical frame members for the wide sections are made rather deep and are located away from the sides of the door (i.e. the door overhangs its supports), the smaller frame members of the narrower sections are thus enabled to pass behind the overhanging portions of the main sections.

By way of illustration are shown four sets of doors as above described running on runways and rails laid in two parallel planes (two sets on each side of the hangar). The runways support the sets of doors which close the end portions of the hangar are not continuous throughout the length of hangar.

The inventor states that considerable economy of space can be achieved by the arrangement described.

Improvements relating to vacuum brake apparatus for railway and like vehicles.

Abstract.—The invention relates to an improved vacuum brake control fitting characterised by the feature that when air is admitted into the train pipe to make a brake application the increase of pressure acting on one side of a diaphragm causes it to move and open a spring loaded valve which puts the brake cylinder directly in communication with air; but when the pressure in the brake cylinder, which acts on the other side of the same diaphragm rises to a certain value dependent on the pressure in the train pipe no further air admission takes place. Thus the strength of brake application is governed to the pressure in train pipe, and graduated application of the brakes can be effected.

A second essential feature is the provision of a reserve reservoir which is continuously under the exhausting action of the train pipe and which is put in communication with the brake cylinder when it is desired to recreate the vacuum quickly after a brake application. This is effected by the above-mentioned diaphragm moving in the opposite direction and opening a valve which puts the reserve reservoir in connection with the brake cylinder *via* a supplementary diaphragm controlled valve.

This latter valve is controlled by atmospheric pressure on one side and the pressure in the brake cylinder assisted by spring pressure on the other. When the degree of vacuum has fallen to a predetermined value in the brake cylinder the valve closes thereby preventing excessive vacuum being created in the brake cylinder. No relief valve is necessary. There are six claims and one sheet of drawings.

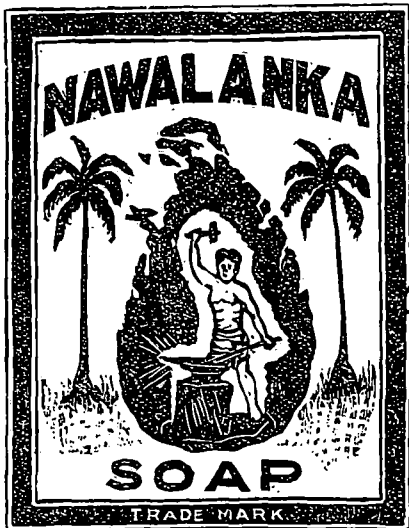
