THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE,
No. 9 OF 1924.

RULE made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 95 of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULE.

The Rules of Criminal Procedure for Village Tribunals and Village Committees published in *Gazette* No. 7,568 of February 18, 1927, as amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,269 of January 29, 1937, are hereby further amended as follows :—

(1) by the substitution, for rules 31, 34, and 36 respectively, of the following new rules :—

" 31. Where (a) a defendant or witness is brought up before a President or Chairman upon a warrant of arrest; or (b) a complainant or defendant has been sentenced to fine, and the President or Chairman thinks fit to allow him time to pay the fine; or (c) the offence disclosed appears to be of a serious nature, information of which should be laid before a Police Magistrate, the President or Chairman may require such person to enter into a bond or recognizance substantially in the Form "D" in Schedule I., with or without sureties at the discretion of such President or Chairman—

- (1) to appear on a certain date before the Village Tribunal or Village Committee;
- (2) to pay the fine on the date fixed for such payment; or
- (3) to appear before such Magistrate within the period fixed in such recognizance.

The amount of such recognizance shall not exceed Rs. 50.

34. (1) The warrant referred to in section 80 (2) of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, shall be substantially in the Form "G" in Schedule I.

(2) It shall be lawful for the President or Chairman, at his discretion, to issue either a summons or a warrant, in any case where it is necessary to secure the attendance, before the President or Chairman, of any person bound by a bond referred to in section 80 of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, in order that such person may be sentenced to imprisonment under subsection (4) of that section.

36. When an appeal has been preferred either under section 84 (1) or under section 87 (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, against any decision, order or sentence of a Village Tribunal or Committee or of a Government Agent, such appeal shall not stay the execution of such decision, order or sentence unless the party appealing enters into a bond or recognizance, substantially in the Form "D" in Schedule I., with or without sureties as the President or Chairman may order, conditioned to appear before the Tribunal or Committee on a date to be notified to him by the President or Chairman by written notice served in the manner prescribed for service of summons, and to abide the order made in such appeal. The amount of such recognizance shall in no case exceed Rs. 50. It shall also be lawful for the President or Chairman after the order in appeal has been made, to issue a warrant to compel the appearance of the party appealing, in order that the sentence imposed on him may be carried out; and

(2) by the substitution, for Form "G" set out in Schedule I. of the following new Form :—

REGULATIONS made by the Governor under Article 23 (4) of the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927, as last amended by the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1937.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Customs) Regulations, 1938, and shall come into force on the 12th day of August, 1938. Short title and commencement.
2. Nothing in these regulations shall extend to the Maldivé Islands. Exclusion of Maldivé Islands from operation of regulations.
3. The Ordinances and provisions of Ordinances specified in column I. of the First Schedule and the rules, regulations, and rates for the time being in force under the said Ordinances and provisions of Ordinances shall (except to the extent specified in column II. of the First Schedule and except as otherwise expressly provided) be deemed, so far as the same are applicable, to apply, with any modifications which may be necessary and not inconsistent with these regulations or with the Convention, to aircraft arriving in and departing from Ceylon; and the words "import", "re-import", "export", and "re-export", with their grammatical variations and cognate expressions, wherever occurring in the Ordinances and provisions of Ordinances specified in column I. of the First Schedule and in the rules and regulations for the time being in force under the said Ordinances and provisions of Ordinances (except in those provisions of the said Ordinances and in those rules and regulations which are specified in column II. of the First Schedule or unless the context otherwise requires) shall be deemed to include respectively the meanings import by air, re-import by air, export by air, and re-export by air. Ordinances relating to customs, and rules, &c., in force thereunder, to be deemed to apply to aircraft.
4. In the Ordinances and provisions of Ordinances specified in column I. of the First Schedule and in the rules and regulations for the time being in force under the said Ordinances and provisions of Ordinances (except in those provisions of the said Ordinances and in those rules and regulations which are specified in column II. of the First Schedule or unless the context otherwise requires)— Interpretation in respect of aircraft of Ordinances, &c., relating to customs.
 - (a) except in Schedule B to the Customs Ordinance, and in any resolution for the time being in force duly passed and having effect under section 11 of that Ordinance, a reference to a ship, a vessel, or a steamer shall be deemed to include a reference to an aircraft;
 - (b) a reference to a mail steamer shall be deemed to include a reference to an aircraft carrying mails;
 - (c) a reference to the master of a ship, vessel, or steamer shall be deemed to include a reference to the person having for the time being control or charge of an aircraft;
 - (d) the word and expressions "name", "name, country, and tonnage", and "name and tonnage" shall severally be deemed to mean, in reference to an aircraft, the nationality and registration marks of such aircraft;
 - (e) the expression "port of registry" shall be deemed to mean, in reference to an aircraft, the Registry or Sub-Registry at which such aircraft is registered;
 - (f) the expression "certificate of registry" shall be deemed to mean, in reference to an aircraft, the certificate of registration of such aircraft;
 - (g) the expression "tackle, apparel, and furniture" shall be deemed to mean, in reference to an aircraft, the equipment of such aircraft;
 - (h) the expression "in ballast" shall be deemed to mean, in reference to an aircraft, not carrying goods;
 - (i) a reference to a voyage shall be deemed to include a reference to a journey made by an aircraft;
 - (j) a reference to a port or harbour, in respect of a place situated in Ceylon, shall be deemed to include a reference to a customs aerodrome, and in respect of a place situated elsewhere than in Ceylon shall be deemed to include a reference to any place from or for which an aircraft arriving in or departing from Ceylon arrives or departs;
 - (k) a reference to a wharf or to a quay or to a legal quay shall be deemed to include a reference to a customs examination station;
 - (l) a reference to a passenger jetty or to a Baggage Office or to a Baggage Office at a Passenger Jetty shall be deemed to include a reference to any portion of a customs examination station which is used for the examination of passengers' baggage;

- (m) a reference to a custom house shall be deemed to include a reference to any place for the transaction of customs business at a customs aerodrome ;
- (n) the words " ship ", " unship ", " re-ship ", and " tranship ", with their grammatical variations and cognate expressions shall be deemed to include respectively the meanings load into an aircraft, unload from an aircraft, re-load into an aircraft, and transfer from one aircraft to another or in either direction between an aircraft and some other vessel ;
- (o) the word " land ", with its grammatical variations and cognate expressions, shall, in reference to goods, be deemed to include the meanings take out of, and pass out from, an aircraft, and in reference to persons be deemed to include the meaning descend to the ground from an aircraft ; and the word " re-land ", with its grammatical variations and cognate expressions, shall be construed accordingly ;
- (p) " goods " shall be deemed to include aircraft imported by flight.

Application to aircraft of prohibitions and restrictions of importations and exportations.

5. For the purpose of the application to aircraft arriving in or departing from Ceylon of section 11A of the Customs Ordinance and of Schedule C to the said Ordinance, in every Ordinance and legal order from time to time in force whereby, and in every rule, regulation, notification, proclamation, and order made or issued under any such Ordinance or legal order and from time to time in force whereby, the importation into, or exportation from, Ceylon of any article is prohibited or restricted—

- (a) the words " import " and " export ", with their grammatical variations and cognate expressions, shall be deemed to include respectively the meanings import by air and export by air ;
- (b) a reference to a ship or to a vessel (unless the context otherwise requires) shall be deemed to include a reference to an aircraft ;
- (c) a reference to the master of a ship or of a vessel shall be deemed to include a reference to the person having for the time being control or charge of an aircraft ;
- (d) a reference to the name of a ship shall be deemed to include a reference to the nationality and registration marks of an aircraft ;
- (e) a reference to a voyage shall be deemed to include a reference to a journey made by an aircraft ;
- (f) the word " land ", with its grammatical variations and cognate expressions, shall be deemed to include the meanings take out of, and pass out from, an aircraft ;
- (g) the words " ship ", " unship ", and " tranship ", with their grammatical variations and cognate expressions, shall be deemed to include respectively the meanings load into an aircraft, unload from an aircraft, and transfer from one aircraft to another or in either direction between an aircraft and some other vessel ;
- (h) a reference to a port, in respect of a place situated in Ceylon, shall be deemed to include a reference to a customs aerodrome, and in respect of a place situated elsewhere than in Ceylon shall be deemed to include a reference to any place from or for which an aircraft arriving in or departing from Ceylon arrives or departs.

Application to aircraft of section 17A of the Customs Ordinance.

6. The word " dues " in section 17A of the Customs Ordinance shall be deemed to include any charges payable to the Government of Ceylon or to any person on account of the landing, stay, or housing at a customs aerodrome of any aircraft arriving in or departing from Ceylon ; and for the purpose of the said section such charges shall be deemed to have become payable under the Customs Ordinance, and the expression " amount due to the Crown " in the said section shall be deemed to include any such charges payable to any person.

Application to aircraft of sections 21, 39, 47A and 52 of the Customs Ordinance.

7. (1) (a) For the purpose of complying with the provisions of section 21 of the Customs Ordinance, the person in charge of an aircraft arriving at any customs aerodrome shall in lieu of the report required to be made under that section—

- (i.) produce the journey log-book of the aircraft to the Collector for inspection ;
- (ii.) deliver to the Collector the manifest of the goods and supplies carried on the aircraft ; and
- (iii.) deliver to the Collector a list in duplicate of the names of the passengers carried on the aircraft and of their baggage.

(b) For the purpose of complying with the provisions of section 39 of the Customs Ordinance the person entering inwards any goods imported on an aircraft shall deliver to the Collector a customs declaration signed by the consignor of the goods ; every such declaration shall be deemed to be a bill of entry delivered under that section and the provisions of that section shall apply accordingly.

(2) (a) For the purpose of complying with the provisions of section 47A of the Customs Ordinance the consignor of any goods intended for exportation on an aircraft shall deliver to the Collector

a customs declaration signed by him; every such declaration shall be deemed to be a bill of entry delivered under that section and the provisions of that section shall apply accordingly.

(b) For the purpose of complying with the provisions of section 52 of the Customs Ordinance the person in charge of an aircraft departing from a customs aerodrome shall in lieu of the content required to be delivered under that section—

- (i.) deliver to the Collector the manifest of the goods and supplies carried on the aircraft; and
- (ii.) deliver to the Collector a list in duplicate of the names of the passengers carried on the aircraft and of their baggage.

(c) Where the provisions of section 52 of the Customs Ordinance as modified by paragraph (b) are complied with, the Collector shall, in lieu of giving the certificate of clearance referred to in that section, sign the journey log-book of the aircraft and the manifest of the goods and supplies carried on the aircraft and such signature shall for the purpose of that section be deemed to be a clearance.

(3) Every manifest and declaration required to be delivered under this regulation shall be substantially in Form 1 and Form 2 respectively, set out in the Second Schedule.

8. For the purpose of the application to aircraft arriving in or departing from Ceylon of section 29 of the Customs Ordinance, the period which shall be allowed for the discharge of the import cargoes of such aircraft shall, notwithstanding anything contained in the said section, be twenty-four hours.

Application to aircraft of section 29 of the Customs Ordinance.

9. For the purpose of the application to aircraft arriving in or departing from Ceylon of the provisions of section 85 of the Customs Ordinance, the Governor may by Proclamation published in the *Gazette* appoint any aerodrome to a customs aerodrome and declare the limits thereof, and may appoint proper places within such aerodromes to be customs examination stations for the lading and unloading of goods and declare the bounds and extent of such stations.

Application to aircraft of section 85 of the Customs Ordinance.

10. The expression "port dues" in section 100 of the Customs Ordinance shall, subject to the provisions of the said section, be deemed to include any charges payable to the Government of Ceylon or to any person on account of the landing, stay, or housing at a customs aerodrome of any aircraft arriving in or departing from Ceylon, and the owner or person in charge of an aircraft shall, for the purpose of the said section, be deemed to be liable to such charges in respect thereof under the Customs Ordinance.

Application to aircraft of section 100 of the Customs Ordinance.

11. (1) An aircraft entering Ceylon on any journey from a place out of Ceylon shall not land in Ceylon for the first time in the course of such journey at any place other than a customs aerodrome:

Prohibition of landing or departure except at or from customs aerodrome.

Provided that, if by reason of accident, stress of weather, or other unavoidable cause an aircraft entering Ceylon as aforesaid lands at any place other than a customs aerodrome, the person in charge of the aircraft shall forthwith report to an officer of customs or police officer, and shall on demand produce to such officer the log-book belonging to the aircraft and shall not allow any goods to be unloaded therefrom without the consent of an officer of customs, and no passenger thereof shall leave the immediate vicinity without the consent of an officer of customs or police officer; and if such place of landing shall be an aerodrome, the person in charge of the aircraft shall forthwith report the arrival of the aircraft and the place whence it came to the proprietor of the aerodrome, who shall forthwith report the arrival of the aircraft to an officer of customs, and shall not allow any goods to be unloaded therefrom or any passenger thereof to leave the aerodrome without the consent of such officer.

(2) No aircraft shall fly from Ceylon to any place out of Ceylon unless its place of final departure in Ceylon is a customs aerodrome:

Provided that where an aircraft, after departing from a customs aerodrome in Ceylon for a place out of Ceylon, is compelled by reason of accident, stress of weather, or other unavoidable cause again to land in Ceylon at a place other than a customs aerodrome, the person in charge of such aircraft shall forthwith report such landing to the Collector at the nearest port or to the Principal Collector of Customs; and such Collector or the Principal Collector of Customs, as the case may be, may, if he thinks fit, permit such aircraft, by an entry signed by him in the journey log-book belonging to the aircraft, to proceed to its destination out of Ceylon.

12. Where it appears to any person authorized in writing by the Governor for the purpose that any aircraft is intended or likely to depart from any place in contravention of the provisions of regulation 11 (2) or of the provisions of section 52 of the Customs Ordinance as modified by regulation 7 (2), such person may give such directions and take such steps by way of detention of the aircraft or otherwise in relation thereto as appear to him to be necessary in order to prevent the flight; and any person

Power to detain aircraft.

who obstructs such authorized person in the exercise of the powers conferred on him by this regulation or fails to comply with any such direction shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of these regulations.

Interpretation.

13. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “ Ceylon ” includes the Island of Ceylon and the territorial waters thereof ;
- “ customs aerodrome ” means an aerodrome appointed to be a customs aerodrome by Proclamation under section 85 of the Customs Ordinance as modified by regulation 9 ;
- “ customs examination station ” means a place appointed to be a customs examination station by Proclamation under section 85 of the Customs Ordinance as modified by regulation 9 ;
- “ police officer ” includes every member of the regular police force of Ceylon ;
- “ proprietor of an aerodrome ” includes any person responsible for the management thereof ;
- “ Schedule ” means a schedule to these regulations ;
- “ the Customs Ordinance ” means Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, intituled “ An Ordinance for the General Regulation of Customs in the Island of Ceylon ” ;
- “ the Convention ” means the convention for determining by a common agreement certain uniform rules with respect to international air navigation, signed on behalf of His Majesty in Paris on the thirteenth day of October, 1919.

 - (6) To receive, purchase, hire, repair, alter, use, sell and let aircraft, and such things as are necessary to give effect to any of the objects above set out.
 - (7) To promote, hold, manage and conduct aviation meetings, athletic sports, tournaments, exhibitions and entertainments and otherwise utilise the property of the Club and develop the social aspects of the Club and therefore to give and contribute towards Prizes, Cups, Stake and other Rewards.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE AERO CLUB OF CEYLON, LIMITED.

4. The Club shall consist of Founder, Life, Flying, Ordinary, Honorary, Temporary, and Absentee Members the number of whom shall be determined from time to time by the Committee. Ladies shall be eligible as members.

5. No member who is in receipt of remuneration in respect of service rendered to the Club shall be eligible to serve as President or Vice-President.

6. Every candidate for election as a life, flying or ordinary member shall be proposed by one Flying Member and seconded by another Flying Member. Every proposal shall be made by a letter addressed to the Secretary, which shall be signed by the proposer and the seconder and shall give the full name and address of the candidate and his profession, rank, business or occupation. If a candidate has been formally rejected, suspended or expelled or is in debt to any other Flying Club the fact shall be stated in the proposal. A remittance covering entrance fee and the full prescribed subscription shall be tendered with the proposal.

7. Every person complying with the provisions of Article 6 shall be duly elected a member of the Aero Club of Ceylon, Ltd., except that if a candidate has been formally rejected, suspended or expelled by any other Flying Club or is in debt to any other Flying Club, such a candidate shall not be elected unless his proposal is supported by a majority of committee members present at the next committee meeting subsequent to the proposal being received by the Secretary.

8. Notice in writing of his election shall be sent through the post to each new member by the Secretary, together with a copy of the Rules and official receipt for entrance fee and subscription paid.

FOUNDER MEMBERS.

9. The first 120 members (or the survivors thereof) shall be Founder Members and shall have the same voting powers as Flying Members. The following are the Founder Members :—

LIFE MEMBERS.

10. Any member may with the approval of the Committee, either upon his election or at any time thereafter, compound by one payment for all his future subscriptions and shall thereupon become a Life Member and be entitled to all privileges of flying membership for life, unless he shall cease to be a member under Rule No. 30 or be suspended, required to resign or expelled under Rule No. 31. The compounding fee shall be Rs. 250 which fee shall, in the case of a Member becoming a Life Member on his election, include the entrance fee and subscription payable on election.

11. Firms, whether incorporated or not, may, on payment of the sum of Rs. 400 and with the sanction of the Committee, have the right of nominating one member of their staff to full flying membership of the Club. The individual nominated may be changed as often as the firm considers desirable but only one individual may carry the firm's nomination at any one time. Such individual shall have the same rights and obligations as a Flying Member of the Club except that he shall not be called upon to pay an entrance fee or yearly subscription.

FLYING MEMBERS.

12. A Flying Member shall be entitled to two votes and shall be eligible to hold any office in the Club provided that the provisions of Articles 38 and 39 are complied with.

Flying Members shall be entitled to receive instruction in flying and they shall be allowed to fly solo and to pilot an aircraft carrying passengers, subject to the Rules, Regulations, and By-laws of the Club and subject to obligations arising under the Air Navigation Act, 1920, Air Navigation Act, 1936, as the same have been applied to Ceylon by "The Colonial Air Navigation (Application of Acts) Order, 1937" and also any orders, directions, and regulations issued thereunder, being observed and complied with.

ORDINARY MEMBERS.

13. The number of Ordinary Members may be limited by the Committee at any time. An Ordinary Member shall be entitled to one vote but shall not be entitled to hold any office in the Club (except as a member of the Committee of the Club or a sub-Committee subject to Articles 38 and 39) nor to fly either alone or as a pupil. Ordinary Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of Flying Members on payment of the dues prescribed by the Rules.

HONORARY AND TEMPORARY MEMBERS.

14. The Committee may elect Honorary Members under special circumstances and without ballot.

15. Candidates for Honorary Membership must be proposed and seconded by members of the Committee.

16. Honorary Members shall not be called upon to pay any subscriptions.

17. The Committee shall have power to elect Temporary Members on such terms as they may determine for any period not exceeding three months. Every candidate for temporary membership shall be proposed in writing by one Flying Member and seconded by another Flying Member and the proposer shall furnish the Committee with such information as they may require regarding the candidate. The Committee shall consider the proposal for election at their first meeting held after the expiration of forty-eight hours from the receipt by the Secretary of such proposal and information.

18. Temporary Members shall pay such subscriptions as the Committee may determine, which shall not be less than a proportionate amount of the subscriptions payable by a Flying Member.

19. Honorary and Temporary Members shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club, and be subject to the Rules of the Club as if they were members, except that they shall not be qualified to be office-bearers of the Club or Members of the Committee, or to attend or vote at any Meeting.

20. Absentee Members shall pay a subscription of Rs. 5 for any continuous period of absence from the Island exceeding six months, provided that notice of their intention to be absent has been given to the Secretary in writing. The annual subscription of an absentee member shall be suspended during such absence.

21. No compounding of the unexpired portion of a subscription already paid for the purpose of a refund shall be entertained by the Committee.

REGISTER OF MEMBERS.

22. A list or register shall be kept in which shall be set forth the names and addresses of all members for the time being and in which all changes in membership from time to time taking place shall be recorded.

ENTRANCE FEES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.

23. Entrance fee and subscription :—

24. All entrance fees and subscriptions, shall be payable on election and subsequent annual subscriptions shall be paid annually in advance on the first day of the month in every year during which the application for membership was made, subject to the provision that an extension will be granted according to Rule 20.

25. If the subscription of any member is not paid within two months of its due date, then the Committee shall be competent to post that member's name on the Club notice board and if the subscription remains unpaid for a further month such member shall cease to be a member unless he excuses his default to the satisfaction of the Committee. The member shall, however, remain liable for any subscription and other monies then due.

26. No member whose subscription is in arrear shall be allowed to fly either as a passenger, pupil or pilot or to vote at any meeting.

27. Every member shall be governed by the Articles and all the Rules, Regulations and By-laws of the Club for the time being in force, and on that condition alone is entitled to enjoy the advantages and privileges of the Club.

28. A member may be required to sign, and must do so if and when called upon, such forms of agreement and or indemnity as may be adopted by the Club from time to time.

RESIGNATIONS.

29. Any member wishing to resign his membership shall give notice in writing of his desire to the Secretary before the first day of the month in which his subscription falls due, failing which he shall be liable to pay his subscription for the following year.

BANKRUPTCY.

30. If a member shall be adjudicated insolvent or shall make a composition or enter into a scheme of arrangement for the benefit of his creditors, he shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Club but the Committee shall have power, in exceptional cases, to reinstate him without entrance fee.

SUSPENSION AND EXPULSION.

31. In the event of any member being charged with conduct which the Committee may consider ungentlemanly or prejudicial to the interest of the Club, or in the event of a grave breach by a member of the Rules, Regulations or By-Laws of the Club, or of conduct on the part of a member rendering it, in the opinion of the Committee, desirable that he should cease to be a member, he shall be called before the Committee and failing a satisfactory explanation shall be liable to be cautioned, suspended, required to resign or expelled, as the Committee may determine, and a statement may be inserted in the Official Organ of the Club of the decision of the Committee. The penalties under this article shall be in addition to any penalties incurred or inflicted under the Competition Rules for the time being in force.

32. The Committee shall be specially summoned to consider questions under the last preceding Article, and notice shall be sent to the member whose conduct is in question at least seven days prior to the meeting. Before coming to a decision the Committee shall hear any explanation which such member may desire to give, together with any evidence in support of such explanation tendered by him.

33. No member shall be cautioned, suspended, required to resign or expelled under Articles 31 and 32 unless the resolution is supported by ten members of the Committee Members present or two thirds of the members of the Committee present whichever is the higher.

34. The quorum for a Committee Meeting called under Article 32 shall be twelve or two thirds of the full number of the Committee whichever is the higher.

OFFICE BEARERS.

35. The following Office-bearers shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting and these offices shall be held by the elected members for one year immediately following their election, or until their successors have been duly elected.—(1) President, (2) Vice-Presidents (not exceeding 4 in number) (3) Honorary Secretary, (4) Honorary Treasurer.

36. The offices of Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer may be held by one member with the approval of the Annual General Meeting.

37. The Committee shall have power to fill such vacancies as may occur amongst the Office-bearers or amongst their own numbers, at their discretion, but such members shall only hold office for the unexpired term of the members they replace.

MANAGEMENT OF THE CLUB.

38. The management of the Club shall be vested in a Committee which shall consist of the Office-bearers, who shall be ex-officio members of all Committees, the Director of Civil Aviation or his nominee, and such additional members as shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting to a total not exceeding eighteen in number for the whole Committee inclusive of the Office-bearers.

39. The Committee shall contain at least fourteen Flying Members and at least nine Ceylonese members.

40. Members elected to the Committee shall hold office for one year immediately following their election, or until the next Annual General Meeting when they shall retire and be eligible for re-election.

41. The Committee shall meet at such times as it may arrange, and a special meeting may be summoned at any time by the President. A special meeting shall be called by the Secretary on requisition signed by one-third of the members of the Committee or in a case of emergency by the Secretary in consultation with the President or if he is not available with one of the Vice-Presidents.

42. Seven day's notice shall be given of a Committee Meeting, counting from the date of posting, except in the case of an emergency or when it is considered expedient in the interest of the Club by the President or Vice-President to hold a meeting without delay, when the notice shall be reduced to a minimum of three days, counting from the date of posting.

43. Six members of the Committee shall form a quorum for the transaction of business except as provided in Article 34.

44. In the case of an equality of votes at a meeting of any Committee, the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

45. The President, or in his absence, a Vice-President shall preside at all Committee Meetings. In the unavoidable absence of either of them, the meeting shall elect a Chairman from amongst members of the Committee.

POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

46. The Committee in addition to the powers by these Articles expressly conferred upon them may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Club and are not by law expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Club in General Meeting.

47. Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by Article 46 thereof, the Committee shall have power:—

- (1) To make such regulations in respect of the control of funds and of the property of the Club as they may think proper.
- (2) To appoint members to be Stewards of the Club for that year.
- (3) To appoint from time to time such number of persons whether members of the Club or not as the General Committee shall consider necessary or desirable to be Stewards at Flying Meetings held by the Club and to determine their powers and duties and to revoke any such appointment at pleasure.
- (4) To defray all expenses in connection with Flying Meetings held by the Club and in connection with the Club and its properties, aerodromes, moorings, landing grounds used by the Club, stands and enclosures, and to provide such prizes as they may think fit.
- (5) To appoint an Executive Committee or Sub-Committees and such Executive Committee or Sub-Committees may be permanent or temporary or for special purposes as the Committee may determine.
- (6) To delegate, subject to such conditions as they think fit, any of their powers to the Executive Committee or Sub-Committees and to make, vary and repeal by-laws or rules for the regulation of the proceedings of the Executive Committee or Sub-Committees.
- (7) To make, vary and repeal by-laws or rules for the regulation of the business of the Club and the meetings to be held by the Club and of the Officers or servants or members of the Club or any department or section of the Club.
- (8) To pay the costs, charges, and expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment, and registration of the Club.
- (9) From time to time to appoint and at their pleasure to remove or suspend one or more Stipendiary Stewards and such Secretaries, Officers, Clerks, Agents, and Servants, for permanent, temporary, or special services as they may from time to time think fit, and to determine their powers and duties and to fix their salaries, wages, commission or emoluments, and to require security in such instances and to such amounts as they may think fit.
- (10) To purchase aeroplanes and accessories, and all articles any things which may from time to time be required by the Club, and to pay for the same in cash or otherwise as may be deemed expedient and to repair the same.
- (11) To purchase, take on lease, or licence, or otherwise acquire and land, buildings, houses, or other immovable property as may be required or deemed expedient for the purposes of the Club and to manage the same.
- (12) To undertake on behalf of the Club the payment of all rent, premiums, and licence moneys and the performance of all covenants, conditions, and agreements contained in or reserved by any deed or contract to which the Club may be a party, or which may have been assigned to the Club, to insure and keep insured, if deemed expedient, all or any of the buildings, articles, or other property of the Club, to insure against the consequential loss through accident or fire of the Club's revenue

and or standing charges, to execute all deeds, agreements, contracts, receipts, and other documents that may be necessary or expedient, for the purposes of the Club.

- (13) To appoint any person or persons, company or corporation to accept and hold in trust for the Club any property belonging to the Club or in which it is interested, or for any other purpose, and to execute and do all such deeds, acts, and things as may be requisite in relation to any such trust and to provide for the remuneration of such trustees.
- (14) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, and abandon any legal proceedings by or against the Club, its officers and servants or otherwise concerning the business affairs of the Club and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to the Club and to compromise any claims and demands by or against the Club.
- (15) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Club to arbitration and to observe and perform the awards.
- (16) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Club and for the claims and demands of the Club.
- (17) To determine the manner in which bills, notes, receipts, acceptances, endorsements, cheques, releases, contracts, and documents shall be signed or executed by or on behalf of the Club.
- (18) To execute in the name and on behalf of the Club in favour of any member of the Committee or other person who may incur or be about to incur any personal liability for the benefit of the Club, such mortgage of the Club's property (present and future) as they may think fit and any such mortgage may contain a power of sale and such other powers, covenants and provisions as shall be agreed upon.
- (19) To establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of associations, institutions, funds or trusts, calculated to benefit employees of the Club or the dependants or connections of such persons and to grant pensions and allowances and to make payments towards insurance.
- (20) To invest and deal with any of the moneys of the Club not immediately required for the purposes thereof upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit and from time to time to vary or realize such investments.
- (21) From time to time at their discretion to raise or borrow any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Club and to secure the repayment of such moneys in such manner and upon such terms and conditions in all respects as they think fit and in particular by the issue of debentures or debenture stock of the Club charges upon the property and assets of the Club (both present and future).
- (22) From time to time to fix the fees payable for tuition and flying which shall belong to the Club.
- (23) From time to time to make rules, regulations and by-laws concerning flying and determining when (if at all) non-members may be permitted to fly either as passengers or alone. Provided always that no person shall fly solo until he has attained the standard of proficiency laid down from time to time by the Committee.
- (24) To control competitions, sporting events and trials in connection with the Club and to make, alter or amend such rules and regulations as they may think fit.
- (25) From time to time to make provision for badges for members and to sell them to members at such price and on such terms as the Committee may from time to time determine.

SECRETARY.

48. Notwithstanding anything which may have been said or laid down in the foregoing articles, and in particular Articles 35 and 36, the Committee may at any such time of the Club's existence in which it is considered expedient and in the interests of the Club to do so, appoint a Secretary at such salary or upon such terms as the Committee think fit. He shall have charge of all correspondence and shall keep an account of the funds of the Club. He shall keep accurate minutes of all meetings of the Club, and of the General Committee and of the Executive Committee and Sub-Committees. He shall have the care of the offices and furniture and of all books and documents belonging to the Club. He shall give notice of all meetings of the Club, of the General Committee, and of the Executive Committee and Sub-Committees. He shall duly notify members of their election and collect all dues from members of the Club and others. He shall prepare the Annual Report and

Balance Sheet of the Club under the guidance of the General Committee and generally perform all such duties as are incidental to his office. Until a Secretary shall be appointed as aforesaid, his office shall be fulfilled by an Honorary Secretary assisted, if necessary, by an Honorary Treasurer at such honorariums (if any) as the Committee shall deem fit.

49. The offices of Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall cease to exist on the appointment of a Secretary.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

50. The Committee shall call an Annual General Meeting of the members of the Club each year.

51. The business of the Annual General Meeting to be held in each year shall be :—

- (a) To receive from the Committee the Report, Balance Sheet, and Statement of Accounts for the preceding financial year.
- (b) To decide on any resolution which may be duly submitted to the meeting as herein provided.
- (c) To elect Office-bearers and Committee and Auditor or Auditors for the ensuing year.

52. Any member desirous of moving any resolution at a General Meeting shall give notice thereof in writing to the Secretary, or Honorary Secretary as the case may be, not less than TEN DAYS before the day of such meeting.

53. No business not included in the notice convening the meeting or in the notice of resolution submitted under Article 51 shall be discussed at a meeting.

54. A preliminary notice of General Meetings shall be sent 20 days before the date fixed for such meeting to all members; this notice shall call for resolutions from members and shall state date, time, place, and object of meeting. In addition, at least FOUR DAYS before the date for such a meeting, a notice briefly stating the business to come before the meeting shall be inserted in at least one newspaper. A more detailed Agenda Paper stating the nature of the business to be transacted shall be posted to All Members of the Club SEVEN DAYS before such meeting, counting from date of posting.

55. The quorum at a General Meeting shall be ten members of whom at least five shall be Flying Members present in person. At a General Meeting the President or in his absence a Vice-President shall preside. In the absence of the President or a Vice-President the meeting shall elect some other member of the Committee or (if no member of the Committee is present and willing to act) some other Flying Member of the Club to preside.

56. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

57. Every question unless otherwise provided by these Articles shall be decided by majority of votes. Every Flying Member shall have two votes and every ordinary member one vote and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote. Members may vote by proxy on any matter at such General Meeting.

58. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointer. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a member of the Club.

59. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited with the Secretary or Honorary Secretary as the case may be, not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the member named in such instrument proposes to vote.

60. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in one of the forms hereto annexed :—

61. At any meeting unless a poll is demanded a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried or carried by a particular majority or lost or not carried by a particular majority shall be conclusive.

62. If a poll be demanded it shall be taken by a show of hands at the meeting.

EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETINGS.

63. An extraordinary General Meeting of the Club shall only be held by direction of the Committee or on a written request to the Secretary signed by no fewer than ten Flying Members of the Club; such direction or written request shall state the purpose or purposes for which such meeting is to be held, and at such extraordinary General Meeting (which shall be held within one calendar month after receipt by the Secretary of such direction or request) no matters shall be taken into consideration except those specified in the notice convening the same. The Secretary shall send to members notice of the date, place, time and object of such extraordinary General Meeting, not less than fourteen days before the date of the meeting, counting from the date of posting.

64. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice and there shall be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently on the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

ACCOUNTS.

65. The Committee shall cause true accounts to be kept of all sums of money received and expended by the Club, and the matters in respect whereof such receipts and expenditure take place and of the assets and liabilities of the Club. The Books and Accounts of the Club shall be kept at the registered office of the Club or at such place or places as the Committee may think fit.

AUDIT.

66. The Accounts of the Club shall, before every Annual General Meeting, be examined and the correctness of the Balance Sheet ascertained by an Auditor or Auditors who shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting of the Club.

NOTICES.

67. A notice may be served by the Club upon any member either personally or by sending it through the post, in a stamped or prepaid envelope, or wrapper addressed to such member at his registered address.

68. Every member whose residence is not in Ceylon may from time to time notify in writing to the Club an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed his registered address within the meaning of the last preceding Article.

69. Those members who have no registered address in Ceylon shall not be entitled to receive any notices from the Club.

70. Any notice required to be given by the Club to the members or any of them not expressly provided for by those Articles shall be sufficiently given by advertisement.

71. Any notice required to be or which may be given by advertisement shall be advertised once in one or more daily newspapers.

72. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the envelope or wrapper containing the same is posted and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was properly addressed and put into the Post Office.

73. When a given number of days notice or notices extending over any other period is required to be given, the day of service shall, unless it is otherwise provided, be counted in such number of days or other period.

INTERNATIONAL CONTROL OF AERONAUTICS.

74. Any penalties pronounced by the competent authority of one of the Federations of Clubs of the Federation Aeronautique Internationale against one of its pilots or aviators or any other pilot or aviator, or other person, whether holding a certificate or not, will be recognized and applied by all the Federations or Clubs of the Federation Aeronautique Internationale.

USE OF CLUB ADDRESS.

75. No member shall use the name of the Club in any advertisement, prospectus, or business announcement, other than as a holder of the Club's certificates or awards.

76. The name or address of the Club shall not be given by a member as his address or otherwise for the purpose of identification in connection with legal proceedings.

77. No new Articles or alterations of existing Articles shall be made, except as follows:—

It shall be duly proposed, seconded and carried at a General Meeting and be confirmed at a subsequent General Meeting. Notice of every new Article, or alteration of any existing Article, shall be given in the form of a written motion by the proposer to the Secretary fourteen days before its discussion, and shall be duly set out in the final notice sent to all members; and any amendments to such motion shall be sent in writing to the Secretary three days previous to the meeting.

78. In the interpretation of these Articles, unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent therewith:—

- (a) Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine gender.
- (b) Words importing the singular number include the plural number and *vice versa*.
- (c) Words importing persons include corporations.
- (d) "The Articles" mean the foregoing Articles.
- (e) "The Club" means "The Aero Club of Ceylon, Limited".
- (f) "The Committee" means the General Committee of the Club elected in the manner prescribed by these Articles.
- (g) "The Secretary" means the Honorary Secretary or the duly appointed Secretary or Secretaries of the Club.
- (h) "Members" mean and include all Founder, Flying, Ordinary, Life, Absentee, Honorary and Temporary Members of the Club.
- (i) "The Executive Committee" means the Executive Committee elected in the manner prescribed by these Articles.

SHARES.

79. Honorary and temporary members shall not be entitled to hold shares. Each founder member shall hold two shares. Each Flying Member shall hold two shares. Each ordinary member shall hold one share.

No member shall be entitled to hold more than two full shares or less than one full share.

80. Shares of the Club shall not be applied for, allotted, purchased, sold, transferred, registered or held in the name of a person who is not a member of the Club.

81. The Club shall not be bound to recognize any contingent, future, partial or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share or in any right in respect of any share excepting the absolute right thereto of the member.

82. A share shall not be registered in the joint names of two or more persons.

83. If a certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Secretary he may order the same to be cancelled and may issue a fresh certificate in lieu thereof, and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Committee a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate.

84. A fee of one rupee shall be paid to the Club for every certificate so issued in place of a certificate lost, destroyed, defaced or worn out.

85. The heirs, executors, administrators, trustees or estate of a deceased member shall not be entitled to the share of such member but such share shall be extinguished on the death of the member.

COMMON SEAL.

86. The Committee shall provide a Common Seal of the Club and shall provide for the safe custody thereof. The Seal shall not be used except with the authority of the Committee and except in the presence of any two out of the following, viz., the President, the Secretary, the Treasurer, a Committee Member authorized thereto by the Committee, who shall sign every instrument to which the Seal is affixed.

Any Instrument sealed with the Seal of the Club and signed as aforesaid shall be presumed to be duly executed.

87. Any matter not provided for in the foregoing Articles may be dealt with by the Committee provided it is in the interests of the Club and is not contrary to the objects of the Club as set out in the Memorandum of Association.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, July 6, 1938, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated June 29, 1938.

Present : Dr. V. R. Schokman, the Mayor, presiding ; Mr. Geo. R. de Silva, Deputy Mayor ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Dr. A. F. J. Casie Chitty ; Dr. E. A. Coorey ; Mr. J. R. Dharmasena ; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando ; Dr. C. W. S. Fernando ; Dr. S. D. Fernando ; Mr. D. S. Fonseka ; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C. ; Mr. N. M. M. Ishak ; Dr. A. Ratnapala ; Mr. M. L. M. Réyal ; Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam ; Mr. N. Saravanamuttu ; Dr. R. Saravanamuttu, M.B. ; Mr. S. Saravanamuttu ; and Mr. J. Tyagaraja.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 8, 1938, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. Tyagaraja moved :—" This Council requests the Hon. the Minister for Local Administration to secure the necessary amendments to section 60 (2), and to section 61 (1) and (2) of Ordinance No. 60 of 1935, with a view to enabling this Council, at its first meeting after a General Election, to elect a Mayor and a Deputy Mayor who shall hold office for the full term of the life of the Council as contemplated by section 56 of the said Ordinance ". Mr. Geo. R. de Silva seconded.

Dr. R. Saravanamuttu, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, and Mr. S. Saravanamuttu spoke on the motion.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha suggested that the matter be put to a Committee to go into the whole question of the reform of the Constitution.

Mr. J. Tyagaraja replied and the motion being put to the house was carried unanimously.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Geo. R. de Silva moved :—" That an additional member be appointed to the Special Committee on Housing and Town Improvement ". Mr. D. S. Fonseka seconded.—Carried.

Mr. M. L. M. Réyal proposed and Mr. J. R. Dharmasena seconded that Dr. S. D. Fernando be appointed to the Special Committee.

Dr. A. F. J. Casie Chitty proposed and Mr. S. Saravanamuttu seconded that Mr. D. S. Fonseka be appointed.

The two names being put to the house, Mr. D. S. Fonseka was declared appointed.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam moved :—" That this Council is of opinion that a part of the Beira lake including the island, should be developed for purposes, such as boating, bathing and providing a pleasure centre with a promenade and tea kiosk, and that Government be written to with a view to ascertain whether they will assist the Council in such a scheme by dredging the part of the lake concerned ". Dr. C. W. S. Fernando seconded.

Resolved that Government be written to and that when the reply from Government is received, the subject should be referred to the Works Committee for report.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam moved :—" That this Council shall delete the word " minor " in the designation of Haig road, Bambalapitiya, in Council's records and that this be referred to the Housing and Town Improvement Committee for consideration and report ". Mr. N. M. M. Ishak seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Geo. R. de Silva, moved :—" That another member be appointed to the Special Committee to suggest alterations and amendments to the Building Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915, in order to expedite the work of the Committee ". Mr. N. Saravanamuttu seconded.

Mr. Geo. R. de Silva proposed and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded that Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader be appointed to serve on this Special Committee.—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, Dr. A. Ratnapala moved :—" That this Council is of opinion that such amendments as are necessary should be made in section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 in order to exempt from taxation Homes for Aged and similar Charitable Institutions which are purely maintained by public contributions and that this be referred to the Finance Committee for consideration and report ". Dr. A. F. J. Casie Chitty seconded.—Carried.

8. Pursuant to notice, Dr. C. W. S. Fernando moved :—" That a Free Municipal Dispensary be opened in the Kollupitiya Ward, preferably in the Polwatte area and that provision be made for same in the Budget for next year and that this be referred to the Sanitation Committee for consideration and report ". Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

9. Pursuant to notice, Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam moved :—" In view of the fact that Milk Bars are being established indiscriminately throughout the City, it is desirable that all such be licensed and that the Medical Officer of Health be asked to frame suitable regulations for the control of the same and that this be referred to the Sanitation Committee for consideration and report ". Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

10. Pursuant to notice, the Mayor moved :—" That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee :—

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Committee of the whole Council of July 1, 1938, was considered.

(1) To consider Counsels' opinion on the question of water mains in streets and lanes taken over by the Council and converted into public streets.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved :—" This Committee recommends that the Council accepts the principle that in cases where water mains have been laid in private lanes which have been converted into public streets by resolution of Council, the owners of properties, who contributed towards the cost of laying of such mains, are entitled to a refund and in each case it should be proved that the main was laid by resolution of Council before refund is made ". Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried, 10 Members voting for and 3 Members against it.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. R. Saravanamuttu in commenting on Counsels' opinion stated that as this was a matter involving the expenditure of thousands of rupees, he felt that the motion should be sent back for further consideration by the Law Committee.

Dr. E. A. Coorey and Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader spoke against this suggestion.

After further discussion, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that the question be put to the house. This was agreed to and the question being put, the recommendation of the Committee of the whole Council was carried in the following amended form :—" This Committee recommends that the Council accepts the principle that in cases where water mains have been laid by resolution of Council in private lanes which have been converted into public streets, the owners of properties, who contributed towards the cost of laying of such mains, are entitled to a refund and in each case it should be proved that the main was laid by resolution of Council before refund is made ".

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 16, 1938, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(2) To reconsider :—(a) A plan and detailed estimate for Rs. 4,800 from the Municipal Engineer, for the acquisition of the site and the construction of a public bath at Training School road, Bambalapitiya. (b) A report of the acting Municipal Treasurer stating that a sum of Rs. 2,500 is provided in the 1938 Budget for this purpose and that sanction of Council is necessary for supplemental provision of Rs. 2,300, the detailed estimate and the plan. Resolution of Council in Committee.

The Mayor explained the reasons which made the Finance Committee to make their recommendation.

Dr. E. A. Coorey suggested that the Mayor should look into the question of closing the wells.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha suggested that further investigations be made as regards a suitable site.

Dr. R. Saravanamuttu spoke in support of Mr. Fonseka and moved that the bath be constructed at the Tannery lane junction at a cost of Rs. 4,800 inclusive of supplementary provision of Rs. 2,300 for the acquisition of the site. Mr. S. Saravanamuttu seconded.—Carried.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(6) To consider the Annual Report of the nominated Auditor on his audit of the Council's Accounts for 1937, and the comments thereon of the Acting Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 491. Considered.—To be submitted to Council.

(8) To consider :—(a) Quotations received for enamelled number plates, badges, and dog tickets for 1939. (b) The recommendation of the Acting Municipal Treasurer that the following quotations be accepted :—(1) Factory Engineer : Rs. 3,079.43 for the supply of number plates and badges. (2) Messrs. J. Hudson & Co. : £22. 10s. f.o.b. London, for the supply of dog tickets. *Note*.—The cost will be met from Advance Account, Purchase of Stores and the sanctioned estimates debited when the materials are drawn for use. 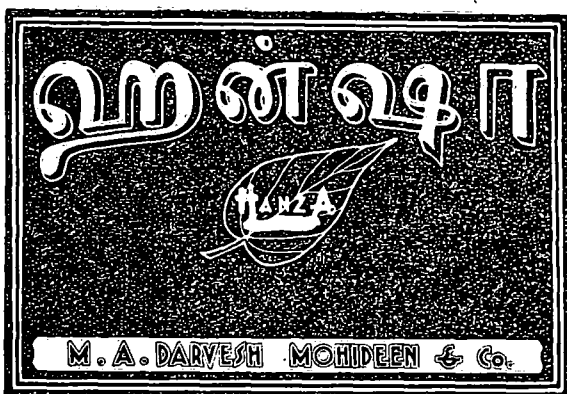
