SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, approved under section 12 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on April 24, 1938, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Bilangalena amuna irrigation work in the Kandy District, and sanctioned by the Officer Administering the Government by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

(3) The proprietors further agree to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

## RULES.

*(Sub-sections (1), (3), (4), and (11).)*

Slaughtering Places.

1. No person shall establish or keep a private slaughtering place within the Dikwella subdivision except on an annual licence obtained from the Chairman in that behalf.

2. (1) No person shall slaughter cattle, goats or sheep at any place other than a village slaughtering place or a licensed slaughtering place.

(2) The fees payable for the use of a village slaughtering place shall be in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule hereto.

3. (1) No person shall slaughter any animal in the presence of other animals.

(2) No person shall bring any animal for slaughter into any slaughtering place until the carcass of any animal previously slaughtered has been removed or screened off.

4. No person shall slaughter any animal for human consumption unless it has previously been exposed for a period of not less than twenty-four hours in such public place within the Dikwella subdivision as may have been set apart for that purpose.

5. No person shall slaughter for human consumption any diseased animal.

6. No person who is suffering or who has recently suffered from any contagious, cutaneous, or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall be permitted by the licensee or any person in charge of a licensed slaughtering place to enter such place or to take part in the slaughtering of any animal until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

7. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer authorized by him in writing, at all reasonable times, to enter and inspect any slaughtering place; and the licensee or person in charge of such slaughtering place shall permit the Chairman or such officer to make such inspection and shall render all such assistance therein as may be necessary.

8. It shall be lawful for the Village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these rules relating to licensed slaughtering places; and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.

The Ceylon Telegraph Rules (Inland and Indo-Ceylon) published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,198 of January 24, 1936, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,384 of July 29, 1938, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) In rule 31—

(a) by the substitution, for the words and figures "Post (Rule 126)", of the following:—

"Post (Rules 126, 129, and 130)";

(b) by the substitution, for the words and figures "Post Registered (Rule 130)" of the following:—

"Post Registered (Rule 132)";

(c) by the substitution, for the words and figures "To be sent by Air Post (Rule 132)" of the following:—

"To be posted by the 'surcharge air service' (Rule 131)"; and

(d) by the substitution, for the words and figures "To be sent by Air Post Registered (Rule 132)" of the following:—

"To be posted Registered by the 'surcharge air service' (Rule 132)";

(2) By the substitution for rules 128, 129, 130, 131, 132, 133, and 134 respectively, of the following new rules:—

128. (1) *Inland Telegrams to be posted to places outside Ceylon.*—An inland telegram may be telegraphed to Colombo or to any other suitable telegraph office in Ceylon thence to be posted to an address beyond the limits of Ceylon.

(2) On a telegram to be posted to a place in India, no charge shall be made for postage.

(3) On a telegram to be posted to a place outside Ceylon, except India, the minimum letter postage to such place prescribed by Regulation, and reproduced in the Foreign Letter Post Section of the Ceylon Post Office Guide shall be paid by the sender.

(4) A telegram under paragraph 1 to India or to any other country may also be posted by the "surcharge air service" where one is available. In that case, the minimum "surcharge air service" fee for a letter to such country, prescribed by Regulation, and reproduced in the Foreign Post Section of the Ceylon Post Office Guide shall also be paid by the sender.

(5) Telegrams under paragraph (1) cannot be accepted at a Railway Telegraph Office except when they are to be posted to a place in India by the ordinary post (not the "surcharge air service").

129. (1) *Inland Telegrams to be posted to India.*—The address of a telegram to be posted to India, under Rule 128, should read, e.g., "Sen Gupta, Royal Hotel, Bombay, Post Colombo".

(2) The charge for such a telegram shall be the inland ordinary telegraph rate, postage being as laid down in paragraph (2) or paragraph (4) of Rule 128, as the case may be.

(3) The Inland Urgent telegraph rate will not be available for this service.

130. (1) *Inland Telegrams to be posted to a country other than India.*—The address of a telegram to be posted to a country other than India, under Rule 128, should read, e.g., "Mrs. Johnson, 20 Cambridge Terrace, Hyde Park, London, Post Colombo".

(2) The charge for such a telegram shall be the Inland Ordinary or Urgent Telegraph rate, as the case may be, and the postage as laid down in paragraph (3) or paragraphs (3) and (4) of Rule 128, as the case may be.

131. When a telegram under Rule 129 or 130 is to be posted by the "surcharge air service", the letters "PAV" shall be substituted for the word "Post" in the address.

132. (1) The Inland Registration fee in the case of a telegram under Rule 129 and the Foreign Registration fee in the case of a telegram under Rule 130 shall also be paid by the sender if the telegram is to be posted registered.

(2) When a telegram is to be posted registered, the letters "PR" shall be substituted for the word "Post" or the letters "PAVR" for the letters "PAV" as the case may be, in the address.

(3) A telegram intended to be registered and posted but received at the posting office too late for registration will be posted unregistered, a copy marked "Duplicate" being sent as a registered letter as soon as practicable.

133. (1) Telegrams sent under Rule 129 or Rule 130 may also be multiple, but in every such case the sender must pay the copying fee for each additional address, and also an additional fee (if one is due) for postage on each copy or for postage and registration as the case may be.

(2) Such telegrams cannot be addressed partly to persons in Ceylon and partly to persons outside Ceylon, e.g., they cannot be addressed partly to persons in Colombo including the Colombo Harbour and partly to persons overseas.

134. In the case of telegrams referred to in Rules 128 to 133, a full postal address is always necessary. Registered abbreviated telegraphic addresses cannot be used; and

## THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## General Meeting.

Wednesday, August 3, 1938, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated July 27, 1938.

*Present* : Dr. V. R. Schokman, the Mayor, presiding ; Mr. Geo. R. de Silva, Deputy Mayor ; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader ; Dr. A. F. J. Casie Chitty ; Dr. E. A. Coorey ; Mr. J. R. Dharmasena ; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando ; Dr. C. W. S. Fernando ; Dr. S. D. Fernando ; Mr. D. S. Fonseka ; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C. ; Mr. N. M. M. Ishak ; Mr. C. G. C. Kerr, C.A. ; Dr. A. Ratnapala ; Mr. A. R. A. Razik, J.P., M.S.C. ; Mr. M. L. M. Reyah ; Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam ; Mr. N. Saravanamuttu ; Dr. R. Saravanamuttu, M.B. ; Mr. S. Saravanamuttu ; Mr. M. Subbiah ; and Mr. J. Tyagaraja.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 6, 1938, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

The Mayor then referred to item No. 13 of the Minutes and stated that Mr. Goonesinha had informed him that he (Mr. Goonesinha) had been compelled to return to the Island without continuing his voyage to England owing to illness and that he did not wish to avail himself of the leave of absence granted by the Council, as he would not be leaving the Island.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam asked the following questions, to which the Mayor replied :—  
Will the Mayor be pleased to state for the information of this Council :—

(1) Q.—What financial and other assistance are rendered annually to the Municipal Education District Committee, Colombo ? A.—(a) A grant of Rs. 20,000 for feeding children attending Vernacular and Bilingual schools in Colombo. (b) A contribution of Rs. 2,240 towards a special treat to school children in Colombo on the occasion of His Majesty the King's Birthday. (c) A sum of Rs. 1,140 from the Mayor's Relief Fund for feeding of poor school children in Colombo.

(2) Q.—What supervisory control does this Council exercise over the disbursements of these funds ? A.—No supervisory control is exercised, but statements of expenditure are furnished together with certificates from Head Teachers of schools in support of meals and refreshments supplied.

(3) Q.—Is it a fact that the two members nominated by this Council to the Municipal Education District Committee, Colombo, disagreed from the discontinuance of a certain Attendance Officer of the Municipal Education District Committee, Colombo, without framing charges and holding a proper inquiry ? A.—Yes, as far as one Member is concerned.

(4) Q.—Is it a fact that on a communication received from the Minister of Education regarding this matter that charges should be framed and a proper inquiry held against this officer, that the Chairman dealt personally with the matter without consulting the Committee, two Members of which are nominated by this Council ? A.—I have no information beyond the fact that the Executive Committee of Education has suggested that the case against the officer should be reconsidered after framing charges and holding an inquiry.

3. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. N. M. M. Ishak :—“ In view of the fact that recommendations—*vide* Sessional Papers XVIII. of 1937—have been made by the Committee appointed by His Excellency the Governor to report on Class III. of the General Clerical Service, I move that a Special Committee of five members of this Council be appointed to report to the Finance Committee on the salaries and conditions of service of Division II. Clerks of the Municipal Clerical Service.” With the permission of the Council, Mr. Ishak withdrew his motion to be brought up again in an amended form.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. Tyagaraja moved :—“ This Council requests the Hon. the Minister for Local Administration to take steps to amend section 60 (3) and (4) of Ordinance No. 60 of 1935, with a view to making it legally necessary for this Council to elect its Mayor and Deputy Mayor by an absolute majority of the votes cast, provided, however, that when the candidates seeking election to either of the said posts receive an equal number of votes the result shall be determined by the drawing of lots.” Dr. R. Saravanamuttu seconded.

Mr. M. Subbiah and Mr. M. L. M. Reyah spoke on the motion.

Mr. J. Tyagaraja replied and the motion being put to the house was carried unanimously.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. (Mrs.) M. H. Rutnam moved :—“ That this Council recommends that street lines to a width of 40 feet should immediately be laid down under section 19 of 1915 for the continuation of Gower street to the Galle road, through the existing Pepin lane, and that this recommendation be referred to the Municipal Engineer and Municipal Assessor for report and be placed before the Housing and Town Improvement Committee at its next meeting.” Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, in seconding the motion suggested that the Municipal Treasurer be requested to prepare a statement of savings on budgeted expenditure, for circulation to Members for their information.

Mr. Geo. R. de Silva spoke to the motion.

The motion was ultimately adopted in the following amended form :—“ That this Council requests the Housing and Town Improvement Committee to consider the question of laying down street lines immediately to a width of 40 feet (under Ordinance No. 19 of 1915) for the continuation of Gower street to the Galle road, through the existing Pepin lane, and to report to this Council.”

6. Pursuant to notice, the Mayor moved :—That a civic reception be accorded His Excellency the Delegate Apostolic of the East Indies on Wednesday, August 24, 1938. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.—Carried unanimously.

7. Pursuant to notice, the Mayor moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda :—Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

(8) At the intersection of the highways known as Alutmawatta road and Daniel's road in Colombo, Alutmawatta road shall be considered as the main road.

(9) At the intersection of the highways known as Alutmawatta road and Rajamalwatta road in Colombo, Alutmawatta road shall be considered as the main road.

(10) At the intersection of the highways known as Alutmawatta road, Vine street south and St. John's way in Colombo, Alutmawatta road shall be considered as the main road.

(11) At the intersection of the highways known as Alutmawatta road and Vine street north in Colombo, Alutmawatta road shall be considered as the main road.

(12) At the intersection of the highways known as Alutmawatta road, Ferguson's road and Mattakuliya centre road in Colombo, Alutmawatta road and Mattakuliya centre road shall be considered as main roads.

(13) At the intersection of the highways known as Mutwal street, Marshall street 2nd, Marshall street 3rd and St. Andrew's road in Colombo, Mutwal street and St. Andrew's road shall be considered as main roads.

(14) At the intersection of the highways known as Mutwal street and St. James street in Colombo, Mutwal street shall be considered as the main road.

(15) At the intersection of the highways known as Modera street, Mutwal street, Temple road and Madampitiya road in Colombo, Modera street and Mutwal street shall be considered as main roads.

(16) At the intersection of the highways known as Modera street and Rajamalwatta road in Colombo, Modera street shall be considered as the main road.

(17) At the intersection of the highways known as Modera street and St. John's way in Colombo, Modera street shall be considered as the main road.

(18) At the intersection of the highways known as Modera street, Vuystwyke road, Fergusons road and Vine street north in Colombo, Modera street and Fergusons road shall be considered as main roads.

(19) At the intersection of the highways known as Blomendhal road and Skinner's road north in Colombo, Skinner's road north shall be considered as the main road.

(20) At the intersection of the highways known as Blomendhal road and Blomendhal lane in Colombo, Blomendhal road shall be considered as the main road.

(21) At the intersection of the highways known as Blomendhal road and Wasala road in Colombo, Blomendhal road shall be considered as the main road.

(22) At the intersection of the highways known as Blomendhal road and Walls lane in Colombo, Blomendhal road shall be considered as the main road.

(23) At the intersection of the highways known as Blomendhal road and St. James street in Colombo, Blomendhal road shall be considered as the main road.

(24) At the intersection of the highways known as Blomendhal road, Madampitiya road and Vine street south in Colombo, Blomendhal road and Vine street south shall be considered as main roads.

(25) At the intersection of the highways known as Vine street south and Daniel's road in Colombo, Vine street south shall be considered as the main road.

(26) At the intersection of the highways known as Madampitiya road and Mahawatta road in Colombo Madampitiya road shall be considered as the main road.

## ANNEXURE " C ".

*Report of the Rent Restriction Sub-Committee.*

## A.

Of the two motions passed on October 6, 1937, viz., (1) that a Rent Restriction Ordinance should be introduced more or less in accordance with the terms of the draft Ordinance attached to the motion and (2) that the law be amended relating to the assessment of properties in Colombo, the more important is undoubtedly the 2nd motion above named. After careful consideration, we are of opinion that the law relating to the assessment of properties in Colombo should be amended in the manner mentioned below.

As the law now stands, under section 120 of Ordinance 6 of 1910, the Municipality has got the right to ask for returns of the rent or annual value of properties from the owner or occupier only for purposes of valuation. Further the penalty is only a fine not exceeding Rs. 100 for a false return or a refusal to make a return. If we compare this section 120 with the Local Government Ordinance 11 of 1920 sections 179 and 180, it will be seen that so far as District Councils are concerned, the Local Authority has got much wider power. We are therefore of opinion that section 120 should be repealed and the law be amended giving—

(1) The Municipality power to revise the assessments of properties in Colombo periodically, say once in every five years, ward by ward.

(2) Whenever the Municipality has given notice of such revision in any ward, the Municipal Assessor or the Commissioner should be given the power to require the owner, occupier and tenant of every house, building, or land to furnish a return of the rent or annual value thereof, the penalty for a refusal or for false return being Rs. 500 or six months' rigorous imprisonment.

(3) The power to call for returns should not only be for the purpose of the periodical assessment, but also at any time and from time to time for the purpose of "the ascertainment of any information which, in the opinion of the Commissioner shall be necessary" (see section 179 of Ordinance 11 of 1920).

(4) The Municipality should be given the right to enter and inspect and survey any house, building, or land at reasonable times.

(5) The Municipality should have the right also to summon and question any occupier, owner or tenant of the house, land, or building for the above purposes with the same penalty mentioned above.

(6) We are of opinion that objections to assessments should not be heard by the Assessment Department, but by an independent Committee composed, say, of three Members, to be appointed from amongst the Members of the Municipal Council as well as from outside the Council.

This Committee should also have the power of hearing proposals for the reduction of the assessments for the following year made by any person to the Assessment Department, provided that such application shall be heard by the Committee only if the Assessment Department is not satisfied with the evidence placed before it for the proposed reduction of assessment. If the Assessing Department is satisfied that the proposed reduction of the assessment for the following year is justified on the evidence placed before it, the necessary alteration can be made for the next year. If the Assessing Department is not so satisfied, there should be a right of appeal to the Committee.

There should be a right of action in a Court of Law for the purpose of testing the decision of the Committee, as in the existing law.

## B.

As regards the first motion, we have had several representations from landlords, but only one on behalf of the tenants of small buildings. The draft Ordinance was based on legislation passed in India, Rangoon and Singapore, and a notice was published inviting criticism from the public. It was not meant to be passed intact as it stood, but was drafted with the object of inviting public comments. We are satisfied that it will not be advisable to pass the bill as drafted for the reasons given by the landlords. In spite, however, of the vehement protests of the landlords, we are firmly convinced that some relief should be given to the tenants of small buildings. Such relief can be given without unsettling the existing law to a great extent.

1. (a) In the first place, we think the Small Tenements Ordinance 11 of 1882, should be amended in two respects. The word "tenement" should mean a house or other building or room which may be rented, exclusive of all taxes, rates and assessments for a sum of not exceeding Rs. 30, instead of Rs. 20 as at present.

(b) Some provision should be made in the Small Tenements Ordinance introducing the English Law relating to Landlords' lien.

We understand that, owing to a decision of the Supreme Court, a landlord has no right to stop a tenant from removing his furniture for arrears of rent due unless he has obtained an order of Court to back him up. We think that power should be given to landlords to stop the removal of property by a tenant who tries to evade payment of arrears of rent.

2. No landlord should have the right to increase the rent of a tenement, the monthly rental of which is Rs. 30 or under, above the assessed annual rent as assessed in the Municipal books, without getting the permission of the Municipal Magistrate. Such application should be dealt with summarily after notice to the tenants and the Municipal Authorities. Similarly no landlord should have the right to bring an action in any Civil Court in Ceylon to recover any sum above the assessed monthly rent as rent without getting the special permission of the Municipal Magistrate as stated above.

3. No action to recover rent in respect of a tenement not assessed with a separate number in the Municipal Assessment books should be allowed to be brought in any Civil Court, except with the previous sanction of the Municipal Magistrate obtained as stated above. This is to prevent a dwelling house being divided into cubicles for the purpose of being let.

4. A right of appeal should be provided from the decision of the Municipal Magistrate, say, to the Commissioner of the Court of Requests, the party appealing furnishing security in a sum not exceeding Rs. 25, the cost of appeal being taxed as in an ordinary action in a Court of Requests.

5. There should be provision made that no premium is to be chargeable in respect of a tenancy and a penalty provided for disturbance of easements by the landlord in order to get rid of an unsatisfactory tenant.

## C.

If this report is approved or modified by the Municipal Council, a draft bill or bills will be drafted by the Special Committee in terms of the resolution.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Friday, August 12, 1938, at 2.30 p.m.

*Present* :—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. W. Dahanayake; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. G. Ross Bell; Mr. A. C. Mohammado; Mr. J. C. Cooper; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on July 22, 1938, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

Mr. W. Dahanayake asked that the word "only" in line 11 of item 8 (3) be deleted, but the Chairman declined to accede to the request on the ground that the entry in the Minutes was in accord with what the member had stated.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayake presented a petition from the Incumbent of the Vijeyananda Vihare, Weliwatta, Galle, objecting to the proposed construction of a public latrine contiguous to the vihare premises.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved:—(1) That, in view of the serious shortage of water in the Hiyare reservoir, arrangements be immediately made by the Council to augment the supply of water in the town. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded. In the course of his speech the mover suggested the pumping of water into the main from the Madola stream to the north of Hiyare reservoir. Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya, A. C. Mohammado, W. Dahanayake and E. M. Karunaratne supported the motion. The Chairman explained the present position with regard to the water supply and said that it was a mistake to be unduly pessimistic over the matter. The present shortage was due chiefly to lack of rain and wastage of water in the town, and personally he did not think that the reservoir was going to fail. He was confident that towards the end of the year, with normal rains, the position would considerably improve and give no further cause for anxiety. However, as it was necessary that the Council should be prepared for an emergency, he had caused investigations to be made with a view to augmenting the supply temporarily, and the necessary action was now being taken. He referred to the Holuwagoda-ela pumping scheme which was under consideration at present and which he thought could be put through and completed for use within three weeks of its being sanctioned. As regards the quality of the water, he did not think there was any justification for the criticisms made, as the last report from the Analysts showed that the water was fit for human consumption. He would now get another report from the Analysts which he hoped would be accepted as final. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(2) That the construction of drains planned for this year be speeded up. Mr. W. Dahanayake seconded.—Carried.

(3) That the Municipal Engineer be directed to draw up a programme of work necessary to be carried out daily at the Pettigala Sump with reference to the pumping of the sewage and the cleaning up of the Sump. Mr. W. Dahanayake seconded.—Carried.

(At this stage Mr. E. M. Karunaratne, with the permission of the Chairman, left the meeting.)

4. To consider the representation of Ward No. 6 in view of the absence of the member from three consecutive General Meetings of the Council.

The Chairman moved that, in terms of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, Mr. A. Kahaduwa, Member for Ward No. 6, who having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings of the Council, had *ipso facto* ceased to be a Councillor, be restored to membership.—Carried by 8 votes, Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya and R. L. Ephraums declining to vote.

5. To nominate, in terms of Regulation 3 (b) of the Galle Street Collections Regulations, 1938, two persons to serve on the Board of Control established under the said regulations for the year 1938. Mr. W. Dahanayake moved that Messrs. A. I. H. A. Wahab and Thomas Amarasuriya be nominated to serve on the Board of Control for the year 1938. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

6. The Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1937:—Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Administration Report of the Chairman for the year 1937 be submitted to His Excellency the Governor. Mr. R. L. Ephraums seconded.—Carried.

7. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 8, 1938, and continued on August 10, 1938:—*

(2) Considered Audit Query No. 153 I.M. of April 26, 1938, regarding the excess expenditure on the construction of side drains on Wackwella road.—Recommended that the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 64.34 in excess of the tendered amount be sanctioned for extra work required to be done.

(3) Considered further the suggestion made by the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, to adopt the system of no parking on either side of Main street on alternate days owing to congestion of traffic.—Recommended by 2 votes to 1. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya dissenting, that the system be adopted in respect of that portion of Main street lying between Dickson road and Talapitiya Cross road, and that the draft, by-law and the draft regulation under the Vehicles Ordinance and the Motor Car Ordinance, respectively, be approved.

(5) Considered the question of keeping a Register of approved Contractors.—Recommended that the Chairman do keep a register of approved contractors for all works involving an expenditure of Rs. 1,500 and over.

(6) Considered tender for the construction of side drains on the southern side of Circular road from the culvert near Athoya bridge to the Railway crossing.—Recommended the acceptance of the lowest tender, viz., Rs. 2,869.70 by R. B. de Silva.

(7) Considered the question of providing electric lights along the new Kachchiwatta road.—Recommended that the estimate of Rs. 2,070 for five street lamps be passed and that the necessary supplemental expenditure be sanctioned under Head E 39—the work to be carried out departmentally.

(8) To approve the payment of an additional sum of Rs. 155.34 to Contractor M. H. James Appu for extra work done in connection with the construction of side drains along Hirimbure road.—Recommended that the payment be approved subject to the Municipal Engineer submitting an amended estimate for the work.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (3), Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya and W. Dahanayake opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committee. Messrs. J. C. Cooper and G. Ross Bell supported it. Mr. J. E. Perera moved as an amendment that the system suggested by the Superintendent of Police be tried for a period of three months before a definite decision is arrived at. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded.—Carried by 8 votes to 2.

With regard to item (5), the recommendation of the Standing Committee was adopted by 9 votes to 1, Mr. W. Dahanayake dissenting.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(At this stage Mr. J. E. Perera, with the permission of the Chairman, left the Meeting.)

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of August 10, 1938:—*

(3) List of demolished buildings in Wards 4 and 7.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(4) Considered papers relating to the recovery of rent for Electricity meters.—Recommended that the rent for all meters be fixed at Re. 1 per mensem with effect from September 1, 1938, and with retrospective effect in the case of those consumers who have been supplied with meters above 10 amps., but who have not been charged the increased rental of Rs. 1.50 per mensem in terms of the Council's resolution of April 9, 1927.

(5) To revise the present minimum charge for electric lighting and the present rates for power other than industrial power.—Recommended (1) that the minimum monthly charge for lighting be fixed at Rs. 2.25 per mensem for consumers within Municipal limits and at Rs. 2.75 per mensem for consumers outside Municipal limits; (b) that Refrigerators be classified as domestic appliances and charged for at the rate of 8 cents per unit up to 50 units and 6 cents per unit for all units over 50—the above recommendations to take effect from September 1, 1938.

(6) To approve the payment from Vote 45 of 1938—Maintenance of Roads—of a sum of Rs. 434.67 being expenditure incurred in November and December, 1937, on patching Municipal roads.—Recommended that the payment be approved.

(7) Considered a letter from the Municipal Magistrate regarding provision of funds for the destruction of old Municipal Court records.—Recommended that the Municipal Magistrate be informed that the Council does not consider it necessary that each case should be scrutinized and the particulars thereof entered in a Register before the records are destroyed, and that in the circumstances the employment of a temporary clerk for the purpose does not appear to be necessary.

(8) Considered the question of appointing an additional clerk for the office of the Municipal Engineer.—Recommended that an additional clerk be appointed on a salary of Rs. 480—48—1,200 and that the necessary supplemental expenditure be sanctioned.

(9) Considered papers relating to the Accounting work of the office.—Recommended (1) that a separate clerk be appointed to assist the Accountant on a salary of Rs. 480—48—1,200; (2) that with effect from June 1, 1938, the Chief Clerk be paid a personal non-pensionable allowance of Rs. 15 per mensem for daily checking the account books of the Council; and (3) that the necessary supplemental expenditure be sanctioned.

(10) To authorize the Chairman to waive the ground rent in the case of temporary sheds erected on M. C. land for public, religious and charitable purposes, and also the fees payable for pandals and decorations erected and put up on the occasion of any public function or ceremony.—Recommended.

(11) Considered the case of Anti-Plague Labourer, D. K. Girigoris, who met with an accident while performing his duties.—Recommended that in accordance with the Medical report he be given light work for 6 months as a rat-trapping labourer on his present salary, and that the necessary arrangements be made for an exchange of duties between him and one of the present rat-trapping labourers.—Recommended, further, that in terms of the by-law he be granted half-pay leave for the 61 days on which he was absent from work.

(12) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, papers relating to the appointment of the second Public Health Nurse.—Recommended that Mrs. V. S. Aponso be appointed to the post of second Public Health Nurse on the salary scale and allowances as already decided on by the Council.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (8) the recommendation of the Standing Committee was adopted by 7 votes to 2 after Council in Committee had discussed the matter and interviewed the Municipal Engineer.

With regard to item (9), recommendation (1) was adopted unanimously and recommendation (2) was adopted by 7 votes to 2, after Council in Committee had discussed the matter and interviewed both the Accountant and the Chief Clerk. Recommendation (3) was also adopted.

With regard to item (10) it was resolved that the recommendation be adopted and that the question as to whether a function or ceremony is public or not be left to the discretion of the Chairman.

With regard to item (11) it was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted subject to the following amendment, viz., the addition of the words "who will during that period be paid the salary of an Anti-Plague labourer" after the word "labourers" in line 7 and the substitution of the words "for the excess period of 30 days" for the words "for the 61 days" as the Chairman is authorized to grant half-pay leave in such cases up to one month.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

#### (c) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of August 10, 1938 :—

(2) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, papers relating to the appointment of the second Public Health Nurse.—Recommended that Mrs. V. S. Aponso be appointed to the post of second Public Health Nurse on the salary scale and allowances as already decided by the Council.

(3) Considered the question of making suitable provision in the by-laws for the disposal of rubbish on private premises.—Recommended that the following new by-law be added to Chapter X. of the by-laws :—"No person shall deposit dust, ashes, rubbish, sewage, soil, dung or filth at any place within the Municipality of Galle, except in such places as the Chairman shall from time to time appoint."

(4) Considered the present rates fixed by the Council for the sale of beef and mutton.—Recommended that no change be made.

(5) Considered an application from A. R. Periyatamby, Gem Merchant, for the lease of a vacant stall in the Fruit Market to be used by him as an office.—Recommended that the application be allowed.

#### Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake moved :—(1) That the position as regards the quality of the water from the Hiayre Reservoir do receive immediate consideration. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded—Carried. (2) That inquiries be made from the Charity Commissioner, Colombo, whether it would be possible for him to relieve any cases of indebtedness among the Galle Municipal employees. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded—Carried.

9. The following motion which also stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayake fell through for want of a seconder :— "That the Finance Committee do consider suitable reductions, to take effect from next year, in the licensing fees for (a) bullock carts, (b) hackeries, and (c) tea kiosks."

10. Considered an application from the Provincial Surgeon, S. P., to use some of the sheds at the Segregation Camp as a temporary hospital for tuberculosis patients :—Resolved that, as a temporary measure, permission be granted for the use of two sheds at the Segregation Camp for tuberculosis patients, provided that infectious disease contacts are not interfered with.

11. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next Meeting be held on September 9, 1938, immediately after the Meeting of the Special Committee on Housing and Town Improvement.

12. The following documents were laid on the table :—

- (1) Statement of accounts of expenditure of the Municipal Education District Committee in respect of the grant of Rs. 1,500 for supply of free midday meals for 1937.
- (2) Letter from Sir Mohamed Macan Markar acknowledging receipt of the congratulatory resolution of the Council.
- (3) Statement of receipts and disbursements to the end of July, 1938.
- (4) Progress report of works done on estimates during July, 1938.
- (5) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on Carriages plying for hire during July, 1938.
- (6) Report of the Superintendent, Electricity Department.
- (7) Diaries of (a) the Medical Officer of Health, (b) the Municipal Engineer, (c) the Inspector of Works, and (d) the Manager, Health Department.

Improvements in the construction of re-inforced hollow brick slabs and to the method employed for the construction of floors and roofs.

*Abstract.*—The inventor proposes the use of hollow concrete bricks for making the roofs and floors of buildings. The hollow brick has large semicircular horizontal grooves made on its vertical sides about an inch from the bottom so that when two bricks are laid side by side a tensile reinforcement bar can be placed in the circular opening thus formed. Preferably the brick has two longitudinal hollows in it divided by a rib. This improves its sound absorbing property.

Slabs are made by cementing a row of bricks end to end, and by cementing to it other rows with the tensile reinforcement bars between. Slabs of convenient length and breadth can be made on the ground and hoisted into position. The inventor states that the cost of centering can be eliminated.

An improved process for concentrating, separating, and purifying colloidal dispersions.

*Abstract.*—The inventor describes a continuous process for concentrating and purifying natural dispersions, such as Rubber Latex and the like, using an electrolytic cell fitted with diaphragms in which the rate of supply of the dispersion and the rate of withdrawal of the layers separating out are regulated in such a manner that the effective diaphragm surface is kept constant and the uniformity of product is ensured.

By way of example the inventor describes a process in which a cell is used which is fitted with circular diaphragms. Fresh latex is supplied to the middle of this cell at the rate of 50 gallons an hour, and the layers at the top and bottom are led away at the rate of 29 and 21 gallons per hour, respectively. The electric field applied is of the order of 1.08 volts per centimeter. The cream is found to have 50.4 per cent. dry residue and the serum 4.1 per cent. dry residue. In another example the supply is at the rate of 35 gallons per hour, the rate of withdrawal of the serum being 15.4 gallons per hour. The concentrate has 58 per cent. dry residue.

Improvements in relief valves for vacuum systems.

*Abstract.*—The inventors describe a relief valve for a vacuum system (such as a train pipe) in which the air admission is effected through a piston valve whose rim in the closed position seats against a casing thereby

providing an additional seal against leakage. A guide piston is used on the atmospheric side and the stem between the guide piston and main piston is coned so as to control the flow of air through the valve. A low rate compression spring is used to enable the valve to lift quickly. A ball valve which puts the vacuum chamber in communication with air when the vacuum is too low is described but not claimed.
