209A. Public officers are strictly prohibited from borrowing money on the security of salary receipts. If it is established that an officer has borrowed money tendering a "pay-bearer" salary receipt as security for the loan such officer will render himself liable to dismissal. THE CEYLON RAILWAY BENEFIT ASSOCIATION ORDINANCE, 1908.

RULE made by the Ceylon Railway Benefit Association under section 14 of the Ceylon Railway Benefit Association Ordinance, 1908, and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

The rules published by notification dated July 17, 1909, in Gazette No. 6,320 of July 23, 1909, as last amended by rule published in Gazette No. 8,023 of December 15, 1933, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) in rule 8, by the substitution, for the words "next of kin", of the words "widow and children, if any";
(2) by the substitution, for rule 9, of the following new

rule :-

"9. (1) In addition to the payment referred to in rule 8 any member who retires from the public service and who has completed 20 years or more of membership of the Corporation and has been a regular contributor to the funds of the Corporation shall receive a donation calculated at whichever of the rates of Rs. 2, Re. 1 50 or Re. 1 is applicable to him under the Schedule given Re. 1, is applicable to him under the Schedule given below, from the members in the books of the Corporation: provided, however, that no such donation shall become payable by any member who has contributed to the funds for less than one full year. Any member who retires from the public service and who has not so completed the minimum period of 20 years shall be entitled to receive one-twentieth of the rate applicable to him for every completed year of membership, if he has been a member of the Corporation and a regular contributor for a period of not less than one full year:

(2) In the case of retirement donations the maximum amount of such donations payable to any member shall not exceed double the amount he has paid for donation

calls during his membership.

(3) In the event of the death of a member while in the public service, his nominee or widow and children, if any, or heirs at law shall receive a donation at the maximum rate applicable to the deceased member, if he has been a member of the Corporation and a regular contributor for one full year or more.

(4) in rule 19, by the substitution, for the words "next of kin", of the words "the widow and children"; and
(5) in rule 21, by the substitution, for rule 21 (6), of the

following new paragraph:---

"(6) the maximum amount allowable shall be Rs. 5,000. No application for a further loan shall be entertained from any member who has not paid up in full the loan already granted to him. No loan shall in any case exceed one-third of the appraised value of the property offered as security or shall be granted on any security other than immovable property invested in the name of the applicant or his wife and himself jointly and situated within the limits of any Municipality or Urban District Council or within 8 miles of the Municipal limits District Council or within 8 miles of the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo."

(6) in rule 21, by the addition, immediately after paragraph (12) of the following new paragraph (13):-

" (13) The amount which the Committee of Management may from time to time invest on the security of immovable property shall be so regulated that at any given date the total of the sums outstanding on account of principal on such investments shall not exceed threefourths of the nett assets of the Corporation, such nett assets being arrived at by deducting from the gross assets of the Corporation at that date such sum as the Committee of Management may on that date deem to be necessary for the following :-

(a) Cost of establishment of the Corporation for the rest of the financial year;

(b) Rs. 10,000 out of the current account as an emergency reserve;

(c) Reserve Fund on account of loans on immovable property; (d) Amount of donations due on account of deaths or

retirements:

(e) Fees due to appraisers and amounts due to miscellaneous depositors;

(f) Security deposits;
(g) Loans to members outstanding under rules 17 and 18, exclusive of interest thereon.

Saheed, on behalf of the Market Spaceholders, praying for the removal of the by-law recently enacted to restrict the height to which goods can be stored. (7) Petition dated June 30, 1938, from Mr. M. 5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Usoof Ismail asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied:—

Q.—(1) How many prople pay rates in the Mapanawatura area? A.—The figure is 205. There are 205 "Assessment Units". This does not mean of course that there are only 205 rateable properties. One man may pay rates for several. Q.—(2) For how many years have taxes been collected from this area and the total amount so collected? A.—Taxes have been collected from this area since 1900, i.e., 37½ years. The amount collected in 1900 was Rs. 466 and the amount to be collected in 1938 is Rs. 1,270·52. The total collected during the whole period can be calculated, if necessary. A rough estimate would be Rs. 30,000. Q.—(3) Is the Chairman aware that no amenities in the way of lights and roads have been provided in this area? A.—Yes. Q.—(4) Will the Chairman consider exempting this area from taxation or provide lights and improve the existing unsatisfactory path? A.—It is essential to explain that different rates are charged according to the facilities provided. Of the 205 ratepayers in this area—183 pay the minimum 8 per cent. rate, 12 pay the 10½ per cent. rate, and 10 pay the 18½ per cent. rate. Those who pay the highest rate obtain water, light, conservancy, and good roads; and those who pay the 10½ per cent. rate obtain conservancy. It is admitted that those who pay the lowest rate obtain very little, if anything, in return at present. The Chairman has discussed the question with the Works Engineer and hopes that in future, by the giving of necessary orders to the overseers, at least some maintenance of the existing paths will be possible. He understands that the question of maintenance of existing paths was discussed sometime ago and dropped owing to the large number of such paths in the Municipal area and the high cost involved in any such undertaking. in any such undertaking.

As regards this particular area (Mapanawatura), the Chairman will certainly consider the provision of lights in due course, but at the moment there are two obstacles:—(1) The difficulty of fixing lamp standards on land which at present does not vest in Council and which might have to be shifted at a later date, and (2) the fact that no further extensions are possible with the Council's existing electric plant. As the Hon. Member is aware, a loan of Rs. 150,000 has just been applied for, and, if the funds are forthcoming, it should be possible to provide a new engine within about a year from now. As regards the improvement of the existing path this will receive attention along with other such needs. It would facilitate acquisition if the landowners concerned were willing to give their land free or on payment of nominal costs. It is not possible legally to exempt this or any other "Village" area from the minimum rate, which is imposed under section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

17. To obtain sanction to the sick leave granted to Mr. X. A. Pillai on full pay of 94½ days in 1938, and to set off

47½ days of this leave against lapsed leave of 1935-1936. Resolved that the leave be sanctioned accordingly

To obtain sanction to the sick leave granted to Mr. K. Nagappar on full pay of 52 days in 1938.

Resolved that the leave be sanctioned. 19. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on June 18, 1938.

(1) Papers on the subject of the size and speed of motor buses used for the Kandy Town Service.

Resolved to ask Police to watch speed and to prosecute if they exceed 15 miles per hour. Question of size to be taken up later.

Resolution of Council.

Resolved that no action be taken regarding speed, and that future buses introduced for the town service be limited to 4 tons fully loaded.

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on June 18, 1938. (Item deferred from last General Meeting.)

(2) Memo from the Works Engineer dated May 31, 1938, suggesting further improvements to the Island in the Lake.—Recommended. Bottle palms to be cut down. Cane palms to be left. Hibiscus tree to be removed and replaced by a pelm. Bougainvilleas—6 to be planted. Central part to be turfed. Pentos plants to be planted in the Gardener's discretion. Branfelsia bicolor to be planted. Estimate of Rs. 400 recommended. Question of providing a boat to be considered with next Budget.

Resolution of Council.

Resolved that no trees be cut down, the scheme for planting be approved, the fallen arch be rebuilt as per plan given by the Archæological Commissioner, and a vote of Rs. 425 be allowed for the whole scheme of improvements. The Chairman and Mr. Marikar dissented from the proposal to restore the arch.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General subjects held on July 16, 1938.

(3) Papers re the supply of water to Jumina Mosque in Getambe. (W/PW 274.)—Recommended to enter into an

agreement with the Trustees mentioned in the enclosure to Mr. Usoof Ismuil's letter dated July 5, 1938.

(4) Letter No. B-1610 of June 18, 1938, from the Commissioner of Local Government inquiring whether the Council desires an amendment of section 219 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, empowering the Governor to dispense with the requirement to create a sinking fund for the redemption of any loan when the terms of repayment are by annual fixed instalments (G 349.)—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on July 16, 1938.

(5) Application from Mr. Nagoor Meera for a licence in his favour for trading in Spaces Nos. 63 and 64, Public Market. (D/Sp. 64.)—Recommended that Nagoor Meera pay Rs. 10 a month for 18 months to the Council for the benefit of the outgoing licensee and the licence be altered at once in favour of Nagoor Meera on the usual terms and subject to the payment of instalments.

(6) To obtain sanction for allowing Mr. M. Kandiah to occupy Public Market Stall No. 27 on monthly rent without the levy of a premium. (D/St. 27.)—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on July 16, 1938.

(7) Application from Dingiri Menika, foster mother of Simon, late labourer, Works Department, for a gratuity.—

Recommended a gratuity of Rs. 100 payable in monthly instalments of Rs. 7.50.

(8) Papers re the application of Abessa Umma, widow of V. Sulaiman, late Engine Cleaner, Power Station, for a gratuity.—Recommended a gratuity of Rs. 60 payable in monthly instalments of Rs. 5.

- (9) To consider the question of paying a reward to Mr. Jayasinghe for his services in bringing to light the existence of a tea area in Roseneath, which has now been leased and is a source of revenue to the Council.—Recommended a reward of Rs. 150.
- (10) To obtain sanction for the payment of rewards of Rs. 10 each to Police Constable Kadurugamuwa and one Kuda Banda for timely action taken by them to check the spread of the fuse of an electric wire in the Public Market.—
- (11) To obtain sanction for the lease of land belonging to the Railway at Mulgampola on which there is a public well at a rental of Rs. 5 per annum. (O 711.)—Recommended.

 (12) To obtain a vote for Rs. 87:46 for printing 10 copies of Preliminary Plan 8,769 connected with the Hunasgiriya

Scheme on 4 chain scale.—Recommended.

(13) Letter from the Municipal Education District Committee dated June 3, 1938, applying for a grant for purposes of feeding school children.—Recommended to consider with next budget, and meanwhile to ascertain how many are willing to be fed in the manner proposed.

(14) Chairman's memorandum dated June 13, 1938, on the desirability of adopting a more expeditious method of disposal of matters by Council than the one obtaining at present.—Recommended that the Chairman be empowered to bring up before the General Meeting any matter which he considers to be urgent after circulation of papers to all members.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on July 16, 1938.

(15) Estimate for Rs. 1,260 from the Works Engineer for demolishing and removing the existing open drain running alongside premises Nos. 8 to 15a, Ward street, and replacing it with a 1 ft. diameter hume pipe underground drain complete with necessary gratings.—Recommended for consideration with next budget.

(16) Application from Mr. F. Joseph for a water service to premises No. 75/76, Brownrigg street. (W/PW 48/38.)

-Recommended.

(17) Method of performing road maintenance services during 1938-1939.—Recommended that the tender received be rejected and the method proposed in Works Engineer's memo dated July 13, 1938, be approved.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on July 16, 1938.

(18) Papers re suggestion made by the Municipal Electrical Engineer that the Council should take over the maintenance of all service mains from the Municipal main to user's bungalow.-Recommended, consumers to pay (ordinary charges) for the service.

(19) To consider the question of extending the main in Katugastota to a distance of 400 yards from the present point at a cost of Rs. 780 for the purpose of installing lights at the Katugastota Police Station.—Recommended to consider with next budget.

(20) Papers re cost of repair and re-erection of damaged lamp standard at Victoria Drive.—Recommended.
(21) Letter dated July 9, 1938, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer indicating arrangements made by him for giving a limited supply of electrical energy to the Industrial Exhibition and Carnival.—Recommended.

Resolution of Council on items (3) to (21).

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted, subject to expenditure under item (9) being incurred after Govern-

ment sanction, and the vote under item (20) being limited to Rs. 40.

20. Petition dated—May, 1938, signed by Mr. L. B. Mavilmada and several other residents of Mavilmada, Siyambalagastenne, &c., protesting against the use of Municipal land at Mavilmada for purposes of a slaughter-house and a cattle shed, and connected papers returned by Mr. Marikar to whom they were referred in pursuance of a resolution passed at the meeting held on July 16, 1938, to select an alternative site in consultation with the Medical Officer of Health. (H/P 131.)

Mr. Marikar suggested that the slaughter-house be built on Municipal land in Nittawela.

Ratwatte Adigar opposed this suggestion.

The Chairman moved that the slaughter-house be built on the Municipal land in Mavilmada as originally proposed.

The Chairman moved that the slaughter-house be built on the Municipal land in May Indiana. Dr. Godlieb seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried by 6 to 3. Ayes.—The Chairman, Mr. Beven, Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Soysa, Mr. Nettelton, and Dr. Godlieb. Noes.—Mr. Marikar, Mr. Wijayatilake, and Mr. Usoof Ismail.

21. Chairman's memo dated August 1, 1938, on the desirability of carrying out improvements to the Market street 'Bus stand at a cost of Rs. 1,731 60. (O 159.)

The Council was opposed to the enlargement of the Market street stand, and the Chairman, was directed to consider the revocation of the rule by which certain buses parked in the Railway approach road stand were allowed to halt for 15 minutes in the Market street stand, and to report, in consultation with the Provincial Engineer, on the possibility of longitudinal parking of buses in Malabar street.

22. Letter from the Chairman, Kandy Museum Committee, stating that the period of office of Mr. T. B. Keppitipola, Council's nominee on the Committee, expires on September 30 next, and asking the Council to submit the name of the person whom the Council would nominate for the next period of 3 years from that date. (O 220.)

Resolved that Mr. Keppitipola be re-nominated for a further period of 3 years.



Abstract.—The inventor states that oral administration of insulin is not successful due to the fact that insulin is rapidly acted on by intestinal enzymes and rendered ineffective. If substances are added which prevent this action, then oral treatment can replace the painful injections now used.

According to the invention suppositories are made by combining with insulin (a) a carrier substance such as cacao butter which melts at body heat, (b) acid or acids which prevent the destruction of insulin by intestinal ferments and (c) a substance which by decreasing the surface tension accelerates the absorption of the insulin. Suitable substances in class (b) are lactic acid, citric acid, acetic acid and tartaric acid; palmitic acid may be used in conjunction with a small quantity of citric and/or lactic acid. Under class (c) soaps and soap like substances can be used, but one must be careful to see that they do not have any haemolytic action; suitable substances are guaiacum saponins hipposastanum saponins and glycyrhizines. With suppositories made according to the invention it has been found that blood sugar depression of as much as 50 per cent. is brought about, the effect lasting for about two hours.
