A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS His Excellency Sir Andrew Caldecott, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon with the Territories and Dependencies thereof, has quitted the Island :

It is hereby proclaimed that in conformity with His Majesty's Will and Pleasure declared in the Letters Patent dated the Twenty-second day of April, One thousand Nine hundred and Thirty-one, constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Ceylon and its Dependencies, the Honourable Mr. Guy Stanley Wodeman, the officer lawfully discharging the functions of Chief Secretary to the Government at the time of the departure of the said Governor, has this day assumed administration of the Government of the Island :

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirty-eight.
