THE CEYLON STATE MORTGAGE BANK  
ORDINANCE, 1931.

RULE under section 91 (d) of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank Ordinance, 1931, made by the Board of Directors and approved by the Officer Administering the Government by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by the said section.

RULE.

The rules made under section 91 (d), published in *Gazette* No. 7,939 of August 12, 1932, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,287 of April 30, 1937, are hereby further amended by the addition, immediately after rule 5, of the following new rule 5A:—

5A. (1) Debentures may be consolidated or subdivided at the option of the Debenture-holder, subject to the condition that each new debenture which is issued shall be for Rs. 50 or a multiple of Rs. 50.

(2) The fee payable for the consolidation or subdivision of debentures under paragraph (1) of this rule shall be one rupee for each new debenture which is issued.

(3) No debentures shall be consolidated or subdivided during the seven days immediately preceding the days fixed for the payment of interest.

**Abstract.**—The inventor describes a process for producing soil improvers by reacting materials containing a substantial amount of humin acids, which by the addition of monovalent bases have been brought into dissolved or sol or gel condition, with aluminium and/or iron ions in the absence of substantial amounts of phosphate ions, or with aluminium and/or iron compounds in sol or gel condition, so as to produce complex compounds of humin acids with aluminium and/or iron, the proportion of aluminium and/or iron in the final product being of the order of 1 per cent. to 5 per cent. calculated as  $Al_2O_3$  and/or  $Fe_2O_3$  on the dry organic matter. During the reaction the pH value of the mixture is maintained between 4 and 8 by adding suitable quantities of ammonia in the gaseous form or in solution. The aluminium salt may be prepared by acting on an aluminium ore (e.g., bauxite or clay) with a mineral acid.

Substances rich in humin acids may be prepared by subjecting fossil or recent organic matter to an oxidising process by blowing air through the material at a pressure of 10 atmospheres and a temperature of  $120^{\circ}C$ , and periodically or continuously introducing ammonia so as to keep the pH value between 6 and 7 as described in British Patent No. 438, 144. The binding of the aluminium and/or iron on the complex compound may be improved if the organic matter is first treated with dilute acid or alkali, preferably at an elevated temperature, the material being subsequently washed and oxidised, or oxidised first and then washed.

The aluminium compound may be added either before or during or after the oxidising process, but it is preferable to complete the oxidising process first. Calcium and/or magnesium may be incorporated in the soil improver by neutralising the product obtained by the reaction with aluminium compound partly with calcium and/or magnesium hydroxide and partly with ammonia.

The final product is adjusted to have a pH between 6 and 8. The soil improver when dispersed in the soil has a favourable influence on crumb structure and retards the evaporation of water from it.

There are six examples and eleven claims.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

### Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Friday, September 9, 1938, immediately after the meeting of the Special Committee on Housing and Town Improvement.

**Present:** Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. W. Dahanayake; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. E. M. Karunaratne; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. A. C. Mohammado; Mr. G. Ross Bell; Mr. J. C. Cooper; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on August 12, 1938, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. F. Magdon Ismail asked the following questions :—(1) will the Chairman draw the attention of the Police to the desirability of stationing policemen to do night duty at both the Fort Gates? (2) Why was there a failure of water supply to the Fort on the 28th and the morning of the 29th instant? (3) In view of the fact that the only source of water available to the residents of the Fort is from the pipes will the Chairman consider the desirability, of supplying them with it either in carts or lorries at any future emergency.

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) If the Member will state what purpose a guard at the Two Gates would serve the Superintendent of Police states he will be glad to go into the question. (2) The reasons for the failure of the water supply on August 28 and 29 are explained in the notice sent out to the public on August 30, a copy of which is tabled. (3) Yes.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved :—That a Collector be appointed to Ward No. 1 to collect the assessment rates as is done in the other Wards. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. Messrs. W. Dahanayake and A. C. Mohammado opposed the motion. The Chairman said the present system was working quite satisfactorily and there was no reason why it should not be continued. Messrs. J. E. Perera and E. M. Karunaratne also spoke. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the Meeting and declared lost, 2 voting for and 10 against.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake asked the following questions :—(1) (a) Did not the Council at its General Meeting in July decide, that, instead of being guided by the Schedule of Rates originally approved for this year, open tenders be called for by public notice? (b) Is it true that certain works continue to be entrusted to those contractors who had been chosen on the Schedule of Rates? If so, will the Chairman please see that the decision of the Council is carried out? (2) (a) What exactly is the work that the Council has entrusted by resolution to Mr. A. H. Nathanielsz,

and when was such resolution passed? (b) How much of this work has been done so far, and how much remains to be done? (c) When is Mr. Nathanielsz's work likely to be over? (d) What is the total amount of all fees, including batta for travelling, already paid and payable to Mr. Nathanielsz for work done so far? (e) What is likely to be the total amount of all such fees at the end of his work? (f) Has Mr. Nathanielsz done or is he doing any work that is not covered by a resolution of Council? If so, on whose authority?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) Yes. (b) The resolution of the Council is being put into effect, but pending a decision on the tenders to be called for in terms of that resolution, works, other than those done on tender, are being carried out, as before, according to the Schedule of Rates approved for 1938. (2) (a) The services of Mr. Nathanielsz were obtained to examine the present position with regard to the Galle Water Supply Scheme and to advise the Council on the proposed installation of a Venturi meter at Hiyare reservoir and the introduction of the Deacon meter system of waste detection. The resolution of the Council authorizing his employment on the terms laid down by him was passed on January 13, 1938. (b) and (c) I am informed by Mr. Nathanielsz that he has now practically completed his investigations, and that he hopes to submit his report within a month. (d) A statement giving the information required is tabled. (e) A rough estimate will be Rs. 1,000. (f) Yes.

5. At this stage, at the request of Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, the Chairman read out to the Meeting the reports received on the chemical and bacteriological analyses of the samples of water taken from the Hiyare reservoir on August 16, 1938.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake moved:—(1) In view of the continued drought, and as the quality of the water from the Hiyare reservoir becomes poorer and poorer as the level goes down, steps be taken without the least delay to distribute to householder an adequate supply of water obtained from other sources. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded, and Mr. F. Magdon Ismail supported the motion. Messrs. J. E. Perera, Thomas Amarasuriya, and E. M. Karunaratne also spoke. The Chairman said he did not think there was anything wrong with the water in the reservoir and that his own opinion of the analysts' report was that the water was quite fit for human consumption. He agreed, however, with the mover that, in view of the continued drought and the present low level of the water in the reservoir, early arrangements should be made to obtain a supply from other sources for distribution to householders if and when the water level in the reservoir goes down to such an extent that it becomes inadvisable to continue the supply therefrom. The Government Sanitary Engineer was due to visit Galle shortly to advise on the various augmentation schemes that had been proposed, and he would consult him on the matter. At least five motor lorries would be required for the purpose, and expenditure would also have to be incurred on the purchase or hire of a chlorinating plant and pump, and the wages of labourers. The Chairman also explained the Madela Scheme which he said appeared to him to be quite feasible and which was roughly estimated to cost Rs. 25,000.

The motion was then put to the Meeting and carried. It was also resolved that the Chairman be authorized to spend up to Rs. 5,000 on supplying water to the town by lorry from such sources as may be found to be suitable after due investigation, and that all necessary steps be taken to put the scheme into force from October 1st, if in the meantime there is no improvement. A supplemental vote of Rs. 5,000 for the purpose was accordingly sanctioned.

(2) That greater vigilance be exercised than now over the work of the cattle seizers. This motion fell through for want of a seconder.

7. Considered the question of further restricting the water supply:—Resolved that the water supply to the town, be further restricted to the following hours only after due notice to the public—6.30 A.M. to 8.30 A.M. and 6 P.M. to 7.30 P.M.

8. Letter from the Hon. the Minister for Communications and Works regarding the widening and duplication of the main Colombo-Matara road:—Resolved that consideration be deferred until a reply is received as regards the probable cost of the proposed marine Drive.

9. Considered, in terms of section 15 of the Municipal Pension Minute, the extension of service of the following officers of the Council who are 60 years of age or over:—A. Sarnelis, caretaker, Segregation Camp—65 years; and N. B. Stephen, Conservancy Kangany—61 years—Resolved that the above-mentioned officers be retired from service at the end of the year on the ground of age.

10. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake presented a petition from Mr. Andiris Serasundera of Talgahahena, Galle, making a complaint against a cattle seizer.

11. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera moved:—(1) That in view of the recent changed condition of the weather and the shortage of rainfall, Government be requested to retain without alienation that part of the forest originally intended as a reserve for the Hiyare Reservoir catchment, inasmuch as the clearing of any part of the reserve would endanger the rainfall in the water shed. With the permission of Council the mover amended the motion by substituting the words "the 40 chain belt of forest" for the words "that part of the forest". Mr. W. Dahanayake seconded. The motion, as amended, was then put to the Meeting and carried.

(2) That this Council requests Government to be so good as to lend in the services of a competent P. W. D. Engineer to report on the Hiyare Reservoir and the connected water works. Mr. A. C. Mohammado seconded. After discussion it was resolved that consideration of this matter be deferred.

(3) That the Municipal Engineer be directed to make out a scheme and estimate to augment the supply of water from Madela stream feeding the 8 in. or 12 in. main from Hiyare by gravitation. Mr. E. M. Karunaratne seconded. The mover asked the permission of Council to amend the motion by adding the following words at the end thereof:—"and that if the scheme is feasible it be given effect to and the work carried out at a cost not exceeding Rs. 25,000." Mr. W. Dahanayake was opposed to the addition of these words on the ground that the Council should not commit itself to any expenditure in this connection without full details of the scheme. Mr. J. C. Cooper said that no scheme should be undertaken without suitable investigation. After further discussion, the motion, as originally worded, was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

12. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake moved:—That a life saving apparatus be provided at Closenber Bay. Mr. E. M. Karunaratne seconded. The Chairman said that Closenber Bay itself was hitherto found quite safe for bathers and that as far as he was able to ascertain no loss of life from drowning had occurred there previous to the one which recently took place. He was not in favour of providing a life-saving apparatus because the probability was that, owing to disuse, it would not be able to function when required. He thought it would be sufficient if a notice was put up advising bathers to keep within the centre of the bay. Mr. J. E. Perera also spoke. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the Meeting and declared lost, five voting for and six against. Mr. W. Dahanayake called for a division which resulted as follows:—*For*: Messrs. W. Dahanayake, E. M. Karunaratne, A. I. H. A. Wahab, Thomas Amarasuriya, and G. Ross Bell. *Against*: The Chairman and Messrs. J. E. Perera, F. Magdon Ismail, A. C. Mohammado, J. C. Cooper, and R. L. Ephraums. Dr. A. T. Kuriyan declined to vote.

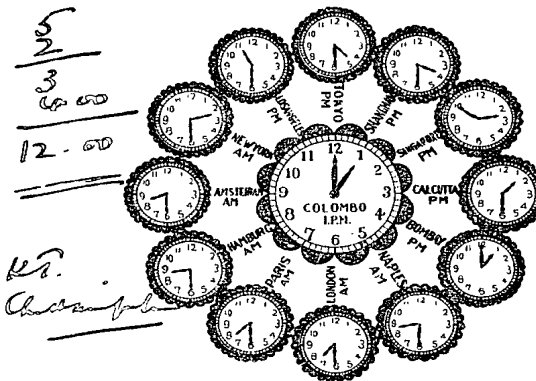

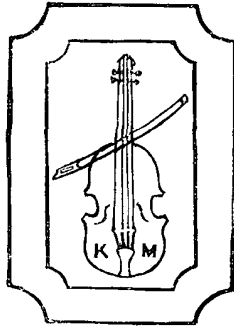

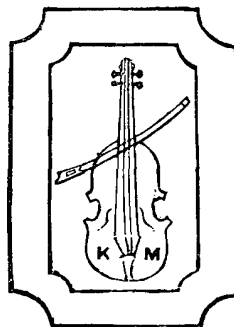
