THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
NO. 13 OF 1896.*Regulations for the Kataragama Ihaha
Kachchi Festival.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages", and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Guy Stanley Wodeman, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Ihaha Kachchi Festival commencing in December, 1938.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations "camp area" includes—

(a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewala at Kataragama; and

(b) the area within a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama.

2. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Ihaha Kachchi Festival, 1938, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to three days, namely, December 5 to 7 inclusive.

(b) No pilgrim shall arrive before December 5, or stay after December 7 in the camp area.

3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.

4. (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water for drinking and for natural offices;
- (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
- (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
- (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
- (e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

(2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).

5. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by or with the approval of the Government Agent.

6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Government Agent.

7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer.

8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits.

9. Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.

10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

11. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

(2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Inspector to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

12. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed flyproof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purpose of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

16. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

APPOINTMENT OF PROBATIONERS.

APPLICATIONS are invited from applicants possessing the necessary qualifications, as set out in this notice, for appointment as Probationers in the scheme of Divisional Revenue Officers which it has been decided should replace the present Chief Headmen System.

Method of Application.

2. (a) Application on forms to be obtained from the Government Agent of the Province in which the candidate resides must be addressed to the Director of Education, Branch E, Galle Face Secretariat, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo, and must reach that Office on or before November 21, 1938. No application received after that date will be considered. *It is important that all necessary enclosures—vide (d) and (e) below—should be attached to and forwarded with the completed form of application.*

(b) Stamps to the value of Rs. 10 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over them.

(c) Two referees must be named in the form, who from their personal knowledge of the candidate can testify to his character and capacity.

(d) Originals of recent testimonials, not more than three in number, must be attached to the application form. These will be returned after the selection has been made.

(e) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth must be attached to the form of application. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this Examination. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

Number of vacancies and conditions of appointment.

3. Eighteen probationers will be selected in the first instance, two for each Province. Further appointments may be made on the results of the present selection to fill any additional vacancies that may occur prior to September 30, 1939. Each Probationer will be attached to a Kachcheri and will rank as a junior Staff Officer. He will undergo a period of training in Kachcheri as well as in district work in the course of which he will be expected to qualify himself for appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer on the occurrence of a vacancy in a Chief Headman's post. He will not be appointed a Divisional Revenue Officer until the Government Agent has certified that he has fully qualified himself in all respects including the passing of an exacting test in the language spoken in the District.

Pay and Conditions of Service.

4. A Probationer while in training will be paid at the rate of Rs. 1,800 per annum. After a period of not less than six months a qualifying examination will be held and on passing that examination a probationer will be paid at the rate of Rs. 2,100 per annum until such time as he receives an appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer. On appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer he will be paid at the rate of Rs. 3,000 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 200 to Rs. 6,000 subject to the passing of Efficiency Bars.

A travelling allowance will be paid in accordance with the Regulations.

The post of Divisional Revenue Officer will be pensionable. Probationers will be subject to the Public Service, Financial, Leave and other Regulations applicable to Public Officers.

Qualifications of Candidates.

5. Every candidate must possess the following minimum qualifications:—

- (1) He must be a natural born British subject and his permanent home must be in Ceylon.
- (2) He must have been born not later than December 1, 1916, and not earlier than December 1, 1913.
- (3) He must have passed at least the Senior School Certificate Examination English, or Cambridge Senior or London Matriculation or an equivalent examination.

(4) He must be of good moral character and of sound constitution, physically fit for service in any part of the Island.

(5) Successful candidates will be required to pass a Medical examination the fee for which must be paid by the candidate.

Method of Selection.

6. For the purpose of recruitment of Probationers the Island will be regarded as comprising three administrative areas, viz., Low-country, Kandyan, and Tamil-speaking; in each case the successful candidate will be selected for service in one of these three areas and an officer will subsequently be transferable only within the area for which he was originally selected. The selection will be made having regard to two considerations, viz.—

- (i) the results of a competitive examination, and
- (ii) the requirements of the particular area in which the selected candidate is intended to serve.

Examination.

7. A competitive examination will be held for the selection of candidates wishing to join the Divisional Revenue Officers' Service. The Examination will be in two parts, viz., (a) Written and (b) Personal Interview.

(a) The written examination will be held at Batticaloa, Colombo, Galle, Jaffna, and Kandy. Candidates should state in their application forms at which centre they wish to be examined. Any candidate who fails to indicate where he wishes to be examined will be entered for the centre closest to his place of address. Candidates will however be required to attend at Colombo or any other centre if circumstances so require.

(b) The personal interview, which will be restricted to candidates attaining a certain standard in the written examination, will be held only in Colombo on a date which will be communicated to candidates after the written examination. Candidates will be required to produce at the interview the original certificates granted in respect of any examinations they have passed.

Subjects and Syllabus of Examination.

8. The subjects for the examination will be as follows and marks will be assigned as indicated against each:—

The interview will be similar to that at present conducted at the Civil Service Entrance Examination.

The examinations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil will be designed to test the candidate's understanding and command of the language. In the English paper a passage will be set for a summary or precis.

Questions in General Knowledge will be designed to test the knowledge and interest of candidates (a) in the more important topics of the day, and (b) in literature, world geography, and other subjects.

Deductions up to 20 per cent. of the marks awardable will be made on account of handwriting which is difficult to read.

Refunds of Value of Stamps.

9. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5ths the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of 1/2 the value of stamps affixed to his application, provided his form of admission to the examination is returned with his notice of withdrawal.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate

from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) These regulations shall come into operation on October 28, 1938.
- (b) From and after the date on which these regulations come into operation, the regulations published in *Gazettes* Nos. 8,208 of March 13, 1936, and 8,336 of December 10, 1937, shall be rescinded; and all other by-laws, orders, rules, and regulations relating to the use of highways by Motor Cars, Omnibuses, Lorries and Trailers and kept in force by and deemed to be regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, shall, in so far as they are inconsistent with these regulations, cease to have effect.
2. The highways outside Colombo specified in Schedule A hereto are hereby declared to be suitable for use by any motor car, other than a trailer, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in that Schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof :
Provided that—
 - (i.) the tare of the motor car, together with the weight of the maximum number of passengers or the maximum load, if any, which it is licensed to carry, shall not exceed six tons in the case of a four-wheeled motor car or seven tons in the case of a six-wheeled motor car; and
 - (ii.) the maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of a four-wheeled motor car or three tons in the case of a six-wheeled motor car.
3. (a) The highways outside Colombo specified in Part I. of Schedule B are hereby declared to be suitable for use by any motor car, other than a trailer or six-wheeled motor car; and
- (b) the highways outside Colombo specified in Part II. of Schedule B are hereby declared to be suitable for use by any motor car other than an omnibus, trailer or six-wheeled motor car,

subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the first column of that Schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof :

Provided that—

- (i.) the tare of the motor car, together with the weight of the maximum number of passengers or the maximum load, if any, which it is licensed to carry, shall not in the case of any highway specified in the first column of Schedule B exceed the weight specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of the Schedule; and
- (ii.) the maximum axle load shall not exceed three tons.
4. (a) The highways outside Colombo specified in Part I. of Schedule C are hereby declared to be suitable for use by any motor car, other than a trailer or six-wheeled motor car;
- (b) the highways outside Colombo specified in Part II. of Schedule C are hereby declared to be suitable for use by any motor car other than an omnibus, trailer or six-wheeled motor car; and
- (c) the highways outside Colombo specified in Part III. of Schedule C are hereby declared to be suitable for use by any motor car other than a lorry, trailer or six-wheeled motor car,

subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the first column of that Schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof :

Provided that the tare of the motor car, together with the maximum number of passengers or the maximum load, if any, which it is licensed to carry, shall not in the case of any highway specified in the first column of Schedule C exceed the weight specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of the Schedule.

5. The highways outside Colombo specified in Schedule D are hereby declared to be suitable for use by any trailer, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in that Schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof :

Provided that the tare of the trailer together with the maximum load which it is licensed to carry shall not exceed eight tons.

6. No omnibus, lorry or trailer shall be used on any highway outside Colombo unless that highway is by these regulations declared to be suitable for use by such omnibus, lorry or trailer, as the case may be.

Provided, however, that an omnibus, lorry or trailer which is not carrying passengers or goods may for the purpose of entering or leaving a garage, use, at the risk of the owner or driver thereof, any highway which affords the only means of access to that garage.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during August, 1938.

3A. Mr. Marikar drew the Chairman's attention to the inconvenience caused to the people in Malabar street by the closing of the standpipes in that street. The Chairman said that no complaints had been received by him from the residents in the locality but he would ask the Works Engineer to investigate.

3B. On a complaint made by Ratwatte Adigar that the street lights in Lady McCallum's drive were situated far too close the Chairman agreed to inspect the lights.

3C. Ratwatte Adigar observed that the voter's lists prepared under Ordinance No. 60 of 1935 were unsatisfactory in that a large number of names had been omitted, votes had been given to market stall and space holders as being resident at the market, though the Municipal by-laws prohibited sleeping in the market, and the double qualification mark had not been given to all eligible persons.

The Chairman explained that perfection could not be expected as the lists were prepared for the first time under a new Constitution. He pointed out that the lists contained approximately 15,000 names out of a population of 40,000, which was a fair proportion. The large number of vacant houses, and the aversion on the part of 99 per cent. of the Muslim women to register their names were some of the main causes that contributed to reduce the number of registered voters.

As regards the double qualification the Chairman pointed out that it was not possible in every case to ascertain, whether a person was able to read or write.

The Council thereafter resolved into Committee and the Chief Revenue Inspector was called in and questioned particularly as regards Market votes.

Mr. Beven expressed the opinion that the people in the Market who were qualified should have had their names included in the Wards in which their homes were situated as the Market was not a residence. The Chief Revenue Inspector pointed out that they had no other residence besides the Market.

Ratwatte Adigar named several prominent residents in his neighbourhood whose names he alleged had been omitted.

The Chairman agreed to look into the question of Market votes and also to consider what powers he had to revise the register in the absence of claims and objections.

The Council resumed and approved of action being taken by the Chairman as agreed to in Committee.

4. Petitions :—Ratwatte Adigar presented—(1) Petition dated September 11, 1938, signed by Mr. Edmund Perera and several other residents of Udamadapotha applying for the provision of two wells, and a few lights in the village. Mr. Soysa presented—(2) Letter dated September 10, 1938, addressed to him by Messrs. N. N. Moosa Naina & Sons asking him to secure private water service connections to their premises 85/87A, B, C, D, E, Brownrigg street.

Resolved that petition (1) be referred to the Works Engineer and Municipal Electrical Engineer for estimates, and (2) be referred to the Works Engineer for report.

4B. On the suggestion of Mr. Soysa the Chairman agreed to look into the papers connected with the proposal to remove the night soil depot in Colombo road.

5. Correspondence :—Letter No. W 6,924/Misc. of September 1, 1938, from the Government Agent, Central Province, stating that he is preparing a Food Control Scheme for the whole revenue district including Kandy Municipal area, under instructions from the Food Controller, cost of which is being met by Government, and that in the event of it being necessary to introduce food control, the Council would be asked to appoint an Advisory Committee. (O 146).—Tabled.

The Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider the letter and the question of expenditure incurred by the Council amounting to Rs. 66.

The Council in Committee approved of the scheme of control outlined by the Government Agent.

As regards expenditure, the Chairman explained that a refund of Rs. 66 paid as remuneration to the temporary clerks was claimed from the Government Agent but the Government Agent considered that Rs. 33.75 was a fair sum for the services rendered by the clerks. The Chairman suggested that the refund of Rs. 33.75 be accepted and the balance Rs. 32.25 be met from Municipal Funds as a refund could not be obtained from the clerks concerned. This was agreed to, Ratwatte Adigar and Dr. Godlieb dissenting.

The Council resumed and the decision made in Committee was adopted.

5A. The Chairman gave notice that he would move the following motion at the next meeting of Council. "That with a view to remove congestion in the Market street bus stand and to cause the Railway Approach road bus stand to be more fully used, regulation 4 of the regulations published in *Gazette* No. 8,265 of December 23, 1936, be revoked."

5B. Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijayatilake moved :—"As the needs of the children resident between Halloluwa junction and Peradeniya Bridge cannot be met by the existing playgrounds, the Medical Officer of Health and the Works Engineer be asked to select suitable sites at or near Katukelle, Mulgampola, and Peradeniya for the establishment of such playgrounds." Mr. Marikar seconded.

After further discussion Mr. Wijayatilake withdrew the motion on the Chairman's undertaking to investigate the possibility of acquiring certain lands, a list of which would be supplied by Mr. Wijayatilake, to be used as playgrounds.

6. Four tenders received for building the sides and paving the bottom of the stream flowing by the side of Buddhist Girls' College in Victoria drive. (W/M 13/38.)

The Chairman stated that as decided at the last meeting he had inspected the site with the Provincial Engineer and found an encroachment made by the Buddhist Girls' College of an extent of 1.5 perches.

He moved that the vote of Rs. 2,000 taken by the Council be deleted temporarily, and that the Chairman be authorized to agree with the Buddhist Girls' College authorities—(a) either to allow the encroachment to stand on their paying a nominal rent of Re. 1 per annum, and building a retaining wall 35 feet long at their expense to protect the road, or (b) to remove the encroachment at the expense of the Buddhist Girls' College. Mr. Beven seconded.

Ratwatte Adigar and Mr. Soysa were of opinion that the encroachment was on Mr. Soysa's private property, and in any event, the encroachment was not extensive.

The Chairman's motion was agreed to by the Council, subject to a further inspection by the Chairman and the Manager of the College and members of Council on September 21, 1938, at 9 A.M.

7. Draft of agreement proposed to be entered into with the Planters' Association of Ceylon in connection with the granting of permission to the Association to lay an effluent pipe line from the Association's building across Torrington road into the Meda-ela. (D 321.)

Resolved that the draft be approved.

8. To fix the rates laviabile during the year 1939.

Resolved that the same rates as in 1938 be levied in 1939. The Chairman pointed out that an increase of rates would become necessary for purposes of financing the Hunasgiriya Scheme.

9. Letter dated August 16, 1938, from Mr. H. F. Mottram asking for permission to erect a dance floor of a permanent nature on the Island on the Lake. (W/M 77.)

Mr. Mottram was requested to submit concrete proposals with a plan.

10. Tenders received for the construction of footpath and bridge at Huduhumpola. (W/M 24/34.)

Resolved that the tender of contractor G. H. Arnolis Baas for Rs. 1,266·50 be accepted.

11. Five tenders received for the erection of pork stalls in Railway Approach road. (O 713.)

Resolved that the tender of contractor B. D. Ekanayake for Rs. 1,891·36 be accepted.

12. To obtain a vote for Rs. 300 for the supply of water by carts to the bungalows in the higher level. (W/PW 17/38.)

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

13. Recommendations of Standing and Special Committees :—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on August 20, 1938.

(1) Draft by-law proposed by the Chairman for the purpose of prohibiting the distribution of hand bills from moving vehicles.—Recommended.

(2) Papers *re* the proposal to take over and maintain the Sir John Anderson Memorial Hall in the Buddhist section of the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery. (H/G 13/39.)—Recommended to accept Mr. K. W. David's offer to effect the necessary repairs at his expense.

(3) Papers *re* dispute as regards ownership of premises No. 36, King street—Recommended that in terms of the Council's Legal Adviser's Report, taxes be accepted from Mr. Cassie Lebbe, and his name be retained in the register as owner.

(4) Form of agreement proposed to be entered into in connection with the supply of water to premises exempted from payment of rates under section 115 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910". (C 315.)—Recommended.

Resolved that sanction be given.

17. To sanction the draft lease bond in connection with the lease of an allotment of Municipal land (1 acre and 17 perches in extent) in Cemetery road to the Chairman, Home for the Aged Building Committee. (O 561.)

Resolved that the draft lease be approved.

18. With the leave of Council the Chairman introduced the following extracts from the minutes of the meeting of the Law Committee of September 17, 1938, for Council's consideration as matters of urgency:—

(1) To table Commissioner of Local Government's letter No. C 1119 of May 31, 1938, and to consider whether the survey in connection with acquisition of land required for Back Lane Block B should be undertaken pending the resolution of the State Council approving the Scheme. (O 565).—Recommended to proceed with the survey.

(2) Correspondence with the Public Trustee on the subject of re-conveyance of temple properties purchased by the Council for default in payment of rates and vested in it.—Recommended that the Public Trustee be informed that the Council is unable to accede to the request contained in his letter No. BT 3 KD/3 of August 25, 1938, as in the Council's opinion the more substantial share of the surplus is payable to the paraveni tenants, and the temple is entitled only to the equivalent of the value of the services.

Resolution of Council.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

RULES in respect of the Kegalla Resthouse made by the Kegalla Urban District Council under section 60 of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, and approved by the Local Government Board.

RULES.

1. (1) The resthouse is intended primarily for the use of travellers. Every person using any part of the resthouse as an office or place of business shall pay, in addition to the occupation fee, a special fee of 50 cents for each period not exceeding one hour. Every person so using the resthouse shall desist from doing so upon being requested by the resthouse-keeper whose duty it is to consult the comfort and convenience of the occupants of the resthouse.

(2) The Chairman may permit the use of the resthouse or any portion thereof for the purpose of any lunch, dinner, garden party or other organized reception on payment of a fee, for occupation only, of ten rupees for the first six hours and one rupee for every additional period not exceeding one hour.

2. A consolidated fee at the rate set out in the Schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying the resthouse or garage: Provided that no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- (a) a child in arms;
- (b) a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at the resthouse and sleeps within the resthouse;
- (c) the chauffeur of a car garaged in the resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car or in the garage.

3. (1) Every visitor shall, on his admission to the resthouse, legibly write his or her correct name in the resthouse visitors' book.

(2) No visitor shall be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments until he has complied with the requirements of paragraph (1).

4. No person shall occupy any portion of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days, without the special authority in writing of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

5. No charges other than those payable to the Urban District Council shall be entered in the resthouse book by a visitor.

6. The resthouse fees and charges shall be paid in cash on demand. In default of such payment, the resthouse keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies. The attention of visitors is invited to the Hotel Keepers Protection Ordinance, 1908, a copy of which shall be exhibited, together with these rules, in some conspicuous place in the resthouse.

7. (1) No room shall be reserved unless it is engaged at least one day in advance.

(2) When a room is so engaged it shall be paid for even if the person engaging it does not occupy it.

(3) Until the arrival of the person or persons for whom a room is reserved, the room shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

8. The resthouse-keeper shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

9. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used by any visitor for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon. A breach of this rule shall be punishable with a fine of Rs. 5.

10. The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by that visitor, in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

11. Visitors shall be entitled to call upon the resthouse-keeper to attend on them personally. The resthouse keeper and servants shall wear clean white coats and cloths when attending on visitors.

12. (1) Any complaint which a visitor may have to make about the resthouse or the resthouse-keeper shall be noted in the complaint book.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper to produce the complaint book when called upon to do so.

13. No visitor shall bring any dog into the resthouse.

14. A breach of any of the above rules other than rule 9, shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

15. All rules under section 19 of the Road Ordinance, 1861, hitherto in force are hereby repealed.

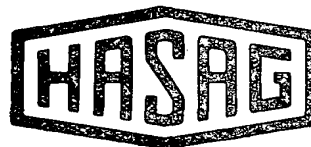

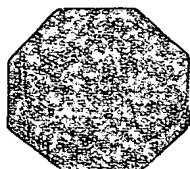
