SCHEDULE.

Schedule I. to the Proclamation dated September 12, 1935, is hereby amended by the substitution, for the definition of Moratuwa town in the Colombo District of the Western Province, therein appearing and reproduced in Column I. of the definition appearing in Column II. hereunder.

Column I.

Limits as defined by Proclamation dated September 12, 1935.

Moratuwa town comprising the area within the following boundaries :—

North : The northern bank of the stream known as the Lunawa river up to the western extremity of the bridge across the river, the approach road to the Angulana railway station as far as its junction with the Colombo-Galle road. The line of the said approach road produced to a point 5 chains to the north-east of the Colombo-Galle road. From this point a line drawn south-eastwards and southwards parallel to the Colombo-Galle road as far as a point 5 chains to the north of the road known as the Katubedde Broadway. From this point a line drawn eastwards and south-eastwards parallel to the Katubedde Broadway as far as the middle of the Panadure river.

East : The middle of the Panadure river.

South : The Panadure river.

West : The sea.

Column II.

Limits as defined by this Proclamation.

Moratuwa town comprising the area within the following boundaries :—

North : From a point on the centre of Lunawa-ela eastwards, southwards and thence north-eastwards along the southern limit of Dehiwala-Mount Lavinia Urban District Council to a point on the northern boundary of the road to Borupane ferry 25 chains to the north-east from the centre of the Colombo-Galle road, thence south-eastwards along a line parallel to and at a distance of 25 chains to the north-east from the centre of the Colombo-Galle road till it meets the southern boundary of Telawala road, thence south-westwards along the southern boundary of Telawala road to a point 5 chains to the north-east from the centre of the Colombo-Galle road, thence south-eastwards and southwards along a line parallel to and at a distance of 5 chains to the north-east from the centre of the Colombo-Galle road to a point 5 chains to the north from the centre of Katubedda Broadway, thence eastwards and south-eastwards along a line parallel to and at a distance of 5 chains to the north from the centre of Katubedda Broadway to the centre of Bolgoda lake.

East : From the last mentioned point southwards, north-westwards and thence southwards along the centre of Bolgoda lake including Maduruduwa to the centre of Panadure river, thence south-eastwards and southwards along the centre of Panadure river to the western limit of Panadure Urban District Council, thence southwards along the western limit of Panadure Urban District Council as far as the railway bridge.

South : From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the western limit of Panadure Urban District Council to the high-water mark of the sea.

West : From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the high-water mark of the sea to the centre of the railway bridge over Lunawa-ela, thence north-eastwards and north-westwards along the centre of Lunawa-ela to the starting point of the northern limit.

THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1895.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification—

(1) amend the schedule to the notification under the said section, dated September 13, 1935, and published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,146 of September 20, 1935, in that part thereof which is set out under the heading "Western Province, Colombo District" in the manner following:—

(a) under the sub-heading "16. Moratuwa Town Division" by the insertion of the word 'Kaldemulla' immediately after the word 'Indibedda' in the list of villages therein; and

IT is hereby notified that the Public Service Regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, have been amended by the addition of the following new Regulation as-section (f) to Public Service Regulation 130A:—

INCREMENTAL VALUE OF LEAVE PERIODS.

(i) Subject to the limits in sub-section (ii) of this regulation, prolonged periods of leave whether with or without pay necessitated by illness should not operate either to stop or defer the increment of an officer, provided that his record prior to the absence was satisfactory. Increments to salary may, in such cases, be allowed at the discretion of the Head of the Department: where, however, it is considered that frequent absences on leave necessitated by ill-health have so impaired an officer's usefulness that in the opinion of the Head of the Department payment of increment would not be justified, the orders of the Deputy Chief Secretary should be obtained.

(ii) The incremental value of leave periods shall be determined by the following rules:—

(I) Any period of leave with full pay or half pay will count for increment (subject to the provisions of sub-section (i).)

(II) Any period of leave without pay will count for increment if (a) it is less than six months in any one incremental period: or (b) it is granted for reasons outside the officer's own control, e.g., illness, or special absence in the interest of and at the instance of the Government, or special absence in accordance with a scheme of study recognized for the purpose of this regulation.

(III) If an officer fails to complete a recognized course of study in the time prescribed by the Government, the period of leave without pay in excess of the prescribed period will not ordinarily count for increment. The matter must be submitted for the orders of the Deputy Chief Secretary in each case.

Uniform of Headmen and Persons holding Ceylonese Ranks.

THE following instructions regarding the wearing of Uniform by Headmen, Presidents of Village Tribunals (appointed prior to October 1, 1938), and persons holding honorary or ex-officio rank are published for general information. All previous Notifications on the subject are hereby cancelled:—

- (1) All headmen and other persons holding titular ranks, and their attendants, must, on any public occasion at which they attend officially, wear such uniform as is specified below.
- (2) Medals should be worn by those who have received them from Government, but persons who have inherited Government medals from their ancestors may only wear them on permission being *first* obtained from His Excellency the Governor. Medals otherwise obtained must not be worn on official occasions.
- (3) Medals which have been inherited, and which the possessor has the permission of His Excellency to wear, should be worn on the *right* breast to distinguish them from those received from Government by an officer personally, which should be worn on the *left* breast. (This rule applies only to such medals as are attached to the coat, and not to those hung round the neck.)
- (4) The Maha Mudaliyar and Headmen of the Governor's Gate or of the Guard are entitled to the services of the lascoreens of the guard, and Headmen of the Atapattu and of the Korales to those of the lascoreens of the Atapattu, as their attendants, respectively.

REGULATIONS for the award of educational scholarships and scholarships for Music, Art, and Research Work, tenable outside the Island, framed by the Executive Committee of Education and approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government on October 22, 1938.

A.

1. (a) A scholarship of the annual value as set out in sub-clause (b) with an outfit allowance of Rs. 750 and a free second class passage to the United Kingdom or any other country approved for the purpose and a medical allowance not exceeding £30, tenable for one year with the possibility of extension for another year will be awarded biennially to an officer selected by the Governor from the permanent establishment of the Education Department subject to the conditions and restrictions here set out.

(b) If the officer selected for the award is in receipt of a salary of £300 or more he will be permitted to draw his full salary during the period of the scholarship. If he is in receipt of a salary less than £300 he will be permitted to draw his full salary and in addition be paid a supplementary amount to bring his remuneration during the tenure of the scholarship up to £300. In either case if the selected officer is married and his wife and/or children are resident in Ceylon a further sum of Rs. 1,500 per annum will be paid as a separation allowance.

2. The scholarship will be granted only for the purpose of special study or experience calculated to increase the efficiency of the officer to whom it is granted in his own work or in the work selected for him.

3. If the scholarship is made tenable in a country other than the United Kingdom the value of the scholarship will be as determined by the Executive Committee of Education after prior consultation with the Treasury.

4. The extension of the scholarship for a second year will be granted only if the Minister for Education is satisfied that the extension is necessary to enable the officer to complete the course of study he has undertaken.

5. The scholarship may be terminated at any time and the officer recalled if his work or progress is considered unsatisfactory or if he fails in health.

6. A free return passage will be granted to the officer on the expiry or the earlier termination of the term of the scholarship.

7. The award of scholarships under these regulations is conditional on the necessary financial provision being sanctioned by the State Council.

B.

1. (a) A scholarship of the annual value of £360, if held in collegiate residence at Oxford or Cambridge, £325, if held in non-collegiate residence at Oxford or Cambridge, and £240 (with fees) if held at any other University in the United Kingdom, with the same passage, outfit, and medical allowances as laid down in regulation A 1 (a) tenable for a period of one year with the possibility of extension for a second year, will be awarded biennially to teachers of secondary schools subject to the conditions and restrictions here set out.

(b) No grant will be paid towards the salary of the teacher selected for an award during the period the scholarship is in force unless a substitute has been appointed. Study leave in terms of the regulations in force for Assisted schools will not be granted for any part of the period of the scholarship. The emoluments of a Government secondary school teacher selected for an award will be governed by regulation A 1 (b).

2. Only graduates of distinction with not less than 5 years professional experience and not over 35 years of age will be eligible for this award.

3. The award is conditional on the necessary financial provision being sanctioned by the State Council. Not more than one award shall be made in every two years.

4. The selected candidate must pursue a course of studies calculated to increase his professional efficiency at a University in the United Kingdom or any other University or institution approved by the Governor for the purpose.

5. If a University or institution in a country other than the United Kingdom is approved the value of the scholarship will be as determined by the Executive Committee of Education after prior consultation with the Treasury.

6. The extension of the scholarship for a second year will be granted only if the scholar has pursued his studies with diligence and obtains a diploma in education or other equivalent qualification at the end of the first year. He shall, when called upon to do so, transmit periodically to the Director of Education or any other officer appointed for the purpose, a report on his work from his Professor or other authority supervising his studies.

7. The extension of the scholarship for a second year is further conditional on the Minister for Education being satisfied that the extension is necessary to enable the scholar to complete the course of study he has undertaken.

8. The scholarship may be terminated at any time and the scholar ordered to return if his work or progress or his conduct is considered unsatisfactory, or if he fails in health.

9. A free return passage will be granted to the scholar on the expiry or the earlier termination of the term of the scholarship.

10. The candidate selected for an award shall enter into a bond with the Director of Education in such an amount as may be prescribed undertaking to repay to the Government the amount expended on his training abroad in the event of his not undertaking educational work to the satisfaction of the Director for a period of five years after his return to the Island on the expiry of his scholarship.

11. The candidate for an award under these regulations will be selected by the Governor on the recommendation of the Minister for Education.

C.

Music.

1. Two scholarships of the annual value of Rs. 400 if held at the Annamalai University or a similar institution in South India, Rs. 600 if held at the Visvabharati University or similar institution in North India, and tenable for two years with the possibility of extension for another year, will be awarded, one to enable a student to pursue a course in Carnatic Music in India and the other to enable a student to pursue a course in North Indian Music respectively.

2. One scholarship of the annual value of £300 with the same passage, outfit, and medical allowances as for Government University scholarships, and tenable for two years at a recognized institution in Europe approved by the Governor, will be awarded to enable a student to pursue a course in Western Music.

Art.

3. One scholarship will be awarded to enable a student to study Art in an institution outside Ceylon approved by the Governor. If the scholar is to pursue his studies at an institution in Europe the value and tenure of the scholarship will be the same as that of the scholarship for Music tenable in Europe. If the scholar is to pursue his studies in any country other than a country in Europe the value of the scholarship will be as determined by the Executive Committee of Education in consultation with the Treasury, and it will be tenable for two years.

Research Work.

4. One scholarship, open to all students, irrespective of age, who have shown exceptional promise or capacity, and tenable for two years with the possibility of extension for another year at a University or other institution approved by the Governor, will be awarded to enable a student to carry out research work.

5. The value of the scholarship for research work will be determined by the Executive Committee of Education in consultation with the Treasury with due regard to the University or other institution selected and approved for the purpose.

6. One scholarship of the annual value of Rs. 400 and tenable for two years with the possibility of extension for another year will be awarded to enable a student to pursue a research course in Tamil at the Annamalai University, India.

General.

7. The Scholarships for Music, Art, and Research Work will not be awarded annually, but only when the Executive Committee of Education is satisfied that the necessity for an award has arisen, and the awards are subject to the following further regulations.

8. The continuance or extension of a scholarship, when such extension is provided for, shall be conditional on the Minister for Education being satisfied with the work and progress and conduct of the scholar. The scholar shall transmit periodically to the Director of Education or any other officer appointed for the purpose reports on his work from his Professor or other authority supervising his work.

9. Reasonable travelling expenses of the scholar including that of the return journey if he is not granted a free passage, will be allowed.

10. The selection of candidates for scholarships under these regulations will be made by the Governor on the recommendation of Boards constituted as follows for the different classes of scholarships:—

Music and Art: The Minister for Education, the Director of Education, and three competent persons nominated by the Governor.

Research Work: The Minister for Education, the Principal, University College, and the Director of Education.

GOVERNMENT UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS.*

1. Four scholarships of the annual value of £360 (including fees) when held in collegiate residence at Oxford or Cambridge, £325 (including fees) when held in non-collegiate residence at Oxford or Cambridge, otherwise £240 (with fees) tenable for two years together with an outfit allowance of Rs. 750 and a second class passage to the British Isles, will be awarded annually until further notice to students of the University College, for the purpose of enabling them to prosecute their studies at a University in the United Kingdom. In exceptional circumstances a scholar will be permitted to proceed for advanced study to a University outside the United Kingdom approved by the Governor, the value of the scholarship in such a case being determined by the Executive Committee of Education in consultation with the Treasury.

2. The Scholarships will be awarded on the results of the Final Honours Examination of the London University as follows:—

- One scholarship to the candidate recommended by the authorities of the University of London as the most meritorious candidate of those who have appeared for the B.A. Honours Examination in an Arts subject (excluding Oriental Languages and Mathematics);
- One scholarship to the candidate recommended by the authorities of the University of London as the most meritorious candidate of those who have appeared for the B.A. Honours Examination in Oriental Languages;
- One scholarship to the candidate recommended by the authorities of the University of London as the most meritorious candidate of those who have appeared for the B.Sc. Special Examination in a Science subject (excluding Mathematics);
- One scholarship to the candidate recommended by the authorities of the University of London as the most meritorious candidate of those who have appeared for the B.Sc. Special Examination in Mathematics. A candidate may, at the same time, take the optional examination in Advanced subjects, and, if he so takes it, the Examiners of the University may, in making their recommendations, consider the work of the candidate as a whole.

3. A candidate to be eligible for one of these scholarships—

- Must have been registered as a student of the University College for not less than two years;
- Must have been resident in the Island for five years next before the examination;
- Must not have completed his twenty-third year before the first day of the month fixed for the examination;
- Must pass the examination on the results of which the scholarship is awarded with First Class Honours, provided that, in the case of the Science Scholarship, if in any year no candidate passes with First Class Honours, a candidate who passes with Second Class Honours, may, in exceptional cases, and on the recommendations of the Heads of the Science Departments, be selected for an award;
- Must produce medical evidence of physical fitness to undergo a course of study abroad;
- Must have stated in his form of application to appear for one of the examinations specified in (2) above that he is a candidate for a scholarship.

4. These scholarships are awarded subject to the following further conditions:—

- That the holder shall enter, as an internal student, one of the Universities of the United Kingdom or such other place as shall be approved by the Governor, and shall there prosecute his studies in the subject offered by him in competition for the scholarship, or in an allied subject approved for the purpose of his scholarship by the University College Council;
- That the course of study approved by the Council shall not be changed without the approval of the Council;
- That the holder shall transmit quarterly to the Director of Colonial Scholars a certificate signed by the college tutor or other responsible authority stating that he continues to pursue his studies with diligence and that his general conduct is satisfactory.

5. Students, who are otherwise eligible under these regulations, may compete for these scholarships at the examination held in June of the year in which they complete at the University College the course of studies prescribed for that examination, and/or at the next examination, but not at any subsequent examination.

6. A proper certificate of birth must accompany the application for entry to the examination; a certificate of baptism will be accepted instead, provided that baptism took place within four months of the date of the candidate's birth.

7. The duration of the Government University Scholarship may be extended to a further period of one year in cases where a scholarship-holder engages in a course of study which lasts more than two years, provided that he has shown marked promise and ability during the first two years of his tenure of the scholarship. Every scholar will forfeit his scholarship who, not being disabled by illness or prevented by any other cause which the Director of Colonial Scholars may consider sufficient, fails to comply with the regulations here set forth.

8. On the expiration of the scholarship the scholar will be provided with a free second class passage to Ceylon. The scholarship may be terminated at any time—

- If the scholar's work and progress be considered unsatisfactory,
- if his conduct proves unsatisfactory, or
- if he fails in health,

in which cases, unless the Director of Colonial Scholars sees reasons to the contrary, the scholar will retain his right to a passage to Ceylon, provided he returns when instructed by the Director of Colonial Scholars. Any scholar failing to return to Ceylon when instructed to do so by the Director of Colonial Scholars, will forfeit his right to a free passage.

A scholar who resigns his scholarship before the expiration of its tenure for reasons which, in the opinion of the Director of Colonial Scholars, are not satisfactory, will be held to resign his claim to a return passage to Ceylon.

9. Notwithstanding the preceding regulation the scholar will, with the permission of the Secretary of State for the Colonies or the Governor, be allowed to postpone his return for two years, after the expiration of the scholarship, and to remain in Europe for a further period not exceeding three years, on the distinct understanding that such permission will be given only to enable the scholar to pursue a course of studies or to acquire professional qualifications likely to be of benefit to the Island on his

eventual return. In such cases the scholar will be provided with his passage back to Ceylon on the expiration of the two years or the permitted period of extended stay in Europe, provided that the Director of Colonial Scholars is satisfied that the scholar is in a position to maintain himself during the period of the proposed extension.

10. No scholar shall return to Ceylon during the tenure of his scholarship except during the long vacation and at his own expense and with the permission of the Chief Secretary obtained through the Director of Colonial Scholars. Such permission will be granted only in cases of real need or urgency.

11. No scholar may marry during the tenure of his scholarship. If a scholar proposes to marry during the tenure of his scholarship, he must so inform the Director of Colonial Scholars, who in consultation with the Ceylon Government, will decide what action should be taken in the circumstances.

12. The medical expenses of University Scholars will be paid by Government in cases recommended by the Director of Colonial Scholars, but the total sum which will be paid for any one scholar on this account is limited to £50.

13. The parent or guardian of every University Scholar will be required to execute a bond for an amount of not less than Rs. 1,000 to be utilized to meet medical expenses in excess of £50, which are considered to be necessary by the Director of Colonial Scholars. The Secretary of State may at any time order the return to Ceylon of any University Scholar on the recommendation of the medical advisers to the Colonial Office.

Method and machine for the drying of tea.

Abstract.—The inventor states that one of the disadvantages of present day drying machines is that the drying air flows from the bottom to the top of the machine in a vertical direction, and therefore the leaf at entry does not come into contact with air of the right temperature (70°C). He accordingly describes a machine in which this defect is overcome by providing controllable air ducts which supply fresh warm air to each of the conveyor surfaces from a side. The conveyor surfaces are placed at an incline to prevent the tea from being blown away. The exhaust air may, if desired, be used to preheat the incoming air. A centrifugal fan is used to impel the air into the various ducts.

The machine is fed from the top through a rotary valve. Alternatively, leaf may be blown to the top web by pneumatic means ; this is accomplished by diverting the normal supply to the topmost web through another impeller which supplies the excess pressure necessary to pick up the tea and deliver it to the topmost web. The bottom of the drying chamber has a sloping floor and a beating device to prevent the accumulation of fine dust thereon. From the drying chamber the tea falls *via* a rotary valve into a cold chamber provided with a single endless web where it is brought into contact with cold dried air from another blower. From here it is blown into suitable collecting means.
