By His Excellency Sir ANDREW CALDECOTT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Territories and Dependencies thereof.

KNOW Ye that in pursuance of the provisions of Article 74 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation signify the assent given by His Majesty the King, through one of His Principal Secretaries of State, to the Bill intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the establishment and regulation of a State-aided Bank in Ceylon," which was passed by the State Council on the Twenty-ninth day of March, One thousand Nine hundred and Thirty-eight, and was reserved by me under Article 77 of the aforesaid Order in Council for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure.

Given at Kandy, in the Island of Ceylon, this Eighteenth day of November, One thousand Nine hundred and Thirty-eight.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers of the General Clerical Service holding appointments as Interpreters in Courts and from officers in Classes II. and III. of the General Clerical Service who wish to sit for an examination in both Sinhalese and Tamil with a view to qualifying for appointment as Court Interpreters. The place and date of the examination will be notified later.

2. Applications, which should be forwarded through the Heads of the Departments concerned, should reach this office not later than December 12, 1938.

3. Batta and travelling expenses will be paid to candidates who attain a reasonable standard of interpretation in both vernaculars at the examination.

4. The syllabus of the examination will be as follows :—

## Written Examination.

A. ENGLISH LANGUAGE (one paper of 2 hours).

Questions will be set to test the candidates' (a) power of expression, (b) comprehension of passages of average difficulty (selected from newspapers, official publications, or books by modern authors), and (c) knowledge of idioms of the language.

(N.B.—No questions in grammar will be included.)

B. (i.) TRANSLATION FROM ENGLISH INTO SINHALESE (one paper of 1½ hours).

(ii.) TRANSLATION FROM ENGLISH INTO TAMIL (one paper of 1½ hours).

Candidates will be required to translate one or more of the following :—

A judgment in a Police Court or District Court case ; an extract from an Ordinance, by-law, Gazette Notification or Hansard or other Government Publication.

Candidates will also be required to translate English idiomatic phrases.

C. (i.) TRANSLATION FROM SINHALESE INTO ENGLISH (one paper of 1½ hours).

(ii.) TRANSLATION FROM TAMIL INTO ENGLISH (one paper of 1½ hours).

Candidates will be required to translate into English—

(i.) An article from a newspaper or modern prose book ; (ii.) A manuscript letter, petition, deed or report of average difficulty.

Questions will also be set to test the candidates' ability to translate idiomatic expressions into correct idiomatic English.

*Oral Examination.*

Candidates will be further tested by an oral examination. The following will receive attention :—

Translation of ordinary technical terms in current use; facility of expressions in both languages; pronunciations, knowledge of idioms and idiomatic phrases in both English and the vernacular.

Candidates will be expected to dictate off-hand the translations of an English letter, report, or other official paper put into their hands for the first time.

5. The rules relating to the payment of allowances to Court Interpreters are as follows :—

(1) An allowance of Rs. 10 per mensem will be paid to officers of the General Clerical Service other than members of the Special Class of that Service, who pass examinations in both Sinhalese and Tamil and who are employed as Court Interpreters. Officers employed as Additional Interpreters will not, however, be eligible to draw the allowance.

(2) The payment of the allowance will be subject to the following conditions :—

- (a) no Interpreter shall draw the allowance until he has passed the examination to be held by the Education Department in both Sinhalese and Tamil;
- (b) he shall have interpreted to the satisfaction of the Judge during a period of three months. If he does not satisfy the Judge he shall not draw the Interpreter's allowance even though he has passed the examination. Failure to satisfy the Judge will generally mean transfer to some other post in the Clerical Service, but not necessarily;
- (c) if an officer who has passed the examination and drawn the allowance is transferred and employed on other work he may, on being re-transferred to an Interpreter's post, be paid the allowance without further examination provided that his absence from a post of Court Interpreter is less than one year. If the period of absence is over one year he must interpret to the satisfaction of the Judge during a period of three months before the allowance can be paid.
- (d) the allowance shall be paid from the date of passing the examination or the date of appointment to a post of Interpreter, whichever is the later;
- (e) the allowance in question will not be paid during the period of three months referred to in (b). If the Interpreter satisfies the Judge, he will draw the allowance retrospectively as from the date laid down in (d).

(3) Officers now employed as Interpreters will be required to take the examination before they can draw the allowance.

## RULE.

The Rules for Passenger and Goods Train Traffic and Rates and Classification of Goods published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,514 of February 26, 1926, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,320 of September 30, 1937, are hereby further amended as follows:—

I. Under the heading "Conveyance of Traffic by Passenger Trains"—

(i.) by the substitution for rule 25 of the following new rule:—

"25. *Agricultural Labourers.*—Agricultural labourers employed in farms at Killinochchi and Paranthan shall be charged 1 1/24 cents per mile when travelling to such station from any station in the section Madawachchi-Kankasanturai and *vice versa* on production of certificates signed by the Government Agent or other official as may be notified from time to time. The minimum charge for each labourer shall be 25 cents."

(ii.) by the addition, immediately after the new rule 25, of the following new rules 25A and 25B:—

"25A. *Labourers.*—(1) For the purpose of this rule "registered estate" means any estate registered in the books of the Government Agent of the Province as having 10 acres or more cultivated; "labourer" means a labourer and kangany employed, about to be employed, or discharged from employment on a registered estate or on any public works but does not include a labourer or kangany employed in domestic labour.

(2) Labourers of registered estates in Ceylon and also labourers of Ceylon Government Departments shall be conveyed over the Ceylon Government Railway at the reduced third class rate of 2 cents per mile per adult and one cent per mile per child over three years and under 12 years of age, on the conditions following. In the case of any failure to comply strictly with those conditions full fares shall be charged:—

(a) The minimum charge for each labourer or each child of such labourer shall be 25 cents between the stations, and subject to the terms, hereinafter enumerated. Provided, however, that in the case of infants under three years of age no charge shall be made.

(b) Labourers travelling at the reduced rate shall be entitled to such free baggage not exceeding 30 lb. per labourer as they may take with them in the carriage. The Government shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage caused to such labourers' baggage.

(c) The reduced rate will be accepted at the stations and in respect of the journey specified below:—

(i.) From the Mandapam Segregation Camp in India to stations in Ceylon *via* Talaimannar, on production to the Superintendent of the Camp of tin tickets issued by Superintendents of registered estates in Ceylon, or by Heads of Government Departments, or of "excess labourer" cards issued by the Ceylon Labour Commissioner in India.

(ii.) From Colombo to India *via* Talaimannar on warrants issued by the Labour Commissioner or on certificates on the standard forms supplied by the railway and correctly filled in and signed by an authorized officer of a Government Department.

(iii.) From stations in Ceylon to stations in India *via* Talaimannar to which through bookings are in force, or to Colombo (Maradana or Fort) in the case of labourers returning to India *via* Tuticorin on production of certificates on the standard form supplied by the railway and correctly filled in and signed by the Superintendent of a registered estate or by an authorized officer of a Government Department as laid down hereunder

(d) Books of certificate forms will be supplied free of charge, on application in writing to the General Manager of the Railway, Colombo, to Superintendents of registered estates and Heads of Government Departments.

(e) The certificate must be filled in strictly in accordance with the instructions on the form, and be signed in full on the face and on the back by the Superintendent of the estate or by an authorized officer of a Government Department. The registered letter and the number of the estate, or the name of the Government Department must always be filled in on the face of the certificate, and the number of labourers on the face must correspond with the details on the back, on which the individual name of each labourer (in English) must be inserted in ink, with the full signature of the Superintendent or of the officer of the Government Department immediately under the names. Any alteration on either the face or the back of the certificate must be initialled by the Superintendent or by the officer of the Government Department as the case may be. A book of certificates issued for one estate or one Government Department must not on any account be used for labourers of any other estate or Government Department.

"25B. *Colonists.*—Colonists under the Minneriya Development Scheme shall be conveyed in the third class at a charge of 1 1/24 cents per mile, from Hatamune, Hingurakgoda, and Minneriya to their home stations and *vice versa*, on production at the booking office of certificates from the Revenue Officer, Tamankaduwa, or the Korala of the Sinhala Pattu. The minimum charge for each colonist shall be 25 cents."

(3) in rule 26, by the substitution, for the words "nearest of these starting points" occurring in the second paragraph thereof, of the following:—

"nearest of these starting points; provided that when the reservation is on Government account the charge shall be for the actual distance for which the reserved accommodation is required."

(4) in rule 27—(i.) by the substitution, for the words "the passenger is booked" occurring in the first paragraph thereof, of the following:—

"the passenger is booked. Holders of tickets available for return as well, can purchase return sleeping berth tickets at Rs. 6 each;" and

(ii.) by the substitution, for the words "whether bedding is required or not" occurring in the ninth paragraph thereof, of the following:—

"whether bedding is required or not. Holders of tickets available for return as well can purchase return sleeping berth tickets at Rs. 6 each."

(5) in rule 27A, by the substitution, for the words "the second class fare" occurring in the first paragraph thereof, of the following:—

"the second class fare. Holders of tickets available for return as well, can purchase return sleeping berth tickets at Rs. 3 each."

(6) in rule 32—(i.) by the substitution, in paragraphs (6) and (8), for the expression "Sailors and Soldiers" wherever it occurs in those paragraphs, of the following:—

"Sailors, Soldiers, and Members of the Royal Air Force"

(ii.) by the substitution, for paragraph (9), of the following new paragraph:—

"(9) *Choristers, School Children, and Lads belonging to Boys' Brigades.*—Parties of choristers, school children, and lads belonging to Boys' Brigades under twelve years of age, when not less than twenty in number, will be conveyed at 2/3 of the single fare for the double journey.

Choristers, school children, and brigade lads aged twelve years and over, and teachers accompanying them, will be charged one and a quarter fare for the double journey if the whole party consists of not less than ten persons. These reductions are only granted on production of a letter of authority from the General Manager.

Application to travel at these reduced rates must be made by the clergyman or Principal of the school as the case may be, to the General Manager in terms of paragraph (a) of rule 32."

(iii.) by the substitution, in paragraph (10), for the expression "Naval and Military", or the expression

“ Naval or Military ”, wherever it occurs in that paragraph of the following :—

“ Naval, Military, and Royal Air Force ”

(iv.) in paragraph (12) by the addition immediately after item 19, of the following new item 20 :—

“ 20. House of | Mrs. Napier Clavering | Galgamuwa ’  
Light | | ”

(v.) by the addition immediately after paragraph (18) of the following new paragraphs (19) and (20) :—

“ (19) *Girl Guides*.—Girl Guides travelling in uniform to attend camps and rallies will, on production of a Ticket Voucher from the Secretary, Girl Guides Association in Ceylon, be conveyed at the following fares :—

- (a) Girl Guides under 12 years of age at  $\frac{1}{2}$  single fare for the double journey; and  
(b) Girl Guides aged 12 years and over at  $1\frac{1}{4}$  single fare for the double journey.

(20) *Children of Deaf and Blind School*.—Children of the Deaf and Blind School, Mount Lavinia, and their escorts, on production of warrants issued by the Principal will be conveyed at the following fares :—

- (a) Children under 12 years of age at  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the full fare  
Children aged 12 years and over at  $\frac{1}{2}$  the full fare  
(b) Escorts at  $\frac{1}{2}$  single fare for single journey and at  $1\frac{1}{4}$  single fare for the double journey.”

II. Under the heading “ Passengers’ Luggage ” in rule 33, paragraph (f)—

(1) by the substitution, for the words and figures “ Third Class . . . 56 lb. ”, of the following :—

“ Third class . . . . . 70 lb. ”

(2) by the substitution, for the words “ the whole of the luggage will be weighed and charged for without making any free allowance on the tickets held. ” of the following :—

“ the whole of the luggage will be weighed and charged for as follows :—

- (i.) If the excess weight is more than 25 per cent. of the free allowance the whole weight will be charged for at ordinary parcels rate without making any free allowance on the tickets held.  
(ii.) If the excess weight is not more than 25 per cent. of the free allowance freight at ordinary parcels rate will be charged for only on the excess weight after making free allowance on the tickets held.”

III. Under the heading “ Parcels ”—(1) in rule 35, paragraph (a)—

- (i.) by the substitution, for the words “ Live poultry and pigeons ”, of the words “ Live poultry, pigeons and rabbits ”;  
(ii.) by the substitution, for the words “ fish game ”, of the word “ game ”;  
(iii.) by the substitution, for the words “ frozen meat and poultry ”, of the words “ frozen meat, poultry, and rabbits ”;  
(iv.) in the note thereto, by the substitution for the word “ Poultry ”, of the words “ Poultry, rabbits ”;  
(v.) in the note thereto, by the substitution, for the words “ charged at 50 per cent. increase upon ordinary parcels rate ”, of the words “ charged at ordinary full parcels rate.”

(2) in rule 35, paragraph (b)—

- (i.) by the substitution, for the words “ Country grown fruits ”, of the words “ Fish, country grown fruits ”; and  
(ii.) by the substitution, for the words “ fish, poultry ”, wherever they occur in that paragraph, of the word “ poultry ”.

(3) in rule 36, by the substitution, for the word “ articles ”, of the words “ aerated waters and articles ”

(4) by the addition immediately after rule 37, of the following new rule 37A :—

“ 37A. Parcels of copra samples weighing not more than 5 lb. each, addressed to the Ceylon Coconut Board, Auctioneers and Brokers, in Colombo will be charged 25 cents each or the ordinary parcels rate whichever is lower.”

IV. Under the heading “ Horses, Carriages, Dogs, Motors, &c.”

(1) in rule 50, by the substitution, for the first and second paragraphs thereof, of the following :—

“ 50. *Horses and Carriages*.—Horses and carriages are conveyed at owner’s risk, and the rates for their conveyance are :—

(2) in rule 51, paragraph (b), by the substitution, for the word “ trucks ” occurring in the note thereto, of the words “ trucks except when conveyed on Government Account ”.

(3) in rule 54, by the substitution, for paragraph (a) thereof, of the following :—

“ (a) Dogs conveyed in crates or hampers will be charged for by weight at parcels rates.

For each dog conveyed in the dog locker the charge will be at the rate of 35 cents for every 25 miles or part of 25 miles : provided that half this charge (subject to a minimum of 20 cents) will be made when the owner of the dog travels by the same train.”

(4) by the substitution, for rule 55, of the following new rule :—

“ 55. *Bicycles*.—Bicycles (not packed) when sent as parcels will be conveyed at owner’s risk at the rate of 2 cents each per mile, subject to a minimum charge of 50 cents, fractions of 10 cents being treated as 10 cents. When the owner travels by the same train the charge for the bicycle will be at the rate of half a cent per mile subject to a minimum charge of 15 cents.”

(5) in rule 57, by the substitution, for the words “ Perambulators; mail carts ”, of the words “ mail carts ”.

(6) by the addition, immediately after rule 57, of the following new rule 57A :—

“ 57A. Perambulators will be conveyed at owner’s risk by passenger train at the rate of 4 cents each per mile subject to a minimum charge of Re. 1, fractions of 10 cents being treated as 10 cents. When the owner travels by the same train the charge for the perambulator will be  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the above charge, namely, at the rate of 1 cent per mile subject to a minimum charge of 25 cents.”

V. Under the heading “ Conveyance of Goods Traffic ”—

(1) in rule 22—

(a) by the substitution for paragraph (c), of the following new paragraph :—

“ (c) Copra from all stations to Colombo will be allowed free storage in Colombo Goods Sheds for 5 days (50 working hours). ”

(b) by the re-lettering of paragraphs (d) and (e), as paragraphs (e) and (f), respectively;

(c) by the addition, immediately after paragraph (e), of the following new paragraph (d) :—

“ (d) Coconut produce except copra but including desiccated coconuts, fibre, &c., from all stations to Colombo will be allowed the following free storage in Colombo Goods Sheds :—

- (1) Consignments placed in position for unloading before 12 noon, up to and including the following day.
- (2) Consignments placed in position for unloading after 12 noon, up to and including the third day of arrival.
- (3) Consignments placed in position for unloading after 12 noon on Thursday and before 12 noon on Friday, up to and including the following Monday.
- (4) Consignments placed in position for unloading after 12 noon on Friday, up to and including the following Tuesday.”

(d) by the addition, at the end of paragraph (f), of the following :—

“ Note.—In computing warehouse rent on copra in Colombo all other public holidays which are Bank Holidays as well, will also be considered as *dies non*.”

(2) in rule 35, by the addition at the end of paragraph (a) thereof, of the following :—

“ Consignments of cadjans not exceeding 2 cwt. in weight will be charged for on the actual weight as per classification. But two or more consignments the aggregate weight of which exceeds 2 cwt., sent by one consignor to two or more consignees, or by two or more consignors to one consignee will be charged the above mileage charge and freight on each consignment apportioned *pro rata* according to its weight.”

VI. Under the heading “ Live Stock Traffic ”, in rule 45, by the omission from paragraph (e) thereof of the following words :—

“ and the freight must be prepaid.”

VII. Under the heading “ Special Rates ” in rule 48, by the substitution for paragraph (b) thereof, of the following new paragraph :—

“(b) *Reduced Rates for Cattle.*—Cattle from Polonnaruwa, Manampitiya, Welikande, Valaichchenai, Eravur, Batticaloa, and Tampalakamam to stations distant 100 miles and over will be conveyed at 25 cents per truck per mile.”

VIII. Under the heading “ Concessions ”, in rule 50, by the substitution for paragraph (a) thereof, of the following new paragraph :—

“(a) Country grown paddy and rice will be conveyed at owner's risk on all sections of the Railway at the following rates :—

Consignments of 4 tons and over for distances over 100 miles at 3 cents per ton per mile; for distances 50 miles and over up to 100 miles at 4 cents per ton per mile, and for distances less than 50 miles at 8 cents per ton per mile; consignments of less than 4 tons for distances over 100 miles at 6 cents per ton per mile, and for distances 100 miles and less at 8 cents per ton per mile. But should the freight on the minimum distance or weight calculated at the lower rate provided for the same is less than the freight on actual distance or weight at the higher rate, the lower charge shall be made.”

**GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.****Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Friday, October 7, 1938, at 2.30 p.m.**

Present: Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. E. M. Karunaratne; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. W. Dahanayake; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. A. C. Mohammado; Mr. G. Ross Bell; Mr. J. C. Cooper; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on September 9, 1938, copies thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. To approve the draft boundaries of the present lighting area:—Resolved that the draft boundaries be approved.

3. *Assessment Rates for 1939.*—The Chairman moved:—(a) To make and assess for the calendar year 1939 a uniform assessment rate of 7 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Municipal limits of Galle, a water rate of 6 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the water-served area, and a lighting rate of 4½ per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the area lit with electricity, as required by section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 and in accordance with the provisions of section 2 of Ordinance No. 31 of 1938, payable by four instalments on or before the following dates:—First instalment, on or before March 31, 1939; second instalment, on or before June 30, 1939; third instalment, on or before September 30, 1939; fourth instalment, on or before December 31, 1939. (b) To adopt the valuation of properties for the current year subject to such alterations as the Chairman may from time to time find necessary to make for the purpose of rating for the calendar year 1939.

Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment that the water rate be reduced to 4 per cent., but the amendment fell through for want of a seconder. The Chairman's motion was then put to the Meeting and carried, Mr. W. Dahanayake dissenting as he was opposed to a water rate of 6 per cent.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya asked the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to state, how many written objections he has received with regard to assessments made by the Government Assessor? (2) Have these objections been inquired into by the Chairman? (3) Has the Chairman informed his decisions to the objectors? (4) Is the Chairman aware that the ratepayers are inconvenienced to a great extent as a result of delay in investigating into these objections? (5) Will the Chairman please inquire into these without delay? (6) Is it a fact, that portions of land in the vicinity of Hiyare Reservoir have been allotted to the villagers as small-holdings by the Land Settlement Department?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) 1,068. (2) Up to September 30, 528 objections had been inquired into. (3) Yes. (4) No, but if any inconvenience has been caused to the ratepayers as a result of the delay it is regretted. (5) About 400 objections have still to be reported on by the Local Government Valuer. As soon as these reports are received the remaining objections will be inquired into. (6) Inquiry is being made from the Settlement Officer.

5. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. F. Magdon Ismail, was, with the permission of Council, deferred for the next Meeting:—“That a suitable number of Abyssinian wells be sunk in the Fort for the use of the ratepayers according to the discretion of the Chairman.”

6. Considered a letter from the Secretary to the Minister for Local Administration regarding legislation to enable a Local Authority to assist poor land-owners to rebuild houses where such have been condemned as unfit for human habitation:—Resolved to inform the Minister for Local Administration that the Council agrees to legislation being introduced on the lines proposed.

7. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of September 23, 1938.*

(2) Considered papers relating to the erection of wireless arials.—Recommended that application be made to Government to amend Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 so as to confer on Municipal Councils the power to control wireless arials.

(3) Considered tenders for the construction of side drains on Wackwella road from Hume road junction to the Minuwangoda Railway crossing. Recommended the acceptance of the lowest tender, viz., Rs. 1,409·28 by Y. L. George Silva, provided the Municipal Engineer is satisfied, after due investigation, that this contractor is capable of carrying out the work satisfactorily.

(4) Considered tenders for the following services for 1939 :—

(1) *Supply of Bulls and Drivers for Scavenging Carts.*—Recommended that the tender of L. O. E. de Silva, being the lowest, be accepted, viz., Rs. 36 per mensem for a single bull and driver and Rs. 48 per mensem for a pair of bulls and drivers.

(2) *Supply of Coir Dust.*—Recommended that the tender of E. D. P. de Silva, being the lowest, be accepted, viz., Rs. 10 per 100 bags of 2½ bushels each.

(3) *Supply of Screened Metal and Random Rubble : Metal.*—Recommended that the tender of W. Goonewardena, being the lowest, be accepted, viz., Rs. 7·70, Rs. 9·25, Rs. 10·90, and Rs. 12·40 per cube of 2 in., 1½ in., 1 in., and ¾ in. metal respectively. *Random Rubble.*—Recommended that the tender of W. Goonewardena, being the lowest, be accepted, viz., Rs. 7·50 per cube.

(4) *Supply of Grass.*—Recommended the acceptance of the only tender received, viz., 18 cents for a bundle of 20 lb. and 7 cents for a bundle of 8 lb. by K. Eneris Silva.

(5) *Whitewashing and/or Colour Washing Municipal Buildings during 1939.*—The only tender received was from C. L. M. M. Haniffa for Rs. 125 per quarter, and as the rate for 1938 was Rs. 88 per quarter, it was resolved that consideration be deferred and that meanwhile the Municipal Engineer be requested to report on the rate quoted for 1939 in relation to the quantity of work required to be done.

(6) *Supply of Sea Sand.*—Recommended that this be obtained departmentally as at present.

(7) *Supply of Ekels, Baskets, Coir Yarn, Coconuts, Coconut Oil, Ekkel Brooms, and Coir Brooms.*—Recommended that the tender of W. V. Jinasena, being the lowest, be accepted at the following rates :—*Ekels.*—75 cents per 100 bundles of 50 ekels each ; *Baskets.*—Large size (with lugs) Rs. 1·80 per dozen ; small size (without lugs) Re. 1 per dozen. *Coir Yarn.*—7 cents per lb. *Coconuts.*—Rs. 3·75 per 100. *Coconut Oil.*—25 cents per bottle. *Ekkel Brooms.*—12 cents each. *Coir Brooms.*—12 cents each.

(8) *Lease of Fruit Trees at the Segregation Camp and Infectious Diseases Hospital, Dadalla.*—Recommended that the tender of E. D. P. de Silva for Rs. 150 be accepted.

(5) Supervision of the work of the canal labourers.—Recommended that the arrangement suggested by the Municipal Engineer be approved, viz., that the work of the canal labourers should be supervised by the Waste Detection Overseer.

(6) Considered the question of carrying out all maintenance and repair works on contract.—Recommended that the system of carrying out all maintenance and repair works on contract be adopted as from January 1, 1939, and that the present system be continued till the end of the year according to the schedule of rates approved for 1938. Recommended, further—(1) that heavy equipment, such as bullock rollers, tar sprayer, and tar boiler be supplied by the Council ; (2) that other equipment, such as hand carts and hand rollers be hired out to the contractors, if required by them ; and (3) that all tools and other materials, such as powder, fuse, and steel should be provided by the contractors themselves.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (6) it was resolved that consideration be deferred till the next Meeting. The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of September 23, 1938.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Wards 4 and 6.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) Considered the question of writing off rates due for 1938 on the ground of poverty of the owners.—Recommended that the rates due for 1938 on 207 properties in the town (as per lists submitted) amounting to Rs. 303·71 be waived on the ground of poverty of the owners.

(4) To recommend the following supplemental votes :—(a) Rs. 200 under Head 90—Refunds ; (b) Re. 1 under Head E 25—Interest on Loans.—Recommended.

(5) Application for a gratuity from the widow of R. Mohamad, late Head Fitter of the Waterworks Department.—Recommended, under Rule 24 of the Municipal Pension Minute, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 240, being three months' pay of the office, to the widow, and one month's pay for each of the four minor children.

(7) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, the question of providing rat-proof grain bins in the stalls of the fruit market which are being used for the storage of grain.—Recommended that the lessees of the stalls in which grain is stored be noticed to provide rat-proof bins as required by the regulations relating to grain boutiques.

(8) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, the question of the lease of market stalls, &c., for 1939.—Recommended (1) that in the case of the green market, fruit market, offal market (and rooms), Municipal shops and boutiques, betel shed in the Fort, and room in the fish auction shed, the leases be offered to the present lessees at the same rentals as in 1938, that in the case of those who renew their leases fresh security deposits be taken for 1939, and that in the case of any vacant stalls or rooms the leases be sold by public auction ; (2) that in the case of the fish market and the Dewatte market the stalls be sold by public auction at the rates fixed for 1938 ; (3) that in the case of fruit trees in the Fort, Wackwella road, Katugoda, Elliot road, Weliwatte, Maitipe Hirimbure and at the Bataduwa Depôt, the leases be sold by public auction ; and (4) that in the case of the fruit trees in Victoria Park and the Dadalla Cemetery the leases be offered to the Park-keeper and the Cemetery-keeper respectively at the same rentals as in 1938.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (8) Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment that the rents of the stalls in the fruit market be reduced by 10 per cent., but the amendment fell through for want of a seconder. The recommendation of the Standing Committee was then put to the Meeting and adopted.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were also adopted.

At this stage Mr. W. Dahanayake gave notice of the following motion for the next Meeting of the Council :—“ That the leases of all the stalls in the meat market for 1939 be sold by public auction.”

(c) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of September 23, 1938.*

(1) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, the question of providing rat-proof grain bins in the stalls of the fruit market which are being used for the storage of grain.—Recommended that the lessees of the stalls in which grain is stored be noticed to provide rat-proof bins as required by the regulations relating to grain boutiques.

(2) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, the question of the lease of market stalls, &c., for 1939.—Recommended (1) that in the case of the green market, fruit market, offal market (and room), Municipal shops and boutiques, betel shed in the Fort, and room in the fish auction shed, the leases be offered to the present lessees at the same rentals as in 1938, that in the case of those who renew their leases fresh security deposits be taken for 1939, and that in the case of any vacant stalls or rooms the leases be sold by public auction; (2) that in the case of the fish market and the Dewatte market the stalls be sold by public auction at the rates fixed for 1938; (3) that in the case of fruit trees in the Fort, Wackwella road, Katugoda, Elliot road, Weliwatte, Maitipe, Hirimbure, and at the Bataduwa Dépôt, the leases be sold by public auction; and (4) that in the case of the fruit trees in Victoria Park and the Dadalla Cemetery the leases be offered to the Park-keeper and the Cemetery-keeper respectively at the same rentals as in 1938.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (2) Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment that the rents of the stalls in the fruit market be reduced by 10 per cent., but the amendment fell through for want of a seconder. The recommendation of the Standing Committee was then put to the Meeting and adopted.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item was also adopted.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. M. Karunaratne moved:—In the opinion of this Council, it is not desirable to make use of any buildings or sheds at the Segregation Camp, Dadalla, as a temporary hospital for patients suffering from tuberculosis. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, and Messrs. Thomas Amarasuriya and W. Dahanayake supported the motion. Dr. A. T. Kuriyan explained that the application was made for the benefit of the tuberculosis patients in Galle and because there was no room for such patients in any hospital. He did not consider that there would be any danger of infection to the residents of the locality. The Chairman agreed with Dr. Kuriyan and said that the resolution passed by Council at the August Meeting was a charitable one and should not be rescinded. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the Meeting and carried by 8 votes to 4.

9. Pursuant to notice Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya asked the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to state whether the registration of voters entrusted to temporary clerks was supervised by a permanent officer of the Council? (2) How much has been spent by the Council in connection with the registration of voters? (3) Have the ten temporary clerks been paid in full for their services? (4) Is it a fact that these clerks were not furnished with plans or sketches of the respective wards they were entrusted with? (5) Is the Chairman aware that according to a report which appeared in the "The Ceylon Daily News" of September 26, 1938, a member of a deputation in the course of his remarks to the Minister for Local Administration stated as follows:—"These clerks had not been instructed to call at each and every house, nor had they been given plans or sketches of the wards they had to cover."

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The outdoor work of the temporary clerks was supervised by the Ward Inspectors and the office work by the Secretary. (2) Rs. 521.65 up to September 30. (3) Yes. (4) No. (5) Yes, but as I was not present myself on the occasion I am unable to say whether such a statement was made. But if a Member of a deputation did make such a statement it was an incorrect statement.

Arising out of these replies Mr. W. Dahanayake gave notice of the following supplemental question for the next Meeting:—"If there were instructions and the work was supervised, how was it that a large number of voters were left out of the lists."

10. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. M. Karunaratne asked the following questions:—(1) Did the Chairman receive a letter dated July 21, 1938, from Mr. C. W. Goonewardene, retired Secretary of the District Court, Galle, in which he drew the Chairman's attention to a noticeboard that had been put up on the lane leading from Bataganwila to Kitulampitiya, with the word "Private" written on it? (2) Is not the lane in question a "Street" vested in the Municipal Council? (3) Is the Chairman aware that this is a path used by the members of the general public? (4) Has a reply been sent to Mr. Goonewardene's letter? (5) What steps, if any, have been taken by the Chairman to conserve the rights of the public and to have the notice board in question removed?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Yes. (2) Inquiry is being made. (3) Inquiry is being made. (4) No reply has been sent yet pending full inquiry. (5) If the rights of the public as claimed are established I shall take steps to conserve them and have the notice board removed.

11. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayake moved:—(1) That Osira mercury vapour lamps be installed at the following important and busy centres:—Kaluwella Junction, Old Bus Stand Junction, Dewatte Junction, Sarenthukade Junction, Beligaha Junction, Joolgaha Junction, Kalegarte Junction, Pedurugewala Junction near the Minuwangoda Railway level crossing, and Dangedera Junction. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. On the suggestion of the Chairman the mover, with the permission of Council, amended the motion by deleting the word "Osira". The Chairman stated that the Superintendent of the Electricity Department had reported that the approximate cost of installing these lamps would be Rs. 2,500. The Superintendent had suggested that in addition to the places mentioned the two entrances to the Fort be also be lit with Mercury vapour lamps, the cost of which would be approximately Rs. 175. This suggestion was agreed to. The motion, as amended, was then put to the Meeting and carried unanimously. It was further resolved that a supplementary vote of Rs. 2,675 be sanctioned for the purpose.

(2) That one of the conditions in leasing out the meat stalls for 1939 be that they should be closed on Wesak Day, as it was done this year. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. Mr. A. C. Mohammodo opposed the motion. The mover replied. The motion was then put to the Meeting and resulted in six members voting for and six against. The Chairman thereupon gave his casting vote against the motion which was accordingly declared lost. The division was as follows:—*For*: Messrs. W. Dahanayake, Thomas Amarasuriya, J. E. Perera, E. M. Karunaratne, G. Ross Bell, and J. C. Cooper. *Against*: The Chairman and Messrs. F. Magdon Ismail, A. C. Mohammodo, A. I. H. A. Wahab, R. L. Ephraums, and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

12. The following motion which also stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayake was ruled out of order by the Chairman:—"In view of the fact that the water level in the Hiyare Reservoir has risen considerably, an extra hour's service be granted before noon and an extra hour's service after noon."

13. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council:—Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on Friday, November 11, 1938, at 2.30 P.M.
