## REGULATIONS.

*Motor Traffic Advisory Board.*

1. The Commissioner shall give to each member of the Board not less than five clear days' notice, exclusive of Sundays and public holidays, of the date fixed for each meeting of the Board.
2. (1) Unless the Commissioner otherwise directs, every meeting of the Board shall be held at the office of the Commissioner.  
(2) At every meeting, three members including the Chairman, shall form a quorum.
3. In the absence of the Commissioner from any meeting of the Board, a member of the Board elected by the majority of the members present shall preside at the meeting.
4. The Commissioner shall cause a record of the minutes of all meetings of the Board to be kept in a Minute Book.
5. Where a request is made to the Chairman under section 3 (4) of the Ordinance, to summon a meeting of the Board such request shall specify the purpose for which the meeting is to be summoned.
6. The business of the Board may be conducted so far as is practicable by the circulation of papers amongst the members of the Board.

## REGULATIONS.

*Manner in which objections may be made under section 46 (3), and the procedure to be followed by the Commissioner in the hearing of such objections.*

1. Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry shall be distinctly written upon good and suitable paper and shall be signed by the person making it. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm, it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm as the case may be.
2. Every objection shall state the specific grounds on which it is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

3. The Commissioner may refuse to consider any objection which does not comply with the provisions of any of the foregoing Regulations.

4. The Commissioner may refuse to consider any objection which is received by him after the date specified in the list of applications published in the *Gazette* under section 46 (1) of the Ordinance.

Where any tree within the Malimboda Subdivision, or the branch, fruit or leaf of such a tree is likely to fall upon any building or likely to be dangerous to the occupants of such building or where any tree, branch, fruit or leaf overhangs any road, path or paddy field or is in a condition dangerous to any property of the inhabitants of the Subdivision, the Chairman, may by a notice in writing served on the owner, lessee or occupier of the land upon which the tree stands, require such owner, lessee or occupier to cut down the tree, branch, fruit or leaf as the case may be within such time as may be specified in such notice; and if such owner, lessee or occupier fails within the specified time to comply with the requirements of the notice, any officer or workman authorized by the Chairman in writing may enter upon such land and, at the expense of the owner, lessee or occupier, do what the owner, lessee or occupier was required to do by the notice.

The Quarantine Regulations made under sections 4 and 5 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,029 of January 26, 1934, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,399 of September 30, 1938, are hereby further amended in the schedule to these regulations, by the addition, at the end of item 8A headed "Fumigation of Merchandise arriving from plague-infected ports", of the following:—

"For any work done in connection with the opening up of lighters for ventilation, or the testing and releasing of lighters, between 5 P.M. on any day and 7 A.M. on the following day, an overtime charge of Rs. 10 per hour or part thereof, shall be payable.

Where any lighter is left unattended at the fumigation moorings from 5 P.M. on any day for release after 7 A.M. on the following day, no overtime charge shall be payable.

*Note.*—These charges are credited to general revenue."

Improvements in or relating to the production of folded textile threads.

*Abstract.*—The inventor claims the method of producing folded textile thread with a low degree of twist by winding a plurality of threads into one package with a taper wind and drawing the said threads together from the single package to the holder upon which the ply yarn is to be employed. The taper winding is performed by the use of known machines such as bottle bobbin winding or pirn winding machines.

As an example of the use of this method, thread from two kinds of cops are wound on separate bottle bobbins. The two threads are now run together on to a single bottle bobbin, from which it is run off as the low-twist thread. The taper winding ensures that in the ultimate unwinding the degree of twist is uniform, without variation in the tension of the threads.

Improvements relating to the dyeing of textile fibres.

*Abstract.*—The object of the invention is to impart colour patterns to wound packages of textile fibrous material. The thread is first wound on a tubular holder over which is drawn a permeable sleeve of soft material such as stockinette. After winding, the tube is withdrawn, thereby allowing the core of the package to expand inward and to become permeable to the colouring matter. A perforated sleeve of lesser diameter than the original holder is then fitted into the package.

The application of the pattern consists in mounting the prepared package on a hollow mandrel and lowering on to it a stencil in such a way that the uncut portion of the stencil compresses the package and prevents the penetration of the colouring medium, whereas the cut portions allow the liquid to pass through. The stencil itself forms the bottom of a colour container. A suitable quantity of colouring matter is introduced into this container and is drawn through the package by a vacuum-creating means connected to the mandrel. The mandrel may or may not be patterned to correspond to the stencil.

Suitable machinery for carrying out the process is described.

Waterproof Compound Paper, Cardboard, and the like.

*Abstract.*—Waterproof packing material is made by cementing two or more layers of cardboard or paper with concentrated latex of such a character that on evaporation a tough membrane of rubber is left between the layers of cardboard. When thick packing material is required only the outer layers need to be cemented with latex, the other layers being cemented with agglutinants other than latex or consisting only partly of latex. The membrane of rubber should be of sufficient thickness to allow some movement of the surface layer in relation to the base. The surfaces to be united with latex should have a smooth surface and be impervious to latex. Concentrated latex should be used to which a strongly adhesive quality is imparted by the addition of partly decomposed latex, gum arabic, wood tar or the like. Too much pressure should be avoided in cementing the layers.

Material made in this manner besides being impervious to water is capable of being folded without fracture to make boxes, &c. If necessary the material may be waterproofed on both sides.

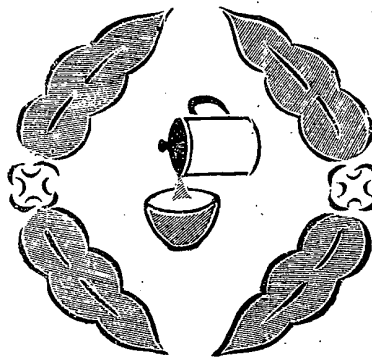
