Text.

CONVENTION BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY IN RESPECT OF THE United Kingdom and His Majesty the King of Yugoslavia regarding Legal Proceedings in CIVIL AND COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

London, February 27, 1936.

[Ratifications exchanged at Belgrade on June 18, 1937.]

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and His Majesty the King of Yugoslavia by the Council of Regency,

Being desirous to render mutual assistance in the conduct of legal proceedings in civil and commercial matters which are being dealt with or which it is anticipated may be dealt with by their respective judicial authorities;

Have resolved to conclude a Convention for this purpose

and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

The Right Honourable Anthony Eden, M.C. M.P., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and

His Majesty the King of Yugoslavia by the Council of Regency: M. Slavko

Grouitch, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in London;

M. Milan Kugler, Judge of the Court of Cassation at Zagreb;

Who, having communicated their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:

I.—Preliminary.

ARTICLE 1.

(a) Except where the contrary is expressly stated, this Convention applies only to civil and commercial matters, including non-contentious matters.

(b) In this Convention the words:

(1) "territory of one (or of the other) High Contracting shall be interpreted (a) in relation to His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, as meaning England and Wales and all territories in respect of which the Convention is in force by reason of extensions under Article 17 or accessions under Article 18; and (b) in relation to His Majesty the King of Yugoslavia, the Kingdom of Yugoslavia;

(2) "persons" shall be deemed to mean individuals and artificial reference.

and artificial persons;
(3) "artificial persons" shall be deemed to include

partnerships, companies, societies and corporations;

(4) "nationals of a High Contracting Party" shall be deemed to include artificial persons constituted or incorporated under the laws of the territory

of such High Contracting Party;
(5) "nationals of one (or of the other) High Contracting
Party" shall be deemed (a) in relation to His
Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, to mean all subjects of His Majesty wherever domiciled, and all persons under His protection; and (b) in relation to His Majesty the King of Yugoslavia all Yugoslavian citizens.

II.—Service of Judicial and Extra-Judicial Documents.

ARTICLE 2.

(a) When judicial or extra-judicial documents drawn up in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties are required by a judicial authority situated therein to be served on persons in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such documents may be served on the recipient, whatever his nationality, by any of the methods provided in Articles 3 and 4 in all cases where such method

of service is recognised by the law of the country of origin.

(b) In Part II. of this Convention the expression

"country of origin" means the country from which the
documents to be served emanate, and the expression

"country of execution" means the country in which service

of documents is to be effected.

ARTICLE 3.

(a) A request for service shall be addressed and sent by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer acting for the country of origin to the competent authority of the country of execution, requesting such authority to cause the document in question to be served.

(b) The request for service shall be drawn up in the language of the country of execution and shall state the names and descriptions of the parties, the name, description and address of the recipient, and the nature of the document to be served, and shall enclose the document to be served either in duplicate or accompanied by a certified copy.

(c) The document to be served shall either be drawn up in the language of the country of execution, or be accompanied by a translation into such language in duplicate. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer acting for the country of origin.

(d) Requests for service shall be addressed and sent:

In England to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

In Yugoslavia to the Ministry of Justice.

If the authority to whom a request for service has been ent is not competent to execute it, such authority shall (except in cases where execution is refused in accordance with paragraph (f) of this Article) of his own motion forward the request to the competent authority of the country

(e) Service shall be effected by the competent authority of the country of execution, who shall serve the document in the manner prescribed by the law of such country for the service of similar documents, except that, if a wish for some special manner of service is expressed in the request for service, such manner of service shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law of that country.

(f) The execution of a request for service, duly made in accordance with the preceding provisions of this Article, shall not be refused unless (1) the authenticity of the request for service is not established, or (2) the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be executed considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.

(g) In every instance where a request for service is not executed by the authority to whom it has been sent, the latter will at once inform the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request was sent, stating the ground on which the execution of the request has been refused or the com-

petent authority to whom it has been forwarded.

(h) The authority by whom the request for service is executed shall furnish a certificate proving the service or explaining the reason which has prevented such service, and setting forth the fact, the manner and the date of such service or attempted service, and shall send the said certificate to the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom the request for service was sent. The certificate of service or of attempted service shall be placed on one of the duplicate documents or on the certified copy or attached thereto.

ARTICLE 4.

- (a) Service may be effected, without any request to or intervention of the authorities of the country of execution, by any of the following methods:-
 - (1) By a Diplomatic or Consular Officer acting for the country of origin; (2) Through the post.

(b) All documents served in the manner provided in (1) of the preceding paragraph shall, unless the recipient is a national of the High Contracting Party from whose territory the document to be served emanates, either be drawn up in the language of the country of execution or be accompanied by a translation into such language, certified as correct as prescribed in Article 3 (c).

(c) The High Contracting Parties agree that in principle it is also desirable that the provisions of paragraph (b) of this Article should apply to documents served in the manner provided in (2) of paragraph (a) of this Article. Nevertheless, in the absence of any legislation in their respective territories making translations obligatory in such cases, the High Contracting Parties do not accept

any obligation in this respect.

(d) It is understood that the question of the validity of any service effected by the use of any of the methods referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article will remain a matter for the free determination of the respective courts of the High Contracting Parties in accordance with their

ARTICLE 5.

(a) In any case where documents have been served in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, the High Contracting Party, by whose Diplomatic or Consular Officer the request for service was addressed, shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any charges and expenses which are payable under the law of the country of execution to the persons employed to effect service, and any charges and expenses incurred in effecting service in a special manner. These charges and expenses shall not exceed such as are usually allowed in the courts of that country.

(b) Repayment of these charges and expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the service has been effected from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer

by whom the request was addressed, when sending to him the certificate provided for in Article 3 (h).

(c) Except as provided above, no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the service of any documents.

III.—Taking of Evidence.

ARTICLE 6.

(a) When a judicial authority in the territory of one of the High Contracting Parties requires that evidence should be taken in the territory of the other High Contracting Party, such evidence may be taken, whatever the nationality of the parties or witnesses may be, in any one of the ways prescribed in Article 7 or 8.

(b) In Part III. of this Convention, the expressions—

(1) "Taking of evidence" shall be deemed to include the taking of the statements of a plaintiff, defendant, expert or any other person on oath or otherwise; the submission to a plaintiff, defendant, expert or any other person of any oath with regard to any legal proceedings and the production, identification and examination of documents, samples or other objects.

(2) "Witness" shall be deemed to include any person from whom any evidence, as defined above, is

required to be taken.
(3) "Country of origin" shall be deemed to mean the country by whose judicial authority the evidence is required, and "country of execution," the country in which the evidence is to be taken.

ARTICLE 7.

- (a) The judicial authority of the country of origin may, in accordance with the provisions of the law of his country, address himself by means of a Letter of Request to the competent authority of the country of execution, requesting such authority to take the evidence.
- (b) The Letter of Request shall be drawn up in the language of the country of execution, or be accompanied a translation into such language. Such translation shall be certified as correct by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer acting for the country of origin. The Letter of Request shall state the nature of the proceedings for which the evidence is required, giving all necessary information in regard thereto, the names of the parties thereto, and the names, descriptions and addresses of the witnesses. They shall also either (1) be accompanied by a list of interrogatories to be put to the witness or witnesses, or, as the case may be, by a description of the documents, samples or other objects to be produced, identified or examined, and a translation thereof, certified as correct in the manner heretofore provided; or (2) shall request the competent authority to allow such questions to be asked *viva voce* as the parties or their representatives shall desire to ask.
 - (c) Letters of Request shall be transmitted-
 - In England by a Yugoslav Diplomatic or Consular Officer to the Senior Master of the Supreme Court of
 - In Yugoslavia by a British Consular Officer to the Ministry of Justice.

In case the authority to whom any Letter of Request is transmitted is not competent to execute it, such authority shall (except in cases where execution is refused in accordance with paragraph (f) of this Article) of his own motion forward the Letter of Request to the competent authority of the country of execution.

(d) The competent authority of the country of execution shall give effect to the Letter of Request and obtain the evidence required by the use of the same compulsory measures and the same procedure as are employed in the execution of a commission or order emanating from the authorities of his own country, except that if a wish that some special procedure should be followed is expressed in the Letter of Request, such special procedure shall be followed in so far as it is not incompatible with the law

of the country of execution.

(e) The Diplomatic or Consular Officer, by whom the Letter of Request is transmitted, shall, if he so desires, be informed of the date when and the place where the proceedings will take place, in order that he may inform the interested party or parties, who shall be permitted to be present in person or to be represented, if they so desire, by any representatives who are competent to appear before the courts either of the country of origin or of the country of execution.

(f) The execution of a Letter of Request which complies with the preceding provisions of this Article can only be

- (1) If the authenticity of the Letter of Request is not established:
- (2) If, in the country of execution, the execution of the Letter of Request in question does not fall within the functions of the judiciary;
- (3) If the High Contracting Party in whose territory it is to be executed considers that his sovereignty or safety would be compromised thereby.
- (g) In every instance where a Letter of Request is not executed by the authority to whom it is addressed, the latter will at once inform the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted, stating the grounds on which the execution of the Letter of Request has been refused, or the competent authority to whom it has been forwarded.
- (h) When a Letter of Request has been executed, the competent authority to whom it was transmitted or forwarded shall send to the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted the necessary documents establishing its execution.

ARTICLE S.

(a) The evidence may also be taken, without any request to or the intervention of the authorities of the country of

execution by a Diplomatic or Consular Officer in that country acting for the country of origin appointed for this purpose by the court in that country.

(b) An officer so appointed to take evidence may request

the individuals named by the court appointing him to appear before him and to give evidence. He may take all kinds of evidence which are not contrary to the law of the country of execution. The attendance and giving of evidence before any such officer shall be entirely voluntary and no measures of compulsion shall be employed.

(c) Requests to appear issued by such officer shall, unless (c) Requests to appear issued by stein times stain, times the recipient is a national of the High Contracting Party for whose judicial authority the evidence is required, be drawn up in the language of the country of execution or be accompanied by a translation into such language.

(d) The evidence may be taken in accordance with the procedure recognised by the law of the country of origin, and the parties will have the right to be present in person or to be represented by any representatives who are competent to appear before the courts either of the country of origin or of the country of execution.

ARTICLE 9.

The fact that an attempt to take evidence by the method laid down in Article 8 has failed owing to the refusal of any witness to appear or to give evidence does not preclude a request being subsequently made in accordance with Article 7.

ARTICLE 10.

(a) Where evidence is taken in the manner provided in Article 7 the High Contracting Party, by whose judicial authority the Letter of Request was addressed, shall repay to the other High Contracting Party any expenses incurred by the competent authority of the latter in the execution of the request in respect of any charges and expenses payable to witnesses, experts, interpreters, or translators, the costs of obtaining the attendance of witnesses who have not appeared voluntarily, and the charges and expenses payable to any person whom such authority may have deputed to act, in cases where the law of the country of execution permits this to be done, and any charges and expenses incurred by reason of a special procedure being requested and followed. These expenses shall be such as are usually allowed in similar cases in the courts of the country of execution.

(b) The repayment of these expenses shall be claimed by the competent authority by whom the Letter of Request has been executed from the Diplomatic or Consular Officer by whom it was transmitted when sending to him the documents establishing its execution as provided in Article 7 (h).

(c) Except as above provided no fees of any description shall be payable by one High Contracting Party to the other in respect of the taking of evidence.

IV .- Provisions relating to Equality of Treatment in Judicial Matters.

ARTICLE 11.

Legal Protection and Access to the Courts of Justice.

(a) The nationals of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territories of the other the same rights in respect of the legal protection of person and property, and shall have free access to the courts of justice for the prosecution or defence of their rights under the same conditions (including the taxes and fees payable), as nationals of the latter High Contracting Party.

(b) This Article applies to criminal as well as to civil and

commercial matters.

ARTICLE 12.

Security for Costs.

- (a) The nationals of one High Contracting Party resident in a territory of the other, where the proceedings are brought, shall not be compelled to give security for costs or court fees in any case where a national of such other High Contracting Party would not be so compelled in similar circumstances.
- (b) The nationals of one High Contracting Party, resident outside the territory of the other, where the proceedings are brought, shall not be obliged to give security for costs or court fees in any case where they possess in that territory "immovable property" or other property not readily transferable which is sufficient to cover these costs and fees.
- (c) It is understood that the interpretation of the expressions "immovable property" and "property not readily transferable" is a matter within the exclusive competence of the respective courts of the High Contracting Parties.

ARTICLE 13.

Free Legal Assistance.

(a) The nationals of one High Contracting Party shall enjoy in the territories of the other High Contracting Party a perfect equality of treatment with nationals of the latter High Contracting Party as regards free legal assistance for poor persons.

(b) The provisions of this Article apply to criminal as well as to civil and commercial matters, but do not apply

to artificial persons.

ARTICLE 14.

Imprisonment for Debt.

(a) The nationals of one High Contracting Party shall not in the territories of the other High Contracting Party be liable to imprisonment as a means of execution for debt or as a conservatory measure in any case where the nationals of the other High Contracting Party would not be so liable.

(b) The provisions of this Article do not apply to artificial persons.

V.—General Provisions.

ARTICLE 15.

Any difficulties which may arise in connexion with the operation of this Convention shall be settled through the diplomatic channel.

ARTICLE 16.

The present Convention, of which the English and Yugoslav texts are equally authentic, shall be subject to ratification. Ratifications shall be exchanged in Belgrade. The Convention shall come into force two months after the date on which ratifications are exchanged and shall remain in force for three years after the date of its coming into force. If neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice through the diplomatic channel to the other not less than six months before the expiration of the said period of three years of his intention to terminate the Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to terminate it.

ARTICLE 17.

(a) This Convention shall not apply ipso facto to Scotland, Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, nor to any of the Colonies, overseas territories or Protectorates of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, nor to any territories under His suzerainty, nor to any Mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Government in the United Kingdom, but His Majesty may at any time, while this Convention is in force under Article 16 by a notification given through His Minister at Belgrade, extend the operation of the Convention to any of the above-mentioned territories.

(b) Such notification shall state the authorities in the territory concerned to whom requests for service under Article 3 or Letters of Request under Article 7 are to be transmitted, and the language in which communications and translations are to be made. The date of the coming into force of any such extension shall be two months force. into force of any such extension shall be two months from

the date of such notification.

(c) Either of the High Contracting Parties may, at any time after the expiry of three years from the coming into force of an extension of this Convention to any of the territories referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article, terminate such extension on giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel.

(d) The termination of the Convention under Article 16 shall, unless otherwise expressly agreed to by both High Contracting Parties, ipso facto terminate it in respect of any territories to which it has been extended under para-

graph (a) of this Article.

ARTICLE 18.

(a) The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, may at any time, while the present Convention is in force, either under Article 16 or by virtue of any accession under this Article, by a notification given through the diplomatic channel, accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations whose Government may desire that such accession should be effected, provided that no notification of accession may be given at any time when His Majesty the King of Yugoslavia has given notice of termination in respect of all the territories of His Majesty to which the Convention applies. The provisions of Article 17 (b) shall be applicable to such notification. Any such accession shall take effect two months after the date of its notification.

(b) After the expiry of three years from the date of the coming into force of any accession under paragraph (a) of this Article, either of the High Contracting Parties may, by giving six months' notice of termination through the diplomatic channel, terminate the application of the Convention to any country in respect of which a notification of accession has been given. The termination of the Convention under Article 16 shall not affect its application to any such country.

(c) Any notification of accession under paragraph (a) of this Article may include any dependency or mandated territory administered by the Government of the country in respect of which such notification of accession is given; and any notice of termination in respect of any such country under paragraph (b) shall apply to any dependency or mandated territory which was included in the notification

of accession in respect of that country.

REGULATIONS.

$Tribunal\ of\ Appeal.$

- 1. Every appeal under section 50 of the Ordinance against any decision of the Commissioner shall be signed by the appellant and shall-
 - (a) be made by a written petition in the English, Sinhalese or Tamil language substantially in the form set out in the Schedule to these regulations;

(b) contain a concise statement of the grounds upon which the appeal is preferred;

- (c) bear uncancelled revenue stamps to the value of ten rupees.
- 2. (a) Every petition of appeal shall be sent to the Commissioner by registered post or personally delivered so as to be received at the office of the Commissioner before the expiry of a period of ten days, exclusive of Sundays and public holidays, from the date on which the notice of the decision against which the appeal is preferred should in the ordinary course of post have been delivered to the appellant. In any case where a petition of appeal is personally delivered at the office of the Commissioner, the Commissioner shall issue a written acknowledgment of the receipt thereof.
- (b) No petition of appeal which is received by the Commissioner after the expiry of the period referred to in paragraph (a) shall be considered by the Tribunal.

3. The Commissioner shall keep and maintain a register of appeals and shall on the receipt of a petition of appeal assign a number to that petition and cause that number and the date on which the petition is received to be entered on the register, together with such other particulars as the Commissioner may deem necessary or as the Tribunal of Appeal may direct.

4. The Tribunal of Appeal may from time to time determine the places at which appeals shall be heard.

5. (a) The Commissioner shall as soon as may be after the receipt of a petition of appeal inform the appellant, by written notice despatched by registered post, of the date on which and the time and place at which the appeal will be heard by the Tribunal, and where the appeal is preferred against a decision to issue a licence, shall in addition despatch a like notice to the applicant for that licence.

(b) Every notice under paragraph (a) shall be despatched not less than seven days before the date specified therein as the date on which the appeal will be heard by the

Tribunal of Appeal.

6. The Tribunal of Appeal may on its own motion, or upon application made by any appellant or by any applicant to whom a notice has been despatched under regulation 5, fix a special date for the hearing of any appeal, and may where the hearing of any appeal is not concluded on the date specified in a notice under regulation 5 or fixed under this regulation, fix a further date or dates for the hearing of the appeal.

7. Where an appellant fails to appear on any date fixed for the hearing of his appeal, the Tribunal may dismiss the appeal or may, if it thinks fit, consider the appeal and make

such order thereon as to it may seem just.

8. The appellant and the Commissioner and, in the case of an appeal against a decision to issue a licence, the applicant for that licence shall be entitled to be present and to be heard at the hearing of the appeal either in person or by representative authorized in writing for the purpose. Where the Commissioner or any applicant for a licence or any such representative is heard in support of any decision, the appellant or his representative shall have the right of reply.

reply.

9. The Tribunal of Appeal may during the hearing of any appeal call for such evidence, oral or documentary as it may consider necessary for the adjudication of any matter

or matters at issue in the appeal.

10. In case of any difference of opinion among the members of the Tribunal of Appeal, the decision of the majority of them shall be deemed to be the decision of the Tribunal.

Tribunal.

11. The decision of the Tribunal of Appeal shall be reduced to writing dated as of the date on which it is given, and a copy thereof shall be transmitted or delivered by the Commissioner to each of the parties to the appeal within three days of such date.

12. (1) Where the Tribunal of Appeal is satisfied that any appeal preferred to it is frivolous, it may order the appellant to pay a sum not exceeding fifty rupees as costs.

(2) The sum ordered by the Tribunal to be paid by any appellant as costs in any appeal shall be paid by such appellant within fourteen days from the making of the order by the Tribunal

13. The remuneration payable to each member of the Tribunal shall be fifty rupees for a working day exceeding two hours and twenty-five rupees for a working day not exceeding two hours.

THE STATISTICS ORDINANCE, No. 44 of 1935.

IT is hereby notified in terms of section 14 (1) of the Statistics Ordinance, No. 44 of 1935, that the following regulations, made by the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce in pursuance of the powers vested in that Committee by section 13 of the Ordinance, have been approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Paddy Statistics Regulations, 1938.

2. All returns called for under these regulations shall be furnished to the Director of Statistics, Colombo, or to any other officer authorized by him.

3. Every Government Agent and Assistant Government Agent shall be responsible for the enforcement of these regulations within his Province or Revenue District,

as the case may be.
4. Every Govern

4. Every Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall impose the duty of keeping records and collecting paddy statistics under these regulations upon such of his subordinate officers hereinafter referred to as Collecting Officers, as he may deem fit, and assign to each such Collecting Officer an area of paddy land for the statistics relating to which he is to be responsible.

5. Every Collecting Officer shall keep a record in the Form I. set out in the Schedule for the area of paddy land

assigned to him.

6. Every cultivator shall whenever called upon to do so furnish the Collecting Officer with all the information necessary for the keeping of the records referred to in regulation 5.

7. The records referred to in regulation 5 shall be open to inspection by any superior officer of the Collecting Officers or by any officer authorized by the Director of Statistics.

Statistics.

8. Every Collecting Officer shall furnish in the Form II. set out in the Schedule a return of the total acreage of asweddumized land capable of cultivation and the total acreage sown in his area.

9. The return referred to in regulation 8 shall be made twice a year, and forwarded to the Director of Statistics—

- (a) in the case of the Maha Season not later than the 30th day of October in each year, and
- (b) in the case of the Yala Season not later than the 30th day of April in each year.

10. Every Collecting Officer shall furnish in the Form III. set out in the Schedule a return of the expected yield of paddy for each season.

11. The return referred to in regulation 10 shall be made twice a year in January and in May, and forwarded to the Director of Statistics or other officer authorized by him not later than the 10th day of January and the 10th day of May respectively.

Every Collecting Officer shall furnish in the Form IV. set out in the Schedule, a return of the total acreage sown, the total acreage of paddy harvested and the total yield of paddy realized.

13. The return referred to in regulation 12 shall be made twice a year, and forwarded to the Director of Statistics or other officer authorized by him—

- (a) for the Maha Season not later than the last day of March, and
- (b) for the Yala Season not later than the last day of August.
- Where the return referred to in regulation 13 is made in terms of the local measures, a statement must be attached showing the relationship of such measure to the standard acre and bushel.







Marshall's Tea Machinery, Company, Limited.

Improvements in or relating to machines for bruising or crushing and sifting rolled tea leaf.

Abstract.—The inventors describe a combined sifting and crushing machine for black tea. The sifting portion consists of a perforated stepped tray which is oscillated in the usual manner by cranks and "legs". Beneath and suspended from this tray is another stepped tray with finer perforations. The feed hopper is provided with a rake with prongs to break up the balls of leaf. Tea after the first rolling is fed into the machine where it is divided into three grades by the action of the sieves. The portion that passes over the top sieve before being crushed is subjected to the action of a wiper with rotating blades by which the leaves are combed level.

The crusher consists of a solid corrugated crushing drum resting on which is another corrugated drum comprising a number of independently movable sections. These sections press by their own weight against the solid drum and are free to rise against any obstruction. The solid drum is driven at the higher speed. Tea which falls between the rollers is cut or broken according to whether the corrugations are sharp or blunt.

A rotary sifter may be used instead of the stepped sifter described.

The advantages arising from the use of the invention are stated to be (1) saving of time in the treatment of tea (2) equalizing of the time of fermentation in each of the grades, and (3) improvement of the aeration of the leaf.

There are nine claims and one sheet of drawings.
