ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1891 INTITULED "AN ORDINANCE TO INCORPORATE THE PUBLIC SERVICE MUTUAL PROVIDENT ASSOCIATION".

RULE made by "The Public Service Mutual Provident Association" under section 14 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1891, intituled "An Ordinance to incorporate the Public Service Mutual Provident Association", and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULE.

The rules dated June 14, 1892, and published in *Gazette* No. 5,147 of June 17, 1892, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,208 of March 13, 1936, are hereby further amended by the addition, at the end thereof, of the following new chapters:—

CHAPTER III.—PROVIDENT FUND RULES.

1. Every monthly paid permanent employee of the Association (other than pensionable officers seconded from the Government Service for service with the Association and the persons specified by name in the Schedule to this Chapter) shall, as a condition of his being employed by the Association, become a member of the Fund established by these rules.

Membership of
the Fund.

2. (1) Every member shall, from the date on which this chapter comes into operation, or where a member is first employed by the Association after this chapter has come into operation from the date on which he is first employed by the Association, contribute monthly to the Fund, from his monthly salary, a sum equal to five per centum thereof.

Member's
contributions.

(2) The contribution shall be levied from a member's salary by abatement made on the Association's pay sheet, and every abatement so made shall be deemed, for the purpose of computing the interest due upon the members' contributions, to have been credited to the Fund on the last day of the month for which the salary was due.

(3) In the event of any such abatement not having been duly made from any monthly salary, the member from whose salary it should have been made shall pay to the Joint Secretary and Treasurer, within a period of fifteen days after the receipt by him of such salary, the sum due from him as his contribution to the Fund in respect of the month for which the salary has been paid; and, for the purpose of computing the interest due upon such sum, such sum shall be deemed to have been paid on the last day of the month in the course of which it was received by the Joint Secretary and Treasurer.

(4) The amount of every abatement shall be computed on the actual sum payable to the member on account of salary for the month in respect of which the abatement is made and no contribution shall be due in respect of any period of leave without pay.

3. (1) On the first day of each financial year there shall be placed to the credit of every member in the books of the Fund, a bonus equal to the total sum contributed by such member to the fund during the preceding financial year.

Contributions
by the
Association.

(2) There shall also, on the dates herein-after specified, be placed to the credit of every member who is, on the date on which this Chapter comes into operation, a permanent employee of the association, a bonus of an amount equal to five per centum of the aggregate salary actually paid to such member from the date on which he commenced his permanent employment to the date preceding that on which this Chapter comes into operation.

Such amount shall be placed to the credit of each member by means of five equal annual instalments on the first day of each of the five financial years next succeeding the date on which this Chapter comes into operation.

Provided that in the event of an employee's services being terminated by death or otherwise before the expiration of five years such instalments shall forthwith be placed to his credit in the books of the Fund and be payable to the persons entitled to receive it.

(3) Where a member ceases to contribute to the Fund at death or on retirement, a further bonus, which shall be equal to the sum contributed by such member to the Fund during the current financial year, shall be placed to his credit in the books of the Fund on the date of his death or retirement.

4. The sums from time to time standing to the credit of the members in the books of the Fund, on whatever account, shall be a liability of the Association: and interest shall be credited in the books of the Fund in respect of the said sums, as hereinafter provided, at the rate of four per centum per annum.

5. (1) The interest due shall be computed on the first day of each financial year on the minimum daily balance standing to the credit of each member in the books of the Fund in the course of each month of the preceding financial year. No interest shall be due in respect of any broken period of a month.

(2) The sum so computed to be due in the case of any member as interest in respect of any financial year shall, on the first day of the succeeding financial year, be added to the sum standing to such member's credit in the books of the Fund.

6. (1) A separate account shall be kept for each member in the books of the Fund and shall be divided into two parts, the first of which shall show the amount of the member's own contributions with the interest thereon as it accrues and the second of which shall show the bonus credited to the member with the interest thereon as it accrues.

(2) As soon as possible after the close of each financial year, the Joint Secretary and Treasurer shall furnish each member with a statement of his account.

(3) Where a member leaves the service of the Association or dies, his account shall be closed as from the end of the month last preceding that in which he left the service of the Association or died: but interest shall continue to accrue upon the sum standing to such member's credit in the books of the Fund up to the end of the month next preceding that in which payment of any sum payable under rule 7 in this chapter to the member himself or to any other person is duly tendered.

7. (1) The amount standing to the credit of a member in the books of the Fund shall, subject to the deduction therefrom of such sum (if any) as may be ordered by the Committee of Management to be deducted on account of any moneys due from such member to the Association, be paid—

(a) where the member's service is terminated by his death, to the person or persons entitled in law to receive it;

(b) where the member's service is terminated by due notice given by the member himself or by the Committee of Management in accordance with the terms of his employment, or otherwise than by his death or by his dismissal or discharge on the ground of misconduct or negligence in the performance of his duties, to the member himself.

(2) In the event of the dismissal or discharge of a member from the service of the Association on the ground of misconduct or negligence in the performance of his duties, the Committee of Management may by resolution declare that portion of the sum standing to his credit in the books of the Fund which represents the bonus payable under rule 3 in this chapter and the interest accrued thereon, or any part of the said portion, to be forfeited; and on a declaration, the sum so declared to be forfeited shall cease to be a liability of the Association, and any part of the aforesaid portion which has not so been declared to be forfeited, and that portion of the sum standing to the member's credit in the books of the Fund which represents his own contributions and the interest accrued thereon, shall be paid to him, subject to such deduction as aforesaid.

8. (1) Nothing in this chapter shall be deemed to confer upon any member or upon the legal representative of any member, any interest in the Fund, or in any part of it, entitling him to assign, transfer, mortgage, charge, or otherwise deal with the sum, or any part of the sum, standing to his credit in the books of the Fund, before such sum or part thereof has become due for payment under rule 7 in this chapter.

(2) If any member, before the sum or any part of the sum standing to his credit in the books of the Fund has become due for payment under rule 7 in this chapter, does or purports to do any act for the purpose of assigning, transferring, mortgaging, charging or otherwise dealing with such sum or part thereof, or becomes bankrupt, or voluntarily or involuntarily does or suffers to be done any act or thing whereby such sum or part thereof becomes or is likely to become due or payable to any other person, the Committee of Management may by resolution annul such member's membership of the Fund and declare the sum standing to his credit in the books of the Fund to be forfeited, or may apply the said sum or any part thereof for the benefit of such member's wife or children or other dependants, as the Committee of Management may determine.

9. The books, accounts, and vouchers of the Fund shall form part of, and shall be subject to the same audit and publication as, the accounts of the Association.

10. In this chapter—

“ financial year ” means the Association's financial year;

“ member ” means a person who is a monthly paid permanent employee of the Association;

“ salary ” includes any personal allowances equivalent to salary, but does not include emoluments other than salary or such personal allowances;

“ the date on which this chapter comes into operation ” means the date on which notice of the confirmation thereof by the Governor is published in the *Gazette*.

CHAPTER IV.—RULES RELATING TO PAYMENT OF GRATUITIES.

1. Subject to the provisions of this chapter of these rules the Committee of Management may pay a gratuity to each of the persons specified by name in the schedule to this chapter of these rules (hereafter in this chapter of these rules referred to as “ specified persons ”) upon his retirement from the service of the Association, or where any specified person

has died while still in the service of the Association may pay a gratuity to any person for the benefit of the dependants of such specified person: but no specified person or dependant of a specified person shall have any claim as of right to a gratuity under this chapter of these rules.

2. Except as hereafter in this chapter of these rules provided, the gratuity payable to a specified person upon retirement shall be calculated on the basis of one-eighteenth of a month's salary of the permanent office held by him at the time of his retirement for each completed month of service under the Association.

3. For the purpose of calculating the gratuity payable to a specified person under the provisions of this chapter of these rules—

- (1) such specified person's service under the Association shall be deemed to have begun on the first day in respect of which he became entitled to salary in respect of his first permanent appointment under the Association;
- (2) the whole of any period of leave of absence on full salary and one half of any period of leave of absence on half salary shall count as service;
- (3) a period of absence without salary shall not count as service.

4. A gratuity shall be paid to a specified person under the provisions of this chapter of these rules only in respect of unbroken service under the Association:

Provided that the Committee of Management may allow any period of service by a specified person under the Association prior to a break of service to count for the purpose of the calculation of the gratuity payable to him as though it were a part of his period of service under the Association subsequent to such break of service: Provided further that the Committee of Management shall allow any such period of service by a specified person prior to a break of service so to count where such break of service has been due to a temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation.

5. The full gratuity calculated upon the basis specified in rule 2 in this chapter of these rules shall be payable to a specified person only if his service under the Association has been faithful and meritorious.

Where a specified person has been guilty of misconduct while in the service of the Association, the Committee of Management shall make such deduction from the full gratuity calculated as aforesaid as it thinks fit. Where such misconduct has been of a serious nature, no gratuity shall be paid.

6. No gratuity shall be paid to any specified person before such specified person has reached the age fifty-five years, unless he has been certified by a medical board appointed by the President with the approval of the Committee of Management to be unfit to discharge the duties of his office owing to infirmity either of mind or of body.

7. Where a specified person retires from the service of the Association before he has reached the age of fifty-five years in consequence of any infirmity either of mind or of body for which he is himself responsible, the Committee of Management may, for the purpose of determining the amount of the gratuity to be paid to him, make such deduction from the full gratuity calculated upon the basis specified in rule 2 in this chapter of these rules as it thinks fit.

8. The Committee of Management may call upon any specified person to retire from the service of the Association before he reaches the age of fifty-five years, on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties of his office; and shall, in every case, for the purpose of determining the amount of the gratuity to be paid to such

specified person, make such deduction from the full gratuity calculated upon the basis specified in rule 2 in this chapter of these rules as it thinks fit.

9. The Committee of Management may require any specified person to retire from the service of the Association at any time after he has reached the age of fifty-five years; and shall not, otherwise than in pursuance of a special resolution passed by it, permit any specified person to remain in the service of the Association after he has reached the age of sixty years.

10. If any specified person dies while still in the service of the Association, the Committee of Management may by resolution grant to any person named in such resolution a gratuity equal to one year's salary of the permanent office held by the deceased specified person at the time of his death, to be applied by such person named in the resolution for the benefit of the dependants of the deceased specified person.

The Committee of Management may require any specified person to retire at any time after reaching the age of fifty-five years.

Grant of gratuity to the dependants of specified person who has died while in the service of the Association.

Basis of calculation of gratuity on retirement.

Service for gratuity, how to be reckoned.

Service must be unbroken.

Full gratuity payable only in cases of faithful and meritorious service.

Gratuities not to be paid to persons of less than fifty-five years of age. Exception.

Amount of gratuity may be reduced where premature retirement is due to illness for which specified person is himself responsible.

Committee of Management may call upon a specified person to retire before reaching the age of fifty-five years.

Sreekandath Ramen Kuttij Menon.

The manufacture of pulp from coconut husk and/or coir fibre.

Abstract.—The inventor states that the production of paper pulp from coconut fibre has not been satisfactory hitherto firstly due to the fact that care was not taken to separate the fibre from the coir dust adhering to it and the tannin-like compounds permeating it, and secondly because the temperature chosen by investigators, though suitable for grasses, jute, &c., was not suitable for coconut.

The inventor's process is in three stages, viz. :—(a) mechanical separation of fibre from dust by well known methods, (b) further purification of the fibre by steeping it for an hour or two in a dilute solution of sodium sulphite (one part in 100–1000 parts of water) and washing; this separates the fibre from the dust still adhering to it, and from the tannin-like matter, (c) pulping digestion at 150°C–180°C, the optimum being 170°C; either caustic soda alone is used (15–35 parts to 100 parts of air-dry fibre) or a mixture of caustic soda and sodium sulphide (10–40 parts to 100 parts of air-dry fibre).

Improvements in and relating to tea rolling apparatus.

Abstract.—The invention depends on the discovery that the current taken from the mains by the main driving motor of a tea roller is roughly proportional to the pressure exerted by the cap. Accordingly, an overload device is arranged to be operated by the main-motor-driving current which actuates a plunger which closes either the forward motoring or reversing contacts of the pilot motor driving the cap. Thus when the current is excessive the pressure cap is raised, and lowered when the current has fallen to a predetermined value. For an intermediate value of the current both forward and reversing contacts are open.

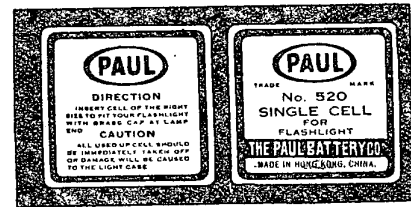
