REGULATION.

The regulations for the Ceylon Defence Force published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,074 of August 24, 1934, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,427 of January 20, 1939, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) in regulation 38, by the substitution for the figure and word "4 years", of the figure and word "3 years";

(2) by the substitution for regulation 392, of the following new regulation:—

"392. Corps will issue uniform to recruits, in accordance with the scale laid down by C. D. F., H. Q."

The actual cost of the articles will be refunded to corps from voted money. (See also regulation 405.)

This regulation does not apply to the C. C. B."

(3) in regulation 405, by the addition of the following at the end thereof:—

"In addition, C. Os. will certify, on the claims, that issues were made in accordance with the scale laid down by C. D. F., H. Q., and that the claim is for a refund of the actual cost of the issues."

(4) by the substitution for regulation 479, of the following new regulation:—

"479. Officers of the C. C. B. will be commissioned to the Junior Division in the first instance and they will each receive Rs. 150 from the votes of the Education Department, for the purchase of the necessary uniform.

When they are posted to the Senior Division, they will obtain the additional uniform required and a sum of Rs. 150 will be paid from the votes of the C. D. F. on the production of the certificate indicated in regulation 398."

**THE STREET COLLECTIONS REGULATION ORDINANCE,
No. 47 OF 1935.**

IT is hereby notified that the following regulations under section 2 of the Street Collections Regulation Ordinance, No. 47 of 1935, made by the Executive Committee of Local Administration, for the area within the administrative limits of the Negombo Urban District Council, have been approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section.

The Negombo Street Collections Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Negombo Street Collections Regulations, 1939.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“ Board ” means the Board of Control established by these regulations for the area within the administrative limits of the Negombo Urban District Council ;

“ Charity ” means the charitable institution or purpose for the use or benefit of which a collection or sale is held ;

“ collecting committee ” means the body of persons organizing or promoting and conducting or supervising any collection or sale ;

“ collection ” means the collection of money for any charitable or other similar purpose ;

“ collector ” means a person participating in any collection by taking money from the public for the purposes of such collection ;

“ Fund ” means the fund which is or is to be set apart for any charitable or philanthropic purpose and for which a collection or sale is held ;

“ sale ” means a sale of articles held for any charitable or other similar purpose ;

“ vendor ” means a person participating in any sale by selling to the public the article or articles provided for the purposes of such sale.

3. For the purpose of supervising and controlling the collection of money or sale of articles for charitable or other similar purposes in any street or other public place within the administrative limits of the Negombo Urban District Council, there shall be a Board of Control, which is hereby established, consisting of—

(a) The Chairman of the Negombo Urban District Council, as Chairman of the Board,

(b) Two persons nominated from time to time by the Negombo Urban District Council with the approval of the Executive Committee of Local Administration, and

(c) Two persons nominated from time to time by the Executive Committee of Local Administration.

4. (1) No person shall organize or promote any collection or sale in any street or public place within the administrative limits of the Negombo Urban District Council—

(a) unless he is a member of a collecting committee of not less than three persons appointed with the object of organizing or promoting such collection or sale by any society or association, or by the managing body of any Charity or Fund, or by a representative meeting of the section of the public interested in any charitable purpose or institution ; and

(b) unless such collecting committee has obtained from the Board, in the manner hereinafter prescribed, a permit authorizing the collection or sale ;

Provided, however, that nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit or affect in any other way—

(i.) any collection taken at an open-air meeting ; or
(ii.) the sale of any article in any street or public place in the ordinary course of trade, or for the purpose of earning a livelihood, without any representation being made by or on behalf of the seller that any part of the proceeds of sale will be devoted to any charitable purpose.

(2) No person who is a member of a collecting committee to which a permit is issued under these regulations shall cause or permit the collection to be taken or the sale to be held otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of the permit.

5. Every application for a permit shall—

(a) be substantially in Form A set out in the Schedule hereto ;

(b) be signed by every member of the collecting committee organizing the collection or sale for which the permit is required ;

(c) be addressed to the Chairman of the Board ; and

(d) be made not later than the first day of the month preceding the month fixed for the collection or sale ;

Provided, however, that the Board may in the special circumstances of any case entertain an application notwithstanding that such application is made later than the aforesaid date.

6. The following shall be conditions attached to every permit issued by the Board :—

(1) The collection shall be taken or the sale held only on the day and between the hours and in the districts, streets or places specified in the permit.

(2) No person under the age of fourteen years shall be authorized or permitted to act as a collector or vendor.

(3) Every person authorized to act as a collector or vendor shall, before the hour fixed for the commencement of the collection or sale, be given a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority.

(4) All boxes or other receptacles in which the collection or the purchase money is to be placed shall be numbered serially and shall be securely closed and sealed in a manner capable of preventing the extraction of money placed therein without breaking the seal, and a record shall be kept of the serial number of each box or receptacle issued to each person who is authorized to act as collector or vendor.

(5) Every such box or receptacle shall bear prominently displayed thereon—

(a) the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held ;

(b) the date of the collection or sale ; and

(c) the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle.

(6) No payment shall be made or reward given—

(a) to any collector or vendor for his services in connection with the collection or sale ; or

(b) directly or indirectly to any other person connected with the promotion or conduct of the collection or sale, unless the name of that person and the nature of the payment or reward have been specified in the application made for the permit.

7. No person shall act as a collector or vendor in connection with any collection or sale—

- (a) if he is under fourteen years of age ; or
- (b) if he is not the holder of a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority ; or
- (c) if he knows or has reason to believe that the collection or sale has not been authorized by a permit issued by the Board.

8. No person acting as a collector or vendor in connection with any collection or sale shall—

- (a) carry or use any collecting box or receptacle for money which is not securely closed and sealed and which does not bear prominently displayed thereon—
 - (i) the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held ;
 - (ii) the date of the collection or sale ; and
 - (iii) the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle ;
- (b) carry on the collection or sale on any date, or at any time or in any district or street or place, other than that specified in the permit issued in that behalf ; or
- (c) carry on the collection or sale in any part of the carriage-way of any street, or in such manner on any part of the foot-way of a street or in any public place as to cause obstruction or annoyance to any person lawfully using such street or public place ; or
- (d) use for the purposes of the collection or sale any table exceeding 30 inches in length or 20 inches in width, or use any table in a manner which causes or is likely to cause obstruction to the public ; or
- (e) keep any animal with him at the place where he is to carry on the collection or sale ; or
- (f) in the course of the collection or sale importune any person to the annoyance of that person ; or
- (g) fail to place any money received in the course of the collection or sale in the sealed box or receptacle or one of the sealed boxes or receptacles issued to him for the purpose ; or
- (h) fail or refuse for any reason after the close of the collection or sale to deliver each of the boxes or receptacles issued to him, with the seals intact, to the person authorized by the collecting committee to take charge of such boxes or receptacles.

9. Every person acting as a collector or vendor shall produce forthwith for inspection, on the demand of any Police Officer, the written authority issued to him by the collecting committee.

10. (1) Within one month after the date of any collection or sale the collecting committee shall—

- (a) cause a statement of the amount received and the expenditure incurred in connection with such collection or sale to be prepared substantially in Form B set out in the Schedule hereto, and to be signed by two of the office-bearers authorized in that behalf by the committee ;
- (b) cause the statement to be audited by the auditor appointed by the committee, or where there is no such auditor, by a responsible person who is not a member of the committee ; and
- (c) forward to the Chairman of the Board the original of the statement so audited, together with receipts or vouchers in proof of the items of expenditure set out in the statement.

The Inland Post Rules, 1934, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,093 of November 30, 1934, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,371 of June 3, 1938, are hereby further amended in rule 24 thereof as follows :—

- (1) by the insertion immediately after paragraph (1) (v) thereof of the following new paragraph :—
- “ (vi.) No extra or supplement, issued with any number of a registered newspaper shall be deemed to be an extra or supplement within the meaning of section 11 (3) of the Ordinance, if it exceeds the newspaper itself in size or weight.”
- (2) by the renumbering of paragraph (2) as paragraph (3) ;
- (3) by the insertion immediately before the renumbered paragraph (3), of the following new paragraph (2) :—
- “ (2) If the foregoing condition (1) is infringed, the newspaper or packet shall be surcharged at the rate applicable to newspapers. Double the postage due shall be recovered in the case of a newspaper or packet the postage on which is unpaid, and double the amount of the deficiency shall be recovered in the case of a newspaper or packet, the postage on which is insufficiently paid ” ; and
- (4) in the renumbered paragraph (3) by the substitution, for the word “ conditions ” of the following :—
- “ conditions (ii) (iii) (iv) or (v) ”.

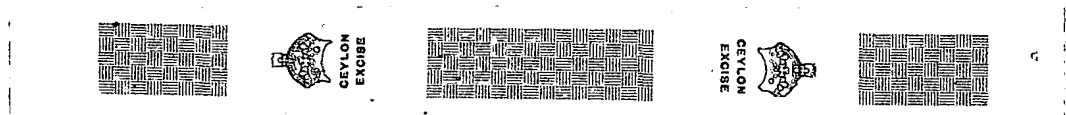

- (e) To plant, grow, import, manufacture, blend and in any way deal in tea, coffee and cocoa and other Eastern, Colonial, Continental, American, and Australian products and to carry on the business of merchants, agents, manufacturers' representatives, indentors, suppliers, dealers both wholesale and retail, sugar merchants, sweetmeat merchants, refreshment room proprietors, refreshment room contractors, fruiteres, grocers, tobacconists, perfumers, importers and dealers in wines, spirits, liquors, alcohol, beverages, aerated waters, mineral waters, food essences, colours, colognes, toilet requisites, pharmaceutical products and all foreign and colonial produce and wares of all kinds, commission agents and to deal in articles of all kinds commonly dealt in by persons carrying on any of the business aforesaid.
- (f) To carry on the business of manufacturing, importing, indenting, exporting and generally dealing in all and every goods and articles other than those above referred to and useful for or conducive to the objects of the Company.
- (g) To carry on the trades and business of tin-smiths, tin-plate makers, tin-can makers, crate, carton, receptacle, container, pouch, cover and drum makers, aluminium workers, miners, smelters, manufacturers and dealers in aluminium or other metal articles used or capable of being used in any business which this Company is authorized to carry on.
- (h) To adopt such means of making known the products of the Company as may seem expedient and in particular by advertising in the press, by circulars, by purchase and exhibition of works of art or interest, by publication of books and periodicals and by granting prizes, rewards, donations and free samples.
- (i) To acquire, use, exercise, develop, apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire any patents, licences, recipes and like rights, conferring an exclusive or non-exclusive or limited right to use, or any secret or other information as to any invention recipe or mixture which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the Company, or the acquisition of which may seem calculated directly

or indirectly to benefit this Company, and to use, exercise, develop, grant licences in respect of, or otherwise turn to account the rights and information so acquired.

- (j) To carry on business as financiers, concessionaires and merchants, and to undertake and carry on and execute all kinds of financial, trading and other operations but not the business of bankers and insurers.
- (k) To acquire and carry on all or any part of the business or property, and to undertake any liabilities of any person, firm, association or company possessed of property suitable for any of the purposes of this Company, or carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, and as the consideration for the same to pay cash or to issue any shares, stock, debentures or debenture stock or obligations of this Company.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF J. L. MORISON, SON & JONES (CEYLON), LIMITED.

1. The regulations contained in the table marked "C" in the schedule to the Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table "C") shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of

these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa* and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. (a) The right to transfer the shares of the Company is restricted in the manner hereinafter appearing;

(b) The number of members of the Company (exclusive of persons who are in the employ of the Company and of persons who having been formerly in the employment of the Company were while in such employment and have continued after such employment to be members of the Company) shall be limited to 50 provided that for the purposes of this provision, where two or more persons hold one or more shares in the Company jointly they shall be treated as a single member; and

(c) No invitation shall be issued to the public to subscribe for any shares or stock, or debentures or debenture-stock of the Company.

3. The following new Regulations shall be inserted immediately before Regulation 1 of Table "C", namely:—

BUSINESS.

(a) The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted as soon as in the judgment of the Directors a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

(b) No objection shall be taken to any agreement or sale by which the Company may acquire any property or rights or pay for any services rendered on the ground that any party or parties thereto is or is about to be or are about to become a director or promoter or directors or promoters of the Company or that any director having accepted office at his or their request do not constitute an independent board. Every member of the Company present or future shall be deemed to have notice of the contents of any such agreement or sale and to join the Company on this basis.

(c) None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or lent on shares of the Company and the Company shall not, except as shall be authorized by law, give any financial assistance for the purpose of or in connection with any purchase of shares in the Company.

(d) The shares shall be under the control of the Directors who may allot or otherwise dispose of the same to such persons and on such terms and conditions as they think fit.

CAPITAL.

(e) The nominal capital of the Company is Rupees Ten thousand (Rs. 10,000) divided into 100 shares of rupees hundred (Rs. 100) each.

(f) The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified or other rights, privileges or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

(g) Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls, and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

(h) The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital in any manner authorized by law or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

4. The Company may pay a commission not exceeding five per cent., on any shares or debentures to any person in consideration of his subscribing or agreeing to subscribe, whether absolutely or conditionally, for any shares or debentures in the Company or procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions whether absolute or conditional, for any shares or debentures in the Company.

5. The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 10 of Table "C", namely:—

10. (a) Except with the previous sanction in writing of the Directors of the Company no share shall be transferred to any person who is not already a member of the Company.

The Directors may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register or acknowledge any transfer of shares, and in particular may so decline, whilst any Shareholder executing the same is either alone or jointly with any other person or persons indebted to

the Company on any account whatsoever, or whilst any moneys in respect of the shares desired to be transferred or any of them remain unpaid or unless the transferee is approved by the Board; but the Directors shall not be entitled to disapprove of a transferee who is already a member of the Company, except for good and sufficient cause. The registration of a transfer shall be conclusive evidence of the approval by the Directors of the transferee.

10. (b) Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty Cents or such sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 10 (a), shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

10. (c) The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

10. (d) In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferee.

6. The following new regulations shall be added after the Regulation 20 of Table "C", namely:—

BORROWING POWERS.

20. (a) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's business, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company.

7. Regulations 21 and 22 of Table "C" are expressly excluded.

8. Regulation 24 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely, "Subsequent General Meetings shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors".

9. Regulation 29 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation shall be substituted therefor, namely:—

29. Subject as hereinafter in this clause provided seven days notice at the least specifying the place and the hour of the meeting and the purpose for which any meeting is to be held shall be given by notice to the Shareholders in the manner in these Articles provided or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company. Whenever it is intended to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice and it shall be no objection that the notice only convenes the second meeting contingently on the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting. A General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting may with the consent in writing of all the members for the time being be convened on a shorter notice than seven days or without written notice and notice of an adjourned meeting shall not be requisite in any case.

10. A quorum at any General or Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company shall consist of not less than two Shareholders and Regulation 32 of Table "C" is modified accordingly.

11. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor, namely:—

(a) On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. On a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.

(b) No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any general meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.

(c) On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy or attorney.

(d) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing or if the appointor is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized. Shareholders not resident in Ceylon may appoint and revoke proxies by cable.

(e) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.

(f) An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form or in any other form which the Directors shall approve:—

12. The following new regulations shall be added after Regulation 44 of Table "C", namely:—

44. (a) The number of Directors shall not be less than two nor more than four.

44. (b) A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers and discretions by or under the regulations of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally. The presence of two or more Directors shall form a quorum at any Directors' meeting.

44. (c) A resolution in writing signed by all of the Directors then resident in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted and every such resolution shall be as soon as practicable entered in the minutes of the Directors' meetings.

44. (d) Any deed or other instrument to which the seal of the Company is required to be affixed may be sealed in the presence of and signed by one Director only and of such other person (if any) as the Directors may appoint for the purpose.

44. (e) A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or Secretaries of the Company, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors but not before his office shall become vacant.

44. (f) The remuneration of the Directors shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services (over and above the remuneration fixed as aforesaid) either by way of salary, commission or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

44. (g) A Director who is out of Ceylon or about to go out of Ceylon may with the approval of the Directors, by notice in writing under his hand, appoint any duly qualified person to be an Alternate Director during his absence abroad provided such absence shall not be less than for a period of three months and such appointment shall have effect and such appointee, whilst he holds office as an Alternate Director, shall be entitled to notice of meetings of the Directors and to attend and vote thereat accordingly, but he shall, *ipso facto*, vacate office if and when the appointor returns to Ceylon or vacates office as a Director or removes the appointee from office.

44. (h) The Directors may, from time to time, appoint one of their body to be Managing Director of the Company, either for a fixed term or without any limitation as to the period for which he is to hold such office and may from time to time remove or dismiss him from office and appoint another in his place.

44. (i) A Managing Director shall not, while he continues to hold that office, be subject to retirement by rotation, and he shall not be taken into account in determining the rotation of retirement of Directors, but he shall, subject to the provisions of any contract between him and the Company, be subject to the same provisions as to resignation and removal as the other Directors of the Company, and if he cease to hold the office of Director from any cause, he shall, *ipso facto* and immediately, cease to be Managing Director.

44. (j) The remuneration of a Managing Director shall from time to time be fixed by the Directors, and may be by way of salary or commission or participation in profits, or by any or all of those modes.

44. (k) The Directors may from time to time entrust to and confer upon a Managing Director for the time being such of the powers exercisable under these presents by the Directors as they may think fit, and may confer such powers for such time, and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions, and with such restrictions as they think expedient and they may confer such powers, either collaterally with, or to the exclusion of, and in substitution for all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and may from time to time revoke, withdraw, alter or vary all or any of such powers.

44. (l) The qualification of a Director shall be the holding of at least one share in the Company. A Director may act before acquiring his qualification but must acquire the same within two months after his appointment or election.

13. Regulation 48 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

48. The office of Director shall be vacated—

(a) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs or compounds with his creditors.

Provided that the Directors, or any of them, may vote on any contract of indemnity against any loss which they or any one or more of them may suffer by reason of becoming or being sureties or surety for the Company. A general notice that any Director is a member of any specified firm or Company, and is to be regarded as interested in any subsequent transaction with such firm or Company shall be sufficient disclosure under this Article, and after such general notice it shall not be necessary to give notice relating to any particular transaction with such firm or Company. A Director may hold any other office or place of profit in the Company in conjunction with his Directorship, other than that of auditor, and may be appointed thereto upon such terms as to remuneration tenure of office and otherwise as may be arranged by the Directors.

14. A Director may be removed from office by an ordinary resolution passed by the Company in General Meeting and Regulation 63 of Table "C" is modified accordingly.

15. Regulation 64 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

64. (a) The Directors may at such times as the circumstances of the Company warrant the same declare dividends to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the number of their shares and the amount paid up or deemed to be paid up thereon respectively.

64. (b) The Directors may if they shall think fit declare from time to time such interim dividends as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.

16. Regulation 66 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

66. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside, out of the profits of the Company, such sums as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for special dividends, or for repairing, improving, and maintaining any of the property of the Company, and for such other

purposes as the Directors shall in their absolute discretion think conducive to the interests of the Company; and may invest the several sums so set aside upon such investments (other than shares of the Company) as they may think fit, and from time to time deal with and vary such investments, and dispose of all or any part thereof for the benefit of the Company, and may divide the reserve fund into such special funds as they think fit and employ the reserve fund or any part thereof in the business of the Company and that without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.

66. (a) Any General Meeting declaring a dividend may resolve that such dividend be paid wholly or in part by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company, or paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of any other company, or in any one or more of such ways.

66. (b) Any General Meeting may resolve that any moneys, investments, or other assets forming part of the undivided profits of the Company standing to the credit of the reserve fund or in the hands of the Company and available for dividend (or representing premiums received on the issue of shares and standing to the credit of the share premium account) be capitalized and distributed amongst such of the Shareholders as would be entitled to receive the same if distributed by way of dividend and in the same proportions on the footing that they become entitled thereto as capital and that all or any part of such capitalized fund be applied on behalf of such Shareholders in paying up in full any unissued shares of the Company which shall be distributed accordingly or in or towards payment of the uncalled liability on any issued shares, and that such distribution or payment shall be accepted by such Shareholders in full satisfaction of their interest in the said capitalized sum.

66. (c) For the purpose of giving effect to any resolution under the two last preceding articles the Directors may settle any difficulty which may arise in regard to the distribution as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of any specific assets, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any members upon the footing of the value so fixed or that fractions of less than One Rupee may be disregarded in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such cash or specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or capitalized fund as may seem expedient to the Directors.

17. Regulations 85, 86, and 87 of Table "C" are expressly excluded and the following regulations added after Regulation 84 of Table "C":—

NOTICES.

85. A notice may be served upon any Shareholder whose registered address is in Ceylon either personally or by posting it in a post office to such address in a prepaid envelope.

And a certificate in writing signed by any Manager, Secretary, or other officer of the Company that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was so addressed and posted shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

89. PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

2. The Charges Officer will enter in a register to be maintained for the purpose all fumigation fees received, and account for such fees as in the case of his other daily takings at the Baggage Office.

3. After the Charges Officer has registered the form and endorsed due receipt of the fee, it will be sent to the Inspector, Fumigatorium.

4. When plants and seeds are landed outside the Exports premises (e.g., at Kochchikkade or Indian Goods Shed) and conveyance to the Fumigatorium involves removal outside the Customs premises, the usual fee of Re. 1 to cover Customs supervision will be payable by the consignee or his Agent.

5. For each plant or package sent to Ceylon by post and conveyed to the Fumigatorium under the supervision of the Postal authorities a supervision fee of 50 cents for any period from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. will be recovered from the consignee or his Agent. If the plant or package is fumigated the fumigation fee of 25 cents per plant or package will also be recovered. The fees referred to in this paragraph will be recovered by the postal authorities at the time of delivery of such plant or package.

6. The fumigatorium labourer will attend the Baggage Office at 10 A.M. on Saturdays and at 10 A.M. and 2 P.M. on other week days, to remove for examination or fumigation packages landed there by passengers or sent in the sealed van from Talaimannar.

Part II.—*Inspection and Fumigation after Office Hours.*

1. Application for inspection or fumigation after the usual office hours should be made to the Inspector, Fumigatorium, within office hours.

2. If packages are conveyed under Customs supervision after 4 P.M. a fee calculated at the rate of 25 cents per hour is payable in addition to the charges payable under paragraphs 1 and 4 of Part I.

3. If packages are conveyed under the supervision of the Postal authorities a fee calculated at the rate of 25 cents per hour for any period between 4 P.M. and 9 P.M. on week days is payable in addition to the charge payable under paragraph 5 of Part I. 4. If packages are delivered on Sundays, Customs Holidays, after 2 P.M. on Saturdays or after 4 P.M. on other week days, a delivery charge of 75 cents per hour will be made.

5. In addition to the charges mentioned above fees at the rate of Rs. 2.85 an hour for the attendance of the Fumigation Inspector, and cents 35 an hour for the attendance of a labourer are payable for the period during which their services are required for inspection and/or fumigation of consignments at any time on Sundays and Public Holidays, and outside the hours of 9 A.M. to 1 P.M. on Saturdays and 9 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on other week days. When the services of the Assistant Fumigation Inspector are in addition necessary, a charge of Re. 1 an hour for his services will be made.
