RESOLUTION.

This Council resolves under section 11 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, that, from and after the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this resolution is notified in the *Government Gazette*,—

(1) import duty upon the goods specified in column I. of the First Schedule to this resolution shall continue to be levied and paid at the general rate prescribed in column III. of that schedule :

Provided that import duty at the preferential rate prescribed in column II. of that schedule shall be levied and paid upon such of the aforesaid goods as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs to have been produced or manufactured in, and to have been consigned from, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Dominions, India, Burma, the territories administered by His Majesty's Governments in the Dominions under Mandate or otherwise, the British Colonies, the British Protectorates and Protected States, and the Mandated Territories of Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British Mandate and Togoland under British Mandate, in lieu of the preferential import duty payable thereon at the date of this resolution : and

(2) import duty upon the goods specified in column I. of the Second Schedule to this resolution shall be levied and paid at the general rate prescribed in column III. of that schedule in lieu of the general import duty payable thereon at the date of this resolution :

Provided that import duty at the preferential rate prescribed in column II. of that Schedule shall continue to be levied and paid upon such of the aforesaid goods as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs to have been produced or manufactured in, and to have been consigned from, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Dominions, India, Burma, the territories administered by His Majesty's Governments in the Dominions under Mandate or otherwise, the British Colonies, the British Protectorates and Protected States, and the Mandated Territories of Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British Mandate and Togoland under British Mandate.

9. If required, samples must be deposited.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender or the whole of it for any period less than three years.

12. Contracts may not be assigned, sublet, or otherwise transferred without the previous written sanction of the Tender Board obtained through the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. Sanction will not be given for any transfers including powers of attorney in favour of persons in the defaulting contractors' list. No defaulting contractor should be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

13. The Director of Medical and Sanitary Services may for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

14. Tenderers, who have not previously held Government contracts, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving their full names and permanent addresses, stating in which district or districts they own landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and the extent of other interests should also be given.

In the case of persons who have carried out contracts with the Medical Department, but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders, they should state in which divisions or districts of divisions or districts they held contracts.

In the case of persons who have carried out Government contracts with departments other than the Medical Department, the name of such department and the district in which the service was rendered should be stated.

15. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Head of the Department, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

Improvements in tiffin carriers or the like.

Abstract.—The main object of this invention is to provide means whereby one vessel of a series held in a tiffin carrier may be removed without disturbing the rest. Each vessel is provided with a cover and each vessel except the lowest rests on the cover of the vessel beneath. The side members of the carrier are U shaped straps having notches so arranged that when a cover is raised and given a small circumferential twist it is held apart from the lower vessel thereby permitting the removal of the latter. Normally the vessels have no clamps to engage with the side straps, as is now usual, the covers being provided instead with such clamps, but the arrangement may be reversed.

The side straps are rivetted at the bottom to a stand on which the lowest vessel rests. Holes are provided in the side straps so that any number of vessels can be locked, for instance by a padlock, to prevent their removal. A spring clamp is also provided at the top attached to the handle for locking the vessels together to prevent displacement. Pins are provided on one of the side members of the handle, and slots in the opposite member. By this means tiffin carriers may be joined together rigidly side by side. Suitable locking means are described.

Besides the main object attained further advantages accruing from the use of the invention are as follows : (a) Condensation of steam does not take place on the underside of vessels as in tiffin carriers in present day use ; (b) Covers can be made a better fit, (c) Vessels have no ridges at the bottom where dirt might collect.

Newcon Industries Limited and Guy Pascoe Crowden.

Improvements in and relating to cubicles or apartments for use in houses, factories, tents and other buildings and temporary shelters.

Abstract.—The inventors state that when the temperature and hygrometric condition of the outside air are greatly different from those required inside, the cost of air-conditioning even a small dwelling house is excessive. They accordingly propose to use a cubicle which can be erected inside factories, dwelling houses, &c., and air conditioned at small cost.

Such a cubicle for a single person would have about 400 cubic feet capacity. The walls and ceiling would be made up of "panels". Each panel would be composed of three or more layers separated by air spaces to minimise conduction. At least one these layers would be covered on both sides with light aluminium foil to prevent radiation. One of the main features of the invention is the provision whereby the air that is exhausted from the room is made to circulate first through the inner air spaces of walls and ceiling, so that they are maintained at the same temperature as the inside. This greatly increases the comfort of the occupant as there is no radiation to or from him to the walls.

Suitable toggle clips would hold the wall and ceiling members together. The floor made in sections fitting neatly together; is thoroughly heat insulated with cork.

The inventors state that such a cubicle would be particularly useful in hot and humid climates.

There are claims and four sheets of drawings.

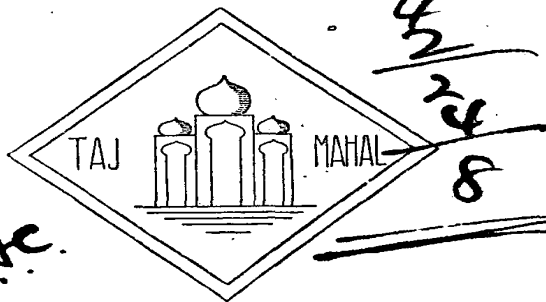
