Whereas I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, have during the present session of the State Council approved of the introduction into the State Council of a resolution whereby, if such resolution be passed into law, the import duty payable on ghee and substitutes for ghee under the designations enumerated in the First Schedule hereto will be altered in the manner set out in the Second Schedule hereto :

And whenever he changes his residence or moves for any period whatsoever from the district to another he shall personally notify such change or such moving 48 hours beforehand to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the former district, and within 48 hours of his arrival, he shall report himself to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the new district, and also, whenever he shall leave the Island, he shall at least 48 hours before leaving personally notify the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district which he is leaving, or the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent to receive such reports, and shall whenever he returns to the Island, if his period on licence has not expired, report himself personally within 48 hours of his arrival to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of the district in which he lands, or to the person deputed by such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent to receive such reports.

(6) Shall once a month report himself personally at such time and place as may be ordered by the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Police of the district in which he resides to such Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent or to a person deputed by him. (The Inspector-General of Police may after the lapse of six months from the granting of the licence during which the conduct of the licence holder shall have been satisfactory permit the reports to be made at longer intervals than above).

*Note.*—(1) If the holder of this licence commits any crime set forth in the Schedule A to the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, No. 2 of 1926, while this licence is in force he shall on conviction of that crime undergo:—

- (a) any term of imprisonment to which he may be sentenced for that crime; and

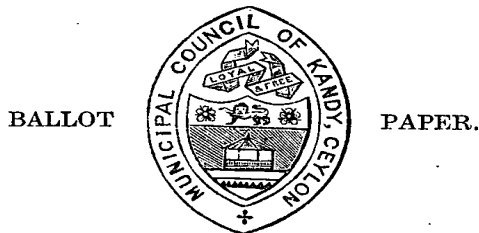

- (1) by the deletion, from the heading of the part or Chapter thereof numbered II., of the words "and for sale of milk"; and
- (2) by the insertion, immediately after the aforesaid part or Chapter II., of the following new part or chapter :—

III.—*Regulations for Sale of Milk generally.*

1. No person who is not a licensee of a dairy as aforesaid, shall himself, or by any agent or servant, sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, any milk within the administrative limits of the Council, save in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

2. (i.) Every such person, whether resident within or without the limits of the Council, who desires to sell or supply for money milk in any quantity to any person or persons within the limits of the Council, shall cause himself to be registered in the books of the Council as a purveyor or supplier of milk.

(ii.) Such registration shall be free of all fees or charges.

3. Every such person shall, by proper application made for that purpose, further cause registration-cards to be issued annually by the Chairman to each servant, vendor, or agent, whether paid or unpaid, employed by him in the work of selling or delivering milk.

4. (1) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to register as a purveyor or supplier of milk under the foregoing by-law 2, any person who has not been recommended for registration, after such inspection, as may be necessary, of his premises, his animals, and his utensils and equipment generally—

- (a) if he is a resident within the administrative limits of the Council, by the Medical Officer of Health of the Council ; or
- (b) if he is resident in any area outside the limits of the Council, by the Chairman of any duly constituted local authority there may be in such area, or if there is none, by the Medical Officer of Health for the district in which such area lies.

(2) The Chairman may likewise refuse to issue any registration cards, under the foregoing by-law 3, until a Medical Officer deputed by him has examined and found each such servant, vendor, or agent to be free from any infectious or contagious disease and from diseases of the skin.

5. Every registration-card issued by the Chairman shall include the following particulars :—

- (a) employer's name and number on register ;
- (b) name of vendor or servant or agent, and his thumb impression.

6. No person shall deliver milk or carry or hawk milk for sale within the limits of the Council, unless he has in his possession a registration-card for the current year duly issued as aforesaid.

7. Every registered vendor and every holder of a registration-card issued under these by-laws shall carry the registration-card on his person when carrying, delivering, hawking or exposing milk for sale, and shall on demand made by any Sanitary Inspector or other person authorized thereto by the Chairman produce such card for inspection. Such Inspector or person may in default of the production of such card exercise the powers conferred on a Peace Officer by section 33 (1) of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

8. No person shall sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, within the limits of the Council—

- (i.) any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless such milk is contained in a vessel which is distinctly and conspicuously labelled "Skimmed Milk" in English and the equivalent term in Sinhalese and Tamil, and is sold as such.
- (ii.) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid; provided that milk, to which tea, coffee, or cocoa has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house, shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law.
- (iii.) any milk contained in bottles of which the mouth is not covered with paper or other impermeable material.

9. Every contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws 1 to 8 inclusive, shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman, or an officer authorized by the Chairman of such contravention.

10. If any person found guilty of a contravention of by-law 8 is proved to be the agent or servant, whether paid or unpaid, of any other person, such other person shall also be liable to be punished for the same contravention unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he had given all necessary instructions and used due diligence to ensure compliance, and that such contravention was due to an act or default of his agent, or servant without his knowledge, consent, or connivance.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. R. F. S. de Mel asked the following question :—

With reference to the supplementary provision of Rs. 50,000 which was made by this Council last month to enable the necessary measures to be taken with a view to augmenting the water supply to the City, will the Mayor kindly make a statement with regard to the steps which are being taken to meet the situation ?

*Answer.* The following steps are being taken :—Three temporary pumps (including two fire engine pumps) have been installed at Ambatale for pumping about 2 million gallons of water a day from the Kelani river into Elie House Reservoir. The estimated daily cost of pumping this quantity of water is about Rs. 450. Two electrically-driven centrifugal pumps for the same purpose, to produce an additional 3 million gallons a day, have been ordered from England and delivery is expected in February. The Department of Electrical Undertakings are constructing an Extra High Tension line so as to be ready to supply current for operating the pumps immediately delivery is made. A temporary intake is being constructed to divert the flow of the Kalatuwawa-ela into a new 30-inch pipe line and connected to the existing pipe

lines near the Labugama entrance gate. The average dry weather flow of this stream is about 3 million gallons a day. This work will be completed early in February as it is necessary to wait for a shipment of 30-inch steel pipes due on January 30. Chlorinating apparatus has now been installed at Maligakanda and Elie House Reservoirs, in addition to that at Labugama Reservoir. The City consumption of water has been reduced from about 15 to 9½ million gallons a day.

Means for storing articles in ware-rooms and the like.

Abstract.—The invention relates to improvements in the means described in Patent No. 2,982. In that invention each of the front rows had one movable unit less than the back rows. The inventor now proposes to fill in these vacant spaces (minor spaces) with units. When required, the additional units may be wheeled out into the gangway (major space) between the different sets of rows, thus permitting the units on the front rows to be moved along their tracks. Suitable tracks, switching points, turntables etc., are described.

According to a further feature, even the major spaces in a warehouse may be filled in with units, thus making use of all the available floor space. These units together with or without the additional units in the minor spaces may be wheeled out into a yard adjoining in order to render the rows accessible. One of the advantages of this invention is that when all the units are in place the shelves are inaccessible, thereby rendering the warehouse burglar proof. This invention is also applicable to a safe.

According to another improvement, the units may run on over-head rails, suitable switches, points &c., being provided for moving or transferring the units.

Fire extinguishing means are provided in each unit or cubicle. This is an advantage, as damage by water or other fire-extinguishing means does not extend to the other units.

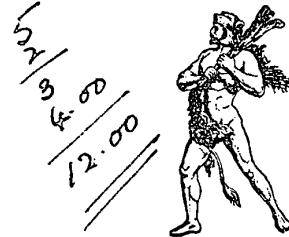
