SCHEDULE.

Schedule I. to the Proclamation dated September 12, 1935, is hereby amended by the substitution, for the definition of Ambalangoda town in the Galle District of the Southern Province, therein appearing and reproduced in Column I., of the definition appearing in Column II. hereunder:—

Column I.

Limits as defined by Proclamation dated September 12, 1935.

Ambalangoda town comprising the area within the following boundaries:—

North: From the sea along the northern boundaries of lots V 124 in preliminary plan No. 482 and U 603 and T 603 in preliminary plan No. 8,867 as far as the Colombo-Galle road, thence a line drawn eastwards across the Colombo-Galle road and Ambalangoda-Paragahatota road to the north-western corner of lot W 300 in preliminary plan No. 3,388, thence along the northern boundaries of this lot and lot X 300 in the same preliminary plan as far as the north-eastern corner of lot X 300: From this corner a line drawn eastwards to the south-western corner of lot B 126 in preliminary plan No. 483, thence along the southern boundaries of lots B 126, A 126; southern and eastern boundaries of W 125; southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of lot X 125, eastern boundary of lot G 126 and along the northern boundary of lot I 126 and lot K 126 to the north-western corner of lot P 126 in preliminary plan No. 483; thence northwards for about one chain, and thereafter north-north-east along the south-eastern limits of the Randonbe Police Officer's division to a point approximately half a chain east of the south-eastern corner of preliminary plan No. 10,280, then westwards to this corner and along the southern boundary of this preliminary plan, and northwards along its western boundary to the Watugedara-Welegoda road; thence along this road eastwards and thence southwards as far as the south-eastern corner of lot N 588 in preliminary plan No. 8,176; thence a line drawn south-eastwards to the north-western corner of lot A 130 in preliminary plan No. 483, and along the northern boundary of this lot, western and northern boundaries of B 130, northern boundary of S 129, and northern boundary of R 129 in preliminary plan No. 483 as far as the north-eastern corner.

East: From the last mentioned point and along the western boundary of lot R 129 in preliminary plan No. 483 western edge of the Goda-ela, western boundary of lot N 128, northern boundary of M 128, northern and western boundaries of L 128, western boundaries of K 128, D 128, northern boundary of C 128, eastern boundary of B 127, northern and eastern boundaries of C 127, northern boundary of T 127, northern and eastern boundaries U 127, eastern boundaries of W 127 and R 127, southern and western boundaries of Q 127, western boundaries of S 127 and T 127, southern boundary of C 127, eastern and northern boundaries of D 127, eastern, northern, and western boundaries of Y 126, western boundaries of D 127 and E 127, western and southern boundaries of I 127 in preliminary plan No. 483; and thence along the Hin-ela as far as the south-western corner of lot N 127 in preliminary plan No. 483; from this corner a line drawn south-westwards to the north-eastern corner of title plan No. 74,983, thence a line drawn north-eastwards to the north-western corner of title plan No. 264,063, along the northern boundary of this title plan eastward to the Madampe lake, thence along the edge of the Madampe lake southwards to a point 12 chains south of the landmark at the south-eastern corner of title plan No. 276,529.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the edge of the Madampe lake up to the sea.

West: The sea.

Column II.

Limits as defined by this Proclamation.

Ambalangoda town comprising the area within the following boundaries:—

North: From a point on the foreshore called Galketiya-watta (lot V 124 in P. P. 482) claimed by Mrs. D. E. Wijesinghe, north-eastwards along the southern boundary of Randonbe Police Officer's division, defined by banks, wirefences, walls, and landmarks, excluding Siriniketaramaya Buddhist Temple premises, Udumullekumbura, and Udumullewatta claimed by K. T. E. Silva, to the south-eastern corner of the Segregation Camp, thence westwards and northwards along the southern and western boundaries of the Segregation Camp to the southern boundary of Polwatta road, thence north-eastwards along the southern boundary of Polwatta road, to its junction with Pinnaduwa road, thence southwards along the western boundaries of Polwattukanattakumbura claimed by O. B. D. S. Jayawardena and others, thence eastwards along the ridge dividing the said Polwattukanattakumbura and Batalawattatottadarakumbura claimed by O. B. D. S. Jayawardena and others, and Nugetuduweaddarawela claimed by W. M. Radalies and others, thence north-eastwards along the boundary dividing the said Nugetuduweaddarawela and Nugetuduwa (lot R 129 in P. P. 483, claimed by U. P. Paul Silva and others) to the north-eastern corner of the said Nugetuduwa.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the western boundaries of Hatarakohotewela claimed by O. Daniel Silva and others, Totupolekekulama claimed by P. S. Nandoris and others, Mahawela claimed by A. Amaris and others, northern, western, and southern boundaries of Paniyanwalekumbura claimed by L. A. Siriman Silva and others and western boundary of Paniyanwela *alias* Giratuduwa claimed by M. Udaris and others; thence westwards, northwards, and southwards along the eastern boundary of Paniyanwela claimed by S. Andiris and others, and the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of Paniyanwela claimed by N. Nandoris and others, and the western boundary of Paniyanwela claimed by S. Andiris and others to the landmark at the point where the Heen-ela meets the Porok-ela, thence southwards in a straight line across Mahawela claimed by S. W. Suwederis and others, Paniyanduweela claimed by M. T. Fernando and others and Enderemullewelyaya claimed by M. C. de Silva and others to the landmark on the northern boundary of Bogahawatta claimed by U. P. Raiso Nona, thence north-eastwards along the boundary defined by banks and landmarks to the eastern boundary of Maha-Ambalangoda road; thence north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road to its junction with Paniyanduwa lane; thence north-westwards along the northern boundary of Paniyanduwa lane, thence north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of Manana claimed by M. C. de Silva and the southern boundary of Addarawela claimed by B. Panis to the landmark on the north-western corner of Elamoderaobadaowitawela *alias* Mahadimanawela (lot I in P. P. A 45), thence southwards along the western boundary of the said lot to the landmark on its south-western corner, thence southwards in a straight line to the point where the Bogahakumbure-ela falls into the Madampe lake, thence southwards along the bank of the said lake to the western side of the wooden bridge on the road to Delduwa.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the bank of the Madampe lake, to a point on the foreshore called Uswellewatta.

West: From the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the foreshore to the point on the foreshore called Galketiya-watta heretofore described as the starting point of the northern boundary.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the spaces within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, areated water manufactories, tea and coffee boutiques, eating-houses or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose, by or

with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

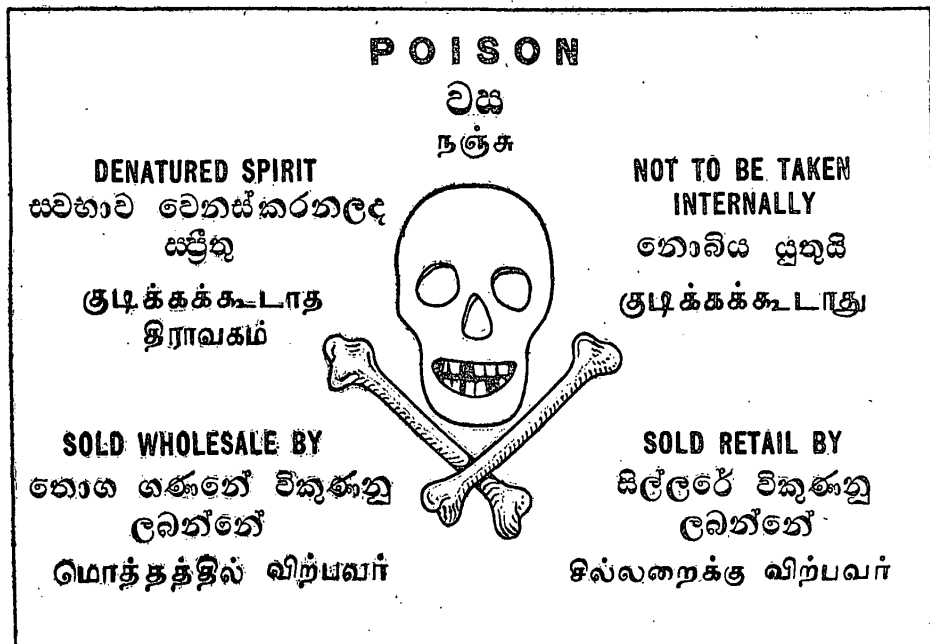
RULES RELATING TO THE LABELLING AND ACCOUNTING OF DENATURED SPIRITS.

1. *Definition.*—In these rules, "denatured spirit" means any spirit of over-proof strength, which has been subjected to the following process for the purpose of rendering it unfit for human consumption, that is to say, the admixture of such spirit with light caoutchoucine and pyridine bases in the proportion of half-a-gallon of the former and half-a-gallon of the latter to 99 gallons of spirit, and the addition to every 100 gallons of this mixture of not less than 1/40 of an ounce of Methyl Violet (aniline dye), and includes any spirit sold under the popular appellation of "methylated spirit".

2. *Labelling.*—(a) No person shall store, supply, sell, or keep or expose for sale, or transport any denatured spirit unless the cask, jar, bottle or other receptacle containing such spirit bears a label, printed in red on a white background, in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

(b) The label required by paragraph (a) to be affixed to every receptacle containing any denatured spirit must also set out the name and address of both the wholesale suppliers and the retail suppliers of the spirit.

3. *Accounting.*—Every wholesale or retail supplier of any denatured spirit, who is served with a written notice in that behalf by the Excise Commissioner, shall, from a date one month after the service of the notice, keep an account, in such form as may be prescribed by the Excise Commissioner, of all purchases and sales of such spirit made by him on and after that date. A notice under this rule shall be deemed to be duly served on any such supplier if it is sent by post to, or delivered to the person for the time being in charge of, the premises at which the supplier carries on his business.

“(1) It shall be lawful for the Conservator of Forests or the Government Agent to allow free grants of scheduled or non-scheduled trees or timber or stone, coral, peat, surface soil, or minerals, and for any authorized headman to allow free grants of non-scheduled trees and timber from any forest subject to these rules for such purposes as the following:—

- (a) the construction of village huts or well-sweeps by resident villagers or of fences and cattle-pens and the like for domestic or agricultural purposes by resident villagers or shareholders of fields in villages; or
- (b) works of public utility such as village bridges, ferry boats and canoes, ambalams (when these are not erected by private persons as works of piety), and village schools, and in other similar cases of necessity in which the Conservator of Forests or the Government Agent or the authorized headman may deem it proper to give such aid.

Provided that no free grant shall be allowed for any purpose of trade or for the construction of any religious building, or of any house, bridge, ferry or boat, for the use of which fees or tolls are levied; and provided further that no free grant shall be made to any District Road Committee, Village Committee, Education Committee or other public body to which an annual grant is made from public revenue, or to any school or other public institution maintained by the Government or for the maintenance of which a contribution is made from the public revenue.”

3. The selected candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness, including eyesight test, to serve for indefinite periods in any part of the Island.

They should enter into an agreement and bond to faithfully and diligently pursue a course of training which will be provided for by Government.

4. Their course of training will be as indicated below :—

(a) (i.) If in Ceylon at the time of selection, to serve one year's probation in the Office of the Engineer, Way and Works, in order to decide whether they are suited for training.

(ii.) If at the end of that period they are considered suitable for further training and employment as Civil Engineers, they will receive 2 years' training on a British or large Indian Railway at the expense of the Government of Ceylon.

(b) If in England at the time of selection, they will receive two years' training on a British Railway at the expense of the Government of Ceylon.

(c) The training under sub-paragraphs (a) (ii.) and (b) will be of a duration and type calculated to satisfy the requirements of the Institution of Civil Engineers.

(d) On their return to the Island, they will, provided satisfactory reports are received on their work and conduct whilst in training in England or India, undergo further training as below :—

(i.) To be attached for a period of two years to an Engineering District to enable them to obtain a thorough knowledge of—

Permanent Way maintenance and Surveying (practical and theoretical) ;

Office routine and practice ;

The indenting for and care of stores, tools, &c. ;

The preparation of paysheets and accounts.

(ii.) To take a course in the Railway Training School in Safety Rules and Working.

(iii.) To pass, with merit, examinations in—

Safety Rules ;

Railway Departmental Instructions ;

Way and Works Rules and Regulations ;

Public Service Regulations, General Orders and Financial Regulations so far as they affect the Railway Department.

(iv.) Generally to act, without extra remuneration, in any post or perform any duties which will give them experience in maintenance work and handling workmen, and engender a sense of responsibility and broader outlook in Railway work.

5. No promotion will be considered until a satisfactory standard is reached in the subjects quoted in (d) (i.) and a merit pass has been obtained in subjects quoted in (d) (iii.). Failure to satisfy these conditions may result in termination of the candidate's services.

6. On completion of training and on satisfactorily passing prescribed examinations, the candidates will be retained in service as supernumerary Assistant District Engineers, pending vacancies in the grade of Assistant District Engineer.

They must pass in Section C of the A.M.Inst.C.E. Examination before they are appointed to the District Engineer's grade.

7. A Probationer recruited in Ceylon will be given an allowance of Rs. 150 a month during the year he spends in the Island before proceeding abroad for further training. During the period of training abroad he will be given the allowances normally granted to persons sent abroad for specialist training in preparation for Government employment. On return after a successful course of training abroad a Probationer will be placed on the salary scale Rs. 2,700—150—3,600 which will be increased to Rs. 4,200—360—6,360 on his obtaining the A.M.I.C.E. qualification.

8. The grant of leave and other conditions of service will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be

governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934. No rent allowance is payable unless the candidate holds an appointment under the Ceylon Government and was appointed before June 1, 1934.

9. Candidates must be prepared to present themselves before a Board of Selection, if required, or attend any interview considered necessary at their own expense.

10. Original testimonials should not be forwarded with the applications. Copies of not more than three testimonials should be forwarded in the first instance. No testimonial will carry any weight which is not signed by someone who is himself personally acquainted with the candidate. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will render the application liable to be rejected.

NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted:—

No. 3,025 of March 22, 1938 (Date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance: April 16, 1937).

Erich Helmut Reinau.

Method for finding out the kinds and quantities of nutritious substances to be introduced into a certain cultivated soil with the object of obtaining a maximum yield in cultivated plants.

Abstract.—The inventor states that since bacterial activity in the soil is accompanied by the production of heat, the temperature curves of samples of soil to which certain nutritive substances have been added may be used to deduce the quantity and quality of such substances that must be added in the actual cultivation of the soil to produce the best results. He further states that such a method gives more reliable results and occupies less time than the methods in present day use, such as the use of mushroom cultures.

The process claimed is as follows:—

A number of samples, 600 c.c. each, are taken of the soil to be tested, care being taken that the air, water, and solid constituents of the samples are the same. The samples are placed in suitable heat insulated vessels that would allow sufficient aeration without drying, and treated with an "energy medium" for example 1 per cent. by volume of sugar, or a corresponding quantity of humus. Each sample, excepting one which is used as the basis of comparison, is, in addition, treated with a nutritive substance, and the temperature course of all the samples is observed for a period, generally about 72 hours. The temperature course of all the samples would be higher than that of the standard, but it may be found that the addition of a certain substance beyond a certain limit, lowers, instead of increasing, the temperature curve. This gives an indication of the amount to be added to the cultivated soil. Addition of a greater amount, besides being wasteful, may be actually harmful.

This method may also be used to test whether it is advantageous to add all the fertilizer at one stage, or to do it in two stages. In such cases the temperature curve of the soil sample to which all the fertilizer is added in one stage, will be at first lower than that to which a lesser quantity has been added, but will cross that curve later.

Different soils may also be compared in this way. Soils which react strongly to "energy media" or to nutritive substances are less fertile than those which respond less. There are six claims and one sheet of drawings.
