  - (b) if he changes his residence in Ceylon and has, although he did not intend to do so, stayed more than one month at the new residence, forthwith at the end of such month, notify to the Registrar in writing such change of residence and give his new address; and

- (c) at least seven days before his departure from Ceylon, notify to the Registrar in writing the probable date and route of such departure, and the name of the ship in which he intends to travel, if he is travelling by sea.
- 2. The particulars required by the form of return prescribed in the Schedule to the Ordinance are hereby varied by substituting therefor the particulars set out in the Schedule hereto.

# REGULATIONS GOVERNING ADMISSION.

- 1. No student shall be admitted to the Intermediate Courses of the Ceylon University College unless, either—
  - (1) he passes an entrance examination to be held annually by the Authorities of the University College, or
  - (2) produces a certificate from the headmaster of an approved secondary school in Ceylon that he has successfully completed at least one year's post-Matriculation course in such school.
  - (For the purpose of this regulation an approved secondary school means any secondary school which conducts post-Matriculation courses approved by the Director of Education.)
- 2. (a) A student who is awarded a University College entrance scholarship or exhibition or any free tuition scholarship awarded on the results of the London Matriculation or the Cambridge Senior School Certificate Examinations may be exempted from the operation of Regulation 1.
- (b) The Principal shall also have power to admit not more than 10 candidates annually over and above those selected on the results of the entrance examination and on production of a post-Matriculation certificate from a headmaster, provided that such candidates have reached a suitable standard in the entrance examination.
- 3. A student who has passed the Intermediate examination of the London University may be admitted to a Final Class without examination. A student who has been "referred" in one subject in the Intermediate
- \* These regulations are liable to alteration in succeeding years.

- examination and is due to take the examination in the "referred" subject in July of this year may be admitted provisionally to a Final Class.
- 4. No student will be admitted to the Intermediate Arts course including Latin or Mathematics unless he has offered that subject in the entrance examination. Similarly no student will be admitted to the Intermediate Science course which includes Physics and Chemistry unless he has offered one of these subjects in the entrance examination.
- 5. No student will be admitted to a course which contains Sanskrit and/or Pali unless he has offered one of these languages or Sinhalese or Tamil in the entrance examination.
- 6. No student will be admitted to the Intermediate (Economics) course unless he has offered Geography in the entrance examination. The Principal may for sufficient reason relax this requirement.
- 7. No student will be admitted to the Premedical course unless he has offered one at least of the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Botany, and Zoology in the entrance examination. The Principal may for sufficient reason relax this requirement.
- 8. The above regulations are in addition to and not in substitution of the existing regulations relating to admission to the University College.

# Conditions of Eligibility and Scheme for the Entrance Examination.

- 9. The entrance examination will be held during the week ending May 27, 1939, or such other dates as may be notified by the Principal.
- 10. Application for entry to the examination must be in such form as the Principal may prescribe and must reach the Registrar, University College, not later than April 30, 1939.
- 11. No candidate will be admitted to the examination who (a) has not passed the London Matriculation examination, and (b) will not have completed his/her 17th year on the first day of July, 1939.
- 12. Candidates will be examined in three subjects selected from the following :—  $\cdot$

English Geography Elementary Mathematics Latin Greek either Advanced Mathematics Sanskrit or Mechanics Pali Physics Sinhalese Chemistry Botany Tamil Zoology History

- 13. The syllabus in each subject will be the syllabus prescribed for the London Matriculation examination of 1939, except that in the Arts subjects there will be no examination in set books. In Physics the syllabus will be the syllabuses in Heat, Light, Sound, Magnetism, and Electricity, and candidates will be given a wide choice of questions.
- 14. Candidates intending to take an Arts or Science course must offer the subjects which they propose to study in their degree course, or cognate subjects.

#### AIR NAVIGATION

The Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) (No. 2)
Order, 1938.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of December, 1938.

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty.

WHEREAS in pursuance of powers vested in Him by virtue of the Air Navigation Acts, 1920 and 1936, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927(a), and the further Orders amending the said Order which are mentioned in the Schedule hereto, which said Order as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order":

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on Him by the Air Navigation Acts, 1920 and 1936, and the Colonial Air Navigation (Application of Acts) Orders, 1937 and 1938, and otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. Article 10 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—
  - (a) In paragraph (2) thereof the following proviso shall be substituted for the proviso to sub-paragraph (b):—
    - "provided that this prohibition shall not apply—
    - (i) in a case where any such concourse is assembled for the purpose of witnessing an event which consists wholly or principally of an aircraft race or contest or exhibition of flying, to an aircraft taking part in such race, contest or exhibition or engaged in a flight arranged by or made with the written approval of the organizers of the event as part of the entertainment afforded in connection therewith;
    - (ii) to an aircraft which is being used for police purposes;
    - (iii) to an aircraft arriving at or departing from a licensed aerodrome if flying over or in the immediate vicinity of any such place as aforesaid is necessary for the purpose of effecting such arrival or departure; or
    - (iv) to an aircraft passing from place to place in the ordinary course of navigation and flying at a reasonable height."
- (b) The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (8):—
  - "(8) In every flying machine registered in the Colony and carrying passengers for hire or reward or, in a case where the carriage is effected by an air transport undertaking, whether for hire or reward or not—
  - (a) every means of exit from the aircraft and from every passenger compartment therein shall be kept free from any obstruction and no such means of exit shall be so fastened by locking or otherwise as to hinder the immediate use thereof in an emergency; and
  - (b) the position of every such means of exit which is specially provided for use in an emergency shall be clearly marked and in each case the method of operation shall be indicated."
  - (c) The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph
    (8):—
    - "(9) The Governor may, for the purpose of promoting the safety of aircraft, make regulations as to special signals and other communications to be made by or to an aircraft, as to the course on which and the height at which an aircraft shall fly and as to any other precautions

to be observed in relation to the navigation and control of aircraft which the Governor may consider expedient for the purpose aforesaid and no aircraft shall fly in contravention of any such regulations."

Amendment of Article 14.

- 2. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 14 of the principal Order:—
  - "14. In every British aircraft registered in the Colony, when flying—(a) there shall be carried and maintained in a fit condition for immediate use such instruments and equipment applicable to the class or description of the aircraft as may be prescribed, and any such instruments and equipment shall be installed or stowed in the aircraft in such manner and position and in such places, which shall be marked in such manner, and shall be used by such persons and in such manner as may be prescribed; and (b) such devices shall be used and such precautionary measures shall be taken (including the treatment of any part of the aircraft with specified preparations) as may be prescribed for the purpose of promoting the safety of the aircraft."

Carriage of dangerous goods.

- 3. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 19 of the principal Order:—
  - "19a.—(1) Subject as hereinafter in this paragraph provided, no person shall carry in—
  - (i) any British or foreign aircraft when such aircraft is in or over the Colony; or
  - (ii) any British aircraft registered in the Colony when such aircraft is carrying pasengers for hire or reward outside the Colony.

any dangerous goods to which this Article applies except with the special permission in writing of the Governor, and subject to any conditions imposed by such special permission:

Provided that the special permission of the Governor shall not be required for the carriage of—

(a) safety cartridges, so long as, when carried as cargo in an aircraft carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward, such cartridges are packed in substantial tin-lined wooden cases in such a manner as to ensure that there is no undue movement within the package, and

(b) any article of equipment of the aircraft or any article required for the purposes of the operation, navigation or safety of the aircraft or the safety or well-being of any person or persons on board, so long as, in the case of a British aircraft registered in the Colony, fuel and oil are carried in the fuel and oil tanks of such aircraft or in special stowage approved for the purpose by the Governor and articles of an inflammable nature required in connection with the navigation or safety of the aircraft are of a type approved by the Governor.

(2) Subject as hereinafter in this paragraph provided, every person consigning for carriage by any aircraft any dangerous goods—

 (i) shall mark distinctly on the outside of the package or container containing such goods their nature, weight and quantity;

(ii) shall give to the carrier of the goods written notice of such nature, weight and quantity and of the name and address of the sender thereof by means of an air consignment note coloured red or bearing the words 'dangerous goods' in prominent red letters; and

(iii) shall in any case where the special permission in writing of the Governor given under paragraph (1) of this Article is necessary for the carriage, attach such per-

mission to the air consignment note:

# Provided that—

(a) Sub-paragraph (ii) of this paragraph in so far as it requires the air consignment note to be coloured red or to bear the words 'dangerous goods' in prominent red letters shall not apply to the case of the carriage of safety cartridges in accordance with proviso (a) to paragraph (1) of this Article; and

(b) This paragraph shall not apply to the carriage of equipment or other articles in accordance with proviso (b)

to paragraph (1) of this Article.

(3) In cases to which paragraph (2) of this Article applies and not within proviso (a) to that paragraph the carrier shall notify the person in charge of the aircraft of the nature, weight and quantity of the goods at or before the time of sending such goods to be carried or taken on board the aircraft.

(4) In this Article the expression—

'Dangerous goods' means any explosive substance and any other goods (whether explosive or not) which by reason of their nature are liable to endanger the safety of the aircraft or persons on board the aircraft;

'Safety cartridges' means cartridges for small arms of which the case can be extracted from the small arm after firing and which are so closed as to prevent any explosion in one cartridge being communicated to other cartridges.

- (5) The provisions of this Article shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of Article 19 of this Order.
- 4. The proviso to paragraph (1) of Article 27 of the principal Order shall be amended by inserting the words "flown by a civilian pilot for the purpose of any test or "after the words "military aircreft." military aircraft ".

5. In Schedule IV. to the principal Order the following paragraphs shall be substituted for paragraphs 20, 21 and 29,

" **20**. To require an aircraft to land, the following signals shall be used:

respectively:

By day and by night, a series of projectiles discharged at intervals of 10 seconds, each showing on bursting green lights or stars;

In addition, if it is necessary to distinguish amongst several the aircraft which is to land, a continuous white luminous beam shall be directed at that aircraft:

Provided that, when the authority who desires to give the order to land is able to establish radioelectric com-munication with the aircraft, this order may be given by using the means of communication established."

- To warn an aircraft that it is in the vicinity of a prohibited area (including areas flight over which is temporarily prohibited or restricted) and should change its course, the following signals shall be used :-
- (a) By day, a series of projectiles discharged at intervals of 10 seconds, each showing on bursting black or white smoke;
- (b) By night a series of projectiles discharged at intervals of 10 seconds showing on bursting white lights or stars, or an intermittent white luminous beam directed at the aircraft:

Provided that, when the authority who desires to give the order for the change of course referred to in this paragraph is able to establish radioelectric communication with the aircraft, this order may be given by using the means of communication established."

"29. An aircraft which overtakes another aircraft shall keep out of the way of the overtaken aircraft by altering its own course to the right.

If an aircraft approaches another aircraft from the rear, following a course forming an angle of less than 70° with the plane of symmetry of the latter, that is to say, is in such a position with reference to the other aircraft that at night it would be unable to see either of that aircraft's side lights, the aircraft approaching the other shall consider itself to be an overtaking aircraft, and no subsequent alteration of the relative position of the two aircraft shall make the aircraft which approaches the other a crossing aircraft within the meaning of these rules, or relieve it of the duty of keeping clear of the course of the overtaken aircraft until it is entirely past and clear.

As by day an aircraft which approaches another aircraft' from the rear cannot always know with certainty whether it comes within the case provided for in the last preceding sub-paragraph, it should, if in doubt, assume that it is overtaking the other aircraft and alter its own course to the right."


