Prohibition of Transport or Possession of Fermented Toddy without Permit in Vadamaradchi Division of the Jaffna District.

## Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, approved under section 12 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on January 7, 1939, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Lolluwela-Dorawela Amuna irrigation work in the Matale District, and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

1. Name and description of work: Lolluwela-Dorawela Amuna in Matale District, Central Province.

2. Extent and nature of lands irrigable under the scheme:—

3. Terms agreed upon—

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, masonry anicut across Suduganga, Head Wall, retaining wall, spill and Head sluice for Dorawela Channel and Head Sluice for Lolluwela Channel up to the estimated cost of Rs. 4,000 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, as follows:—Lolluwela cultivators to repair breaches in channel and grade channel involving about 150 cubes of earthwork. Dorawela cultivators to repair breaches in channel and grade channel involving about 100 cubes earthwork, all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree to forego, on receipt of due notice, the Yala cultivation for 1 year, viz., the year of construction, and contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

AIR NAVIGATION

THE CARRIAGE BY AIR (PARTIES TO CONVENTION) (No. 3) ORDER, 1938.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 25th day of November, 1938.

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS a Convention for the unification of certain rules relating to international carriage by air was on the twelfth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, signed at Warsaw on behalf of His Majesty :

And whereas provision is made by the Carriage by Air Act, 1932(a), for giving effect to the said Convention :

And whereas by subsection (2) of section one of the said Act His Majesty may by Order in Council from time to time certify who are the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention, in respect of what territories they are respectively parties and to what extent they have availed themselves of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention :

And whereas since the date of the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) (No. 2) Order, 1938(b), the accession to the said Convention by His Majesty in respect of Aden (Protectorate) has been duly notified, and it is, therefore, expedient that the said Order should be superseded by a more comprehensive Order :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. It is hereby certified that the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention and the territories in respect of which they are respectively parties are as specified in Part I of the Schedule to this Order, and that the only High Contracting Party who has availed himself of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention is the High Contracting Party specified in Part II of the said Schedule, who has availed himself of those provisions to the extent specified in the said Part.

2. The Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) (No. 2) Order, 1938, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) (No. 3) Order, 1938.

THE various groups in the Department to which Medical Officers will be recruited are :—

- (a) Honorary House Officers.
- (b) Field Medical Officers.
- (c) Acting Medical Officers.
- (d) Relieving Medical Officers.
- (e) Permanent Medical Officers, Grade II. (including Women Medical Officers).

2. The system of recruitment for each of these groups will be as follows :—

(a) *Honorary House Officers.*—The posts (except those reserved for Women Officers) will not be advertised; instead, they will, as vacancies arise, be offered to Men Doctors who have obtained a 1st Class in the final L. M. S. examination of the Ceylon Medical College, or British degrees, like M.B. B.S., M.R.C.P., &c., if they are considered suitable by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. This system will continue until there is a shortage of Officers with 1st Class degrees at the final examination of the Ceylon Medical College or with British degrees of the type indicated above. ## KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

## The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 21, 1939, at 8 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated January 17, 1939.

Present:—Mr. M. K. T. Sandys, Chairman, Sir Cudah Ratwatte, Adigar, Mr. Geo. E. de Silva, Mr. S. A. Wijayatillake, Mr. W. A. B. Soysa, Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail, Mr. Walter Beven, Mr. M. A. S. Marikar, Dr. E. S. Godlieb, Mr. O. T. Nettelton.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on December 17, 1938, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

1A. The Chairman on behalf of the Council congratulated Sir Cudah Ratwatte, Adigar, on the knighthood conferred on him by His Majesty King George VI on the occasion of the New Year Honours.

Mr. Geo. E. de Silva associated himself with all that the Chairman said and supported it.

Sir Cudah Ratwatte replied and thanked the Chairman and members.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Progress report of works brought up to the end of November, 1938.

(b) Health Officer's report for December, 1938.

(c) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1938.

(d) The reservoir readings for the week ending January 21, 1939.

Resolved that the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, and dairies inspected during December, 1938.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. Usoof Ismail asked the following questions which the Chairman replied:—

Q.—(a) What is the total anticipated cost of the Hunagiriya Water supply scheme? A.—Anticipated total cost of the Scheme (Stage I) is Rs. 1,515,600. Q.—(b) What part of the cost is intended to be met by a Government loan? A.—Half the cost, i.e., Rs. 757,800. Q.—(c) What sum would be necessary to meet the interest and sinking fund annually on this basis? A.—Interest at 4 per cent. Rs. 30,312. Annual instalment of principal for repayment in 30 years, Rs. 25,260. Total, Rs. 55,572, for the first year of loan repayment. This would diminish by Rs. 1,010.40 annually. Q.—(d) If the charges are to be met by raising the assessment rates, what additional percentage is suggested as adequate for the purpose? A.—It is not suggested that the charges should be met entirely by the raising of rates. It is calculated that in 1941,—if there is no appreciable increase in annual expenditure,—there should be an annual surplus of Rs. 28,000. Electricity Department profits could provide Rs. 12,322 and an increase of 1½ per cent. in the maximum rates Rs. 26,250. Total Rs. 66,572. This would allow for a drop of Rs. 11,000 in the estimated surplus, which is difficult to calculate in advance and which is dependent on variable factors such as the recent large increase in expenditure on Maternity and Child Welfare work. In my letter to the Commissioner of Local Government dated November 28, 1938, I have asked that repayment of the principal—as distinct from repayment of interest on it—should be deferred until the enhanced water supply is available, i.e., until about 1944 or 1945. If this request is granted, then for the present there need be no raid on electricity funds and during the years 1941-44 the interest charges could be met by the estimated surplus plus a 1 per cent. increase in the maximum assessment rates.

5. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved:—(a) That the post of Installation Inspector and Plant Record-keeper be revived as from January 1, 1939. (b) That Mr. E. N. de Lanerolle be appointed to fill it, and that his services under the Council be considered as continuous from the date of his discontinuance on August 2, 1938.

Resolved that Mr. de Lanerolle's temporary engagement should continue till the new Council comes into being.

6. To consider:—(a) Application from the Hony. Secretary, Old Boys' Association, St. Anthony's College, for a lease of the Bogambara Ground this year during the Esala Perahera for an exhibition and carnival to be held in connection with the Diamond Jubilee Celebrations of the College. (b) Joint application by Mr. L. H. Mettananda and Mr. H. L. Ratwatte, supported by the Diyawadana Nilame and Basnayake Nilames of the four dewales, for the ground for purposes of an exhibition during the same period in aid of Buddhist Education in the Central Province, and (c) Proposal made that this exhibition should be organized and conducted as a Municipal enterprise, with report from Mr. P. de Lanerolle giving a brief outline of the scope of the exhibition. (D 284).

Resolved that the Finance Committee resolution that the lease of the grounds during the next Esala Perahera be offered to (a) and (b) to be taken up jointly be conveyed to the applicants.

7. Petition from Tea kiosk keepers pointing out their difficulties in complying with the requirement of metered water services and Chairman's memorandum thereon.

The Chairman's recommendation for the deferment of the by-law for one year and the issue of licences for 1939 with this requirement was approved.

8. To obtain sanction for the acceptance of Mr. A. R. Suwaris' tender for the following works:—(a) Building a section of unbuil leadaway drain adjoining premises No. 330A, Peradeniya road—Rs. 1,129. (b) Erecting labour lines in Reservoir road for Waterworks fitters—Rs. 1,595. (c) Effecting improvements to bathing place at Bahirawakande—Rs. 1,135.60.

Resolved that the tenders be accepted.



9. Papers *re* the proposal to improve the Matale-Wattegama road junction. Resolved that the land be acquired and a vote of Rs. 1,000 was passed for this purpose.
10. Chairman's memo on the subject of a third infiltration gallery and the disposal of 4" suction valve. Resolved that the suction valve be disposed of for the sum of Rs. 20.

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

*Wingfoot Corporation.*

Rubber hydrochloride structures and methods of making same.

*Abstract.*—The inventors describe the method of producing stretched films of rubber hydrohalides, particularly rubber hydrochloride. Hydrochloride films used for this invention are formed in the usual way, and stabilised by the addition of suitable chemicals. Colouring matter and plasticisers may be added to the solution when making the film.

The inventors state that stretching produces an enormous increase in the tensile strength of such films in the direction of stretch. Moreover, the stretched material is softer and more flexible than ordinary film; it is also more lustrous, and may be advantageously used in the manufacture of raincoats, ribbons, florist tissue, &c. A film of rubber hydrochloride .0012" thick may be stretched to .0003"—.0002".

Films may be stretched longitudinally and laminated to paper, cloth or unstretched film. The lamination process may be effected by a cement or a solvent. It is preferred however to heat the film and stretch it, and press it while still hot to the material to which it is to be laminated.

Two sheets stretched in different directions may be cross laminated with several coloured strips, thereby producing pleasing colour effects. The stretched film may be heated and rolled up into a string which could be used as a surgical suture, &c. The stretched film may also be caused to adhere to string in order to still further increase its tensile strength.

Suitable apparatus for stretching is described. The film is first passed over one pair of rollers, and then over a second pair revolving at a higher speed. The film may be heated by means of a water bath or an oven. Preferably the film is kept stretched till it is cool.

Improved apparatus and means for treating tea leaf and other produce in the manufacture thereof.

*Abstract.*—The inventors state that the reciprocating sifters of the present day do not work satisfactorily owing to the fact that the leaf is given an upward throw in addition to the reciprocating motion. In its downward motion coarse leaf tends to be forced through the mesh; thus the uniformity of grading is impaired.

According to the present invention a frame carries a sifting tray which is pivoted at one end of the frame and held by struts at other end so that the inclination can be varied. A horizontal circular motion is given to the tray by means of cranks from below. The leaf never leaves the meshes and thus the grading is more uniform. Suitable collecting means are described. The meshes of the tray are made so that they can be removed easily for cleaning purposes, &c.

There are seven claims and one sheet of drawings.

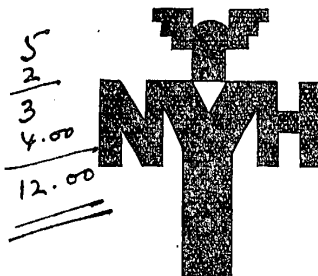

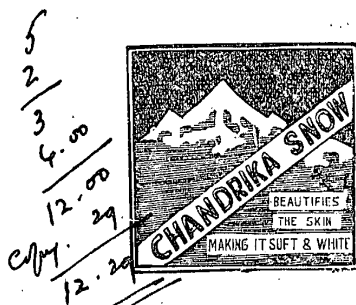
