- (a) proclaim the rules, made by the Judges of the Supreme Court by virtue of the powers vested in them by the said section, and duly laid before the State Council, and set out in the schedule hereto; and
- (b) declare that the rules shall come into force on the first day of April, 1939.

Schedule.

ORDER FOR REGULATING THE MODE OF PROSECUTING CIVIL APPEALS IN THE SUPREME COURT, MADE BY THE JUDGES UNDER SECTION 53 OF "THE COURTS ORDINANCE, 1889".

The Civil Appellate Rules, 1938.

By virtue of the powers vested in Us by sections 53 and 54 of the Courts Ordinance, 1889, We, Sidney Solomon Abrahams, Knight, Chief Justice of the Island of Ceylon, Kenneth Elliston Poyser Francis Arnold Moseley, Horace Hector Hearne, Arthur Eric Keuneman, Oswald Leslie de Kretser, and Edwin Arthur Lewis Wijewardene, Puisne Justices of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct that the Civil Appellate Rules, 1938, published by Proclamation dated January 15, 1938, in *Gazette* No. 6,602 of January 16, 1938, as last amended by Proclamation dated January 26, 1938, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,346 of January 28, 1938, are hereby annulled and the following rules substituted therefor:—

Appellant to provide typewritten copies of record.

1. (1) In every Civil appeal preferred after the date of the passing of these rules, the appellant shall provide, in the manner hereinafter prescribed, for the use of each of the Judges who shall sit on the hearing of the appeal, a typewritten copy of so much of the record of the case as may be necessary for the decision of the appeal.

Appeal when preferred.

(2) For the purpose of sub-rule (1) an appeal shall be deemed to be preferred on the date of the presentation of the petition of appeal in the Court of first instance.

Application for typewritten copies.

2. (1) The appellant shall apply in writing to the District Judge or the Commissioner of Requests, as the case may be, within the time limited by law for the completion of the security for costs of appeal, for typewritten copies of the record, stating in such application whether copies of the whole or portions only, if so, of what portions of the record, are necessary for the decision of the appeal. Every such application shall state the value of the subject matter and the nature of the action or proceedings in which the appeal is preferred, and shall be accompanied by the fees prescribed in the schedule hereto.

Provided that where no time is fixed by law for the furnishing of security for costs of appeal, the appellant shall apply for typewritten copies within one month of the date of preferring his appeal.

Copies for Judges.

(2) (a) On receipt of such application and payment in terms of sub-rules (3) and (4), the District Judge or the Commissioner of Requests, as the case may be, shall furnish the appellant, as soon as possible with typewritten copies applied for.

Payment of fees in cash.

(b) The District Judge or the Commissioner of Requests shall cause copies to be made for the use of the Supreme Court and shall forward the same to the Registrar of the Supreme Court.

Rate of charges.

(3) Payments for copies shall be made in cash to the Secretary of the District Court or to the Chief Clerk of the Court of Requests, as the case may be, and a receipt obtained for the payment on the prescribed form.

Number of copies to be issued.

(4) (a) The rates embodied in the annexed schedule of fees shall be in respect of typewritten copies not exceeding thirty pages or seventy-five folios, a folio to consist of 120 words.

(b) Whenever a typewritten copy exceeds the prescribed standard of 30 pages or 75 folios, the District Judge or the Commissioner of Requests, as the case may be, shall require payment for every additional thirty pages or 75 folios or fraction thereof, at a rate equal to 50 per cent. of the amount charged for the first 30 pages or 75 folios.

Copies subsequently applied for.

(5) Exclusive of the typewritten copies for the use of the Judges, (a) one typewritten copy only shall be furnished to the appellant, unless he shall have stated in his application under sub-rule (1) that additional copies will be required; and (b) not more than two copies in all shall be so furnished, unless the District Judge or Commissioner of Requests, as the case may be, shall think fit, in exceptional cases, to direct that an additional copy or copies shall be prepared.

Weekly list of applications for typewritten copies to be furnished to Registrar, S. C. Time limit for completion of copies.

(6) Provided that in the event of any additional copy being found necessary subsequent to the original application, the District Judge or the Commissioner of Requests, as the case may be, may in his discretion, supply such additional copy on application being made to him, and the provisions of this rule as to payment and scale of charges shall apply to every such application.

When Registrar Supreme Court, shall prepare copies.

(7) Every Court of first instance shall forward weekly to the Registrar, Supreme Court, a list of applications for typewritten copies with the dates thereof and giving the names of the appellant and respondent. Where the copy does not exceed the prescribed standard of 30 pages, the Court shall forward the record along with the copies for the use of the Supreme Court, at latest, as soon as a period of two months has elapsed from the application, or explain the delay. Whenever the Registrar of the Supreme Court is satisfied that the preparation of typewritten copies is being unnecessarily delayed in any Court of first instance, he is empowered to call for the record of such case and to cause the preparation or completion of typewritten copies to be made in the Registry of the Supreme Court, on the same terms and rates as those referred to in this rule. The Court of first instance shall thereupon remit to the Registrar the fees paid to it for copies. In the event of the copy exceeding the prescribed standard, the record shall be forwarded within a period of three months from the application and the Registrar shall deal with any case of delay in the same manner as has been laid down for standard copies.

Numbering and listing of appeals.

(8) On the Registrar receiving the weekly lists referred to in sub-rule (7), he shall allot to each such appeal a number and shall list the same for disposal on receipt of the record with the typewritten copies or on the same being made in the Registry.

3. The fees paid in respect of all typewritten copies furnished under these rules shall be costs in the appeal. Costs of typewritten copies.
4. (a) Where the appellant fails to make application for typewritten copies in accordance with the requirements of these rules; or Abatement of appeal on default of application for copies.
 (b) fails to pay the additional fees due under rule 2 sub-rule (4), within one month from the date of the order requiring him to do so, or, before the expiry of the time allowed by rule 2 sub-rule (7), whichever is later, the appeal shall be deemed to have abated. Non-payment of additional fees due.
5. The provisions of these rules shall, as far as is practicable, apply to any respondent to any appeal. But no delay or default on the part of a respondent in applying for typewritten copies shall prevent the appeal from coming on for hearing in accordance with the provisions of "The Civil Procedure Code, 1889". Respondent.
6. These rules may be cited as "The Civil Appellate Rules, 1938". Short title.

In appeals in Insolvency, Testamentary, and all other proceedings not hereinbefore mentioned, the charges for typewritten copies shall be the same as that levied under the heading "In all other Interlocutory Appeals."

Copies of maps, plans or pedigrees of great complexity, and beyond the skill of an Officer of Court, shall be furnished by the appellant for the use of the Judges; the appellant shall also furnish at the same time, the necessary copies of same for inclusion in the typewritten copy or copies applied for by him.

Appeals from Courts of Requests.

(Class I.)—Where the action or proceedings involves property or rights of the value of Rs. 100 or under—

Payable by either party for each copy Rs. 4

(Class II.)—Where the action or proceedings involves property or rights of the value of over Rs. 100—

Payable by either party for each copy Rs. 5

In appeals in Court of Requests cases, copies of maps, plans or pedigrees of great complexity, and beyond the skill of an Officer of Court, shall be furnished by the appellant as in appeals in District Court cases.

Note.—No further fees are chargeable in respect of the copies made for the use of the Judges, as the fees prescribed in this schedule include those charges, too.

BY-LAWS.

1. In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Kalutara Urban District Council;

"Open space" means any open space, or place for public recreation, which is vested in or under the control of the Kalutara Urban District Council.

2. No person shall in any open space commit any nuisance or create any disturbance or behave in such a manner as to cause annoyance to any other person.

3. Except with the written permission of the Chairman no person shall cut, uproot or cause any damage to, any tree, plant or shrub growing in any open space, or cut or pluck any fruit or flower from any such tree, plant or shrub.

4. No person shall bathe, or commit a nuisance in, or commit any act likely to foul the water of, any tank, pond or water-course which is situated in or flows through any open space.

5. (a) No person in any open space shall, in contravention of any notice exhibited therein by or under the authority of the Chairman—

- (1) sell or offer for sale goods of any description ;
- (2) deposit any refuse or rubbish ;
- (3) sleep between the hours of sunset and sunrise ;
- (4) drive, ride or lead any horse in any manner likely to cause damage or injury to person or property ;
- (5) ride any animal other than a horse, or exercise any animal other than a horse or a dog which is on a lead ;
- (6) ride any bicycle, or drive or push any vehicle other than a bicycle except under the authority of a permit issued by the Chairman ;
- (7) allow any cattle or poultry to stray or to graze, except under the authority of a permit issued by the Chairman ;
- (8) erect or construct any building, shed, tent or post, except under the authority of a permit issued by the Chairman ; or
- (9) lay out any cricket pitch or golf green, or otherwise appropriate any portion of the open space to the exclusion of other persons, except under the authority of a permit issued by the Chairman.

(b) Nothing in paragraph (a) shall be deemed to prohibit, or to permit the Chairman to prohibit, any person from riding a horse or a bicycle—

- (i.) on the main avenue leading to the Town Hall from the Clock Tower ; or
- (ii.) on the drive leading to the Town Hall from the Maternity Home ; or
- (iii.) on the drive leading to the Pavilion of the Kalutara Town Club from the Colombo-Galle road.

6. Every contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

BY-LAW.

(1) Within the administrative limits of the Kalutara Urban District Council, no person shall, except with the written permission of the Chairman—

- (a) kill, wound or take, or attempt to kill, wound or take, any game or wild bird ; or
- (b) take or destroy, or attempt to take or destroy, the eggs or nest of any game or wild bird ; or
- (c) discharge any firearm or airgun, or use a catapult, or do any other act, for the purpose of frightening or scaring away any game or wild bird.

(2) The provisions of this by-law shall be supplementary to the provisions of the Fauna and Flora Protection Ordinance, No. 2 of 1937.

(3) In this by-law—

“ game ” means any wild animal hunted for sport or for food and includes sambar, spotted deer, red or barking deer, or talagoya ;

“ wild bird ” means any wild bird, other than a crow (*corvus coronoides culminatus*) or a bird of prey, which is hunted for sport or for food, and includes a pea fowl and a Ceylon spur fowl.

(4) Every contravention of this by-law shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

BY-LAWS.

1. The rate of deductions to be deemed the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep to be deducted each year in the computation and assessment of the annual value of any immovable property situated within the administrative limits of the Trincomalee Urban District Council—

- (a) in the case of any house or building, shall be the rent payable for such house or building for one month ; and
- (b) in the case of any cultivated land on which there is no house or building shall be the rent payable for such land for one-half of a month.

2. In this by-law “ rent ” means the rent which a tenant might reasonably be expected, taking one year with another to pay for any house, building, land or tenement, if the landlord undertook to pay all public rates and taxes and to bear the cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance, and upkeep, if any, necessary to maintain the house, building, land or tenement in a state to command that rent.

BY-LAWS.

I.—Definitions.

In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“warehouse” means any building used mainly for the storing of goods or wares by merchants or traders, but does not include a shop, boutique, or other place used mainly for the sale of goods or wares by retail;

“workshop” means any building where any work of making, altering, ornamenting, finishing, or repairing articles or goods is carried on by manual labour for the purposes of trade;

“factory” means any workshop where mechanical power of any kind is used.

II.—Residential Areas.

The area within the administrative limits of this Council defined in Schedule I. hereto is hereby declared to be a “residential area”.

III.—New Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. (1) From and after the date on which these by-laws come into force no new building shall be erected within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman of this Council, for the purpose of being used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse or as a boutique or as tenements, or as stables, galas, cattle pens, or dairies.

(2) Such permission may be refused or withheld by the Chairman unless or until the following conditions are fulfilled, namely:—

- (a) that the site selected for such building is not in close proximity to existing residential buildings;
- (b) that the site selected is not situated in such a prominent place as to make the erection of the building likely to mar the amenities of the residential area;
- (c) in the case of a workshop, that the business or industry for which it is to be used is not likely to create any kind of nuisance whatsoever;
- (d) in the case of a shop or boutique, that the site selected will serve an area really in need of such conveniences, and that the design of the building will harmonize with the surroundings.

2. It shall be lawful for the Chairman by notice in writing to direct that an air space of not less than 7½ feet be provided between each side of any new building and the boundary on that side, irrespective of the question whether there are windows in the wall on that side of the building.

IV.—Existing Buildings in Residential Areas.

1. Within a residential area, except with the written permission of the Chairman—

- (1) no building used for residential purposes at the date on which these by-laws come into force, shall be used for any other purpose whatsoever;
- (2) no building used at that date for the purpose of any one of the following, namely, a workshop, warehouse, boutique, tenement, stable, gala, cattle pen, or dairy shall be used for any other of the said purposes; and
- (3) no building shall be used for any of the purposes set out in the foregoing paragraph of this by-law, if at that date it was not in actual use for that purpose.

2. (1) Within a residential area no building used as a factory, workshop, or warehouse at the date on which these by-laws come into force shall be enlarged, extended, or added to except with the written permission of the Chairman.

- (2) Such permission shall be refused by the Chairman—
- (a) in any case in which the building is used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. hereto; and
- (b) in any case where the boundaries of the premises on which the building stands have not been registered in the books of the Council within six months of the date on which these by-laws come into force.

3. Within a residential area no building shall be used for the purposes of any of the dangerous or offensive trades enumerated in Schedule II. unless it can be shown to have been in use for such purposes on the date on which these by-laws come into force.

V.—Penalties.

The chief occupier of any building who contravenes any of the provisions of the foregoing by-laws or any owner or occupier who fails to comply with any written notice or directions given by the Chairman, thereunder, shall in respect of each day during which such contravention or non-compliance continues, be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

VI.—Repeal.

The by-laws made by the Local Board of Health and Improvement, Badulla, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,757 of January 24, 1930, are hereby revoked.

"(2) The Executive Committee may, in its discretion, at any time before an Ordinance for the regulation and supervision of the business of insurance is brought into operation in Ceylon, authorize any company to issue policies of insurance for the purposes of Part VIII. of the Ordinance—

(a) if the company is duly incorporated under the Companies Ordinance, No. 51 of 1938, or if the company, being incorporated outside Ceylon, has after the date appointed for the operation of the Companies Ordinance, No. 51 of 1938, established a place of business in Ceylon and complied with all such provisions of that Ordinance as are applicable to the company; and

(b) if a copy of the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the company is transmitted to the Commissioner, and the Executive Committee is satisfied that the object or one of the objects of the company is to carry on the business of an insurer within the meaning of these Regulations and that the company will be able to conduct such business in a satisfactory and efficient manner; and

(c) if the company, upon being required so to do by the Executive Committee, makes a deposit equal in value to such amount, not being less than Rs. 15,000 and not more than Rs. 150,000, as the Executive Committee may determine."

(c) in clause (2) by the substitution, for all the words from "they" to the end of the clause, of the words "they must be packed either singly or in pairs of fours in substantially constructed and sealed wooden cases of such a size as will exactly accommodate either one, two, or four receptacles of 4-gallon capacity as above defined. The thickness of the wood must not be less than half an inch, and the general pattern of the cases must be approved by the General Manager of the Railway." ; and

(d) in clause (7) thereof, by the substitution, for all the words and figures from "5 gallon receptacles" to "transported", of the words "2- and 5-gallon receptacles to be conveyed unpacked, and on the wooden cases in which the 4-gallon receptacles are transported."

(2) in rule 41 by the substitution, for paragraphs (g) and (r) respectively of the following new paragraphs:—

"(g) Explosives will be accepted for despatch at Colombo Goods Shed on the following days or any other days as may be notified from time to time:—

Articles in classes E and F shall be conveyed in gunpowder wagons or in steel-covered lime wagons, but shall never be loaded together with articles in classes A, B, C or D or with any other inflammable goods in the same wagon."

AMENDMENT REFERRED TO.

Clause 41.—Add a new sub-clause as follows after Clause 41 (e) :—

(f) Graduates and first class trained teachers who have completed five years' satisfactory service in Assisted English Schools, with at least three years' service under the last management that makes the recommendation may, at the discretion of the Director, be granted one year's full-pay study leave outside the Island, provided the applications are recommended by the Manager, and fulfil the following conditions :—

- (i.) The applicant must submit a scheme of study for the Director's approval, and undertake to furnish the Director with quarterly reports of his/her progress and conduct while on study leave ;
- (ii.) The total number of eligible teachers including the applicant must not exceed the number for whom the school is qualified to claim grant, and in no case will study leave be allowed to more than one teacher at a time from any school, or to more than ten teachers in any year from all schools ;

(iii.) The Manager must agree to retain the applicant's name on the eligible staff of the school, to enter it in the Annual Returns, and to pay the applicant his/her approved salary, provided however, that the applicant shall not be entitled to draw any increment to his/her salary during the period of absence ;

(iv.) The Manager must enter into a bond binding himself and two approved sureties, to repay to the Department the Government contribution towards the applicant's salary if the applicant does not, on his/her return to the Island, serve in an Assisted or a Government School for a period of at least three years.

The Director may, if satisfactory reasons are urged, allow, subject to the foregoing conditions, an extension of leave for a further period, in no case exceeding one year, provided always that the Government contribution towards the applicant's salary ceases at the end of the first year and that the maximum period of absence from the Island does not exceed two years.

A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests, the extent of landed property and the nature and the extent of other interests should also be given.

A tenderer who has carried out contracts with any other department should state the name of such department and the district in which the service was rendered.

16. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Head of the Department, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE KEMMANA RUBBER COMPANY, LIMITED.

The regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context, viz.:—

The word "Company" means "The Kemmana Rubber Company, Limited", incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The "ordinance" means and includes the "Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company.

"Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

"Shareholder" means any person whose name is entered in the Register of Shareholders as owner or joint owner of any share in the Company.

"Presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or by attorney.

"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled at a Board.

"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

" Seal " means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

" Month " means a calendar month.

" Writing " means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Words importing the singular number include the plural, and *vice versa*.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine, and *vice versa*.

" Holder " means a Shareholder.

" Extraordinary resolution " means a resolution passed by three-fourths in value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy or attorney (in cases where by these Articles proxies or powers of attorney are allowed) at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

BUSINESS.

2. The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

3. The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these presents. The basis on which this Company is being established is that the Company shall acquire the Kemmana estate and other lands situated in the villages of Kemmana, Ridiwita, Hiramadagama, Makandura, Emitiyagoda, and Ammuduwa from Robert Gregor, Sidney Diack, George Geddes, Alexander Dawson Panton, William Panton Brown, John Stirling Marshall, Henry Milne, and James Mac Paterie, and that the said Robert Gregor, Sidney Diack, George Geddes and Alexander Dawson Panton, four of the vendors are to be the Directors of the Company from its commencement. It shall accordingly be no objection that the vendors are in a fiduciary position to the Company, or that there is no independent Board of Directors, or that the vendors or any of them are themselves Directors. No claim whatsoever shall be made against any person whomsoever at any time on any such ground as is set forth above nor on any other ground whatsoever in reference to or in relation to, or in respect of or arising out of the constitution of the Board of Directors, as indicated above, or the appointment of any such person as a Director of the Company. Every Shareholder of the Company, present and future, is deemed to join the Company on this basis.

CAPITAL.

4. The nominal capital of the Company is One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Rupees (Rs. 150,000), divided into Seventy-five Thousand shares of Two Rupees (Rs. 2) each.

5. The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share, and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

6. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

7. The Directors may also, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company, reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

SHARES.

8. The Company may issue the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit, and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amounts of calls to be paid, and the time of payment of such calls.

9. If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the holder of the shares.

10. The shares, except when otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares, except when otherwise provided, shall first be offered by

the Directors to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time with the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may at their discretion allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholder.

11. In case of the increase of the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares, such new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights and privileges annexed thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof, or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct, and, if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine, and in particular such share may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends, and in the distribution of the assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting.

Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors, may at their discretion, allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company, in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

12. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company may from time to time direct.

13. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership, and any one partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of the firm.

14. Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons jointly.

15. Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares, shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

16. In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

17. The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust, or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except an absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 36 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

18. The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls due in respect of such share.

19. Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate or certificates under the common seal of the Company, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid thereon.

20. If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then, upon production thereof to the Directors they may order the same to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof may be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

21. The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the person first named in the register.

CALLS.

22. The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, provided that three months notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the persons and at the time and place appointed by the Directors.

23. If any Shareholder fail to pay the amount of any call due by him on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest on the same at the rate of nine per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment.

24. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such call was passed.

25. The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

26. The Directors may at their discretion receive from any of the Shareholders willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the moneys uncalled upon their respective shares beyond the sums actually called up; and upon the moneys so paid in advance, or upon so much thereof as from time to time and at any time thereafter exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon, and due in respect of the shares in respect of which such advances have been made, the Board may pay or allow interest at such rate as the Shareholders paying such sums in advance, and the Directors may agree upon, not exceeding, however, eight per centum per annum.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. Subject to the restrictions contained in these Articles any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing.

28. No transfer of shares shall be made to a minor or person of unsound mind.

29. The Company shall keep a book or books to be called "The Register of Transfers", in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

30. The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise; or in case of shares not fully paid, to any person not approved of by them; and in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

31. Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty Cents or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 30, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

32. The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of Directors for that purpose.

33. In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever

upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only, if at all, upon the transferee.

34. The Register of Transfers may be closed at such times and for such periods as the Directors may from time to time determine, provided always that it shall not be closed for more than twenty-one days in any year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

35. The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder (other than one of several joint Shareholders) shall be the only person recognized by the Company, as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

36. Any guardian of any minor Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Directors think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

37. If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 36, shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder, no person shall within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such shares, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same, and the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

38. The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed, a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company, provided such acceptance is properly legalized.

39. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder requiring him to pay the same together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at, which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid. The notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

40. Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay, and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, premia, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at nine per centum per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

41. Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, reallocated, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

42. The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interests in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

43. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be effected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

44. The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payments of all moneys, due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per centum per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share *bona fide* sold or reallocated, or otherwise disposed of under Article 41 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

45. The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or in respect of any other debt, liability, or engagement whatsoever, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the time appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

46. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholders or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

47. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debt, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholders or his representatives.

48. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that the power of sale given by Article 46 has arisen and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

49. Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title of such share.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

50. Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right or preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (with preference), or at such premium, or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may from time to time by special resolution determine.

51. If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any,

accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that the Article shall not be read as implying the necessity, for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolutions could have been effected without it.

52. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company provided that no member, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any member personally present and entitled to vote at such meeting.

BORROWING POWERS.

53. The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees Ten Thousand (Rs. 10,000).

54. With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

55. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets, of the Company both present and future, including uncanceled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

56. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise.

57. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

58. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

59. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year, at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day in each year as may be determined by the Directors.

60. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

61. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

62. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company.

Upon the receipt of such requisition, the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

63. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than five days previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting.

64. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

65. Seven days notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the object and business of the meeting, shall be given by advertisement in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice, and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently upon the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

66. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors in place of those retiring by rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever to which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

67. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice upon which it was convened.

68. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented at the commencement of the business two or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

69. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

70. The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting, he shall not be present at the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Director be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

71. No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the Chair is vacant.

72. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place unless due notice thereof shall be given.

73. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting whether ordinary or extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

74. At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands, and in case there shall be an equality of votes the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some Shareholder, or in the case of a special resolution by five shareholders, present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The power of demanding a poll conferred by this clause may be exercised by the proxy or attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf.

75. If at any meeting a poll be demanded by some Shareholder present, his proxy or attorney, or in the case of a special resolution by five Shareholders, their proxies or attorneys at the meeting and entitled to vote, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and place and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided; and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder or proxy or attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

76. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

77. No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

78. On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. Where a Shareholder is present by an attorney who is not a Shareholder, such attorney shall be entitled to vote for such Shareholder on a show of hands. In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

79. The parent or guardian or curator of a minor Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian or curator of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator, of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such minor, lunatic, female, or deceased person unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

80. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.

81. No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by proxy or attorney at any meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares have been paid, and no Shareholder, other than the trustee assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least three months previous to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

82. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company, but this rule shall not apply to a power of attorney.

83. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written and shall be signed by the appointer (whether a Shareholder or his attorney) or if such appointer be a company or corporation, it shall be under the seal of such company or corporation.

84. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

The instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form:—

The Kemmana Rubber Company, Limited.

I, _____ of _____, appoint _____, of _____ as my proxy, to represent me and to vote for me and on my behalf at the Ordinary (or Extraordinary as the case may be) General Meeting of the Company to be held on the _____ day of _____, One thousand Nine hundred and _____, and at any adjournment thereof, and at every poll which may be taken in consequence thereof.

As witness my hand this _____ day of _____, One thousand Nine hundred and _____.

85. No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such votes shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

86. No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

DIRECTORS.

87. The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than five; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

88. The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least one thousand fully or partly paid shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors.

89. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Five Hundred Rupees annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company. The Directors may repay to any Director all reasonable travelling and hotel expenses incurred by him in or about the *bona fide* performance of his duties as a Director including all reasonable travelling expenses to and/or from Board Meetings.

90. The first Directors shall be Robert Gregor of Opata estate, Kahawatta, Sidney Diack of Poronuwa estate, Kahawatta, George Geddes of Wellandura estate, Kahawatta, and Alexander Dawson Panton of Urumiwella Group, Bulathkohupitiya.

The first Directors shall hold office till the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

91. One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director, or Managing Directors, and/or, Visiting Agent or Agents of the Company for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director, or Managing Directors and/or, Visiting Agent or Agents or Superintendents.

The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Director may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

92. At the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company all the Directors shall retire from office and at the First Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 93.

93. The Directors to retire from office at the Second Ordinary General Meeting shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

94. In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

95. Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

96. The Ordinary General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting.

97. Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise, may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

98. A General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors and may also determine in what rotation such increase or reduced number is to go out of office.

99. If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place the place of a retiring Director is not

filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the First Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

100. A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or Secretaries, or by leaving the same at the registered office of the Company, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before his office shall become vacant.

101. The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

102. Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

103. No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager, exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS.

104. The Office of Director shall be vacated :—

- (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director, Visiting Agent, Superintendent, or Secretary of the Company, or trustee for debenture holders.
- (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.
- (c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
- (d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.
- (e) If he resigns his office under the provisions of clause 100.
- (f) If he ceases to ordinarily reside in Ceylon or is absent from Ceylon for a period of six consecutive months.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company, or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or solicitors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract, work, or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

105. The Directors shall have power to carry into effect the acquisition of the said Kemmana estate and other lands situated in the said villages of Kemmana, Ridiwita, Hiramadagama, Makandura, Emitiyagoda, and Ammuduwa of the District of Ratnapura in the Island of Ceylon, and the lease, purchase, or acquisition of any other lands, estates, or property they may think fit, or any share or shares thereof.

106. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director, or with the assistance of an agent or agents and secretary or secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and

in and about the valuation, purchase, lease, or acquisition of the said estates and lands, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company.

107. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, superintendants, assistants, clerks, artisans, labourers, and other servants, for such period or periods, and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, treasurers, accountants, officers, clerks, or servants of the Company for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause for so doing.

108. The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting, and shall generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinance and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

109. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys, to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company on such terms as they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

110. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

111. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such secretaries.

112. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Shareholders of the Company in General Meeting, to arrange terms of the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or a special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

113. In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to, the general powers conferred or implied in any of the preceding clauses, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly

declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say) :—

- (a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company, and any claims or demands made by or against the Company.
- (b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or enforce the awards.
- (c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands by the Company.
- (d) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, inspector, or any similar office.
- (e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not to be immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or release such investments.
- (f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon, or elsewhere, all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors; and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of and in substitution for all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf and from time to time to revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or Company to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

114. The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings at such places and times and in such manner as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

115. A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

116. The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

117. Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.

118. The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

119. The Meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

120. The acts of the Board or of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment or qualification of any Director or of any member of the

committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect has existed, and as if such person had been duly appointed or qualified, provided the same be done before the discovery of the vacancy or defect.

121. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

122. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the purpose:—

- (1) Of all appointments (a) of officers and (b) committees made by Directors.
- (2) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.
- (3) Of the names of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.
- (4) Of all orders made by the Directors.
- (5) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings of the Company.
- (6) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.
- (7) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the committees appointed by the Board.

123. All such minutes shall be signed by the person who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, as the case may be; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be *prima facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

ACCOUNTS.

124. The Agent or Secretary, or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being, or if there be no Agent or Secretary, or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such sums were received and expended, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company. The accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company, as the Directors think fit.

125. The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of the them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account, or book, or document of the Company except as conferred by Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

126. At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the previous financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the same period.

127. The statements so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income, distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other heads of expenditure. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting, and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

128. The balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in Schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861", or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

129. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the amount which the Directors recommended should be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

130. A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

131. The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained, by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

AUDIT.

132. No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during the continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.

133. The Directors shall appoint the First Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the Second General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall, except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and the Auditor or Auditors appointed at such meeting shall hold office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

134. The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

135. Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

136. If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor, is not supplied at the Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.

137. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, after his appointment, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto, and to report thereon to the meeting, generally, or specially, as he may think fit.

138. The Auditor or Auditors for the time being shall have a list delivered to him or them of all books kept by the Company, and he or they shall at all reasonable hours in the daytime have access to all accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company for the purpose of Audit.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

139. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and/or pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of net profits.

140. The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, or pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account, and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year.

141. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend or bonus, set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund and may invest the same in such securities as they may select, or place the same in fixed deposit in any bank or banks, and may from time to time deal with and vary such investment and apply such reserve fund or such portion thereof as they think fit, to meet contingencies or for special dividends or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing, or maintaining, or extending any building or and premises of the Company, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purposes connected with the interest of the Company that they may from time to time deem expedient without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.

142. Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend or bonus declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends or bonuses which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of the Company or of any other Company, or in any other form of specie, or any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction, and when any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates

and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such specific assets in trustees upon such trust for the persons entitled to the dividend or bonus as may seem expedient to the Directors.

143. No unpaid dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.

144. No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

145. The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding the fact that such sums or any of them are not payable until after the date when such dividend or bonus is payable.

146. Notice of any dividend that has been declared, or of any bonus to be paid, shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and any dividend or bonus unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company, and if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.

147. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

148. Every dividend or bonus, payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

NOTICES.

149. Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or persons appointed by the Board to authenticate the same.

150. Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

151. A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder either personally or by being sent through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode, and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead unless his executors or administrators shall have given to the Directors or to the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries of the Company, their own or some other address in Ceylon to which notice may be sent.

152. All notices directed to be given to Shareholders shall with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled, other than a firm, be given to whichever of such persons is named first in the Register of Shareholders, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

153. Any notice if served by post, shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a post office or post box, and the entry in the Company's book of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

154. Any Shareholder who fails to give and register an address in Ceylon as provided in Article No. 151, shall not be entitled to be given any notices.

155. All notices required to be given by advertisement shall be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

ARBITRATION.

156. Whenever any question or other matter whatsoever arises in dispute between the Company and any other Company or person, the same may be referred by the Directors to arbitration.

EVIDENCE.

157. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money

claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to provide the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISION RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

158. Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not and whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

159. If the Company shall be wound up, whether voluntarily or otherwise, the liquidator or liquidators may with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may with the like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator or liquidators with the like sanction shall think fit, and if thought expedient, any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the members of the Company and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights or may be excluded altogether or in part, and the liquidator or liquidators shall be entitled to sell all or any of the assets of the Company in consideration of or in exchange for shares, ordinary, fully paid, part paid, or preference in the purchasing company, but in case any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on or any sale made of any or all of the assets of the Company in exchange for shares in the purchasing company either ordinary, fully paid, or part paid, or preference, any contributory who, would be prejudiced thereby, shall have a right to dissent as if such determination were a special resolution passed pursuant to the section 192 on the Companies (Consolidation) Act of 1908 in England but for the purposes of an arbitration as in sub-section (6) of the said section provided the provisions of the Ceylon Arbitration Ordinance, 1866, and of the Ceylon Ordinance No. 2 of 1889, shall apply in place of the English and Scotch Acts referred to in the said sub-section (6) of section 192 of the aforesaid Companies (Consolidation) Act, and the said section 192 save as herein excepted, shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these present Articles.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on February 25, 1939, at 9.10 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated February 21, 1939.

Present : Mr. M. K. T. Sandys, Chairman; Sir Cudah Ratwatte, Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. Beven; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. O. T. Nettelton.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on January 21, 1939, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements for the 12 months ended December 31, 1938, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for January, 1939.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the months of January, 1939.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending February 25, 1939.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—(1) Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during January, 1939. (2) Half yearly report on the condition of drives in Kandy.

3A. (1) Mr. Beven drew the Chairman's attention to the condition of the paths round the lake. He said that the gravelling was done in patches, and the gravel used was not of the quality required as they were sharp stones which prevented pedestrians using the paths.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matter and report. On Sir Cudah's suggestion he also agreed to look into the condition of Lady Horton's walk.

(2) Dr. Godlieb inquired whether a census of the unemployed in Kandy could be taken.

The Chairman explained the action he had taken in that connection.

(3) Mr. de Silva observed that the present rates of pay given to the unemployed were too low and should be revised.

(4) Dr. Godlieb inquired whether hydraulic tests on the joints of the 8-inch main laid in Peradeniya road were taken before the pipes were covered. Mr. de Silva answered that all tests were carried out.

(5) On the suggestion of Mr. Wijayatilake the Chairman agreed to enquire whether residents of the area which is now served with water from the wells at Peradeniya were experiencing any trouble as regards supply.

(6) Mr. Soysa observed that all ratepayers were interested in knowing when the elections would be held, and he desired that steps be taken to avoid delay. The Chairman explained that as matters stood at present the elections could be held in early June, but he would do his best to expedite them.

(7) The question of the appointment of a Librarian for the Municipal Free Library was raised, and with the leave of Council, Mr. Marikar moved that the qualification of "Inter Arts of the London University" prescribed for the post in the Salaries Scheme of 1934, be reduced to "London Matriculation", without altering the salary of Rs. 900 attached to the post, and that in selecting a candidate to fill the present vacancy preference be given in the following order :—(1) Council's Officers, (2) Local Applicants, and (3) Applicants from outside Kandy. Mr. Soysa seconded.—Carried.

Mr. Wijayatilake was opposed to the qualification being reduced.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Marikar presented (1) Petition dated February 16, 1939, from Mr. Maula Thamby complaining that the claim made on him of arrears of electricity dues defaulted by a previous tenant was inequitable, and that his proctor who gave an undertaking to pay the amount under protest should be released from the obligation. (2) Letter dated February 23, 1939, addressed to Mr. Marikar by Mr. S. L. A. Majid complaining that he had been served with bills for water consumed when no water had been supplied, and asking that the Chairman be directed to investigate the matter and provide him with water.

Resolved that petition (1) be referred to the Electricity Committee and petition (2) to the Works Committee.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijayatilake asked the following questions which the Chairman replied :—

(1) Q.—When was my motion for the construction of a road to run almost parallel to the railway line through Deyannawela, Suduhumpola, and Bowela and to join the Colombo road accepted by Council? A.—There appear to have been two motions proposed by the hon. member on this subject. The first was on June 16, 1928, and it was resolved that the Chairman should correspond with the Public Works Department and bring the matter up at a later stage.

No papers regarding any further action taken on this resolution have been traced.

The second was proposed at the Council meeting held on September 21, 1935. The minutes read—"After some discussion the Council agreed to ask the Municipal Engineer to prepare plans and estimates for a section of the road from Deyannawela up to Hantane road."

(2) Q.—Since the said motion was accepted by Council, approved by Government and highly commended by the press, have any data been collected or even a sketch plan made to give effect to the said resolutions? A.—Yes. Mr. Spencer at once prepared a sketch and the late Municipal Engineer, Mr. Garment, prepared an estimate amounting to Rs. 40,000. This estimate is dated December 13, 1935. After that the file is silent for some time, and I can only infer that the matter was postponed in 1936 on considerations of cost. In the 1937 budget I find a token vote of Rs. 1,000 "for constructing a new road through Deyannawela to connect on to the road constructed by relief labourers outside Municipal limits". This must be the road in question. This token vote was again inserted at the end of 1937 in the budget for 1938.

On December 13, 1937, the present Works Engineer, Mr. Gunasekera, called for papers. Since then he has revised the estimate but the papers relating to this matter have been temporarily mislaid. Search for them is still proceeding. In the meantime a few weeks ago I inspected the section of this road near the Model Tenements and decided that a survey was necessary. This is now awaiting the attention of the Council's Surveyor. The Rs. 1,000 will be revoted shortly.

(3) Q.—Since the University is to be established at Peradeniya, and since the construction of a road as described in the said motion will, in addition to diverting traffic from Peradeniya road, give easier access to Kandy from the University area, will the Chairman be pleased to get into touch with the proper authorities with a view to ascertain if Government will make a reasonable contribution towards the construction of such a road? A.—Yes. I am quite agreeable to getting into touch with the Public Works Department on this subject, and should be glad if the hon. member could ask me for details of progress from time to time.

(4) Q.—When was the construction of Lady Manning's drive started? A.—In 1922.

(5) Q.—Have any steps been taken to obtain a vote even with the next budget for the completion of the said drive? A.—No vote was taken in the 1939 budget. There was a vote of Rs. 3,000 for this purpose in the 1938 budget, but only Rs. 54.50 of this was spent, and it is proposed to ask for a revote of the balance Rs. 2,945.50 to be spent in acquisition of the trace of the next section of this road during the remainder of 1939. Whether this sum can be actually spent or not will however depend on the time taken by Council to come to an agreement with the landowners and by the Government Agent over the acquisition proceedings.

(6) Q.—Was any land belonging to the Asgiriya temple donated to the Council for the construction of the said road? A.—Yes.

(7) Q.—If so, was any undertaking given by the Council to construct a gate at the point where the private road to the temple met the new road? A.—Yes.

(8) Q.—If such an undertaking was given, why has the work not been undertaken? A.—The possibility of giving effect to this undertaking was considered by Mr. Whitehorn in 1930, and again by Mr. Rogerson in 1936, but it was found impracticable to give effect to the undertaking as all persons who use the path in question and over which they appear to have established a right of way are not served either by Lady Manning's drive or by the Udamadapotha road. It is possible, however that all parties may be persuaded to consent to the closing of the road through the temple after the construction of the Udamadapotha road is complete.

(9) Q.—Will the Chairman be pleased to table all papers relating to the construction of this road? A.—The papers are tabled.

6. Letter dated February 3, 1939, from the Secretary to the Minister for Health, requesting the Council to nominate a person who should be appointed as a visitor to the Kandy Hospital for 1939. (O 666).—Resolved that Mr. Soysa be nominated.

7. To table letter No. B 1431 of January 13, 1939, from the Secretary to the Minister for Local Administration stating that the Hon. the Minister would prefer the question of revocation of regulation 4 of the regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance published in *Gazette* No. 8,265 of December 23, 1936, to lie over for consideration by the new Council, and to consider Chairman's proposal for the enlargement of the Market street stand for which a vote of Rs. 1,730·60 is required. (O 114).—Resolved the Chairman dissenting that the consideration of the proposal to enlarge the stand be deferred until the new Motor Car Ordinance is put into operation and the new Council begins to function.

It was further agreed that the Chairman should address the Hon. the Minister pointing out the urgent necessity to give effect to the Council's proposal to revoke regulation 4 of the regulations referred to.

8. To obtain approval for exempting the stall holders of the public market who are trading in dry fish from the necessity to obtain licences under by-law 131B.—Resolved that the papers be referred to the Law Committee for consideration of the proposal.

9. Two tenders received for the entire construction and completion of a playground, well, and bathing place at Deyannawela.—Resolved that the tender of Contractor Suwaris for Rs. 955·25 be accepted.

(10) Tenders received for the construction of roadside drains along Peradeniya road.—Resolved that the tender of Contractor Suwaris for Rs. 1,130·50 be accepted.

11. Papers *re* the proposal made by Mrs. Godlieb for starting a Waiting and Convalescent Home in Kandy. The Chairman read his memo on the subject and pointed out that the proposal involved the allotment of one or two of the Katukele Model Tenements, and the Council's contribution would be the amount of rent of these tenements.

Mr. de Silva moved that consideration of the proposal be deferred and the Medical Officer of Health be asked to submit a complete scheme with full details of cost to be organized and run as a Municipal concern, and if such a scheme were found impracticable then to consider any other scheme that may be put forward. Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried, the Chairman and Mr. Ismail dissenting.

12. Application from Messrs. Madan Theatres for an extension of the lease of the Empire Theatre site for a further term of 3 years from January 1, 1941, on the terms of the present lease.—Resolved to reply that the Council will be prepared to consider an extension if Messrs. Madan Theatres would agree to erect a building worthy of the town of Kandy on a design submitted by them and approved by the Council as a condition of such extension.

13. To obtain sanction for the reconveyance of premises No. 641/642, Peradeniya road, to Packeer Lebbe Mohamado Lebbe Sameem.—Resolved that reconveyance be sanctioned accordingly.

14. Progress report of Municipal Forester for the month of January, 1939. Tabled.

15. Estimate for Rs. 30 from the Works Engineer for constructing a notice board at Temple street bus stand.—Resolved that the estimate be passed.

16. To obtain sanction to renew the lease of site for a shed to house the bier at Mahaiyawa for a further term of 5 years on the present terms and conditions.—Resolved that renewal be approved accordingly.

17. Estimate for Rs. 343 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer to provide lights on the road leading to the new Toc H. building.—Resolved that the estimate be passed.

18. Letter No. EX/63 of December 23, 1938, from the Director of Commerce and Industries, forwarding a copy of accounts of the last Industrial Exhibition and stating that there were no profits, after meeting all overhead charges and Government contribution, to make any contribution to charitable institutions in Kandy.

The Chairman was directed to address the Director of Commerce and Industries again claiming a share of the profits.

19. Recommendations of Standing and Special Committees :—

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on December 17, 1938.

(1) Papers *re* reconveyance of premises No. 75, Siyambalagastenne.—Recommended that it be reconveyed in favour of Jamila Umma, W. Usubu Lebbe's son, Omaru Lebbe, and A. Mohamado Lebbe's son, Ahamed Lebbe with the written consent of the original owner.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on January 21, 1939.

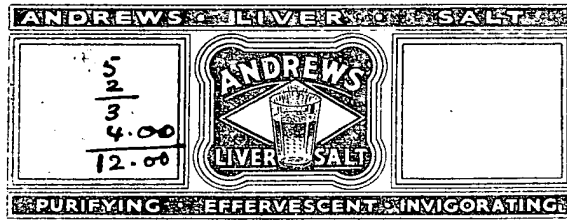
