## REGULATION.

No person shall on any Crown land outside a National Reserve—

- (a) hunt, shoot, kill or take any animal, reptile, or bird between sunset and sunrise; or
- (b) set, lay, or spread any net, pitfall, trap, snare or other instrument for the purpose of killing or taking any animal, reptile, or bird,

unless he is the holder of a permit in that behalf issued by the Warden, or otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of such permit. L. D.-B 50/34

REGULATION made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands under section 9 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance, 1909.

#### REGULATION.

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, published in Gazette No. 8,338 of December 17, 1937, are hereby amended in Part III. thereof, by the substitution, for regulation 25 set out under the heading "B—cattle", of the following new regulation:-

"25. (1) No person shall at the Port of Colombo, land, or cause or permit the landing of, any head of cattle imported from any port or place outside Asia or Africa, unless written permission for such landing has been granted by a Government Veterinary Officer after due inspection of the cattle.

(2) In any case where such Government Veterinary Officer is, after inspection of any head of cattle, of opinion that it should be placed under observation or subjected to further tests, he may, in granting permission for its being landed under paragraph (1), prescribe conditions as to the place at which and the manner in which it shall be kept; and the person to whom such permission is granted shall keep the head of cattle in accordance with such conditions until such time as the Government Veterinary Surgeon authorizes its removal from such place.

(3) No person shall remove or cause the removal of any head of cattle landed under paragraph (1) from the Customs premises without a Pass which shall be issued by the Collector of Customs upon the production of the Government Veterinary Officer's written permission to land under paragraph (1).

(4) The importer of any cattle shall pay to the Government Veterinary Officer a fee calculated at the rates set out hereunder for the inspection of such cattle under this regulation: Provided that the fee payable by any one importer in respect of any one shipment of cattle shall not exceed twenty rupees.

THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE, No. 22 OF 1937.

IT is hereby notified that the regulation set out hereunder made by the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce under section 4 of the Food Control Ordinance, No. 22 of 1937, has been approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the said section.

REGULATION.

The Food Control Regulations, 1938, published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 8,397 of September 27, 1938, are hereby amended in the Regulations under the head "E. EFFECT OF ORDERS FOR ALLOCATION AND RATIONING OF SUPPLIES"—

(1) in Part I. of those Regulations, by the addition at the end of that Part of the following new regulation: "3. Where an Order is in operation for the allocation of supplies of any cattle, food or article of

food, the officer in charge of any railway goods shed at which any quantity of such supplies arrives after transport by rail-

- (a) shall forthwith inform the Deputy Food Controller, for the district or area in which that goods shed is situated, of the quantity of such supplies which have arrived and of the name of the consignee
- (b) shall not cause or permit the whole or any part of that quantity to be removed from the goods shed except in compliance with any order which may be issued in that behalf by the Deputy Food Controller, or upon production of a permit from the Deputy Food Controller authorizing such removal.";
- (2) by the substitution, for Part III. of those Regulations, of the following:-

#### Part III.

Supplies and Distribution in Places other than Estates.

1. Where an Order is in operation directing the Food Controller to allocate supplies of any food or article of food to distributors or merchants and to organize and administer a system of rationing such supplies, the regulations in this Part shall have effect for the purpose of the allocation and rationing of such supplies to persons resident in all places other than estates to which the regulations in Part II. apply.

2. (1) In this Part—

"controlled commodity" means any food or article of food for the allocation and rationing of supplies of which an Order under section 3 (1) (g) of the Ordinance is in force; "period of control" means the period during which an Order is in force for the allocation

and rationing of supplies of any food or article of food.

- (2) Any reference in any regulation in this Part to a Deputy Food Controller shall, in its application in the case of any district or area, be deemed to be a reference to the Deputy Food Controller appointed for that district or area.
- 3. The Deputy Food Controller appointed for any district or area may establish such number of supply stations as he may consider necessary in order that supplies of any controlled commodity may be distributed in accordance with the provisions of this Part for the purpose of sale to the inhabitants of that district or area.

4. (1) The Food Controller may from time to time by notice published in the Gazette declare the weekly ration of any controlled commodity which may be sold for consumption by an individual

during the period of control.

(2) The Deputy Food Controller appointed for any district or area shall, save as otherwise provided

(2) The Deputy Food Controller appointed for any district or area shall, save as otherwise provided in regulation 8, issue a ration book or cause a ration book to be issued to every inhabitant of that district or area who has attained the age of three years, in order to enable such inhabitants to procure supplies of a controlled commodity during the period of control:

Provided, however, that where the Deputy Food Controller is satisfied that a sufficient quantity of any controlled commodity will be available for consumption by any inhabitant and that it is not necessary to issue a ration book to him, the Deputy Food Controller may refuse to issue a ration book to that inhabitant.

(3) Every ration book issued under this regulation in respect of any controlled commodity shall contain coupons upon the surrender of which supplies of the commodity may be purchased or obtained in accordance with the provisions of this Part. Every such coupon shall bear a number indicating the week, commencing with the first week of the period of control, for which the coupon will be valid.

(4) Every person who issues any ration book under this Part shall specify therein the name and address of the inhabitant to whom the book is issued, and shall enter in the book such other particulars as the Controller may direct.

- 5. (1) The Deputy Food Controller appointed for any district or area other than the Municipality of Colombo
  - (a) shall authorize a sufficient number of merchants or other fit and proper persons to be distributors (hereinafter referred to as "authorized distributors") of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people, and shall specify in the case of each such distributor the supply station or the name of the wholesale dealer, as the case may be, from whom such supplies may be obtained by

(b) may direct such number of wholesale dealers as he may consider expedient to sell supplies of any controlled commodity to specified distributors in accordance with the provisions of this Part.

(2) The Deputy Food Controller appointed for any district or area in respect of which persons have under paragraph (1) been authorized to be distributors of supplies of any controlled commodity shall specify or cause to be specified in every ration book issued to an inhabitant of that district or area the name of the authorized distributor from whom such supplies may be purchased by that inhabitant, and the distributor shall, when the book is first produced to him by the holder thereof, affix his signature in the green state of the signature of the supplier of the sup in the space provided for the purpose in the cover of the ration book.

(3) Every authorized distributor shall, each week, on demand made by or on behalf of the holder of a ration book which entitles the holder to purchase any controlled commodity from that distributor and on payment of the purchase price, sell and deliver such quantity of the commodity, not exceeding the weekly ration declared under regulation 4 (1), as the holder may require:

Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to prevent an authorized distributor

from delivering such quantity without requiring payment of the purchase price therefor.

(4) Every authorized distributor shall, upon the sale of any quantity of any controlled commodity to the holder of a ration book or to any person on behalf of such holder, remove or cause to be removed from that book the coupon entitling the holder to purchase that quantity and no distributor shall deliver any quantity of such commodity unless the coupon is removed from the ration book in his presence.

(5) In every case where a distributor is informed under paragraph (1) that supplies of any controlled commodity may be obtained by him from a supply station, the distributor shall, when he desires to obtain such supplies, make application in that behalf to the Deputy Food Controller; and the Deputy Food Controller may issue to that distributor an order addressed to the officer in charge of a supply station directing that officer to deliver to the distributor such quantity of such supplies as may be specified in the order. No order for the delivery of any quantity of such supplies shall be issued to any authorized distributor under this paragraph except upon delivery to the Deputy Food Controller of coupons received by the distributor under this regulation or regulation 7 and representing that quantity of such supplies, and except upon payment of the purchase price of that quantity.

(6) In every case where a distributor is informed under paragraph (1) that supplies of a controlled commodity may be obtained by him from a specified wholesale dealer, the distributor shall, when he desires to obtain supplies, surrender to the wholesale dealer coupons received by the distributor under this regulation or regulation 7 and representing the quantity of such supplies which he requires; and the wholesale dealer shall thereupon on payment of the purchase price sell and deliver such quantity of such supplies to that distributor: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prevent a wholesale dealer from delivering such quantity without requiring payment of the purchase price therefor.

  (7) Every wholesale dealer to whom coupons are surrendered under paragraph (6) shall, when he desires to obtain supplies of a controlled commodity, make application in that behalf to the Deputy Food Controller; and the Deputy Food Controller may upon such application issue to that dealer an order addressed to the officer in charge of a supply station directing that officer to deliver to the dealer such quantity of such supplies as may be specified in the order. No order for the delivery of any quantity of such supplies shall be issued to any dealer under this paragraph except upon delivery to the Deputy Food Controller of coupons representing that quantity of such supplies and except upon payment of the purchase price of that quantity.
- 6. (1) Every inhabitant of the Municipality of Colombo to whom a ration book is issued under this Part shall, as soon as may be after the date of the issue of the ration book, present the book to the retail trader from whom he desires, during the period of control, to purchase supplies of the controlled commodity in respect of which the ration book is issued.

(2) Every retail trader to whom a ration book is presented under paragraph (1) shall, if he agrees to sell supplies of a controlled commodity to the holder of that book—

 (a) cause the holder to enter his name and address and to affix his signature or thumb impression in the trader's counterfoil contained in the ration book;

(b) remove the trader's counterfoil from the ration book;

- (c) enter his name and address and affix his signature in the space provided for the purpose in the cover of the ration book.
- (3) Where a retail trader has, in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (2), affixed his signature in a ration book issued in respect of any controlled commodity, he shall each week on demand made by or on behalf of the holder of that ration book and on payment of the purchase price sell and deliver such quantity of such commodity not exceeding the weekly ration declared under regulation 4 (1), as the holder may require: Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to prevent a retail trader from delivering such quantity without requiring payment of the purchase price therefor.

(4) Every retail trader who sells or delivers any quantity of any controlled commodity under paragraph (3) to the holder of a ration book shall upon such sale or delivery remove or cause to be removed from the book the coupon entitling the holder to purchase that quantity; and no trader shall deliver any quantity of such commodity upon the surrender of a coupon unless the coupon is removed from the ration book in his presence.

(5) (a) Every retail trader shall, as soon as may be after he agrees under paragraph (2) to sell supplies of any controlled commodity to the holders of ration books, cause himself to be registered with a wholesale dealer who is willing to sell such supplies to him during the period of control; and upon such registration the retail trader and the wholesale dealer shall execute, in duplicate, a document in the form set out hereunder. One of such forms shall be retained by the retail trader and the other of such forms by the wholesale dealer.

(b) Every retail trader who is registered under paragraph (a) with a wholesale dealer shall surrender to the dealer the trader's counterfoils removed by him from ration books under the provisions of paragraph (2) of this regulation, together with a list signed by him showing the serial numbers assigned to the counterfoils so surrendered; and the wholesale dealer shall, if required so to do, acknowledge receipt of the counterfoils, and shall deliver to the Deputy Food Controller all counterfoils and lists surrendered to him by retail traders under this paragraph.

(6) Where a retail trader and a wholesale dealer have executed a document in the form prescribed in paragraph (5), the wholesale dealer shall from time to time upon surrender to him by that trader of coupons received by the trader under this regulation or regulation 7 and upon payment of the purchase price sell and deliver to that trader the quantity of supplies equivalent to the quantity represented by the coupons delivered to him: Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to prevent the dealer from delivering such causaffing the paragraph of the purchase price therefore

from delivering such quantity without requiring payment of the purchase price therefor.

(7) Every wholesale dealer to whom coupons are surrendered under paragraph (6) shall, when he desires to obtain supplies, make application in that behalf to the Deputy Food Controller; and the Deputy Food Controller may upon such application issue to that dealer an order addressed to the officer in charge of a supply station directing that officer to deliver to the dealer such quantity of such supplies as may be specified in the order, or may issue to the dealer a permit authorizing the dealer to remove from any specified granary, warehouse or store such quantity of such supplies as may be specified in the permit. No order or permit for the delivery or removal of any quantity of such supplies shall be issued to any dealer under this paragraph except upon delivery to the Deputy Food Controller of coupons representing that quantity of such supplies.

representing that quantity of such supplies.

(8) Notwithstanding that any retail trader may have been registered with a wholesale dealer under the provisions of paragraph (5), the Deputy Food Controller may make order cancelling that registration, and may by notice require that trader to cause himself to be registered with some other wholesale dealer named in the notice and call upon such other dealer to execute the document referred to in that paragraph; and the provisions of paragraph (6) shall apply accordingly for the purpose of enabling that trader

to purchase or obtain supplies from such other dealer.

7. (1) The proprietor or manager of any hotel, restaurant or eating-house may, upon production of a ration book issued under this Part and upon surrender to him of a valid coupon removed from the ration book in his presence, sell or deliver to the holder of the ration book a quantity of any controlled commodity not exceeding the quantity which the holder is entitled to purchase or obtain upon surrender

of that coupon. The quantity so delivered shall not be supplied otherwise than in the form of a meal: Provided, however, that if the holder so requires, such quantity may be supplied in the form of meals

served on two or more occasions in any week.

(2) (a) In the case of any area outside the Municipality of Colombo, the Deputy Food Controller may, on application made by the proprietor or manager of any hotel, restaurant or cating-house, direct an authorized distributor to sell supplies of any controlled commodity to such proprietor or manager during the period of control; and in every such case the distributor shall, upon delivery to him by the proprietor or manager of coupons surrendered under paragraph (1) of this regulation and upon payment of the purchase price, sell and deliver to the proprietor or manager such quantity of the controlled commodity as he may require, not exceeding the quantity represented by the number of coupons so delivered: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prevent the distributor from

delivered: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prevent the distributor from delivering such quantity without requiring payment of the purchase price therefor.

(b) Any authorized distributor who sells or delivers supplies of any controlled commodity under paragraph (a) may obtain supplies of the commodity under the provisions of paragraph (5) or paragraph (6) of regulation 5, upon the delivery to a wholesale dealer or to a supply station, as the case may be, of coupons received by the distributor under this regulation.

(3) (a) The proprietor or manager of any hotel, restaurant or eating-house situated in the Municipality of Colombo may cause himself to be registered with a retail trader from whom he desires to purchase supplies of any controlled commodity during the period of control and, where he is so registered with any retail trader, the trader and the proprietor or manager shall execute in duplicate a document in the form set out hereunder. One of such forms should be retained by the trader and the other of such forms by such proprietor or manager.

- (b) Where a retail trader and the proprietor or manager of any hotel, restaurant or eating-house have executed a document in the form prescribed in paragraph (a) the trader shall, from time to time, upon delivery to him by the proprietor or manager of coupons surrendered under paragraph (1) of this regulation for the purchase of meals and upon payment of the purchase price, sell and deliver to the proprietor or manager such quantity of the controlled commodity as he may require, not exceeding the quantity represented by the number of coupons so delivered: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prevent the trader from delivering such quantity without requiring payment of the purchase price therefor.
- (c) Any retail trader who sells or delivers supplies of any controlled commodity under paragraph (b) may obtain supplies of the commodity under the provisions of regulation 6 upon delivery, to the wholesale dealer with whom he has been registered, of coupons received by the trader under this regulation.
- (4) The proprietor or manager of any hotel, restaurant or eating-house who has obtained supplies of any controlled commodity under this regulation shall not sell or deliver any part of such supplies to any person except in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1).
- (1) In the case of any prison, Government hospital or other Government institution at which meals are usually supplied to not less than ten persons the Deputy Food Controller for the district or area in which such prison, hospital or institution is situated may, in lieu of issuing ration books under regulation 4 to those persons, issue from time to time to the officer in charge of the institution a permit authorizing that officer or his authorized agent to take delivery from an authorized distributor, retail trader or wholesale dealer named in the permit of such quantity of any controlled commodity as may be specified therein.

(2) Any officer who obtains supplies of any controlled commodity under a permit issued under paragraph (1) shall take such steps as may be necessary to ensure that every person to whom meals are usually supplied in the prison, hospital or institution, as the case may be, receives each week in the form of meals a quantity of the commodity equivalent to the ration declared under regulation 4 (1).

(3) Where any person who is the holder of a ration book is received into any such prison, hospital cr institution and resides or is detained therein, he shall surrender the ration book to the officer in charge thereof and such officer shall-

- (a) where any quantity of the controlled commodity is supplied to such person remove
- from the book the coupon entitling that person to receive that quantity; and
  (b) return the ration book to that person when he leaves the prison, hospital or institution.
- 9. The Deputy Food Controller for any district or area in which a Hindu temple is situated may from time to time, upon application made by the manager of the temple, issue to the manager a permit authorizing him to take delivery from an authorized distributor, retail trader or wholesale dealer named in the permit of such quantity of any controlled commodity as may be specified therein, for use for religious purposes in the temple.

(1) The Deputy Food Controller for any district or area may from time to time sell or issue or cause to be issued to any authorized distributor, retail trader or wholesale dealer such quantities of supplies of any controlled commodity, in addition to the quantities delivered under regulation 5 or regulation 6, as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling such distributor, trader or dealer to sell or deliver supplies to persons to whom permits have been issued under the provisions of regulation 8 or regulation 9.

(2) No permit shall be issued under regulation 8 or regulation 9 unless the Deputy Food Controller is satisfied that the distributor or trader or dealer named in the permit will have in his possession a sufficient quantity of supplies to enable him to sell to the holder of the permit the quantity of supplies specified therein.

(3) Upon production to any distributor, trader or dealer of a permit issued under regulation 8 (a) Upon production to any distributor, trader of dealer of a permit issued under regulation or regulation 9 authorizing the holder thereof to take delivery of a specified quantity of supplies and upon payment of the purchase price therefor, such distributor, trader or dealer shall be bound to sell and deliver such specified quantity to the holder of the permit:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prevent such distributor, trader or dealer from delivering any quantity not exceeding the quantity specified in the permit without requiring nayment of the purchase price therefore.

(4) Any distributor, trader or dealer who sells or delivers any quantity of supplies of a controlled commodity upon production of a permit shall take possession of the permit and shall produce it on demand when required to do so by the Deputy Food Controller or by any person authorized by him for the purpose.

Provisions applicable to dealers, &c.

- (1) No authorized distributor or retail trader or wholesale dealer shall-
  - (a) purchase or take delivery of any supplies of any controlled commodity, except in accordance with the provisions of this Part;
  - (b) sell or deliver to any person (other than a person who is entitled under the provisions of this Part to take delivery of supplies of any controlled commodity from such distributor, trader or dealer), any quantity of such supplies except for the purpose of complying with any notice issued under Part I. of these Regulations.
- (2) No authorized distributor or retail trader shall in any week sell or deliver to the holder of a ration book any quantity of any controlled commodity
  - (a) in excess of the ration declared under regulation 4(1); or
  - (b) except upon surrender of a coupon which is valid for that week and which is removed from the ration book by or in the presence of the distributor or dealer.

(3) No wholesale dealer shall sell or deliver under the provisions of regulation 5 or regulation 6 to any authorized distributor or retail trader any quantity of supplies of any controlled commodity exceeding the quantity represented by the coupons surrendered to him by such distributor or trader.

- (4) No authorized distributor, retail trader or wholesale dealer shall without lawful cause refuse to sell to any person any quantity of any controlled commodity which that person is entitled under this Part to purchase from such distributor, trader or dealer, if the purchase price for that quantity is tendered by that person and if that person surrenders a valid coupon or permit entitling him to purchase that quantity.
- (5) Every authorized distributor, retail trader or wholesale dealer shall keep such books or registers and make such entries therein as the Deputy Food Controller may require and shall forthwith produce such books or registers for inspection on demand made by the Deputy Food Controller or by any person authorized by him for the purpose.
- (6) Every authorized distributor, retail trader or wholesale dealer shall comply with all such directions as may be issued by the Deputy Food Controller for the purpose of securing that supplies of any controlled commodity are distributed in accordance with the provisions of this Part.

Change of residence.

- (1) Where any person who has been resident in any district or area to which the provisions of an order for the rationing of supplies of any controlled commodity have not been applied, commences to reside in a district or area to which the provisions of the order apply, the Deputy Food Controller for the district or area in which the new place of residence is situated may refuse to issue a ration book to that person if he fails to produce a certificate of identity signed by a Justice of the Peace or by an officer of the Revenue Department of a rank not below that of Chief Headman or Muhandiram.
- (2) Where the holder of a ration book changes his place of residence and desires to purchase supplies of a controlled commodity from a distributor or trader other than the distributor or trader whose name is specified or entered in that ration book under regulation 5 or regulation 6, the Deputy Food Controller for the district or area in which the new place of residence is situated may, if he thinks fit and upon surrender of the ration book issue to that person a ration book entitling him to purchase or obtain such supplies from a new authorized distributor or retail trader specified in the book; and the Deputy Food Controller shall in every such case direct such new distributor or trader to sell supplies of the commodity to that person in accordance with the provisions of regulation 5 or regulation 6, as the case may be.
- The Deputy Food Controller for any district or area, if he is satisfied that any authorized distributor or retail trader has committed a breach of any provision in this Part or has ceased to carry on business as a dealer in any controlled commodity, may require the holders of ration books in which the name of that distributor or trader has been specified or entered under regulation 5 or regulation 6 to surrender the ration books, and may issue to every such holder a new ration book entitling him to purchase or obtain such supplies from a new authorized distributor or retail trader specified in the book; and the Deputy Food Controller shall in every such case direct such new distributor or trader to sell supplies of the commodity to the holder of the book in accordance with the provisions of regulation 5 or regulation 6, as the case may be.

- 14. The holder of a ration book-
  - (a) shall not sell the book or deliver or transfer it to any other person except for the purpose of enabling that person to purchase or obtain supplies of a controlled commodity for and on behalf of the holder;
  - (b) shall not, save as otherwise provided in regulation 7, purchase or take delivery of any quantity of such supplies from any person other than the authorized distributor or retail trader, as the case may be, whose name is specified or entered in the book;
  - (c) shall, when he purchases or obtains any quantity of such supplies from an authorized distributor or retail trader, as the case may be, produce the ration book to the distributor or trader and permit him to remove from the book the coupon or coupons entitling the holder to purchase or obtain that quantity;
  - (d) shall not purchase or obtain during any week any quantity of such supplies in excess of the weekly ration declared under regulation 4 (1);
  - (e) shall not use any coupon for the purpose of purchasing or obtaining any supplies except during the week for which the coupon is valid;
  - (f) shall, when called upon by the Food Controller or by any Deputy Food Controller or any other person duly authorized in that behalf, produce the ration book for inspection, and shall surrender the ration book if required to do so under regulation 13.

Supplementary provisions as to ration books.

- 15. (1) No person shall alter or deface any ration book or make any entries therein except in accordance with the provisions of this Part.
- (2) No person shall make application for the issue in his name of more than one ration book or be the holder of more than one ration book.
- (3) No person shall use any ration book issued in the name of any other person except for the purpose of obtaining delivery of supplies of any controlled commodity for and on behalf of such other person.
- Where any person, other than an authorized distributor, has in his possession in any premises any quantity of any controlled commodity, he shall not sell or otherwise deliver possession of any part of such quantity except in accordance with these Regulations and with such directions as may be issued to him by the Food Controller or by the Deputy Food Controller for the district or area in which such premises are situated.

IT is hereby notified in terms of section 3 (3) of the Food Control Ordinance, No. 22 of 1937, that the Order under section 3 (1) of the Ordinance, prohibiting the removal or transport of paddy grown in the Maritime pattus of the Mullaittivu District or rice made from such paddy except on permits issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Mullaittivu, and published in Gazette No. 8,441 of March 24, 1939, has been confirmed by the Board of Ministers.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Friday, February 24, 1939, pursuant to notice dated February 16, 1939.

Present:—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. É. M. Karunaratne; Mr. W. Dahanayake; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. A. C. Mohammado; Mr. G. Ross Bell; Mr. J. C. Cooper; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

- 1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on January 27, 1939, and of the Special Meeting held on February 10, 1939, copies thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.
- 2. To consider the following extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of October 28, 1938:—
  - "Considered the draft by-laws relating to Eating-houses and Tea and Coffee Boutiques:—Recommended that the draft by-laws, as amended, be approved."

The Medical Officer of Health was present and explained to the Members the necessity for the proposed new by-laws. After discussion Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the by-laws be left to be dealt with by the new Council. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. On the motion being put to the Meeting six members voted for and six against. The Chairman thereupon gave his casting vote against the motion which was accordingly declared lost. Mr. E. M. Karunaratne then moved that the by-laws as approved by the Law Committee be adopted subject to the deletion of by-laws (c), (d), (g) and (i) and the omission of the words "having a minimum superficial area of not less than 80 square feet "from by-law (j). Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. Mr. Wahab moved as an amendment that the matter be deferred for consideration till the next Meeting. Mr. W. Dahanayake seconded. The amendment was first put to the Meeting and declared lost, four voting for and seven against. Mr. Karunaratne's motion was then put to the Meeting and carried by nine votes to three. Mr. W. Dahanayake called for a division which resulted as follows:—For:—The Chairman, and Messrs. E. M. Karunaratne, J. E. Perera, F. Magdon Ismail, A. C. Mohammado, R. L. Ephraums, G. Ross Bell, J. C. Cooper, and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan; Against:—Messrs. A. I. H. A. Wahab, Thomas Amarasuriya, and W. Dahanayake.

- 3. To nominate a person as Visitor to the Civil Hospital, Galle, for 1939:—The Chairman moved that Mr. F Magdon Ismail be nominated as a Visitor to the Civil Hospital, Galle for 1939. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.
- 4. To approve the amendment of regulation 1 of the regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance published in the Gazette of January 11, 1929, by substituting the words "from the 72nd milestone to the 73rd milestone," for the words "from the 72½ milestone near the Dutch burial ground to the 73rd milestone":—Resolved that the amendment be approved.
- 5. To consider what action should be taken by the Council with regard to unemployment in the town:—After discussion Mr. W. Dahanayake moved that the Municipal Engineer be requested to submit a report as early as possible on works that can be carried out as unemployment relief schemes. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

It was also resolved to inform the Controller of Labour that it is not possible for the Council to obtain a census of the unemployed in Galle and to inquire whether arrangements could not be made by his Department to open an unemployment bureau in the town with a view to obtaining such a census.

- 6. Considered further the suggestion made by the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, to adopt the system of no parking on either side of Main street on alternate days owing to congestion of traffic:—Messrs. W. Dahanayake, A. I. H. A. Wahab, Thomas Amarasuriya, J. E. Perera and E. M. Karunaratne opposed the adoption of the proposed system on the ground that the experiment which had been tried during the last few months had proved a failure. The Chairman said he was unable to agree that the experiment was a failure and stated that from his own experience he was of opinion that the experiment had proved successful. He saw no reason why the system should not be adopted. Mr. G. Ross Bell said he did not think the scheme was such a success as he had hoped for at the start. After further discussion of the matter in Committee Mr. W. Dahanayake moved that the proposed system of no parking on either side of Main street be abandoned. Mr. Wahab seconded. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried by 6 votes to 5.

(4) Considered an estimate of Rs. 8,850 for rat-proofing the Bazaar drains:—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that tenders for the work be called for, the pipes to be obtained from the Indian Hume Pipe Co.

- (5) Considered an estimate of Rs. 165 for the construction of a retaining wall alongside House No. 131, Wackwella Recommended that the estimate be passed, that a supplemental vote of Rs. 165 be sanctioned, and that the work be carried out departmentally.
- (6) To approve the excess expenditure of Rs. 24 90 in connection with the construction of steps to the Ramparts from the road near the District Judge's bungalow.—Recommended that the excess expenditure of Rs. 24.90 for three additional steps be approved.

(7) Considered an estimate of Rs. 200 for re-grading the outlet drain at Dewatte.—Recommended that the estimate

be passed, that a supplemental vote of Rs. 200 be sanctioned, and that the work be carried out departmentally.


