RULE.

The Colombo Port Rules, 1936, published in *Gazette* No. 8,251 of October 16, 1936, are hereby amended in rule 25 thereof, as follows:—

(1) by the substitution, for all the words from "This restriction" to "officers" of the following:—

"Provided that nothing in this paragraph of this rule shall be deemed to prohibit the landing of any officer wearing a sword, if such sword is ordinarily a part of his uniform."

(2) by the substitution, for the words "Unarmed soldiers" of the following:—

"Subject to such restrictions in respect of numbers and such conditions as the Governor may in the special circumstances of any case impose, unarmed soldiers".

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, NO. 45 OF 1917.

Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, approved under section 12 (1) (b) at a meeting duly held on January 7, 1939, by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the irrigable area of the Rajjamma-Linipitiya irrigation work in the Matale District and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 45 of the aforesaid Ordinance, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

1. Name and description of work: Rajjamma-Linipitiya irrigation work, Ambanganga Korale, Matale East, Matale District, Central Province.

2. Extent and nature of lands irrigable under the scheme:—

Private lands under cultivation	.. 133 acres approximately
Private lands not under cultivation	.. —
Crown lands under cultivation	.. 65 acres approximately

3. Terms agreed upon—

(1) The construction of the following items of the necessary work, namely, anicut, Head sluices, spills, overcrossing and trough up to the estimated cost of Rs. 13,800 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, namely:—Linipitiya cultivators to do 700 cubes earthwork in regrading and repairs to channel and Rajjamma cultivators to do 190 cubes earthwork in repairs to breaches; all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors agree to forgo one Yala cultivation in the year of construction, *i.e.*, from February to September, to enable the work to be carried out, and to contribute, after the completion of the work, all labour required for its maintenance and repair, free of all charges.

(4) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Assistant Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

RULE.

The Inland (Colombo) Telephone Rules, 1938, published in *Gazette* No. 8,413 of November 18, 1938, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in rule 15, by the substitution, for the definition of "external extension" of the following:—

" 'External extension' means an extension from an exchange line instrument or private branch exchange in any building connecting—

- (a) a point in another building which is in the occupation of the same subscriber, the distance between the exchange line instrument or the private branch exchange as the case may be and the point to be connected exceeding 440 yards and not exceeding 2 miles measured in a straight line, or
- (b) another point in the same building and in the occupation of the same subscriber, the distance between the exchange line instrument or the private branch exchange as the case may be and the point to be connected exceeding 440 yards measured in a straight line."

(2) in Schedule A, in the Form of Agreement set out therein—

(a) by the substitution, for the words "message-rate fees, trunk calls" occurring in the first paragraph, of the words "message-rate fees, inland trunk calls"; and

(b) by the substitution, for the words "if rental is paid annually" occurring in the second paragraph, of the words "if subscription is paid annually."

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

Felling, Burning, and Clearing of 55 Acres of land for Development of Fruit Culture under Minneriya Scheme by the Department of Agriculture.

TENDERS are hereby invited for clear-felling and burning of 55 acres of high lands in lot Nos. in I. S. P. P. No. 12, 347, 348, 349, and a portion of lot No. 7 in I. S. P. P. No. 12 in Minneriya, North-Central Province. The site will be pointed out by the Agricultural Officer, Northern, or his representative.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Agricultural Officer, Northern Division, Anuradhapura.

3. Tenders should be marked "Tender for clearing land for Development of Fruit Culture at Minneriya" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Agricultural Officer, Northern Division, Anuradhapura, not later than midday on Monday, April 24, 1939.

4. The tenders need not be made upon forms, but can be sent on ordinary writing paper.

5. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

6. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract, if necessary.

7. The successful tenderer will be required to furnish security not exceeding 5 per cent. of the value of his contract for the due performance of the contract to the satisfaction of the Agricultural Officer, Northern, or his representative.

8. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

9. The Agricultural Officer, Northern, reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders.

10. A deposit of Rupees Ten will be required to be made either at the local Kachcheri, or at the Agricultural Office,

Anuradhapura, and the receipt so obtained should accompany the tender. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned upon the signature of a contract.

11. The successful tenderer will be required to commence clearing operations on receipt of the notice referred to in clause 10, of this notice, to finish clearing by July 15, 1939, and to complete the entire work on or before August 20, 1939. No extension of time will be granted for any reason whatsoever.

12. No trees to be felled at more than two feet from the ground. There are to be no standing trees or logs and branches of whatever lying about on the land after the completion of the work of burning and cleaning up. The successful tenderer will not be allowed to remove any timber from the site, but the right is reserved to the Agricultural Officer, or his accredited agents, to cut and remove prior to the "burn" all such timber as he may require for fence posts or building purposes, &c.

13. No contract may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Agricultural Officer, Northern Division. The Agricultural Officer, Northern Division, reserves the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

14. The Agricultural Officer, Northern Division, or his representative may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

15. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract, should furnish to the Agricultural Officer, Northern Division, sufficient statement in writing, giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns property or other interests. This should accompany his tender.

A registered contractor who has done work previously with any Government Department, should state the name of such Department or Departments and the place in which service was rendered.

16. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Agricultural Officer, Northern Division, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

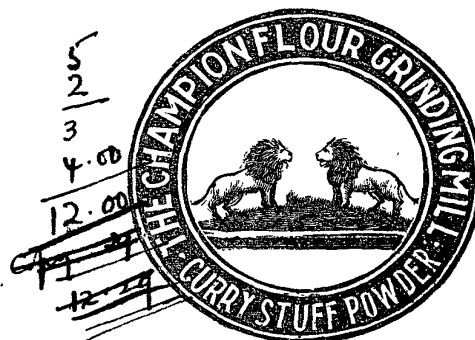

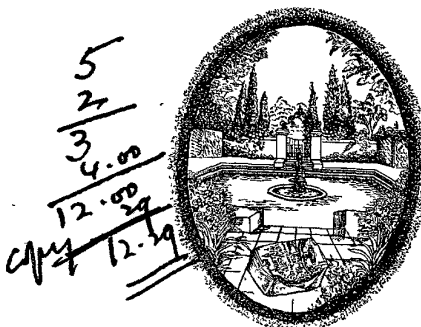
