Specification of Areas in the Vadamaradchi Division in which Tapping for Sweet Toddy is not allowed except on a Licence under the Tree Tax System.

Preliminary Report on the Vital Statistics of Ceylon, 1938.

(N.B.—Figures are subject to revision). THE salient features of the Vital Statistics of Ceylon for

the year 1938, are as follows:—
(a) the marriage rate, 11.6, is the same as in the previous

year; (b) the birth rate 35.9 is one of the lowest in recent times;

(c) the death rate, 21.0, is the lowest since 1900, except for the year 1932, when it was 20.5;
(d) the infant mortality rate, 161, is one of the lowest in

the present century.

Population.

2. The estimated population of the Island on December 31, 1938, was 5,864,000. It was 5,780,000 on December 31, 1937. The births registered during the year exceeded the deaths by 86,091, and the emigrants exceeded the immigrants by 1,363.

Marriages.
3. The number of General and Kandyan marriages registered during 1938, was 31,385 (23,701 under the General Marriage Ordinance, and 7,684 under the Kandyan law), and represented a rate of 11.6 per 1,000 of the population (excluding Muslims), being the same rate as in 1937. There were 4,081 Muslim marriages representing an approximate rate of 20.8 per 1,000 of the Muslim population as against 20.2 in the previous year.

Births.

4. The number of births registered in 1938, was 208,391 (105,905 males and 102,486 females). The birth rate was 35.9 per 1,000 of the population as compared with 37.8 in the previous year. The sex ratio at birth was 1,033 males to 1,000 females. In the City of Colombo the birth rate was 38.7 as against 38.6 in the previous year. There were 28,582 births on the estates as against 28,421 in 1937.

122,300 deaths (62,080 among males and 60,220 among females) were registered in the year. The death rate was 21.0 per 1,000 of the population as compared with 21.7 in 1937. Improvements in and relating to the production of spiral filaments.

Abstract.—The invention refers to "coiled-coil" filaments. The inventors state that the usual method of preparing such filaments is to wind the wire into a coil of the first order on a mandrel, and then to wind this coil with or without its mandrel on another mandrel to produce a coil of the second order; the mandrel or mandrels are then heated and removed. The removal of mandrels after heating is a troublesome operation and the present invention is for obviating this disadvantage.

According to the invention the coil of the first order with its mandrel is wound on a second mandrel and both mandrels are removed before the main heating commences. The coil is stretched to separate the convolutions and heated in a reducing atmosphere in a furnace to a temperature between 900°C and 2200°C before insertion in the lamp.

The duration of this heating depends on the temperature and the gauge of wire used. If desired the coil of the first order may be heated in air or hydrogen atmosphere to a temperature below 900°C, and the same treatment may be given to the coil of the second order, before the mandrel is

The first mandrel is removed by known chemical means The second mandrel may be removed chemically or just pulled out.
