THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

Regulations for the Kataragama Esala Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133) I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival commencing in July, 1939.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, "camp area" includes—
 - (a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewale at Kataragama; and
 - (b) the area within a radius of a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama.
2. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1939, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to fifteen days from July 17 to July 31, inclusive.
 - (b) No pilgrim shall arrive before July 17 or stay after July 31 in the camp area.
3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.
4. (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power, on the line of march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama—
 - (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water for drinking, and for natural offices;
 - (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
 - (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
 - (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;

(e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

(2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).

5. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits.

9. Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.

10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

11. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

(2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Inspector to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.

12. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle herein-after prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purposes of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

16. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

All other goods, for each ton or for any quantity less than a ton	0 50

(b) In the case of goods charged by the ton, the basis of calculation of the ton may be either weight or measurement as notified from time to time by the Collector of Customs.

2. Goods brought for reshipment to a foreign port, including coastwise goods brought for reshipment to a foreign port, and goods arriving from abroad to be reshipped coastwise, shall be free of warehouse rent if they are reshipped within the period of first rent.

3. Goods intended for reshipment, which are deposited in or removed to a reshipment warehouse but are not reshipped within the period of first rent shall in respect of that period be liable to rent at the rates prescribed in regulation 1, and thereafter shall be liable to rent at the same rates for each complete period not exceeding five days (including Sundays and Customs Holidays).

4. Goods intended for reshipment which remain in an import warehouse beyond the period of first rent shall be liable to rent at the rates of Import Warehouse Rents prescribed above, until they are removed to a reshipment warehouse or unless special permission is granted by the Collector of Customs for such goods to remain in the import warehouse, and where such permission has been obtained such goods shall be liable to rent at the rates mentioned in regulation 3 above. Unless in the opinion of the Collector of Customs there has been unreasonable delay in removal, the date set out in the application for permission to remove such goods to the reshipment warehouse as that upon which it is desired to remove such goods to a reshipment warehouse shall be taken as the date of actual removal.

5. Goods intended for reshipment and deposited in a reshipment warehouse shall, if they are not actually reshipped abroad or coastwise, but are cleared for home consumption at the port at which they were so deposited, be liable to the same rent as imported goods, and such rent shall be payable from the date of landing of the goods.

6. *Coastwise goods which are brought for transshipment or reshhipment, and do not come within the category of goods mentioned in regulation 2 above, shall, if they are landed, pay rent at the rates of Import Warehouse Rent prescribed above, and, if they are transhipped without being landed shall not be liable to the payment of rent.*

7. *If opium intended for reshhipment is deposited in the Strong Room and not reshhipped on the day on which it is so deposited, any reshhipment warehouse rent payable shall be deemed to be included in the consolidated rate of fifteen cents per package which shall be charged for each day (including the day of landing or deposit, day of removal, Sundays and Customs Holidays) during which it remains in the Strong Room any period less than a day being reckoned as a complete day for this purpose.*

8. *In these regulations, the expression "first rent" has the same meaning as in regulation 2 of the regulations relating to Import Warehouse Rent.*

IT is hereby notified that the following resolution under section 17 (new section 25) of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185) passed by the State Council at its public session on December 14, 1938, and sanctioned by the Governor has been submitted to and sanctioned by the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

RESOLUTION REFERRED TO.

This Council resolves under section 17 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, that on and after the date succeeding that on which this resolution is notified in the *Government Gazette* after submission to and sanction by the Secretary of State, notwithstanding anything contained in the resolution relating to port dues passed at the public session of this Council on December 15, 1936, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,269 of January 29, 1937,—

- (a) any vessel which, while in harbour, carries out any or all of the operations specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be charged the consolidated rate of Rs. 200 to cover pilotage, entering dues, use of tugs, and bill of health granted by day;
- (b) in the case of imports, the goods specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall be exempt from first harbour dues;
- (c) in the case of exports, the goods specified in the Third Schedule hereto shall be exempt from first harbour dues; and
- (d) reshhipment harbour dues shall be levied and paid on all goods brought to the port of Colombo for reshhipment, at the rates and subject to the conditions, exceptions and provisions prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

First Schedule.

1. Extinguishing a fire on board the vessel and unshipping, reshhipping or transshipping passengers or cargo for the purpose of extinguishing such fire.
2. Undergoing inspection or deratisation for the purpose of obtaining a Deratisation Certificate or a Deratisation Exemption Certificate.

Second Schedule.

Government cargo, military baggage, dhobies' bundles, liquid fuel in bulk, export cargo shut out and relanded, and all goods which at the time of importation are exempt from duty under Ordinance No. 3 of 1927, as amended by Ordinances No. 17 of 1928, and No. 6 of 1938, or under section 16A of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869.

Third Schedule.

Coal and liquid fuel for bunkers, Government cargo, military baggage, dhobies' bundles, dubashes' supplies, export cargo shut out and relanded (in respect of such uncompleted shipments only), stores for British and foreign

men-of-war and all goods which are exempt from duty under Ordinance No. 3 of 1927, as amended by Ordinances No. 17 of 1928, and No. 6 of 1938, or under section 16A of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869.

Fourth Schedule.

Reshhipment Harbour Dues.

Note.—In the case of goods charged by the ton, the basis of calculation of the ton may be either weight or measurement as notified from time to time by the Collector of Customs.

2. Goods brought for reshhipment to a foreign port, including coastwise goods brought for reshhipment to a foreign port and goods arriving from abroad to be reshhipped coastwise shall be free of reshhipment harbour dues if reshhipped within the period of First Harbour Dues.

3. Goods intended for reshhipment, which are deposited in or removed to a reshhipment warehouse but are not reshhipped within the period of First Harbour Dues shall be liable to a single payment of harbour dues at the rates prescribed in paragraph 1 above.

4. Goods intended for reshhipment which remain in an Import Warehouse beyond the period of First Harbour Dues shall be liable to Import Harbour Dues until they are removed to a reshhipment warehouse or unless special permission is granted by the Collector of Customs for such goods to remain in the import warehouse; and where such permission has been obtained such goods shall be liable only to the payment of harbour dues provided in paragraph 3 above. Unless in the opinion of the Collector of Customs there has been unreasonable delay in removal, the date set out in the application for permission to remove such goods to the reshhipment warehouse as that upon which it is desired to remove such goods to a reshhipment warehouse shall be taken as the date of actual removal.

5. Goods intended for reshhipment and deposited in a reshhipment warehouse shall, if they are not actually reshhipped abroad or coastwise but are cleared for home consumption at the port at which they were so deposited, be liable to the same harbour dues as imported goods and such harbour dues shall be payable from the date of landing of the goods.

6. Coastwise goods which are brought for transshipment or reshhipment, and do not come within the category of goods mentioned in paragraph 2 above, shall, if they are landed, pay both import and export harbour dues; if they are transhipped without being landed, they shall be liable to export harbour dues only.

7. If opium intended for reshhipment is deposited in the Strong Room and not reshhipped on the day on which it is so deposited, any reshhipment harbour dues payable thereon shall be deemed to be included in the consolidated rate of fifteen cents per package which shall be charged for each day (including day of landing or deposit, day of removal, Sundays and Customs Holidays), during which it remains in the Strong Room, any period less than a day being reckoned as a complete day for this purpose.

8. In the foregoing paragraphs, the expression "First Harbour Dues" has the same meaning as in paragraph 2 of the provisions relating to the recovery of Import Harbour Dues contained in the resolution relating to port dues, published in *Gazette* No. 8,269 of January 29, 1937.

RULES FOR THE BOTTLING OF TODDY FOR SALE.

1. *Applicability of Rules.*—

These rules shall apply to the bottling of toddy for purposes of sale.

The general rules relating to bottling for purposes of sale of all liquor, whether foreign or country, appearing in Excise Notification No. 305 published in the *Gazette* No. 8,256 of November 13, 1936, shall not be applicable to the bottling of toddy for purposes of sale.

2. *Prohibition of Bottling of Toddy for Sale without Licence.*—

(1) No person shall bottle toddy for the purposes of sale except under a licence issued in that behalf by the Government Agent.

(2) The licence to bottle toddy shall be deemed to authorize the sale of toddy in bottles, subject to the conditions that such sale shall not be other than wholesale, or to any person other than the renter of a toddy tavern.

3. *Application for a Licence.*—

(1) Every person desirous of obtaining a licence to bottle toddy for purposes of sale shall forward to the Excise Commissioner, through the Government Agent—

(a) a written application in that behalf, together with plans and specifications, and a detailed description of the premises in which it is proposed to bottle toddy,

(b) three quart bottles of the toddy prepared by him for such bottling, and

(c) a report under the hand of an approved analyst, in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, on the results of three successive tests carried out by him on the toddy in accordance with the scheme of tests specified in that form.

(2) For the purpose of obtaining the analyst's report referred to in paragraph (1), six quart bottles of the toddy prepared for such bottling, must be sent to an approved analyst by each intending applicant at the time he makes his request for such report.

(3) An " approved analyst " means a person whom the Excise Commissioner has approved as an analyst for the purposes of these rules.

4. (1) *Payment of Licence Fees and Security Deposits.*—

If it is decided to issue any licence applied for, the applicant shall be called upon to deposit within a specified time—

(a) the fee prescribed by Notification for any such licence, and

(b) a further sum of five hundred rupees (Rs. 500) as security.

(2) *Hypothecation of Security Deposits.*—

No licence for the bottling of toddy for purposes of sale shall be granted, unless the applicant enters into a bond with the Government Agent, hypothecating the said security deposit, and making it liable to confiscation by the Government Agent for breach of any of the provisions of the Ordinance, any of these or other rules relating to the bottling of toddy for sale, and any of the conditions of the licence, and such confiscation shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by the Ordinance, or by any rules thereunder.

(3) *Security Deposit to be Drawn upon for Fines.*—

The Government Agent may direct that the amount of any fine or penalty imposed by him or by the Excise Commissioner under the Ordinance, or the rules framed thereunder shall be deducted from the amount deposited by the licensee as security for the due observance of the conditions and rules, and any amount so deducted shall be replaced by the licensee within fifteen days from the date of receipt of a notice from the Government Agent, informing the licensee that such deduction has been made.

5. *Bottling Room to be approved.*—

Bottling shall be carried on in a separate warehouse or room, which has been previously approved for the purpose by an Excise Officer not below the rank of Superintendent as affording proper control of the operations. Such warehouse or room shall be kept closed, when not in use, and locked with an Excise ticket-padlock.

6. *Requirements for Bottling Room.*—

(1) The bottling room shall be provided with—

(a) a properly cemented floor sloping into drains at the sides, so designed as to carry away waste matter and water from the floor ;

(b) electric lights for purposes of illumination, wherever a public supply of electricity exists, or wherever connection can be given at a reasonable cost from any private installation belonging to the licensee ;

- (c) bars for the windows, if there are any, and, in addition, on the inner side of such windows, with permanently fixed covers of wire-gauze with a mesh not exceeding one inch or of expanded metal with openings not exceeding one inch in width ;
- (d) doors of expanded metal to keep the room closed during operations ;
- (e) a water tap within the room, or an adequate supply of clean water for washing , and
- (f) arrangements to enable all windows and doors other than the main door to be securely closed from inside, and the main door to be locked from the outside with an Excise ticket-padlock.

(2) The Excise Commissioner may at his sole discretion waive the observance of this rule, wholly or partly in any special case.

7. *Sanitary Requirements.*—

The licensee shall see that the licensed premises and all receptacles and utensils used in the course of the storing and the bottling of toddy are kept scrupulously clean, and are washed clean after the close of operations for the day.

8. *Wholesale Price to be notified.*—

A signboard shall be affixed to the front of the licensed premises showing in English, Sinhalese or Tamil the number and nature of the licence, the name of the licensee and the current wholesale price.

9. (1) *Excise Officer in Charge of Manufactories.*—

The Excise Commissioner may appoint such officers of the Excise Department (hereinafter referred to as Excise Officers in Charge) as he may think fit for the supervision of the bottling of toddy for sale referred to in rule 1, and it shall be the duty of the licensee to afford to such Excise Officers in Charge all facilities for the enforcement of the provisions of all Excise rules applicable to the bottling of toddy, and of the conditions of the licence.

(2) *Licensee to provide Accommodation and Furniture for Office.*—

The licensee shall provide, within the licensed premises, accommodation for an office for the use of the Excise Officer in Charge, and the necessary furniture for such office to the satisfaction of the Excise Commissioner.

10. *Bottling Operations only in Presence of Excise Officer in Charge.*—

All operations connected with bottling, including corking, sealing and capsuling, shall be done in the presence of an Excise Officer in Charge.

11. *Notice of Time of Bottling.*—

Not less than 48 hours notice of the intention to commence bottling shall be given to the Excise Officer in Charge ;

Provided that shorter notice may be accepted as sufficient, if the Excise Commissioner so directs in the special circumstances of any case.

12. *Appeal to Excise Commissioner from Orders of Excise Officers in Charge.*—

Save as otherwise expressly provided, all orders made by any Excise Officer in Charge shall be subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner within fourteen days from the date on which the order is communicated to the licensee. The decision of the Excise Commissioner on any such appeal shall be final and conclusive.

13. *Numbering and Gauging of Storage Vats and other Receptacles.*—

(1) Every vat, vessel and receptacle, other than bottles, used for the storage or preservation of toddy shall—

- (a) be provided with a dip-rod in accordance with condition No. 29 (1) of Excise Notification No. 329 published in *Gazette* No. 8,368 of May 11, 1938 ;
- (b) be gauged by the Excise Officer in Charge in the presence of the licensee or his agent, who will satisfy himself as to the correctness of all measurements and calculations. Such gauging shall be done by pouring accurately measured quantities of liquid into such vat, vessel or receptacle ;
- (c) have its capacity in gallons painted thereon ; and
- (d) have a distinctive serial number assigned to it and have that number painted on it, and painted and engraved on the upper end of its dip-rod.

(2) Every cask or vessel used for the transportation of toddy shall—

- (a) be provided with a dip-rod in accordance with condition No. 29 (1) of the Excise Notification No. 329 published in *Gazette* No. 8,368 of May 11, 1938 ;
- (b) be gauged by the licensee by pouring accurately measured quantities of liquid into such cask or vessel ;
- (c) have its capacity in gallons painted and engraved thereon ; and
- (d) have a distinctive serial number assigned to it, and have that number painted and engraved on it and on the upper end of its dip-rod.

14. *How Toddy to be Bottled may be obtained.*—All toddy which is to be bottled shall be drawn under a tapping licence in form Excise T 2A and transported, under a special pass obtained from the Circle Superintendent, from—

- (a) a licensed toddy tavern ; or
- (b) a collecting station licensed for a toddy tavern ; or
- (c) a collecting station established for the collection of toddy from trees specially licensed for the purpose of supplying toddy for bottling.

15. *Operations other than preserving not allowed without permission.*—

(1) No toddy, either before or after the process of preservation for bottling, shall be diluted or adulterated in any manner whatsoever ;

(2) No flavouring, colouring, blending, fortification, aeration or any other operation other than preservation shall be carried out without the prior approval of the Excise Commissioner.

16. *Preservative used to be subject to the approval of Excise Commissioner.*—

(a) No preservative shall be used in the bottling of toddy unless the quality of such preservative and the quantity to be used have received the prior approval of the Excise Commissioner.

(b) Sulphur dioxide (including sulphites) shall not be used as a preservative in any proportion exceeding 200 parts per million.

17. *Storage and use of unapproved Preservatives prohibited.*—No preservative or ingredient which has not been approved by the Excise Commissioner shall be kept within the licensed premises, or used either before or in the process of bottling, or added to the toddy stored at the licensed premises.

18. *Unapproved Preserved Toddy not to be Bottled.*—No preserved toddy shall be bottled for sale unless a sample of the same has been approved in writing by the Excise Commissioner.

19. *Gauging and Proving before Bottling.*—

No bottling of any toddy shall be commenced till it has been gauged both before and after the process of preservation.

20. *Minimum Quantity to be Bottled at a Time.*—

Not less than 50 gallons of toddy shall be bottled in one operation :

Provided that the Excise Commissioner may waive compliance with this rule in the special circumstances of any case.

21. *Prohibition against removal of Toddy.*—

No toddy, either in bulk or bottles, preserved or otherwise, shall be removed from the licensed premises except under a pass issued by a duly authorized Excise Officer.

22. *Stoppage of Bottles to be Proof against Tampering.*—

Every receptacle containing bottled toddy shall be—

- (a) properly stopped with a cork or other stopper, and shall be either sealed with a wax seal, or wired and sealed with a lead seal, the seal in each case bearing the licensee's distinctive design ; or
- (b) secured by firmly adhering capsules, so that the bottled toddy cannot be tampered with without breaking the seal or tearing the capsule ;

Provided that no seal or capsule shall be required, if the stopper used is a " Crown Cork " which cannot be opened without rendering it unfit for further use.

23. *Taking of Samples.*—

After each bottling operation, samples not exceeding one reputed quart may be removed by the licensee, or by an Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, who shall give a receipt for the quantity removed and report the fact of such removal to his superior officer.

24. *Distinctive Labels for Bottled Toddy.*—

Every bottle of toddy bottled for sale shall bear affixed to it a distinctive label or set of labels in accordance with the next following rules.

25. *Labels to be approved by Excise Commissioner.*—

(1) A sketch of the label or set of labels proposed to be used, showing the design and details to scale, shall be submitted for preliminary approval to the Excise Commissioner. If the preliminary approval is given, a printed label or set of labels shall be sent to the Excise Commissioner for his final approval.

(2) No label shall be used, unless the design and details thereof have been finally approved by the Excise Commissioner in writing.

26. *Essential Particulars in a Label.*—

The label, or the main label in a set of labels, shall contain the following particulars among others :—

- (a) The name or word " TODDY ",
- (b) Name of proprietary brand, if any.
- (c) Pictorial symbol of proprietary brand, if any.
- (d) Name and address of the bottling licensee.

Provided that the Excise Commissioner may at his discretion allow any of the above particulars to be set out in subsidiary labels.

27. *Further Essential Particulars in a Label for Bottled Toddy.*—

In addition to the above particulars for labels generally, the main label shall also indicate the kind of toddy, by the prefixing before the word " TODDY ", of the word " COCONUT ", " PALMYRA ", or " KITUL " as the case may be. This description of the contents must be in letters of the same conspicuousness in English, Sinhalese and Tamil.

28. *Delivery of 30 Copies of Label to Excise Commissioner.*—

No duly approved label shall be affixed to a bottle, until 30 copies of the label have been delivered to the Excise Commissioner.

29. *Alterations in Labels to be approved by Excise Commissioner.*—

The design of any duly approved label or any part or detail thereof shall not be in any way altered or added to without the prior approval of the Excise Commissioner in writing.

30. *Particulars of Label to be True and Correct.*—

Every particular of a label, whether required by these rules or not, shall at all times, before the label is affixed to a bottle be true and correct, and if any particular becomes at any time untrue or incorrect, the label shall not be used, until such particular has been rectified with the approval of the Excise Commissioner in writing.

31. *Diseased Persons not to be Employed.*—

No person suffering from any dangerous communicable disease shall be allowed to work in any bottling room, or take any part in the bottling operations, including preserving, corking, sealing, capsuling, and labelling.

32. *Employment of Women and Children Prohibited.*—

(1) No child under the age of 16 years, and no woman shall be employed in any bottling room.

(2) The Excise Commissioner may at his sole discretion waive the observance of this rule, wholly or partly, in the special circumstances of any particular bottling room.

33. *Admittance into Bottling Room of Persons not having Business therein forbidden.*—

(1) Except with the permission of the Excise Officer in Charge, no person other than officers of the Excise Department, the licensee, and the employees registered as hereinafter provided shall be allowed to enter any bottling room on any pretext.

(2) A register in a form prescribed by the Excise Commissioner shall be kept by the licensee in the bottling room, showing the names of all employees employed therein. Each such employee shall at all times, when within the bottling room, have with him a pass signed by the Excise Officer in Charge, and shall produce the pass when called upon by any Excise Officer to do so.

(3) The Excise Commissioner may at his sole discretion waive the observance of this rule, wholly or partly, in the special circumstances of any particular bottling room.

34. *Control of Persons entering Bottling Room.*—

(1) All persons entering the bottling room shall be under the orders of the Excise Officer in Charge in respect of their conduct and proceedings within the bottling room, and shall be liable to be searched, on their quitting the premises, at the discretion of the Excise Officer in Charge.

(2) The Excise Commissioner may at his sole discretion waive the observance of this rule, wholly or partly, in the special circumstances of any particular bottling room.

35. *Accounts.*—

An account showing the different amounts of toddy received into the bottling room, bottled, and issued therefrom daily shall be maintained in such form as the Excise Commissioner may prescribe, and be produced on the demand of an Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector.

36. *Wastages.*—

Allowance shall be made for wastage in transport and storage of bulk toddy not exceeding two per centum of the quantities transported or stored.

37. *Government not liable for Loss, &c., of Toddy in Bottling Rooms.*—

The Government shall not be held responsible for the destruction or loss of, or damage to, any toddy stored in any bottling room. In case of fire or other accident the Excise Officer in Charge shall immediately attend at any hour of the day or night to assist the licensee in saving his property, if any of it is under Excise ticket-padlock.

38. *Licensee bound to report Breaches of Law, &c., committed by his Employees.*

If it comes to the knowledge of the licensee that any person employed by him has committed any breach of the Ordinance, or of any rules thereunder, he shall immediately report the matter to the Excise Officer in Charge, and shall comply with the directions of that officer respecting the continued employment of such person pending further orders from the Superintendent of Excise or a higher officer.

39. *Removal of Toddy, after Expiry of Licence.*—

On the expiry of his licence (unless a fresh licence shall have been granted to him), or on the cancellation or suspension of the licence, every licensee shall be bound forthwith to remove all toddy remaining within the bottling room for disposal in such manner as the Excise Commissioner may order. If the licensee shall fail to do so within ten days of the receipt of written notice from the Excise Commissioner, the cost of any staff employed in guarding or keeping watch over the manufactory may be recovered from the defaulter. In the event of continued neglect the toddy shall be liable to be destroyed at the discretion of the Excise Commissioner.

40. *Licensee bound to obey all Additional Rules.*—

The licensee shall be bound by the provisions of the Ordinance, and by all additional rules that may from time to time be made for the management and regulation of the bottling of toddy for purposes of sale and shall cause all persons employed by him to obey all such provisions and rules.

TODDY RENT SALE CONDITIONS FOR 1939-40 AND SUBSEQUENT PERIODS.

THE Governor, has, under section 18 of the Excise Ordinance, directed that the grant of the exclusive privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail within any local area, during the period from October 1, 1939, to September 30, 1940, and subsequent periods shall until further notice be subject—

- (1) to the General Conditions for the time being in force and applicable to all Excise Licences ; and
- (2) to the special conditions set out hereunder.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

1. (1) Periods of Privilege.—

(a) The privilege shall be granted—

- (i.) for the period from July 1 of any one year to June 30 of the next succeeding year, in respect of all toddy taverns in the Mannar District of the Northern Province, in the Mullaitivu District of the Northern Province, and in the Eastern Province (except in the case of Alampil, Valayanmadam, Kanagarayankulam, and Kurisuddakulam taverns) ; and
- (ii.) for the period from October 1 of any one year, to September 30 of the next succeeding year, in respect of all toddy taverns in other Provinces,

or for any shorter period within these twelve months, on application by way of tender in the form or by auction in the manner, prescribed in these conditions.

(b) In the case of Alampil, Valayanmadam, Kanagarayankulam, and Kurisuddakulam toddy taverns in the Mullaitivu District of the Northern Province, the privilege shall be granted for the period from March 1 of any one year to September 30 of the same year, or for any shorter period within these seven months on application as aforesaid.

(2) Areas for which Privilege granted.—

The privilege may be granted for the local area of an individual tavern, or for the respective local areas of each tavern in a group of taverns, as the Government Agent may decide.

2. *Tapping areas, and Number of Trees allowed for Tapping.*—

(1) Tapping areas, particulars of which may be obtained from the Superintendent of Excise of each Circle, will be allotted for all taverns other than those situated within the limits of the Colombo Municipality or in the Chilaw District, and licences to tap trees outside the tapping area allotted to a tavern will not be issued without the sanction of the Excise Commissioner previously obtained in writing.

(2) The number of trees that will be allowed to be licensed for tapping will be estimated on the basis of the previous period's sale figures, with due regard to the likely increase or decrease of sales.

(3) Trees situated even within the tapping areas allotted are liable to be disallowed on the ground of inaccessibility, distance from one another, situation in relation to places of worship, or of cemeteries, or of illicit consumption or sale, or for other similar reasons. The final arrangements for the lease of the trees should therefore be made only after the topos specified in the application are approved by the Superintendent of Excise.

3. *Tender Form.*—

Every tender shall be made on the form set out hereunder. Forms may be obtained from the offices indicated in the sale notice.

4. *Tender Deposit.*—

(1) The Government Agent may, if he considers it necessary, require the deposit of a sum not exceeding Rupees Five hundred (Rs. 500) by the tenderer in respect of each tender.

(2) Every tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of the sum required by the Government Agent under the foregoing paragraph of this condition, and the number and date of the receipt shall be entered on the face of the tender form.

5. *Prohibition of Tenders by Agents or of more than one tender by any person.*—

(1) Every tender or bid shall be made by the tenderer or bidder in his own name. No tender or bid, made through an agent, will be accepted.

(2) No person shall send in more than one tender for any one tavern, or group of taverns.

6. *Disqualifications against Acceptance of Tenders ; Acceptance under Ignorance null and void.*—

(1) No tender will be accepted from any person—

(a) whose name appears on the list of defaulting contractors, or on the list of defaulters in respect of any kind of Excise licence or of toll rents, or on the list of persons precluded for other reasons from having any concern in any Government rent or contract ; or

(b) whose name is on the Excise register of offenders ; or

(c) who is a registered criminal within the meaning of the Prevention of Crimes Ordinance, or who has been convicted of any grave crime or of any Excise offence ; or

(d) who at any time held a licence which has been cancelled under section 26 of the Excise Ordinance.

(2) If any tender of any such person has been accepted in ignorance of the existence of any such disqualification, the Government Agent may in his sole discretion cancel the acceptance within a period of 30 days from the date of such acceptance, and shall communicate his order of cancellation to the grantee. On the making of any such order of cancellation, the original acceptance shall become null and void.

No such order of cancellation shall however be made in pursuance of this condition after the commencement of the period of the privilege.

7. *Delivery of Tenders.*—

(1) Every tender shall be placed in a sealed envelope, on the top left hand corner of which shall be clearly marked the name of the tavern in respect of which the tender is made and its number on the list of sanctioned taverns, or the designation of the group of taverns in respect of which the tender is made as given in the notice calling for tenders, as the case may be.

(2) Every sealed envelope containing a tender shall—

(a) be deposited in the Kachcheri tender box ; or

(b) be handed to the Government Agent or to his Assistant ; or

(c) be sent by registered post addressed to the Government Agent so as to reach the Kachcheri,

before the time fixed for closing the tenders.

8. (1) *Power of Rejection of Tender.*—

The Government Agent may in his discretion reject any or all of the tenders received ; and in the event of his so rejecting all tenders, he may call for tenders again or put up the privilege, either at once or after further notice, for sale by auction.

(2) *Restriction of Bidding at Auction.*—

At such auction no person shall be allowed to bid, unless he shall have either—

(a) submitted a tender accompanied by the Treasury or Kachcheri receipt prescribed in condition 4, whether such tender be for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege ; or,

(b) produced the receipt prescribed in condition 4, notwithstanding his failure to submit a tender for the particular privilege to be auctioned or for any other privilege.

Provided that no person who is duly declared the purchaser of any privilege, whether by way of tender or of auction, shall use or be permitted to use the same receipt for the purpose of a tender or a bid for any other privilege, until he has completed in respect of the privilege already granted to him the steps prescribed hereinafter in condition 9 (1) (a).

(3) *Power of Rejection of Bid.*—

The privilege shall be granted to the highest bidder at such auction : Provided that the Government Agent may in his discretion reject any or all of the bids made at such auction.

(4) *Procedure after Rejection of all Bids.*—

In the event of the rejection of all bids as aforesaid, the Government Agent may in his discretion—

(a) call for further tenders for the privilege for any single tavern or for sub-groups of two or more taverns included in any group of taverns, or for any combination of parts of groups or of whole groups of taverns either at once or after further notice, and accept or reject all or any tenders so received, and thereafter, put up for sale by auction the privilege for any single tavern or sub-groups or combinations as aforesaid for which the further tenders were rejected, either at once or after further notice, and accept or reject all or any bids so received ; or

(b) put up for sale by auction the privilege for any single tavern or for sub-groups of two or more taverns included in any group of taverns, or for any combination of parts of groups or of whole groups of taverns either at once or after further notice, and accept or reject all or any bids so received ; or

(c) grant the privilege for the tavern, or group, or any single tavern or sub-group of two or more taverns included in a group or for any combination of parts of groups or of whole groups of taverns to any person, who is approved by the Government Agent, and who agrees to pay by way of rent such amount as the Government Agent may fix.

(5) *Procedure after Rejection of further Bids.*—

In the event of the rejection of the bids received under paragraph 4 (a) and 4 (b) of this condition, the Government Agent may in his discretion take action under paragraph 4 (c).

9. (1) (a) *Security Deposit.*—

The grantee shall, immediately on being declared to be the purchaser of the privilege, sign these conditions, and pay to the Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent payable for that privilege.

(b) *Signing of Bond.*—

The grantee shall also within fourteen days of his being declared to be the purchaser of the privilege enter into a bond with the Government Agent for the full amount for which he has purchased it, and he shall specially hypothecate by such bond the said security deposit.

(c) *Consequences of Breach of Condition of Bond.*

The said security deposit shall be liable to be confiscated, either in whole or in part, by the Government Agent, at his sole discretion and without any process of law, for breach of any of these conditions or of any of the conditions of the licence or licences referred to in condition 12 (2) below, or for non-payment of any instalment, and such confiscation shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by these conditions for such breach or non-payment, and to any other amount which the Crown may have the right to claim and recover by due process of law.

(2) *Banking of Security Deposit.*—

Security money so paid will be deposited in a bank only on the grantee's application and only at his risk, and when such deposit is made, no withdrawal will be allowed till the date of maturity.

(3) *Warrant or Power of Attorney to confess Judgment.*—

If the highest bid or tender under condition 8 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000 the grantee shall at the time of the execution of the bond as aforesaid execute, if so required by the Government Agent, a warrant or power of attorney in the form sanctioned by law, to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege, and shall also furnish to the Government Agent within fifteen days of the date of the execution of such warrant or power of attorney a duly certified copy thereof for filing in the District Court under section 32 of the Civil Procedure Code.

(4) *Registered Postal Address.*—

The grantee shall, on signing these conditions, elect and signify under his hand a post office or postal address to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the privilege may be addressed under registered cover; and all such notices or processes so addressed to such post office or to such postal address, and posted in due course, shall be deemed to have been duly served and be as effectual for all purposes, as if they had been served upon the grantee in person upon the day on which such notice or process was so posted.

10. *Failure to complete Purchase of Privilege.*—

If any tenderer or bidder, on being declared to be the purchaser of the privilege, declines or fails to sign these conditions of sale, or fails to furnish the security prescribed in condition 9 (1) (a) when called upon to do so, the deposit made under condition 4 will be declared forfeited, and the defaulter will render himself liable to have his name entered in the list of defaulters in respect of all Excise licences. Subject to this exception, the deposits of all tenderers or bidders will be returned, after the conditions of sale have been signed and the aforesaid security given by the successful tenderer or bidder.

11. *Grantee to have no Interests in Arrack and Foreign Liquor Sales or in Toddy Estate Canteens.*—

The grantee shall not acquire or hold any share or any interests whether direct or indirect (a) in the sale of arrack, or (b) in the purchase of any privilege of selling arrack, or (c) in the sale of foreign liquor, or (d) in the purchase of any privilege of selling foreign liquor, or (e) in any toddy estate canteen, within the local area to which the privilege of selling toddy relates.

12. (1) *Opening of Tavern on due Date and Approval of Site.*—

(a) The grantee shall open the tavern or taverns on the day on which the privilege commences to run.

(b) The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site.

(c) The grantee shall not open a tavern on any site otherwise than with the approval of the Government Agent, such approval being obtained from the Government Agent at least fourteen days before the privilege commences to run.

(2) *Obtaining of Licences for Sale of Toddy.*—

The grantee shall, not less than five days before the date on which the privilege commences to run, obtain from the Government Agent a licence or licences for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the tavern or taverns within the local area covered by this privilege.

13. (1) *Application for Licensing of Trees.*—

The grantee shall, at least twenty-one days before the date on which the privilege commences to run, furnish to the Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form, showing the numbers and the situation of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern, and the situation and numbers of the collecting stations for toddy which he proposes to establish; and no trees shall be tapped or toddy drawn in pursuance of this privilege otherwise than under cover of a tapping licence setting forth the numbers and the situation of such trees, the name of the drawer, the name of the owner or possessor of such trees, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended.

(2) *Licences for Additional Trees.*—

Any application for a licence to tap additional trees for any tavern shall be made to the Superintendent of Excise in like manner three weeks before the grantee intends to commence the tapping of such trees.

(3) *Tapping Areas for Taverns.*—

Except in cases where the Excise Commissioner's previous sanction has been obtained in writing the Superintendent of Excise will not issue any licence to tap any tree situated outside the tapping area allotted to that tavern.

(4) *Power to refuse or cancel Licences.*—

Subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, whose decision shall be final, the Superintendent of Excise shall have power to refuse any application for a licence to tap additional trees for any tavern, and to cancel any tapping licence, the continuance of which appears to him to be unnecessary or open to objection.

(5) *Special Temporary Licences.*—

Special licences for tapping and drawing fermented toddy from trees already licensed for sweet (unfermented) toddy will be allowed in order to meet a temporary special demand for festivals and such other contingencies for any period not exceeding two weeks duration, provided however that such special licences will not be granted in respect of trees tapped for sweet toddy in dry areas.

14. (1) (a) *Marking of Trees.*—

The grantee shall not—

permit any tree to be tapped or toddy to be drawn from any tree for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at any tavern, unless such tree has first been marked for the purpose in the manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner; or

(b) *Transport Passes.*—

permit any toddy to be transported to any tavern otherwise than under cover of a pass issued to him under the hand of the Superintendent of Excise, and setting forth the name of the person who is to transport the toddy.

(2) *Separate Pass for each Carrier.*—

The grantee shall obtain separate passes for the transport of toddy by pingo carrier from the tree tope to the tavern or collecting station and for its transport by cart, lorry, or other vehicle from the collecting station to the tavern, and shall deliver the appropriate pass to such pingo carrier or to the person in charge of such cart, lorry, or other vehicle.

(3) *Separate Passes for each Person handling Toddy.*—

The grantee shall obtain a separate pass for each person employed in collecting or otherwise handling toddy at topes, collecting stations, or taverns.

15. *Establishment of Collecting Stations.*—

If toddy is to be transported in pursuance of this privilege by motor vehicle, cart, or railway, the grantee shall establish collecting stations on a road suitable for use by all motor traffic in places approved by the Superintendent of Excise, and shall obtain licences for such collecting stations. The grantee shall be bound by and conform to the conditions prescribed in the notifications relating to such collecting stations.

16. (1) *Vinegar Licence.*—

If the grantee wishes to make vinegar from surplus toddy, he may apply for a vinegar licence to the Government Agent, who shall however have full discretion to refuse to issue such licence.

(2) *Vinegar Store to be approved and Accounts kept.*—

If a licence to make vinegar from surplus toddy has been issued to the grantee, he shall store such vinegar in premises approved by the Government Agent, and shall keep a true account in the form prescribed by the Excise Commissioner of all toddy converted into vinegar, and of all sales of vinegar.

(3) *Inspection by Excise Officers.*—

The grantee shall cause such vinegar store to be opened for inspection at the request of any Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, and shall produce the accounts kept therein whenever called upon to do so.

17. *Bottling of Toddy.*—

(a) The Excise Commissioner may, in his absolute discretion, issue or authorize the issue of a licence to—

- (i) any grantee to bottle toddy at duly approved premises other than premises licensed for the retail sale of liquor and to sell such bottled toddy by retail at his toddy tavern or taverns, and by wholesale at his bottling premises to any other grantee for retail sale by such other grantee only at such other grantee's tavern or taverns, or
- (ii) any other person to bottle toddy at duly approved premises as aforesaid and to sell by wholesale at such premises such bottled toddy only to renters of toddy taverns for retail sale by such renters at their licensed taverns under the provisions of Excise Notifications Nos. 344 and 345 published in *Gazette* No. 8,448 of April 28, 1939.

(b) No bottled toddy shall be transported to a toddy tavern for sale thereat except under a pass issued by the Assistant Commissioner of Excise.

(c) The sale of bottled toddy at a tavern shall be under the same restrictions and regulations to which the retail sale of ordinary toddy in bulk is subject.

18. (1) *Payment of Rent.*—

The grantee shall pay the purchase money or rent to the Government Agent in twelve equal monthly instalments.

(2) *Due date of Instalment.*—

The first instalment of the rent shall be deemed to be due and payable on the last day of the month preceding the commencement of the period of the privilege as in condition 1, and succeeding instalments shall be deemed to be severally due and payable on the last day of each succeeding month.

(3) *Interest and Penalty.*—

Interest at the rate of 9 per centum per annum shall be payable in respect of all arrears of rent. The payment of interest shall not be deemed to be prejudice or affect the powers which may be exercised by the Government Agent under section 53 of the Ordinance in any case in which the licence issued to the grantee is liable to be cancelled under section 26.

19. (1) *Payments not valid without Kachcheri Receipt.*—

No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be deemed to have been duly made, unless the grantee produces a Kachcheri receipt in respect thereof.

(2) *Money left with Officers not reckoned as Money paid.*—

No money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of any Shroff or any other officer of any Kachcheri shall be deemed to be money paid under this contract.

20. *Limit of Sale and Transport.*—

The limit of sale by retail with respect to the whole Island and as regards purchasers generally shall be one-third of an imperial gallon, and no toddy in excess of that quantity may be removed at any one time from the tavern by any person without a valid permit or pass.

21. *Prohibition of Possession of Toddy in certain Dry Areas.*—

The transport or possession of toddy in any quantity whatsoever is entirely prohibited within the areas specified in Excise Notification No. 261 published in *Gazette* No. 8,046 of May 4, 1934, as amended by Excise Notification No. 323 published in *Gazette* No. 8,301 of July 9, 1937, except under a pass or permit granted in accordance therewith.

22. *Grantee responsible for Agent's Acts.*—

The grantee shall be responsible for all acts of his agents or employees in relation to the privilege.

23. *Non-transferability of Privilege.*—

The privilege shall not be transferable otherwise than with the sanction of the Excise Commissioner first had and obtained.

24. (1) (a) *Cancellation of Licences and Privilege for Non-payment of Rent, &c.*—

If any instalment or part of any instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, composition fee, or other sum due to the Crown from the grantee, in respect of the grant or of the licence issued to him, remains unpaid, after the date on which it becomes due and payable, the grantee shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these conditions and of the conditions of the licence issued to him, and the Government Agent shall accordingly have power, without further process of law, either (i.) to suspend or cancel the licence or licences issued to the grantee in pursuance of the provisions of section 26 of the Excise Ordinance, or (ii.) to take the licence or grant under management at the risk of the grantee, or to declare the licence or grant forfeited and reissue or resell it at the risk and loss of the grantee in pursuance of the provisions of section 30 of the said Ordinance.

This condition does not in any way affect the Government Agent's powers to confiscate the security deposit in pursuance of the provisions of condition 9 above.

(b) *Intimation or Notice of Cancellation, &c.*—

Intimation of any order of suspension or cancellation, under the said section 26, or the statutory notice or order under the said section 30 may be served personally on the grantee, or addressed under registered cover to the post office or postal address elected and signified under condition 9 (4), and duly posted, as the Government Agent thinks fit.

(2) *Regrant of Privilege between Cancellation and Resale.*—

In the event of the cancellation of a licence, the Government Agent shall have power to grant the privilege to any person approved by him for any period intervening between such cancellation and the resale of the privilege, and for this purpose may issue to such approved person a temporary licence upon such terms as he may think fit.

(3) *No Remission of Rent.*—

No remission of the rent payable in respect of the privilege will be granted on any plea of the grantee's having overestimated the value of any tavern or on any other ground.

(4) *No Compensation of Losses.*—

The grantee shall not have or make any claim to any reduction, or to the remission, of any sum due and owing by him to the Crown by reason of any loss alleged to have been sustained by him—

- (a) whether on account of any closing of the tavern or taverns during the passage of troops, or during the encampment of troops in the vicinity of the tavern or taverns, or during the holding of any poll ; or
- (b) whether on account of the opening of any new arrack, or foreign liquor tavern or estate canteen for arrack or toddy or foreign liquor, or any new foreign or country liquor premises of any other description licensed after the sale of the privilege under these conditions ; or
- (c) whether on account of the manufacture and drawing of fermented toddy on special licences issued by the Assistant Commissioner for *bona fide* domestic consumption on medical grounds, and not for sale ; or
- (d) whether on account of the manufacture and drawing of fermented toddy within the local area or areas of the privilege hereby granted for supply to licensed manufactories in which toddy is used in the process of manufacture ; or
- (e) whether on account of the issue of a licence for bottling and sale of bottled toddy to any other grantee or person or on account of the grantee's inability to make satisfactory arrangements with any such bottling licensee for the supply of bottled toddy to his tavern or on account of the breach by any such licensee of any of the conditions of his licence for bottling and sale of bottled toddy.
- (f) through any other cause whatsoever.

25. *Termination of Privilege.*—

The privilege shall terminate on (a) the expiry of the term for which it is granted, (b) the death of the grantee or (c) a breach of any of the conditions governing it.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Wednesday, March 15, 1939, at 2.30 p.m., pursuant to notice dated March 9, 1939.

Present : Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. A. C. Mohammado ; Mr. W. Dahanayake ; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab ; Mr. R. L. Ephraums ; Mr. G. Ross Bell ; and Dr. A. T. Kuriyan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on February 24, 1939, copies thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. The Chairman moved :—That this Council records its sincere regret at the death of Mr. K. T. S. Gurusinghe who was Assistant Chairman of the Council from November 16, 1936, to May 31, 1938, and its sympathy with his widow and relatives and desires that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to them :—Carried in silence, all present standing.

3. The Chairman moved :—That the Council do place on record its sincere appreciation of the valuable services rendered to it by Mr. J. C. Cooper, Provincial Engineer, Southern Province, as a Nominated Member of the Council. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

4. To consider applications for the post of Inspector of Works :—Resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting.

5. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of March 7, 1939.*

(2) Considered the following matters in connection with the Madola Augmentation Scheme :—(a) The appointment of a technical assistant to supervise the work at the spot ; (b) the question of granting an increased travelling allowance to the Municipal Engineer as long as the work is in progress.—(a) Recommended the appointment of a technical assistant at Rs. 3 per day from the time the work is started and as long as it is in progress. (b) Recommended the payment of an additional travelling (motor car) allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem to the Municipal Engineer from the time the work is started and as long as it is in progress.

(3) To approve the purchase from the Chettinad Corporation, Ltd., of Asbestos cement pipes, Super-spun cast-iron pipes and other specials required for the execution of the Madola Augmentation Scheme at a total approximate cost of Rs. 11,000.—Recommended that the purchase of the materials from the Chettinad Corporation, Ltd., be approved at a total approximate cost of Rs. 11,000 in view of the urgency of the work.

(4) Considered an estimate of Rs. 1,335 for providing suitable seating accommodation for the new Council.—Resolved to submit the estimate to the Council for consideration.

(5) Considered tenders for (a) Constructing a "V" shaped drain along the eastern side of Hirimbure road. (b) Re-grading the existing drain along the southern side of Matara road.—(a) Recommended the acceptance of the tender of Y. L. George Silva for Rs. 528·08. (b) Recommended the acceptance of the tender of R. B. de Silva for Rs. 488·85 which is the lowest.

(6) Considered an estimate of Rs. 200 for providing a barbed wire fence at the Cart Shed.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 200 be sanctioned.

(7) Considered an estimate of Rs. 240 for improvements to the public latrines at Mahamodera.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 240 be sanctioned.

(8) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, the question of placing the following officers on an incremental scale of salary :—(a) the Waste Detection Overseer ; (b) the Road Overseer.—(a) Recommended (1) that the following scale of salary be attached to the post of Waste Detection Overseer with effect from January 1, 1939 :—Rs. 540—Rs. 60—Rs. 900 ; (2) that Mr. J. H. W. Austin, the present holder of the post, be paid his present salary on that scale (*i.e.* Rs. 55 per mensem) ; and (3) that his next increment be paid to him with effect from January 1, 1940. (b) Resolved to inform the Road Overseer that the Committee is unable to recommend that he be placed on an incremental scale unless he shows considerable improvement in his work within the next six months, at the end of which time the matter will again be considered.

(10) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, the question of revising the present quarterly rents payable for water meters.—Recommended that the rents be reduced as follows with effect from July 1, 1939, and that the necessary steps be taken to amend the by-law accordingly :— $\frac{3}{8}$ in. meters from Rs. 4·50 to Rs. 2·25 ; $\frac{1}{2}$ in. meters from Rs. 5·50 to Rs. 2·25 ; $\frac{3}{4}$ in. meters from Rs. 6·50 to Rs. 3 ; 1 in. meters from Rs. 8 to Rs. 4 ; 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. meters from Rs. 14·04 to Rs. 6 ; 2 in. meters from Rs. 20 to Rs. 10 ; and 3 in. meters from Rs. 33·50 to Rs. 16.

Resolution.

With regard to item (4) Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the matter be left to the new Council to decide. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item (5) (a) Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment that the lowest tender of R. W. H. Robert for Rs. 474·25 be accepted. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 7 against. The recommendation of the Standing Committee was then put to the Meeting and adopted by 7 votes to 3.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to all the remaining items were adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 7, 1939.*

(2) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Municipal Works, the question of placing the following officers on an incremental scale of salary :—(a) the Waste Detection Overseer ; (b) the Road Overseer.—(a) Recommended (1) that the following scale of salary be attached to the post of Waste Detection Overseer with effect from January 1, 1939 :—Rs. 540—Rs. 60—Rs. 900 ; (2) that Mr. J. H. W. Austin, the present holder of the post, be paid his present salary on that scale (*i.e.* Rs. 55 per mensem) ; and (3) that his next increment be paid to him with effect from January 1, 1940. (b) Resolved to inform the Road Overseer that the Committee is unable to recommend that he be placed on an incremental scale unless he shows considerable improvement in his work within the next six months, at the end of which time the matter will again be considered.

(4) Considered, together with the Standing Committee on Municipal Works, the question of revising the present quarterly rents payable for water meters.—Recommended that the rents be reduced as follows with effect from July 1, 1939, and that the necessary steps be taken to amend the by-law accordingly :— $\frac{3}{8}$ in. meters from Rs. 4·50 to Rs. 2·25 ; $\frac{1}{2}$ in. meters from Rs. 5·50 to Rs. 2·25 ; $\frac{3}{4}$ in. meters from Rs. 6·50 to Rs. 3 ; 1 in. meters from Rs. 8 to Rs. 4 ; 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. meters from Rs. 14·04 to Rs. 6 ; 2 in. meters from Rs. 20 to Rs. 10 ; and 3 in. meters from Rs. 33·50 to Rs. 16.

(5) Considered the question of waiving the rates due on the following properties on the ground of poverty of the owners :—8/3, Pokunewatta footpath ; 29/1, Akuressa road ; and 29/2, Akuressa road.—Recommended that the total rates due on the above properties in respect of 1938 and 1939, amounting to Rs. 6·25, be waived on the ground of poverty of the owners.

(6) Application from Mr. S. Sahabandu, Electrical Inspector, for (a) an enhanced scale of salary ; and (b) an increased travelling allowance.—(a) Recommended that the matter be considered when the officer reaches the maximum salary on his present scale ; (b) Recommended that the officer's travelling allowance be increased from Rs. 25 per mensem to Rs. 35 per mensem with effect from January 1, 1939, and that the necessary supplemental expenditure be sanctioned under vote E 7/2.

(7) Application from Mr. D. A. Amaratunge, Electrical Inspector, for an increased travelling allowance.—Recommended that this officer's travelling allowance be increased from Rs. 20 per mensem to Rs. 25 per mensem with effect from January 1, 1939, and that the necessary supplemental expenditure be sanctioned under Vote E 7/2.

(8) Application from Mr. R. F. Seresinghe, Clerk, Electricity Department, for an enhanced scale of salary.—Recommended that the application be refused.

(9) Application from A. Sarnelis, Caretaker, Segregation Camp, for the grant of a long service allowance under Rule 21 of the Municipal Pension Rule.—Recommended the grant of a long service allowance of Rs. 5 per mensem under Rule 21 of the Municipal Pension Minute with effect from January 1, 1939.

(10) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 100 under Head 19—Overtime.—Recommended.

(13) Applications from Messrs. T. and D. Amarasuriya for the supply of Electricity to their premises which are situated outside Municipal limits.—Recommended that the applicants be informed that the supply will be given provided they agree to pay half the cost of extending the present mains, which amounts to Rs. 780.

Resolution.

With regard to item (9) Mr. W. Dahanayake moved as an amendment that a long service allowance of Rs. 7·50 per mensem be granted to A. Sarnelis, Caretaker, Segregation Camp. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to all the remaining items were adopted.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya presented a petition signed by Mr. K. G. P. Gunasekera and a large number of ratepayers, requesting that they should be exempted from the extra lighting rate of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

7. To approve the expenditure of an additional sum of Rs. 129 in connection with the acquisition of land for the construction of a public latrine at Halls Cross road.—Resolved that the expenditure of an additional sum of Rs. 129 be approved and that a supplemental vote of this amount be sanctioned under Vote 56.

8. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of Council :—Agreed that next General Meeting of Council be held on April 21, 1939, at 2.30 P.M.

Method and apparatus for pulverizing minerals and other materials.

Abstract.—A method of pulverizing granular materials (such as graphite, by projecting it by fluid pressure on to an abrading surface which moves relatively to the impinging material at high speed.

According to one method of carrying out the invention, a flat abrasive wheel suitably shrouded and reinforced to withstand centrifugal stresses is rotated inside a casing (which may be lined with abrasive material) at a high speed; fluid jets carrying the granules are directed at an angle of about 15° tangentially to the wheel in a direction opposed to its motion. The granular material is reduced to fine powder by the impact and the movement relative to the wheel and casing.

In dry pulverizing in which compressed gas is used to project the particles, the exhaust pipe is arranged with its mouth close to the abrading surface; provision is made to move this pipe in and out of the casing in order to control the fineness of the product. The pipe may also be lined with abrasive material. An adjustable baffle may be interposed between the exhaust pipe and the wheel to still further increase the sensitivity of control over the finished product.

In wet grinding a dam ring and plate are provided to prevent excessive splashing of the liquid and to keep material close to the wheel. The liquid containing the fines passes into a sump and after separation the oversize particles are returned to the machine for further treatment.

The contour of the wheel may be convex or concave or a combination of both.

Cigarettes, cigars, foodstuffs, &c., may thus be wrapped. The sheet preferably contains an age register, and may be coloured with oil-soluble dyes.

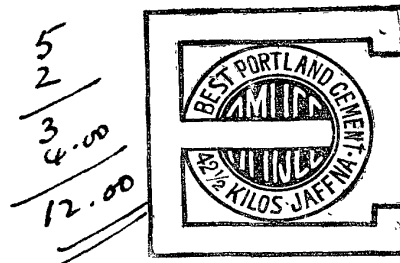
