

According to that invention, the reacting torque of the engine and the braking torque are transmitted to the frame of the vehicle by a common lever; springs are interposed between the casing and the braking cone, and damping is provided by sliding friction, or by pneumatic or hydraulic means. According to the present invention, an annular ring of rubber is fixed by vulcanization or other means to the gear casing and to a transmitting portion connected to the bearing cone of the free wheel hub. This serves to transmit the reacting torque as well as to absorb the shocks. There are two claims and one sheet of drawings.
