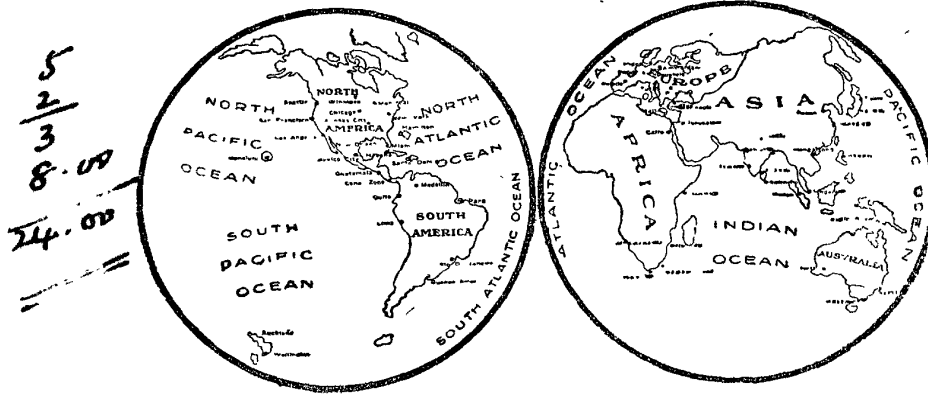

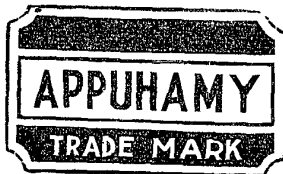

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 18, 1939, at 8.45 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated March 14, 1939.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on February 25, 1939, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1938 to January 31, 1939, on account of the Municipal Fund—General Revenue Account.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for February, 1939.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February, 1939.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending March 18, 1939.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—

Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes and house service taps inspected during February, 1939.

4. Petitions:—Sir Cudah Ratwatte, Adigar, presented—(1) Petition from Parent-Teachers' Association in Mavil-mada dated March 17, 1939, addressed to Sir Cudah, praying that the concession of relief from rates be secured in respect of the paddy fields in Mavil-mada, Nittawcla, Siyambalagastenne as the crops have failed owing to the severe drought; and Mr. Nettelton presented—(2) Letter dated March 16, 1939, addressed to him by Col. G. A. S. Collin, stating that the grave of the late Mr. J. B. S. D'Agular, the perpetual upkeep of which has been undertaken by the Council, has not been properly maintained.

The Chairman undertook to inquire into the matters referred to in the petitions.

4A. Mr. Soysa inquired when it was intended to have the elections under Ordinance No. 60 of 1935.

The Chairman read out a statement indicating on what dates he intended to publish the notifications preliminary to the elections and pointed out that he had provisionally fixed April 24, 1939, as the date for nominations and May 15, 1939, as the date for polling.

Mr. Marikar asked the Chairman to consider the desirability of having several polling dates instead of one day for all Wards.

5. To obtain sanction for a vote of Rs. 450 for survey and landmarking of 625 acres forming the catchment of the Hunasgiriya Scheme.

Resolved that the vote be allowed. The Chairman agreed to fix a time limit of 3 months for the completion of the survey if it were possible.

6. Further memo from the Chairman on the subject of organization of a Lands branch and the proposal to appoint a Surveyor's Draughtsman.

The Council moved into Committee to consider the proposal.

The Chairman placed before the meeting the recommendation of the Finance Committee on the subject, viz.:—"That a licensed draughtsman be appointed temporarily up to December 31, 1939, on a pay of Rs. 40 per mensem to assist Mr. Spencer, and explained the nature of duties performed by Mr. Spencer at present.

The Council then resumed.

The Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Sir Cudah Ratwatte seconded.—Carried.

To sanction the extension of the Halloluwa toll rent lease which expires on March 31, 1939, for one month up to April 30, 1939, by which time it is possible that the bridge might be completed.—Resolved that the lease be extended up to the date of completion and opening of the bridge for public use.

21. To obtain a vote of Rs. 1,300 for the transport of water by lorry and carts up to end of April, 1939.—Resolved that the vote be allowed.

According to the present invention, an annular ring of rubber is fixed by vulcanization or other means to the gear casing and to a transmitting portion connected to the bearing cone of the free wheel hub. This serves to transmit the reacting torque as well as to absorb the shocks.
