Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, have during the present session of the State Council approved of the introduction into the State Council of a resolution whereby, if such resolution be passed into law, the import duty payable on the goods specified in the first column of the schedule hereto shall be altered:

Wednesday, April 5, 1939, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated March 29, 1939.

Present:—Dr. V. R. Schokman, the Mayor, presiding; Dr. A. F. J. Casie Chitty; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. R. F. S. de Mel; Mr. Geo. R. de Silva; Mr. J. R. Dharmasena; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. C. W. S. Fernando; Mr. D. S. Fonseka; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. N. M. M. Ishak; Mr. C. G. C. Kerr, C.A.; Mr. Merrill W. Pereira; Dr. A. Ratnapala; Mr. A. R. A. Razik, J.P., M.S.C.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Mr. N. Saravanamuttu; Dr. R. Saravanamuttu, M.B.; Mr. S. Saravanamuttu; Mr. V. R. Somanathan; Mr. J. Tyagaraja; and the Municipal Commissioner.

- 1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of March 1, 1939, were taken as read and confirmed.
- 2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. R. Dharmasena, M.M.C., presented a petition from the land owners and tenants of 1st Maligakanda lane asking for the provision of water mains and lights and requested the Mayor to refer it to the appropriate Committee for report.
- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Merrill W. Pereira, M.M.C., presented a petition from Dr. D. F. de S. Gunawardena seeking relief in respect of certain street lines, and requested the Mayor to refer it to the appropriate Committee for report.
- 4. Mr. R. F. S. de Mel, M.M.C., with the permission of the House, presented a petition from Mr. Harry Pereira of Shorts road, Slave Island, who had been employed as an Acting Playground Instructor for the past 11 years, and requested the Mayor to deal with it.
 - 5. The Mayor replied as follows to the questions of which due notice had been given by Mr. J. R. Dharmasena:—
- Q.—Is the Mayor aware of the use by several dealers in the City, specially in the Pettah area, of false weights and measures and thereby swindle the poor ratepayers? If so, will the Mayor please direct the Municipal Treasurer to start a vigorous campaign for the detection of such false weights and measures and the prosecution of such offenders? A.—Since 138 cases were instituted against persons using false and/or unstamped weights and measures resulting in fines amounting to Rs. 6,050 during 1938, the answer must be "Yes". A systematic campaign is carried out every year.
 - 6. The Mayor replied as follows to the questions of which due notice had been given by Mr. J. R. Dharmasena:-
- Q.—Will the Mayor please state whether Dematagoda road is a trunk road approved by the Government as such? If so, as there is a large amount of traffic taking this narrow road daily and the severe congestion involved as a result, will the Mayor please communicate with the Government and take early steps to have this road widened? A.—Dematagoda road is a trunk road. The whole question of trunk roads is being reviewed and the question of the widening of the Dematagoda road will also be placed before Government shortly.
 - 7. The Mayor replied as follows to the questions of which due notice had been given by Mr. J. R. Dharmasena:-
- Q.—When was the land acquired at Kirillapone as the proposed site for the Colombo South Cemetery? What was the total cost of its acquisition and what is the annual cost of its upkeep up to date? Q.—Is it being used for any Municipal purpose at present and if not, what is the loss to the ratepayers annually by way of interest on the capital sum involved in the acquisition of this property? A.—(a) In 1923 both for a Cemetery and a quarry. (b) Rs. 363,092.71 including filling by unemployed and cost of boundary wall and fencing. (c) The average annual cost of upkeep is Rs. 440. (d) No—but is reserved for use as a cemetery. (e) The land has risen in value and unless sold the question of profit or loss does not arise.

- The Mayor replied as follows to the questions of which due notice had been given by Mr. J. R. Dharmasena:
- -As auditing is an independent check on accounts of every department, does not the Mayor consider that the Internal Audit Branch at present under the Municipal Treasurer, should be an independent branch under the Municipal Commissioner? If so, will the Mayor kindly direct steps to be taken to give effect to it? A.—The Auditor-General serves as the independent Audit of the Council's finances. What is called the Internal Audit Branch is a specialised checking section of the Treasurer's Department which exercises a detailed check in regard to revenue and store accounts. opinion that it serves a very useful purpose and should continue to function as at present.
 - 9. The Mayor replied as follows to the questions of which due notice had been given by Mr. R. F. S. de Mel:-Will the Mayor kindly state for the information of the members of this Council
- (a) Q.—The total number of boutiques and tenements which are contained in the Housing Estate belonging to this Council at Kochchikade? (a) A.—354 tenements and 50 boutiques. (b) Q.—The total number of boutiques and tenements which are vacant to-day and the reasons for their being so vacant? Registered No. 816.—Recommended.

To consider, in connection with the proposed conversion of part of the premises of the present Child Welfare Centre in Slave Island to a Maternity Home:—(a) A plan (No. 3718a) showing the design, and a detailed estimate for Rs. 12,500 submitted by the Municipal Engineer for sauction of Council. (b) A report of the Commissioner. Registered No. 974.—Recommended that tenders be called for.

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

- (18) To consider :—(a) The quotations received locally and direct from the manufacturing firms in England for the purchase of spun iron pipes. (b) The recommendations of the Waterworks Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer and the Tender Board) that the following quotations be accepted —8,000 yards 4-in. diameter pipes 12 feet long from Messrs. The Stanton Ironworks Co., Ltd., at £1,966, 13s, 4d. c.i.f., Colombo, excluding war risk, insurance, &c.; 400 yards 6 in. pipes 12 feet long from Messrs. The normal procedure of calling for tenders to be followed in future.
- (19) To consider a memorandum of the Waterworks Engineer, dated February 28, 1939, requesting formal sanction of Council for the laying of a 3-in. diameter water main in private lane off Horton place in connection with Dr. Cyril F. Fernando's application for water service to two new bungalows in that lane. Note.—Dr. Fernando has paid the cost of laying the main—Rs. 912. Registered No. 824.—Recommended.
- (20) To consider a memorandum of the Waterwords Engineer, dated March 3, 1939, requesting formal sanction of Council for the laying of a 4-in. diameter water main in private lane leading to "Glen Aber" premises, Colpetty, in connection with Mr. John Cosmos's application for water service to the premises situated in that lane. Note.—Mr. Cosmos has paid the cost of laying the main—Rs. 2,065. Registered No. 913.—Recommended.

Registered No. 298.—Recommended that the main be laid at the cost of the owners.

Fernando dissented.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. N. Saravanamuttu moved that the recommendations of the Committee be not accepted as they were not in order.

The Mayor ruled that the recommendations were in order.

The recommendation in regard to (a) was then put to the House and Dr. E. A. Perera was declared appointed.

The recommendation as regards (b) was then put to the House and declared lost.

The names were then put to the House in alphabetical order and Dr. Dharmaratne was declared appointed.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(5) To consider the following motion of Mr. A.R. A. (b) Benzoic acid—six hundred to two thousand parts.

If used in combination the quantity of chemicals used must not exceed three hundred parts of (a), one thousand parts of (b) and three hundred parts of (c) per million parts by weight of juice.
