THE CEYLON (STATE COUNCIL) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1931.

Order under Article 94.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by Article 94 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order delegate to the Chief Secretary those of the powers vested in the Governor by section 54 of the Courts Ordinance (Chapter 6), in pursuance whereof any officer of the Ceylon Civil Service not holding any specific post in the said service may be appointed to be an Additional Magistrate or Additional Commissioner of Requests.

IT is hereby notified that the Public Service Regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, as amended by the Notification of November 9, 1936, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,256 of November 13, 1936, have been amended by the deletion of Public Service Regulation 119 and the substitution of the following new regulation:—

119. (a) If in any case the Governor considers that the interests of the Public Service require that an officer should cease forthwith to exercise the powers and functions of his office he may interdict the officer from the exercise of the powers and functions of his office, provided that proceedings for his dismissal are being taken or are about to be taken, or that criminal proceedings are being instituted against him.

(b) A Head of Department may interdict from duty any officer employed in the Department whose emoluments do not exceed £300 or Rs. 4,500 per annum where in the opinion of the Head of Department the interests of the Public Service so require, provided that proceedings for the dismissal of the officer are being taken or are about to be taken or that criminal proceedings are being instituted against him.

(c) Subject to the provision of Public Service Regulation 126 an officer who has been interdicted shall receive from the date of interdiction one-half of his emoluments unless the Governor orders that a greater proportion of his emoluments than one-half shall be paid. If the proceedings against any such officer do not result in the dismissal or other punishment of the officer, he will be entitled to the full amount of emoluments which he would have received if he had not been interdicted.

(Note—(a) Retirement for inefficiency does not fall within the term "other punishment" in this regulation.

(b) For the purpose of this regulation, an officer's emoluments mean the emoluments of his substantive office and comprise salary, rent allowance, personal allowance and any other allowance not being in the nature of a duty allowance or an allowance for out-of-pocket expenses (travelling, transport and subsistence allowances.)

(d) If the proceedings result in an officer receiving punishment less than dismissal, the order for punishment may include an order that the whole or a part of the emoluments withheld shall be paid to the officer in respect of the period of interdiction.

Note.—When an officer is found guilty of the charges in respect of which he is interdicted and is dismissed, it is appropriate that he should receive no further emoluments in respect of the period of interdiction; but if the proceedings disclose that he is guilty of only minor defaults or of misconduct not necessitating his dismissal, the loss of emoluments under the first sentence of Public Service Regulation 119 (c) for the period of interdiction may entail too heavy a punishment, in which case order may be made for a greater proportion of his emoluments to be paid. In deciding on the order to be made consideration should be given to the length of the period of interdiction necessitated by the proceedings especially when any unusual delay is not directly attributable to any act of the officer charged.

(e) A Minor Headman who draws an allowance shall not, if he has been interdicted, draw any allowance in respect of the period of interdiction.

IT is hereby notified that the Public Service Regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, have been amended by the addition of the following new regulation :—

Seniority.

76A. (i.) Except where otherwise provided—

- (a) seniority in any department shall be determined by the date of an officer's appointment to the particular class or grade in which he is serving ;
- (b) seniority as between persons selected for appointment from outside the Colony shall be determined by the date of arrival in the Island. Where, however, two or more persons selected from outside the Colonial Service arrive on the same date, seniority *inter se* shall be determined by the date of the letter from the Colonial Office confirming the selection, or, in the case of officers engaged on agreement, by the date of the agreement.

(ii.) An officer's seniority in a grade or class shall only be altered in the following cases :—

- (a) where he fails to pass an Efficiency Bar at the due date ;
- (b) where his probationary period is extended : *vide* Public Service Regulation 61 (Correction Slip No. 35) ; or
- (c) where an order of reduction in seniority is made as a disciplinary measure.

(iii.) This regulation shall come into effect from June 1, 1939 ; and shall not have retrospective effect.

(iv.) When an officer is transferred from one service to another, his seniority in relation to the other officers in his new grade or class shall, if possible, be determined at the time of his transfer.

BY-LAW.

The percentage to be deemed the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance, and upkeep to be deducted each year in the computation and assessment of the "annual value" of any immovable property situated within the administrative limits of the Kolonnawa Urban District Council shall be as follows:—

- (a) in the case of any house covered with cadjan or straw, twelve per centum per annum;
- (b) in the case of any house other than a house referred to in paragraph (a), eight per centum per annum;
- (c) in the case of any cultivated land on which there is no house, three per centum per annum; and
- (d) in the case of any land not referred to in paragraph (c) on which there is no house, one per centum per annum.

In this by-law "house" includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure, whether used for the purpose of human habitation or otherwise.

BY-LAWS.

By-laws regulating the Supply of Electricity.

1. In these by-laws—
"the Council" means the Weligama Urban District Council.
2. Any person desirous of obtaining the use of electrical energy from the Council shall make application in the form set out in the Schedule A hereto.
3. Every consumer of electrical energy shall pay (a) the charges for consumption, (b) meter rent, and (c) other connected charges at the rates set out in Schedule B hereto: Provided that in the case of any consumer whose monthly consumption exceeds 50 units, the Council may with the prior written sanction of the Chief Engineer and Manager, Government Electrical Undertakings, fix such other rate as to it may seem reasonable.
4. (1) That portion of the service cable which is on the consumer's premises, the transformers, the main fuses, the meter and the board remain the property of the Council and on no account shall they be moved or handled by any person other than an employee of the Council.
(2) Any installation is liable to be disconnected from the Council's main on discovery that the Council's seals on the meter or the fuse have been broken or that any part of the Council's apparatus or wires has been tampered with.
(3) No consumer shall break, or tamper with, or permit any person other than an employee of the Council to break or tamper with, any seal or any part of the Council's apparatus or wires.
5. (1) Every consumer wishing, at any time after his installation has been connected, to use any lamp, fan, or motor of greater size, or to instal any additional lamp or other apparatus consuming energy, either temporarily or permanently or in any way to alter or extend the wiring on his premises shall notify his wish to the Council in writing, and if he desires that an electrical contractor should do the work, he shall at the same time notify the name and address of such contractor.
(2) Failure on the consumer's part to notify to the Council the matters referred to in paragraph (1) shall render the whole installation liable to disconnection from the Council's mains without further notice.

(3) No person shall connect any extension to the main installation until such extension has been inspected and tested and found to be satisfactory by the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department.

6. Every consumer shall permit the Council's inspectors and employees at all reasonable times to enter any of his premises to which energy is supplied for the purpose of reading the meter or inspecting any apparatus or of disconnecting or reconnecting the supply to such premises, or of removing or replacing any apparatus belonging to the Council.

7. (1) In the event of the melting of the main fuse in any premises the consumer shall forthwith inform the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department.

(2) No person other than one of the Council's authorized officers or workmen shall replace any melted fuse, which is the property of the Council.

(3) Where the services of any officer or workman of the Council are required to replace any fuse which is the property of the consumer, or where the melting of any fuse, which is the property of the Council is found to have been caused by a defect in the consumer's wiring or apparatus, a charge of one rupee will be made for replacing the fuse.

8. (1) The Council does not hold itself liable to the consumer, for any loss or damage occasioned, directly or indirectly, by the total or partial interruption of supply.

(2) In the case of electrical energy being used or dealt with by any consumer in such manner as unduly or improperly to interfere with the efficient supply of energy to any other person, the Council reserves to itself the right to disconnect such consumer's supply of energy without notice.

(3) Where the installation is reconnected after having been disconnected under paragraph (2) a fee of five rupees for testing and reconnecting will be charged and shall be paid in advance by the consumer.

9. (1) All charges shall be deemed to be due on the date on which an account is presented.

(2) Where any account is not paid within seven days of its presentation, the Council may, after giving seven days' notice in writing to the consumer, disconnect such defaulting consumer's installation without prejudice to the right of the Council to recover all arrears.

(3) Any installation disconnected under paragraph (2) shall not be reconnected until the amount of arrears due is paid together with a reconnection fee of five rupees.

10. (1) The Council reserves to itself the right to demand a deposit as security against the supply of energy in any case.

(2) In particular, the Council reserves to itself the right to demand as a condition of the supply of energy the deposit in cash of the equivalent of two months' probable consumption as estimated by the Chairman, but the deposit of such security shall not prejudice the right of the Council to disconnect an installation for non-payment of accounts rendered as provided by by-law 9.

11. The Council will not entertain any complaint against the accuracy of an account unless such complaint is made within a week after the presentation of the account.

12. (1) Every consumer about to vacate his premises shall give in writing three clear days' notice of his intention to do so.

(2) Where the notice referred to in paragraph (1) is not given, the consumer shall be held responsible for all energy consumed on such premises until the lapse of three days from the date on which the Council receives notice of the fact that the premises have been vacated: Provided that if the supply to the premises is disconnected by the Council before the lapse of the said three days, the consumer shall be responsible for the energy consumed on the premises up to the time of disconnection.

13. (1) If a consumer or the Council at any time considers that any meter is not in proper working order, the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department may, of his own motion or on receipt of a notice to that effect from the consumer, take the necessary steps to have the meter tested.

(2) If it is found as a result of any test made at the request of a consumer that the supply registered by the meter is not more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. fast or $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. slow, the consumer shall pay on demand the testing fee of five rupees.

(3) If it is found as a result of any test made at the request of a consumer that the supply registered by the meter is more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. fast, no testing fee shall be charged and the Council shall refund to the consumer any amount paid by him in excess of the value of the quantity actually consumed by him during the previous three months.

(4) If as a result of any test made at the request of a consumer, it is found that the supply registered by the meter is more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. slow, no testing fee shall be charged but the consumer shall pay on demand the

charges for the difference between the quantity registered by the meter and the quantity actually consumed during the previous three months.

(5) For any period during which the meter is found to have been out of order or to have registered incorrectly, the consumer shall not be liable to pay meter rent.

(6) No testing fee shall in any case be recovered where the test is made on the initiative of the Council or the Superintendent of its Electricity Department.

14. No consumer shall wilfully or negligently cause any electrical energy to be diverted or wasted, or maliciously injure any meter or wilfully alter the index of any meter fixed to his premises, or prevent any such meter from duly registering.

15. (1) No person who is not the holder, or a workman employed by the holder, of a certificate of competence to act as electrical contractor issued by the Council shall—

(a) undertake or carry out any work in connexion with the wiring or the electrical fittings or fixtures of any new installation which is intended to be connected to the Council's mains, or

(b) after an installation in any premises has been connected to the Council's mains carry out or perform, in connexion with such installation, any electrical work—

(i.) which consists of, or is in the nature of, alterations, adjustments, additions, or repairs to such installation, or

(ii.) which is other than such ordinary replacement of lamps, fans, switches or other component parts as in no way alters or affects the capacity and nature of such installation.

(2) No electrical work described in paragraph (i.), carried out by a person who does not hold a valid certificate of competency or by the workman of such person, shall be connected to the Council's supply mains.

16. No person shall be granted a certificate of competency to act as electrical contractor unless he is the holder of a certificate of recommendation from the Chief Engineer and Manager, Government Electrical Undertakings, or unless he has—

(a) had at least three years' practical experience in a recognized electrical engineering workshop or firm or electrical power station, and

(b) been regularly engaged for a period of not less than two years in the practice of electrical engineering: Provided that the Council may in its discretion refuse to grant a certificate of competency to any person to act as electrical contractor whatever his qualification may be, without assigning any reason or excuse for such refusal.

17. (1) No electrical contractor shall carry out or perform any electrical work, such as installation work, including additions, alterations, and adjustments to existing installations, except after notice of not less than two days to the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department to enable such Superintendent to inspect the proposed work.

(2) If the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department approves of the intended work, he shall settle with the contractor the position of the meter, and the contractor shall carry out the work in accordance with the latest regulations of the Institution of Electrical Engineers.

18. On the completion of any electrical work referred to in by-law 17, such work shall be inspected and tested by the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department, and—

(a) if the installation is found to comply with the regulations laid down, a supply of electrical energy to the premises shall be given;

(b) if the installation does not comply with the regulations laid down, the certificate of competency issued to the contractor shall be liable to cancellation or suspension, and a supply of electrical energy to the premises shall not be given until such time as the installation has been made to comply with such regulations.

19. If any electrical contractor commences or carries out any work connected with any new installation without giving notice to the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department and obtaining the prior approval of the Superintendent, the Council may refuse to supply electrical energy to the premises wherein such work has been carried out, or may call upon the contractor to effect such modifications or alterations to the wiring as the said Superintendent may think necessary. If such modifications or alterations are duly carried out, the installation shall be

reinspected and tested by the said Superintendent and if found to be in order, a supply of electrical energy to the premises shall be given.

20. Where any electrical contractor carries out any extension to any installation which is already connected to the Council's mains without prior notice to and without the permission of the Superintendent of the Council's Electricity Department, notwithstanding that such extension has not been connected by the contractor to the main installation—

(1) the whole installation shall be liable to disconnection from the Council's mains; and

(2) the electrical contractor shall, in addition, be liable to have his certificate of competency cancelled or suspended.

21. Every contravention of by-law 4 (3), or by-law 14 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws published by Notification in *Gazette* No. 7,813 of November 7, 1930, as last amended by by-law

published by Notification in *Gazette* No. 8,273 of February 19, 1937, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(a) in by-law 1 thereof, under the heading "General By-laws relating to Licences—Interpretation of Terms", by the addition, at the end of the definition of "offensive or dangerous trades", of the following:—

"storing or sale of dry fish (that is to say, any edible fish other than fresh fish, iced fish or canned fish) in any quantity over 28 lb.;" and

(b) by the insertion immediately before the heading "Repeal", of the following new by-laws:—

STORING AND SALE OF DRY FISH.

I.—Conditions of issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to a licence for the storing or sale of dry fish in any quantity over 28 lb. in a boutique unless the premises or the part of the premises to be used for the purpose comply with each of the following conditions:—

- that the premises are in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted, and that every room is provided with windows capable of being opened, and having, when so opened, an area not less than one fifteenth of the superficial floor area of the room;
- that the premises are free of any loft, structure, fixture or other thing which obstructs or is likely to obstruct the proper cleansing of any part of the premises and the maintenance of sanitary conditions therein;
- that the walls of every room—
 - are built of brick, concrete, stone or cabook,
 - are not less than 7 feet in height, and
 - have their internal and external surfaces limo-plastered and lime-washed except where they are plastered in cement;
- that all the eaves are at least 7 feet from the ground;
- that the roof is covered with burnt clay tiles or other durable material;
- that all the woodwork is oil-painted or lime-washed;
- that the floor is of cement concrete not less than 4 inches thick, and that the cementing is carried over the lower end of the walls to a height of three feet;
- that the premises are provided with sufficient latrine accommodation;
- that the premises are provided with adequate surface drains;
- that for the storing of dry fish the premises are provided with platforms which—
 - are not less than 18 inches in height,
 - are open on the sides, and
 - are so constructed as not to interfere with the lighting and the ventilation or the cleaning and sweeping of the premises.

II.—Regulations for Licensed Dry Fish Boutiques.

1. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his boutique a board with his name and the words "Licensed Dry Fish Boutique" legibly painted thereon in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil.

2. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall cause a copy of these regulations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil, and the licence, to be framed and hung in a prominent place in the boutique, and shall also cause a list of the names and addresses of all employees to be kept in the boutique so as to be available at all reasonable times for inspection by the Chairman or any person authorized by him.

3. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall not use the boutique for the purposes of the storing or the sale of any article other than dry fish.

4. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall not use or permit any other person to use as a sleeping or residential apartment any room, hall or enclosed space which forms part of the boutique and in which dry fish is stored or sold.

5. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall cause one quarter of the floor area of any room, hall or enclosed space, where dry fish is stored, to be left free and unoccupied.

6. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall not cause or permit the dry fish to be stored in the premises otherwise than on platforms provided for that purpose.

7. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall cause the dry fish to be stored in a manner approved by the Chairman.

8. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall not cause any goods or articles to be placed in any part of the boutique which is under the platforms or within four feet of the roof.

9. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall take out or cause to be taken out at least four times a year, that is to say, in the months of March, June, September, and December each year, all goods and merchandise stored therein, and shall, before replacing them, cause all rat-holes in the walls and the floor to be filled up with broken glass and cement.

10. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall provide a sufficient number of sanitary dust bins and at least one spittoon for use in the boutique.

11. No person shall spit within a dry fish boutique except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

12. (1) The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall cause all by-products, refuse, waste or decaying matter in the boutique to be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle, and shall, at least once a day, cause—

(a) all such by-products, refuse, waste or decaying matter, as may not be set apart for further treatment for purposes of trade, to be removed from the boutique, and

(b) the receptacle, which contained the by-products, refuse, waste or decaying matter so removed, to be washed or cleaned thoroughly.

(2) The licensee shall cause the receptacle, while it is in the boutique, to be kept covered, except when any by-product, refuse, waste or decaying matter is being placed therein.

13. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall cause every part of the boutique, its surroundings, drains, and equipment to be kept at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

14. No person shall, for any purpose whatsoever, keep any animal or bird in a licensed dry fish boutique.

15. The licensee of a dry fish boutique shall permit the Chairman, or any person authorized by the Chairman, to enter upon and inspect the boutique at any reasonable hour of the day.

1. No omnibus shall enter or be parked in a public stand unless the driver is in possession of a valid permit issued in respect of it by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board.

2. (1) The Chairman of the Sanitary Board shall issue the permit referred to in regulation 1 on payment of a fee of Re. 1.

(2) Every permit issued under paragraph (1) shall contain the number of the omnibus in respect of which it is issued, and shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issue.

3. The person in charge of each omnibus occupying a public stand shall, whenever required to do so by a Sanitary Board Inspector, or a Police Officer in uniform, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of such omnibus.

IT is notified for general information that it is proposed to enforce the following "Closing Orders" within the Municipal Limits of Colombo, Kandy, and Galle, under the Shops Regulation Ordinance, 1938 :—

1. (a) All Shops except those specifically exempted herein shall be closed not later than 5 P.M. on five days of the week and 2 P.M. on one day (Saturday) and shall remain closed on all Sundays; provided that in cases where any person employed in or about the business of the Shop is a member of the occupier's family the Shop may remain open till 8 P.M. on week days.

(b) Shops where articles, such as fish, meat, and eatables that are subject to rapid decay are sold, may remain open for not more than 1 hour after the time prescribed in (a).

Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding sub-section stalls which form part of the premises or the buildings of a market may remain open till 7.30 P.M.

2. Subject to the exemption shown below, closing orders shall apply to all premises in which any retail or wholesale trade or business is carried on (such as that of a milliner, draper, grocer, haberdasher), the business of the lending for reward of books and periodicals, any premises in which goods are received direct from customers to be dyed, cleaned, or laundered; any premises where goods are sold wholesale to customers resorting thereto and any warehouse connected with these premises.

3. The following trades and businesses shall be exempted from the operation of the Closing Order :—

- The sale by retail of intoxicating liquors,
- The sale of refreshments for consumption on the premises,
- The business carried on at a Railway refreshment room,
- The delivery of ice to hospitals and nursing institutions or in case of sickness to private persons,
- The sale of petroleum and motor oil,
- The sale of Newspapers,
- The business carried on at a railway bookstall,
- The sale of medicines and medical and surgical appliances,
- Post Office and Telegraph business (the Cable and Wireless Limited which receive wireless messages, &c., for the Telegraph Department).

4. It shall be lawful for any occupier to keep open his Shop on Sundays provided that the Shop is closed on any other day of the week for a whole day and provided such day shall have been notified beforehand to the Controller of Labour. It shall not be lawful to alter this day until after three months have elapsed since the date of fixing it.

5. This order shall not apply to licensed trades in which the occupier is authorized to carry on his trade or business within specified hours.

6. The Regulation as regards working hours, holidays, leave and other conditions shall be applicable to all Shops which are not specifically exempted therein notwithstanding that such Shops are exempted from the operation of the Closing Orders.

II. Those interested are invited to make representations on the above subject to the Controller of Labour on or before June 30, 1939. Every objection preferred in consequence of this notice shall be made in writing and shall contain a statement of the grounds upon which objection is taken to the proposed order.

The Food Control Regulations, 1938, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,397 of September 27, 1938, are hereby amended in regulation 2 of the regulations under Head "F.—General"—

(a) by the substitution for paragraph (1) of that regulation of the following new paragraph:—

"(1) for the purposes of these regulations there shall be established for every judicial district, that is to say, the area within the jurisdiction of a District Court, a Board of Assessors consisting of the District Judge of the district as chairman and of two other members to be nominated by the Minister:

Provided, however, that the Minister may in any case appoint one or more additional Boards for any specified area or areas in any such district; and every such additional Board shall consist of the District Judge of the district as chairman and of two other members to be nominated by the Minister." ; and

(b) in paragraph (2) of that regulation, by the substitution for the words "Board of Assessors" of the words "Board of Assessors through the Deputy Food Controller".

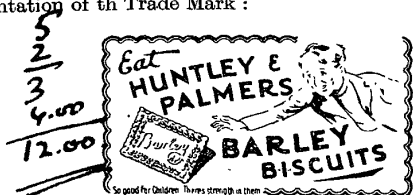
