WHEREAS I have deemed it necessary to issue a Commission to inquire into and report upon the matters hereinafter mentioned upon which information in my opinion is necessary and it is expedient that the Commission so appointed should have the power to hear evidence with a view to such inquiry and report:

Now know Ye that I, ANDREW CALDECOTT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon with the Territories and Dependencies thereof, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability and fidelity, do by these presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you the said Doctor LAKSEMI CHANDRA JAIN, to be my Commissioner for the purposes of an inquiry into the following matters, that is to say—

REGULATION.

The regulations relating to the Ceylon Light Infantry, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,095 of December 14, 1934, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,436 of March 3, 1939, are hereby further amended as follows:—

- (1) in regulation 62, by the omission of paragraph (a) thereof, and the renumbering of paragraphs (b) and (c), as (a) and (b) respectively;

- (2) by the substitution for regulations 78, 79, and 80 of the following new regulations:—

“78. Except when on active service, members other than officers may be transferred to the reserve at any time at their own request or at the discretion of the Commanding Officer, if they have at least 5 years efficient service. They will automatically be transferred to the reserve on attaining the age of 50.

79. Members due for transfer to reserve under regulation 78 and not desirous of serving therein will be discharged.

80. Reservists will be discharged on attaining the age of 60.”; and

- (3) by the omission of regulations 81 and 82.

INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS FOR DISPENSING WITH BILLS OF HEALTH AND CONSULAR VISAS ON BILLS OF HEALTH.

Paris, December 22, 1934.

No. 1.

International Agreement for Dispensing with Bills of Health.

The under-mentioned Governments desiring, in accordance with the spirit of article 49 (4) and of article 57 of the International Sanitary Convention, signed at Paris on the 21st June, 1926, to reduce as far as possible the formalities to which merchant vessels are subject, the undersigned, provided with full powers found to be in good and due form, have agreed to the following provisions:—

1. All ships registered in the metropolitan territory of one of the Contracting Governments, from whatever place arriving, shall be exempted at any port in the metropolitan territories of the other Contracting Governments from the obligation to produce a bill of health.

2. Each of the Contracting Governments undertakes not to require such vessels on calling at its ports to produce any documents such as a consular bill of health or any other certificate or to carry out formalities which would render ineffective the exemption provided for in article 1.

3.—(a) Each of the Contracting Governments at the time of signing or acceding to this agreement may declare that it intends to make it applicable to all or to any of its colonies, overseas territories, protectorates or territories under its suzerainty or mandate.

(d) The French Government shall immediately inform the Contracting Governments and the International Office of Public Health of any notifications which it may receive under the provisions of the two preceding paragraphs, indicating at the same time the date of each notification.

(e) Vessels registered in any territory to which this agreement is applicable under the previous paragraphs of this article shall be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of articles 1 and 2.

4. Any Government which is not a signatory of the present agreement, other than the Government of any of the territories mentioned in article 3, may accede to it hereafter at any time. Such accession shall be effected by notification in writing to the French Government and shall take effect six months after the date of such notification. The French Government shall notify the contracting Governments and the International Office of Public Health of each accession and of the date of the notification.

5. The present agreement may be denounced by any Contracting Government at any time after the expiration of five years from this day. Denunciation shall be effected by means of a notification in writing to the French Government and shall take effect six months after the date of notification.

The French Government shall immediately notify the Contracting Governments and the International Office of Public Health of any denunciations received and of the date of each denunciation.

6. The present agreement shall not prevent any of the Contracting Governments from concluding separate agreements among themselves or with non-contracting countries for dispensing with bills of health. Every such agreement shall be deposited with the French Government, which shall inform the International Office of Public Health and the Governments parties to the present agreement.

Agreement for Dispensing with Consular Visas on Bills of Health.

The under-mentioned Governments desiring, in accordance with the spirit of article 49 (4) and of article 57 of the International Sanitary Convention, signed at Paris on the 21st June, 1926, to reduce as far as possible the formalities to which merchant vessels are subject, the undersigned, provided with full powers found in good and due form, have agreed to the following provisions :—

1. Each of the Contracting Governments undertakes not to require in the ports of its metropolitan territory that the bills of health of vessels registered in the metropolitan territories of the other Contracting Governments, from whatever place arriving, shall bear visas issued by its consular officers.

2. Each of the Contracting Governments undertakes not to require such vessels on calling at its ports to produce any

documents such as a consular bill of health or any other kind of certificate or to comply with formalities which would render ineffective the exemption provided for in article 1.

3.—(a) Each of the Contracting Governments at the time of signing or acceding to this agreement may declare that it intends to make it applicable to all or to any of its colonies, overseas territories, protectorates or territories under its suzerainty or mandate.

(b) It shall likewise have the right subsequently to accede to this agreement in respect of all or part of its colonies, overseas territories, protectorates or territories under its suzerainty or mandate by notifying the French Government in writing. In this case the accession shall take effect six months after the date of such notification.

(c) At any time after the expiration of the period of five years mentioned in article 5 any Contracting Government may, by a notification in writing to the French Government, declare that this agreement shall cease to apply to all or to any of its colonies, overseas territories, protectorates or territories under its suzerainty or mandate, to which it has been extended under the terms of the foregoing paragraphs. Such declaration shall take effect six months after the said notification.

(d) The French Government shall immediately inform the Contracting Governments and the International Office of Public Health of any notifications which it may receive under the provisions of the two preceding paragraphs, indicating at the same time the date of each notification.

(e) Vessels registered in any territory to which this agreement is applicable under the previous paragraphs of this article shall be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of articles 1 and 2.

4. Any Government which is not a signatory of the present agreement, other than the Government of any of the territories mentioned in article 3, may accede to it hereafter at any time. Such accession shall be effected by notification in writing to the French Government and shall take effect six months after the date of such notification. The French Government shall notify the Contracting Governments and the International Office of Public Health of each accession and of the date of the notification.

5. The present agreement may be denounced by any Contracting Government at any time after the expiration of five years from this day. Denunciation shall be effected by means of a notification in writing to the French Government and shall take effect six months after the date of notification.

6. The French Government shall immediately notify the Contracting Governments and the International Office of Public Health of any denunciations received and of the date of each denunciation.

The present agreement shall not prevent any of the Contracting Governments from concluding separate agreements among themselves or with non-contracting countries for dispensing with consular visas on bills of health. Every such agreement shall be deposited with the French Government, which shall inform the International Office of Public Health and the Governments parties to the present agreement.

THE PETROLEUM ORDINANCE.

RULES made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 13 of the Petroleum Ordinance (Chapter 141).

RULES.

1. The Petroleum Service Station Rules, 1937, published in *Gazette* No. 8,275 of March 5, 1937, as amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,316 of September 17, 1937, are hereby further amended as follows:—

- (1) in rule 2 thereof, by the substitution, in the definition of "service station", for the words "the storage of any quantity of dangerous petroleum not exceeding 2,000 gallons at any one time", of the words "the storage of dangerous petroleum";
- (2) by the addition, immediately after rule 2 of the following new rule 2A:—

"2A. (1) The maximum quantity of dangerous petroleum which may be stored or possessed at any one time at a service station shall be determined by reference to the number of measuring tanks installed in that station, allowing in respect of each such measuring tank a quantity of dangerous petroleum of 2,000 gallons.

(2) No licensee of a service station shall store or possess dangerous petroleum in that station in excess of the maximum quantity determined for that station in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1).

(3) In this rule "measuring tank" means a measuring tank or measuring pump installed in compliance with condition 3 of the Second Schedule hereto."

- (3) in rule 9 thereof, by the addition at the end thereof of the following:—

Where the quantity to be possessed at any one time exceeds 2,000 gallons, Rs. 15 for the first 2,000 gallons and Rs. 15 for each additional quantity of 2,000 gallons, any quantity not exceeding 2,000 gallons being reckoned as 2,000 gallons."

- (4) by the substitution, for rule 11 of the following new rule:—

"11. Every licence to possess dangerous petroleum in a service station shall be deemed for all purposes to authorize the holder of that licence to possess a quantity of non-dangerous petroleum in such service station without any further licence in that behalf: Provided that the total quantity of dangerous and non-dangerous petroleum possessed in such service station does not exceed the quantity allowed by the licence."

- (5) in the First Schedule thereto, by the omission of the words and figures "in quantities not exceeding 2,000 gallons"; and
- (6) in the Second Schedule thereto, by the substitution, in condition 2 (b), for the expression "not exceeding 1,000 gallons", of the expression "not exceeding 2,000 gallons".

2. The Petroleum (Minor Installations and Transport) Rules, 1935, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,183 of December 18, 1935, as amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,275 of March 5, 1937, are hereby further amended in rule 1 (2) by the substitution, for paragraph (a) thereof of the following new paragraph:—

- (a) to the possession of dangerous petroleum in a service station as defined in the Petroleum Service Station Rules, 1937, or in any other rules for the time being in force relating to such station; or "

1. (1) No person shall establish or keep a slaughter-house within the village area except on an annual licence issued by the Chairman.

(2) No person shall slaughter cattle, goats, or sheep within the village area at any place other than a village slaughter-house or a slaughter-house authorized by a licence issued under paragraph (1).

2. No person shall slaughter any animal for human consumption unless it has previously been exposed for public view, for a period of not less than 24 hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter, at such public place within the village area as may have been set apart for that purpose.

3. No person shall slaughter any animal at any village slaughter-house except between 8 and 10 A.M. or between 2 and 4 P.M.

4. No person shall slaughter for human consumption any diseased animal.

5. No person shall slaughter any animal in the presence of any other animals or until the carcase of any animal previously slaughtered has been removed or screened off and the premises cleansed.

6. (1) A fee of Re. 1.50 shall be charged for every head of cattle, and a fee of 75 cents for every other animal slaughtered at any village slaughter-house.

(2) The fee referred to in paragraph (1) shall be paid before the animal is slaughtered, to the person authorized in that behalf by the Village Committee, and such person shall give a printed receipt for such payment.

7. The person in charge of a village slaughter-house shall enter or cause to be entered in a register to be kept by him all the necessary information regarding every animal slaughtered or to be slaughtered at such slaughter-house.

8. No person shall slaughter any animal at a village slaughter-house on the full moon day of any month.

9. The person in charge of any slaughter-house shall clean the slaughter-house daily and keep it at all times in a sanitary condition.

10. No person who is suffering or who has recently suffered from any contagious, cutaneous, or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall be permitted by the licensee or any person in charge of a licensed slaughter-house to enter such slaughter-house or to take part in the slaughtering of any animal until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

11. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer authorized by the Chairman in writing at all reasonable times to enter and inspect any slaughter-house, and the person in charge of such slaughter-house shall permit the Chairman or such officer to make such inspection, and shall render all such assistance therein as may be necessary.

12. It shall be lawful for the Village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice to offend of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to licensed slaughter-houses, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.

13. The rules published in *Gazette* No. 8,358 of March 11, 1938, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) Under the heading "4.—Private Galas, &c."—

(a) by the substitution for the words "market or slaughtering place," and for the words "market, slaughtering place" wherever those words occur under that heading, of the words "or market";

(b) by the omission therefrom of rule 2; and

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated April 28, 1939.

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 22, 1939, at 9 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated April 18, 1939.**

Present :—Mr. M. K. T. Sandys, Chairman, Mr. Geo. E. de Silva, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake, Mr. W. A. B. Soysa, Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail, Mr. W. Beven, Mr. M. A. S. Manikar, Dr. E. S. Godliob, Mr. O. T. Nettleton.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 18, 1939, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1938 to February, 1939, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for March, 1939.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of March, 1939.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending April 22, 1939.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes and house service taps inspected during March, 1939.

3A. (1) Mr. Nettleton inquired whether the improvements to the lake bund will be completed before the next Esala Perahera. The Works Engineer who was questioned stated that the contract provided for completion of the work before the Perahera.

(2) On a question raised by Mr. Soysa the Chairman explained that the delay in building the bathing place at Bahirawakande was due to the land having been claimed by a Buddhist Priest. Mr. Soysa undertook to see the priest and obtain his consent.

(3) On Mr. Beven's suggestion the Chairman undertook to inspect the site of the rickshaw stand near the United Services Library with a view to its removal if it was an impediment to other vehicular traffic.

(4) Mr. de Silva inquired whether experiments had been carried out in the transport of water from the Pumping Scheme at Peradeniya up to the Queen's Hotel junction and if so with what results.

The Chairman read the following statement :—The laying of the 8-in. main was only completed the day before yesterday (April 20th) and the Works Engineer at once tried certain interesting experiments to test its value in supplementing the main reservoir supply to the more central parts of the Town.

Yesterday morning at 10 A.M.—with the main reservoir supply shut off and the full supply from Peradeniya Reservoir along Peradeniya road still on—he brought the water along the 8-in. main as far as Halloluwa road junction and thence along the existing 6-in. and 9-in. mains up to the Queen's Hotel. He tested the pressure of water in the main near the Queen's Hotel and found it to be 40 lb. to the square inch, equivalent to a head of 92 feet of water. The supply was adequate.

Later he tried isolating the main by shutting down the various branches and found the pressure to be 70 lb. to the square inch, equivalent to a head of 160 feet of water.

The Works Engineer's conclusion is that water can be brought from the Peradeniya Reservoir up to the Queen's Hotel for distribution to the town, if such water is available in sufficient quantity at the source.

This would relieve the pressure on the main reservoir.

It is however difficult to say at this stage what the amount of water available per diem from this direction will be. The Works Engineer tells me that the Estimate of 40,000 gallons per day which I gave in my last letter dated November 16, 1938, as the surplus available in a dry period from the Peradeniya Pumping Scheme after the needs of the residents had been satisfied is inclined to be over-optimistic. After comments had been made by Mr. de Silva, Mr. Beven and Mr. Nettleton, the Chairman agreed to investigate the question of building another infiltration gallery.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Manikar presented—Petition from Mr. M. R. A. Pieris dated April 21, 1939, praying for the reopening of a path recently closed by St. Anthony's College.

The Chairman agreed to inquire into the matter.

5. Correspondence :—(A) Letter No. B. 1431 of April 4, 1939, from the Commissioner of Local Government, stating that the Executive Committee of Local Administration at its meeting held on March 28, 1939, considered the request of the Kandy Municipal Council for the revocation of Regulation 4 of the Regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, which permits motor buses to halt for 15 minutes in the Market Street Bus Stand, and decided that this matter should await the decision of the New Council.—Tabled.

(B) Endorsement from the Hon. the Minister for Local Administration forwarding a letter addressed to him by the Minister of Home Affairs on the subject of a motion proposed to be introduced by Mr. Geo. E. de Silva in the State Council suggesting the removal of the Bogambara Prison from its present site to a site out of town limits and handing over the site to the Municipal Council, for the views of the Council.

The Chairman explained the terms of the Government letter.

Resolved to reply that the Council approves of Mr. de Silva's proposal provided that no financial obligations regarding removal of the Prison are placed on this Council.

6. To sanction the draft agreement proposed to be entered into with contractor S. Arulappa for the supply of gravel.

Resolved that the draft be approved.

7. To sanction the draft agreement setting out the conditions on which the application of Messrs. P. S. Fernando & Bros. to demolish their existing building and to put up a new building in its place at premises Nos. 100 and 101, Colombo street, will be allowed.

Resolved that the draft be approved.

8. To approve of the draft agreement to be entered into with Mrs. Irene Dias permitting her to erect a barbed wire fence with posts along the boundary of premises Nos. 74A to F, Katukelle.

Resolved that the draft be approved.

9. To obtain sanction to the lease of small plot of land in Peradeniya for a night soil depot from the Department of Agriculture on a nominal rent of 25 cents per annum.

Resolved that the proposal be approved.

10. Estimate for Rs. 850 from Mr. T. H. Cox, Fire Brigade Officer, for providing a water tender for the fire service.

Resolved to refer to Works Committee for further consideration.

11. To obtain sanction for a supplementary vote of Rs. 30 required to meet the cost of hire, current and repairs of an electric fan proposed to be installed in the Municipal Court Clerk's office.

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

12. To obtain sanction to incur an expenditure of Rs. 210 on Est. 36 on the drainage of swamps and the improvement in the flow of existing streams in the catchment area for the purpose of securing a better water supply as suggested by Mr. Sargent, the Hony. Municipal Forester.

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

13. To obtain sanction for a supplementary vote of Rs. 500 for the erection of barriers on roads for traffic control purposes during the Perahera.

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

14. To obtain sanction for a vote of Rs. 600 required to meet the cost of transporting water by lorry and carts during the month of May, 1939.

Resolved that the vote be allowed, to be used only if necessary.

15. To sanction the Chairman's recommendation that the Municipal Forester be given authority to spend the whole of Rs. 2,000 in 1939, on the re-forestation of the Reservoir catchment.

Resolved that the proposal be sanctioned.

16. Memo from the Chairman stating that the Provincial Engineer has inspected the re-forestation work now being done and is in favour of carrying on with it to the extent of 3 or 4 thousand rupees this year, and asking for a further vote of Rs. 2,000 so as to enable the work to be done continuously during 1939.

Resolved that the vote be allowed.

17. (a) To consider revision of the salary scale of the Engineering Draughtsman of the Works Department, and
(b) To sanction the proposal to appoint Mr. Mendis temporarily to carry out the duties of draughtsman from April 24, until relieved by a permanent man.

(a) Resolved to drop the qualification of "Authorized Draughtsman" and to approve the re-advertisement of the post on the same scale, but with the commencing salary altered from Rs. 900 to Rs. 1,200, and

(b) to approve of Mr. Mendis' temporary appointment.

18. Chairman's memo dated March 22, 1939, on the subject of a Scheme he has formulated for the purpose of paying genuine unemployed or under-employed, who are fit to do an economic day's labour, a living wage.

Resolved that the Chairman's proposals be approved.

Mr. de Silva then remarked that the relief labourers outside the Municipal area were being paid a higher wage than the relief labourers in it, and the Chairman agreed to consider the possibility of raising their wages.

19. To obtain authority to take the necessary steps to demolish the ambalam at Getambe.

Resolved that demolition be sanctioned.

20. Letter from the Municipal Electrical Engineer applying for permission to erect a sub-station on the old dis-used latrine site at the junction of Lady MacCarthy's road and Malabar street in connection with the change over in system of supply along upper Malabar street.

The Chairman stated that he had asked Government for the adjoining land, and the papers would be submitted on receipt of a reply.

21. List of revotes required for the year 1939 of unexpended balances on votes for 1938.

The list of revotes annexed to Chairman's memo of April 19, 1939, was approved, except the item of Rs. 1,356.35 under head 19A "Maternity & Child Welfare", which is to be deleted. The item of Rs. 2,000 for construction of drain near Buddhist Girls' College is to remain.

22. (A) Papers on the question of supply of 20,000 gallons of water per diem from the Peradeniya wells to the Farm School and Experimental Station (which lie outside the Municipal limits) with memo from the Works Engineer dated February 9, 1939, suggesting the following conditions in the event of the Council granting the application:—

- (1) That the supply is metered and water is charged for at the rate of 50 cents per 1,000 gallons as suggested by Mr. Garment in his report of August 25, 1936, on page 3 of File W/PW 252. The meter rent of Rs. 35 per quarter for a 3-in. meter must also be paid by them.
- (2) That not more than 10,000 gallons is drawn from our mains on any one day.
- (3) That the supply from our main is taken through a 3-in. pipe line—laid at their expense—direct to a storage tank of at least 10,000 gallons capacity. This 3-in. pipe line is to be used only to supply the storage tank and it must not be tapped for connections at any point of its length.
- (4) The Council must not be held responsible for the maintenance of the 3-in. pipe line.
- (5) The Council to be at liberty to stop or restrict the supply owing to improvements or repairs to the head-works or distribution system during shortage of water.

Resolved to write and inquire whether 10,000 gallons would be sufficient. If not 20,000 gallons is recommended, subject to the Works Engineer's conditions.

Resolved that the proposal be approved subject to charges for water consumed being revised on the basis of cost and overhead charges, storage being limited to 9,000 gallons in 8 tanks and the daily consumption being limited to 10,000 gallons.

Don Fredrick in connection with way-leave on Lady Anderson's road.—Recommended. Rent Re. 1 per annum.

(12) Applications for water services to the following premises:—(a) Deyannawela 19 (row of tenements).—Recommended a metered supply by a stand pipe; (b) Hill street 15; (c) New bungalow under construction in the Vicarage premises, Malabar street; (d) Nittawela 25.—Recommended metered supply for domestic purposes.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on March 18, 1939.

(13) Estimate from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for Rs. 95 for installing an additional lamp standard in Hermitage road.—Recommended.

(14) Correspondence with Mr. D. T. Davendra on the subject of Re. 1 charged for disconnecting the service at his old bungalow on vacation, and a further Re. 1 charged for reconnecting the new bungalow which he occupied.—Recommended to charge Re. 1 for connecting only. Nothing for disconnecting.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Bogambara Grounds Committee held on April 17, 1939.

(15) Application from the Hockey League for a reduction in the charges for the use of Bogambara Grounds.—Recommended to reply that the minimum fee of Rs. 2·50 is now being charged and no further reduction can be made.

(16) Report from the Works Engineer dated January 23, 1939, stating that much damage is caused to the Bogambara Grounds as a result of allowing cars into the green and suggesting the erection of concrete posts at the two entrances in order to prevent them entering in.—Recommended to admit cars to the ground for regular games, matches, shootings, &c., but not for learning to drive or on occasions when the ground is specially soft owing to rain and liable to be damaged.

(17) Application from Mr. H. L. Ratwatte for Bogambara grounds for purposes of an exhibition in aid of Buddhist education for the period of the next Esala Perahera, and the papers connected with the suggestion of the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, that Market grounds be not allowed for perahera booths or entertainments in future. (a) Application recommended subject to arrangements being made to the satisfaction of the Council for the receipt of funds and their disposal in aid of Buddhist education in the Central Province as stated in Messrs. Ratwatte's and Mettananda's letter dated September 10, 1938; terms of lease to be considered after the applicants have communicated to the Council as to who will be responsible for the collection and administration of the funds. The area of Bogambara to be allotted should not exceed the area allowed for the Industries Pavilion and other shows during last year and should not encroach on the cricket pitch. (b) The suggestion of the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, to prohibit perahera booths in the market grounds is not recommended.

(18) Letter dated March 30, 1939, from Messrs. George Stewart & Co., Agents and Secretaries for Hantane estate, stating that they regret they are unable to give favourable consideration to the request made that they should donate or sell a piece of land forming part of the estate for the purpose of constructing a recreation ground.—Tabled. No action recommended *re* acquisition as Works Engineer points out that the available Municipal land across the stream is sufficient to construct a hockey field 90 by 50 yards. Works Engineer's proposal is recommended.

Resolution on item (17).

Resolved to defer consideration and to point out that the proposal contained in letter dated April 20, 1939, was different from the original application dated September 10, 1938, and whether the letter of April 20, 1939, should be regarded as a new application.

(24) To approve of the draft agreement proposed to be entered into with contractor R. A. G. Percra in respect of the supply of metal for 1939.

Resolved that the draft be approved.

Improvements in or relating to a process of and apparatus for fermenting of tea leaf and manufactured tea produced thereby.

Abstract.—

The inventor states that considerable saving in time can be effected if the fermentation of tea is carried out in an atmosphere rich in Oxygen. He accordingly claims the process and the apparatus for carrying this into effect. Rolled and sifted tea leaf is introduced into a polygonal cylinder which is caused to rotate on a shaft which is in effect a perforated pipe. Oxygen from a cylinder is led into this pipe *via* a mixing chamber where the oxygen may be also humidified by suitable means in dry weather. The cylinder is slowly rotated and the leaf is tumbled about (battens being provided to assist this process) in an atmosphere richly charged with oxygen. The exit valve may be partly closed so that fermentation is effected at a slight excess of pressure of about 5 lb. per square inch.

Two machines may be connected in series so as to economise oxygen consumption. The machines may be placed in the rolling room so that rolling is also effected in an atmosphere which is rich in oxygen.

Ludwig Paul Brandts Buys

Tea Rolling Machine.

Abstract.—

In a tea rolling machine the provision of means whereby the cover may partake of the undulating and rotating movement of the tea in the container, thus being effected by means of a suitable bearing interposed between the spindle and the cover. As the cover is free to rotate inside the container, means have to be provided to prevent the screwed spindle from rotating. This is effected by means of a cross bar rigidly fixed to the spindle, whose ends are free to slide along suitable guide bars.

Pressure is applied in the normal manner by a screwed nut working on the spindle in conjunction with a spring.

The inventor states that this construction of a rolling machine prevents flattening and tearing of the leaf and keeps the temperature down.

Process for the manufacture of quinoline compounds.

Abstract.—

The invention relates to the manufacture of quinoline compounds which consists in introducing a basic radicle into the amino group of 4-amino quinolines which contain at least a further substituent (preferably a halogen atom) in the 7 position by condensation with basic alcohols or by the action of their esters. The new compounds may also be obtained by the interaction of basically substituted primary or secondary amine with 7-substituted quinoline derivatives having in the 4 position a replaceable substituent; this reaction may be facilitated by the addition of substances such as phenols, iodides, copper powder, &c. The introduction of the basic radicle may be performed in steps.

The inventor states that the new compounds are particularly efficient against the asexual form of the malarial parasite.

CHAPTER I.—GENERAL.

1. (1) *Under section 193 any person making or authorizing the making of an illegal payment, or by negligence or misconduct causing any deficiency or loss to the Council, or failing to bring to account any sum which ought to have been brought to account is liable to be personally surcharged the amount of the loss. This applies to the Chairman, members, and all the officers of the Council; and in case of any such loss it becomes a question of fact as to who was responsible for the loss in question.*

(2) *Under section 16 (3) the Chairman of a District Council is the Executive Officer of the Council and as such he is responsible for—*

- (a) *seeking from the Council all the decisions necessary for carrying out the duties and responsibilities cast on the Council by law ;*
- (b) *giving prompt effect to those decisions ;*
- (c) *discharging all duties and responsibilities cast on him as Chairman by law ;*
- (d) *controlling the staff of the Council, allocating to them their duties, and ensuring that those duties are promptly and accurately performed.*

(3) *The Chairman of a District Council is personally and pecuniarily responsible for the proper collection, custody and disbursement of the local fund, and for the due performance of the financial duties of the Council's officers. He should therefore exercise such control over the staff as will ensure the prompt and accurate performance of their duties, and should take, or request the Council to take, such disciplinary action as may be found necessary to effect this.*

2 The Chairman is the accounting officer of a District Council and, subject to these rules and orders and to such instructions as may be issued by the Local Government Board, the financial and accounting operations of a District Council are under his general management and supervision

3. It is the duty of the Chairman—

The duties of the
Chairman

- (1) to see that the proper system of account is established in every department of the Council ;
- (2) to keep watch on the receipts of the Council's revenue and to secure its punctual collection ;
- (3) *To see that all moneys, whether revenue or other receipts, paid into the local fund, are promptly brought to account under the proper heads and sub-heads.*
- (4) to see that proper provision is made for the safe keeping of all moneys ;
- (5) to exercise strict supervision over all the officers of the Council entrusted with the receipt or expenditure of the Council's money, and to take precautions, by the maintenance of efficient checks, against the occurrence of fraud, embezzlement, or carelessness in connection therewith ;
- (6) to watch the expenditure and disbursements of the Council ; to take care that no payment is made which is not covered by proper authority, expressed or referred to in the voucher relating to it, and
- (7) *To see that all disbursements of the Council are promptly charged in the accounts under the proper heads and sub-heads of estimates ; that the financial statements and returns are promptly prepared ; and that the accounts are promptly rendered for audit*

4 The Local Government Board may, by an authorized officer, make surprise inspections of the accounts of any District Council. Such officer is entitled at all times to have access to all books, records and vouchers in the charge of the Chairman and the Council's officers Section 208.

Inspect on by

5. The Auditor-General and his officers are at all times entitled to have access to all books, records and returns relating to accounts. All officers of District Councils shall give them every facility for inspecting such documents and answer all questions put to them. Section 192.

Audit.

6. It is the duty of the Chairman promptly to reply to queries addressed to him by the Auditor-General, giving fully the particulars or information desired.

7 The Vice-Chairman of a District Council may be authorized in writing by the Chairman to perform any of the duties which under these rules are required of the Chairman. Section 17.

The estimates of expenditure shall, as far as possible, be framed to show the amounts which it is expected will be spent during the year.

10. The heads and sub-heads of revenue and expenditure as appearing in F. R. 9 shall be adhered to. When it becomes necessary to open a new head or sub-head of revenue or expenditure the prior authority of the Local Government Board shall always be obtained. A new item, however, which comes within the scope of an existing head or sub-head may be inserted without such authority.

Heads and sub-heads of revenue and expenditure.

11. A certified copy of the budget shall be sent to the Local Government Board and to the Auditor-General before the beginning of the year to which it relates.

12. (i.) When the budget has been passed by the Council the expenditure of the year must be held to be limited and arranged. Where any further disbursements on account of any service for that year are required, which could not have been foreseen and cannot be postponed without detriment to the interests of the ratepayers, the Chairman shall at the earliest opportunity and before the expenditure is incurred submit to the Council a supplementary estimate of the expenditure so required and obtain a vote for the amount. Section 190.

Supplementary Votes.

(ii.) Whenever such expenditure or expenditure in excess of the amount already provided under an item can be met from savings on another item, recourse shall be had to such savings. In either case a resolution of the Council is necessary for the additional vote.

13. The number and date of the resolution of the Council approving the budget or supplementary vote, as the case may be, shall be quoted on the vouchers as the authority for the expenditure.

Authority for expenditure.

CHAPTER III.—RECEIPTS.

1.—Receipt and Licence Forms.

14. The standard form of receipt (form L. G. B. 1) shall be used in all cases in which no special form has been authorized. An indelible pencil shall be used for filling in the form and for signature. The form shall be in triplicate, carbon paper being used for obtaining the duplicate and triplicate copies.

Form of receipt.

15. For the various licences issued under any Ordinance or under any by-law of the Council, and for the recovery of any Vehicles and Animals Tax or any Motor Car Licence Duty, the forms to be used shall be those referred to in the rules relating to such revenue. The forms shall be in triplicate. Revenue under these heads shall be collected in cash.

Form of licences.

16. The necessary supply of receipt and licence books shall be obtained sufficiently in advance of requirements. All the leaves shall be machine numbered consecutively.

17. The books when received shall be entered in a register of counterfoiled books in form L. G. B. 50, separate folios being used for each kind of books.

Register of counterfoiled books.
Chairman's signature.

18. The licence books shall be impressed with a rubber stamp signature of the Chairman before they are issued for use.

19. All the counterfoiled books shall be in the charge of the Secretary. He shall be personally responsible for their custody and proper use. The used books shall be preserved for at least two years after they have been passed by an Audit Examiner.

Custody of counterfoiled books.

2.—Revenue, &c., Collection and Disposal of.

20. Any person paying money to the Council shall in the first instance be dealt with by the Revenue Clerk. After verifying the correctness of the amount to be paid by reference to the respective register and recording the receipt therein the Revenue Clerk shall write out the receipt (or licence form) applicable thereto and send the original and duplicate to the Cashier, at the same time instructing the person to pay the money to the Cashier. The triplicate copy shall be left in the book.

Cash, paying in.

21. The Cashier on receiving the money shall sign the receipt or licence, using a carbon paper for the duplicate, stamp it with the office date stamp and hand the original to the payer. The Cashier shall retain the duplicate in support of the entry in the Cash Book.

The Cashier.

22. In the case of remittances by post the officer opening the tappal shall enter the particulars of the remittances in a register in form L. G. B. 2, hand the remittances to the Cashier obtaining his initials against each item, and then pass the register and the letters accompanying the remittances to the Revenue Clerk in order that he may issue receipts (or licence forms) to the Cashier.

Remittances by post.

23. The Cashier shall complete the receipts or licence forms and despatch them to the senders.

24. The date of credit of the remittances entered daily in the Register of Cheques, &c., shall be marked by the Cashier. The entries shall be initialled by the Secretary in column 12 in token of their correctness.

25. The receipt must contain a sufficient description of the amounts paid in and the Head, Sub-head and item of Revenue or other account to which the sum is to be credited.

Receipts, particulars of

26. The receipts representing recoveries of erroneous payments in respect of voted expenditure of a previous year shall be credited to Revenue under Head A. 13.

27. Receipts representing recoveries of erroneous payments made from voted expenditure of the current year shall be credited to the votes concerned. The receipt form shall be headed "Overpayments Recovered Account", with the Heads and Sub-heads shown thereunder. For example, where the sum represents recovery of overpayment of office rent the receipt form shall be—

"Overpayments Recovered A/C."

3.—Local Fund.

- Local Fund. 28. The Local Fund shall be lodged in the name of the Council at the Kachcheri and/or one or more banks to be selected by the Council.
- Signature on Cheques. 28A. All cheques drawn against the Council's bank accounts shall be signed by two officers of the Council, namely, the Chairman or the Vice-Chairman and the Secretary or the Chief Clerk.
- 28B. Four specimens of the signatures of the officers authorized to sign cheques shall be sent to each bank at which the Council has an account. This rule applies also to acting officers.
- Daily collections. 29. Cash transactions shall commence punctually at 9 A.M. and close at 3 P.M. daily (on Saturdays at 1 P.M.), unless other hours are fixed by resolution of the Council.
- Cheques, acceptance of. 30. The total collections shall be lodged at the Kachcheri and/or bank daily—no payments being made therefrom in any circumstances unless approved by the Council.
31. Cheques may be accepted instead of cash provided reasonable precautions are taken to safeguard the interests of the Council.
- Dishonoured cheques. 32. Where a cheque is dishonoured the person from whom it was accepted shall be asked for an explanation. If the explanation offered is unsatisfactory the Chairman may order that cheques should not thereafter be accepted from that person.
33. The amount of the dishonoured cheque shall be debited to Advances—Dishonoured Cheques, and steps shall immediately be taken to recover the amount. When the amount is recovered it shall be credited to Advances and not to Revenue or other Account to which it was originally credited.

4.—Assessment Tax.

- Assessment Register. 34. An Assessment Book in form L. G. B. 3 shall be kept of all houses and lands on account of which assessment tax is payable. The first six columns thereof form the assessors' list, the sixth column shall be totalled. The dates of payment shall be posted by the Assessment Clerk as directed in F. R. 42.
- Assessment Ledger. 35. An Assessment Ledger shall be kept in form L. G. B. 4. The amount of the tax due quarterly according to the figure in the Assessment Book shall be posted in the Assessment Ledger—a separate account being opened for each ward.
- Receipts. 36. Receipts in form L. G. B. 5 with carbon duplicates shall be prepared (*i.e.*, with all details inserted) and issued for each quarter to the collectors about fifteen days before the tax for that quarter falls due. Each receipt must bear the stamped signature of the Chairman. The receipts shall be checked with the Assessment Book before being issued.
37. No blank receipts shall be issued to collectors.
- Collector. 38. The collector shall date and initial with an indelible pencil each receipt at the time he receives the money, using a carbon paper for the duplicate.
39. The collector shall attend the office weekly on an appointed day to pay in his collections. He shall bring all the receipt books, and produce a schedule of the amount collected in form L. G. B. 6. The schedule shall be totalled, signed and dated by the collector.
40. The collector shall hand the receipt books with the schedule to the Assessment Clerk.
41. The Assessment Clerk shall after checking the total of the schedule, issue to the collector a receipt in form L. G. B. 1; the latter shall then pay the money to the Cashier and obtain his receipt for the amount.
42. The Assessment Clerk shall thereupon post in the Assessment Book the date of payment against the items corresponding to those appearing in the collectors' schedule checking at the same time the correctness of the amounts recovered.
- Checking the unpaid amounts. 43. The Assessment Clerk shall at least every other week check completely the unpaid items in the Assessment Book with the receipt books to see that the relative receipts have not been issued by the collector. He shall see that the counterfoils of receipts issued bear the collector's initial and date. Any irregularity or discrepancy noticed shall at once be brought to the notice of the Secretary and the Chairman.
44. After ascertaining that the collector has duly deposited the amount for which the receipt form was issued the Assessment Clerk shall post the amount in the Assessment Ledger.
- Return of Receipt Books. 45. On January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1, or the first working day thereafter, that is on the day following the date on which each quarter's tax falls due, unless the Chairman otherwise directs, the collectors shall return to the office all the receipt books in their hands with the final balance of their collections.
- Distraining. 46. The Assessment Clerk shall then compare the remaining receipts with the outstanding items in the Assessment Book. He shall then prepare a list of defaulters and a distress warrant for the signature of the Chairman. The details in the list shall be carefully checked by the Secretary. The distress warrant shall be given at the earliest possible moment with the list and receipts to the distraining officer with precise instructions as to the warrant costs he should collect under section 138 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, and as to the date by which he must deposit his collections and report his seizures. The 10 per cent. warrant costs shall be entered in red ink on the receipts by the Assessment Clerk before he delivers them to the distraining officer.
- 46A. No charge shall be made for seizure and removal of goods unless such goods are actually removed to and placed in a place approved by the Council for the purpose.
- 46B. Charges for seizure and removal, for keeping in safe custody by a distraining officer, or for keeping a person in possession, shall be recovered by the distraining officer who shall issue a receipt therefor from a blank book in a simple form in duplicate showing the number and the situation of the premises and the amount recovered. The distraining officer may retain these moneys but shall produce his receipt book to be checked with the warrant when he returns the warrant completed.
- 46C. Charges for keeping in safe custody in a store provided by the Council shall be paid at the office and a receipt in form L. G. B. 1 shall be issued.

47. Money collected by the distraining officer shall be deposited and brought to account in the same manner as that prescribed for collectors. Distraining officer.

48. When the distraining officer has taken action he shall return the list with any receipts unissued noting on the list the result of his action in respect thereof.

49. Collectors shall not be appointed distraining officers if that course can be avoided.

50. A separate file shall be maintained by the Assessment Clerk for each collector's area containing the collector's schedules of payments, distress warrants and lists of defaulters, the distraining officer's schedules of payments, lists of property advertised and sold for default and any special instructions to the collector or distraining officer.

51. Collectors' claims for commission shall be checked with the recoveries according to the Assessment Ledger and a note made in the Ledger against the items on which payment of commission is authorized. Commission to collector.

52. No commission shall be paid to the collector or distraining officer until each quarter's accounts have been settled.

53. Each collector and distraining officer shall give security for the due performance of his duties in such manner as the Chairman shall prescribe. Security.

54. A record shall be kept in the register of counterfoiled books of all tax receipt books received from the printer. Blank tax receipt books shall be kept under lock and key. Temporary receipts shall be taken from the clerks to whom the books are issued for filling in prior to issue to the collectors and after issue to the collectors their receipt shall be taken in the register. Assessment Tax receipt books.

54A. The following programme gives appropriate dates for the assessment and recovery of property rates :—

5.—*Conservancy Fees.*

55. A register of all premises conserved shall be kept by the Revenue Clerk in form L. G. B. 7.

56. The supervising Inspector shall furnish a monthly list to the clerk in charge by the 5th of each month showing the variation in the service, if any, for the previous month. Where no change has occurred a nil return shall be furnished. The list shall be filed of record. Variation in service.

57. The clerk shall, in the case of vacant premises, note the letter "v" in the column for the month for which the report is made and alter the other columns in accordance with the variations reported, noting the month against each alteration. The Secretary shall initial the alterations.

58. The procedure laid down for the collection of Assessment Tax shall be applied *mutatis mutandis* to the collection of Conservancy Fees if made by collectors.

59. The receipt to be used in the case of payment of Conservancy Fees shall be in form L. G. B. 8.

60. A Conservancy Ledger shall be kept on the same lines as the Assessment Ledger referred to in F. R. 35.

61. The amount due for each month shall be entered in the Ledger soon after the action mentioned in F. R. 57 has been taken.

6.—*Vehicles and Animals Tax and Dog Registration Fees.*

62. Schedules in form L. G. B. 9 shall be issued to every householder to be returned with all the information required therein before a certain date. Schedules.

63. The schedules shall be issued to all dwelling houses in the order in which they appear in the assessment list. Before the schedules are issued the number of the house and street and the ward shall be filled in and a serial number shall be given them in the order of issue.

64. When the schedules are returned to the office, they shall be filed in the order of the serial number. Care shall be taken to collect all the schedules. Return of schedules.

65. The information regarding vehicles and animals and dogs obtained by means of the schedule shall be transferred to a register in form L. G. B. 10.

66. The receipt to be used in the case of payment of the Vehicles and Animals Tax shall be in form L. G. B. 11.

67. Every certificate of registration of a dog shall be in form L. G. B. 12.

68. The procedure laid down for the collection of Assessment Tax shall be applied *mutatis mutandis* to the collection of Vehicles and Animals Tax and Dog Registration fees if made by Collectors.
69. When the tax or fees are paid the Revenue Clerk shall make a note to that effect in the register, quoting the Cash Book number and date of the receipt.
- Prosecution. 70. In the event of non-payment before the due date action shall be taken as prescribed by law.
- Dog collars, muzzles and vehicle plates. 71. A record shall be kept of the receipt and issue of dog collars, muzzles and vehicle plates.
- Certificates of registration. 72. Certificates of registration of motor vehicles received from the Registrar of Motor Cars shall be filed consecutively and entered in a Register—*vide* Registrar of Motor Cars' Circular No. L. A. 18 of July 16, 1930.
73. The certificates issued to each Licensing Authority are numbered consecutively by the Registrar of Motor Cars. Any missing number shall therefore be called for from him.
- Motor Vehicles Register. 74. The necessary entries shall be made at once in the Motor Vehicle Register and in the Index as well—*vide* F. R. 78. The entries shall be checked and initialled by the Secretary.
- Licence forms. 75. The licence forms for cars, cabs, omnibuses, and lorries shall be obtained from the Government Printer. Each class of forms shall be machine-numbered consecutively and the total number of each class obtained shall be entered in the Register of counterfoiled books.
76. As licences are issued the number of the licence issued shall be noted in the application form. The unissued licences shall be kept in the custody of the Revenue Clerk.
77. All other forms connected with the issue of motor vehicle licences may be obtained from the Government Printer or ordered from private printers, but the forms must strictly conform to the design of the Registrar of Motor Cars.
78. A Motor Vehicle Register shall be kept in form L. G. B. 14. Provision shall be made for the record therein of the recovery of licence duty for not more than six years. Receipts for duty recovered shall be given in form L. G. B. 1.
- Recovery of duty. 79. The recovery of licence duty shall be in the manner laid down in F. R. 20 and 21 ; the Cashier however after signing the receipt shall not hand over the original to the payer, but send it back to the Revenue Clerk. The latter shall thereupon fill up the correct licence form and submit it together with the Motor Vehicle Register and the original receipt for the signature of the Chairman. The Secretary may sign the licence if authorized by the Chairman.
80. The licence and the original of the receipt shall then be handed to the licensee.
- Bills to be sent out. 81. Bills shall be sent out not later than the second week of October each year to every Motor Vehicle owner who is liable according to the Register to pay duty for the ensuing year calling upon him to pay the duty before the last working day in December.
- Prosecution of defaulters. 82. Unless time is allowed by the Registrar of Motor Cars by public announcement steps shall be taken not later than January 31 each year to prosecute owners who have failed to pay licence duty.
- Application for licence duty on Government cars, &c. 83. Periodically, application shall be made to the Controller of Finance and Supply for the grant of the amount due to the Council in lieu of duty on licences for Government motor vehicles.

Instructions regarding Recovery of Licence Duties on Motor Cars.

Note.—

(a) On registration of new and transferred cars the Registrar of Motor Cars will furnish to the licensing authority a duplicate certificate of such registration bearing a separate consecutive number in respect of each licensing authority. On receipt of the certificate of registration the licensing authority will forthwith enter it in his register and file it in serial order or, where the loose leaf register or case system is adopted, make an entry in the record connecting the serial number of the certificate with the distinctive number of the car. On receipt of a certificate the serial number should be verified with the number of the last certificate received and the non-receipt of any certificate should be notified immediately to the Registrar of Motor Cars.

(b) Every year on October 15 a reminder should be sent to the registered owner that the licensing period for the ensuing year commences on November 1. A note should be added to the reminder that if the car is permanently unserviceable the owner should apply to the Registrar of Motor Cars to cancel the registration, or if the car is not to be used or is temporarily unserviceable, he should state the period of non-user to the Chairman, in terms of section 30 (2) of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 20 of 1927.

(c) The Chairman, not later than January 31, should cause the register to be examined and inquiries to be made to ascertain the present addresses of owners and the location of cars on which licence duty has not been paid. If necessary a progress return should be prepared for the purpose of controlling and expediting recoveries.

(d) The Chairman should open a file in respect of each car on which licence duty has not been paid. Instructions should be issued to the Revenue Inspector for inquiry, and a date should be given for the report of the officer concerned. If the licence duty is not paid by that date, a plaint in the standard form should be filed. Plaints against defaulters in respect of the licence duty payable on January 1, should be filed not later than March 31, whenever possible.

(e) In the case of permanently unserviceable cars the Chairman should direct the owner to apply to the Registrar of Motor Cars to cancel the registration. The Registrar of Motor Cars should communicate the result to the Chairman. Until this is done the Chairman should not remove the particulars of the car from his register.

(f) If the owner reports that the car is under repairs or that it will not be used, the Chairman should insist on the owner stating the period during which the car will not be used. If the owner does not state the period he cannot claim the benefit of section 30 (2) of the Ordinance and he should be prosecuted as a defaulter.

(g) The Secretary should inspect the register at frequent intervals to see that proper steps are being taken to recover licence duties. Final entries regarding every car should be checked

and initialled by the Chairman or Secretary. The supervising officer will be held responsible for the efficient recovery of licence duties.

(h) If a licensing authority to whom licence duty is tendered finds that the particulars in the application for licence differ from the certificate of registration, it should accept the licence duty, but before a licence is issued, should insist on the owner getting the certificate of registration amended by the Registrar of Motor Cars.

On the other hand, if the licence duty was due to another licensing authority the licensing authority who accepted the licence duty should remit it to the licensing authority concerned and direct the owner to apply to that licensing authority for a licence.

8.—*Cart Licences.*

84. On application for a licence the Revenue Clerk shall take the declaration of the applicant on the back of the book copy of the licence form and, in the case of a renewal of licence, see that the previous licence and cart-plate are returned.

85. A register shall be maintained in form L. G. B. 18.

86. The clerk shall examine the register at the end of March each year and prepare a list of defaulters in order that action may be taken against them, if necessary, after the reasons for non-renewal have been ascertained. Prosecutions shall be entered without delay.

87. A record shall be kept of the receipt and issue of cart-plates in connection with the issue of these licences.

88. The licence shall be in form L. G. B. 19.

89. After signing the licence the Cashier shall hand it over to the payer.

91. Licences for new carts shall not be issued after July 1 unless the carts have been inspected and passed by the Secretary.

92. Cart-plates shall be kept in the custody of the Cashier. The plates shall be issued together with the licences.

9.—*Miscellaneous Licences.*

93. After the issue of a licence has been duly approved the papers shall be passed to the Revenue Clerk. On the applicant presenting himself for the licence the procedure laid down in F. R.R. 20 and 21 shall be followed. The licence shall be in form L. G. B. 20.

94. Entries made in the licence registers—form L. G. B. 21—regarding non-renewal of licences shall be authenticated by the initials of the Secretary.

10.—*Rents.*

95. A rent ledger in form L. G. B. 31 shall be kept of all rents or leases of lands, premises, rights or privileges. The general rule in regard to paying in money shall be applicable to rents. The Revenue Clerk shall report to the Secretary or Chairman any cases of delay in payment.

96. Ordinarily, rents shall be sold by auction or by tender and the Revenue Clerk shall submit to the Secretary in due time a list of the rents for sale.

97. The sale shall be presided over by the Chairman or other officer deputed by him. The presiding officer shall enter in the sale list the names of the purchasers and the purchase amount at the time of the sale and on the conclusion of the sale sign the list.

98. Immediately after the sale the purchasers shall be required to sign the conditions of sale and make such deposit as the conditions require. A lease or agreement embodying the terms of the sale and providing for recovery of interest on delayed payments and also for cancellation of the lease in the event of default in payment of rent shall be entered into and steps shall be taken forthwith to prepare it and obtain the necessary signatures.

11.—*Revenue Items—Various.*

99. Receipt of miscellaneous items of Revenue, not specifically dealt with in these rules, such as Slaughter-house and Cattle Pound Fees, Cemetery Fees, Grazing Fees, Hire of Hearse, &c., if paid direct to the office shall be checked by the Revenue Clerk with the rates and conditions laid down in the connected by-laws and a receipt written out in the general form L. G. B. 1.

100. If however these items are collected by the Slaughter-house-keeper, Cemetery-keeper or other officer and receipts are issued by him in the first instance, he shall, when he pays in his collections to the office at stated intervals, produce a detailed schedule of collections with his receipt books. Counterfoiled receipt books with carbon duplicates shall be issued to the collectors.

101. The Revenue Clerk shall check the schedule with the counterfoils of receipts, initialling and dating the latter as he checks, before he writes out a receipt in favour of the payer.

102. The Revenue Clerk shall, verify the correctness of the amounts paid in by reference to independent records, e.g., the register of animals passed for slaughter by the Medical Officer of Health, register of burials, &c.

12.—*Refund of Stamp Duty.*

103. Application shall be made at the end of each quarter to the Controller of Finance and Supply for the refund of stamp duties and fees enumerated in Schedule VI. to the Local Government Ordinance.

13.—*Electricity Dues.*

104. The electricity clerk shall keep a ledger in form L. G. B. 35.

105. Meter readings shall be taken on cards or in a book with a page for each customer.

106. The meter reading cards or book shall be handed by the reader to the electricity clerk not later than the 5th of the month.

107. The clerk after checking the number of units shall transfer the units to the ledger. The clerk shall then prepare and despatch the bills in form L. G. B. 36.

108. Work undertaken for customers may be charged to a fixed scale, estimated cost or actual cost. Payment shall be made in advance.

Meter reading.

109. Fittings and sundries supplied with the charges therefor shall be notified by the Stores Clerk or Superintendent, Electricity Department, monthly to the electricity clerk in time for inclusion in the ledger before the monthly bills are prepared.
110. Other works shall be notified to the clerk when completed. The clerk shall enter the charge in the ledger and, if necessary, send a separate bill to the customer.
111. Where work other than maintenance is undertaken for customers estimates shall be prepared showing the cost of materials and labour.
112. A detailed estimate for each work undertaken shall be approved by the Chairman and for each sanctioned estimate a job-sheet in form L. G. B. 37 shall be opened.
113. Job-sheets shall be numbered consecutively.
114. The Superintendent, Electricity Department, shall write out issue orders in form L. G. B. 38 for all materials required.
115. The Stores Clerk shall issue the stores, obtain the receipt of the person authorized to remove the stores on the original of the issue order, retaining it in support of the entry in the Stock Book and return the duplicate to the Superintendent, Electricity Department. The latter shall file the duplicate in support of his job-sheet.
116. Unused stores shall be returned to the Store by the Superintendent, Electricity Department, with a "Returned to Store" note or receipt order in duplicate form L. G. B. 39.
117. The Stores Clerk shall take the stores into stock, receipt the original and duplicate, retain the former in support of his stock book entry and return the duplicate to the Superintendent Electricity Department. The latter shall see that it is receipted and file it in support of his job-sheet.
118. On completion of the work the Superintendent, Electricity Department, shall note in the job-sheet :—
- (a) The actual quantity of stores used giving reference to the Issue Orders and "Returned to Store" notes and insert the cost ;
 - (b) The details of labour employed on the work, hours worked, rate, giving reference to the check and distribution rolls ;
 - (c) The departmental charges.
- He shall then forward the job-sheet to the clerk concerned.
119. The clerk shall note the amount recoverable in column 6 of his ledger, prepare a bill giving such details as may be necessary, give reference to the number and date of the bill in the job-sheet and return the latter to the Superintendent, Electricity Department, for filing.
120. Where it is considered necessary to employ a collector to collect bills he shall be provided with a counterfoiled receipt book with carbon duplicates with all details inserted.
121. The collection shall be made and the amount deposited in the manner laid down for the collection of assessment tax.
122. A register shall be kept showing the total amount due each month as well as the daily recoveries.

CHAPTER IV.—PAYMENTS.

I.—Vouchers, Preparation of, &c.

123. All payments on account of voted services, advances, deposits or other accounts shall be supported by vouchers in the prescribed form prepared with accuracy and completeness.
124. The head, sub-head, and item of expenditure exactly as they appear in the Budget shall be shown on all vouchers for payment from votes.
125. On vouchers for other payments the account and subdivision of the account shall be stated, *e.g.*, a voucher for refund of security shall be headed "Deposits ; Sub-head, Security Deposits".
126. All vouchers shall be certified by the Chairman or, if so authorized by him, by the Vice-Chairman. Section 17.
127. The form of certificate printed on the voucher forms shall be carefully filled in, and where alternative words are prescribed the necessary alterations and deletions shall be made.
128. The resolution of the Council authorizing the expenditure shall invariably be quoted on the vouchers.
129. The voucher to be used for payment of wages at daily rates shall be in form L. G. B. 51 ; and for payment from votes or other accounts in form L. G. B. 52.
130. The officer responsible for the service shall prepare the voucher and after certifying pass it on to the Expenditure Clerk. The latter shall satisfy himself that the expenditure was duly authorized, check the calculations, and pass the voucher to the Cashier after obtaining the Chairman's signature thereto.
131. Vouchers must contain full particulars of the services, *e.g.*, dates, numbers, quantities, distances, rates, &c. ; the rates shall be in accordance with contract or agreement, or fair and reasonable ; and the head and sub-head of expenditure shall be correctly inserted.
132. The amount payable on every voucher shall be entered in words as well as figures. Care shall be taken not to leave space for fraudulent interpolations. The form for stating an account in words will be "Rupees ——— only", or "Rupees ——— and cents ———".
133. Fractional parts of cents shall be excluded from the gross amounts of vouchers for receipts or payments ; when the fraction exceeds a half cent it shall be reckoned as one cent ; when it is a half cent or less it shall be excluded from the accounts.
134. No erasures must appear in any vouchers or accounts. Any necessary corrections shall be made by striking out the figures to be altered with a single line in red ink and writing the correct figures in red ink above, such alterations being attested by the initials of the officer responsible. When an alteration occurs in the amount expressed to be recovered on a voucher the initials of the recipient shall be written against such alteration.

135. Under-receipts or sub-vouchers shall be furnished with vouchers for sums paid to officers of the Council for disbursement to parties to whom the sums are due. Under-receipts.
136. Vouchers in support of payments to Government Departments or other Local Authorities shall be supported by machine-numbered receipts from the Departments or authority concerned.
137. Payments representing refund of revenue of a previous year shall be charged to "Expenditure, Head A. 3". Refund vouchers.
138. Payments representing refund of revenue of the current year shall be debited to the connected Head of Revenue. The voucher shall be headed "Revenue Refunded Account". For example, the voucher for the refund of a sum over-recovered on account of Vehicles and Animals Tax shall be headed—Revenue Refunded Account. A.—General Revenue—
- 3. Vehicles and Animals Tax.**
139. Vouchers for telegrams shall be supported by receipts and the substance of the messages shall be stated therein. Telegrams.
140. Vouchers for advertisements shall be supported by newspaper cuttings of such advertisements. Advertisements.
141. Where discount is allowed on purchases made payments shall be made in time to obtain such discounts. Failure to do so will render an officer liable to be surcharged in the amount. Discount.
142. Where supplies are furnished or work done under agreement or contract, there shall be attached to the voucher a certificate that the payments are in accordance with the terms of the contract or agreement and, in the case of work, that it has been properly done. Payments under contract.
143. Where final payment or payment of "detention money" (which represents a percentage deduction from the estimated value of work done) is made a certificate of the officer in charge of the work that the work has been completed and is in good order and condition shall be furnished. Detention money.
144. Advances for works shall as far as possible be avoided. Payment shall be made only in respect of works actually done or, when such concession is allowed, for half the value of the materials actually delivered at the site at the time of the payment, less any amount that may be due from the contractor. In no case shall payment for work executed or materials supplied be made until the quantity executed or delivered has been measured or otherwise ascertained. Advance.
145. All vouchers for payment for stores shall be supported by a certificate that the articles have been received and brought on charge in the proper Inventory or Stock Book. Stores, vouchers for purchase of.
146. Only one copy of any pay abstract, voucher or other document authorizing payment shall be signed by the Chairman; if additional copies are required the word "duplicate" shall be written across the face of the voucher so that payment cannot be obtained on it.

2.—Leave and Travelling.

147. Leave shall be granted and travelling expenses shall be paid in accordance with the regulations of the Government, subject to any by-laws or regulations that the Council may make. Travelling.

3.—Salaries, Allowances, Pensions, &c.

148. Salaries, allowances, pensions and other monthly emoluments are not payable before the last working day in the month. Advance of salary shall in no case be made by the Chairman. Advance on account of salary.
149. The Expenditure Clerk shall keep in form L. G. B. 53 a register in which he shall record, under each department of the Council, the names of all the officers, servants, &c., who are in receipt of monthly emoluments, showing fully the particulars of the rates of salary, &c. Any variations in the rates, &c., shall be promptly entered therein. This register is a complete record of all the persons in the fixed employ of the Council and shall therefore be kept up-to-date. Personal Emoluments Register.
150. Towards the end of each month the Expenditure Clerk shall prepare from the register referred to in F. R. 149 a paysheet in form L. G. B. 54 and, after satisfying himself as to the correctness of the amounts shown therein, obtain the Chairman's signature thereto. Payment of salaries.
151. Where salaries or allowances are shown in the paysheet for the first time a copy of the resolution of the Council sanctioning the appointment and the rate of salary or allowance shall be attached to the paysheet. A copy of the covering authority of the Local Government Board, wherever it is necessary, shall also be furnished. Authority for first payment of salary.
152. Salaries for broken periods shall be computed with reference to the number of days in the month. Unpayable fractions of cents in monthly salaries shall be multiplied by twelve and included in the salary for December. They shall be omitted from the salary for other months. Broken periods.
153. Where increments are paid a certificate by the Chairman that the officers concerned have discharged their duties satisfactorily shall be attached to the paysheet. The date from which the increment took effect shall be noted in the paysheet. Increment certificate.
154. A declaration in form L. G. B. 81 shall be furnished by each officer in receipt of rent allowance. Such declaration shall be attached to the voucher or paysheet in support of—
 (a) the first payment of rent allowance to any officer;
 (b) vacation of Urban District Council quarters;
 (c) any change in the rate of rent allowance paid to an officer; and
 (d) every payment of rent allowance in the first month of each year with refunds
155. Officers in receipt of fixed transport allowances shall certify on concerned—her that the means of transport for which the allowance is granted has been kept an officer
 on leave whose duties are performed by a substitute shall not be paid the vance
 unless the means of transport is placed at the disposal of the substitute.

4.—Vote Ledger.

- Vote Ledger. 156. All vouchers for payment from votes shall be entered in a Vote Ledger in form L. G. B. 55 before the Chairman's signature is obtained.
157. The Vote Ledger shall be kept carefully written up in order that the expenditure on each vote may be watched. Before monthly accounts are sent to the Auditor-General the total expenditure under each vote as appearing in the Statement of Expenditure shall be compared with the Vote Ledger in order to ensure that the expenditure according to the Monthly Statement is in agreement with that according to the Vote Ledger.
- Credit to Votes. 158. A credit to a vote shall be recorded in red ink and the total expenditure under the vote reduced by the amount.

5.—Payment Orders.

159. All payments above Rs. 10 shall be by cheque or payment order on the Kachcheri.
- Payment order, mode of issuing. 160. When the Cashier receives a voucher duly signed by the Chairman he shall take reasonable steps to identify the payee, obtain his signature and that of two witnesses on the voucher, thereafter write a cheque or payment order as the case may be, obtain the Chairman's signature and then hand over the cheque or payment order to the payee. He shall also stamp the voucher with a rubber stamp marked "Paid" and insert the date of payment below. This course is necessary to prevent vouchers from being presented a second time for payment.
- Imprests. 161. At stations where there is no Kachcheri the Cashier shall be given an imprest (the amount of which is to be determined by the Chairman) from which he shall make payments. The imprest shall be renewed as often as necessary—*vide* F. R.R. 163-167.

6.—Cashier's Imprest.

- Petty Cash Imprest. 162. For the payment of vouchers for amounts below Rs. 10 the Cashier may be given an imprest of Rs. 100. The amount shall not be shown as a payment in the Cash Book. It shall form part of the cash balance and shall be shown as such in the monthly reconciliation in the Cash Book.
163. The Cashier shall keep an imprest ledger in which he shall enter the receipts and payments on account of the imprest.
164. When payments made amount to about the full amount of the imprest the Cashier shall schedule the vouchers and issue himself a payment order for the amount.
- Imprest to be renewed monthly. 165. The imprest shall be replenished as often as necessary but at least once a month in order that payments made from imprest in a month may be brought to account in the Cash Book in that month. Otherwise the total expenditure according to the monthly statement will not agree with that according to the Vote Ledger.
- Secretary to check imprest. 166. The imprest of the Cashier shall be checked by the Secretary at frequent but irregular intervals.
- Petty Cash imprest in office safe. 167. The imprest together with any other money belonging to the Council shall be kept in the office safe. Private money shall in no circumstances be kept in the office safe.

CHAPTER V.—ADVANCES.

- Advances Ledger. 168. An Advance Ledger shall be kept in form L. G. B. 61. Separate folios shall be used to record personal advances made to officers.
- Authority. 169. Reference to the authority under which the advance has been given, the terms of repayment and any other particulars shall be noted on the folio.
- Interest. 170. *An officer who has been confirmed in his appointment and who is required by the nature of his duties to maintain a conveyance may be allowed, with the approval of the Council, an advance for the purchase of such conveyance on the terms and conditions prescribed in the Financial Regulations of the Government, subject to any by-laws that the Council may make. The bond and the agreement required to be signed in connection with such advance shall be in Forms L. G. B. 85 and L. G. B. 86, respectively.*
171. Recoveries shall be posted in the ledger on the day on which they are made.
- Monthly balancing of ledger. 172. The ledger shall be totalled and balanced monthly; the balance shall be abstracted and agreed with the balance of the main ledger account.
- Default in repayment of advance. 173. Any failure to repay an advance or instalment of an advance at the due date shall be brought to the notice of the Chairman through the Secretary.

CHAPTER VI.—DEPOSITS.

- Deposit Ledger. 174. A ledger shall be kept in form L. G. B. 62 in which all receipts and payments of deposits shall be entered.
- Receipts. 175. The receipts shall be posted in the ledger daily after the Cash Book has been written up.
- Sub-Accounts. 176. A separate account shall be opened for each class of deposits, *e.g.*, Security for Rents, Contracts, &c., Tender Form deposits, Security of the officers of the Council, &c. The ledger shall be totalled and balanced monthly and the total of the balances agreed with the balance of the main ledger account.
- Payments from deposits. 177. For payments from deposits the clerk in charge shall prepare a voucher in form L. G. B. 52, enter the amount in the ledger, mark the date of repayment against the deposit entry and obtain the Chairman's signature. The voucher shall then be handed to the payee with instructions to present it to the Cashier for payment.

178. At the end of each year a detailed statement shall be prepared of the various amounts in deposit under each sub-account and the total agreed with the balance according to the main ledger. This statement shall be posted on the inside of the cover of the ledger in order that the date of repayment may be marked on it instead of in the ledgers of previous years.

CHAPTER VII.—ACCOUNTING.

1.—Cash Book.

179. No person other than the Cashier shall be permitted to receive or pay money.
180. The Cashier shall not receive money from any person without a receipt form or licence form issued by the Revenue Clerk.
181. The Cashier shall keep a Cash Book in form L. G. B. 63.
182. Every entry on the receipt side of the Cash Book shall be supported by the duplicate copy of the receipt or licence forms—*vide* F. R. 21 ; and every entry on the payment side by a completed payment voucher.
183. The entries shall be numbered consecutively beginning from the first day of each month.
184. The Cash Book numbers shall be entered on the receipt forms, licence forms and payment vouchers.
185. The particulars of receipts and payments entered in the Cash Book shall be a brief but sufficiently clear description of the transactions.
186. In the columns headed " Bank " and " Kachcheri " shall be entered the receipts which are meant to be deposited with the Bank and Kachcheri respectively. Similarly payments by cheques shall be entered in the column headed " Bank " and payments by order on the Kachcheri in the column headed " Kachcheri ".
187. The columns for " Cross Entry " are for adjustments between accounts. The receipt for cross entries shall be in form L. G. B. 64.
188. The original and duplicate copies of the cross entry vouchers shall be in support of the receipt and payment entries of the Cash Book respectively.
189. The Cash Book shall be closed daily. At the close of business each day the Cashier shall send to the Kachcheri and/or Bank the whole of the money received that day. At stations where there is no Kachcheri the Chairman shall issue orders as to how often in a week money is to be sent to the Kachcheri and/or Bank.

2.—Daily Checking of Books.

190. When the Cash Book has been written for the day the Expenditure Clerk shall enter the receipts other than revenue in the respective ledgers, *e.g.*, Advance, Deposit, &c.
191. The Cash Book and all ledgers together with the counterfoiled receipt books and receipt forms and licence forms and payment vouchers shall be checked daily by the Secretary. He shall—

Daily check
Secretary.

- (1) compare the duplicate copy of the receipt forms and licence forms with the entries on the Dr. side of the Cash Book ;
- (2) check the triplicate copies of the receipt forms and licence forms in the counterfoiled books with the entries in the Cash Book, entering at the same time the Cash Book numbers of the receipts on the triplicates. This is necessary in order to see that all the receipt forms and licences issued have been brought to account—see F. R. 54 ;
- (3) check all the entries on the Cr. side of the Cash Book with the paid vouchers, at the same time seeing that the vouchers have been properly authorized and passed through the ledgers ;
- (4) see the receipt from the Kachcheri in support of the amounts lodged at the Kachcheri and also satisfy himself that the amounts entered in the " Bank " column on the Dr. side of the Cash Book have been sent to the bank ;
- (5) initial the receipt entries made in the Advance, Deposit and other ledgers—*vide* F. R. 190 ;
- (6) if he is satisfied that the entries are in order sign the Cash Book.

On the following morning the Chairman shall compare the Cash Book with the triplicate copies of the receipts and licences issued and also with the paid vouchers. If he is satisfied that the entries are in order and that the amounts collected have been deposited with the Kachcheri and/or Bank he shall sign the Cash Book.

Check by
Chairman.

3.—Monthly Statement of Account.

192. The duplicate copies of the receipt forms and licence forms and the payment vouchers shall, after being checked by the Chairman, be passed on to the Accounts Clerk who may be any clerk other than the Cashier. The Accounts Clerk shall arrange them in order according to the Head, Sub-head and item of Revenue or Expenditure and file them in a cabinet or pigeon-hole almirah. The cabinet must contain a card for every item arranged according to the Budget and for such other accounts as may be necessary.

193. The receipt forms in support of credits to votes shall be filed with the payment vouchers relating to the item of Expenditure affected ; vouchers in support of refunds of Revenue shall be filed with the receipt forms connected with the item of Revenue concerned—F. R. 27 and 138.

Classification
statements.

194. At the end of the month the Accounts Clerk shall remove all the documents from the cabinet or pigeon-hole almirah and proceed to type in duplicate classification statements of Receipts and Payments in form L. G. B. 65.

Column 1 is for the item of Revenue or Expenditure as the case may be or for the title of the account.

Columns 2 and 3 for the date and number of the voucher.

Column 4 is for the amount of each voucher, while column 5 is for the total of each item or account.

195. The entries shall be made strictly in the order of the items as they appear in the form of the budget in F. R. 9, and under each item the entries shall be made in chronological order.

196. Vouchers representing debits to Revenue or credits to Expenditure shall be typed in red in column 3 after the total of the amounts already appearing against the item concerned is first entered in the same column. In such cases only the net total of the item shall be carried to column 4. If the amount in red is more than the total from which it is to be deducted the excess shall be carried to column 4 in red ink and shall be taken into account in the totalling of column 4.

197. When all the items under Revenue and Expenditure have been entered the totals of Revenue and Expenditure shall be shown. Below these the amounts under Advances, Deposits, &c., shall be entered and finally the grand totals of Receipts and Payments.

Note.—The grand totals of Receipts and Payments will not agree with the totals in the Cash Book if the transactions include items under Revenue refunded and Overpayments recovered. The totals of these items should be added to the totals of the Classification Statement to make them agree with the totals of the Cash Book.

Monthly Abstract
of Account.

198. The totals in the Classification Statement shall then be posted in the Monthly Abstract of Account from L. G. B. 66, one copy of which with the duplicate of the Classification Statement shall be filed of record in the office of the Council; another copy with the original of the Classification Statement shall be sent to the Auditor-General with the vouchers for the month. A copy of the abstract for March, June, September, and December shall also be forwarded to the Local Government Board.

199. The copy of the monthly abstract filed in the office shall be carefully kept as it is the only classified record of Revenue received month by month.

4.—Main Ledger.

200. There shall be kept a Main Ledger in which shall be opened the following accounts:—

and also any other accounts which may be found necessary.

201. There shall be kept a Journal for the purpose of making postings into the Main Ledger. The monthly Abstract of Account shall be journalized as follows:—

202. At the end of each year the totals of Revenue and Expenditure shall be transferred to Surplus and Deficit Account as shown below before the annual Balance Sheet is drawn up and published in the *Gazette*:—

5.—Accounts to Audit.

203. Not later than the 15th of the following month the Chairman shall send to the Auditor-General a copy of the Abstract of Account for the month together with the receipt and and/or Bank shall be attached in support of the cash balances.

CHAPTER VIII.—WORKS.

1.—General.

204. The following books and returns shall be kept by the officer in charge of works:—

- (1) Estimates Ledger in form L. G. B. 84.
- (2) Return of Materials in form L. G. B. 83.
- (3) Register of Metal and Gravel in form L. G. B. 82; and
- (4) Measurement Book giving detailed measurements of work with reference in each case to the connected estimate and voucher.

All works whether done departmentally or on contract shall be according to the estimates, duly sanctioned.

205. The officer-in-charge of works shall be personally held responsible for the execution of the works within the amounts of the estimates. Any deviation from the items provided in an estimate which may become necessary during the execution of the works shall be similarly sanctioned.

206. Estimates shall be numbered consecutively and entered in the Estimates Ledger. Payments in respect of each estimate shall be entered therein, reference being quoted where necessary to the connected folio in the Measurement Book, Return of Materials, Check Roll or the folio in the Register of Metal and Gravel. Ledger.

207. Materials drawn for works shall be entered in the Register of Materials which shall be entered up in respect of each month. Surplus materials left over on completion of a work shall be returned to the stores with the least possible delay. Register of Materials.

208. Whenever a building or bridge or any part thereof is demolished the officer-in-charge of works shall furnish to the Chairman a list of materials removed from such work. Those materials which cannot be utilized on other works shall be sold by public auction; the rest shall be brought to account in a separate section of the Stock Book and issued for works as required. Secondhand building materials.

2.—Labour.

209. Whenever works are done departmentally, a check roll and a distribution roll of labour employed shall be kept in respect of each work. Check roll.

210. The officer immediately in charge of the persons whose names appear on the check roll shall mark in indelible pencil or ink their attendance every morning and afternoon and shall insert the total number present immediately under the last entry and initial the check roll. Attendance.

211. The Chairman or other officer authorized by him and the officer-in-charge of works shall periodically and at irregular intervals check the number of persons actually employed on any particular work with that entered in the check roll and shall initial and date against the number actually verified. Verification of labour.

CHAPTER IX.—MISCELLANEOUS.

1.—Security of Officers.

212. Officers who are entrusted with the custody of money or stores or whose duties are connected with the recovery of revenue shall furnish security either in cash or real property or through a guarantee company. Real property mortgaged as security shall be reappraised biennially. Security.

213. All collectors of revenue shall be required to furnish security in sums fixed by the Chairman. Collectors to furnish security.

214. Security shall be furnished within a month of the officer's appointment.

215. Securities furnished in cash shall be credited to Deposits, under Security Deposits.

216. If the amounts are deposited in the Ceylon Savings Bank the payment shall be debited to Ceylon Savings Bank Securities Account.

217. When the money is withdrawn from the bank the capital shall be credited to Ceylon Savings Bank Securities Account and the interest to Deposits, Security Deposits.

2.—Fixed Deposits.

218. The Chairman shall periodically examine the cash balance of the Council and if he considers it too large for immediate requirements he shall with the consent of the Council place in fixed deposit with a bank such sum as he can conveniently release. The payment shall be debited to Fixed Deposit Account. Periodical Examination of Cash Balance.

219. The interest received shall be credited to Revenue A. 11, Interest. Interest.

220. If the interest is added to the capital and the whole amount is again placed in fixed deposit a cross entry adjustment shall be made in the Cash Book debiting Fixed Deposit Account and crediting Revenue A. 11, Interest, with the amount of interest. Renewal of fixed deposit.

3.—Loan Register.

221. A register in form L. G. B. 75 of all loans and the repayments thereof shall be maintained by the Secretary. Loan register.

222. A separate folio shall be opened for each loan. All details regarding purpose of loan, terms of repayment, interest, date of commencement of repayment and of payment of interest, &c., shall be shown therein. Separate accounts.

223. The Secretary shall keep in view the dates on which instalments are due, make the payments and enter them in the Register. Secretary to pay instalments of loans.

CHAPTER X.—AUDIT.

224. A copy of the minutes of meetings after confirmation shall be sent to Audit.

225. All Audit Queries will be issued in duplicate and numbered consecutively; the duplicates shall be filed in serial order; the originals shall be returned with the reply.

226. All queries and letters shall be replied to within a fortnight; where the reply is delayed owing to exceptional circumstances an interim reply shall be sent.

227. At the end of each half year a statement of leave obtained by officers of the Council shall be sent to Audit.

8. At the end of the year a Profit and Loss Account for the year shall be sent to the General setting out the profit or loss on the Electricity Department in the following form:—

229. Soon after the end of the year a statement, as at December 31, showing the surplus and/or shortfall under each item of revenue and the excess and/or saving under each item of expenditure as compared with the budgeted amounts plus supplementary votes, together with an explanation of the causes of the excess or unexpended balance, shall be prepared and forwarded to Audit.

CHAPTER XI.—INVENTORY BOOK.

Inventory Book.

230. Every item of the Council's property including furniture and maps shall be entered in an inventory book in form L. G. B. 80, consumable stores register, stock book or catalogue of books.

Consumable Stores Register.

231. Consumable stores such as stationery, petrol, oil, cattle food, &c., shall, soon after purchase, be entered in a consumable stores register.

232. The consumable stores register shall be in the charge of a responsible clerk and as each article is issued he shall enter the issue in the register showing full particulars of the issue, viz., date, name of person to whom issued, and for what purpose, quantity, &c. The register shall be ruled suitably to show these particulars.

233. At the end of each month the consumable stores register shall be examined and signed by the Secretary.

Catalogue of books.

234. A separate catalogue of books shall be kept.

Voucher number to be quoted in Inventory Book. Receipt for articles removed.

235. Against every entry on the receipt side of the inventory or other register or book shall be quoted the number and date of the voucher on which the article was paid for.

237. Where any article is issued to an officer of the Council whose place of work is not within the premises of the Council's office a receipt shall be obtained from the officer and filed with the inventory book or other register or book.

lost or damaged articles.

238. Where any article of the Council's property is lost or damaged through the carelessness of any of the Council's Officers the value of the article shall be recovered from the officer and credited to Revenue. The article may then be written off with the authority of the Council.

Balancing Inventory Book.

239. At the end of each year the inventory book, consumable stores registers, and stock books shall be balanced, the articles written off being deducted from the total receipts and the balances carried forward to the new year.

Board of Survey.

240. Early in January each year the Council shall appoint a board of survey consisting of a member of the Council and an officer of the Council to make a complete survey of the Council's property. They shall report within a month of their appointment the result of the verification showing the balances according to the inventory book, registers and other books and against these what they actually found.

Shortages.

241. Where any shortages are discovered for which no satisfactory explanation is forthcoming the value of the articles shall be recovered from the officer concerned.

Unserviceable articles.

242. Where any articles are considered unserviceable the board shall report which of them should be destroyed and which sold. The Council shall then have action taken accordingly. The articles shall then be written off the inventory book, register or other book, the number and date of the relative resolution of the Council being entered against each.

Report of Board of Survey.

243. The report of the board of survey shall be in duplicate, one copy shall be filed in the office and the other forwarded to the Auditor-General.

CHAPTER XII.—STORES AND MATERIALS.

244. The supply of stores and materials shall as far as possible be offered to public competition—section 51.

Tenders, notice of.

245. Notices calling for tenders shall be published in two issues of one or more daily newspapers likely to be read by probable tenderers for the particular service required.

246. The notice must state the date and hour by which tenders must reach the Chairman, reasonable time being allowed between the date of publication of notice and the date fixed for closing of tenders. The date fixed for the receipt of tenders shall preferably be a day or two before the next meeting of the Council or Tender Committee.

247. At the appointed hour the Chairman shall take all the tenders, enclose them in an envelope, seal it and lock it up in his safe.

248. The tenders shall be opened and considered at the next meeting of the Council or Tender Committee.

250. Stores and materials purchased shall be taken over by the Superintendent of Works or other officer authorized by the Chairman.

Stock Book.

251. Stores received shall be promptly taken on charge in a stock book, the number and date of the payment voucher being quoted therein.

Issue Order.

252. The stores shall be kept under lock and key. No issue shall be made without an issue order signed by the Superintendent of Works.

253. At the end of each year the stores shall be verified by a board of survey, as provided for in F. R. 240.

CHAPTER XIII.—REPEAL.

254. All Financial Rules and Orders made prior to the date hereof are hereby revoked.

Copy of Section 179 of the Local Government Ordinance.

179. (1) For the purpose of the ascertainment of any information which in the opinion of the Chairman, shall be necessary for the due levying or imposition of any rate or tax, the Chairman may, by notice in writing require all persons who are liable or may be supposed to be liable to the said rate or tax, or who may be the owners or occupiers or supposed owners or occupiers of any property with respect to which any rate or tax is imposed or may be imposed under this Ordinance, or if the Chairman shall so think fit, every householder within the administrative limits of the Council, to render all such returns, and make all such declarations of such particulars and in such form as shall be prescribed by by-laws under Part V., or pending the making of such by-laws, as may be directed by the Council.

(2) All persons on whom any such notice shall be served shall fill up in writing, sign, date and return to the Office of the Council the form served with such notice within seven days, or such longer time as may be prescribed by by-law or by the said notice.

(3) Any person who refuses to accept, or who refuses, neglects, or omits duly to fill up and return such form within the prescribed time, or who negligently renders a return which is in any material respect inaccurate to the advantage of such person, shall be guilty of a summary offence, and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees.

(4) All declarations made for the purpose of any such return shall be free of stamp duty.

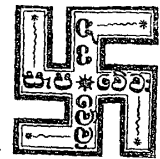
