#### THE GAME PROTECTION ORDINANCE.

REGULATIONS relating to the use of fishing nets within the area of the territorial waters adjoining Weligam korale and Wellaboda pattu in the Matara District of the Southern Province, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 10 of the Game Protection Ordinance (Chapter 326).

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. Within the area of the territorial waters adjoining Weligam korale and Wellaboda pattu no person shall use at any time any madela which has not been registered in the manner hereinafter prescribed.
- 2. Application for the registration of any madela shall be made by producing the madela before such headmen and upon such date as may be specified each year in a notice published in that behalf by the Mudaliyar, not less than one month earlier, by beat of tom-tom for six consecutive days and in writing or in print affixed in conspicuous places in the area concerned.
- 3. Every madela which is in good order with its full equipment of two mandas and a boat shall be accepted provisionally for registration and the owners so informed forthwith on the condition that after the madela is duly registered, its equipment shall not be used with any other madela.
- 4. (a) All madel accepted provisionally for registration shall be produced again before such headmen on such further date, as may be fixed by notice as aforesaid, together with their mandas and boats.
- (b) If after such further inspection as may be necessary, they are found to be in good order they shall be registered, and a registration number assigned to each of them, and the registration number shall be painted on each boat and a metal tag with the registration number and letter denoting the waraya and a crown mark marked on it shall be attached to each such registered madela.
  - (c) No madela shall be registered unless it is produced with its full equipment in accordance with regulation 3.
- 5. (a) The Assistant Government Agent may in his discretion, by suitable notice published in each area concerned prescribe or limit the number of madel to be used in any waraya; and only the number so prescribed and limited shall be registered for use m such waraya.
- (b) No madela registered for use in any one of the warayas defined in the schedule to these regulations, shall be used in any other of those warayas.
- 6. The register shall be forwarded to the Assistant Government Agent, and a true copy kept by each of the said headmen.
  - 7. All registered madel shall be cast in turns according to the sequence of their registration numbers.
- 8. (1) In Weligam korale, the turn of the first madela shall begin at sunrise on a given day and terminate on the madela being drawn ashore; but if the first owner has not exercised his right by sunrise of the following morning, his turn shall be considered to have passed to the next on the register.

On each madela being drawn ashore, the next owner on the register shall have the right to cast his madela, and his turn shall terminate in like manner on his madela being drawn ashore or at sunrise the next morning. In this manner any number of madel may be drawn on one and the same day; provided, however, that the next on the register may elect to wait for his turn to begin till sunrise on the next day.

(2) In Wellaboda pattu, the 24 hours of each day shall be divided into four periods, namely:—midnight to 6 A.M., 6 A.M. to noon, noon to 6 P.M., and 6 P.M. to midnight.

The turn of each madela shall coincide with one of these periods. In warayas other than Kalapumodara wella alias Kalapumodara waraya, each madela shall be cast on four successive days and for each of the above-named periods in turn, according to the table annexed. At the commencement, and in order to start the table of rotation, the first madela shall be cast on the first day only, the second madela on the first and second days only, and the third madela on the first, second, and third days only. Thus, on the first day madel bearing registered numbers 1, 2, 3, and 4 shall be cast from midnight to 6 A.M., 6 A.M. to noon, noon to 6 P.M., and 6 P.M. to midnight, respectively; on the second day madel bearing registered numbers 2, 3, 4, and 5 shall be cast from midnight to 6 A.M., 6 A.M. to noon, noon to 6 P.M., and 6 P.M. to midnight, respectively, and so on, the turn of madela No. 1 coming round again when all the registered madel have been cast, as further illustrated in the annexed table: provided that any owner failing to exercise his right before midnight of any day on which his turn comes round, shall be deemed to have renounced his right for that turn.

(3) In Kalapumodara wella alias Kalapumodara waraya (comprising Kotadelpala waraya, Agala waraya, Egodaha waraya and Yongala alias Beligal waraya) no madela shall be cast during the periods from 6 A.M. to noon and noon to 6 P.M. on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays. During the other periods in each week, each madela shall be cast in turn in each such waraya for four successive periods in accordance with the respective tables annexed hereunder:—

- 9. After both ends of the madela are brought ashore for the purpose of being drawn, no casting or other net shall be thrown within the madela.
- 10. No net other than a registered madela, or a visidela, or a nul (alias elena) dela, or ahurana dela shall be used inside a waraya, unless special provision therefor is made in the regulations following.
  - 11. The following provisions shall be applicable to fishing in Weligam korale only, namely:—
  - (a) The catching of Koramburuwo or Bollo fish by visidel within the Weligama Bay is forbidden, but the Mudaliyar may, by beat of tom-tom, suspend the provisions of this paragraph for a special number of days at a time, when Koramburuwo are plentiful in the Bay.
    - (b) The owners of nuldel shall be allowed unrestricted fishing on one day in each week in Moderawella waraya, and on another day in the week in the portions of the bay ordinarily known as Mirihiwella and Madelwella in Mirissa waraya. These days shall be fixed by the Assistant Government Agent from time to time by notice published in the areas concerned.
    - (c) On the remaining days the owners of madel shall be at liberty to fish in Mirihiwella, in accordance with the foregoing regulations.
    - (d) On the day set apart for nuldel no madela shall be cast, and on the days allowed to madel no nuldela shall be cast in the above warayas.
    - (e) All nuldel fishing is prohibited in Weligama waraya in Weligama Bay, except on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays; and all nuldel fishing is prohibited in the Pelena and Kaluwella warayas within the Weligama Bay.
    - (f) The catching of Koramburuwo or Bollo fish with nets at the places called and known as Etulwala and Katuwalawala in Weligama waraya is prohibited. The catching of fish by rod and line after 1 P.M. in these warayas is also prohibited.
    - (g) The catching of Koramburuwo or Bollo fish within the Denuwala waraya by any means other than rod and line, or otherwise than by a person standing on the coral reef or in water, is prohibited.
    - (h) It shall not be lawful for the Mirissa fishermen to use nuldel in Weligama waraya, or for the Weligama fishermen to use nuldel in Mirissa waraya.
    - (i) No person shall cast any madela in that portion of Mirissa Waraya which is bounded on the east, south, and west by the shore, and on the north by a line connecting two points on the shore, each such point being marked on the shore by a concrete pylon.
  - 12. The following provisions shall be applicable to fishing in Wellaboda pattu only, namely:—
  - (1) Fishing by other means than those indicated below in the following warayas is prohibited:-
    - (a) By rod and line in Undugodawella alias Parawella.
    - (b) By rod and line and atangu in Punchiwella.
    - (c) By rod and line at any time and by visidel from 6 A.M. to 12 noon provided that not more than two turns of each net are cast in Etulassewella.
    - (d) By rod and line, and madel in Madel waraya alias Nilwella.
    - (e) By visidel, waradel, and atangu in Madapatuna.
    - (f) By any kind of net except elenadela, between 6 A.M. and 12 noon in Pehembiyawella and by rod and line alone from 12 noon to 6 P.M.
    - (g) By rod and line, and madel alone in Hanwella.
    - (h) By visidel alone in Dalawelikadwella.
    - (i) By visidel alone in Kemagodawella.
    - (j) By madel at Kirilawella waraya.
    - (k) By rod and line in knee-deep water in Talalla waraya.
    - (1) By madel in accordance with the provisions of regulation 8 (3), or by ahuranadel at any time on any day, or by nuldel from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M. on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays, in Kalapumodara wella alias Kalapumodara waraya (comprising Kotadelpala waraya, Agala waraya, Egodaha waraya and Yongala alias Beligal waraya).

- (2) (a) No delkandas shall be cast inshore of a line from Hambanagala to Halawagala in Gandara waraya.
- (b) Between Halawagala and Hambanagala in Gandara waraya fishing by rod and line shall be from 6 A.M. to 12 noon.
  - (c) Any other form of fishing in Gandara waraya is prohibited.
- (3) (a) Between Weheratuduwa and Muttugala in Nunewella waraya fishing with rod and  $\,$  line is permitted from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m.
  - (b) Fishing with a tangu is permitted in this waraya from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M. in knoc-doop water only.
  - (c) From 2 P.M. to 6 P.M. the use of waradel is permitted in this waraya.
- (d) From 6 P.M. the catching of fish with yoth is permitted provided that the fishermen stand on either side of the reef called Galboda, or in boats anchored beyond Weheratuduwa and Muttugala.
  - (e) Any other form of fishing in Nunawella waraya is prohibited.
- (4) Fishing by visidel in Kavissawella, Etulwolla, and Wawwawella is prohibited except on such days as may be fixed by the headmen hereinafter named; and at all other times subject to the exceptions hereinafter set out, fishing in these warayas shall take place only by rod and line with bait: provided that in Kavissawella unbaited leaden hooks may be used between 7.30 A.M. and noon on any day.
- (5) Fishing in the warayas of Laggowella, Buranewalla, and Sinhasanawella shall be only by rod and line, with or without bait, except as hereinafter provided.
- (6) In the six warayas mentioned in paragraphs (4) and (5) of this regulation it shall be lawful for any person to cast waradel once a day till four "peyas" after daybreak, or till 7.30 a.m. whichever shall be later: Provided that waradel may be cast in knee-deep water at any time between the hours of 5 and 7.30 a.m.
- (7) Fishing with rod and line is permitted in Ikirituduwa waraya between 6 A.M. and 6 P.M. provided that two turns of fishing with visidel and atangu shall be allowed to each person between 6 A.M. and 12 noon.
  - (8) Fishing, by any other means than those indicated below, in the following warayas is prohibited:—
    - (a) By rod and line in knee-deep water from 6 a.m. to 12 noon in Oruwella waraya.
    - (b) By atangu in knee-deep water from 12 noon to 6 p.m. in Oruwella waraya.
    - (c) By rod and line, or line and hook, in boats from 6 A.M. to 12 noon in Bogahawella waraya.
    - (d) By visidel from boats between 6 A.M. and 12 noon in Bogahawella waraya: provided that not more than two turns shall be allowed to each individual in such boats.
    - (e) By rod and line, or line and hook from boats between 6 A.M. and 12 noon in Hinnagalmulla waraya.
    - (f) By rod and line or line and hook, either in knee-deep water or from boats between 6 a.m. and 12 noon in Kopparawella waraya.
    - (g) By atangu or by rod and line in knee-deep water from 12 noon to 6 p.m. in Kopparawella waraya.
    - (h) By rod and line in knee-deep water from 6 A.M. to 12 noon in Edandewella waraya.
    - (i) By visidel from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. in Edandewella waraya; provided that not more than three turns shall be allowed to each individual within that time.
    - (j) By atangu and rod and line from 12 noon to 6 P.M. in Edandewella waraya, in knee-deep water or from the rocks within the waraya.
    - (k) By rod and line or line and hook from boats between 6 A.M. and 12 noon in Maddegalketiya waraya.
    - (1) By rod and line and atangu between 12 noon and 6 P.M. in Maddegalketiya waraya in knee-deep water.
    - (m) By visidel from 6 A.M. to 12 noon in Mattiwala waraya: provided that not more than three turns shall be allowed to each individual.
    - (n) By rod and line in the water at any depth, or from the rocks from 12 noon to 6 P.M. in Mattiwala waraya.
    - (o) By rod and line and atangu, in knee-deep water from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M. in Hitagala waraya, Hurullobokka waraya, and Goigodawella waraya.
- (9) It shall be the duty of the Patabendi Arachchi of Dondra and the Vidane Arachchi of Dondra South to give two full days' notice to the inhabitants by beat of tom-tom when they see proper to permit the use of visidel in the warayas referred to in paragraph (4) of this regulation. Such permission shall not be granted till these headmen are satisfied that the fish have properly shoaled.
- (10) It shall be lawful for the Patabendi Arachchi of Dondra on application to procure even from prohibited areas bait-fish for boats launching into the deep sea according to existing customs.
- (11) In the Wawwawella, Kavissawella, Etulwalawella, Sinhassanawella, Buranawella, Hambanwalawella, and Laggowella warayas, it shall not be lawful to fish with atangu in water which is more than knee-deep between 7.30 A.M. and 5 P.M.
- 13. All disputes arising out of these regulations shall be referred to the Assistant Government Agent, whose decision thereon shall be final.
- 14. Any matter not expressly provided for by these regulations shall be governed by the established local custom and a breach of such custom shall be punishable as a breach of these regulations.
  - 15. These regulations may be cited as the Matara District Fishing Regulations, 1939.
  - 16. The regulations published in Gazette No. 8,178 of November 29, 1935, are hereby revoked.







# Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Friday, May 26, 1939, at 2.30 p.m. pursuant to notice dated May 19, 1939.

Present:—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratne; Mr. A. C. Mohammado; Mr. W. Dahanayake; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; Dr. A. T. Kuriyan; and Mr. W. G. Scott.

The minutes of the General Meeting held on April 21, 1939, copies thereof having been furnished to each 1. Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. To consider applications for the post of Inspector of Works.

The Charman moved Council into Committee to consider this item and also items 3 and 4 on the agenda.

# Council in Committee.

The Chairman read out to Council in Committee a minute recently made by him against Mr. Chinniah and brought it to the notice of the Members that Mr. Chinniah had shown a complete lack of co-operation with the Acting Accountant in matters pertaining to accounts. He was, therefore, he said, unable to recommend the confirmation of this officer and m matters pertaining to accounts. He was, therefore, he said, unable to recommend the confirmation of this officer and was of opinion that the question should be deferred for some time. After a discussion on the matter Mr. A. C. Marisian, whether he is prepared to carry out the work according to the departmental estimate of Rs. 890; (c) earth-work to be done along the 8 inch pipe line at Hiyare and Bekke (Madola Augmentation Scheme):—Recommended the acceptance of the tender of A. M. A. Munaff for Rs. 638·09, being the lowest.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (b) the Chairman stated that D. Marisian was not prepared to carry out the work according to the departmental estimate of Rs. 890. It was accordingly resolved to entrust the work to Contractor R. B. de Silva for Rs. 890 and also to sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 245 under Head 48—Maintenance of Bridges, as the amount provided for this work in the Budget was Rs. 645 only.

- (3) Considered papers relating to the acquisition of land at Weliwatte for the erection of a public latrine:—Recommended that the proposal to creet a public latrine at Weliwatte be abandoned in view of the objections raised to the site by the Temple authorities and the failure of the public to carry out its undertaking to provide a site free of cost, and that the land be ro-conveyed to the person from whom it was acquired. Recommended, further, that the necessary steps be taken to compel the residents of the area to provide their own latrines.

- the Chairman's fine sense of fairplay and justice which was characteristic of the best traditions of the Ceylon Civil Service.

  The Chairman in reply thanked the Members for their kind references to him and said that the services he had been able to render had been made easy for him by a very loyal staff to whom he wished to pay a tribute.
