BY-LAW.

Chapter XVIII A of the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Galle, added to the by-laws dated January 21, 1903, published in *Gazette* No. 5,901 of January 23, 1903, by by-law dated March 14, 1924, published in *Gazette* No. 7,382 of March 21, 1924, is hereby rescinded and the following new chapter is substituted therefor:—

"CHAPTER XVIII A.

Eating-houses and Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

"Eating-house" means any premises (other than a house for which a licence has been obtained under the Excise Ordinance) where curry and rice are prepared for purposes of sale, and are sold or exposed for sale.

"Tea and coffee boutique" means any premises where tea, coffee or cooked food other than curry and rice is prepared for purposes of sale and is sold or exposed for sale.

I.—Conditions of issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to a licence to keep an eating-house or a tea and coffee boutique, unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

- (1) That the site is approved by the Chairman.
- (2) That the premises are in good repair and are well ventilated and well lighted; and that every room used for the serving of meals has a minimum superficial area of 120 square feet, and is provided for the purpose of ventilation with doors or windows capable of being opened, either directly or through an open verandah, on to an external open space and having when opened an aggregate area not less than 1/7th the superficial floor area of room.
- (3) That the roof is made of some durable material.
- (4) That all the woodwork is oil-painted or lime-washed.
- (5) That the premises are provided with adequate drainage, with a sanitary dust bin, and with sufficient latrine accommodation.
- (6) That premises on which any food is cooked include a kitchen with an efficient smoke vent and at least one window capable of being opened, and that such window when open has an area not less than 1/15th of the superficial floor space.

II.—Regulations for licensed Eating-houses and Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

1. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with his name and the words "Licensed Eating-house" or "Licensed Tea and Coffee Boutique" legibly painted thereon.

2. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause the licence to be framed and hung in a prominent place on the premises. He shall also cause a list of the names and addresses of all employees to be kept at all times on the premises so as to be available for inspection.

3. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause the walls of every room forming part of the premises to be lime-washed twice every year in the months of June and December; the

ceiling to be limewashed four times a year in the months of March, June, September, and December; the woodwork to be lime-washed or, if oil-painted, to be washed with hot water and soap at least twice a year in the months of June and December, and at such other times as may be ordered by the Chairman in writing.

4. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause every part of the premises, the surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils, and equipment used in the preparation, sale, or consumption of food or drink to be kept in good repair, clean, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, latrine, cess-pit, or any nuisance on the premises.

5. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause all utensils used in the preparation, sale and consumption of food or drink, to be washed with soap and water at least once in 24 hours.

6. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause every utensil or receptacle used by a customer to be washed immediately after such use and before being used by any other customer.

7. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause all trade and domestic refuse to be placed in an impervious covered receptacle and to be removed from the premises daily. He shall keep such receptacle covered at all times except when refuse is being placed in it, and shall cause all waste tea, coffee, milk, or remnants of food or cooking waste to be collected in such receptacle and shall take all precautions to ensure that they are not scattered on the ground.

8. No licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall use any counter or other place from which tea, coffee or milk is served, unless such counter or other place is covered with zinc or other impervious material.

9. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause a sanitary dust bin to be kept at all times on the premises.

10. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall keep the premises free from rats, and shall fill all rat-holes with broken glass, and shall plaster them with cement as soon as may be after he discovers them.

11. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall provide the premises with an ample supply of potable water.

12. No licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall keep or store or expose for sale any food unless such food is kept in a receptacle so constructed as to prevent its contamination by flies, dust or vermin. He shall keep such receptacle always clean.

13. Every licensee of a tea and coffee boutique shall keep the sugar used in such boutique in wide-mouthed, glass stoppered bottles, and the milk in glass bottles with suitable stoppers.

14. No licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall sell or offer or expose for sale or keep on the premises any unwholesome milk.

15. No person shall spit within the premises of any eating-house or tea and coffee boutique.

16. No person suffering from any infectious, contagious or loathsome disease, or who has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease or who is unwashed and otherwise unclean, shall enter the premises of any eating-house or tea and coffee boutique or take part in the preparation or sale of food or drink therein.

17. No licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall cause or permit the contravention by any person of regulation 15 or regulation 16.

18. No licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall allow any person to transport for sale cooked food from the premises unless such person is in possession of a card of registration signed by the Chairman, and unless such food is carried in a closed basket, tin or other suitable receptacle.

19. Every licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall see that every vehicle, basket, tin, or other receptacle used for carrying food is clean at the time any food is placed in it.

20. The Chairman shall, on application made to him by the licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique, issue cards of registration for use by every person employed by such licensee in carrying food for sale.

21. The licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall not permit the premises to be used for the purpose of any other trade whatsoever on the same floor as the rooms in which meals are served or the kitchen.

22. No licensee of an eating-house or of a tea and coffee boutique shall permit any person to sleep in any room or portion of a room in which food is prepared or exposed for sale or is sold."

BY-LAWS.

Conservancy and Scavenging.

1. The Chairman may, by a notice in writing served on the owner of any premises situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, require such owner to close any cesspit that may be situated on the premises and substitute for such cesspit a pail latrine of a size and type, and in such a position on the premises, as may be approved by the Chairman.

2. Every owner on whom a notice referred to in by-law 1 has been served shall duly comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, in no case to be less than one month, as may be specified in such notice.

3. No person other than a conservancy labourer, employed by the Village Committee shall remove or otherwise dispose of the night soil from any premises on which a pail latrine, in accordance with these by-laws, has been built.

4. Every occupier of premises served by the conservancy service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a conservancy fee at the rate specified in the schedule to these by-laws.

5. Upon the establishment of a scavenging service for the whole or any specified part of the village area, every occupier of any premises situated within an area for which such service has been established, shall deposit or cause to be deposited all ashes, sweepings and other refuse from his premises, in buckets or bins with suitable covers and of such shape and size as may be approved by the Chairman of the Village Committee.

6. The occupier of any premises referred to in by-law 5, shall—

(1) daily between such hours as the Chairman may from time to time notify by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, place or cause to be placed such buckets or bins by the edge of the road outside such premises but so as to cause no obstruction to traffic on the road; and

(2) remove or cause to be removed such buckets or bins, within half an hour of the emptying of such buckets or bins by the scavenging labourers of the Village Committee.

7. No person shall place any ashes, sweepings or other refuse on any road except in such buckets or bins and at such hours as are referred to in by-law 6.

8. Every occupier of any premises served by the scavenging service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a scavenging fee at the rate specified in the schedule to these by-laws.

9. The conservancy fee referred to in by-law 4 and the scavenging fee referred to in by-law 8 shall be paid to the Chairman of the Village Committee on or before the 10th day of the month immediately following the month in respect of which they are due: Provided that when the occupier has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that the premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month, and such occupier subsequently satisfies the Chairman that such premises were in fact not occupied during the month, no conservancy or scavenging fee shall be payable in respect of such month.

The by-laws published by notification dated February 20, 1918, in *Gazette* No. 6,928 of March 8, 1918, as amended by regulation published by notification dated May 18, 1937, in *Gazette* No. 8,292 of May 28, 1937, are hereby further amended in Chapter IV. thereof, as follows:—

(1) under the heading "A—Markets", by the substitution for by-law 1, of the following new by-law:—

" 1. (1) Whenever a public market is established by the Board for any town, no person shall hold a private market within the limits of such town without a licence from the Board.

(2) After any such public market is established and opened, no person shall, without a licence granted by the Board, expose for sale any meat, poultry, fish whether fresh or salted, fresh fruit, or vegetables in any boutique, private market, stall, or place within the limits of the town, other than the public market: Provided that this by-law shall not apply to the sale of fresh fruit or vegetables within the limits of the town by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed places or do not for the purposes of such sale establish themselves on public roads or other public places.

(3) Every licence referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2) shall be in the form set out hereunder, and shall be in force for such period not less than one month and not exceeding twelve months, as may be specified therein.

Form of Licence to sell outside Market.

_____ having paid the prescribed fee of Rs. _____ is hereby licensed by resolution of the Sanitary Board of _____ passed on _____ to sell _____ at _____ from _____ to _____.

Chairman, Sanitary Board.

(4) In respect of each licence, a fee shall be payable in advance at the rate of fifty cents for each month of the period for which the licence is to be in force: Provided that in any case where the licence is restricted to the sale of fresh fruit and vegetables only, the fee payable in advance in respect of such licence shall be one rupee per annum.

(5) No licence under this by-law shall be granted by the Board unless the boutique, private market, stall or place is in conformity with such of the conditions set out hereunder as are applicable thereto.

(a) BUTCHERS' STALL.

Conditions of Issue of Licence.

(i.) The premises must be in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted and every room must be provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open must not be less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

(ii.) The walls of every room must not be less than 7 feet in height and must be built of brick, stone or cabook. The internal surface of the walls, above a height of 4 feet from the floor, must be lime plastered and lime washed. The internal surface of the walls below a height of 4 feet from the floor must be covered with glazed tiles or plastered in cement.

(iii.) The eaves must be at least 6 feet from the ground.

(iv.) The roof must be made of some permanent materials.

(v.) The woodwork must be oil painted or lime washed.

(vi.) The floor must be cemented.

(vii.) The premises must be provided with adequate drainage.

(viii.) The tables and all the furniture must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor and the walls.

(ix.) Every table on which meat is kept must be covered with zinc or other impermeable material.

(x.) The premises must be provided with a sanitary dust bin and at least one spittoon and with sufficient latrine accommodation.

(xi.) The premises must be at least 50 feet distant from any latrine, cesspit, manure heap or open sewer.

(xii.) There must be no cesspit, latrine, or ashpit within, or directly communicating with, the premises.

(b) FISH STALL.

Conditions of Issue of Licence.

(i.) The premises must be in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted and every room must be provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open must not be less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

(ii.) The walls in every room must not be less than 7 feet in height and must be lime plastered and lime washed except such parts as are covered with glazed tiles or are plastered in cement.

(iii.) The eaves must be at least 6 feet from the ground.

(iv.) The woodwork must be oil painted or lime-washed.

(v.) The floor must be of smooth cement having a proper fall leading to a masonry drain built in cement and cement rendered and emptying into a bucket.

(vi.) Every table on which fish is kept must be covered with zinc or other impermeable material.

(vii.) The premises must be provided with a sanitary dust bin and with sufficient latrine accommodation.

(viii.) The premises must be at least 50 feet distant from any latrine, cesspit, manure heap or open sewer.

(ix.) There must be no cesspit, latrine, or ashpit within, or directly communicating with, the premises.

(c) FRESH FRUIT OR VEGETABLE STALL.

Conditions of Issue of Licence.

(i.) The premises must be in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted and every room must be provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open must not be less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

(ii.) The walls in every room must not be less than 7 feet in height and must be lime plastered and lime washed except such parts as are covered with glazed tiles or are plastered in cement.

(iii.) The eaves must be at least 6 feet from the ground.

(iv.) The woodwork must be oil painted or lime washed.

(v.) The floor must be cemented throughout.

(vi.) Every table on which fruits or vegetables are kept must be covered with zinc or other impermeable material.

(vii.) The premises must be provided with a sanitary dust bin and with sufficient latrine accommodation.

(viii.) The premises must be at least 50 feet distant from any latrine, cesspit, manure heap or open sewer.

(ix.) There must be no cesspit, latrine or ashpit within, or directly communicating with, the premises.

(d) POULTRY STALL.

Conditions of Issue of Licence.

(i.) The premises must be in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted and every room must be provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open must not be less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

(ii.) The walls in every room must not be less than 7 feet in height and must be lime plastered and lime washed except such parts as are covered with glazed tiles or are plastered in cement.

(iii.) The eaves must be at least 6 feet from the ground.

(iv.) The woodwork must be oil painted or lime washed.

(v.) The floor must be of smooth cement having a proper fall leading to a masonry drain built in cement and cement rendered and emptying into a bucket.

(vi.) Every table on which poultry is kept must be covered with zinc or other impermeable material.

(vii.) The premises must be provided with a sanitary dust bin and with sufficient latrine accommodation.

(viii.) The premises must be at least 50 feet distant from any latrine, cesspit, manure heap or open sewer.

(ix.) There must be no cesspit, latrine or ashpit within, or directly communicating with, the premises.

(x.) There must be a yard cemented and properly drained, for a poultry run.

(xi.) The yard must be detached from any building.

(xii.) For live poultry, such number of crates or other receptacles must be provided so as not to cause injury or unnecessary suffering to poultry confined therein. Such crates or other receptacles must be mounted on legs, or must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning.

(2) in by-law 4 under the aforesaid heading, by the substitution, for the words "in advance from time to time," of the words "by the occupant of every stall, space or seat,";

(3) by the substitution, for by-law 7 under the aforesaid heading, of the following new by-law :—

"7. Whenever the Board sets apart any market or portion of a market for the sale of any specified article, no person shall—

(a) sell or expose for sale in such market or portion of the market any article other than such specified article ; or

(b) sell or expose for sale such specified article in any market or portion of a market which has not been so set apart."

(4) by the substitution, for by-law 8 under the aforesaid heading, of the following new by-law :—

"8. No person shall take any cattle, sheep, goats, swine or other animals into any portion of a public market other than a portion which has been set apart therefor."

(5) by the substitution, for by-law 16 under the aforesaid heading, of the following new by-law :—

"16. (1) No person shall defecate or urinate or throw any skin, bone, offal, refuse or other matter on any premises or in any building forming part of or belonging to a public market or on any public road or path adjoining a public market.

(2) All skins, bones, offal, refuse or other matter shall be placed in the covered bin or receptacle provided for the purpose by the Board."

(6) by the addition, immediately after by-law 18 under the aforesaid heading, of the following new by-laws 19 and 20 :—

"19. No person shall, within the limits of any public market or on any public road or path adjoining such public market, kill any animal or flay or disembowel any carcase.

20. The period for which any public market or any portion of a public market is let to any person on lease by the Board shall in no case exceed twelve months."

(7) under the heading "B—General", by the substitution, in paragraph (a), for all the words from "No person" to "common lodging house", of the following :—

"No person shall establish or keep within the limits of any Sanitary Board town any bakery, eating-house, tea or coffee boutique, cattle gala, dairy, laundry, or common lodging-house, or establish or keep within the limits of any Sanitary Board town in which a public market has not been established, any butchers' stall or fish stall".

The Moratuwa Street Collections Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Moratuwa Street Collections Regulations, 1939.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Board" means the Board of Control established by these regulations for the area within the administrative limits of the Moratuwa Urban District Council;

"Charity" means the charitable institution or purpose for the use or benefit of which a collection or sale is held;

"collecting committee" means the body of persons organizing or promoting and conducting or supervising any collection or sale;

"collection" means the collection of money for any charitable or other similar purpose;

"collector" means a person participating in any collection by taking money from the public for the purposes of such collection;

"Executive Committee" means the Executive Committee of Local Administration;

"Fund" means the fund which is or is to be set apart for any charitable or philanthropic purpose and for which a collection or sale is held;

"sale" means a sale of articles held for any charitable or other similar purpose;

"vendor" means a person participating in any sale by selling to the public the article or articles provided for the purposes of such sale.

3. For the purpose of supervising and controlling the collection of money or sale of articles for charitable or other similar purposes in any street or other public place within the administrative limits of the Moratuwa Urban District Council there shall be a Board of Control which is hereby established, consisting of—

(a) the Chairman of the Moratuwa Urban District Council, as Chairman of the Board),

(b) one person nominated from time to time by the Executive Committee on the recommendation of the Moratuwa Social Service Society, Ltd.,

(c) one person nominated from time to time by the Executive Committee on the recommendation of the Moratuwa Friend-in-Need Society, Ltd., and

(d) two persons nominated from time to time by the Executive Committee on the recommendation of the Moratuwa Urban District Council.

4. (1) No person shall organize or promote any collection or sale in any street or public place within the administrative limits of the Moratuwa Urban District Council—

(a) unless he is a member of a collecting committee of not less than three persons appointed with the object of organizing or promoting such collection or sale by any society or association, or by the managing body of any Charity or Fund, or by a representative meeting of the section of the public interested in any charitable purpose or institution; and

(b) unless such collecting committee has obtained from the Board, in the manner hereinafter prescribed, a permit authorizing the collection or sale;

Provided, however, that nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit or affect in any other way—

(i.) any collection taken at an open-air meeting; or

(ii.) the sale of any article in any street or public place in the ordinary course of trade, or for the purpose of earning a livelihood, without any representation being made by or on behalf of the seller that any part of the proceeds of sale will be devoted to any charitable purpose.

(2) No person who is a member of a collecting committee to which a permit is issued under these regulations shall cause or permit the collection to be taken or the sale to be held otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of the permit.

5. Every application for a permit shall—

(a) be substantially in Form A set out in the Schedule hereto;

(b) be signed by every member of the collecting committee organizing the collection or sale for which the permit is required;

- (c) be addressed to the Chairman of the Board ; and
 (d) be made not later than the first day of the month preceding the month fixed for the collection or sale :

Provided, however, that the Board may in the special circumstances of any case entertain an application notwithstanding that such application is made later than the aforesaid date.

6. The following shall be conditions attached to every permit issued by the Board :—

- (1) The collection shall be taken or the sale held only on the day and between the hours and in the districts, streets, or places specified in the permit.
- (2) No person under the age of fourteen years shall be authorized or permitted to act as a collector or vendor.
- (3) Every person authorized to act as a collector or vendor shall, before the hour fixed for the commencement of the collection or sale, be given a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority.
- (4) All boxes or other receptacles in which the collection or the purchase money is to be placed shall be numbered serially and shall be securely closed and sealed in a manner capable of preventing the extraction of money placed therein without breaking the seal, and a record shall be kept of the serial number of each box or receptacle issued to each person who is authorized to act as collector or vendor.
- (5) Every such box or receptacle shall bear prominently displayed thereon—
 - (a) the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held ;
 - (b) the date of the collection or sale ; and
 - (c) the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle.
- (6) No payment shall be made or reward given—
 - (a) to any collector or vendor for his services in connection with the collection or sale ; or
 - (b) directly or indirectly to any other person connected with the promotion or conduct of the collection or sale, unless the name of that person and the nature of the payment or reward have been specified in the application made for the permit.

7. No person shall act as a collector or vendor in connection with any collection or sale—

- (a) if he is under fourteen years of age ; or
- (b) if he is not the holder of a written authority in that behalf under the hand of the secretary or other member empowered by the collecting committee to issue such authority ; or
- (c) if he knows or has reason to believe that the collection or sale has not been authorized by a permit issued by the Board.

8. No person acting as a collector or vendor, in connection with any collection or sale shall—

- (a) carry or use any collecting box or receptacle for money which is not securely closed and sealed and which does not bear prominently displayed thereon—
 - (i.) the name of the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection is taken or the sale is held ;
 - (ii.) the date of the collection or sale ; and
 - (iii.) the serial number assigned by the collecting committee to that box or receptacle ;
- (b) carry on the collection or sale on any date, or at any time, or in any district or street or place, other than that specified in the permit issued in that behalf ; or
- (c) carry on the collection or sale in any part of the carriage-way of any street, or in such manner on any part of the foot-way of a street or in any public place as to cause obstruction or annoyance to any person lawfully using such street or public place ; or
- (d) use for the purposes of the collection or sale any table exceeding 30 inches in length or 20 inches in width, or use any table in a manner which causes or is likely to cause obstruction to the public ; or
- (e) keep any animal with him at the place where he is to carry on the collection or sale ; or

- (f) in the course of the collection or sale importune any person to the annoyance of that person ; or
- (g) fail to place any money received in the course of the collection or sale in the sealed box or receptacle or one of the sealed boxes or receptacles issued to him for the purpose ; or
- (h) fail or refuse for any reason after the close of the collection or sale to deliver each of the boxes or receptacles issued to him, with the seals intact, to the person authorized by the collecting committee to take charge of such boxes or receptacles.

9. Every person acting as a collector or vendor shall produce forthwith for inspection on the demand of any Police Officer, or a member of the collecting committee, the written authority issued to him by the collecting committee.

10. (1) Within one month after the date of any collection or sale the collecting committee shall—

- (a) cause a statement of the amount received and the expenditure incurred in connection with such collection or sale to be prepared substantially in Form B set out in the Schedule hereto, and to be signed by two of the office-bearers authorized in that behalf by the committee ;
- (b) cause the statement to be audited by the auditor appointed by the committee or where there is no such auditor, by a responsible person who is not a member of the committee ; and
- (c) forward to the Chairman of the Board the original of the statement so audited, together with receipts or vouchers in proof of the items of expenditure set out in the statement.

(2) In any case where the expenses of a collection or sale are defrayed wholly or in part by any contributions distinct from the amount collected or realized, particulars of such contributions shall be inserted in the statement both under the head "Receipts" and under the head "Expenditure".

11. Every collecting committee shall, if required so to do by the Board, produce proof to the satisfaction of the Board as to the due application of the proceeds of the collection or sale to the Charity or Fund or the purpose for which the collection or sale was conducted.
