BY-LAW.

The by-laws published in Gazette No. 7,929 of June 10, 1932, as amended by by-law published in *Gazette* No. 8,135 of July 26, 1935, are hereby further amended by the addition immediately after by-law 16, of the following new by-law

- "17. (1) The Council may, with the approval of the Governor, pay a gratuity in accordance with the provisions of this by-law to the widow or to the children or to the dependants of any officer or servant who dies in the service of the Council after he has completed five years' public service as defined in by-law 13 (2) and while he is in receipt of a salary of not less than Rs. 360 per annum.
 - (2) (a) In the case of any officer or servant referred to in paragraph (1) who was holding a post on the fixed establishment of the Council at the time of his death, the gratuity payable under this by-law shall be a sum equal to twelve times the monthly salary drawn by him in respect of that post at that time.
 - (b) In the case of any officer or servant referred to in paragraph (1) who was not on the fixed establishment of the Council at the time of his death, the gratuity payable under this by-law shall be a sum equal to three times the monthly salary of the post held by him at that time; and an additional sum equal to such monthly salary for each minor child surviving him.

(3) The gratuity shall be payable-

- (a) Where the widow of the deceased officer or servant survives him, to such widow, whether or not there is any child of such widow surviving him;
- (b) where the widow, whether with or without children, and also children by a previous marriage of the deceased officer or servant, survive him, to the widow and to the children of such previous marriage in such manner and in such proportion as the Council may determine; or

(c) where there is no widow surviving, to the children of the deceased officer or servant in such manner and in such proportion as the Council may determine; or

(d) where there is no widow or child of the deceased officer or servant surviving him, to the dependants who were living with and maintained by him at the time of his death.

(4) Where any child, to whom the amount of any gratuity or share of a gratuity is payable under this by-law, is a minor, such amount may be paid to some person approved by the Council, for the use and benefit of such child."

I have the honour to state on behalf of His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and of the Government of India, that they agree to the following provisions as constituting an agreement on a reciprocal basis between them and the Government of the Republic:—

- 2. The operation of the agreement is limited in all cases to persons who are not prohibited immigrants in the terms of the Immigration Regulations in force at the place of arrival.
- 3. The present note and your Excellency's reply of the same date in a similar sense shall be regarded as placing on record the understanding arrived at in this matter, which may be terminated on either side by three months' notice given through the diplomatic channel.

- (1) As from the date of this note, all Belgian nationals arriving by air as members of the operating personnel of aircraft employed on regular Belgian air lines and registered in Belgium, the Belgian Congo or Ruanda-Urundi, may enter the United Kingdom or Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Commonwealth of Australia, New Zealand and India, upon the production, in lieu of national passports, of a licence in the form of which a specimen is hereto attached.(1)
- (2) The above provision is regarded as also applying to Newfoundland, to all British colonies and to all territories under the protection of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and to the following territories in respect of which mandates on behalf of the League of Nations have been accepted by Him, namely, Palestine (including Transjordan), Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British mandate, and Togoland under British mandate (administered by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom), New Guinea (administered by His Majesty's Government in the Commonwealth of Australia), Western Samoa (administered by His Majesty's Government in New Zealand), and Nauru (at present administered by His Majesty's Government in the Commonwealth of Australia).
- (3) As from the date of this note, all British subjects or British-protected persons arriving by air as members of the operating personnel of aircraft employed on regular British air lines, and registered in any of the territories under the sovereignty, protection, suzerainty or mandate of His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland, the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, may enter Belgium, the Belgian Congo and Ruanda-Urundi, upon the production, in lieu of national passports, of certificates of competency and licences in the form of which specimens are hereto attached. (1) (The specimens attached are of certificates issued in the United Kingdom. The certificates and licences issued in the Commonwealth of Australia, New Zealand, India, Newfoundland and in the British colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories concerned are in the standard form prescribed in Annex E to the International Air Navigation Convention, and are thus similar in form to those issued in the United Kingdom. They contain, however, appropriate variations in matters of detail.)

(4) The present agreement shall not affect existing requirements in respect of visas for entry into the territories concerned.

(5) The provisions of the agreement do not absolve holders of certificates in either of the forms hereto annexed from compliance with the immigration regulations in force at the place of arrival.

(6) The licences referred to in provision (1) and the certificates of competency and licences referred to in provision (3) shall be exempt from stamping on entry and departure.

2. The operation of the agreement is limited in all cases to persons who are not prohibited immigrants in the terms of the Immigration Regulations in force at the place of arrival.

3. This agreement shall remain in force until six months after notice of termination has been given. Such notification shall specify the Government or Governments in respect of which termination is desired.

The above provision is regarded as also applying to Newfoundland, to all British colonies and to all territories under the protection of His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and to the following territories in respect of which mandates on behalf of the League of Nations have been accepted by Him, namely, Palestine (including Transjordon), Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British mandate, and Togoland under British mandate (administered by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom), New Guinea (administered by His Majesty's Government in the Common wealth of Australia), Western Samoa (administered by His Majesty's Government in New Zealand), and Nauru (at present administered by His Majesty's Government in the Commonwealth of Australia).

The present agreement shall not affect existing requirements in respect of visas for entry into the territories concerned.

The provisions of the agreement do not absolve holders of certificates of competency or licences from compliance with the immigration regulations in force at the place of arrival.

The certificates of competency and licences referred to above shall be exempt from stamping on entry and departure.

The operation of the agreement is limited in all cases to persons who are not prohibited immigrants in the terms of the immigration regulations in force at the place of arrival.

This agreement, which may be denounced at any time, shall remain in force for six months after notice of denunciation by one of the contracting parties.

Such denunciation shall affect only those territories specified, the agreement

remaining in force for the other territories.



General Meeting.

Wednesday, June 7, 1939, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated May 30, 1939.

Present.—Dr. V. R. Schokman, the Mayor, presiding; Mr. M. Subbiah, Deputy Mayor; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. R. F. S. de Mel; Mr. J. R. Dharmasena; Mr. R. Doresamy; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. C. W. S. Fernando; Dr. S. D. Fernando; Mr. D. S. Fonseka; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C.; Mr. N. M. M. Ishak; Mr. Merrill W. Pereira; Mr. John A. Pye, B.Sc.; Dr. A. Ratnapala; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Mr. N. Saravanamuttu; Dr. R. Saravanamuttu, M.B.; Mr. S. Saravanamuttu; Mr. V. R. Somanathan; Mr. J. Tyagaraja and the Municipal Commissioner.

- 1. Before proceeding with the business for the day, the Mayor extended a welcome to Mr. J. A. Henley, Mayor of Drummoyne, Australia, on behalf of the Municipal Council of Colombo.
- 2. The minutes of the General Meeting of May 10, 1939, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.
 - 3. The Mayor extended a welcome to Mr. John A. Pye, the new Nominated Member.
- 4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. A. Ratnapala, M.M.C., presented a petition from Mr. G. P. Jayasinghe, who had been discontinued from service, praying that he be given a gratuity considering his 25 years' faithful services, and requested the Mayor to refer it to the appropriate Committee for consideration and report.
- 5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. Saravanamuttu, M.M.C., moved: "That this Council do grant a lease of No. 10/32, Green Path, Colpetty, to H. Charles de Silva, son of the late H. Andris de Silva the previous lessee of the above-mentioned premises." Mr. V. R. Somanathan seconded.

ANNEXURE "C".

REPORT OF THE RENT RESTRICTION SUB-COMMITTEE.

A.

Of the two motions passed on October 6, 1937, viz., (1) that a Rent Restriction Ordinance should be introduced more or less in accordance with the terms of the draft Ordinance attached to the motion, and (2) that the law be amended relating to the assessment of properties in Colombo, the more important is undoubtedly the 2nd motion above-named. After careful consideration, we are of opinion that the law relating to the assessment of properties in Colombo should be amended in the manner mentioned below.

As the law now stands, under section 120 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Municipality has got the right to ask for returns of the rent or annual value of properties from the owner or occupier only for purposes of valuation. Further the penalty is only a fine not exceeding Rs. 100 for a false return or a refusal to make a return. If we compare this section 120 with the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, sections 179 and 180, it will be seen that so far as District Councils are concerned, the Local Authority has got much wider power. We are therefore of opinion that section 120 should be repealed and the law be amended giving-

(1) the Municipality power to revise the assessments of properties in Colombo periodically, say once in every 5 years, ward by ward;

(2) whenever the Municipality has given notice of such revision in any ward, the Municipal Assessor or the Commissioner should be given the power to require the owner, occupier and tenant of every house, building, or land to furnish a return of the rent or annual value thereof, the penalty for a refusal or for false return being Rs. 500 or six months rigorous imprisonment:

(3) the power to call for returns should not only be for the purpose of the periodical assessment, but also at any time and from time to time for the purpose of "the ascertainment of any information which in the opinion of the Commissioner shall be necessary " (see section 179 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920);

(4) the Municipality should be given the right to enter and inspect and survey any house, building or land at reasonable times;

(5) the Municipality should have the right also to summon and question any occupier, owner or tenant of the house, land or building for the above purposes with the same penalty mentioned above.

(6) We are of opinion that objections to assessments should not be heard by the Assessment Department but by an independent Committee composed, say of three Members, to be appointed from amongst the Members of the Municipal Council as well as from outside the Council.

This Committee should also have the power of hearing proposals for the reduction of the assessments for the following year made by any person to the Assessment Department provided that such application shall be heard by the Committee only if the Assessment Department is not satisfied with the evidence placed before it for the proposed reduction of assessonly if the Assessment Department is not satisfied with the evidence placed before it for the proposed roduction of the assessment for the following year is justified on the evidence placed before it, the necessary alteration can be made for the next year. If the Assessing Department is not so satisfied, there should be a right of appeal to the Committee.

There should be a right of action in a Court of Law for the purpose of testing the decision of the Committee, as in

the existing law.

В.

As regards the first motion, we have had several representations from landlords, but only one on behalf of the tenants of small buildings. The Draft Ordinance was based on legislation passed in India, Rangoon, and Singapore, and a notice was published inviting criticism from the public. It was not meant to be passed in tact as it stood, but was drafted with the object of inviting public comments. We are satisfied that it will not be advisable to pass the bill as drafted for the reasons given by the landlords. In spite, however, of the vehement protests of the landlords, we are firmly convinced that some relief should be given to the tenants of small buildings. Such relief can be given without unsettling the exisiting

- 1. (a) In the first place, we think the Small Tenements Ordinance, No. 11 of 1882, should be amended in two respects. The word "tenement" should mean a house or other building or room which may be rented, exclusive of all taxes, rates and assessments, for a sum of not exceeding Rs. 30 instead of Rs. 20 as at present.

 (b) Some provision should be made in the Small Tenements Ordinance introducing the English Law relating to
- Landlords' lien.

We understand that owing to a decision of the Supreme Court a landlord has no right to stop a tenant from removing his furniture for arrears of rent due unless he has obtained an order of Court to back him up. We think that power should be given to landlords to stop the removal of property by a tenant who tries to evade payment of arrears of rent.

- 2. No landlord should have the right to increase the rent of a tenement, the monthly rental of which is Rs. 30 or under, above the assessed annual rent as assessed in the Municipal books, without getting the permission of the Municipal Magistrate. Such application should be dealt with summarily after notice to the tenants and the Municipal Authorities. Similarly no landlord should have the right to bring an action in any Civil Court in Ceylon to recover any sum above the assessed monthly rent as rent without getting the special permission of the Municipal Magistrate as stated above.
- 3. No action to recover rent in respect of a tenement not assessed with a separate number in the Municipal Assessment books should be allowed to be brought in any Civil Court, except with the previous sanction of the Municipal Magistrate obtained as stated above. This is to prevent a dwelling house being divided into cubicles for the purpose of being let.
- 4. A right of appeal should be provided from the decision of the Municipal Magistrate, say to the Commissioner of the Court of Requests, the party appealing furnishing security in a sum not exceeding Rs. 25, the cost of appeal being taxed as in an ordinary action in a Court of Requests.
- 5. There should be provision made that no premium is to be chargeable in respect of a tenancy and a penalty provided for disturbance of easements by the landlord in order to get rid of an unsatisfactory tenant.

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 27, 1939, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated May 23, 1939.

Present:—Mr. M. K. T. Sandys, Chairman; Sir Cudah Ratwatte; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. W. Beven; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Dr. E. S. Godlieb; Mr. O. T. Nettelton.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on April 22, 1939, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

The following documents were submitted:-

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1938 to April 30, 1939, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April, 1939.

(e) The reservoir readings for the week ending May 27, 1939.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 'The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the Government Gazette.

3a. Mr. de Silva inquired why water was still being delivered by lorry when the level of the reservoir had risen. and water from the wells in Peradeniya could be brought up to Queen's Hotel junction along the Peradeniya road main, He also alleged that an old lorry was being used and its jerks made the water from the tank to spill all along the road.

The Works Engineer was called in. He explained that if the lorry was stopped the daily draw from the reservoir would rise from 350,000 gallons to 600,000 gallons per diem. He was experimenting with methods of regulating supply

so that the daily draw might not exceed 500,000 gallons per diem. He hoped to complete these experiments next week when he would stop the lorry.

As regards the actual lorry in use the Works Engineer explained that the lorry was the cheapest offered when

quotations were last invited for lorries for the distribution of water.

The Works Engineer also undertook to look into the question whether water from the wells in Feradeniya should be delivered up to Queen's Hotel junction, from the point of view of the cost of pumping.

3B. The Chairman read the following statement indicating the present position with regard to the Hunnasgiriya Scheme:—"My letter giving full details and asking that a grant and loan should be considered with all possible speed was sent to the Commissioner of Local Government on November 28, 1938. On December 13, the Commissioner of Local Government wrote that he had just completed his report to the Treasury, and agreed to do everything possible to expedite the matter which he agreed to be of the greatest urgency. In January, 1939, the Deputy Financial Secretary, Mr. Collins, wrote that the matter had to be reconsidered by the Board of Ministers and that it would appear to rest with the Honourable the Minister of Local Administration to consult the Honourable the Financial Secretary in the first instance.

This report was sent on March 21 with a covering letter urging on the Commissioner of Local Government the need to do something during the life of the present Council. On April 28, I sent a final reminder; and a few days ago I received from the Commissioner of Local Government a letter dated May 17, 1939, which reads as follows:—'With reference to your letter No. G 341 of April 28, 1939, I am directed by the Honourable the Minister for Local Administration to inform you that the Board of Ministers will be considering shortly a resolution to make a grant to the Municipal Council of Rs. 757,800.—The day before yesterday, May 25, I applied to the Chairman, Local Loans and Development Fund for a loan of the same amount".

Mr. de Silva suggested that the Maha-oya streams which lie within 2½ miles of Kandy fall within the land that would be acquired for purposes of the University, and the possibility of using these streams for supplying the town might be considered as it would be much cheaper than the Hunnasgiriya scheme.

Mr. Nettelton agreed that Maha-oya might be considered as a subsidiery scheme but suggested that the perpendi

4. Petitions:—Mr. Wijayatilake presented: (1) Petition from Mr. T. J. Hassan dated May 26, 1939, suggesting that the arrears of rates due on Nos. 882, 876 and other properties belonging to him and other heirs be taken from the surplus of proceeds of sale of 889 Peradeniya road. Mr. de Silva presented: (2) Petition from Mr. J. W. William dated May 27, 1939, complaining that the sum of Rs. 280 98 due to him on a contract had been remitted to the Government Agent, North-Central Province. Mr. Soysa presented: (3) Petition from Mr. K. B. Dissanayake dated May 25, 1939, objecting to a large portion of his land being taken for the further section of the new Bahirawakanda road. (4) Letter from Mr. P. K. Cader Meera Saibo dated May 22, 1939, asking that Space No. 1 in the Public Market be transferred in favour of Messrs. K. A. Meera Saibo and K. A. Peer Mohamado.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in petitions (1) and (3).

As regards (2) it was explained that the money was seized on a writ issued by the District Court, Anuradhapura, and the amount was remitted to the Government-Agent, North-Central Province, on an order of court.

Petition No. (4) was reserved for consideration with item 11 on the agenda.

5. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-

Sale of Ferry Toll Rents, Jaffna District, 1939-40.

NOTICE is hereby given that sealed tenders will be received by the Government Agent, Northern Province, or by his office assistant at the Jaffina Kachcheri, at 12 noon, on Friday, August 11, 1939, for the purchase of the following ferry toll rents for the period October 1, 1939, to September 30, 1940:—

- (1) Pannaiturai.
- (2) Araliturai.
- 2. Tenders must be handed in personally accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of Rs. 50. If any tenderer or bidder, on being declared to be the purchaser of the rent, declines or fails to make the deposit of one-tenth of the purchase amount hereinafter referred to and to sign the conditions of sale, or fails to furnish the required security when called upon to do so, the tender deposit of Rs. 50 or any part payment made on account of the one-tenth of the purchase amount will be declared forfeited and the defaulter will render himself liable to have his name entered in the List of Defaulters. Subject to this exception, the deposits of all other tenderers or bidders will be returned after the conditions of sale have been signed by the successful tenderer or bidder. No tender received by post will be accepted, nor will any tender received after the day and hour mentioned above be considered. A separate tender must be made in respect of each of the above-mentioned rents.
- 3. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit forthwith one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash, and should the offer be accepted by His Excellency the Governor

- to furnish approved security for one-half of the purchase amount, or security in each for one-third of the purchase amount, within a period of 20 days after the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the Governor's acceptance of his offer.
- 4. The successful tenderer shall also deposit on the day of sale a sum to be fixed by the Government Agent as security for the payment of the cost of all repairs to the ferry boats.
- 5. The successful tenderer will also be required to deposit an amount sufficient to pay the fees of the Crown Proctor for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of properties tendered by the successful tenderer as security, for examining and settling the security bond, and for examining documents and drawing the security bond, and to meet the expenses of appraising the properties and the stamp duty due on the bond under the Stamps Ordinance.
- 6. All title deeds tendered as security must be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the lands to which they relate are unencumbered. This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering the security.
- 7. Further information may be obtained on application to the Government Agent, Jaffna.
- 8. Rents for which tenders are not received will be put up to auction after the opening of the tenders, on the day for which tenders are called.
- 9. The Government Agent reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders.
