THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Dewundera Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale in the Matara District, Southern Province, commencing in July, 1939.

PILGRIMAGE TO DEWUNDERA SRI VISHNU MAHA DEWALE.

Regulations.

- In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity immediately before or during the pilgrimage, or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage, or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all pilgrims to leave Dondra forthwith and return to their homes, and to prescribe the routes by which they shall depart.
- No person who is suffering from a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature shall enter Dondra.
- 3. No person shall bring any person suffering from a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature into Dondra, or aid or abet any such person in entering Dondra.
- 4. Every person who contracts a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other

person has contracted any such disease, shall forthwith report the case to the Sanitary Assistant or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police at Dondra.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

- (4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purpose of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

- (5) cause all straw, rubbish, cattle dung, or any kind of litter to be collected at least once every day, and burned or buried at a place appointed for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board.
- No person shall use any place for the offices of nature other than (a) a place set apart for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board, or (b) a latrine provided by the proprietor or lessee of the premises used for the accommodation of the pilgrims.

The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the urban area or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles, shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned within seven days by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.
- 2. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.
- 4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.
- 5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Council on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year in respect of all vehicles other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used within the limits of the Council.
- 6. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto, and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by such owner of 50 cents.
- 7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate referred to in by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which such plate was issued.
- 8. (1) Every contravention of by-law 1 or by-law 2 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.
- (2) Every contravention of by-law 7 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

Gunatilaka Wijesingha had no authority to make these entries or to issue the certificates or to register the marriages as he was not the duly appointed Registrar of Marriages on these dates.

LOAN BOARD.

Report for the Year 1938.

THE annual report of the Commissioners of the Loan Board for the year 1938, is submitted together with the statement of the Loan Board Funds duly audited by the Auditor-General.

Loans amounting to Rs. 811,600 were granted during the year. This includes the amounts received and paid out on conversion loans at the reduced rates of interest. The corresponding figure for the previous year was Rs. 1,144,600.

Repayments.—During the year a sum of Rs. 671,027 was received in repayment of principal; this includes the amounts repaid for conversion loans.

Purchase and Sale of Securities.—During the year two securities were bought in for loans aggregationg Rs. 128,000 and securities to the amount of Rs. 86,650 were sold in settlement of their relative loans.

A sum of Rs. 6,000 was transferred from the Reserve and Depreciation Fund to meet the depreciation on one security.

Interest.—The amount of interest collected during the year amounted to Rs. 564,816·83 as against Rs. 402,334·67 in 1937. The interest collected was insufficient for the payment of two half-yearly dividends of even 2 per cent. each and therefore a sum of Rs. 7,032·06 had to be withdrawn from profits account to allow the payment of these dividends.






