IT is hereby notified that the Public Service Regulations published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, as amended by the notification dated November 9, 1936, have been further amended by the deletion of Public Service Regulation 125B and the substitution therefor of the following regulation:—

125B. Where a Public Officer is convicted in a Court of Justice on a criminal charge, the Court should report his conviction and the nature of the offence of which he was convicted to the Head of his Department. The Head of the Department concerned shall thereupon report the conviction to the Chief Secretary, making a recommendation as to the punishment (if any) to be inflicted and forwarding the Court record if available.

Provided that in the case of a conviction in the Village Tribunals a report by the Head of the Department shall only be made in the case of pensionable officers drawing over Rs. 1,500 per annum or non-pensionable officers drawing over Rs. 3,000 per annum.

If an appeal is made to a higher Court against the conviction, the lower Court should so report to the Head of the Department, and the final decision in regard to disciplinary action will not be taken until the appeal has been decided.

The regulations published in *Gazette* No. 7,611 of October 21, 1927, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,149 of October 4, 1935, are hereby further

amended with effect from July 31 1939, by the substitution for Schedules A, B, and C respectively of the following new schedules :—

## Class I.

All persons having annual incomes of Rs. 6,000 and over, and the following persons irrespective of their incomes :—

- (i.) Military and Naval Officers not being in the employ of the Ceylon Government.
- (ii.) Unofficial Magistrates.
- (iii.) Commanders of the Mercantile Marine.

## Class II.

All persons having annual incomes of Rs. 3,600 and under Rs. 6,000, and the following persons irrespective of their incomes :—

- (i.) Clergymen of Christian denominations.
- (ii.) Priests.
- (iii.) Inquirers under the Criminal Procedure Code not in Government employ.

## Class III.

All persons having annual incomes of Rs. 1,500 and under Rs. 3,600, and the following persons irrespective of their incomes :—

- (i.) Soldiers and sailors not being in the employ of the Ceylon Government.

## Class IV.

All persons not included in any of the above Classes and having annual incomes of Rs. 500 and under Rs. 1,500.

All persons in Class V. when giving evidence beyond the limits of the area over which the local District Court has jurisdiction.

## Class V.

All persons not included in any of the above Classes and having annual incomes of less than Rs. 500.

*Note.*—(i.) Any person falling within any of the categories specified in clauses (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) of Class II. or in clause (i.) of Class III. and having an income exceeding the limit prescribed for that class shall be classified according to his income.

(ii.) A female witness shall be entitled to receive payment at the same rate as her husband or father. A male child who has not attained the age of 21 years and who is not employed for remuneration shall be entitled to receive payment at the same rate as his father or mother. A child witness under 12 years of age and accompanied by a parent or other relative summoned as a witness in the same case, shall be entitled to receive payment at half rates.

(iii.) The annual income of any person shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions :—

- (a) in the case of any person whose income has been assessed for the purposes of the Income Tax Ordinance at any time during the two years immediately preceding the date on which the claim for payment is made, the assessable income of that person as last determined under that Ordinance shall be deemed to be his annual income ;
- (b) in the case of any person whose income has not been so assessed during the two years immediately preceding the date on which the claim for payment is made, the gross income of that person for the period of twelve months ending on the 31st day of March immediately preceding that date, less the expenses incurred during that period in earning that income, shall be deemed to be his annual income.

CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED ENGLISH SCHOOLS.

THE following amendments to the Code of Regulations for Assisted English Schools, which have been approved by the Board of Education are hereby published for general information in accordance with section 10 (2) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 39a.—

Delete the first part of condition (1) in lines 6 to 47 of this clause. (Quota for Vernacular Schools, Bilingual (non-boarding) Schools, and Bilingual Girls Boarding Schools down to the words ". . . . . except in the case of English Teachers ") and substitute the following :—

(1) *Vernacular Schools and Bilingual (Non-boarding) Schools*.—Vernacular schools and bilingual (non-boarding) schools which have an average attendance of not more than 210 eligible pupils in the primary classes will be allowed to count one teacher for every 30 units of average attendance. When the average attendance of eligible pupils exceeds 210 the allowance will be 7 teachers for the first 210 units and one teacher for every additional 35 units.

The allowance of teachers in the post-primary classes shall be determined separately in accordance with the following rule.

Schools which have an average attendance of not more than 200 eligible pupils in the post-primary classes will be allowed to count one teacher for every 25 units of average attendance. For the units of average attendance over 200, one teacher will be allowed for every 30 units.

*Bilingual Girls Boarding Schools*.—Bilingual Girls boarding schools which have an average attendance of not more than 200 eligible pupils will be allowed to count one teacher for every 25 units of average attendance. For the units of average attendance over 200 one teacher will be allowed for every 30 units.

Average attendance shall be reckoned for the school year, viz., the 12 months preceding the usual date of collection of the annual returns.

In Bilingual Schools the quota of English teachers included in the above staff shall be 30 units of average attendance of pupils learning English in classes above and including Standard IV. for one full-time or part-time teacher.

Fractions of over one half the quota shall count for an additional teacher except in the case of English teachers in Bilingual Schools.

This rule shall come into force from the date on which it has been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this rule a vacancy may be filled by the appointment of a teacher who is undergoing training in a Government or Assisted Training School in Ceylon at the time this rule comes into force, or who has, not more than two years before the date of this rule, completed a course of training in such training school and has been unemployed since the completion of his course, provided that such teacher has, prior to the commencement of his course of training, been employed as a member of the staff of a registered school for at least one year, and, provided that the filling of such vacancy does not permit the school to have a larger staff than that allowed by the conditions in force before the date of this rule.

In sub-paragraph (a) line 3 after the words " last day of the school year or over " delete " 18 " and substitute " 17 " .



*Clause 40.*—Delete and substitute :—

The grant payable on account of English teachers on the eligible staffs of Bilingual Schools shall be the difference between the approved salaries of these teachers in accordance with Appendices B or D and the Manager's contribution as shown in Appendix C.

The above appendices shall continue to apply to those teachers who are on the staffs of Bilingual Schools on the date on which this rule comes into force for the rest of the period they are in service in the same schools or when two such teachers in different schools change places with the approval of the Director, or when one such teacher changes places with a similar teacher in an English School with the approval of the Director or is transferred to a registered new school with the approval of the Director. But when a vacancy occurs for an English teacher in a Bilingual School after the date on which this rule comes into force it shall be filled in the manner indicated in Clause 36A and the grant payable shall be the difference between the approved salary in accordance with Appendix C and the Manager's contribution as shown in the same Appendix.

This rule shall come into force from the date on which it has been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*.

*Clause 55.*—Insert a new Sub-Clause :—

(f) A period of no-pay leave not exceeding two years may be granted to any teacher for the purpose of undergoing training in a registered Government or Assisted Training School. Before granting such leave the Manager shall supply the Director with an undertaking to re-employ the teacher at the end of his course of training. During such leave a substitute may, with the permission of the Director, be appointed.

*Appendix C.*—Delete the heading to the first part of Appendix C and substitute the following heading :—

“ Fixed contributions from Managers towards the Salaries of English Teachers in Bilingual Schools.”  
Delete note “ This contribution is . . . . . Scale C for English Schools.”

Delete the heading and scales in the second part of Appendix C (Fixed contributions from Managers towards the salaries of Women Teachers in Vernacular and Bilingual Girls' and in Vernacular and Bilingual Mixed Schools).

*Insert a New Clause 36A.*—

(a) Any teacher appointed to a school after the date on which this rule comes into force will be placed on the salary scale appropriate to his qualifications and the class in which he fills a vacancy.

There shall be five classes of teachers to which the salary scales in Appendix E for new appointments shall apply.

No appointment to any class shall be made without the approval of the Director.

(b) For the purpose of allotting the proportion of teachers in the various classes there shall be a standard staff fixed for each school. The standard staff for any school shall be as shown in Appendix F and shall be fixed by the average attendance of eligible pupils for the previous school year. In vernacular schools and bilingual (non-boarding) schools which have post-primary as well as primary classes, the standard staff shall be determined by the total eligible staff obtained by adding the eligible staff for the post-primary classes to that for the primary classes. In the case of new schools the Director shall decide the standard staff for the first school year.

(c) The Director shall fix the standard staffs for Bilingual Schools by substituting for posts indicated in Appendix F posts for English teachers according to the number of English teachers allowed by attendance. The highest post in the standard staff shall be one of those substituted. English teachers shall be classified according to the rules of Clause 30B of the Code for Assisted English Schools and the posts for English teachers substituted by the Director shall in no case allow the school to have a higher classification of English teachers than that indicated for an English School of the same total staff.

(d) For the purpose of assessing the quality of the staff of each school at the date on which this rule comes into force the eligible staff shall be allocated to classes as follows :—

Existing English teachers in service in Bilingual Schools shall be classified according to the rules in Clause 30B sub-paragraph (c) of the Code for Assisted English Schools.

As long as such Vernacular and English teachers continue to fill the posts occupied by them at the time of grading, or if they exchange places with teachers of the same class in another school or fill posts in registered new schools with the approval of the Director, their salary scales will continue to be those of Appendices, A, B, or D of the Code, and they shall be eligible to be placed on any other scale to which they may become entitled by reason of improvement of qualifications. But when a vacancy occurs in any school it shall be filled by the appointment of a teacher to a class in which there is a vacancy.

A vacancy shall not be deemed to have arisen in any particular class in any school unless the aggregate number of teachers in that class and in all higher classes is less than the aggregate shown in the table of standard staffs.

(e) Managers of schools shall not transfer a teacher from one school to fill a vacancy in a lower class in the same or another school unless the consent of the teacher has been obtained or good reasons are shown on disciplinary grounds for the transfer.

(f) A Manager may make application to the Director to have the entire staff of his school brought under the provisions of this Clause, but such request shall not be granted, unless the quota of teachers is in accordance with the amendment to Clause 39A of the Code and the teachers have consented to the proposal.

(g) No new school shall be registered unless the staff conforms to the minimum qualifications of the standard staff specified in Appendix E.

This rule shall come into force from the date on which it has been approved by His Excellency the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this rule a teacher who is undergoing training in a Government or Assisted Training School in Ceylon at the time this rule comes into force, or who has, not more than two years before the date of this rule, completed a course of training in such training school and has been unemployed since the date of completion of his course, shall, on appointment to a school, be placed on the salary scale appropriate to his qualifications in Appendix A of the Code, or, if an English teacher in a bilingual school, Appendix B or D with Manager's contribution as in Appendix C, provided that such teacher has, prior to the commencement of his course of training, been employed as a member of the staff of a registered school for at least one year. Such teacher may, however, be given the option of coming under the provisions of this rule, if he so desires.

## CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED VERNACULAR AND BILINGUAL SCHOOLS.

THE following amendments to the Code of Regulations for Assisted Vernacular and Bilingual Schools, which have been approved by the Board of Education are hereby published for general information in accordance with section 10 (2) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

## AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

*Clause 31A.—*

Delete condition (1) in lines 6–13 of this clause and substitute :—

(1) Schools which have an average attendance of not more than 200 eligible pupils in the primary classes will be allowed to count one teacher for every 25 units of average attendance. When the average attendance of eligible pupils in the primary classes exceeds 200, the allowance will be 8 teachers for the first 200 units and one teacher for every additional 30 units.

The allowance of teachers for the post-primary classes shall be determined separately in accordance with the following rule.

Schools which have an average attendance of not more than 100 eligible pupils in the post-primary classes will be allowed to count one teacher for every 20 units of average attendance. For the units of average attendance over 100, one teacher will be allowed for every 25 units. In Girls' Schools which have an average attendance in the post-primary classes exceeding 50 and not exceeding 250 units one extra teacher may be allowed at the discretion of the Director.

Average attendance shall be reckoned for the school year, viz., the 12 months preceding the usual date of collection of the annual returns. Fractions of over one half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

Managers of Senior Secondary Schools shall furnish two sets of annual returns, one for the primary classes and one for the post-primary classes.

This rule shall come into force from the date on which it has been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this rule a vacancy may be filled by the appointment of a teacher who is undergoing training in the Government Training School at the time this rule comes into force, or who has, not more than two years before the date of this rule, completed a course of training in the Government Training School and has been unemployed since the date of completion of such course, provided that such teacher has, prior to the commencement of his course of training, been employed as a member of the staff of a registered school for at least one year, and provided that the filling of such vacancy does not permit the school to have a larger staff than that allowed by the conditions in force before the date of this rule.

*Clause 41.—*

Insert a new Sub-clause :—

(f) A period of no-pay leave not exceeding two years may be granted to any teacher for the purpose of undergoing training at the Government Training School. Before granting such leave the Manager shall supply the Director with an undertaking to re-employ the teacher at the end of his course of training. During such leave a substitute may, with the permission of the Director be appointed.

*Appendix B.—*

In the heading to the first part of Appendix B delete the words "in Boys Schools and Men Teachers in Mixed Schools".

Delete note "For Bilingual Schools . . . . . Scale C."

Delete the heading and scales in the second part of Appendix B. (Fixed contributions from Managers towards the salaries of Women Teachers in Girls' and Mixed Schools and in the Kindergarten classes of Boys' Schools.)

*Add a New Clause 30B.—*

Any teacher appointed to a school after the date on which this rule comes into force will be placed on the salary scale appropriate to his qualifications and the class in which he fills a vacancy.

There shall be five classes of teachers to which the salary scales for new appointments and scales of Managers' contributions in Appendix D shall apply.

No appointment to any class shall be made without the approval of the Director.

(b) For the purpose of allotting the proportion of teachers in the various classes there shall be a standard staff fixed for each school. The standard staff for any school shall be as shown in Appendix E and shall be fixed by the average

attendance of eligible pupils for the previous school year. The attendance of average pupils in accordance with Clause 31A (2) sub-paragraph (a) shall be taken into account in assessing the standard staff. In the case of new schools the Director shall decide the standard staff for the first school year.

In Senior Secondary Schools the standard staff shall be determined separately for the primary and post-primary classes. The Director shall decide which teachers shall be counted as belonging to the primary classes and which to the post-primary classes.

In Junior Secondary Schools the standard staff shall be determined by the total eligible staff obtained by adding the eligible staff for the post-primary classes to that for the primary classes.

(c) For the purpose of assessing the quality of the staff of each school at the date on which this rule comes into force the eligible staff shall be allocated to classes, as follows:—

As long as such teachers continue to fill the posts occupied by them at the time of grading, or if they exchange places with teachers of the same class in other schools or fill posts in registered new schools with the approval of the Director, their salary scales will continue to be those of Appendix A or C of the Code with Managers' contribution as in Appendix B and they will be eligible to be placed on any other scale to which they may become entitled by reason of improvement of qualification.

But when a vacancy occurs in any school it shall be filled by the appointment of a teacher to a class in which there is a vacancy.

A vacancy shall not, however, be deemed to have arisen in any particular class in any school unless the aggregate number of teachers in that class and all higher classes is less than the aggregate shown in the table of standard staffs. In exceptional cases, however, a vacancy for a Head Teacher may be filled by the appointment of a teacher to the highest class allotted to the school in the table of standard staffs provided the Director is satisfied that the vacancy cannot be filled satisfactorily by the appointment of one of the existing staff of the school.

(d) Managers of schools shall not transfer teachers from one school to fill a vacancy in a lower class in the same or another school, unless the consent of the teacher has been obtained or good reasons are shown on disciplinary grounds for the transfer.

Teachers shall not be transferred from the post-primary to the primary section of a senior secondary school without the permission of the Director.

(e) A manager may make application to the Director to have the entire staff of his school brought under the provisions of this clause, but such request shall not be granted, unless the quota of teachers is in accordance with the amendment to Clause 31A of the Code and the teachers have consented to the proposal.

(f) No new school shall be registered unless the staff conforms to the minimum qualifications of the standard staff specified in Appendix E.

(g) Nothing in this rule shall prevent a Manager from employing teachers in excess of the standard staff subject to the approval of the Director.

This rule shall come into force from the date on which it has been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this rule a teacher who is undergoing training in the Government Training School at the time this rule comes into force, or who has, not more than two years before the date of this rule, completed a course of training in the Government Training School and has been unemployed since the date of completion of such course, shall, on appointment to a school, be placed on the salary appropriate to his qualifications in Appendix A or C of the Code with Managers' contribution as in Appendix B, provided that such teacher has, prior to the commencement of his course of training, been employed as a member of the staff of a registered school for at least one year. Such teacher may, however, be given the option of coming under the provisions of this rule, if he so desires.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for omnibuses and lorries for the rest of the year 1939 is published hereunder for general information.

The sub-sections to section 46 of the Ordinance as to persons, &c., entitled to make objections against the issue of licences are reproduced below for general information :—

" 46 (2) (a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of any route, proposed by any applicant for a licence for an omnibus, or any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

46 (2) (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence, or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for an omnibus in respect of any route or part of any route, or for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation, which is proposed by any other person in an application for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry, as the case may be, may make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person."

Objections must be made to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, in the following manner so as to be received by him not later than 1 p.m. on MONDAY, AUGUST 7, 1939. Any objection received after this time and date will not be considered :—

- (a) Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for a lorry or an omnibus should be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which should be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm, it should be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.
- (b) Every statement of objection should set the specific grounds on which the objection is based and should indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made. (If the application is for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry "under construction" the serial number given to the application in the list should also be quoted).
- (c) No objection relating to more than one motor car should be made in any one statement of objection.

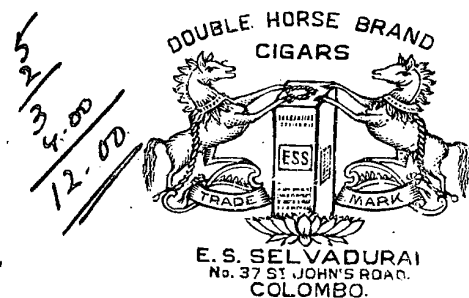

## KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 24, 1939, at 8.40 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated June 20, 1939.

*Present* : Sir Cudah Ratwatte, Mayor ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar ; Gate-Muhandiram N. Canaganayagam ; Mr. B. H. Dunuwille ; Mr. R. S. S. Goonewardane ; Mr. S. Halim Deen ; Mr. L. B. Mawilmada ; Mr. V. D. Paul Raj ; Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra ; Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte ; Mr. A. M. Spaar ; Mr. P. M. Talwatte ; Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne ; and the Municipal Commissioner.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meetings held on May 27, 1939, and June 17, 1939, having been previously submitted to the Mayor for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Mayor.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1938 to May 31, 1939, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the end of April, 1939.
- (c) Health Officer's report for May, 1939.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May, 1939.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ending June 23, 1939.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910" be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries and dairies inspected during May, 1939.

4. Petitions :—Mr. R. S. S. Goonewardane presented petition from L. W. S. John dated June 23, regarding seizure on a Fiscal's writ of a sum lying to his credit and remission of the amount to Anuradhapura Courts.

Mr. M. A. S. Marikar presented : Petition from the residents of Peradeniya, Getambe, Welata, and Halmenikandura stating that as a result of the demolition of the ambalama poor people have no place of shelter and asking that it be rebuilt on the same site.

Mr. A. Morley Spaar presented : Petition from S. M. Abdul Cader of 207, Peradeniya road, applying for a Beef Stall in the Public Market.

The Mayor undertook to look into the matters contained in the petitions and to take necessary action.

5. (1) Pursuant to notice Mr. B. H. Dunuwille moved :—That this Council do take immediate steps to continue the construction and paving of the Meda-ela, and that Government be requested to grant a reasonable subsidy towards this work, as the present condition of the Meda-ela is injurious to Public Health.

After a statement read out by the Mayor showing how the matter stands at present Mr. Dunuwille, with the permission of the Council, withdrew his motion.

5. (2) Pursuant to notice Mr. B. H. Dunuwille moved :—That two public latrines be immediately put up along Peradeniya road, one at Augusta road junction and the other close to the Ambalama near Heerasagala road junction. Mr. Paul Raj seconded.

Mr. R. S. S. Goonewardane proposed an amendment—that it be referred to the Health, Sanitation and Markets Committee. Mr. M. A. S. Marikar seconded.

The amendment was carried.

5. (3) Pursuant to notice Mr. B. H. Dunuwille moved :—That a playground be constructed close to the junction of Lady Blake's drive and peradeniya road.

This was accepted and referred to the Palyground Committee.

5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. A. B. Soysa moved :—That steps may be taken without delay to sink three wells for the use of the public at Dodanwela, Bahirawakanda, and Udamadapotha. Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne seconded.

It was agreed to refer it to the Commissioner for report.

5B. Pursuant to notice Mr. V. D. Paul Raj moved :—(1) That a road be constructed to the Buddhist Cemetery at Mulgampola as the existing path is only a drain and great inconvenience is caused to the people.

The above motion was withdrawn after a statement made by the Mayor that this cemetery will soon be closed.

(2) That a playground be constructed at Mulgampola.

(3) That a Municipal Free Dispensary be established at Mulgampola.

As regards 5B (2) and 5B (3), it was agreed to refer them to the appropriate Committees.

5c. Pursuant to notice Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra was to move :—(1) This Council is of opinion that all properties within the limits of this town be re-assessed immediately by a competent Assessor to be appointed by the Commissioner of Local Administration and that such re-assessment be made once in every five years. (2) That this Council is of opinion that all tenants residing within Municipal Council, Kandy, shall make within a prescribed period a true and correct return of the rents paid by such tenants to their respective land-lords. (3) That this Council resolves that the by-laws and rules framed by the Council should be consolidated and brought up to date.

As regards item 5c, Mr. Premachandra asked permission to move it at the next meeting of Council. Mr. R. S. S. Goonewardane seconded.

This was agreed to.

6. To consider the question of delegation of duties to—

- (1) The Municipal Commissioner.
- (2) The Medical Officer of Health.
- (3) Municipal Accountant.
- (4) Municipal Works and Waterworks Engineer.
- (5) Municipal Electrical Engineer.

The Mayor moved :—That as an interim arrangement pending further consideration of the best means of carrying on the work of the Council it is resolved under section 9 (1) of the Colombo Municipal Council (Constitution) Ordinance, No. 60 of 1935, that all powers, duties or functions which are required in terms of section 9 (2) to be exercised, performed or discharged, subject to the provisions of the Ordinance, by the Council, together with all powers, duties or functions vested in the Chairman by any resolution of the former Municipal Council, shall be and the same are hereby delegated to the Municipal Commissioner to be exercised, performed or discharged, subject to the provisions of the Ordinance, by him. It is further resolved that the Council under section 9 (4) consents to the delegation by the Commissioner to any Municipal Officer of any of the powers, duties or functions delegated to him by this resolution or conferred or imposed or vested in him as Commissioner by the Ordinance, or by any other written law. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille seconded.—Carried.

7. To consider the question of the appointment of a Commissioner.

The Mayor said that the Finance Committee had gone into the matter that morning, Government had been written to find out whether a Civil Servant was available and the reply was that an officer was not available. Even if an officer was available the salary the Council would have to pay as stated by the Financial Secretary is one that the Council would not be in a position to pay. The Commissioner read the letters received from Government.

The Mayor stated the Finance Committee's recommendation was—

- (1) That the salary be Rs. 9,000 per annum rising to Rs. 12,000 per annum by increments of Rs. 300 per annum and pensionable.
- (2) That the post be advertised, and
- (3) Applicants should state age.

The Council thought that an age limit should be fixed and went into Committee. The Council having resumed decided that the age should be between 30 and 45 years.

As regards educational qualifications, the Council, in order to consider details, went into Committee and discussed several proposals. Having resumed, decided that applications should be called from graduates with an Honours Degree at a British University with administrative experience, or from those who have experience in Local Government Institutions and should adduce proof of administrative ability.

Applications were to be called immediately and should close on July 10, 1939.

8. To consider duties and offices to be assigned to—

- (1) The Secretary-Accountant.
- (2) The Assistant Secretary.

As regards (1) it was decided that he be called the Municipal Accountant.

As regards (2), Mr. V. D. Paul Raj proposed that the Assistant Secretary be called Office Assistant to the Commissioner, and Mr. A. Morley Spaar seconded.

Mr. R. S. S. Goonewardane proposed that the Assistant Secretary be given no designation, but that he be appointed to assist the Commissioner in any way the Commissioner thinks fit. Mr. M. A. S. Marikar seconded.

Mr. Paul Raj's proposition was carried by 8 votes to 5 votes.

9. To consider what action is to be taken as regards the two posts of clerks temporarily filled in July, 1938.

Resolved that the Finance Committee's recommendation that the two posts be continued till the end of the year and that the matter be further considered with the Budget be adopted.

10. Memorandum from the Accountant indicating the present financial position of the Council.—Tabled.

11. To sanction the purchase from Messrs. Standard Vacuum Oil Co., quantities of oil at a cost of Rs. 1,464.22. Sanctioned. As regards further quantities, resolved the tenders should be called.

12. Papers *re* correspondence with the Commissioner of Local Government on the subject of revocation of regulation 4 of the regulations under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, which permits motor buses to halt for 15 minutes in the Market Street 'Bus Stand which the Ministry of Local Administration has decided should await consideration by the new Council.

It was agreed that consideration be deferred for four months from July 1, 1939.

It was also resolved that the question of the enlargement of the Market Street 'Bus Stand be referred to the Works Committee for consideration.

13. Papers *re* the suggestion of the Diyawadana Nilame that booths should not be allowed in Temple street during the Perahera with Commissioner's notes of inspection dated June 5, 1939. It was resolved that the Commissioner should see the Diyawadana Nilame and find out what is wanted.

14. To obtain a vote of Rs. 1,000 to meet the cost of revising the Voters' lists.

It was resolved that schedules be served and that the Revenue Inspectors be asked to give householders and necessary assistance in filling up the Schedules.

A vote of Rs. 500 was sanctioned.

15. To obtain a vote of Rs. 500 to provide relief by way of foodstuffs to families whose breadwinners become incapacitated for work.

Resolved that the vote be sanctioned accordingly.

16. Application from Mr. A. C. G. Wijeyakoon for a supply of water from Roseneath to 21, 21A, and 21B, Ampitiya, for domestic purposes. Approved.

Mawilmada; Mr. V. D. Paul Raj; Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra; Mr. A. M. Spaar; Mr. P. M. Talwatte; Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne; and the Municipal Commissioner.

Mr. R. S. S. Goonewardane suggested that the three members who had asked for the special meeting should explain their reasons.

The Mayor called upon Mr. B. H. Dunuwille to explain.

Mr. Dunuwille explained that there was some misunderstanding amongst members as regards the proposed Commissioner's travelling allowance of Rs. 100 a month, and also that when advertising the post of Commissioner the Council had overlooked a resolution of 1924 to the effect that prior consideration should be given to the Council's officers. He also argued that the method of voting on the question of an age limit, when the votes had been 4, 6, 4, was incorrect, and quoted a ruling by the Commissioner of Local Government on this point.

Mr. R. S. S. Goonewardane rose and argued that Mr. Dunuwille's requests were not in order as they were contrary to Municipal By-laws and Ordinance, and appealed to the Mayor for a ruling.

The Mayor ruled that the proposals made by the three Members to modify or alter the decision made at the last meeting were not in order.

Mr. Premachandra then asked whether the Council would consider the equivalent of an Honours Degree in the case of applicants who had graduated prior to 1921.

The Mayor replied in the affirmative.

He also asked on what date should the candidates for the post of Commissioner be 30 or 45. It was decided applicants should be between 30 and 45 on July 10, the last day for applications.

## THE GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Meeting under Section 60 (i.) of Ordinance No. 60 of 1935.

Friday, June 9, 1939, at 2 p.m.

The first Meeting of the New Municipal Council was held at 2 p.m. this day, pursuant to notice, dated May 26, 1939, by the Secretary, and to the summons dated June 7, 1939, issued by the Commissioner, in terms of section 60 (i.) of the Colombo Municipal Council (Constitution) Ordinance, No. 60 of 1935, as applied to the Galle Municipal Council by proclamation published in the *Gazette* of May 27, 1938, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and Deputy Mayor.

1. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail proposed that Mr. T. W. Roberts be elected Mayor. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.

2. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab proposed that Mr. W. Dahanayake be elected Mayor. Mr. P. Dahanayake seconded.

The Council then proceeded to elect the Mayor by secret ballot.

The Commissioner declared Mr. W. Dahanayake duly elected Mayor by 8 votes to 5; one ballot paper being spoilt.

*Election of the Deputy Mayor.*

Mr. W. Dahanayake proposed that Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab be elected Deputy Mayor. Mr. W. T. Wijekulasuriya seconded.

As no other names were proposed the Commissioner declared Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab duly elected Deputy Mayor. The Commissioner then invited the Mayor to preside.

The Mayor thereupon presided and thanked the Councillors for electing him as the first Mayor of Galle.

Mr. Wahab also thanked the Councillors for electing him as Deputy Mayor.

10. Considered an estimate of Rs. 1,335 for providing suitable seating accommodation for the new Council:—Resolved that no action be taken and that the present arrangement do continue.
