THE PASSPORT ORDINANCE.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Passport Ordinance (Chapter 250).

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, no person shall depart from or enter Ceylon by sea or air unless he is in possession of a valid passport.

(2) A passport shall not be deemed to be valid for the purposes of paragraph (1) unless—

- (a) such passport has been issued or renewed—(i.) in the case of any person who is a subject or citizen of any State, by or on behalf of the Government of that State, and (ii.) in the case of a refugee or any person who is not a subject or citizen of any State, by or on behalf of the Government of the State in which such person has found asylum or is permanently resident;
- (b) at the time of departure from or entry into Ceylon of the holder of the passport, such passport is within the period of its validity;
- (c) such passport contains a description of the person to whom it relates and has affixed to it a photograph of such person duly authenticated by a competent authority;

(d) in the case of a passport issued by or on behalf of His Majesty's Government or the Government of any British dominion, possession, colony, protected state or mandated territory, it has been specifically made valid for entry into any part of the British Empire, or has been specifically endorsed by a competent British authority as valid for entry into Ceylon ;

(e) in the case of a passport issued by or on behalf of the Government of a foreign State, it has been endorsed by way of visa for Ceylon by a proper British Diplomatic, Consular or Passport Authority. Such visa shall be of one of the following kinds, namely :—

(i.) A transit visa valid for one year or for such shorter period as may be specified therein (provided that in no case shall it be valid for a period exceeding the period for which the visa for the country of ultimate destination is valid), and granted for the purposes of one or more direct journeys through Ceylon, or for the purposes of transshipment at a Ceylon sea or air port, such journey or transshipment being undertaken for the sole purpose of reaching the destination in a foreign State or in another British possession, and occupying in each case not more than 7 days in Ceylon, unless for special reasons an extension of time for such journey or transshipment is allowed by a competent authority in Ceylon ;

(ii.) An ordinary visa valid for one year or for such shorter period as may be specified therein for any number of journeys to Ceylon for any legitimate purpose ; or

(iii.) A single journey visa valid for one year or for such shorter period as may be specified therein for a single journey to Ceylon for any legitimate purpose.

(3) Nothing contained in paragraph (2) (e) shall be deemed to apply to any passport issued by the Government of any State whose nationals do not require a British visa for entering into Ceylon by virtue of the extension to Ceylon of a reciprocal agreement for the abolition of visas entered into and in force between the said Government and His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

2. The following persons and classes of persons shall be exempted from the provisions of regulation 1 :—

(a) Any person who is in the opinion of a competent authority in Ceylon less than 16 years of age, and is travelling with his parent or guardian ;

(b) Any member of His Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces, entering Ceylon on duty ;

(c) A permanent resident of Ceylon, India or Burma, being a British subject or a British protected person, travelling between India or Burma and Ceylon ;

(d) An Asiatic resident of Ceylon, India or Burma, being a British subject or a British protected person, travelling between the Federated Malay States or the Straits Settlements and Ceylon ;

(e) A member of the crew of any vessel who has been lawfully engaged in Ceylon, or lawfully engaged in India and sent to Ceylon, for an oversea voyage ;

(f) Any person entering Ceylon under and acting in accordance with a special permit in writing issued by the Chief Secretary, the Principal Collector of Customs or the Inspector-General of Police, or under and in accordance with a special landing endorsement made on his passport by the Inspector-General of Police or a Passport Examination Officer duly authorized by the Inspector-General of Police.

3. No person shall remain in Ceylon after the expiry of the validity of the transit visa, single journey visa, special permit or special landing endorsement by virtue of which he has been permitted to enter Ceylon.

4. Passports shall be issued or renewed in Ceylon by a competent authority.

5. Every person desirous of having a passport issued to him or of having a passport renewed, shall make application therefor in such form as may from time to time be provided for the purpose. Such application shall be obtained from and shall be addressed to the Passport Officer, Chief Secretary's Office, Colombo.

6. A competent authority in Ceylon may require such evidence as is necessary, either in the form of a declaration or otherwise, to satisfy himself of the national status of any applicant for a passport.

7. In order that any cost of repatriating any applicant for the issue or renewal of a passport in Ceylon shall not fall on the Ceylon Government, a competent authority in Ceylon may, in his discretion, require as a condition precedent to the issue or renewal of such passport, that a bond in such terms as the competent authority may determine, be entered into on behalf of such applicant with the Government Agent of the province in which the applicant resides.

8. A competent authority in Ceylon may, in his discretion, withdraw a passport issued or renewed in Ceylon, or cancel any endorsement made by a competent authority in Ceylon on a passport, after due notice has been given to the holder of such passport. The holder of such passport shall surrender such passport to a competent authority within a period of 14 days from the date on which a written order in that behalf signed by a competent authority is received by him.

9. Where it appears to a competent authority inadvisable to issue or renew a passport, such authority may, in his discretion, issue an Emergency Certificate in place of a passport. Such Emergency Certificate shall be valid for a single specified journey to or from Ceylon, and shall be subject to such other conditions as such authority may, in his discretion, specify therein. Such Emergency Certificate shall for the purposes of these regulations, be deemed to be a passport for the specified journey.

10. A passport shall be valid only for the countries named thereon, but may be endorsed by a competent authority for additional countries. The possession of a passport shall not exempt the holder of the passport from compliance with any provisions relating to immigration in force in any country named or endorsed thereon, or from the necessity of obtaining a visa where such visa is required by the law of any such country.

11. (1) The particulars relating to a wife intending to travel with her husband may be included on the husband's passport, if a request to that effect is made by such wife and husband in their application under regulation 5.

(2) The particulars relating to any children under the age of sixteen years and intending to travel with their parent or guardian, may be included on the passport of their parent or guardian, if a request to that effect is made by such parent or guardian in his application under regulation 5.

12. Every Indian ordinarily resident in India and leaving Ceylon for any destination other than India, and not falling within the exempted classes specified in paragraph (c) or paragraph (d) of regulation 2, shall possess a valid passport issued to him in India under the regulations for the time being in force in India allowing him to leave India for such destination. No passport shall be issued to such person in Ceylon.

13. (1) A passport shall not, unless it is renewed, be available for more than five years from the date of issue.

(2) A competent authority in Ceylon may, in his discretion, renew a passport from the date of its expiration for such period not exceeding five years as the holder of that passport may desire.

(3) The validity of a passport shall in no case be extended by renewal beyond ten years from its original date of issue.

(4) Where the holder of a passport wishes to travel after the expiration of such period of ten years or where, at any time, such holder wishes to travel to any State for which a visa is required and no more space is available on such passport for such visa, the holder shall make application for a new passport in the manner provided in regulation 5.

14. The fees specified in column II. of the schedule hereto shall be charged for the purposes specified in the corresponding entry in column I. of that schedule.

15. No person shall—

(1) forge, alter or tamper with any passport, whether issued in Ceylon or elsewhere, or any visa or endorsement thereon ; or

(2) without lawful authority use or have in his possession any forged, altered or irregular passport, or any passport with any forged, altered or irregular visa or endorsement ; or

(3) falsely represent himself to be or not to be a person to whom a passport has been duly issued, whether in Ceylon or elsewhere ; or

(4) with intent to obtain a passport or any visa or endorsement thereon, knowingly make any false statement ; or

(5) allow any other person to use any passport issued for his use alone, or without lawful authority have in his possession any passport issued for the use of some person other than himself.

16. Every contravention or attempted contravention of any of the foregoing regulations or of any order issued under the authority of any such regulation shall be a summary offence and shall be punishable with imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months or with fine not exceeding five hundred rupees or with both.

17. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“competent authority”, in the case of any State other than Ceylon, means a person authorized by the law of that State to issue passports, and, in the case of Ceylon, means the Governor and includes any person authorized in writing by the Governor to exercise the powers of a competent authority under these regulations;

“passport” includes any certificate of identity.

18. These regulations may be cited as the Ceylon Passport Regulations, 1939.

19. The regulations, relating to passports, published in *Gazette* No. 7,446 of February 13, 1925, are hereby rescinded.

THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938.

List of Applications for Licences for Omnibuses and Lorries.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for omnibuses and lorries for the rest of the year, 1939, is published hereunder for general information.

The sub-sections to section 46 of the Ordinance as to persons, &c., entitled to make objections against the issue of licences are reproduced below for general information :—

“ 46 (2) (a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of any route, proposed by any applicant for a licence for an omnibus, or any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

46 (2) (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence, or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for an omnibus in respect of any route or part of any route, or for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation, which is proposed by any other person in an application for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry, as the case may be, may make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.”

Objections must be made to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, in the manner prescribed by regulations 1, 2, and 3 of the regulations published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,466 of July 21, 1939, which are also reproduced below, so as to be received by him not later than 1 P.M. on WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 23, 1939. Any objection received after this time and date will not be considered :—

“ Regulation 1.—Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for an omnibus or lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.

Regulation 2.—Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

N.B.—If the application is for a licence for an omnibus or lorry ‘under construction’ the serial number given to the application in the list should also be quoted.

Regulation 3.—No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection.”

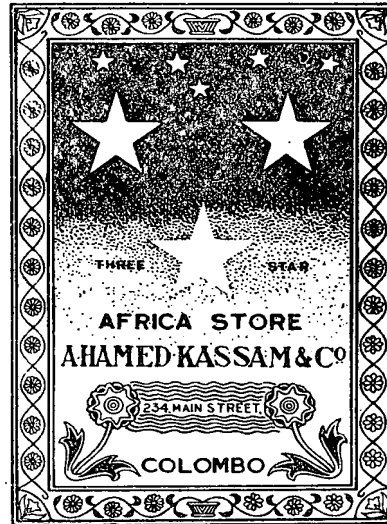


