South : From the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern village limit of Pinnawala, the eastern and northern village limits of Kurempola (F. V. P. 113), the northern village limits of Kudagama (F. V. P. 112) and the southern and eastern village limits of Hurimaluwa (F. V. P. 111) to the centre of the Railway line, thence westwards along the centre of the Railway line to the centre of the Railway bridge at the junction of the Rambukkana-oya and the Maha-oya.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of the Rambukkana-oya to the starting point of the northern limit.

RULE.

The rules under section 59 (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198) published in *Gazette* No. 8,438 of March 10, 1939, are hereby amended as follows:—-

- (1) by the addition, at the end of Part III. thereof, of the new Parts IV., V., VI., and VII. set out in the First Schedule; and
- (2) by the addition, at the end of Form C set out in the schedule thereto, of the new forms set out in the Second Schedule.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

PART IV.-BUDGETS AND ESTIMATES.

1. The annual budget of a Village Committee for any year shall be prepared by the Chairman, and submitted to the Committee in time to admit of its being considered by the Committee before October 31, of the preceding year.

2. The revenue and expenditure shall be arranged in items under heads and sub-heads substantially in form D in the schedule.

3. No item of revenue on account of any tax, licence duty or toll mentioned in section 53 (1) of the Ordinance shall be included in the budget unless the approval of the Governor has previously been obtained.

4. No item of expenditure falling within paragraphs (d), (f), and (g) in section 53 (2), of the Ordinance shall be included in the budget unless the approval of the Government Agent has previously been obtained.

5. (1) The budget for each year as finally passed by the Committee shall be signed by the Chairman and all or a majority of the members present at the meeting at which it is passed;

(2) Copies thereof certified under the hand of the Chairman shall be sent before December 1 of the year preceding to the Government Agent and the Auditor-General. Every such copy of the budget shall be accompanied by—

- (a) a schedule of the taxes which the Committee proposes to levy or impose;
- (b) a detailed statement of any expenditure proposed from loan funds;
- (c) a statement setting out reference to letters from the Government Agent communicating the Governor's approval to the imposition of any tax, licence duty or toll; and
- (d) a statement setting out reference to letters from the Government Agent communicating his approval of any item of expenditure where such approval is required.

(3) The Chairman shall cause to be prepared an estimate of cost giving full particulars of quantities, rates, and scales of pay, wages, &c., in respect of any work, scheme, or project for which provision is included in the budget.

6. (1) Where any disbursement is required on account of any service for which no provision has been included in the budget for any year, the Chairman shall at the earliest opportunity submit to the Committee a supplementary estimate of the expenditure so required and no expenditure shall be incurred until such estimate is passed by the Committee.

(2) In any case where the amount exceeds Rs. 100 no expenditure shall be incurred unless the approval of the Government Agent has previously been obtained, where such approval is necessary under the provisions of the Ordinance.

(3) The supplementary estimate so passed shall be signed by the Chairman and all or a majority of the members present at the meeting.

(4) Copies of such supplementary estimate certified under the hand of the Chairman shall be forwarded forthwith to the Government Agent and to the Auditor-General together with a statement prepared in accordance with rule 5 (2) (d).

7. (1) Not less than two weeks notice of a proposal or resolution relating to the imposition of any tax, licence duty, or toll shall be given in the village area by the Chairman by beat of tom-tom and by the exhibition of written notices at conspicuous places within the area.

(2) No motion relating to the imposition of any such tax, licence duty, or toll shall be taken up for discussion at any meeting unless such notice has been given by the Chairman.

8. (1) Within two weeks from the date on which any resolution or decision relating to the imposition of any tax, licence duty, or toll is passed the particulars shall be notified by the Chairman in the village area, by beat of tom-tom, and by the exhibition of written notices at conspicuous places including the Office of the Village Committee.

(2) After the expiry of a period of one month from the date on which such a resolution or decision is passed, the Chairman shall forward a copy of the resolution or decision together with particulars of the publicity given to it within the village area, to the Government Agent for the purpose of obtaining the approval of the Governor.

9. Application for the approval of the Government Agent in respect of any matter for which his approval is required under the provisions of the Ordinance shall be made by the Chairman within one month from the date on which the resolution or decision relating to that matter was passed by the Committee.

10. (1) The Government Agent may, in any case where he considers it necessary, direct that notice of any application made under rule 9 shall be given by the Chairman within the village area within such time as the Government Agent may in each case specify; and where the Government Agent so directs, it shall be the duty of the Chairman to give notice of such application within the time specified by beat of tom-tom and by the exhibition of written notices at conspicuous places in the area.

(2) Where such notice is given of any application the Government Agent shall have due regard to any representations that may be made by any voter of the area, in considering the question whether the approval applied for should be given. 11. Every appeal to the Executive Committee against the refusal of the Government Agent to approve any resolution of a Village Committee shall—

- (a) be in writing under the hand of the Chairman ;
- (b) be made within one month from the date on which intimation of such refusal was received by the Chairman; and
- (c) be forwarded to the Executive Committee through the Government Agent.

12. Where any resolution or decision of a Village Committee relating to the imposition of any tax, licence duty or toll is disapproved by the Governor no proposal relating to the same matter shall be brought up for discussion by that Committee, or submitted for the Governor's approval until after the expiry of one year from the date on which the Governor's decision was communicated to the Chairman.

13. Where any resolution or decision of a Village Committee which requires the Government Agent's approval is disapproved by the Government Agent, no proposal relating to the same matter shall be brought up for discussion by that Committee or submitted for the Government Agent's approval until after the expiry of six months from the date on which the Government Agent's decision was communicated to the Chairman; or in any case in which there has been an appeal, from the date on which the decision of the Executive Committee was communicated to the Chairman.

PART V.—ACCOUNTS.

1. Every Village Committee shall keep a Cash Book substantially in Form E in the schedule and enter or cause to be entered therein a brief but sufficiently clear description of every transaction as it occurs.

2. Every entry in the Cash Book shall be numbered consecutively beginning from the first day of each year.

3. The Chairman or any officer of the Committee duly authorised in writing by the Chairman shall issue forthwith a receipt (in carbon duplicate) substantially in Form F in the schedule in respect of every sum of money received by him in his official capacity.

4. Every entry of expenditure in the Cash Book shall be supported by a voucher—(a) substantially in Form G in the schedule, (b) containing full particulars, including dates, numbers, quantities, distances, rates, &c., of the services rendered, and (c) duly certified by the Chairman and receipted by the payee.

5. Every Village Committee shall keep a Revenue Ledger and an Expenditure Ledger substantially in Forms H 1 and H 2 respectively in the schedule and every item of receipt and payment in the Cash Book shall be posted to the ledgers in appropriate Accounts in accordance with heads, sub-heads, and items of the budget.

6. The Chairman of a Village Committee shall cause to be prepared a statement of the receipts and payments during the quarters ending March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31 of each year, substantially in Form I in the schedule.

7. The Chairman of a Village Committee shall furnish to the Auditor-General within 30 days of the close of each quarter—

- (a) the statement prepared under rule 6 duly certified under the hand of the Chairman;
- (b) a copy of the ledger entries for that quarter;
- (c) a certificate from the Government Agent as to the balance of cash in the Kachcheri to the credit of the Committee, and a certificate of the Chairman as to the balance, if any, in his haads at the end of that quarter; and
- (d) perfected vouchers in support of the expenditure for that quarter.

8. Not later than the 31st day of January in each year the Chairman of a Village Committee shall cause to be prepared a true statement of the moneys received and disbursed by the Committee during the preceding year ending December 31. Each such statement shall be certified by the Chairman, and submitted to the Auditor-General.

9. A copy of the statement prepared under rule 8 shall be kept during February and March each year at the office of the Village Committee and shall be made available for inspection by any voter of the village area.

10. Every Village Committee shall keep an Inventory, substantially in Form J in the schedule, of all property and stores in its charge, and record therein the receipt and issue of every article.

PART VI.-INSPECTION.

1. (i.) In any village area in which there is no special building set apart or used as the office of the Village Committee, the Village Committee shall, at its first meeting or as soon as may be after that meeting, determine by resolution the place where such Committee shall have its office. The Village Committee may from time to time, by the like resolution, alter the location of its office.

(ii.) The office of every Village Committee shall be kept open on such days and during such hours as the Committee may by resolution determine. Where such resolution has hot been passed by any Village Committee the office of that Committee shall be kept open between the hours of 9 A.M.and 12 noon on all week days except Sundays and public holidays.

2. The Chairman of the Village Committee shall within one week of the passing of any resolution under the last preceding rule, forward copies of such resolution to the Auditor-General and the Government Agent.

3. The furniture, equipment, stationery, books, accounts, documents and other records of each Village Committee shall be kept in the office of that Village Committee, and the Chairman of such Committee shall be responsible for their custody.

4. The Chairman of each Village Committee shall be responsible for the custody of such of the moneys payable into the communal fund as are collected or recovered by the Village Committee, until they are desposited in accordance with provisions of section 55 of the Ordinance.

5. All movable property belonging to each Village Committee, not included in the two rules immediately preceding shall be kept in such places and under the custody of such persons as the Village Committee may decide by resolution. In the absence of any such resolution, the Chairman of the Village Committee shall be responsible for the custody of all such movable property.

6. The books, accounts, documents, and other records of every Village Committee shall be inspected at the Office of the Committee by the Government Agent or an officer authorised by him, once at least in each year.

7. For the purposes of any inspection under the last preceding rule, the Government Agent or the officer authorised by him may, orally or in writing require the production before him of any book, deed, contract, account, voucher, and any other documents and papers which he may deem necessary, and may require any person holding or accountable for any such book, deed, contract, account, voucher, document or papers to appear before him at any such inspection or adjournment thereof.

8. Every work of construction, maintenance or repair undertaken or executed by a Village Committee, which the Government Agent considers necessary to inspect, shall be inspected by such Government Agent or an officer authorised by him at such intervals as the Government Agent may in each case determine.

9. The lands and buildings vested in or used or occupied by every Village Committee shall be inspected by the Government Agent or an officer authorised by him once at least in each year. Such inspection shall be during reasonable hours between sunrise and sunset.

10. The Chairman of every Village Committee shall permit the Government Agent or any officer authorised by him to enter upon the lands and buildings vested in or used or occupied by such Village Committee for the purpose of any inspection under these rules, and shall render him all such assistance therein as may be necessary.

PART VII.-LAND TAX.

Preliminary.

1. Upon communication of the Governor's approval under section 53 of any resolution relating to the imposition of a land tax passed by any Village Committee which has been duly authorised under section 45 of the Ordinance to impose and levy such tax, the Committee may take steps in accordance with the rules next following for the assessment and levy of the tax and may continue to levy the tax until any variation of the rate thereof appears to the Committee to be necessary and is approved by the Governor.

2. The land tax shall be calculated in respect of each financial year of the Committee, and may be collected in instalments at such intervals not exceeding four in each year as the Committee may by resolution determine. Every such resolution shall be published in the village area in such manner as the Committee may consider necessary.

Appointment and Duties of Assessors.

3. Every Village Committee authorised under section 45 of the Ordinance to impose and levy a land tax shall have

power to appoint one or more persons to be assessors for the purpose of ascertaining---

- (a) the annual value, for any specified year, of all buildings and all lands situated in localities within the village area which are declared to be built up 'localities.
- (b) the extent of all cultivated lands for the purposes of the acreage tax.

4. Such assessor or assessors shall inquire into and according to the best of their information and judgment ascertain and assess the annual value of all buildings and all lands situated in the built up localities, and the extent of all cultivated lands in the village area. For this purpose it shall be lawful for the said assessor or assessors to enter at any time between sunrise and sunset, any building or land and to do or cause to be done therein all such acts as may be necessary to ascertain the annual value or the extent thereof.

Assessment of Annual Value of Buildings or Lands.

5. In order to ascertain the annual value of any building or land liable to the land tax, it shall be lawful for the assessor or assessors to require the owner or occupier of such building or land to furnish returns of any rent or income derived therefrom and all such other information as may be necessary.

6. The assessor or assessors shall report the assessments so made to the Chairman. Such assessments shall be entered in a book to be known as the Assessment Register.

Assessment of Cultivated Land for Acreage Tax.

7. The returns and information obtained, under the by-laws made by the Village Committee in that behalf, for the purposes of the taxation of land shall be verified by the assessors after such inspection or inquiry as they may deem necessary and shall be used as the basis for the assessment of cultivated lands for the purposes of the acreage tax.

8. Where any return or information as to the extent of any land is found by the assessors to be false or incorrect the assessors may certify to the Chairman the correct extent of that land as ascertained by them.

9. The Chairman shall cause the extent of each cultivated land, as verified or amended and certified by the assessors, to be entered in a book to be known as the Acreage Register.

Notice of Assessment, Objections, and Appeal.

10. Upon the completion of the Registers referred to in the foregoing rules the Chairman shall cause a notice to be published in the village area that the registers are open for inspection to all owners of buildings and lands within built up localities and to owners of cultivated lands, as the case may be, and to the authorised agents of such owners, and that any such owner who is aggrieved by any finding of the assessors as to the annual value of any building or land or the extent of any cultivated land owned by him may file or cause to be filed, written objections against such findings at the Office of the Committee on or before a date not later than one month from the date of such notice.

11. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to revise any such assessment and to make such alteration therein as to him may seem necessary.

12. The Chairman shall further cause notice of assessment, written, in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil, to be served on the occupier, whether he be owner, joint owner or tenant of the building or land assessed, or to be left in or affixed to such building or land.

- 13. Every such notice—
- (a) shall be substantially in Form K in the schedule,
- (b) shall have appended thereto a demand of payment of the tax within such time and in such proportions as may have been determined by the Committee, and
- (c) shall further intimate that objections to the assess
 - ments will be considered by the Chairman if they are set out in a written statement containing the grounds thereof and such statement is delivered at the Office of the Committee within 30 days next succeeding the date of service of the notice.

14. The Chairman shall cause all objections received within the time specified in the notice to be registered in a book (to be known as the Book of Objections) kept for that purpose, and shall give notice in writing to each objector of the date, time, and place at which his objection will be investigated.

15. (1) At the time and place specified in the notice the Chairman shall investigate the objections or cause them to be investigated in the presence of the objector or an agent authorised by him in writing.

(2) Where the objector does not appear in person or by agent the objections may be investigated in his absence.

(3) Any investigation under this rule may be adjourned from time to time.

16. When any objection is disposed of, the Chairman shall cause his decision to be notified to the objector within 14 days from the date of such decision, and to be entered in the Book of Objections. The Chairman shall cause any the Book of Objections. The Chairman shall cause any necessary amendment to be made in the assessment book, and shall authenticate every such amendment.

Every assessment in respect of which no objection is made shall be final for the year.

18. (1) If any person is aggrieved by the decision of the Chairman with regard to the assessment of any building or land he may within thirty days of receiving the notification of the Chairman's decision under rule 16 appeal to the Government Agent.

(2) Every such appeal shall be made by written state-(3) The decision of the Government Agent in every such

appeal shall be final and conclusive.

(4) The Government Agent shall communicate his decision to the Chairman who shall where necessary amend the Assessment Book or the Acreage Register, as the case may be.

Payment and Recovery of Tax.

19. Neither the lodging of any objection against any assessment nor the appeal to the Government Agent against any decision of the Chairman on any such objection shall stay the levy of the tax, payable on the basis of such assessment : Provided, however, that where any sum in excess of the sum payable in accordance with the final decision, is collected under this rule, such excess shall be returned to the person who paid the tax.

20. If any person shall fail to pay the tax due from him either at the Office of the Village Committee as soon as may be after the tax becomes payable, or to a collector authorised by the Chairman in writing under his hand upon demand made by such collector, it shall be lawful for the Chairman and he is hereby thereunto authorised-

- (a) for non-payment of such tax to seize subject to the provisions of section 45 (6) of the Ordinance, any movable property whatsoever belonging to the person from whom such tax is due, and any movable property to whomsoever the same may belong, which are to be found in or upon the building or land in respect of which the tax is due; and
- (b) if the amount due on account of such tax together with the cost and charges payable under rule 25 shall not be sconer paid or tendered to the Chairman, to sell the property so seized by public auction at any time not less than ten nor more than thirty days from the time of such seizure.

Any seizure or sale under these rules may be 21. effected or carried out by the Chairman or by any person authorised thereto in writing by the Chairman.

22. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the person duly authorised by him in that behalf to break open at any time between sunrise and sunset any building for the purpose of seizing property in pursuance of these rules.

Whenever it becomes necessary to seize and sell 23. property of any person making default in the payment of tax, the Chairman or the Officer authorised under these rules to seize and sell the property, shall observe the following provisions, in the order in which they are set out, in carrying out such seizure and sale :-

- (i.) The movable property of the defaulter, wheresoever the same may be found, sufficient in the opinion of the officer seizing and selling the property to cover the amount of the tax due and the charges incurred in the recovery of the same, may be seized and sold.
- (ii.) Failing such movable property there may be seized and sold rents and profits of the buildings, or land for which such tax shall be due for a term sufficient in the opinion of the officer seizing and selling the property to cover the amount of the tax due and the charges incurred in the recovery of the same.

(iii.) Failing such rents and profits, there may be seized and sold, the materials of any building standing on the land for which such tax shall be due, and the timber growing thereon, sufficient in the opinion of the officer seizing and selling the property to cover the tax and the charges as aforesaid; and the purchaser of such materials or timber shall be entitled to pull down or cut and remove the same within the time allowed him for that purpose by the officer carrying out such seizure and sale.

24. Any movable property seized as aforesaid may be removed by the Chairman for safe custody, pending the sale thereof to such place as he may think fit.

It shall be lawful for the Chairman to demand and levy from the person from whom the tax is due or from the owner or any joint-owner of any property which may lawfully be seized for non-payment of such tax, charges at the rates set out in the following table :-

Table of Charges.

(a) For proceeding to the building or land, or to any premises of any person in default in order to seize property, a charge not exceeding 5 cents for every 50 cents of tax due.

(b) For removal of the property seized in case such removal takes place, a charge not exceeding 5 cents for every 50 cents of tax due.

(c) For keeping the property seized in safe custody, a charge not exceeding 5 cents per day.

(d) For the expenses of sale a charge not exceeding 25 cents on every ten rupees of the net proceeds of the sale.

26. It shall be lawful for the occupier of any building, or land, not being the owner or joint-owner thereof, whose property is seized as aforesaid or who, to avoid such seizure, or after seizure to avoid sale of such property, makes payment of the amount tax due in respect of such building or land, to deduct the amount paid by him from the first payment of rent due from him on account of the said building or land: Provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise any such deduction to be made from rent by any occupier who by the terms of his tenancy was himself bound and liable to pay such tax.

27. In the event of the sale of any property seized for non-payment of tax, the Chairman shall, after deducting the amount due on account of such tax, restore any surplus of the proceeds of such sale, to the owner of the property sold.

In every case where no movable property of any 28. description referred to in rule 20 can be found, the Chairman, shall serve a written notice substatutially in form L man, shall serve a written notice substantially in form L in the schedule on the person who has made default in payment of the tax calling upon him to pay such tax together with an additional amount of 10 per centum of the tax due, within a period of one month from the date of service of the notice, and informing him that in the event of any default in the payment of the tax and additional amount within that period steps will be taken for the seizure and sale of the building or land in respect of which the tax is due the tax is due.

29. In default of compliance by any person with any notice served on him under rule 28 within the time specified in such notice the Chairman shall certify the aggregate amount due from that person to the President of the Village Tribunal having jurisdiction over the village area and the President shall proceed to recover such aggregate amount by the attachment and sale of the building or land in respect of which the tax is due in the manner provided by section 109 (2) and (3) of the Ordinance.



List of Applications for Licences for Omnibuses and Lorries.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for omnibuses and lorries for the rest of the year, 1939, is published hereunder for general information.

The sub-sections to section 46 of the Ordinance as to persons, &c., entitled to make objections against the issue of licences are reproduced below for general information :---

"46 (2) (a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of any route, proposed by any applicant for a licence for an omnibus, or any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

46 (2) (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for an omnibus in respect of any route or part of any route, or for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation, which is proposed by any other person in an application for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry, as the case may be, may make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person."

Objections must be made to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, in the manner prescribed by regulations 1, 2, and 3 of the regulations published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,466 of July 21, 1939, which are also reproduced below, so as to be received by him not later than 1 P.M. on WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 1939. Any objection received after this time and date will not be considered :---

- "Regulation 1.—Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for an omnibus or lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.
- Regulation 2.—Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

N.B.—If the application is for a licence for an omnibus or lorry 'under construction ' the serial number given to the application in the list should also be quoted.


