GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE DEFENCE (PROTECTED PLACES AND AREAS) REGULATIONS.

*Order.*

IN pursuance of the provisions of regulation 2 of the Defence (Protected Places and Areas) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order declare the area more fully described in Schedule A hereto to be a protected area for the purposes of the aforesaid regulations, subject to the exemptions set out in Schedule B hereto.

SCHEDULE A.

The area situated at Colombo within the following boundaries :—

- North : From a point on the sea coast due west of the northern end of Breakwater road a line drawn eastwards across the said road to a point at the western edge of Commissariat street.
- East : From the last mentioned point southwards along the western edge of Commissariat street, Flagstaff street, and Queen street to where it meets Lotus road.
- South : From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the south-western boundary of the Military Quarters area to the sea.
- West : By the sea.

SCHEDULE B.

Exemption from the restrictions imposed by the aforesaid regulations is hereby provided for the following classes of persons :—

- (a) Members of the regular Naval, Military, and Air Forces, or of the Defence Force or the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force.
- (b) Persons holding a permit obtained from an officer of any of the aforesaid Forces.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John Christopher Wilberforce Rock, Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price, above which the article mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or retail, as the case may be, in the area within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (2) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the Schedule to this Order at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (3) direct that no such trader shall sell any article mentioned in the Schedule which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description or quality;

- (4) direct that where any article mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order is sold by wholesale or by retail, the sale shall be made according to the weight or measure specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 or column 3, as the case may be, of that Schedule ;
- (5) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
- any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
  - " measure " shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure equivalent to 1/32nd part of a bushel.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices, Batticaloa District, do by this Order :

- fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the first schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag, the maximum retail price per bag, the maximum retail price per kottu, and the maximum retail price per seer above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or retail, as the case may be, in the area within the Urban District Council limits of Batticaloa ;
- direct that the maximum wholesale price per bag which is prescribed in the First Schedule for rice of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale price per bag above which rice of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- direct that the maximum retail price per bag which is prescribed in the First Schedule for rice of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per bag above which rice of the description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- direct that the maximum retail price per kottu which is prescribed in the First Schedule for rice of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per kottu above which rice of the description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.
- direct that the maximum retail price per seer which is prescribed in the First Schedule for rice of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 4 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per seer above which the rice of the description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule ;

(6) direct that for the purpose of this order :

- (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
- (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
- (c) the maximum price which may be demanded in any area for a quantity of rice which is less than a bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag prescribed by this order in respect of that area for rice of that description and grade ;
- (d) a bag of any description or grade of rice other than broken raw rice shall contain not less than 60 kottus or 70 seers ; and
- (e) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 84 kottus or 98 seers.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices, Batticaloa District, do by this Order :

- (1) prescribe the prices specified in Columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight and the maximum retail price per pound, above which sugar of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entries in Column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the limits of Batticaloa Urban District Council area ;
- (2) direct that the maximum wholesale price per bag which is prescribed in the First Schedule for sugar of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in Column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight above which sugar of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in Column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (3) direct that the maximum retail price per pound which is prescribed in the First Schedule for sugar of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in Column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in Column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
  - (c) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded in any area for a quantity of sugar which is less than a hundredweight shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight.

THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE.

Sections 49 and 59.

NOTIFICATION BY THE PRINCIPAL COLLECTOR OF CUSTOMS.

*Customs Entries.*

THE notification dated April 20, 1939, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,448 of April 28, 1939, in amendment of paragraph (b) of the notification dated March 1, 1919, and published in *Gazette* No. 6,999 of March 7, 1919, is hereby revoked, with effect from September 14, 1939, and the following substituted therefor :—

“ Entries whether for import or export (except those for the *import* of rice, sugar, flour, butter (frozen or tinned), meat (frozen or tinned), milk (tinned or powdered), wheat, potatoes, bacon and ham) shall in future be submitted in triplicate ; or in quadruplicate if the person presenting the entry wishes to retain a duly passed copy thereof.

Entries for the *import* of rice, sugar, flour, butter (frozen or tinned), meat (frozen or tinned), milk (tinned or powdered), wheat, potatoes, bacon and ham shall in future be submitted in quadruplicate ; or in quintuplicate if the person presenting the entry wishes to retain a duly passed copy thereof.”
