DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance further to amend the Essential Commodities Reserves Ordinance, No. 5 of 1939.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Essential Commodities Reserves (Amendment) Ordinance, No. of 1939.
- 2 The following new section shall be inserted immediately after section 14 of the Essential Commodities Reserves Ordinance No. 5 of 1939, and shall have effect as section 14A of that Ordinance:—
 - $14 \mbox{\ensuremath{\mathtt{A}}}.$ (1) Notwithstanding anything in the Criminal Procedure Code—
 - (a) no prosecution shall be instituted against any person for any offence except by the Director or with his written sanction;
 - (b) where the Director has reasonable grounds for believing that any person has committed an offence, he may, if he thinks fit, compound such offence instead of instituting a prosecution against that person for that offence;

- (c) where a prosecution has been instituted against any person for any offence, the Director may, at any time before the Magistrate has recorded his verdict, compound that offence and withdraw the prosecution.
- (2) Where an offence is compounded under sub-section (1), the Director may accept from the offender such sum of money as the Director may deem appropriate for the composition of that offence; and any sum so accepted shall be credited to the general revenue of Ceylon.
- (3) Save as provided in sub-sections (1) and (2), the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code shall apply in respect of any offence or the prosecution of any person therefor.
- (4) In this section, "offence" means an offence under this Ordinance.

Objects and Reasons.

The object of this Bill is to provide-

- (a) that prosecutions for offences under the Essential Commodities Reserves Ordinance, No. 5 of 1939, shall be instituted only by the Director or with his written sanction;
- (b) that offences under the Ordinance may be compounded by the Director who will be authorised to accept a sum of money in composition of any offence, whether before or after the institution of criminal proceedings.
