CHAPTER 65.

An Act to apply prize law to aircraft; to amend and explain the enactments relating to prize; and to provide for purposes connected with the matters aforesaid. [1st September, 1939.]

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellency Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this section, the law relating to prize shall apply in relation to aircraft and goods carried therein as it applies in relation to ships and goods carried therein, and shall so apply notwithstanding that the aircraft is on or over land.

(2) The amendments specified in the second column of Part I of the Schedule to this Act (being amendments necessary for giving effect to the preceding subsection) shall be made in the Acts specified in the first column of that Part of that Schedule. Application of prize law to aircraft. 27 & 28 Vict. c. 25.

Establishment of prize courts outside. His Majesty's dominions. 57 & 58 Vict. c. 39. (3) The provisions of the Naval Prize Act, 1864, specified in Part II. of the Schedule to this Act shall not apply in relation to aircraft or goods carried therein taken as prize.

2.—(1) The power conferred by section two of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, to issue any commission, warrant or instructions for the purpose of commissioning or regulating the procedure of a prize court, and to establish a Vice-Admiralty Court under the authority of any such commission or warrant shall be exercisable not only in relation to a place in a British possession, but also in relation to a place in any of the following countries and territories, that is to say,—

(a) any British protectorate,

- (b) any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, in the Commonwealth of Australia or in the Dominion of New Zealand, and
- (c) any other country or territory in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction in matters of prize;

and accordingly subsection (1) of the said section shall have effect as if the reference therein to a British possession included a reference to any of the countries and territories mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (c) of this subsection; and subsection (2) of the said section shall, in relation to any of the said countries and territories, have effect as if for the reference in that subsection to the Vice-Admiral of the possession, there were substituted a reference to such authority as may be prescribed, in relation to that country or territory, by Order of His Majesty in Council.

(2) The Admiralty may appoint a judge, registrar and marshal, and other officers, of any Vice-Admiralty court established by any commission or warrant the issue of which is authorized by section two of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, as amended by this section, in any of the countries and territories mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (c) of the preceding subsection.

(3) Any commission or warrant for the purpose of commissioning or regulating the procedure of a prize court which has been issued before the commencement of this Act and is in force at the commencement of this Act, shall have effect as if any reference therein to ships included a reference to aircraft.

3. For the removal of doubts it is hereby declared that Colonial Courts of Admiralty within the meaning of the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, courts to which paragraph (b) of the proviso to subsection (3) of section two of that Act applies by virtue of an Order in Council under section twelve of that Act, and Vice-Admiralty courts established by any commission or warrant the issue of which is authorized by section two of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, as amended by this Act, are prize courts within the meaning of the Naval Prize Act, 1864.

4.—(1) This Act extends to the following countries and territories, that is to say,—

- (a) the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man,
- (b) the Commonwealth of Australia and the Dominion of New Zealand,
- (c) British India and British Burma,
- (d) Newfoundland and every colony,
- (e) every British protectorate, and
- (f) every territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, in the Commonwealth of Australia or in the Dominion of New Zealand,

and (to the extent of His Majesty's jurisdiction therein in matters of prize) to every other country or territory in which for the time being His Majesty has such jurisdiction.

(2) The enactments relating to prize, as amended by this Act, shall extend to the countries and territories mentioned in paragraphs (e) and (f) of the preceding subsection, and (to the extent of His Majesty's jurisdiction therein in matters of prize) to every other country or territory in which for the time being His Majesty has such jurisdiction.

Extent of this Act and . existing Prize Acts.

This Act may be cited as the Prize Act, 1939; and the Short title and 5. citation. Naval Prize Acts, 1864 to 1916, and this Act may be cited together as the Prize Acts, 1864 to 1939.

PART I.

AMENDMENTS OF PRIZE ACTS IN RELATION TO AIRCRAFT. Amendment.

The Naval Prize Act, 1864 (27 & 28 Vict. c. 25).

Act amended.

In section two, for the words " and others on "board any of Her Majesty's ships of "war" there shall be substituted the words "airmen and others on board any of His "Majesty's ships of war or any of His "Majesty's military aircraft"; for the words " (other than ships) " there shall be substituted the words " but does not " include ships, and does not include aircraft "which are not part of the cargo of a "ship"; and at the end of that section there shall be inserted the following paragraphs :-

> "The term 'aircraft papers ' includes, " all books, passes, charter parties, bills "of lading, manifests, certificates, "licences, lists, tickets, notes, letters "and other documents and writings "delivered up or found on board a captured aircraft.

> "The term 'any of His Majesty's "military aircraft' includes any air-" craft belonging to His Majesty's naval, "military or air forces, and any hired "armed aircraft in His Majesty's ser-" vice."

In section sixteen, after the second paragraph thereof there shall be inserted the following paragraphs :-

"Every aircraft taken as prize and "brought to a place within the juris-" diction of a prize court, shall forthwith and without bulk broken, be delivered up to the marshal of the court.

"If there is no such marshal, then the aircraft shall be in like manner "delivered up to such person as the "court may appoint";

and in the third paragraph thereof after the words "The ship" there shall be inserted the words "or aircraft", and after the word "officer" there shall be inserted the words "or person".

In section seventeen, for the first paragraph thereof there shall be substituted the following paragraph :-

" The captors shall with all practicable "speed after the ship is brought into " port, or the aircraft is brought to a place within the jurisdiction of a prize "court, bring the ship papers or the "aircraft papers, as the case may be, "into the registry of the court"; in the second paragraph thereof, after the words "capturing ship" there shall be inserted the words "or capturing aircraft ", and after the words " ship papers" in each place where those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or aircraft papers"; and in the "or aircraft papers"; and in the third paragraph thereof, after the words "ship papers" there shall be inserted the words "or aircraft papers", after the words "captured ship" there shall be inserted the words "or captured aircraft", and after the words "captur-ing ship" there shall be inserted the words "or capturing aircraft".

- In section thirty-one, after the word " ships " there shall be inserted the words "an aircraft"; and after the word "ship ' and there shall be inserted the words or aircraft ".
- In section forty, in the first paragraph thereof, after the word "ship" there shall be in-serted the word "aircraft", and after the words "any of Her Majesty's ships of war"

there shall be inserted the words "or any of His Majesty's military aircraft"; and in the second paragraph thereof after the word "ship" in each place where that word occurs, there shall be inserted the words "or aircraft" and after the words "as a ship of war" there shall be inserted the words "or as a military aircraft".

In section forty-one, in the first paragraph thereof after the word "ship" there shall be inserted the words "or aircraft", and after the words "any of Her Majesty's ships of war" there shall be inserted the words "or any of His Majesty's military aircraft"; for the second paragraph thereof there shall be substituted the following paragraph :—

> "The master or owner of the ship or "his agent, or the pilot or owner of the "aircraft or his agent, may, with the "consent of the re-captors, unload and "dispose of the goods on board the ship "or aircraft, as the case may be, before "adjudication";

and in the third paragraph thereof after the words "United Kingdom" there shall be inserted the words "or the aircraft "does not, within six months, return to a "place within the United Kingdom," and after the word "ship" in the second place where that word occurs there shall be inserted the word "aircraft".

In section forty-seven, after the word "ships" in each place where that word occurs there shall be inserted the word "aircraft" and after the words "United Kingdom" there shall be inserted the words "or brought "to a place within the United Kingdom, "as the case may be,".

After section forty-eight, there shall be inserted the following section :---

"48A. Where any aircraft or goods ' taken as prize is or are brought to any " place within the jurisdiction of a prize "court, the pilot or other person in "charge or command of the aircraft "which has been taken or in which the "goods are brought shall, when required "by any officer of Customs deliver an "account in writing under his hand "concerning such aircraft and goods, giving such particulars relating thereto " as may be in his power, and shall truly "answer all questions concerning such "afficer, and in default shall forfeit a " sum not exceeding one hundred pounds, such forfeiture to be enforced as for-"feitures for offences against the laws "relating to the Customs are enforced; "and every such aircraft shall be liable "to such searches as other aircraft are "liable to; and the officers of the "Customs may freely go on board such " aircraft and bring to the King's warehouse any goods on board the same, " subject, nevertheless, to such regula-"tions in respect of military aircraft "belonging to His Majesty as shall "from time to time be issued by the "Traceury" " Treasury.'

In section fifty-five, in paragraph (1) thereof after the words "any of Her Majesty's ships of war" there shall be inserted the words "or any of His Majesty's military aircraft", and after the word "ship" there shall be inserted the word "aircraft"; and in paragraph (5) thereof after the word "ship", in each place where that word occurs, there shall be inserted the word "aircraft".

The Prize Courts (Procedure) Act, 1914 (4 & 5 Geo. 5. c. 13).

In section one, after the words "ships of war", in each place where those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or military aircraft".

REGULATIONS made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Passport Ordinance (Chapter 250), and duly laid before the State Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, no person shall depart from or enter Ceylon by sea or air unless he is in possession of a valid passport.

- (2) A passport shall not be deemed to be valid for the purposes of paragraph (1) unless-
 - (a) such passport has been issued or renewed-(i.) in the case of any person who is a subject or citizen of any State, by or on behalf of the Government of that State, and (ii.) in the case of a refugee or any person who is not a subject or citizen of any State, by or on behalf of the Government of the State in which such person has found asylum or is per-manently resident ;
 - (b) at the time of departure from or entry into Ceylon of the holder of the passport, such passport is within the period of its validity;
 - (c) such passport contains a description of the person to whom it relates and has affixed to it a photograph of such person duly authenticated by a competent authority ;
 - (d) in the case of a passport issued by or on behalf of His Majesty's Government or the Government of any British dominion, possession, colony, protected state or mandated territory, it has been specifically made valid for entry into any part of the British Empire, or has been specifically endorsed by a competent British authority as valid for entry into Ceylon;
 - (e) in the case of a passport issued by or on behalf of the Government of a foreign State, it has been endorsed by way of visa for Ceylon by a proper British Diplomatic, Consular or Passport Authority. Such visa shall be of one of the following kinds, namely :-
 - (i.) A transit visa valid for one year or for such shorter period as may be specified therein (provided that in no case shall it be valid for a period exceeding the period for which the visa for the country of ultimate desti-nation is valid), and granted for the purposes of one or more direct journeys through Ceylon, or for the purposes of transhipment at a Ceylon sea or air port, such journey or transhipment being undertaken for the sole purpose of reaching the destination in a foreign State or in another British possession, and occupying in each case not more than 7 days in Ceylon, unless for special reasons an extension of time for such journey or transhipment is allowed by a competent authority in Ceylon; (ii.) An ordinary visa valid for one year or for
 - such shorter period as may be specified therein for any number of journeys to Ceylon for any legitimate purpose ; or
 - (iii.) A single journey vise valid for one year or for such shorter period as may be specified therein for a single journey to Ceylon for any legitimate purpose.

(3) Nothing contained in paragraph (2) (e) shall be deemed to apply to any passport issued by the Government of any State whose nationals do not require a British visa for entering into Ceylon by virtue of the extension to Ceylon of a reciprocal agreement for the abolition of visas entered into and in force between the said Government and His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom.

The following persons and classes of persons shall be exempted from the provisions of regulation 1 :-

- (a) Any person who is in the opinion of a competent authority in Ceylon less than 16 years of age, and is travelling with his parent or guardian ;
- (b) Any member of His Majesty's Naval, Military or Air
- Forces, entering Ceylon on duty; permanent resident of Ceylon, India or Burma, being a British subject or a British protected person, travelling between India or Burma and Ceylon ;
- (d) An Asiatic resident of Ceylon, India or Burma, being a British subject or a British protected person, travelling between the Federated Malay States or the Straits Settlements and Ceylon ;
- (c) A member of the crew of any vessel who has been lawfully engaged in Ceylon, or lawfully engaged in India and sent to Ceylon, for an oversea voyage ;
- (f) Any person entering Ceylon under and acting in accordance with a special permit in writing issued by the Chief Secretary, the Principal Collector of Customs or the Inspector-General of Police, or under and in accordance with a special landing endorsement made on his passport by the Inspector-General of Police or a Passport Examination Officer duly authorized by the Inspector-General of Police.

3. No person shall remain in Ceylon after the expiry of the validity of the transit visa, single journey visa, special permit or special landing endorsement by virtue of which he has been permitted to enter Ceylon.

Passports shall be issued or renewed in Ceylon by a competent authority.

5. Every person desirous of having a passport issued to him or of having a passport renewed, shall make application therefor in such form as may from time to time be provided for the purpose. Such application shall be obtained from and shall be addressed to the Passport Officer, Chief. Secretary's Office, Colombo.

6. A competent authority in Ceylon may require such evidence as is necessary, either in the form of a declaration or otherwise, to satisfy himself of the national status of any applicant for a passport.

7. In order that any cost of repatriating any applicant for the issue or renewal of a passport in Ceylon shall not fall on the Ceylon Government, a competent authority in Coylon may, in his discretion, require as a condition precedent to the issue or renewal of such passport, that a bond in such terms as the competent authority may determine, be entered into on behalf of such applicant with the Government Agent of the province in which the applicant resides.

8. A competent authority in Ceylon may, in his discretion, withdraw a passport issued or renewed in Ceylon, or cancel any endorsement made by a competent authority in Ceylon on a passport, after due notice has been given to the holder of such passport. The holder of such passport shall surrender such passport to a competent authority within a period of 14 days from the date on which a written order in that behalf signed by a competent authority is received by him.

9. Where it appears to a competent authority inadvisable to issue or renew a passport, such authority may, in his discretion, issue an Emergency Certificate in place of a passport. Such Emergency Certificate shall be valid for a single specified journey to or from Ceylon, and shall be subject to such other conditions as such authority may, in his discretion, specify therein. Such Emergency Certificate shall for the purposes of these regulations, be deemed to be a passport for the specified journey.

10. A passport shall be valid only for the countries named thereon, but may be endorsed by a competent authority for additional countries. The possession of a passport shall not exempt the holder of the passport from compliance with any provisions relating to immigration in force in any country named or endorsed thereon, or from the necessity of obtaining a visa where such visa is required by the law of any such country.

11. (1) The particulars relating to a wife intending to travel with her husband may be included on the husband's passport, if a request to that effect is made by such wife and husband in their application under regulation 5.

(2) The particulars relating to any children under the age of sixteen years and intending to travel with their parent or guardian, may be included on the passport of their parent or guardian, if a request to that effect is made by such parent or guardian in his application under regulation 5.

12. Every Indian ordinarily resident in India and leaving Ceylon for any destination other than India, and not falling within the exempted classes specified in paragraph (c) or paragraph (d) of regulation 2, shall possess a valid passport issued to him in India under the regulations for the time being in force in India allowing him to leave India for such destination. No passport shall be issued to such person in Ceylon.

13. (1) A passport shall not, unless it is renewed, be available for more than five years from the date of issue.

(2) A competent authority in Ceylon may, in his discretion, renew a passport from the date of its expiration for such period not exceeding five years as the holder of that passport may desire.

(3) The validity of a passport shall in no case be extended by renewal beyond ten years from its original date of issue.

(4) Where the holder of a passport wishes to travel after the expiration of such period of ten years or where, at any time, such holder wishes to travel to any State for which a visa is required and no more space is available on such passport for such visa, the holder shall make application for a new passport in the manner provided in regulation 5.

14. The fees specified in column II. of the schedule hereto shall be charged for the purposes specified in the corresponding entry in column I. of that schedule.

15. No person shall—

- (1) forge, alter or tamper with any passport, whether issued in Ceylon or elsewhere, or any visa or endorsement thereon; or
- (2) without lawful authority use or have in his possession any forged, altered or irregular passport, or any passport with any forged, altered or irregular visa or endorsement; or
- visa or endorsement ; or
 (3) falsely represent himself to be or not to be a person to whom a passport has been duly issued, whether in Ceylon or elsewhere ; or
- (4) with intent to obtain a passport or any visa or endorsement thereon, knowingly make any false statement; or
- (5) allow any other person to use any passport issued for his use alone, or without lawful authority have in his possession any passport issued for the use of some person other than himself.

16. Every contravention or attempted contravention of any of the foregoing regulations or of any order issued under the authority of any such regulation shall be a summary offence and shall be punishable with imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months or with fine not exceeding five hundred rupees or with both.

17. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires---

" competent authority ", in the case of any State other than Ceylon, means a person authorized by the law of that State to issue passports, and, in the case of Ceylon, means the Governor and includes any person authorized in writing by the Governor to exercise the powers of a competent authority under these regulations;

" passport " includes any certificate of identity.

18. These regulations may be cited as the Ceylon Passport Regulations, 1939.

19. The regulations, relating to passports, published in Gazette No. 7,446 of Fobruary 13, 1925, are hereby rescinded.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Aluwihare, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do by this Order—

- fix the prices specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto to be the maximum prices per bag and per measure above which rice of the description and grade specified in the same column shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the same schedule;

 (3) direct that no trader shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the schedule
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (4) prescribe that every trader who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the schedule hereto shall give if demanded to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of rice sold;
 - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold ; and
 - (d) the date of the sale.

Column 1.

(5) direct that for the purpose of this Order-

- (a) a bag of any rice other than broken raw rice shall not contain less than 76 measures and 158 pounds by weight;
- (b) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 115 measures and 239 pounds by weight;
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirtysecond part of a bushel;
- (d) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice of any description and grade which is sold in a quantity of one bushel or more shall include the container in which such rice is sold.
- (6) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions and grades of rice mentioned in the schedule hereto.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for omnibuses and lorries for the rest of the year, 1939, is published hereunder for general information.

The sub-sections to section 46 of the Ordinance as to persons, &c., entitled to make objections against the . issue of licences are reproduced below for general information :---

"46 (2) (a) Any licensing, authority within whose area any part of any route, proposed by any applicant for a licence for an omnibus, or any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

46 (2) (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for an omnibus in respect of any route, or part of any route, or for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation, which is proposed by any other person in an application for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry, as the case may be, may make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person."

Objections must be made to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, in the manner prescribed by regulations 1, 2, and 3 of the regulations published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,466 of July 21, 1939, which are also reproduced below so as to be received by him not later than 3 P.M., on WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 18, 1939. Any objection received after this time and date will not be considered :---

- "Regulation 1.—Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for an omnibus or lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.
- Regulation 2.—Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

"Process and means for treating light timber."

Abstract.—Treatment of light timber which is characterized by heating and steaming it in a limited volume of steam and air. According to the inventor, the apparatus for treatment consists of a "Process Chamber" which is provided with pressure and temperature gauges and an outlet valve. This chamber is connected by means of a large and short air duct to an air heating chamber. Steam can be introduced when necessary to the top of the process chamber by means of a pipe connected to a boiler.

The process consists in stacking the process chamber with the planks edgewise in such a manner that there is sufficient room for free circulation between the planks. The air tight doors are then closed, and heat is supplied to the air heating chamber whose inlet side is closed so that the air heating chamber and process chamber enclose a volume to which air from outside has no access. The temperature is maintained at 150° F and the pressure at 75 to 150 lb. *per square foot* for a period of three hours; this is accomplished by adjusting the fuel and regulating the outlet valve. At the end of the period the temperature is raised to 210° F. If it is found that steam is not freely issuing from the outlet valve, more steam is introduced from the boiler till the process chamber is filled with steam. The heating is continued for another three hours, and then the chamber is allowed to cool. The inventor states that by his process the timber is strengthened, and made odourless. "Improvements in flat roofing tiles."

Abstract.—The invention relates to improvements in flat tiles, characterized in having—

- (a) A longitudinal channel the outer wall of which is sloped at an angle of 60° to the horizontal, and a rib on the opposite side shaped to fit.
- (b) A central rib on the tile with a smooth instead of a corrugated surface so that the flow of water into the main channels is facilitated.
- (c) A ridge on the lower edge of the central rib.
- (d) Two uninterrupted depressions at the top edge of the tile for collecting rain spray, with suitable drainage outlets.
- (c) Two flaps projecting from the underside of the tile to fit into the depressions; these flaps are shaped so as to fit over the seam in the lower row of tiles.

"The improvement on the interlocking groove on the Mangalore Pattern Tiles, namely, the Square Groove interlocking arrangement."

Abstract.—This is a modification of existing patterns of Mangalore tile which consists in making the longitudinal edges square instead of round, and allowing sufficient play in the grooves (about $\frac{1}{3}$ of an inch) for easy fitting.

The inventor states that the square grip prevents the tile being displaced easily by burglars or by wind; the clearances in the grooves permits water to flow easily down the slope.
