#### RECRUITMENT OF PROBATIONARY DIVISIONAL REVENUE OFFICERS.

APPLICATIONS are invited from applicants possessing the necessary qualifications, as set out in this notice, for appointment as Probationers in the scheme of Divisional Revenue Officers.

# Method of Application.

2. (a) Application on forms to be obtained from the Government Agent of the Province in which the candidate resides must be addressed to the Director of Education, Branch E, Galle Face Secretariat, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo, and must reach that Office on or before November 24, 1939. No application received after that date will be considered. It is important that all necessary enclosures—vide (d) and (e) below—should be attached to and forwarded with the completed form of application.

(b) Stamps to the value of Rs. 10 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over them.

(c) Two referees must be named in the form, who from their personal knowledge of the candidate can testify to his character and capacity.

(d) Originals of recent testimonials, not more than three in number, must be attached to the application form. These will be returned after the selection has been made.

(e) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth must be attached to the form of application. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this Examination. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

#### Number of Vacancies and Conditions of Appointment.

3. Eight probationers will be selected for the Maritime area, seven for the Kandyan area, and five for the Tamil speaking area. Each Probationer will be attached to a Kachcheri and will rank as a Junior Staff Officer. He will undergo a period of training in Kachcheri as well as in district work in the course of which he will be expected to qualify himself for appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer on the occurrence of a vacancy in a Chief Headman's post. He will not be appointed a Divisional Revenue Officer until the Government Agent has certified that he has fully qualified himself in all respects including the passing of an exacting test in the language chiefly spoken in the District and a less severe test in the other vernacular language.

#### Pay and Conditions of Service.

4. A Probationer while in training will be paid at the rate of Rs. 1,800 per annum. The normal period of training will be 18 months but this period may be extended if necessary. After he has passed an exacting test in the language spoken in the district and a less severe test in the other vernacular language and any examination held to test the results of his training and has obtained a certificate from the Government Agent to the effect that he is fully qualified in all respects for appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer, a Probationer will be paid at the rate of Rs. 2,100 per annum until such time as he receives an appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer. On appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer he will be paid at the rate of Rs. 3,000 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 200 to Rs. 6,000 subject to the passing of Efficiency Bars.

A travelling allowance will be paid in accordance with the Regulations.

The post of Divisional Revenue Officer will be pensionable. Probationers will be subject to the Public Service, Financial, Leave and other Regulations applicable to public officers

# Qualifications of Candidates.

5. Every candidate must possess the following minimum qualifications :---

(1) He must be of Ceylonese or mixed Ceylonese and British descent and his permanent home must be in Ceylon.

- (2) He must have been born not later than December 1, 1917, and not earlier than December 1, 1914.
- (3) He must have passed at least the Senior School Certificate Examination English, or Cambridge Senior or London Matriculation or an equivalent examination.
- (4) He must be of good moral character and of sound constitution, physically fit for service in any part of the Island.
- (5) Successful candidates will be required to pass a Medical examination the fee for which must be paid by the candidate.

# Method of Selection.

6. For the purpose of recruitment of Probationers the Island will be regarded as comprising three administrative areas, viz., Low-country, Kandyan, and Tamil speaking; in each case the successful candidate will be selected for service in one of these three areas and an officer will subsequently be transferable only within the area for which he was originally selected. The selection will be made by a Selection Board having regard to two considerations, viz.,—

- (i.) the results of a competitive examination, and
- (ii) the requirements of the particular area in which the selected candidate is intended to serve.

#### Examination.

7. A competitive examination will be held for the selection of candidates wishing to join the Divisional Revenue Officers' Service. The examination will be in two parts, viz., (a) Written and (b) Personal Interview.

- (a) The written examination will be held at Batticaloa, Colombo, Galle, Jaffna, and Kandy commencing on February 9, 1940. Candidates should state in their application forms at which centre they wish to be examined. Any candidate who fails to indicate where he wishes to be examined will be entered for the centre closest to his place of address. Candidates will however be required to attend at Colombo or any other centre if circumstances so require.
- (b) The personal interview, which will be restricted to candidates attaining a certain standard in the written examination, will be held only in Colombo on a date which will be communicated to candidates after the written examination. Candidates will be required to produce at the interview the original certificates granted in respect of any examinations they have passed.

#### Subjects and Syllabus of Examination.

8. The subjects for the examination will be as follows and marks will be assigned as indicated against each :—

The interview will be similar to that at present conducted at the Civil Service Entrance Examination.

The examinations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil will be designed to test the candidate's understanding and command of the language. In the English paper a passage will be set for a summary or precis.

Questions in General Knowledge will be designed to test the knowledge and interest of candidates (a) in the more important topics of the day, and (b) in literature, world geography, and other subjects.

Deductions up to 20 per cent. of the marks awardable will be made on account of handwriting which is difficult to read.

#### Refunds of Value of Stamps.

(a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not 9. satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5 ths the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination, gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of  $\frac{1}{2}$  the value of stamps affixed to his application, provided his form of admission to the examination is returned with his notice of withdrawal.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

#### MERCHANT SHIPPING

THE EGYPTIAN TONNAGE ORDER, 1939.

#### At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 23rd day of June, 1939.

#### Present.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60) it is enacted that whenever it appears to His Majesty The King in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there, His Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in His Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship : And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said Section it is (amongst other things) provided that His Majesty in Council may make the Order subject to such conditions and ouglifi-

may make the Order subject to such conditions and qualifi-

cations (if any) as His Majesty may deem expedient : And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the Government of the Kingdom of Egypt and are now in force there :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Him by the said Section, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :-

-(a) This Order may be cited as the Egyptian Tonnage

Order, 1939. (b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Ships of the Kingdom of Egypt the certificates of registry or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 31st December, 1935, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes, as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

3. This Order shall apply to ships of the Kingdom of Egypt when in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Newfoundland, Burma, British Colonies or Protectorates or mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom.

# Text of Agreement and Notes exchanged.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE EGYPTIAN GOVERNMENT REGARDING TONNAGE MEASUREMENT, WITH EXCHANGE OF NOTES REGARDING ITS APPLICATION TO INDIA.

London, February 20, 1939.

#### AGREEMENT.

THE Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Egypt have agreed as follows :-

#### ARTICLE 1.

Subject to the provisions of Articles 3, 4 and 5 of this Agreement, the territories of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty) to which this Agreement applies are the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Newfoundland, Burma, British Colonies and Protectorates and mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom.

Any reference in subsequent articles of the present Agreement to the territories of His Majesty shall be deemed to relate to those territories of His Majesty to which the Agreement applies.

#### ARTICLE 2.

In view of the fact that the existing laws and regulations in the territories of His Majesty in regard to measurement of tonnage of merchant ships are in substantial agreement with those of Egypt, ships furnished with certificates of registry and other national papers duly issued by the competent authorities of some part of the territories of His Majesty shall be deemed by the Egyptian authorities to be of the tonnage denoted in the said documents, and shall be exempted from being remeasured in any port or place in Egypt, on condition that similar terms shall be accorded to Egyptian ships equipped with certificates of registry or other national papers duly issued by the competent Egyptian authorities on or after the 31st December, 1935, and that such ships shall be exempt from being remeasured in any place within the territories of His Majesty.

#### ARTICLE 3.

The Government of Egypt may by a twelve months' notice given in writing through the diplomatic channel terminate this Agreement in respect of all or any of the territories of His Majesty and the Agreement shall thereupon cease to apply to the territories named in the notice and to ships registered therein.

#### ARTICLE 4.

The Government of the United Kingdom in respect of all or any of the territories of His Majesty may likewise terminate this Agreement by a twelve months' notice given in writing through the diplomatic channel; and the Agreement shall thereupon cease to apply to the territories named in the notice and to ships registered therein.

# ARTICLE 5.

The termination of this Agreement, under Articles 3 or 4 in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland shall also terminate it in respect of Newfoundland, Burma, British Colonies and Protectorates and mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom, and its provisions shall thereupon cease to apply to all such territories and to ships registered therein. In faith whereof the undersigned have signed the present

Agreement and have affixed thereto their Seals.

# Viscount Halifax to H. Nachât Pasha.

#### Your Excellency,

On the signature this day of the Agreement between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Egypt relative to the reciprocal recognition of certificates of registry and other national papers concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, I have the honour to inform you that it is the desire of the Government of India that an agreement should be concluded between them and the Government of Egypt applying the provisions of the said agreement on the one hand to Egyptian ships in the ports of India and on the other hand to ships in Egyptian ports which have been furnished with certificates and other national papers duly

issued by the authorities of India. 2. If the Government of Egypt are agreeable to this proposal I have the honour to suggest that the present note and your Excellency's reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments in this matter which shall take effect from the date of your note and be capable of termination by either Government by twelve months' notice in writing given through the diplomatic channel.

I HAVE the honour to acknowledge receipt of your Excellency's Note of even date, with regard to the Agree-ment signed to-day between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and my Government relative to the reciprocal recognition of certificates of registry and other national papers concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, and in which your Excellency informs me of the desire of the Government of India that an agreement should be concluded between them and my Government applying the provisions of the said agreement on the one hand to Egyptian ships in the ports of India and on the other hand to ships in Egyptian

ports of initia and on the other name to ships in iggyptian ports which have been furnished with certificates and other national papers duly issued by the authorities of India. 2. In reply I have the honour to inform your Excellency that my Government is agreeable to this proposal and accept that your Excellency's Note and my present reply to that effect shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments in this metter which held between the two Governments in this matter which shall take effect from this date and be capable of termination by either Government by twelve months' notice in writing given through the diplomatic channel.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices, Batticaloa District, do, by this Order :-

> (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag, the maximum wholesale price per bushel, the maximum retail price per kottu and the maximum retail price per seer above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be, for the area within the Urban District Council limits of the town of Batticaloa ;

- (2) direct that every trader who at any premises within the Urban District Council limits of the town of Batticaloa exposes for sale rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of rice of that description and grade;
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell any rice of any description and grade in the Schedule mentioned hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (4) prescribe that every trader who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt on which shall be set out :-
  - (a) the quantity, description and grade of rice sold,
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold,
  - (c) the date of the sale, and
  - (d) the nature of the sale, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order :----
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale.
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail, measure "shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure equivalent to 1/32nd part
  - (c) of a bushel

  - (d) "kottu " shall be deemed to be equivalent to 1/24th part of a bushel,
    (e) "seer " shall be deemed to be equivalent to 1/28th part of a bushel,
    (f) a bag of rice other than broken raw rice shall contain not less than 76 measures and 157 lb. nett excluding the weight of the sack, and
  - (g) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 115 measures and 239 lb. nett excluding the weight of the sack.
- (6) rescind my Order relating to the maximum price of rice dated October 18, 1939, and published in the Gazette No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939.

- (5) direct that for the purposes of this Order :---
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ; and "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-
  - (c) second part of a bushel,

(6) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out :---

- (a) the description and grade of article sold,
- (b) the quantity of the article sold,(c) the date of the sale,
- (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be.

#### MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938.

# List of Applications for Licences for Omnibuses and Lorries, 1939.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for omnibuses and lorries for the rest of the year, 1939, is published hereunder for general information.

The following extract from the Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licences, &c. :---

"46 (2) (a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of any route, proposed by any applicant for a licence for an omnibus, or any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

(2) (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for an omnibus in respect of any route, or part of any route, or for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation, which is proposed by any other person in an application for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry, as the case may be, may, on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.

(4) Any person, who is entitled under sub-section 2 to make objection to the issue of any licence, 46 may, on payment of the prescribed fee\* inspect the application for that licence at any reasonable time at the Office of the Commissioner : Provided, however, that no fee shall be payable by any licensing authority in respect of the inspection of any application".

Objections must be made to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, in the manner prescribed by regulations 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the regulations published in Government Gazette No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939, which are also reproduced below, so as to be received by him not later than 3 P.M., on WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 1939. Any objection not conforming to these requirements will not be considered :-

"Regulation 1.—Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for an omnibus or lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.

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Regulation 2.—Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is made by any person other than a licensing authority, bear stamps to the value of Rs. 2.50.

Regulation 3.—Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

Regulation 4.—No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection."

N.B.—If the application is for an omnibus or a lorry "under construction" the serial number given to the application in the list should also be quoted.

5. The Government Agent reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all tenders without assigning any reason therefor, and selling the privilege thereafter by auction, if he so desires, and in any manner he may elect.

6. The grantee shall immediately on being granted the privilege, pay to the Government Agent the full purchase amount.

7. If the licensee proves satisfactory and if the Government Agent has no objection, he may at his sole discretion renew the licence for the period of one year commencing October 1, 1940, and every succeeding period in favour of the grantee of the privilege at this sale on payment of an annual fee assessed as is customary for licences of the same kind.





"Process of and apparatus for the parti-colour treatment of yarns."

Abstract.---A process is described for applying colours in regular sequence on a length of yarn as follows :---The yarn is wound on a suitable reel such that the thickness of the winding is small in comparison with the diameter. This reel is then mounted on a hollow bearing which is in communication with a suction pump. Colour is applied by means of a nozzle which is made to traverse the package by means of a nozzle which is made to traverse the package in a direction parallel to its axis and is drawn thorough the package by the action of the pump. By turning the package round the colour bands may be applied at equi-distant angular points. Alternatively the colour may be applied by pressing a bottomless trough on the package, filling this with a sufficient amount of dye, and drawing the dye through the package.

By providing two or more nozzles connected to troughs containing dye, bands of different colours may be applied to the package. A plurality of colour applying machines may be arranged to draw this supply from a common trough or set of troughs.

Suitable apparatus for carrying out the process is described in the specification. The nozzle traversing means comprise a double threaded rotating shaft and a half nut which can be brought in and out of engagement with it. The reel for winding the package may consist of two flanges connected by equidistantly spaced rocks. It is so arranged that the colour bands come in between two of these rods. The hollow bearing on which the reel is rotatably mounted has a slot at its uppermost surface corresponding to the dimensions of the colour band to be applied.

BY virtue of powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Saravanamuttu Samuel Navaratnam, Deputy Controller of Prices, Mullaittivu District, do, by this Order :-

  - (b) a bag of Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 115 measures and 239 pounds by weight;
  - (c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

- (d) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
- (e) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to 1/32nd part of a bushel;
- (f) the maximum price which may be demanded within any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto for a quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order, in respect of that area, for rice of that description and grade;
