SCHEDULE.

Schedule I. to the Proclamation dated September 12, 1935, as amended by the Proclamation dated February 15, 1939, is hereby amended by the substitution, for the definition of Ambalangoda town in the Galle District of the Southern Province, therein appearing and reproduced in Column I., of the definition appearing in Column II. hereunder:—

P. 483, claimed by U. P. Paul Silva and others) to the north-eastern corner of the said Nugetuduwa.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the western boundaries of Hatarakohotewela claimed by O. Daniel Silva and others, Totupolekekulama claimed by P. S. Nandoris and others, Mahawela claimed by A. Amaris and others, northern, western, and southern boundaries of Paniyanwalekkumbura claimed by L. A. Siriman Silva and others and western boundary of Paniyanwela *alias* Giratuduwa claimed by M. Udaris and others; thence westwards, northwards, and southwards along the eastern boundary of Paniyanwela claimed by S. Andiris and others, and the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of Paniyanwela claimed by N. Nandoris and others, and the western boundary of Paniyanwela claimed by S. Andiris and others to the landmark at the point where the Heen-ela meets the Porok-ela, thence southwards in a straight line across Mahawela claimed by S. W. Suwederis and others, Paniyanduweela claimed by M. T. Fernando and others and Enderemullewelyaya claimed by M. C. de Silva and others to the landmark on the northern boundary of Bogahawatta claimed by U. P. Raiso Nona, thence north-eastwards along the boundary defined by banks and landmarks to the eastern boundary of Maha Ambalangoda road; thence north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road to its junction with Paniyanduwa lane; thence north-westwards along the northern boundary of Paniyanduwa lane, thence north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of Manana claimed by M. C. de Silva and the southern boundary of Addarawela claimed by B. Panis to the landmark on the north-western corner of Elamoderabadaowitawela *alias* Mahadimanawela (lot 1 in P. P. A 45),

REGULATION.

The regulations governing the award of Government University scholarships published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,410 of November 4, 1938, are amended in the following respects—

(1) (a) By the substitution, for sub-clause ii of clause 3, of the following new sub-clause—“(ii) Must be a Ceylonese.”

(b) By the insertion of the following explanatory note at the end of clause 3—

Note.—“The term ‘Ceylonese’ will be interpreted to mean those born in Ceylon and would include those who were born out of Ceylon but who have acquired Ceylon domicile or whose fathers possessed Ceylon domicile at the time of their birth.”

(2) By the addition of the following new clause immediately after clause 7—

“7A. “The scholarship allowance will normally be payable in quarterly instalments by the Director of Colonial Scholars in England, the first payment falling due at the end of the quarter in which a scholar begins to count residence or attend lectures in the University of which he becomes a member. The payment will be continued up to the end of the period for which the scholarship is granted or to the date of his leaving England after the completion of his studies, whichever is earlier.”

Scholarship Examination Regulations.

The following regulations are published for general information. They come into force in 1940 and thereafter :—

Ten Scholarships each of the value of Rs. 480 per annum, will be awarded on the results of an examination held annually in March, at the University College, to students who have passed the London Matriculation Examination or secured exemption from it. The date of the examination will be notified in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

No Scholarship will be awarded to a candidate who does not reach a sufficiently high standard. If in any year one or more Scholarships remain vacant, Exhibitions each of the value of Rs. 240 per annum may be awarded on the results of the same examination.

Scholarships or Exhibitions which fall vacant may be awarded without examination to students of the College who show special merit.

2. (i.) No student will be admitted to the examination who completes his 19th year on or before the first of July of the year of the examination.

(ii.) Students of the University College who satisfy the regulations in other respects may with the approval of the Principal be candidates for the Scholarship examination, provided that they are not of more than three terms' standing at the College.

(iii.) No student who is not a Ceylonese will be eligible for a Scholarship or Exhibition.

[*Explanatory Note.*—The term “Ceylonese” will be interpreted to mean those born in Ceylon and will include those who were born out of Ceylon but who have acquired Ceylon domicile or whose fathers possessed Ceylon domicile at the time of their birth.]

3. The Scholarships and Exhibitions are tenable at the University College for a year commencing on the first of July immediately following the examination, but are renewable for a further period of one or two years, subject to the good conduct and progress of the holder.

4. Candidates should apply to the Registrar, University College, for a form of entry on or before February 1, which must be returned duly filled up, on or before February 15, accompanied by—

- (i.) The London Matriculation or examination certificate.
- (ii.) A proper certificate of birth.
- (iii.) A certificate of good conduct from the Head of the Candidates Secondary School.

5. Candidates will be examined in—

- (i.) English and
- (ii.) Two subjects chosen from one only of the following groups, (a), (b), (c) :—
 - (a) Latin, Greek, Sanskrit, Pali, Sinhalese, Tamil, English Literature, History.
 - (b) Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, and Pure Mathematics.
 - (c) Pure Mathematics, Applied Mathematics,

Note.—(1) A candidate who proposes to follow the Honours course in Classics if awarded a Scholarship or an Exhibition, must offer both Latin and Greek.

(2) A candidate who proposes to follow the Honours course in Mathematics if awarded a Scholarship or an Exhibition, must offer Group (c).

(3) Candidates who propose to follow the Honours course in History may offer English Literature with History, but are advised to offer a language rather than English Literature.

(4) All candidates will be submitted to a *vivá voce* test.

(5) No candidate will be considered for a Scholarship who does not reach a satisfactory standard in section (i.).

6. The awards are not made solely on the aggregate of marks.

7. Candidates who are elected to Scholarships or Exhibitions will be required to take an Honours course in one of the subjects on which they were adjudged worthy of Scholarships or Exhibitions, or in a cognate subject at the discretion of the College authorities.

In apportioning awards among the different groups offered by candidates the examiners will generally be guided by the desirability of giving due encouragement to the different Honours schools, subject to the proviso laid down in Regulation 1 that no Scholarship will be awarded to a candidate who does not reach a sufficiently high standard.

(The syllabuses for the Examination are published in the College Prospectus.)

PART I.

Board of Education.

1. The Board of Education shall consist of 25 members besides the Director.

2. The Governor may appoint a fit and proper person to be Secretary to the Board.

3. (1) The Board shall meet once in every three months.

(2) Meetings of the Board other than the meeting referred to in paragraph (1) may be summoned at the discretion of the Director or on receipt by him of a written requisition signed by five members of the Board.

(3) At least three days' notice of meetings of the Board shall be given to the members by the Secretary.

4. (1) Any member desirous of bringing up any matter for discussion at a meeting of the Board shall give at least five days' notice thereof to the Secretary.

(2) No matter of which notice has not been given in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) shall be discussed at any meeting without the leave of the Director.

5. At any meeting of the Board ten members shall constitute a quorum.

6. At any meeting of the Board any business proposed by the Director shall have precedence over any business proposed by any other member.

7. The recommendation of the majority of the members present and voting on any matter shall be deemed to be the recommendation of the Board on that matter.

8. Every recommendation of the Board shall be communicated to the Executive Committee by the Director as soon as may be convenient.

PART II.

Local Advisory Committees.

9. Meetings of Local Advisory Committees shall be held at such times and places as may be appointed by the Chairman of the Local Advisory Committee: Provided, however, that the first meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be appointed by the Education Officer.

10. The Director may require any officer of the Department to discharge the duties of Clerk to a Local Advisory Committee.

11. At least three days' notice of any meeting of a Local Advisory Committee shall be given to the members by the Clerk of the Committee.

12. In the absence of the Chairman at any meeting of a Local Advisory Committee the members present thereat may elect one of their number to preside at that meeting.

13. At any meeting of a Local Advisory Committee five members shall constitute a quorum.

14. (1) The recommendation of the majority of the members present and voting on any matter shall be deemed to be the recommendation of the Local Advisory Committee on that matter.

(2) Where the votes of the members present in regard to any matter are equally divided, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

PART III.

Retiring Allowances of ex-employees of Education District Committees and District School Committees.

15. Every full time officer, clerk or other servant in the employment of a District School Committee or District Committee under the Ordinances repealed by the Education Ordinance, No. 31 of 1939, and drawing a salary at a yearly or a monthly rate, who may be discontinued within the period of 6 months from the date on which the Education Ordinance, No. 31 of 1939, comes into operation and who does not immediately obtain other permanent employment under Government, shall be awarded a retiring allowance or gratuity calculated according to the provisions of the Government Minutes on Pensions as if the service of such officer, clerk or servant under such District School Committee or District Committee had been service in a non-pensionable office under Government, but without having regard to the requirement therein of a minimum service of fifteen years.

16. Every full time servant in the employment of a District School Committee or District Committee under the Ordinances repealed by the Education Ordinance, No. 31 of 1939, drawing wages at a daily-rate, who may be discontinued within the period of 6 months from the date on which the Education Ordinance, No. 31 of 1939, comes into operation and who does not immediately obtain other permanent employment under Government, shall be awarded a gratuity calculated under section 29 of the Government Minutes on Pensions as if the service of such servant under such District School Committee or District Committee had been service under Government but without having regard to the requirement therein of a minimum service of 15 years.

17. Any question with regard to the interpretation of the regulations in this Part or the application of such regulations to any person or the amount of any award under such regulations or the grant, refusal, suspension or cessation of any gratuity or retiring allowance, shall be decided by the Financial Secretary whose decision shall be final.

MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938.

List of Applications for Licences for Omnibuses and Lorries, 1939.

IN terms of section 46 (1) (b) of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, as amended by Ordinance No. 38 of 1939, a notice of applications for licences for omnibuses and lorries for the rest of the year 1939 is published hereunder for general information.

The following extract from the Motor Car Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licences, &c.:—

“46 (2) (a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of any route, proposed by any applicant for a licence for an omnibus, or any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

46 (2) (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for an omnibus in respect of any route, or part of any route, or for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation, which is proposed by any other person in an application for a licence for an omnibus or a lorry, as the case may be, may, on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.

46 (4) Any person, who is entitled under sub-section (2) to make objection to the issue of any licence may, on payment of the prescribed fee * inspect the application for that licence at any reasonable time at the Office of the Commissioner: Provided, however, that no fee shall be payable by any licensing authority in respect of the inspection of any application.”

Objections must be made to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, in the manner prescribed by the following regulations (published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939) so as to be received by him not later than 12 NOON ON SATURDAY, DECEMBER 2, 1939. Any objection not conforming to these requirements will not be considered:—

“Regulation 1.—Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for an omnibus or lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of that firm, as the case may be.

Regulation 2.—Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is made by any person other than a licensing authority, bear stamps to the value of Rs. 2.50.

Regulation 3.—Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

Regulation 4.—No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection.”

N.B.—If the application is for an omnibus or a lorry “under construction” the serial number given to the application in the list should also be quoted.

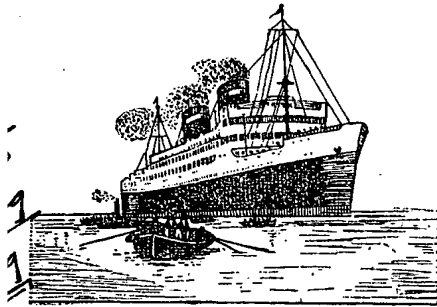

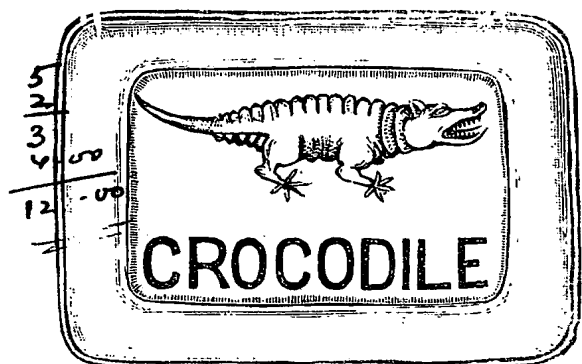

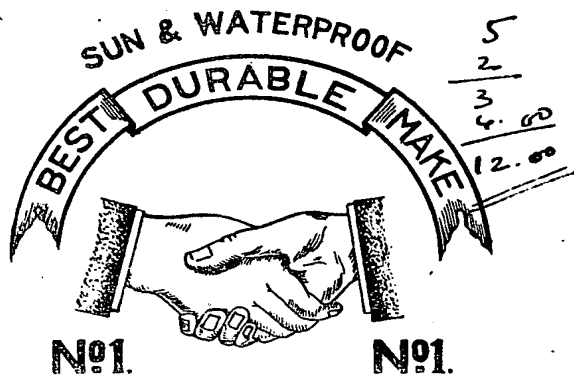

PRESERVED MILK AND MILK FOODS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Edward Heron Ryan Tenison, Acting Controller of Prices, do, by this Order:—

- (1) rescind my Order dated October 31, 1939, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,541 of October 31, 1939, fixing the maximum wholesale and the maximum retail prices above which preserved milk or milk food shall not be sold in any part in Ceylon;
- (2) rescind my Order dated November 16, 1939, published in *Gazette* No. 8,549 of November 17, 1939, fixing the maximum prices above which milk foods shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of Schedule (1) hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per case, and the maximum retail price per tin above which the brand of preserved milk of the description named and specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of Schedule (1) hereto and of the standard pack specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of Schedule (1) hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, in any part of Ceylon;
- (4) fix the prices specified in columns 3, 4, and 5 of Schedule (2) hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per case, the maximum retail price per case, and the maximum retail price per tin above which the brand of milk food of the description named and specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of Schedule (2), hereto, and of the standard pack specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of Schedule (2) hereto, shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, in any part of Ceylon;

- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order :—
- (a) any sale of any quantity of preserved milk or of milk food for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of preserved milk or of milk food for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
- (6) direct that any trader who, at any premises, exposes for sale preserved milk or milk food of the description named and specified in column 1 of Schedules (1) and (2) hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of such preserved milk or milk food ;
- (7) direct that every trader who sells preserved milk or milk food of the description named and specified in Schedules (1) and (2) hereto shall give the purchaser of that preserved milk or milk food a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- (a) The date of sale ;
 - (b) The quantity sold ;
 - (c) The price paid for the quantity sold ;
 - (d) The nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ; and
 - (e) The description and name of the brand of preserved milk or of milk food sold.
- (8) for the purpose of this Order—
- (a) " preserved milk " shall mean full cream milk imported into Ceylon which is preserved by some process and shall include powdered milk ; and
 - (b) " milk food " shall mean Malted milk and Infant Food not being Tonic Milk Food or Medical Milk Food.
- (9) direct that this Order shall come into operation from and after 12 midnight on November 24, 1939.

FORMIC ACID AND ACETIC ACID.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Edward Heron Ryan Tenison, Controller of Prices, do by this Order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price, above which the article mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or retail, as the case may be, in the area within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (2) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the Schedule to this Order at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, shall exhibit, in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (3) direct that no such trader shall sell any article mentioned in the Schedule which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description or quality;
- (4) direct that where any article mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order is sold by wholesale or by retail, the sale shall be made according to the measure of capacity (liquid measure), and concentration specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 or column 3, as the case may be, of that Schedule;
- (5) direct that every trader who sells an article of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (i.) the description and grade of the article sold;
 - (ii.) the price paid for the quantity of the article sold;
 - (iii.) the date of the sale; and
 - (iv.) the nature of the sale, *i.e.*, to say whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purposes of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

- (7) Rescind my Order dated September 20, 1939, fixing the maximum prices above which the articles mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,511 of September 20, 1939 ;
- (8) direct that this Order shall take effect from and after 12 midnight, November 24, 1939, and shall remain in force until 12 midnight, December 15, 1939.
