PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 44 of 1939.

An Ordinance to make provision for the Public and Railway Services and the Electrical Undertakings for the financial year 1939-40, to authorise the payment by way of advance out of Revenue of moneys required during that financial year for specified purposes, and to provide for the refund of such moneys to Revenue.

A. CALDECOTT.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance, No. 44 of 1939.

Appropriation for financial year 1939-40.

2 Without prejudice to any other law authorising any expenditure, sums not exceeding one hundred and four million two hundred and seventeen thousand two hundred and seventeen rupees, nineteen million four hundred and twenty-three thousand four hundred and thirty rupees, three million two hundred and eighty-two thousand five hundred and ninety-two rupees and eight hundred and eighty-three thousand five hundred rupees, are hereby declared to be payable out of the revenue and other funds of the Island, the Ceylon Government Railway, and the Electrical Undertakings, respectively, for the service of the financial year beginning on October 1, 1939, and ending on September 30, 1940; and the said sums may be expended as specified in the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Schedules, respectively.

Schedules I, II, III, and IV.

Payment from and refund to revenue of advances for purposes specified in Schedule V.

3 (1) In addition to the sums mentioned in section 2, sums not exceeding six million one hundred and seventy-nine thousand four hundred and eighty-five rupees in the aggregate are hereby declared to be payable by way of advance out of the revenue and other funds of the Island, during the financial year referred to in that section, for the purposes enumerated in the Fifth Schedule.

(2) Where the total sum paid under sub-section (1) by way of advance during the financial year beginning on October 1, 1939, and ending on September 30, 1940, has not been refunded to revenue out of the proceeds of any loan authorised to be raised under any written law, that sum or so much thereof as has not been so refunded shall be, and is hereby declared to be, payable out of the revenue and other funds of the Island for the service of the financial year beginning on October 1, 1944, and ending on September 30, 1945, in addition to any other sums that may by law be payable, or may by any written law hereafter enacted be declared to be payable, for the service of that financial year.

**An Ordinance to amend the Payment of Fines
(Courts of Summary Jurisdiction) Ordinance,
No. 49 of 1938.**

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Payment of Fines (Courts of Summary Jurisdiction) (Amendment) Ordinance, No. of 1939. Short title.

2 Section 6 of the Payment of Fines (Courts of Summary Jurisdiction) Ordinance, No. 49 of 1938, (hereinafter referred to as " the principal Ordinance "), is repealed and the following section is hereby substituted therefor :— Replacement of section 6 of Ordinance No. 49 of 1938.

6. A court of summary jurisdiction may, in any circumstances in which the court has, or if this Ordinance had not been enacted would have had, power to issue a warrant of commitment to prison in respect of the non-payment of a fine, in lieu of issuing such a warrant, order that the offender be detained in the precincts of the court until such hour on the day on which the order is made, not being later than 8 P.M., as the court may specify in the order. Detention in precincts of court in lieu of imprisonment.

3 Section 11 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :— Amendment of section 11 of the principal Ordinance.

- (1) by the omission of paragraph (c) thereof ;
- (2) by the re-lettering of paragraphs (d), (e) and (f) as paragraphs (c), (d) and (e), respectively ; and
- (3) in the re-lettered paragraph (e) thereof, by the substitution, for the words " court or in a Fiscal's cell under section 6.", of the words " court under section 6."

4 The Schedule to the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed. Repeal of Schedule to the principal Ordinance.

Objects and Reasons.

The object of this Bill is to amend section 6 of the Payment of Fines (Courts of Summary Jurisdiction) Ordinance, No. 49 of 1938, by the omission from that section of the provisions which confer on a court of summary jurisdiction the power to order the detention of an offender in a Fiscal's cell. As a measure of economy, it has been decided that a court of summary jurisdiction should be empowered to order an offender to be detained in the precincts of the court until 8 P.M. on the day on which the order of detention is made, in lieu of directing his detention in a Fiscal's cell.

2. The amendment of section 11 of the Ordinance and the repeal of the Schedule to the Ordinance are of a consequential nature.

2 Section 2 of the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 47 of 1938, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended by the substitution, in the new section 15B set out therein, for all the words from "order that the offender be detained" to the end of that new section, of the following:—

"order that the offender be detained in the precincts of the court until such hour on the day on which the order is made, not being later than 8 P.M., as the court may specify in the order."

Repeal of section 5
of the principal
Ordinance.

3 Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

Objects and Reasons.

Section 2 of the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 47 of 1938, which has not yet come into operation, provides for the insertion in the Code of a new section 15B under which a court will be enabled, in lieu of sentencing an offender to imprisonment, to order him to be detained in the precincts of the court or in a Fiscal's cell.

2. The new section 15B corresponds to section 6 of the Payment of Fines (Courts of Summary Jurisdiction) Ordinance, No. 49 of 1938, and a Bill to amend that Ordinance by the omission of the provisions relating to detention in a Fiscal's cell will be introduced simultaneously with this Bill.

3. The object of this Bill is to effect consequential amendments in Ordinance No. 47 of 1938.
