GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce under section 30 of the Shops Regulation Ordinance, No. 66 of 1938, approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section 30.

THE SHOPS REGULATION ORDINANCE, No. 66 of 1938.

The Shops Regulation Ordinance, No. 66 of 1938.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Shops Regulations, 1939, and shall come into force on the first day of October, 1939.
- 2. It shall be lawful for the occupier of any shop for the sale of refreshments, whether such shop is licensed for the sale of intoxicating liquor or not, to allow to every person employed in or about the business of that shop, two whole holidays with full wages in each month in place of the half holiday with full wages in each week as provided in section 5 of the Ordinance.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of section 7 of the Ordinance, every person employed in or about the business of a shop shall be given an interval of one hour, commencing at any time between 11 A.M. and 2 P.M., for the midday meal.
- 4. (1) Every permit under section 10 (1) of the Ordinance shall be issued by the Medical Officer of Health and shall be substantially in Form A set out in the Schedule. No such permit shall be issued unless the Medical Officer of Health is satisfied that suitable and sufficient accommodation is provided by the occupier of the shop for each person who is to reside therein.
- (2) Where suitable and sufficient accommodation for any person in respect of whom a permit has been issued is not maintained in any shop, the Medical Officer of Health may cancel such permit. Notice of such cancellation substantially in Form B set out in the Schedule shall be given to the occupier.

(3) Every permit shall expire, unless it is cancelled earlier, on the date on which the person in respect of whom it was it sued, ceases to be employed in the shop.

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- If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health that suitable and sufficient sanitary conveniences and washing facilities are available within a distance of fifty yards from any shop for the use of persons employed in or about the business of that shop, the Medical Officer of Health shall issue to the occupier of that shop a certificate under section 12 (1) of the Ordinance. Every such certificate shall be substantially in Form C set out in the Schedule.
- 6. The notice to be given under section 12 (6) of the Ordinance by the Magistrate's Court to the officer who has refused, withdrawn or modified any certificate, shall be substantially in Form D set out in the Schedule and shall be served on such officer personally or delivered to him by post.
- 7. Every notice issued under section 13 (a) of the Ordinance shall be issued by the Medical Officer of Health and shall be substantially in Form E set out in the Schedule.
- 8. The notice given under sub-sections (2) and (4) of section 12 may be in Form F and Form G respectively set out in the Schedule.
 - Every notice under section 14 (3) of the Ordinance shall be substantially in Form H set out in the Schedule.
 - 10. Every notice under section 19 of the Ordinance shall be substantially in Form I set out in the Schedule.
- 11. Any notice required to be exhibited under the Ordinance or these regulations by the occupier of any shop. shall be kept exhibited in such a manner that it may be readily seen and read by any person whom it affects and shall be renewed whenever it becomes defaced or otherwise ceases to be clearly legible.
- 12. (1) The record to be kept under section 20 of the Ordinance by the occupier of a shop of the hours actually worked by each person employed in or about the business of that shop shall be in Form J set out in the Schedule.
- (2) In every record the entries relating to any day shall be made on the day to which they relate or, if that is not reasonably practicable on the following day and the entries relating to overtime shall be made not later than two days from the end of the week to which the record relates.
 - (3) Every employee shall, once a week, initial the entries relating to him in proof of the correctness of the record:
- 13. (1) The Controller of Labour, the Deputy Controller of Labour or an Assistant Controller of Labour may exercise any or all the powers conferred by section 21 (1) of the Ordinance.
 (2) Subject to the general or special directions of any of the officers mentioned in paragraph (1) any Officer men-
- tioned hereunder may exercise any or all the powers conferred by section 21 (1) of the Ordinance.
 - A Medical Officer of Health.
 - A Revenue Officer of any local authority within the administrative limits of which a shop is situated. Any Police Officer not below the rank of Sub-Inspector.

 - Any officer authorized in writing by any of the officers mentioned in paragraph (1).
- No person who is above the age of 14 years and under the age of 18 years, and no woman, shall be employed in or about the business of a shop for a period (including overtime and any intervals for meals) exceeding 9 hours a day.
- 15. (1) No person shall be employed overtime unless such person is paid separately in addition to his ordinary wages for such overtime work.
- (2) For each hour or part of an hour of overtime work done a worker shall be paid not less than one and a quarter times the hourly rate.
- (3) The hourly rate shall be $\frac{1}{8}$ th of the daily rate or $\frac{1}{8 \times 26}$ of the monthly rate, according as the wages of that worker are reckoned daily or monthly.
- . 16. It shall be the duty of every occupier of any shop to furnish such particulars as may be required by the Controller of Labour for the purpose of the issue of any closing orders under section 15 of the Ordinance.
 - The following trades or businesses shall be exempted from the provisions of the Ordinance:-The business carried on by a pharmacist, chemist or druggist registered under the Medical Ordinance (Chapter
- 18. In these regulations "Medical Officer of Health" means the Medical Officer of Health of the area in which the shop in respect of which any action is to be taken, or any permit, certificate or notice is to be issued, is situated, and includes any subordinate officer generally or specially authorized by the Medical Officer of Health to perform any of the duties or exercise any of the functions assigned to such officer under these regulations.

RESCINDING ORDER.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Orders dated September 21, 1939, made by me fixing maximum prices above which sugar, potatoes and curry stuffs shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Galle and other areas mentioned in the schedules to those Orders and published in *Gazette* No. 8,513 of September 23, 1939, are hereby rescinded by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3, sub-section 13 (a) of the Control of Prices Ordinance as amended by Ordinance No. 43 of 1939.

CURRY STUFFS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, 7, Melvill Keverne Trelawny Sandys, Deputy Controller of Prices, Galle District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price, above which the articles mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or retail, as the case may be, in the area within the limits of the Municipal limits of the town of Galle.
- (2) direct that the maximum wholesale price per candy, per cwt., per bag or per bushel respectively as the case may be, which is prescribed in the first schedule for curry stuffs of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified for such candy, cwt., bag or bushel respectively in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum wholesale price per candy, per cwt., per bag or per bushel respectively above which curry stuffs of that description and grade shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.
 (3) direct that the maximum retail price per measure or per lb. as the case may be which is prescribed
- (3) direct that the maximum retail price per measure or per lb. as the case may be which is prescribed in the First Schedule for curry stuffs of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per measure or per lb. as the case may be above which curry stuffs of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.
 (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at
- (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Galle or in the District of Galle shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article.
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of any inferior description and grade.
- (6) direct that where any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto is sold by wholesale or by retail the sale shall be made according to the weight or measure specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the First Schedule.
- (7) direct that for the purposes of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail; and
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry-measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel.
- (8) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out:—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold,
 - (b) the quantity of the article sold,
 - (c) the date of the sale,
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail as the case may be.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Melvill Keverne Trelawny Sandys, Deputy Controller of Prices, Galle District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall, not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be in the area within the Municipal limits of the Town of Galle.
- (2) direct that the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight which is prescribed in the First Schedule for sugar of any description and grade, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, shall be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight above which sugar of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.
- (3) direct that the maximum retail price per pound which is prescribed in the First Schedule for sugar of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail per pound above which sugar of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of an inferior description and grade or quality.
- (5) prescribe that every trader who sells sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that sugar a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of sugar sold;
 - (b) the quantity of sugar sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold;
 - (d) the date of the sale, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was wholesale or retail as the case may be.
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order :-
 - (a) Any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) Any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale.

(7) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the Town of Galle or in the District of Galle, exposes for sale sugar of any description or grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description or grade.

POTATOES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Melvill Keverne Trelawny Sandys, Deputy Controller of Prices, Galle District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight and the maximum retail price per pound above which potatoes of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that schedule shall, not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be in the area within the Municipal limits of the Town of Galle.
- (2) direct that the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight which is prescribed in the First Schedule for potatoes of any description and grade, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, shall be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight above which potatoes of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.
- (3) direct that the maximum retail price per pound which is prescribed in the First Schedule for potatoes of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail per pound above which potatoes of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell potatoes of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with potatoes of an inferior description and grade or quality.

- (5) prescribe that every trader who sells potatoes of any description and grade mentioned in column ! of the First Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that potatoes a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of potatoes sold;
 - (b) the quantity of potatoes sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of potatoes sold;
 - (d) the date of the sale, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was wholesale or retail as the case may be.
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) Any sale of any quantity of potatoes for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of potatoes for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale.
- (7) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the Town of Galle or in the District of Galle, exposes for sale potatoes of any description or grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this order in respect of potatoes of that description or grade.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Melvill Keverne Trelawny Sandys, Deputy Controller of Prices, Galle District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight and the maximum retail price per pound above which poonac of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall, not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be in the area within the Municipal Limits of the Town of Galle.
- (2) direct that the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight which is prescribed in the First Schedule for poonac of any description and grade, increased by the amounts specified, in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, shall be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight above which poonac of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.

- (3) direct that the maximum retail price per pound which is prescribed in the First Schedule for poonac, of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per pound above which poonac of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule.
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell poonae of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with poonac of an inferior description and grade or quality.
- (5) prescribe that every trader who sells poonac of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that poonac a receipt in which there shall be
 - (a) the description and grade of poonac sold;

(b) the quantity of poonac sold

(c) the price paid for the quantity of poonac sold;

(d) the date of the sale, and

- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was wholesale or retail as the case may be.
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order:—
 - (a) Any sale of any quantity of poonac for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (b) Any sale of any quantity of poonac for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale.
- (7) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the Municipal limits of the Town of Galle or in the District of Galle, exposes for sale poonac of any description or grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this order in respect of poonac of that description
