THE DEFENCE (PROTECTED PLACES AND AREAS) REGULATIONS.

*Order.*

IN pursuance of the provisions of regulation 2 of the Defence (Protected Places and Areas) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (a) declare the area described in Schedule A hereto to be a protected area for the purposes of the aforesaid regulations, subject to the exemptions set out in Schedule B hereto ; and
- (b) appoint the Assistant Government Agent of the Trincomalee District to be the authority for granting the permission referred to in the aforesaid regulation 2.

SCHEDULE A.

*Trincomalee Protected Area No. 1.*

That part of the seashore in the Trincomalee District which is bounded on the south by Rocky Point on the Ostenburg Peninsula, and on the north by the sea exit of the lagoon represented by a line drawn from west to east half-way between Uppuveli and Elizabeth Point.

SCHEDULE B.

Exemption from the restrictions imposed by the aforesaid regulation 2 is hereby provided for the following classes of persons :—

- (a) members of the regular Naval, Military or Air Force, or of the Ceylon Defence Force, or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force ;
- (b) persons holding a permit obtained from an officer of any of the aforesaid Forces.

## SCHEDULE A.

*Trincomalee Protected Areas, No. 2.*

That portion of the seashore in the Trincomalee District which is situated between Rocky Point and a point on the seashore due west of Admiral's Bridge on Dockyard road.  
The seashore of the Great and Little Sober Islands.

## SCHEDULE B.

Exemption from the restrictions imposed by the aforesaid regulation 2 is hereby provided for the following classes of persons:—

- (a) members of the regular Naval, Military or Air Force, or of the Ceylon Defence Force, or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force;
- (b) persons holding a permit obtained from an officer of any of the aforesaid Forces.

The water-area of the Inner Harbour and the seashore adjacent thereto, and the water-area between Elizabeth Point and Kinniya Ferry.

## SCHEDULE B.

Exemption from the restrictions imposed by the aforesaid regulation 2 is hereby provided for the following:—

- (a) boats, sea-planes or other craft manned by members of the regular Naval, Military or Air Force, or of the Ceylon Defence Force, or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force;
- (b) boats or other craft belonging to or manned by persons holding a permit obtained from an officer of any of the aforesaid Forces;
- (c) ships belonging to or employed in His Majesty's service; and
- (d) merchant ships.

## THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACT, 1939.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 1 of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939.

## REGULATION.

Cap. 254.

(1) Where the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force or any portion thereof has been called out into actual service under the Naval Volunteer Ordinance, the Commanding Officer of the Force may at any time during the period of such actual service, with the consent of the Captain-in-Charge or Senior Naval Officer, Ceylon, by notice given or published in such manner as he may deem adequate, place on compulsory leave any officer or rating who is on actual service.

(2) A member of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force who is placed on compulsory leave as hereinbefore provided shall not be entitled to any pay or allowance or to any other benefit or to any relief for his wife or family under any regulation for the time being in force under the Naval Volunteer Ordinance in respect of the period of such leave, notwithstanding that he is on actual service during that period.

(3) Any member of the Force who is placed on compulsory leave as hereinbefore provided may, at any time while he is on actual service, be recalled from such leave by notice served or published in such manner as the Commanding Officer may deem adequate; and upon the service or publication of such notice, the compulsory leave of that member shall be determined and that member shall be bound to attend in person on such date and at such place as may be specified in the notice and to perform such service as may be required under the orders of the Captain-in-Charge or Senior Naval Officer, Ceylon.

(4) This regulation may be cited as the Naval Volunteer Force (Compulsory Leave) Regulation, and shall have effect notwithstanding anything contained in the Naval Volunteer Ordinance or in the regulations made thereunder.

PRESERVED MILK.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John Christopher Wilberforce Rock, Controller of Prices, do, by this Order :—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per case, the maximum retail price per case, and the maximum retail price per tin above which the brand of milk food of the description named and specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the schedule hereto and of the standard pack specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo.
- (2) direct that for the purpose of this Order :—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of milk food for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of milk food for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
- (3) direct that any trader who, at any premises, exposes for sale milk food of the description named and specified in column 1 of the schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of such milk food ;
- (4) direct that every trader who sells milk food of the description named and specified in the schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that milk food a receipt in which there shall be set out :—
  - (a) The date of sale ;
  - (b) The quantity sold ;
  - (c) The price paid for the quantity sold ;
  - (d) The nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ; and
  - (e) The description and name of the brand of milk food sold ;
- (5) direct that this Order shall come into operation from and after 12 midnight on October 9, 1939, and shall remain in force until 12 midnight on October 31, 1939 ;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order milk food shall mean Malted Milk and Infant Food not being Tonic Milk Food or Medicinal Milk Food.

## RICE.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Melvill Keverne Trelawny Sandys, Deputy Controller of Prices, Galle District, do, by this Order :—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the First Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag, the maximum retail price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which the rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be in the area, within the Municipal limits of the Town of Galle ;
- (2) direct that the maximum retail price per bag which is prescribed in the First Schedule for rice of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per bag above which rice of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (3) direct that the maximum retail price per measure which is prescribed in the First Schedule for rice of any description and grade increased by the amounts specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto shall be the maximum retail price per measure above which rice of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (4) direct that every trader who exposes for sale rice of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule at any premises within the limits of any area specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto or within the Municipal limits of the town of Galle shall exhibit, in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of rice of that description and grade ;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality ;
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this Order :—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
  - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded in any area for a quantity of rice which is less than 1 bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag prescribed by this Order in respect of that area, for rice of that description and grade ;
  - (d) a " bag " of any rice other than Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 76 cut " measures " and 160 pounds by weight ;
  - (e) a " bag " of Broken Raw Rice shall contain not less than 115 " cut measures " and 240 pounds by weight ;
  - (f) a " measure " shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel.
- (7) Direct that every trader who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in the schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt on which shall be set out :—
  - (a) the description and grade of rice sold ;
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold ;
  - (c) the date of the sale ; and
  - (d) the nature of the sale, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

*Order.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Aluwihare, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do by this Order :—

- (1) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum retail price above which any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price above which any article of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the Second Schedule ;
- (2) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article ;
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of any inferior description and grade ;
- (4) direct that where any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto is sold by wholesale or by retail the sale shall be made according to the weight or measure specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the First Schedule ;
- (5) direct that for the purposes of this Order :—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ; and
  - (c) " measure " shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel.
- (6) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out :—
  - (a) the description and grade of article sold,
  - (b) the quantity of the article sold,
  - (c) the date of the sale,
  - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
  - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail as the case may be.
