THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61 of 1939.

Order under Sections 21 and 30.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from the thirty-first day of December, 1941, the Order relating to the number of members of the Puttalam Urban Council, and to the electoral divisions of the town of Puttalam, published in *Gazette* No. 7,897, of December 11, 1931;
- (2) order under section 30 that with effect from the said date, the Puttalam Urban Council shall consist of nine members;
- (3) order under section 30 that with effect from the said date, the town of Puttalam shall be divided into seven electoral divisions with the limits defined in the Schedule hereto; and
- (4) order under section 21 that, for the purposes of the general election of members who are to come into office on the first day of January, 1942, and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the Urban Councils Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the Orders under section 30 hereinbefore set out shall be deemed to be operative on any date prior to the first day of January, 1942, on which it may be necessary that those Orders should be operative.

ELECTORAL DIVISIONS OF THE TOWN OF PUTTALAM.

Division No. 1.

North: From a point on the western limit of the Urban Council area in prolongation of the southern wall of the market eastwards along the said prolongation and the wall to a point at the centre of the junction of Old Salt Store road and Colombo-Puttalam road, thence along the centre of Old Salt Store road, Kurunegala road, and Anuradhapura road to the centre of its junction with Koch's road.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of Koch's road and Outer Circular road to the centre of its junction with Paramadaluwa Waun.

South: From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the centre of the Outer Circular road till it meets the western limit of the Urban Council area.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 2.

North: From the centre of the junction of Koch's road with Anuradhapura road eastwards along the centre of Anuradhapura road till it meets the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

South: The southern limit of the Urban Council area.

West: The western limit of the Urban Council area from its southern extremity till it meets the starting point of the western limit of Division No. 1, thence the southern and eastern limits of Division No. 1.

Division No. 3.

North: From a point on the western limit of the Urban Council area due west of the centre of the junction of Lake Shore street and Third Cross street eastwards to the centre of the said junction, thence along the centre of Third Cross street to the centre of its junction with Puttalam-Mannar road.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of Puttalam-Mannar road to the centre of its junction with Kurunegala road, thence south-eastwards along the centre of the last-mentioned road to the centre of its junction with Old Salt Store road.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of Old Salt Store road to the starting point of the northern limit of Division No. 1.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 4.

North: From a point where the flood outlet channel meets the Puttalam lake north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of the Puttalam-Mannar road.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of the Puttalam-Mannar road to its junction with the centre of Third Cross street.

South: The northern limit of Division No. 3.

West: From a point at the western extremity of the northern limit of Division No. 3 north-westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 5.

North: From a point at the centre of the junction of Third Cross street with Puttalam-Mannar road eastwards along the centre of Third Cross street to the centre of its junction with Chetty street, thence northwards along the centre of the last-mentioned street to its junction with the centre of Marakar street, thence eastwards along the centre of Marakar street to its junction with the centre of Second Cross street.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards and south-westwards along the centre of Second Cross street to the centre of its junction with Kankanikulam road thence southwards along the centre of Kankanikulam road to the centre of its junction with Kurunegala road.

South: From the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre of Kurunegala road to the centre of its junction with Puttalam-Mannar road.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of Puttalam-Mannar road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Division No. 6.

North: From a point at the centre of Udayar lane where it meets Nedunkulam tank bund eastwards along the said bund to its eastern extremity, thence northwards along the eastern edge of Nedunkulam tank till it meets the centre of Manalkundu Waun, thence eastwards along the centre of Manalkundu Waun till it meets the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of Anuradhapura road.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of Anuradhapura road and Kurunegala road to the centre of its junction with Kankanikulam road.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of Kankanikulam road and Second Cross street to the centre of its junction with Marakar street, thence westwards along the centre of the last-mentioned street to its junction with the centre of Udayar lane, thence northwards along the centre of Udayar lane to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

IT is hereby notified that information has been received by telegraph from the Secretary of State for the Colonies:—

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on December 18, 1940, at 4.30 p.m. in accordance with the Notice dated December 14, 1940.

Present:—Mr. A. Morley Spaar, Mayor; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar; Gate-Muhandiram N. Canaganayagam; Mr. V. D. Paul Raj; Mr. B. H. Dunuwille; Mr. H. R. U. Premachandra; Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne; Mr. P. M. Talwatte; Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte; Mr. L. B. Mawilmada; Mr. S. Halim Deen; and the Municipal Commissioner.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 23, 1940, having been previously submitted to the Mayor for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Mayor.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1939 to November 30, 1940, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Health Officer's report for November, 1940.

(c) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of November, 1940.

(d) The reservoir reading for December 18, 1940.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several inspectors on bakeries and report on public latrines inspected during November, 1940. The Mayor made a statement regarding the rise in the price of rice.

4. Petitions: Mr. M. A. S. Marikar presented a petition from Mr. A. W. M. James Appuhamy, *ex-conservancy kangany*, praying that he be reinstated.

5A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne asked:—A: Q.—(1) Have any public meetings been permitted by the Council to be held on the market grounds prior to December 7, 1940? A.—Yes. Q.—(2) Was a permit granted to the Udarata Sama Samaja Mardhana Society to hold a meeting on the market grounds on December 7, 1940? A.—Yes. The member was so informed by my letter No. L.B. of December 11, 1940. Q.—(3) Have any applications been received at any time from any persons or organizations other than the Sama Samaja Mardhana Society for permission to hold public meetings at the market grounds? A.—Yes. Q.—(4) Was any such application made by A. Morley Spaar, Esq., when he was seeking election to this Council? A.—No. Q.—(5) What was the procedure followed in respect of the applications referred to in questions 3 and 4? A.—(a) Such applications were dealt with by the Chairman Municipal Council, and subsequently by the Commissioner. (b) Does not arise. Q.—(6) What was the procedure followed in respect of, the unique permit issued to the Sama Samaja Mardhana Society to hold a public meeting on the market grounds? A.—Same procedure. The permit was not considered unique. Q.—(7) Is it not the usual official procedure to refer to the Council for its sanction all applications for permission to use open spaces in the town belonging to the Council? A.—No. But in the case of applications for the use of the Esplanade it was usual for the Chairman or Commissioner to allow or disallow the application and circulate papers for approval or information of the members. Q.—(8) Was the unprecedented procedure that led to the issue of this unique permit adopted because the Commissioner and/or Mayor are in sympathy with the said Society? A.—Definitely not. Q.—(9) Is the Mayor aware that this particular meeting was utilized as a platform for making a vile attack on the erstwhile opponent of the Mayor at the last Municipal elections? A.—No. The purpose of the meeting was stated in the application, to wit:—

B: Q.—(10) Are there in the service of this Council any officer or officers convicted by a Court of law of offences involving *moral turpitude*? A.—Yes. One. Q.—(11) If so, how and when did they come to be employed? A.—Appointed by the Chairman in 1933.

5B.—Notice of Motions.—Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne gave notice of the following motion:—"In view of the fact that there is general dissatisfaction in regard to the manner in which applications to hold meetings on open spaces belonging to this Council are now disposed of, this Council resolves that a set of rules be framed to regulate the grant of such permits."

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. B. H. Dunuwille moved:—"That in view of the distress and inconvenience caused to the residents of the town by the periodical inundation of the Mahaweli-ganga at Getembe, this Council in consultation with the P. W. D. do take steps to formulate a flood control scheme, including the blasting of rocks at the gorge, which impede the flow of water alongside Lady Blake's drive." Mr. V. D. Paul Raj seconded. Agreed that the motion be referred to the Works Committee for report.

7. The Executive Committee of Local Administration having nominated Mr. W. A. B. Soysa in terms of regulation 3 (c), the Council is required to nominate another member to serve on the Board under rule 3 (b) of the Street Collection Regulations.

Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne proposed and Mr. V. D. Paul Raj seconded that Mr. M. A. S. Marikar be nominated in place of Mr. W. A. B. Soysa to represent the Friend-in-Need Society.—Carried.

8. Recommendations of Standing Committees,

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Establishment held on November 23, 1940.

(1) Applications received for the post of Accountant.—Recommend that applications be circulated to Council.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Establishment held on December 14, 1940.

(2) Approval is required to let the roadside fish stall No. 2, Katugastota road, from October 1, to Mr. Podiappuhamy who has paid a premium of four months' rent and security Rs. 12·50. The Health Committee recommends the letting of the stall to Mr. Podiappuhamy.—Recommend that Health Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(3) Draft of advertisement calling for applications in connection with the training of 3 electrical engineering apprentices at the Power Station. The Electricity Committee recommends the adoption of the draft notice as amended.—Recommend that notice recommended by Electricity Committee be adopted.

(4) Papers *re* lease of land behind premises No. 21, Ward street, to Mr. Mohammed Ismail.—Recommend that the lease rent paid Rs. 5 be refunded.

(5) Mr. Sinnaduray's increments which fell due on August 1, 1938, was withheld until he brought the assessment work up to date. He has done so now and approval is required to pay him his increments for the years 1938 and 1939 from the savings on the Personal Emoluments Vote.—Recommend the payment of the increments due for the years 1938 and 1939.

(6) Approval is required to fix the rent of the 4 new model tenements constructed at Mahayaya at Rs. 4 each.—Recommend that the rent of the tenements be fixed at Rs. 4 each.

(7) Papers *re* extension of electric lights beyond the Municipal limits. The Electricity Committee recommends that lights be extended beyond the Municipal limits provided each of such extensions is capable of yielding a return of 10 per cent. on the outlay. Recommend that Electricity Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(8) Application from Sanitary Inspector Jayatunge for the bungalow at Gohagoda. The Mayor suggests that the bungalow be let to Mr. Jayatunge with the right to the produce of the entire land and to cultivate the portion of land attached to the bungalow at Rs. 20 per mensem.—Recommend that the Mayor's suggestion be approved.

(9) The Mayor has interviewed Kuda Banda, the son of the lessee of the produce of Pitakanda cemetery, in connection with the appointment of a caretaker for the cemetery and thinks that he will prove suitable. The Health Committee recommends the appointment of Kuda Banda as caretaker of the Pitakanda cemetery on an allowance of Rs. 5 a month and that he be entitled to take the produce of the land. (2) That he be allowed 50 cents for every grave dug in the cemetery, the upkeep of the cemetery be attended to by the Council.—Recommend that Health Committee's recommendation be approved.

(10) Resignation of Playground Instructor. The Playground Committee recommends that the resignation be accepted and that applications be called for the post on the present salary and allowances of the Playground Instructor. The qualifications to be as follows:—(1) E. S. L. C. or higher examination. (2) Practical experience in organization of games and sports. (3) Age between 20–30 years. (4) Preference to be given to those possessing a Diploma or Certificate in Physical Education from a College of Physical Education. (5) Must be of good physique.—Recommend that Playground Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(13) Application by Mr. D. T. Pelpola to purchase all albizzia trees in the Roseneath Catchment area. The Works Committee recommends that the application be refused.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(14) Mr. Siriwardane who tendered for the paving of a section of the Mahayaya-ela was asked if he was prepared to carry out the work connected with the paving on his old tender rates, in terms of the Municipal Council resolution of May 25. He has written asking that the item quoted by him in respect of expanded metal be increased to Rs. 10 per cube in view of the fact that there has been an increase in the price of materials since. The total amount of his tender would be increased by Rs. 200 if the request is granted. The Works Committee recommends the acceptance of the tender of Mr. Siriwardane with the increase of Rs. 200.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

The Works Committee recommends acceptance of the tender of Mr. Ponweera.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(21) To consider tenders received for improvements to King street 'bus stand. The Works Engineer recommends the acceptance of the tender of Mr. A. R. Suwaris for Rs. 1,188. The Works Committee recommends the acceptance of the tender of Mr. A. R. Suwaris.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

(22) To consider tenders received for repairs to the damage to Meda-ela caused by the floods. The Works Engineer recommends the acceptance of the tender of Mr. E. K. D. P. Siriwardane for Rs. 1,111. The Works Committee recommends acceptance of the tender of Mr. Siriwardane.—Recommend that Works Committee's recommendation be adopted.

Of this sum Rs. 17,900 remains invested in the purchase of the debt of the Electricity Department, and the balance Rs. 149,727 provides for advances for the purchase of stores, financing of expenditure pending realization of revenue, &c.

As a matter of interest it might be mentioned that at the end of 1932 the Council had a surplus of Rs. 415,371 and each year a slice had been taken to finance current expenditure which is not a satisfactory feature in budgeting for expenditure.

In the past, the annual budgetary position has been unbalanced by the numerous supplementary votes passed at almost every monthly meeting. This practice should be discouraged in future as unsound and supplementary votes should be strictly confined to unforeseen emergencies.

I feel it is the duty of the Council to pass a vote of appreciation of the services rendered by you, Sir, to this Council during your term. I can say, without any hesitation, that you have, as Mayor, done more service for this town than the Chairmen of the old Council have done for 10 years. I feel that that has been because you knew the conditions of the town and you knew the hardships of the ratepayers. You also knew to what extent help should be rendered to the ratepayers. It is not necessary for me to make a long speech, as the whole town knows what services you have rendered to it. With these few remarks, I propose that we place on record a vote of appreciation of the services of the Mayor.

Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte: I have great pleasure in seconding the vote and in associating myself with all that Mr. Marikar has said. I think I am one of the members who has given you the most trouble in this Council. We greatly appreciate what you have done, and done most ungrudgingly for the welfare of the town. You have done what we should have done by going round our wards and inquiring very minutely as to what were their needs. I have great pleasure in seconding the vote.

The vote was carried unanimously.

ANNEXURE.

Mayor's Statement.

I do not think it will be out of place if I touch on a few points of interest at the close of the second year of the reformed Council. To begin with, I should like to thank the members for their regular attendance at the standing committee meetings and at the monthly meetings during my period of office as Mayor, and for the keen interest they have evinced in all matters that came up for consideration for the welfare of the town—also for their ready co-operation and help which I received on all occasions and which materially assisted me in carrying out the administration of the Council. I should also like to take the opportunity, at the end of my period of office, of thanking the Commissioner, the Executive officers and others members of the staff for their loyal co-operation.

The members representing the different wards have been very much alive to their responsibilities and used every effort to ameliorate and improve the conditions prevailing in their constituencies—sometimes to a very embarrassing extent regardless of the financial implications their suggestions involve.

We have achieved a lot though it is not possible under existing financial conditions to supply all parochial needs.

At times we were apt to forget the greater needs of the town and to lose sight of the need for tackling larger issues in an effort to please our constituents. The health of the town has been good and there were no serious epidemics. I am informed by the Medical Officer of Health that there will be a distinct improvement on last year's figures in the maternal and infant mortality rates. The 3 Maternity and Child Welfare clinics continued to justify the expenditure incurred on them. An additional clinic was opened at Watapuluwa and the Council has provided for another next year in the neighbourhood of Getambe.

The improvements to the small market have been fully justified, but conditions in the big market are not by any means satisfactory. Rough plans and designs have been prepared for the big market and it is hoped to reconstruct it on loan funds. There is much improvement still needed to tea kiosks, eating-houses and bakeries, and I hope these will receive greater attention next year.

Conditions prevailing around the market on Fair Days are very unsatisfactory. Chaos and confusion prevail and provisions brought for the Fair are dumped on the roadside bespattered with filth and excretion. It is now time for the Council to tackle the question of shifting the fair day to another site and this is under consideration.

Abnormal rains during the second half of the year helped to overcome the usual difficulties experienced by the shortage of water.

The rainfall to date was 95.46 inches and the reservoir has been spilling for 153 days in the year. These conditions, as you may be aware, do not prevail usually. This is, however, not a record, for I find that the record has been in the year 1933 in which there were 116.18 inches of rains and the reservoir spilled for 250 days; in 1933 with a rainfall of 63.64 inches the reservoir did not spill at all.

The May rains and floods, however, caused considerable damage to the town. Considerable damage was also caused to private property when the lake overflowed the bund. The silting of the lake which has been aggravated by the heavy rains during the year is a problem which the Council must face.

The enlargement of existing silt traps round the lake has been provided for in the Budget and provision has been made for additional ones.

The absence of a dumping ground for the depositing of silt adds to the cost of its removal to a considerable distance.

The lake is vested in Government and the Central Government should therefore meet the cost of a dredger which is estimated to be about Rs. 22,500 especially as the vote for dredging is entirely provided by Government.

Pecuniary assistance was given to the poorer classes to reconstruct their dwellings which were damaged by the floods, the collection of subscriptions made from the public for King's Birthday celebrations in Kandy being diverted for the purpose.

An application was made to Government for financial assistance towards the repair of bunds, elms, and paddy fields within Municipal Council limits which were considerably damaged by the floods, but a satisfactory reply has not been forthcoming as yet.

A sum of Rs. 5,796.85 has been spent to date by the Council in repairing the damage caused to Municipal roads, culverts, bridges, buildings, and dhobies' tanks water main, &c., and in removing earth slips. The estimate of such repairs in progress when completed will amount to Rs. 3,470 and the repairs to be undertaken in the future for which monies have been provided will involve the Council in a further expenditure of Rs. 7,945.

The total estimate of flood damage repairs when completed will amount to Rs. 23,221.85.

Considerable improvement was effected to certain roads and others await attention next year.

The following works, among others, were carried out during the year. Repairs to ambulams; improvements to bathing places and the construction of two wells and a hot water bathing place, provision of two hearses to serve the poor ratepayers of the town, the opening of a new cemetery to serve the needs of the residents of Getambe area and the construction of a public latrine at the Railway approach road bus stand, the dismantling and reconstruction of a set of 5 labourers' lines, the conversion of one cattle shed in Mahayaya to line rooms, the conversion of another set into 4 tenements and improvements to the small market and granaries.

Provision was also made for a playground at Katukelle, the construction of two additional public latrines—one at Getambe and the other at Katugastota—and improvements to the King street and Market street bus stands. These works were sanctioned towards the end of the year. One of them is in progress and the other will be put in hand very shortly.

The reforestation of the catchment area is progressing steadily and will be continued next year. A civic survey of the town was undertaken and completed and plans are now under preparation.

You will be pleased to know that all works budgeted for and sanctioned by supplementary estimates in the earlier period of the year have all been completed except works which were sanctioned a few months ago and others held up owing to the acquisition of land. This is a very pleasing feature in the activities of the Works Department, but greater improvement is desirable and necessary and more attention should be paid to the supervision of work.

The maintenance cost of work and supervision has been less than in the previous year. During the course of the year the daily rate of pay of unskilled labourers was increased by 4 cents, and this increase has resulted in the cost of labour increasing by Rs. 548.25.

The Council also increased its grants to various charitable institutions and took upon itself the task of providing poor relief for the town from November. This is an added liability to the Council costing Rs. 20,000 annually.

The Council also donated a sum of Rs. 5,000 for war charities as a very small token of appreciating and gratitude for all that is being done by the mother country for the security and freedom of our Island. As it was found impossible to meet these extra demands the Council by a unanimous vote decided to increase the rates by 1½ per cent. next year.

You will I am sure agree that all the above expenditure was fully justified for the amelioration of the conditions of the masses in the town.

I stress these matters as the ordinary ratepayer is oblivious to these facts.

The Council suffered a considerable loss in revenue by the closing down of the Hotel Suisse and a section of the Queen's Hotel owing to depression and lack of patronage.

The Council also undertook the revision of rates and taxes on house property at a cost of Rs. 12,500.

The re-assessment of properties has not been completed and it is not possible at this moment to state whether there will be an appreciable increase on this head.

There has been an appreciable improvement in the efforts made for the recovery of rates and taxes, but I feel that a greater effort should be made to collect arrears as some dues under this head are outstanding from 1938.

There has been a very appreciable increase in the collection of water rates due to re-organization of the methods adopted for collection and change of staff.

A beginning I hope has at last been made to seriously tackle the water problem of Kandy and the Council has, I am glad to say, with good judgment passed a vote of Rs. 5,000 at its last meeting which it turned down some months ago, for the initial stages of the Hunnasingiriya Water Scheme, such as the preparation of survey plans and estimates.

The installation of a new 500 KW or 875 B.H.P. engine at the power station during the year is a forward step in the progress of this Department which has been a revenue earning department from its inception.

Considerable extensions have been made during the year in the lighting of areas which were shrouded in darkness and further extensions have been provided for the coming year and sections of the town have been converted from D.C. to A.C. current. Improvements to the public lighting system of the town have also been provided for.

Members are however apt to labour under the misapprehension that as the engine is capable of generating greater power extra lighting can be provided *carte blanche* without any cost. This is not so. If greater power is to be generated, it will result in the Council having to increase the contribution which it makes from general revenue to the Electricity Department for the cost of public lighting. The Council at present pays a sum of Rs. 39,500 from general revenue for the public lighting of the town.

The concession allowed to customers by the introduction of the two part tariff and the enforcement of the Shop Act in Kandy have been responsible for causing a drop in the revenue of the Electricity Department.

In conclusion, I would strongly urge on the members to refrain from applying for supplementary votes for carrying out additional work during the coming year unless such votes are needed for unforeseen expenditure of an immediate and urgent nature.

The Commissioner (Mr. W. Gopallawa) was in the Chair.

The Commissioner announced the result of the ballot, Mr. A. Morley Spaar, 8 votes; Mr. B. H. Dunuwille, 6 votes; and Mr. A. Morley Spaar was duly elected Mayor.

The Mayor thereupon took the chair and thanked the Council for electing him for a second term as Mayor of the Council and the Commissioner for the assurance given of the loyal co-operation of the executive officers and staff.

The Deputy Mayor also thanked the members of Council for electing him without a contest.

Messrs. H. A. C. Wickremaratne and B. H. Dunuwille addressed the house and congratulated the Mayor and assured him of their support and co-operation in the performance of his duties as Mayor for the benefit of the town.
