- (a) declare the premises described in Schedule A hereto to be a protected place for the purposes of the aforesaid Regulations; and
- (b) exempt from the restrictions imposed by the aforesaid regulation 25 the classes of persons specified in Schedule B hereto.

## Schedule A.

## PROTECTED PLACE No. 19.

## Royal Air Force Aerodrome, China Bay.

All that allotment of land occupied by the Royal Air Force, China Bay, situated in Nachchikuda, Chinanvadi, Nedunkuda, and Tirukkaikuda villages in Tamblegam pattu, Trincomalee District, Eastern Province, and bounded as follows:—

**North:** By the barbed wire fence along the southern boundary of the Railway reservation starting from the north-east corner of Kurinchameddaikadu to the junction of that fence with the barbed wire fence along the western boundary of Periyakulathukadu, thence southwards along the said barbed wire fence to where it meets the barbed wire fence on the northern boundary of the right of way through Periyakulathukadu and Nachchikudakadu, thence along the said barbed wire fence to where it meets the eastern boundary of Nachchikudakadu, thence northwards along the said barbed wire fence to its junction with the barbed wire fence on the southern boundary of the Railway reservation, thence along the said barbed wire fence to its junction with the barbed wire fence on the Public Works Department reservation near the 27th culvert to the north of the 76½ milestone on the road from Batticaloa to Trincomalee.

**East:** From the last mentioned point along the barbed wire fence on the western, southern, and western boundaries of the reservation along the road from Batticaloa to Trincomalee to where the said road meets the old road from Batticaloa to Trincomalee immediately north of the 75½ milestone and across the said road to the north-west corner of the reservation along the west of the said road, thence southwards along the barbed wire fence on the said road reservation to its junction with the barbed wire fence on the northern boundary of the right of way to Tamblegam Bay.

**South:** From the last mentioned point along the barbed wire fence on the northern boundary of the right of way to where it meets the Vettina-aru, thence across the Vettina-aru and along the barbed wire fence on the northern boundary of the said right of way up to the south-eastern corner of Sinnakulamviswalingamtotam, thence along the barbed wire fence on the eastern boundary of the said totam, the southern boundary of the right of way through the Crown land called Nachchikudakadu and Periyakulathukadu, thence southwards along the barbed wire fence on the western boundary of Periyakulathukadu, Sinnakulathutotam, Vellaikattukadu up to Tamblegam Bay.

**West:** From the last mentioned point along the barbed wire fence on the water's edge of Tamblegam Bay up to the south-eastern corner of Kurinjaveddaikadu, thence northwards along the barbed wire fence on the eastern boundaries of the said kadu, Kurinjaveddaikotam and Kurinjaveddaikadu to its junction with the barbed wire fence on the southern boundary of the Railway reservation.

(a) Members of the Regular Naval, Military or Air Force or of the Ceylon Defence Force or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force, who enter the protected place in uniform for the performance of any official duty.

(b) Persons holding a permit from an officer of any of the aforesaid Forces who is duly authorized to issue such permit.

(c) Police officers who enter the protected place in uniform for the performance of any official duty and are for the time being in possession of passes issued by the Assistant Superintendent of Police, Trincomalee, to authorize any police officer to enter any such place.

*REGULATION.*

The Trincomalee (Boat Lights) Regulations, 1940, published in *Gazette* No. 8,695 of December 13, 1940, are hereby amended by the substitution for regulation 1 thereof, of the following new regulation:—

"1. (1) No light shall be lit or displayed on or from any boat in Trincomalee Harbour at any time between 6 P.M. and 6 A.M. on such date or dates, or during the period between such dates, as the Assistant Government Agent of the Trincomalee District may determine and notify by beat of tom-tom or by any other means of local publication which he may deem sufficient.

(2) The date or dates for the purposes of paragraph (1) shall in every case be determined by the Assistant Government Agent in consultation with the Naval Officer-in-Charge, Trincomalee, and notified with the prior approval of the Minister for Local Administration:

Provided that in any case where immediate action appears to the Assistant Government Agent to be necessary, the prior approval of the Minister may be dispensed with, but in every such case the Assistant Government Agent shall forthwith report to the Minister the action taken by him and the reasons therefor."

"Home Safes—

Noliability shall be deemed to be incurred by the President, or any of the Directors of the Ceylon Savings Bank, jointly or severally, or by any other officer of the Ceylon Savings Bank in any case where the contents of any Home Safe which is lost or stolen are credited to the account of any person other than the depositor to whom the Home Safe was issued."

## BY-LAWS.

1. No person shall sink any well or cause any well to be sunk within the administrative limits of the Kotte Urban Council, unless he has obtained written permission in that behalf from the Chairman.

2. (1) No person shall sink any well or cause any well to be sunk for the supply of water for drinking or any other domestic purpose, or for the sale or supply of water to the public, unless the plan and specification of such well have been approved in writing by the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with the plan and specification so approved.

(2) The Chairman shall not approve any plan or give permission for the construction of any well within a distance of 50 feet from any cesspit, cesspool, soakage pit, pigsty, gala, cattle shed, pit latrine or defective or unbuilt drain, or from any land regularly manured every year for the purposes of any cultivation.

3. No person shall, at any place which is within a distance of 50 feet from any well used for the supply of water for drinking or any other domestic purpose—

- (a) construct, or cause or permit the construction of, any cesspit, cesspool, soakage pit, pit latrine, gala, cattle shed or unbuilt drain; or
- (b) deposit, or cause or permit the deposit of, any manure or any decaying animal or vegetable matter; or
- (c) cause or permit the accumulation of any refuse which is not cleared at least once in every week; or
- (d) permit any drain to remain in a defective condition.

4. The owner, lessee, or occupant of any land on which there is any well used for the supply of water for drinking or any other domestic purpose shall at all times—

- (1) keep the well in such condition or in such state of repair as may be necessary to prevent the flow or percolation of surface water into such well; and
- (2) keep every drain on that land which is within a distance of 50 feet from the well in a clean and sanitary condition, and in a proper state of repair.

5. No person shall use any unclean receptacle to draw water from any well used for the supply of water for drinking or any other domestic purpose.

6. No person shall wash any clothes within a distance of 10 feet from any well used for the supply of water to the public.

7. The Chairman may, whenever he deems such a course to be necessary, cause notice to be given in writing to the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land in which there is a well used for the supply of water for drinking or domestic purposes, to bale out the water and clean and disinfect the well within a time to be specified in such notice, and such owner, lessee, or occupant shall comply with such notice within the time specified therein.

8. It shall be lawful for any Sanitary Officer of the Council, or other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, to inspect any well and its surroundings at any time between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6 P.M.

9. Every contravention of the foregoing by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

10. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise admits, "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Kotte Urban Council.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance, every person who has possession, custody, or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt, by the person to whom the schedule is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, notify to the Chairman in writing the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the ground on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year. Provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman after the thirty-first day of March in any year, the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such schedule or notice shall be payable within one month of the date on which such schedule or notice is so furnished.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person the Chairman shall issue to that person in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of such owner and on the payment by such owner of fifty cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of the vehicle.

8. In these by-laws—"Committee" means the Panawal korale east, Panawal korale west, Atulugam korale east, and Atulugam korale west Village Committee;  
"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee.

The rules made under section 59 (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and published in *Gazette* No. 8,438 of March 10, 1939, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 8,659 of September 6, 1940, are hereby further amended by the addition, at the end of Part VIII. thereof, of the new Parts IX. and X. set out in the schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

*Part IX.—Officers and Servants.*

1. Where any post to which a monthly salary is attached is created, or becomes vacant, in the permanent establishment of a Village Committee, applications from persons eligible for appointment to such post shall be called for by the Committee by such notice published in such manner as the Committee may decide with the approval of the Government Agent. If the initial salary attached to such post is not less than Rs. 600 per annum, notice calling for such applications shall also be published in one or more of the local newspapers.

2. No person shall be selected for appointment to any post in the service of a Village Committee, if he—

- has been convicted of any offence under the Penal Code; or
- has been dismissed from the service of the Government or of any local authority or of any statutory public body; or
- is an uncertificated insolvent or bankrupt; or
- has not satisfied any decree entered against him by a civil court; or
- has directly or indirectly solicited the support of any member of the Committee to secure his appointment to such post.

3. Every officer or servant of a Village Committee shall be appointed by a resolution of the Committee:

Provided, however, that a Village Committee may by resolution authorize its Chairman to appoint any officer or servant who is—

- paid by the day, or
- is engaged to fill a vacant post temporarily:

Provided further that no appointment of any person by the Chairman to fill a vacant post temporarily shall be valid for any period exceeding two months from the date of appointment.

4. Every officer or servant of a Village Committee who is entrusted with the custody of money or stores, or whose duties are connected with the collection or recovery of revenue, shall, within one month of his appointment, or, in the case of an officer or servant who is in the service of the Committee on the date on which these rules come into force, within three months from such date, furnish security in one or more of the following ways, in such sum as may be fixed by the Committee with the approval of the Government Agent:—

- by personal bond and deposit, with the Government Agent, of cash to the required amount; or
- by the hypothecation, with the Village Committee, of immovable property approved by the Government Agent; or
- by the guarantee of any such public company or association accustomed as part of its regular business to guarantee the fidelity of any person, as may be approved by the Executive Committee of Local Administration.

5. (1) No officer or servant of a Village Committee shall—

- take part in any election held in the village area under the provisions of the Village Communities Ordinance, except by recording his vote, if he is entitled to one, or
- either directly or indirectly concern himself, or acquire a financial interest, in any contract with the Committee.

(2) Every officer or servant of a Village Committee who commits a breach of this rule shall be liable to dismissal from the service of the Committee.

6. The Chairman of a Village Committee may grant to any officer or servant who has been continuously in the service of the Committee for a period of at least nine months, and who is in receipt of a monthly salary of more than Rs. 25, leave of absence on full pay for any period not exceeding twenty-four working days in each year.

7. Except in the case of illness or of absence through any other unavoidable cause, the Chairman of a Village Committee shall not grant leave of absence to any officer or servant of the Committee under rule 6, unless such officer or servant, with the concurrence of the Chairman, makes such arrangements as may be necessary for the adequate discharge of his duties during his absence without expense or inconvenience to the Committee.

8. Every officer or servant of a Village Committee who applies for leave of absence on the ground of illness for any period exceeding three days shall support such application with a medical certificate.

9. The Chairman of a Village Committee, for special reasons approved by the Committee, may in any year grant to any officer or servant of the Committee any balance of the leave of absence unavailed of by such officer or servant under rule 6 during any preceding year.

10. The Chairman of a Village Committee may grant to any officer or servant of the Committee who is in receipt of a monthly salary of not more than Rs. 25, and who has been continuously in the service of the Committee for a period of not less than two years, leave of absence on full pay for any period not exceeding fourteen working days in each year.

11. The Chairman of a Village Committee may grant to any daily paid officer or servant of the Committee who has been continuously in the service of the Committee for a period of not less than two years leave of absence with full pay for any period not exceeding seven working days in each year.



12. No officer or servant of a Village Committee shall be entitled to demand payment of his salary, or of any allowance, or emolument, which is payable monthly, until the last working day in each month; and no Village Committee shall grant such officer or servant any advance of such salary, allowance, or emolument.

13. (1) The salary of a monthly paid officer or servant of a Village Committee for any period less than one month shall be computed with reference to the number of days in the month of which that period is a part.

(2) Where the monthly salary payable to any officer or servant includes any unpayable fraction of a cent, such fraction shall be omitted from the salary paid to him for each month other than December, and a sum of money equal to twelve times such fraction shall be included in the salary paid to him for the month of December in each year.

14. No officer or servant of a Village Committee shall be paid any increment to his salary or wage without a certificate from the Chairman of the Committee that such officer or servant has discharged his duties satisfactorily. The date from which any such increment takes effect shall be noted in, and such certificate from the Chairman shall be attached to, the pay sheet.

15. (1) Every officer or servant in the permanent establishment of a Village Committee shall hold office until he—

- (a) retires from office on the ground of age or ill-health, or
- (b) resigns his office, or
- (c) is discontinued from the service of the Committee on the abolition of the office, or
- (d) is dismissed from office for inefficiency or improper conduct.

(2) Every officer or servant in the permanent establishment of a Village Committee may retire at the age of 55 years, and shall retire at the age of 60 years, from the service of the Committee.

(3) No officer or servant of a Village Committee who is in the permanent establishment thereof shall be dismissed from the service of the Committee except by resolution of the Committee passed by not less than three-fourths of the number of members in the Committee.

16. Before any officer or servant of a Village Committee is dismissed from the service of the Committee for improper conduct, the Committee shall—

- (a) frame a charge against him regarding such conduct and provide him with a written statement of such charge;
- (b) allow him reasonable time to state in writing any grounds upon which he relies to exculpate himself;
- (c) hold an inquiry into such charge, and, at the inquiry, permit him to appear and defend himself and cross-examine any witnesses who give evidence against him;
- (d) supply him with a copy, or allow him to inspect and take a copy, of any document which is used or to be used against him; and
- (e) find him guilty of such charge.

17. Every daily-paid officer or servant of a Village Committee who, after serving the Committee continuously for a period of 15 years, retires from the service of the Committee on account of age or infirmity, may be awarded at the discretion of the Committee a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/24 of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

#### Part X.—Provident Fund.

1. In this Part—

- “bonus” means any sum of money placed to the credit of a contributor in accordance with rule 7;
- “contributor” means a contributor to the fund;
- “contribution” means a sum of money contributed to the fund by a contributor in accordance with these rules;
- “fund” means a provident fund established and administered by a Village Committee under rule 2;
- “Village Committee” means the Village Committee which administers the fund.

2. Every Village Committee may establish and administer a provident fund for the benefit of its monthly paid officers and servants.

3. (1) Where a Village Committee has established a fund, every monthly paid officer or servant of the Committee shall, as a condition of his employment by the Committee, become a contributor to the fund and make a monthly contribution thereto of a sum equivalent to 5 per centum of his salary.

(2) Every officer or servant shall, on becoming a contributor, forthwith make a declaration nominating one or more beneficiaries who are to receive the sum, if any, standing in the fund to the credit of the contributor in the event of his death. Such declaration shall be made on such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Village Committee.

4. The contribution of each contributor shall be deducted from his salary and placed to his credit in the fund.

5. The contribution of a contributor for any month shall be computed on the actual salary payable to him for that month.

6. It shall be optional for a contributor to make a contribution in respect of any period of absence on leave without pay.

7. (1) On the first day of January in each year there shall be placed in the fund to the credit of each contributor a bonus equal to his total contributions during the twelve months immediately preceding.

(2) Where a contributor dies or retires from the service of the Village Committee, a bonus equal to twice the aggregate amount of his contributions during the year in which he dies or retires shall be placed to his credit in the fund.

8. All monies in the fund shall be deposited in the Ceylon Savings Bank to the credit of the Village Committee, or be invested in the name of the Committee in any securities selected by resolution of the Committee out of such securities as may be approved for the purpose by the Executive Committee of Local Administration:

Provided that the preceding provisions of this rule shall not be deemed to prohibit a Village Committee from depositing a part of such monies in the Ceylon Savings Bank and investing the balance in any such securities.

9. The interest for each year on the monies of the fund deposited in the Ceylon Savings Bank or invested in securities under rule 8 shall be apportioned *pro rata* among all the contributors and placed to their credit in the fund.

10. (1) A separate account shall be kept for each contributor showing—

- (a) his contributions,
- (b) the bonuses placed to his credit in the fund under rule 7, and
- (c) the amounts placed to his credit in the fund as interest under rule 9.

(2) Every contributor shall be provided with an annual statement of his account in the fund.

(3) A contributor's account in the fund shall be closed on the date on which he dies or ceases to hold office under the Village Committee.

11. Every contributor who retires from office under the Village Committee on the ground of age or ill-health, or whose services are discontinued on the abolition of such office, or who resigns from such office voluntarily, shall be entitled to receive the entire sum standing to his credit in the fund at the date of such retirement, discontinuance, or resignation.

12. Where a contributor dies while in the service of the Village Committee, the entire sum standing to his credit in the fund at the time of his death shall be paid to the beneficiary or beneficiaries nominated by him under rule 3 (2).

13. Where a contributor is dismissed, on the ground of inefficiency or improper conduct, from the service of the Village Committee, the Committee shall have power to declare forfeited out of the aggregate sum standing to his credit in the fund—

- (a) the whole or any part of the sum which represents the bonus credited to him under rule 7, and
- (b) one half of the total amount of the interest credited to him under rule 9;

and on the Committee's making such declaration, the sum so forfeited shall be appropriated to the revenue of the Committee, and the balance of the sum standing to his credit in the fund shall be paid to him.

14. Where the Village Committee is of opinion, after such inquiry as it may deem necessary, whether of its own motion or on information furnished by any person, that any contributor to whom any money becomes payable under these rules is of unsound mind and incapable of managing his affairs, the Committee may pay the money, for the use and benefit of the contributor, to any person who is proved to the satisfaction of the Committee to be acting as guardian of the person or as manager of the affairs of the contributor, and the receipt of such person shall be a valid discharge to the Committee in respect of all its liability to that contributor under these rules:

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this rule shall apply in the case of any contributor as to whose state of mind any adjudication has been made by a court of competent jurisdiction.

15. Before any sum under rule 11, rule 12, rule 13 or rule 14 is paid to any contributor or beneficiary nominated by him, or to any other person, the Village Committee shall be entitled to deduct from that sum any monies which may be due to the Committee from that contributor.

16. (1) No contributor shall have any right or title to, or assign, transfer, mortgage, charge, or otherwise deal with, the sum or any part thereof standing to his credit in the fund, before such sum or part thereof becomes payable to him in accordance with the provisions of these rules.

(2) Where any contributor, before the sum or any part thereof standing to his credit in the fund has become payable to him under these rules, does any act for the purpose of assigning, transferring, mortgaging, charging, or otherwise dealing with, such sum or any part thereof, or is adjudicated an insolvent by a court of competent jurisdiction, the Village Committee may by resolution debar him from continuing to be a contributor and forfeit and appropriate to the revenue of the Committee the sum standing to his credit in the fund, or pay that sum or any part thereof to his wife, or children, or other dependants, as the Committee may determine.

17. The accounts of the fund shall form part of the accounts of the Village Committee and shall be subject to the same audit and publication as the accounts of the Committee.

## By-laws.

## CAPITATION TAX.

*Exemption.*

1. (1) The following classes of persons are hereby exempted from the liability to pay the capitation tax :—

- (a) accredited priests or ministers of any religious denomination,
- (b) members of the Ceylon Defence Force,
- (c) railway telegraph linesmen, and
- (d) persons over 55 years of age.

(2) Any person who has paid the land tax imposed by the Committee for any year shall, from the date of such payment, be exempt from the liability to pay the capitation tax for that year.

*Preparation of Lists.*

2. The person or persons authorized in that behalf in writing by the Chairman, shall on or before December 1 in each year, prepare in such form as may be specified by the Chairman, a list of all persons resident within the village area who are liable to pay the capitation tax for the next succeeding year.

3. The chief occupier of every house shall, whenever required by the Chairman or by any duly authorized person, fill in to the best of his knowledge any form supplied to him for the purposes of the preparation of the list, or furnish all such information, written or oral, as may be required, relating to the number of persons resident in the house (including the householder himself), and the name, age, and race, and other particulars of each such person.

4. The list prepared in each year shall be kept at the office of the Village Committee or at any other suitable place appointed by the Chairman and shall be open for inspection to the public from December 1 to 31 of that year.

5. Any person whose name is included in the list may by a written statement addressed to the Chairman on or before January 31 next succeeding, object to the inclusion of his name in the list on the ground that he is not a voter, or that he has ceased to be resident in the village, or that he is exempted by by-law 1 from the liability to pay the capitation tax. The Chairman shall, after holding such inquiry as he may consider necessary, make such order as may seem to him just.

6. Any person not already exempted under by-law 1 may, on or before February 15, make a written application to the Chairman for exemption from the liability to pay the capitation tax for that year. The Chairman may exempt such person from such liability for that year, or for life, or for such other period as he may think fit, on the ground that such person is by reason of bodily infirmity or disease incapable of performing labour.

7. The list shall be revised in accordance with the orders made by the Chairman under by-law 5, and with the exemptions granted under by-law 6, and shall be certified under the hand of the Chairman on or before March 1, as the final list of the persons liable to pay the capitation tax for that year.

*Annual Programme of Work.*

8. (1) The Committee shall at a meeting to be held on or before March 15 in each year—

- (a) prepare a programme of all the items of work which have to be constructed or maintained during that year;
- (b) determine the number of days for which each person included in the final list should be called upon to perform labour for that year in payment of the capitation tax due from him;
- (c) determine the rate, not exceeding fifty cents in respect of each day, at which the labour due from any person may be commuted by payment of money.

(2) Notice of the matters determined by the Committee under paragraph (1), shall be published by the Chairman as soon as may be, by beat of tom-tom in the village area and by the exhibition of written notices in conspicuous places in that area.

9. In the case of any item of work not included in the programme referred to in by-law 8 (1) any person included in the final list may be called upon to contribute labour for an additional period, but so however, that the total period for which any one person may be called upon to perform labour in any year does not exceed ten days.

*Commutation of Tax.*

10. Any person whose name is in the final list prepared for any year may commute his liability to perform labour for that year by making payment of money on or before March 31 of that year at the rate determined by the Committee under by-law 8 (1).

11. Not less than one week before the date appointed by the Chairman for the commencement of any item of work, information shall be given in the village area by beat of tom-tom, and by the exhibition of written notices under the hand of the Chairman,

specifying the place at which the work is to be done, the persons who are required to perform the labour necessary, the number of days for which each person has to contribute labour and the hours of work on each such day. The persons required to contribute labour may be described in the notice either by name or as inhabitants of any specified village or part of a village or group of villages.

12. (1) Every person who elects to commute his liability to perform labour by making payment of money shall pay the money to such officer and at such place as may for the time being be appointed by the Committee.

(2) A written receipt in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee shall be issued under the hand of the officer to whom such payment is made.

*Performance of Labour.*

13. Every person whose name appears in the final list referred to in by-law 7 and who has not commuted his liability to perform labour, shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on the days and at the time and place specified in such notice as may be issued, exhibited or published by the Chairman in that behalf.

*Performance or Commutation of Double Labour.*

14. Every person who fails to perform labour on any day on which he is required to do so by by-law 13, shall be deemed to be in default on that day and shall be liable to perform double labour, that is to say, labour for two days in respect of each day on which he is in default.

15. Any person who is liable to perform double labour may commute his liability to perform such double labour by making payment of money at the rate determined under by-law 8 (1): Provided that no person shall be permitted to make payment of money in commutation of the liability to perform such double labour after the expiry of a period of one month from the earliest day in respect of which he is in default.

16. Every person who is liable to perform double labour under by-law 14, and has not made payment in commutation thereof under by-law 15 shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary, and perform labour on such days and at such time and place as may be specified in a notice which shall be issued by the Chairman. Such notice shall not require any person to perform labour for any period exceeding in length the total number of days for which such person is liable to perform labour under by-law 14.

17. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

“Committee” means the Village Committee;

“list” means the list of persons liable to pay the capitation tax in the village area.

18. The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 8,219 of May 22, 1936, and therein called “Rules” are hereby amended in so far as they relate to this village area by the rescission of by-laws 1 to 8 appearing under the heading “Annual Tax”.

## BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance, every person who has possession, or custody, or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal, in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt by the person to whom such schedule is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, notify to the Chairman in writing the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice referred to in by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee within one month from the date on which the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, was furnished to the Chairman.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person the Chairman shall issue to that person in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the Schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by such owner of fifty cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of the vehicle.

8. In these by-laws—

“Committee” means the Ambalangoda Village Committee;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee.

#### BY-LAWS.

1. For the purposes of the assessment tax, the percentage or rate to be deducted from the annual value for the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep, shall be as follows:—

- in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent;
- in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent;
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent; and
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent.

2. (1) For the purpose of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

- to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto, and
- to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may, in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose.

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall, within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice.

(3) For the purposes of this by-law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed on a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person.

3. No person shall obstruct any assessor, or any person acting under the orders of an assessor, in the lawful discharge of his duties.

4. In these by-laws—

“building” includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure, whether used for human habitation or otherwise;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

“Committee” means the Kosgoda Village Committee.

#### BY-LAWS.

(1) Except under the authority of a permit in that behalf under the hand of the Chairman of the Village Committee, no person shall erect or maintain any kraal for soaking coir husks in any public lake, river, lagoon, or estuary within the limits of the village area.

(2) No such permit shall be issued except upon payment of a fee at the rate of ten cents for each square fathom proposed to be enclosed in the kraal:

Provided, however, that the Committee may by resolution waive the fee in the case of any person who is unable through poverty to pay such fee.

For the purposes of this paragraph, any outstanding fraction of a square fathom should be deemed to be a square fathom.

(3) Every permit issued under this by-law shall cease to be in force on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which it is expressed to come into force.

#### BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

1. For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance, the Chairman, shall, by written notice, require every person who has possession, or custody, or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax to furnish particulars relating to such vehicle or animal on such form as may be supplied by the Committee. The person to whom such form is delivered shall, within the time specified in such notice, fill up and return such form to the Chairman, or to any person authorized by the Chairman, to receive such form.

2. If any person, after having filled up and returned the form referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such form, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires, or commences to keep, or use any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has filled up and returned the form referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such form, to pay the tax for the year for which such form has been filled up and returned, and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who having filled up and returned the form referred to in by-law 1 or sent the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such form or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the Office of the Committee on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year: Provided that in any case where the form referred to in by-law 1 is filled up and returned, or the notice referred to in by-law 2 is sent, after the thirty-first day of March in any year, the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such form or notice shall be payable within one month of the date on which such form is returned or such notice is sent.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person, in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with the distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto, and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of such owner and on payment by such owner of 50 cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

“Committee” means the Godapitiya Village Committee, or the Akuressa Village Committee, as the case may be.

1. Every village path or road within the village area shall be constructed or reconstructed and maintained in accordance with the decision of the committee as to the width of such path or road and the course which it is to take.

2. No person shall—

- injure, damage, obstruct, encroach upon, or otherwise interfere with the use of, any village path or road, whether constructed or in course of construction; or
- except with the permission of the Committee, divert the line of any village path or road, whether constructed or in course of construction.

3. No person shall—

- erect any new building or wall within a limit of twelve feet from the centre of any village path, or within a limit of eighteen feet from the centre of any village cart road; or
- commence the erection of any building or wall along any such path or road unless written notice of the intention to erect such building or wall has been given to the Chairman at least thirty days before the date on which such erection is intended to be commenced.

4. (1) It shall be the duty of the proprietors and cultivators of paddy fields through which any public footpath runs, to maintain such footpath at its customary width.

(2) No person shall cut or encroach upon any such footpath so as to reduce its width to less than its customary width.

5. Where any path or road of a width exceeding three feet has been constructed by the committee through any paddy field, no person shall cut into or reduce the width of such path or road.

#### BY-LAWS.

##### Wells, Spouts, Bathing places, &c.

1. No person of one sex shall enter any enclosure at a public well, or any public bathing place, set apart by the Committee for the exclusive use of persons of the other sex.

2. (1) No person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any infectious, contagious or cutaneous disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall bathe or wash at any public well or watering place set apart by the Committee as a public bathing place, until the periods of infection and of incubation have elapsed.

(2) Water for the use of any person referred to in paragraph (1) shall be drawn by a healthy person and carried for use to a distance, at least twenty feet away, from the well or bathing place.

3. (1) No person shall wash, or cause to be washed, any animal, or any clothes, mats, or other articles whatsoever, at any public well, or at any place set apart as a public bathing place.

(2) No person shall lead, or drive, or take any animal into any public bathing place for any purpose whatsoever.

(3) No person shall in any manner pollute the water, or the precincts, of any public well or bathing place.

4. (1) No person shall wash or bathe at any public well, spout, or other watering place at which washing or bathing is prohibited by order of the Committee.

(2) Where the Committee has set apart any special place in any tank, stream, or other watering place, for washing, for bathing, for taking water for human consumption or for the washing of animals, no person shall use any such place for any purpose other than that for which it has been so set apart.

5. No person shall, without the written permission of the Chairman, remove water from any public well, tank, or other watering place, in any cart or barrel or in any quantity, exceeding such quantity as may from time to time be determined by the Committee.

#### BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE VEHICLES AND ANIMALS TAX.

##### Section 47.

1. (1) For the purpose of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance, every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall fill up and return to the Chairman a schedule in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt by the person to whom such schedule is delivered.

2. If any person, after having filled up and returned the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came in to his possession.

4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 1 or the written notice by by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the ground on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee on or before March 31 in each year provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman after March 31 in any year, the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such schedule, or notice shall be payable within one month of the date on which such schedule or notice is so furnished.

6. (1) On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles specified in the schedule hereto and figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. (2) Where any plate referred to in paragraph (1) becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents, to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue or cause to be issued a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by him of 50 cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate referred to in by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which such plate was issued.

#### BY-LAWS.

1. For the purposes of the assessment tax, the percentage or rate to be deducted from the annual value for the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep, shall be as follows:—

- in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent;
- in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent;
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent; and
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent.

2. (1) For the purposes of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

- to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto, and
- to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may, in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose.

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall, within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice.

(3) For the purposes of this by-law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed to a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person.

3. No person shall obstruct any assessor, or any person acting under the orders of an assessor, in the lawful discharge of his duties.

- “building” includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure, whether used for human habitation or otherwise;

#### BY-LAWS.

#### Bakeries.

1. In these by-laws—

“bakery” means any premises in which bread, biscuits or confectionery is or are baked for sale as food for human consumption, and includes any premises in which such food is prepared or in which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Village Committee.

2. (1) No person shall keep any bakery except on a licence issued by the Chairman.

(2) Every licence issued under paragraph (1) shall expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which it is issued.

3. No licence shall be issued under by-law 2 unless the premises to be licensed are in conformity with the following requirements:—

(i) The premises must be well ventilated and well lighted, the walls thereof must be plastered with lime mortar and whitewashed, the floor must be cemented and provided with sufficient drains, and a ceiling made of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof.

(ii) The premises must not be situated within fifty feet of any cesspit, permanent manure heap, uncovered sewer or privy.

4. The licensee of every bakery shall cause—

(a) the bakery to be kept clean and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy or cesspit and from any other similar nuisance;

(b) the floor of the bakery to be swept at least once in every twenty-four hours, the sweepings to be placed immediately in an impervious and covered receptacle, and daily removed from the bakery;

(c) the drains to be flushed, and all refuse around the premises to be removed, daily;



- (d) the flour which is to be used in the bakery to be kept on a platform raised three feet above the ground ;
- (e) all troughs, utensils and furniture used in, or belonging to, the bakery to be kept clean ;
- (f) the tops of the tables to be made of well-seasoned, closely fitting planks, or of some non-harmful impervious material, and such tables to be scraped and cleaned daily ;
- (g) a copy of these by-laws in Sinhalese to be exhibited in some conspicuous part of the bakery.

5. The licensee of a bakery shall not keep in the bakery any furniture or equipment which cannot be easily moved so as to enable the premises to be swept and cleaned.

6. The licensee of a bakery shall not allow the bakery to be used as a place for sleeping, or for keeping any animal, or for storing any article other than an article used in the manufacture of bread or pastry.

7. No person engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits or confectionery shall use any flour, water or other material which is not good and wholesome.

8. No person shall expose for sale any bread, biscuits, confectionery or sweetmeats otherwise than in clean and properly constructed, fly-proof glass cases.

9. Every person employed in the preparation and baking of bread, biscuits or confectionery shall wash his hands before engaging in that process, and shall wear a clean white apron covering the chest and body and also a white cap or turban.

10. The licensee or the person in charge of a bakery shall not permit any person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any cutaneous or contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, to enter the bakery, or to take part in the manufacture or sale of bread, biscuits or confectionery, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

11. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer authorized by him in writing, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of kneading or baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery.

(2) The licensee or the person in charge of a bakery shall permit the Chairman or any officer authorized by the Chairman in writing to inspect the bakery, and shall render the Chairman or such officer all such assistance as may be necessary.

#### THE TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE.

RULE made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 5 of the Telegraph Ordinance (Chapter 147).

#### RULE.

The Wireless Telegraph Rules, published in *Gazette* No. 7,555 of November 12, 1926, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 7,954 of November 18, 1932, are hereby further amended by the addition, immediately after rule 18, of the following new rule 19—

19. (1) The Governor may grant to any telegraph company a licence to instal, establish, maintain and work a wireless telegraph station and apparatus.

(2) Every licence granted under paragraph (1) shall be subject to such terms and conditions as may, in the discretion of the Governor, be specified in the licence.

(3) The Governor may in his discretion determine the fee payable on the grant of any licence under paragraph (1).

(4) Nothing contained in any of the preceding rules 2 to 18 shall apply to any telegraph company to which a licence is granted by the Governor under paragraph (1) and every such licence shall have effect notwithstanding anything contained in those rules."

**Regulations for the Grant of Industrial Scholarship by the Government of Ceylon.**

THE Industrial Scholarship Regulations published in *Gazette* No. 8,647 of August 2, 1940, are hereby repealed and the following regulations are substituted therefor:—

These regulations shall be cited as the "Industrial Scholarship Regulations, 1941".

2. In the interpretation of these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

"Director" shall mean the officer holding or acting in the office of Director of Commerce and Industries, and shall include the Deputy Director or any Assistant Director.

"Board" shall mean the Board appointed under these regulations.

"Government" shall mean the Government of Ceylon.

"Scholarship" means any scholarship awarded by the Government under these regulations.

"Department" means the Department of Commerce and Industries.

"Scholar" means the person who has been awarded a scholarship.

"Executive Committee" means the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce.

3. (1) Until further notice, scholarships will be granted by the Department to approved persons who desire to acquire a training in industries.

(2) The Industries for which scholarships are available will be notified by the Director in the *Gazette* and in any daily English newspaper published in Ceylon.

(3) The Department will arrange courses of training at selected Institutions in or outside Ceylon for all persons awarded a scholarship.

4. (1) No person shall be eligible to be awarded a scholarship unless—

- (a) he is a Ceylonese by birth or is a Ceylonese of mixed descent and one of his parents is a Ceylonese;
- (b) he is, on the date on which applications for a scholarship are notified in the *Gazette*, not less than 21 years of age nor more than 28 years of age. The Director may in any particular case dispense with the requirements of this clause where the applicant is, in the Director's opinion, suitable and deserving of a scholarship;
- (c) he is a graduate in Science of any University in England or of any other University which in the opinion of the Board is of equivalent standing.

Provided that where any person, is not a graduate in Science as required by this clause, he shall not on this ground be ineligible for a scholarship if he can satisfy the Director that his general education and practical experience in the industry for which a scholarship is offered are of the same standing as if he were a graduate in Science.

(2) The provisions of clauses (b) and (c) of paragraph (1) shall not apply to any person who on the date on which applications for scholarships are invited is in service under the Government in any capacity whatsoever.

5. (1) The value of a scholarship will vary with the industry for which the scholarship is offered.

(2) In every case the Government will pay—

- (a) all academic fees payable by the scholar to the Institution to which the scholar has been sent by the Government for training;
- (b) an adequate subsistence allowance to the scholar, the amount of the allowance to be fixed by the Board. Subsistence allowance shall commence from the date on which the scholar arrives at the Institution to which he is being sent for training and shall cease on the date on which he finally leaves the Institution.
- (c) the travelling expenses of the scholar. For the purpose of this clause travelling expenses shall mean a return second class steamer or a return second class rail fare from Colombo to the place where the Scholar is to pursue his training.

(3) In appropriate cases the Government will pay—

- (a) the scholar an outfit allowance, the amount of which will be determined by the Board;
- (b) other travelling expenses necessarily incurred by the scholar in pursuing his training.

6. The duration of the scholarship will depend on the industry for which a scholarship is awarded. Scholarships will ordinarily be tenable for two years.

7. Applications for a scholarship shall be made to the Director on the form prescribed by him for the purpose.

8. Every applicant for a scholarship must forward with his application—

- (a) a certificate of birth; and
- (b) a declaration that he has the consent of his parents (or, if he has no parent, of his guardian), to proceed out of Ceylon for the purpose of the scholarship, if the applicant has no independent means; and
- (c) three certificates of good character and suitability for being awarded a scholarship as follows:
  - (i) one certificate by the principal of the last school or College (including the University College, Colombo), or University at which the applicant obtained his education;
  - (ii) two certificates by two persons of responsibility known to the applicant, such persons not being related to the applicant by kinship or marriage; and
- (d) a certificate of physical fitness by a recognized Government medical practitioner that the applicant is physically fit and proper person to be awarded a scholarship in the

particular industry applied for and to undergo a course of training in the industry for which the scholarship is awarded under the conditions of climate and environment prevailing in the country where the training is to be obtained.

9. (a) Scholarships will be awarded to eligible applicants by a Board consisting of—

- (1) The Minister for Labour, Industry and Commerce;
- (2) The Director of Commerce and Industries;
- (3) The Professor of Physics, Ceylon University College;
- (4) The Professor of Chemistry, Ceylon University College.

(b) The Minister for Labour, Industry and Commerce shall have a casting vote.

10. The person awarded a scholarship shall proceed to the place at which the training is to be given on the date notified to him by the Director, and he shall, throughout the duration of the scholarship be under general control and authority of the Director or such other person as the Director may appoint for the purpose.

11. (i) The person awarded a scholarship shall, if so required by the Director, serve an apprenticeship period in the Department or in some other institution in Ceylon selected by the Director for the purpose, before he proceeds for a training under Regulation 10. The duration of the apprenticeship period shall be fixed by the Director.

(ii) The person awarded a scholarship may, while serving an apprenticeship period, be paid an allowance not exceeding Rs. 75 per mensem as the Director may fix.

12. Throughout the duration of the scholarship—

- (1) no scholar shall—
  - (a) follow any course of training other than that prescribed by the Director with the prior sanction of the Executive Committee;
  - (b) actively engage in any profession;
  - (c) leave the place to which the scholar has been sent for training without the prior permission of the Director;
  - (d) correspond with the Government or any other government except through the Director or the person appointed by the Director under Regulation 10.
- (2) the scholar shall at consecutive intervals of 3 months from the date on which the scholar commences his training at the place selected for the purpose, transmit or cause to be transmitted to the Director, a progress report signed by the Head of the Institution or other responsible person in the Institution at which the scholar is being trained stating whether the scholar is pursuing his training satisfactorily, that his conduct is satisfactory, and whether there is no objection to the continuance of the scholarship.

13. The continuance of the scholarship shall depend on the good conduct of the scholar, and on his satisfactory progress in the subject of training.

14. (1) On the completion of the training a scholar shall, if required to do so by the Government, serve in the Department or in any other department of Government for a period not exceeding 5 years on such terms and on such emoluments as the Government may fix.

(2) Nothing in paragraph (1) shall be deemed to bind the Government to provide the scholar with suitable employment in Government on the termination of the scholarship.

15. A scholarship may be forfeited if—

- (a) the scholar not being disabled by illness or prevented by other good cause fails to complete the course of training or to pass any interim examination prescribed by the Institution at which the scholar is being trained;
- (b) the Director is of opinion, either from reports received from the Head of the Institution or other responsible person, or from other reports, that the scholar is no longer deserving of the scholarship.

16. (1) Where a scholarship is forfeited under Regulation 15, the scholar and the surety shall be liable to refund the whole or such part of the expenses which the Government has had to incur on the scholar's account as may be decided by the Government.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation "surety" shall mean the surety referred to in Regulation 17.

(3) A scholar whose scholarship has been forfeited shall notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) be entitled to a free second class passage back to Ceylon from the place at which he was being trained provided that he returns to Ceylon on the date and by the conveyance specified by the Director.

17. Every scholar shall, before proceeding to the place where he is to be trained, enter into a bond with one surety approved by the Director (such bond being prescribed for the purpose by the Director) undertaking to abide by the terms and conditions of the scholarship and agreeing to refund to Government, jointly and severally with his surety, all expenses incurred by the Government in the grant of the scholarship if the scholar fails to fulfil any of the conditions of the scholarship.

18. The Government reserves to itself the right to add to, amend or vary these regulations at any time. Any addition, amendment or variation shall be as valid and effectual as if herein contained.

19. Where any dispute arises as to the correct interpretation of these regulations or where any matter arises which is not provided for in these regulations the decision of the Director shall be final conclusive and binding on the scholar.

Resolved that the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies inspected during December, 1940.

4. Petitions: (a) Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte presented an undertaking from the residents along the road to the Oruwakotuwa Dewale giving over the road leading to the Oruwakotuwa Dewale to the Municipal Council for its maintenance. (b) Mr. V. D. Paul Raj presented a petition from Mr. G. K. G. Appuhamy, proprietor of the Kandy town bus service, regarding an application from outstation bus owners for a bus halting place on the Ampitiya road between the market bus stand and the United Services Library. (c) Mr. L. B. Mawilmada presented a petition from the residents of Mawilmada regarding the bad condition of the public path running between premises No. 113, Mawilmada, and Mrs. Wijegonewardane's property. (d) Mr. P. M. Talwatte presented a petition from Mr. A. W. M. James Appuhamy, ex-Conservancy Kangany, praying that he be reinstated.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. A. S. Marikar asked:—Q.—(1) On what principles are model tenements let out to tenants? A.—In letting the Municipal model dwellings the principle followed is that preference over all other applicants is given to those evacuated by the Council from insanitary dwellings on closing orders made by the Court. When there are no such applicants on the waiting list tenements are given by the priority of applications which are registered in a waiting list after they are all investigated into by the Ward Inspectors and approved of by the Medical Officer of Health. Q.—(2) Why has the Council sought to eject the tenant occupying No. 6, Katukelle model tenements? A.—On several complaints received from the neighbours of the annoyance caused by the tenant of No. 6, Katukelle model dwellings, the tenant had been warned by two previous Chairmen. After the last complaint the said tenant was noticed to move into another house in a more isolated area with a view to avoiding further trouble. On the tenant's refusal to do so notice to quit was served. On failure to vacate legal action was instituted. Q.—(3) Has this tenant occupied this tenement for over 15 years? A.—Yes. Q.—(4) Are not the model tenements intended for the working classes? A.—The Deyannewela and Mahayaya houses are intended for the poorer classes while those at Katukelle are given to a better class of tenant who is able to pay the rent of Rs. 15 per month. (a) The Mahayaya tenements are usually given to those whose incomes as far as could be ascertained do not exceed Rs. 40 or so per month; (b) Deyannewela model dwellings, Rs. 60; and (c) Katukelle Rs. 100 or so. Q.—(5) Why are tenements rented out to assistants employed in shops? A.—The Municipal houses are given on the basis of an applicant's income irrespective of occupation.

6. Notice of Motions:—Nil.

7. (a) Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved:—In view of the fact that there is general dissatisfaction in regard to the manner in which applications to hold meetings on open spaces belonging to this Council are now disposed of, this Council resolves that a set of rules be framed to regulate the grant of such permits. Mr. W. A. B. Soysa seconded.

Mr. M. A. S. Marikar proposed the following amendment:—In view of the fact that there is no definite policy laid down as regards the disposal of the applications to hold meetings in open spaces belonging to the Council, this Council resolves that a set of rules be framed to regulate the grant of such permits. Mr. R. S. S. Gunawardane seconded. The amendment was carried and it was referred to the Law Committee for report.

7 (b) Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved:—In view of the fact that the stagnation of effluvia in the roadside drains at Ampitiya owing to their unbuilt condition has made them cesspools and breeding places for mosquitoes, and as health measures on which large sums of money are spent by the Council are rendered nugatory owing to the existence of such drains, this Council resolves that such sections of the Ampitiya roadside drains as are in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health a menace to public health be immediately built by Council, utilizing for the purpose a part or whole of the amount already voted for the purpose. Mr. R. S. S. Gunawardane seconded. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille spoke in support of the motion. Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne was heard in reply.

The Mayor explained the position as regards the building of the drain. The motion was carried.

7 (c) Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne moved:—With a view to relieving the great hardships which the ratepayers of Ampitiya have to undergo owing to the absence of any kind of water supply, this Council resolves that the Works Engineer be directed to report on the feasibility of providing them with a good supply of water by harnessing the several springs on the Udawela side of Roseneath. Mr. B. H. Dunuwille seconded. Decided to refer to the Works Engineer for report.

8. Applications received for the post of Municipal Accountant. (To interview the candidates—Messrs. I. R. Peries, H. de Mel, and X. A. Pillai). (This item was taken up last). The Council went into Committee and interviewed the 3 candidates.

After the interview the Council adjourned for 5 minutes at 10.25 A.M. The Council re-assembled at 10.30 A.M. and heard Mr. M. A. S. Marikar and Mr. V. D. Paul Raj in support of the claims of Mr. X. A. Pillai.

The Council having resumed, Mr. M. A. S. Marikar proposed that Mr. X. A. Pillai be selected for the post of Municipal Accountant. Mr. V. D. Paul Raj seconded.

Mr. H. L. Ratwatte proposed that Mr. H. de Mel be selected for the post of Municipal Accountant. Mr. W. A. B. Soysa seconded. Mr. R. S. S. Gunawardane proposed an amendment—That the post be re-advertised on a higher salary. Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne seconded. The amendment was put to the house and declared lost.

The original motion was then put to the house. Mr. Pillai obtained 5 votes and Mr. de Mel obtained 8 votes. Mr. R. S. S. Gunawardane declined to vote.

Mr. H. de Mel was declared selected for the post.

9. Joint letter from Messrs. W. A. B. Soysa, H. A. C. Wickremaratne, and M. A. S. Marikar stating that they wish to exchange places on the Committees in the following manner:—Mr. W. A. B. Soysa to be transferred to the Works Committee from Health Committee; Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne to be transferred to Finance Committee from Works Committee; and Mr. M. A. S. Marikar to be transferred to the Health Committee from the Finance Committee. The Council agreed to the proposals made by the 3 members.

10. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

*Extract from Minutes of the Joint Meeting of Standing Committees on Law and Health held on December 14, 1940.*

(1) To consider petition from the occupiers of the grain sheds in the Kandy market and Jail road protesting against the prohibition of the sale of sundry goods in their sheds. (To receive representatives and ascertain their views on the subject). Mr. N. M. Mohammed of the firm of Messrs. N. M. Moosa Naina & Sons acted as spokesman for the occupiers of the grain sheds, and Mr. S. M. Meera Saibo acted as spokesman for the market stall holders. Having heard the views of both parties, the deputation was asked to withdraw.

The Joint Committee considered the expression of views made by the parties and after discussion a vote was taken on the question. Mr. Dunuwille and Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne voted against the varying of the by-law. Messrs. Marikar, Halim Deen, Premachandra, and the Chairman voted for the proposal to vary the by-law and allow the stall holders in the market to sell rice in bins in terms of the M. O. H.'s recommendation, and the occupiers of the grain sheds to continue to sell sundry goods and things other than rice.

The M. O. H.'s recommendation is as follows:—Also it must be clearly understood that such of the stalls as are suitable and require to sell rice must be partitioned in zinc sheeting by the Municipal Council at the expense of the stall holders. If stall holders are allowed to do the work a satisfactory job is not likely to be done.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Public Health, Sanitation and Markets, held on January 13, 1941.*

(2) Draft Poor Law Scheme for 1941 for consideration of the Council. (See Annexure).

The Committee considered the scheme set out by the Poor Law Officer and recommends the scheme subject to the following:—

Paragraph 4. Local Sub-Committees.—The Committee considers the time inopportune and does not recommend the appointment of local Sub-Committees, and suggests this paragraph be deleted. The question may however be considered with the scheme for 1942.

5c. Items: Salaries and allowances.—The scale of salaries contained in this paragraph be adopted subject to revision, if necessary on the appointment of a suitable officer.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Establishment held on January 18, 1941.*

(3) Refund of security deposit to Mr. B. B. Fernando. There was a balance sum of Rs. 11.70 remaining to the credit of Mr. B. B. Fernando from a deposit of Rs. 25 made by him on account of water and electricity charges on premises No. 3A, King street, occupied by him after deducting certain charges due to the Council in respect of water and electricity supplied to him in January, 1939. As the amount was unclaimed on December 31, 1939, it was credited to revenue. He is claiming the amount and a vote of Rs. 11.70 is required to enable payment to be made.—Recommended.

(4) (a) Sanction of Council is required for the purchase of 201½ bushels of milhard rice made on December 16, 1940, for issue to labourers as the cost exceeds Rs. 1,000. (b) In the same connection the Storekeeper has represented that he finds it difficult to handle the issue from the depot at Mahayaya owing to the disorderliness of the labourers, and has asked for approval to issue the rice from the Town Hall premises.—Recommended.

The Committee also recommends the Mayor and Commissioner be authorized to purchase rice without calling for tenders and without entering into contracts as required by sections 80 and 81 of Ordinance No. 60 of 1935.

(5) Application from Mr. E. R. Abeyagoonsekera, Sanitary Inspector, for a loan of Rs. 600, repayable with interest in 24 monthly instalments for the purchase of a motor vehicle.—Recommended.

(6) Draft Poor Law Scheme for 1941 for the consideration of the Council, with recommendation of the Health Committee.—Recommends that the recommendations of the Health Committee be adopted.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Works Committee held on November 9, 1940.*

(7) Papers re application of Mr. F. E. Joliffe to lay a pipe line for the purpose of obtaining a water supply to Castle Hill in Gregory road.—Recommended.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Purposes, held on January 20, 1941.*

(8) Draft of bond proposed to be entered into with the Trustee of the Huduhumpola Vihare in connection with the lease of the site for the playground at Katukelle.—Recommend that the draft indenture of lease be approved.

(9) Draft of bond proposed to be entered into with the contractor in connection with his security for the right of collection of rents from the market spaces and fair day area during 1941. (D/400)—Recommend that the draft bond be approved.

(10) Memorandum dated July 9, 1940, from the M. O. H. stating that it appears to him to be necessary to have section 56 of the Medical Ordinance proclaimed in addition to section 55 already proclaimed. The Health Committee recommends it.—Recommend that Health Committee's recommendation be adopted.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on January 20, 1941.*

(11) Tenders received for the construction of the Heerasagala road bridge. The question was referred back to Works and Finance Committees at the last meeting of the Council to consider the question of the rate of Rs. 1.10 in respect of the item 9 of the tender of Mr. S. L. Liyanage. Reconsidered. The Committee recommends the acceptance of the tender of Mr. S. L. Liyanage, Rs. 5,579. Regarding the rate of Rs. 1.10 quoted, the Committee considers it to be a bona fide error for Rs. 1.10 and recommends that it be amended to Rs. 1.10.

The Finance Committee considered the recommendation of the Works Committee and recommend that fresh tenders be called for the construction of this work.

#### ANNEXURE.

##### *Draft Poor Law Scheme, 1941.*

(1) Outdoor relief can be given to persons of either sex, unable to support themselves, owing to physical or mental infirmity or incapacity, and in need of relief, and to orphans and children below 16 years of age, of poor parents who are in need of relief. Owing to want of accommodation and other facilities it is not possible to consider the question of granting indoor relief during this year. However, the Public Assistance Committee can use their discretion, and grant indoor relief to very deserving persons who have no houses to live in, and who have neither relatives nor friends to help them.

(2) As the nature or the amount of relief to be given is not specified in the Ordinance, each case must be dealt with on its own merits. As a general standard it has been decided that the charitable allowance to be given to each individual, should not, except for special reasons which the Public Assistance Committee thinks it necessary, be in excess of Rs. 2 per head and Rs. 5 for a family for a month.

##### *Public Assistance Committee.*

(3) The following powers are delegated on the Public Assistance Committee:—“All the functions conferred or imposed upon or vested in it by this Ordinance except the power of voting, or providing or borrowing money or levying a rate or acquiring lands or appointing officers or keeping and auditing accounts”.

##### *Local Sub-Committee.*

(4) For public assistance purposes Kandy is divided into five administrative areas as follows:—Area No. 1 comprises Ward Nos. 2 and 3; area No. 2 comprises Ward Nos. 1 and 8; area No. 3 comprises Ward Nos. 4 and 5; area No. 4 comprises Ward Nos. 6 and 7; and area No. 5 comprises Ward Nos. 9 and 10.

The local Sub-Committee appointed for each administrative area shall consist of four members, two of whom will be the Council members representing the two wards included in each area, and the balance two members, not being members of the Council, shall be nominated by the Public Assistance Committee. Each local Sub-Committee shall, subject to such rules as may be prescribed exercise, perform and discharge such functions as may be delegated to it under the general direction and control of the Public Assistance Committee. (Section 13 (3)).

*Delegation of Powers.*

Each of local Sub-Committee shall be empowered, subject to reporting action taken in regard to the principal matters dealt with by them under the rules made in terms of section 31 of Ordinance No. 30 of 1939.

(1) To consider reports made by the investigating officer.

(2) To give consideration (including interviewing of applicants and to determine the nature and amount of relief (if any) to be given in cases referred to them by Poor Law Officer.

(3) To keep under observation the circumstances and the conditions of persons to whom relief has been granted.

(4) To deal with the panel of tradesmen for supply of relief in kind.

(5) To act in co-operation with the voluntary agencies rendering analogous services in that area.

(6) To institute legal proceedings where necessary so as to recover costs of relief from those liable under the Ordinance.

(7) To visit, inspect or manage, if the Public Assistance Committee so request, of any Poor Law Institutions in the area for which the Local Sub-Committee is appointed.
