GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

IT is hereby notified that under the provisions of section 20E of the Tea Control Ordinance, No. 12 of 1938, as amended by the Tea Control (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 26 of 1940, the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands has fixed 62 cents as the maximum price at which a Tea Coupon or Coupon Credit may be bought or sold on or after February 17, 1941.

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS (REGULATION) ORDINANCE, No. 29 OF 1939.

IT is hereby notified that the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands has, in pursuance of the powers vested in that Committee by section 6 (1) of the Agricultural Products (Regulation) Ordinance, No. 29 of 1939, after consultation with the Agricultural Products Regulation Board, prescribed, from the date of publication of this notification—

- (a) that in order to obtain a licence to import a specified quantity of Red Onions an importer must purchase Ceylon-grown Red Onions in the ratio of two bags of 112 lb. each of Ceylon-grown Red Onions to 100 bags of 112 lb. each of imported Red Onions.
- (b) that in order to obtain a licence to import a specified quantity of Chillies, an importer must purchase Ceylon-grown Chillies in the ratio of 15 candies of 525 lb. each of Ceylon-grown Chillies to 100 candies of 525 lb. each of imported Chillies.
- (c) That the standard price and the standard place in respect of the above commodities remain the same as in the notifications of October 10 and October 31, 1940.
