THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF IMPORTS) REGULATIONS.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 3 of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order amend the Order under that regulation published at page 2 of the Supplement to the Gazette No. 8,712 of February 14, 1941, as follows ..

- (1) In Clause (3) of that Order by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (m), of the following new paragraph:
 - "(n) Such of the goods specified in items 5A and 11A'in the First Schedule hereto as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs to have been despatched from the country of origin direct to Ceylon before the 3rd day of May, 1941."
- (2) In the First Schedule to that Order-

 - (a) by the omission of items 28B, 28C, 28D, 106A, 123, and 125; and (b) by the insertion therein, in the appropriate places, of the following new items:—

5a. Beef, tinned or preserved ...

THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF IMPORTS) REGULATIONS.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 4 of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order amend the Order under that regulation published at page 7 of the Supplement to Gazette No. 8,712 of February 14, 1941, as follows:—

(1) In Clause (3) of that Order by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (l), of the following new paragraph:-

"(m) Such of the goods specified in items 28, 108, 10c, 10b, 10c, 10f, 15A, 33B, 17A, 48B, 48c, 54AA, and 55 in the First Schedule hereto as may be proved to the satisfaction of the Principal Collector of Customs to have been despatched from the country of origin direct to Ceylon before the 3rd day of May, 1941."
