MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend the Rabies Ordinance.

Chapter 333,
Vol. VI.,
page 753.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Rabies Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1941.

Short title.

2. Section 9 of the Rabies Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the two following paragraphs immediately after paragraph (e) of that section :—

“(f) for the establishment within the jurisdiction of any such local authority of inoculation stations for the inoculation or testing of dogs or suspected animals and for the regulation, management and control of such stations ;

(g) for the compulsory testing of dogs or suspected animals in order to detect the presence of rabies ; for the compulsory preventive inoculation against rabies of dogs or suspected animals ; and for the imposition and recovery of fees in respect of such testing or inoculation.”

Objects and Reasons.

The object of this Bill is to amend section 9 of the Rabies Ordinance (Chapter 333), so as to empower a local authority under that Ordinance to make regulations for the establishment of inoculation stations and for the compulsory testing or inoculation of dogs or suspected animals for the purpose of detecting the presence of rabies or preventing the spread of that disease.
