THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) AMENDMENT
REGULATIONS.

Divesting Order.

WHEREAS the Compagnie des Messageries Maritimes, (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), was an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Enemy Property) Regulations

And whereas all movable and immovable property belonging to or held or managed for or on behalf of the Company was vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property under or by virtue of the said Regulations:

And whereas by Regulation 7 (1) of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations such property is deemed to be vested in the Custodian

And whereas it is expedient to divest the Custodian of such property.

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by Regulation 7 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations, as amended by the Regulation published in *Gazette* No 8,760 of July 4, 1941, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (a) divest the Custodian of such property, and
- (b) direct that payment shall not be required of any fees due to the Custodian under the Defence (Enemy Property) Regulations in respect of such property.

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS,
1939

WHEREAS the Compagnie des Messageries Maritimes (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), functioning in Ceylon through its duly appointed Agent General is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulations

And whereas by paragraph (1) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations it is provided that any person who trades with the enemy within the meaning of those Regulations shall be guilty of an offence:

And whereas by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations it is provided that a person shall not be deemed to have traded with the enemy by reason only that he has done anything under authority given generally or specially by the Governor

And whereas prior to the date on which the Company became an enemy within the meaning of the aforesaid Regulations, the Company through its Agent General carried on shipping, export and import business in Colombo, and did other business arising out of or in connection with such shipping, export and import business with persons resident in Ceylon.

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to the Agent General and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, do hereby authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the Company through its Agent General in Ceylon.

1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 18 (1) of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, as amended by the regulation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,641 of July 25, 1940, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby revoke the Order under that regulation, published in *Gazette* No. 8,751 of June 6, 1941, whereby it was directed that Syria and Lebanon shall each be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of the aforesaid Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939.

THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF EXPORTS) REGULATIONS

Order.

IN pursuance of the provisions of regulation 3 (1) of the Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), exemptions from the requirements as to a licence under that regulation are hereby granted in respect of—

- (a) the exportation of any commodity, specified in any of the items 1 to 8 (inclusive) of the Schedule to the principal Regulations, to any territory to which regulation 2 of the Defence (Finance No. 2) Regulations applies, under the authority of a licence issued under that regulation,
- (b) the sending or taking out of Ceylon, by any person, of any quantity of any commodity specified in any of the items 2 to 8 (inclusive) of the Schedule to the principal Regulations, to any territory included in the following list:—
 - (i.) any part of the British Empire other than Canada or Newfoundland,
 - (ii.) the territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom or in any Dominion;
 - (iii.) the British Protectorates and protected states;
 - (iv.) Egypt and the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan,
 - (v.) the Belgian Congo and Ruanda-Urundi,
 - (vi.) French Equatorial Africa, the Cameroons under French mandate, French Oceania, and the French Establishments in India (being territories under the control of the Council of Defence of the French Empire), and
 - (vii.) Iceland and the Faroe Islands;
- (c) the taking out of Ceylon, by any person as his personal baggage and solely for his own use, of any quantity of diamonds or articles mounted or set with diamonds (as described in item 1 of the Schedule to the principal Regulations) not exceeding Rs. 5,000 in value, to any territory included in the list set out in paragraph (b);
- (d) the taking out of Ceylon, by any person as his personal baggage and solely for his own use, of any quantity of any commodity specified in items 1 to 8 (inclusive) of the Schedule to the principal Regulations, not exceeding Rs. 1,000 in value in the aggregate, to any territory which is not included in the list set out in paragraph (b), and which is not enemy territory within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939,
- (e) the taking out of Ceylon, by any visitor or person passing through Ceylon, of any commodity specified in items 1 to 8 (inclusive) of the Schedule to the principal Regulations, irrespective of the value thereof, if, but only if, such commodity was brought by him to Ceylon as part of his personal baggage and was at the time of his landing in Ceylon declared and produced by him before, and passed by, a Customs officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Principal Collector of Customs.

THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF EXPORTS) REGULATIONS

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 3 of the Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order amend the Schedule to those Regulations by the addition of the following new items to that Schedule—

- "9. All agricultural, mining, electrical and industrial machines and machinery (and parts of all agricultural, mining, electrical and industrial machines and machinery) of all types including boilers, boilerhouse plant, cranes, hoists and lifting machinery, foundry and workshop machinery, machine belting, machine tools, oil-pressing and refining machinery, pumping machinery, control and switch gear, electrical transformers, converters and magnetos
- 10 Aluminium or lead foil and lining
11. Iron or steel plates and sheets of every description."

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE

Regulations for the Mandur Festival

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Mandur in the Porativu pattu of the Batticaloa District

REGULATIONS.

1 (1) These regulations shall be in force during the period commencing on the sixteenth day of August, 1941, and ending on the fifth day of September, 1941.

(2) In these regulations—"camp area" means the area within the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto, "Government Agent" means the Government Agent of the Eastern Province

2 No person shall camp in any part of the camp area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Government Agent by special or general order or by notice exhibited on the spot

3 No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Government Agent

4 No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area, except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.

5 (1) No person shall keep any cattle—(a) in the camp area, or (b) in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala, or at a place approved for such use by the Government Agent.

(2) Every person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed daily from the camp area to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle

6 Every person who exposes food for sale within the camp area shall keep such food—

- (a) wrapped in, or covered with, clean paper or cloth so as to protect such food from contamination by flies or dust; or
- (b) in closed glass cases, or
- (c) in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

7 No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area, or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

8 In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area, and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart

9 Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

10 When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11 No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house, or gala, or expose for sale rice cakes within the camp area, unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. Such licence shall be issued free of charge.

12 No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building, so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

13 No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area, or within a distance of one mile from the boundaries of such area

14 No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent; and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

The boundaries of the "camp area" are as follows:—
North by the first public lane on the north running parallel to the Mandukkodamunai road
East by the lagoon facing Mandukkodamunai temple.
South by the lake (lagoon) known as Kovilkudah and the village of Palamunai.

- (a) by the creation and issue of registered stock,

3. The rate of interest payable shall—

- (a) in the case of the short term loan, be 2½ per centum per annum; and
(b) in the case of the medium term loan, be 3 per centum per annum.

ISSUE OF CEYLON GOVERNMENT WAR LOAN.

THIS LOAN WILL BE RAISED IN TWO ISSUES AT THE OPTION OF THE APPLICANT:—

The first payment of interest will be the amount of interest due for the period from the date on which the stock is purchased to the 28th day of February, 1942, and a warrant for this amount payable on the 1st day of March, 1942, will be attached to the scrip. A first full six months' interest will be payable on the 1st day of September, 1942.

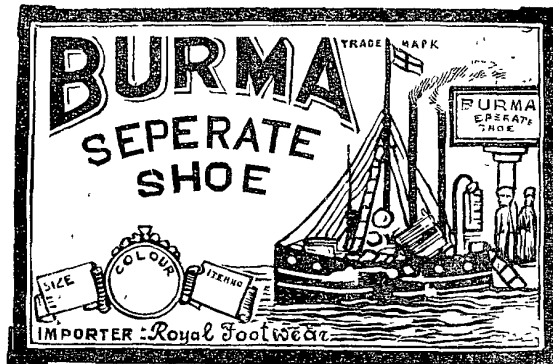

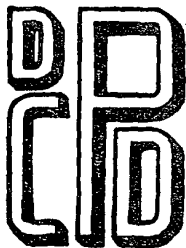
